

# **DAFFODILS BLOOM IN TIME FOR FUNDRAISER**

Spring sunshine and a field full of daffodils set the scene for members of the Killarney/South Kerry branch of the Irish Cancer Society when they visited the O'Shea family farm at Cleeney on the Tralee road at the weekend.

Michael O'Shea and his daughters Marian and Elizabeth supply daffodils every year to the Irish Cancer Society, a tradition that was started by the late Vivienne O'Shea who passed away two vears ago.

The funds raised on Daffodil Day, which will take place on Friday next March 27th will go directly to fund the work of the Society across support, prevention, research and advocacy. Night Nursing is one service funded by Daffodil Day. Last year the Society was able to fulfil 96 per cent of requests for a night nurse. Seventy Five percent of cancer patients wish to die at home surrounded by family, yet only 25% get to do so.

The Irish Cancer Society provides the only night time care service for cancer patients in their own homes. In 2014 the Society's nurses provided 7,800 nights of care to over 1,670 patients in which 312 nights of care was provided to 74 patients in Kerry. This service is fully funded by the people of Ireland who consistently support the work of the Society.

If you would like to support the Irish Cancer Society on Daffodil Day you can do so in many ways.... you can donate on the street to one of the many official collectors, you can offer up an hour of your time to sell daffodils or you can call to the offices of the Killarney Outlook where you can purchase Irish Cancer Society merchandise. It's vital that Daffodil Day reaches its ambitious fundraising target of €3.5 million in order to continue to provide and expand this service and others.

# **DRUG SEIZURE IN KILLARNEY**

Killarney Gardai seized a quantity of controlled drugs following a targeted surveillance operation when a vehicle was stopped at Dromickbane, Muckross, Killarney on Monday evening, 16th March 2015. In a follow up searches in nearby woodland, further quantities of drugs were seized. Two Killarney men were arrested by Gardaí and detained in Killarney Garda Station under Drug Trafficking Legislation. One man was released without charge late on the 17th March 2015.

The second man appeared at Tralee District Court on Wednesday 18th March 2015 in relation to the matter.


# LOTS OF LOTTO WINS CELEBRATED ACROSS THE COUNTY

Many many people experience feelings of hopelessness and despair. Jenny\* is one such person.

Jenny's Story

"There were times when I felt no way out of this prison of my mind. I just wanted the pain to end. I wanted to disappear. I tried to kill myself but looking back now I'm so grateful I got the right support I needed. In Counseling I was able to talk about whatever was on my mind. I had always felt not good enough and somehow thought what had happened to me was my fault, even though I was just a child. I thought it would be best for everyone if I died, I know now I couldn't have been more wrong. After counselling, the 'demons' in my head have quietened and I've moved to a better place within myself. Yeah, sure I have down days but nothing like before. I've started a new course and for the first time ever I'm looking forward to the future."

#### Steps to take

You do not have to suffer in silence. If you are in despair please talk to someone. Whilst it may feel like a difficult thing to do it's really important to speak to someone who may be able to help. This may be a family member, a friend, your GP, a teacher or a counsellor. There are people who understand what you are going through. You don't need to go through this alone. # **Health Matters....** With Dr. Michael Moloney

# **CROUP**

Croup is an infection of the larynx (voice box) and trachea (windpipe). These are the upper and lower parts of the breathing tube that connects the mouth to the top of the lungs. The usual cause of croup is a viral infection.

Croup is common in young children and occurs most commonly between the ages of one and three years. As children become older, their breathing tube becomes firmer and wider. Therefore, croup becomes uncommon after the age of six years. Croup often occurs in outbreaks or epidemics in the winter.

#### WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF CROUP?

- Cough, which is usually harsh and barking.
- Breathing symptoms. The infection causes inflammation on the inside lining of the breathing tube. There may also be a lot of thick mucus. A combination of these can cause narrowing of the breathing tube. The narrowed tube may cause noisy breathing (stridor). Breathing may become difficult if the narrowing becomes worse.
- Other symptoms that may occur include a runny nose, hoarseness, and sore throat. The symptoms are often worse at night. Symptoms usually peak after 1-3 days, and then improve. A mild but irritating cough may last a further week or so.

#### **HOW SERIOUS IS CROUP?**

Symptoms are often fairly mild, but sometimes become severe. Any breathing difficulty is often mild. Parents can expect to have one or two disturbed nights nursing a coughing child. Most children with croup remain at home and soon recover.

The main concern is if severe narrowing of the breathing tube develops. If this occurs then breathing can become difficult.



# Easter Grange LAYER CAKE

#### For the Cake

- 225g baking spread 225g self-raising flour 1 level tsp baking powder 100g golden caster sugar 100g brown sugar
- 4 large eggs finely grated zest of 2 oranges

#### For the butter icing

- 150g butter, softened
- 300g icing sugar, sifted
   finely grated zest of 2 oranges

#### For the glaze

- 25g caster sugar
   juice of 2 oranges
- The second second second

#### Method

- Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. You will need 2 x 20cm loose-bottomed sandwich tins, greased and bases lined with baking parchment. Measure all the cake ingredients into a large bowl (reserve a little orange zest for decoration) and beat with a wooden spoon or electric hand mixer until combined and smooth.
- Divide evenly between the 2 tins. Bake for 20-25 mins or until well risen, lightly golden and shrinking away from the sides of the tins. After 5 mins, remove from the tins and leave to cool on a wire rack.
- To make the icing, put the butter and icing sugar into a bowl and mix with an electric hand mixer until light and fluffy. Stir in the orange zest.
- Remove the paper from the cakes. Sit 1 cake upside down on a plate. Make the glaze by putting the caster sugar and orange juice into a saucepan, stirring over a low heat until the sugar has dissolved. Boil until reduced by half, then brush half on the upside-down cake, using a pastry brush. Spread half the butter icing over the glazed cake. Sit the other cake on top, brush with the remaining glaze, then spread with the remaining butter icing. Scatter with the reserved orange zest. The cake is best eaten on the day, but will keep for up to 3 days in a cool place. It freezes well un-iced or filled.

# **HOW TO CHANGE A** WHEEL SAFELY

To save space and weight, many new cars have a punture repair kit - sealant and compressor - rather than a spare wheel. If you don't have a spare it's a good idea to familiarise yourself with the kit provided so you'll know what to do if you do get a puncture.

If your car does have a spare it's a good idea to practise changing a wheel at home in the daylight when the weather's warm and dry. Then, if you do suffer a puncture you'll be able to cope more easily, even if it's dark, cold or wet. Given a safe environment, the right tools and some basic knowledge, changing a wheel on any vehicle should be fairly straightforward. Check the handbook first as this might include vehicle specific advice.

Where the handbook and our advice appear to be in conflict, follow the advice in the handbook.

#### **FOR YOUR OWN SAFETY**

Don't try to change a wheel on the hard shoulder of a motorway or at the side of a road. Turn off or pull over well away from the traffic and call for help. Don't try to change a wheel on soft, loose or uneven ground. Don't try to change a wheel with passengers still in the car. Move everyone to a place of safety, well away from the vehicle and carriageway. Don't work under a car while it's raised on a jack. Don't try to use the jack anywhere other than at the specified jacking points - attaching the jack in the wrong place can cause damage to the car and/or risks it collapsing when lifted.

#### What you'll need

Handbook - showing where to attach the jack spare wheel - with adequate tread and correctly inflated. Vehicle jack wheel-nut wrenchwith extension bar and locking wheel nut adaptor if fitted at least one wheel chock. gloves - the wheel/tyre will be dirty. Something to kneel on - the ground will be dirty too. Sharp knife or cutters to remove cable ties if these are used to hold wheel trims in place. Torch. Reflective jacket and sensible/strong shoes for your own safety



#### Before lifting the car

Plan the job so that the vehicle is raised for the minimum amount of time. Switch off the engine and turn on the hazard lights. Apply the handbrake and engage first gear (or 'P' if an automatic). Check the road wheel diagonally opposite the one to be replaced. Remove the spare from the boot/carrier – a carrier under the vehicle may be rusty and difficult to move. Lay the spare on the ground where it will be convenient for fitting. Remove the wheel trim (if fitted) - you may have to cut cable ties and/ or lever the trim off.

Place the jack in the recommended lifting point closest to the wheel to be removed. Ensure that the jack head engages correctly (as shown in the handbook) and extend the jack until it just starts to lift the car on its springs. Don't lift the car any further yet. Slacken off the wheel nuts/bolts (most turn anti-clockwise to undo) using the vehicle's wheel brace and locking wheel-nut adapter if required. (There might be a protective cover over locking wheel nuts). Keep your back straight and body weight evenly distributed on both feet. Apply effort downward and in a controlled way so that when the nut finally 'breaks' you won't lose your balance or fall over. You can achieve greater efficiency by applying controlled effort through the foot, but only if you can support your upper body.

#### Lifting the car

Raise the jack to lift the vehicle sufficiently

so that the wheel is just clear of the ground. Remove the slackened wheel nuts/bolts while keeping the wheel in position on the hub using a knee or toe - leave the top one until last so that both hands are free to lift the wheel away from the hub.

#### Fitting the spare

Fitting the spare is the reverse of the removal procedure - secure the wheel by refitting the top bolt/nut first, and tighten all the nuts by hand first in stages and in a diagonal sequence. Don't oil the bolts/nuts before refitting them, as this will make them more likely to work lose. Carefully lower the wheel to make contact with the ground before fully tightening the wheel nuts - again in diagonal sequence. Stow the damaged wheel safety. Replace it in the carrier or boot well.

#### And finally

If the spare is a temporary-use 'skinny' spare, note any restrictions on use - they're typically limited to 50mph and should be replaced with a normal tyre as soon as possible. Some dashboard lights may come on while a space saver spare is used because systems like ABS, traction control and some automatic gearboxes can be upset by odd tyre sizes. Check/adjust the pressure in the 'new' tyre as soon as possible get the wheel nuts tightened to the correct torque figure as soon as possible replace or repair the damaged tyre as soon as possible.

# **AVOIDING CAR PARK CRASHES!**

To avoid car park fender benders and the hassle of a car insurance claim, the AA have put together the following motoring advice:

- Slow down. It's a car park not a race track!
- Be patient. Impatience will only lead to careless driving.
- Turn off your car radio when in car parks. It'll distract you and you won't hear other vehicles.
- Give reversing the car your full attention. Don't be checking your texts, tuning the radio or programming your car's SatNav when pulling out of your car parking space. Check and check again that you're clear to reverse your vehicle. And don't forget to check if there's someone about to pull out of the car parking bay directly behind you or else you could have a case of bumper cars on your hands.
- Don't squeeze into a parking space which barely allows you to open your car doors just for the sake of being closer the shops. You'll only end up scratching your car of those either side
- Use your indicators. Although not on a main road, you still need to let other drivers know which way you're turning your vehicle.
- Ask your children to be quiet when parking the car.





# **LEGION GAA CLUB**

### WHERE ARE THEY NOW

Last week, with it being the week that it was I jetted off to the Big Apple to make off former great clubman Sean "The Shining "Brosnan and take in a bit of the St Patricks day festivities in New York at the same time. Sean arranged for us to meet at a little Irish place in midtown Manhattan just far enough away from the hustle and bustle so as to have a bit of comfort. Seans wife Christine, who is originally from the Bronx joined us along with their beautiful daughters, Erin, 16, twins Carolyn and Shannon 14, and Maura who is 11. Sean, who hails from Hibernian House in New St. Killarney was born to parents Jack and Maura on January 20th 1961 only minutes after his twin sister Marie, who he still likes to tease about being his older sister and he has two older brothers Padraig and Donal, both of whom are still very much involved in Legion activities and I could tell during the course of our conversation that Sean really looked up to his two brothers, both as footballers and as a role model. When I asked Sean if he lived nearby, he told me that he now lives upstate in Valhalla in Westchester near a place called "Legion Drive", he laughs as he says how ironic it was to travel thousands of miles to find a streetname close to his heart. Sean left Killarney for New York in 1983 at the the tender age of age of 22 but not before giving great service to not just Legion but also to Killarney Athletic in soccer and St Brendans for Rowing. Sean also played schools football and was actually on the Kerry Vocational School team that won the All Ireland in 1978 playing alongside Ambrose O'Donovan, who captained that side and also former Kerry manager, Jack O'Connor. On the club front Sean had, as he says, a lot of near successes at underage level but was finally rewarded when he won a County U21 Championship playing with Killarney and recalls a funny story about that particular game where by having not being selected on the original starting fifteen, only for Pat Reen to pick up an injury on the Thursday before the final, he got notified that he would be starting and was to be given the job of marking the high flying Mike mcAuliffe, so when his mother found out that he was going to be starting, the first thing she did was to strip the sheets off the bed as she knew only too well that otherwise they would be torn to shreds as

Sean, on the night before all big games played the game in his sleep so his mother always had special sheets for pre game nights. He says that they often laughed about that years later. Sean played U21 for four years adding a second title in the process. Sean was also on a winning junior team around that time with teammates like Jimmy and Pat Reen, Genie Fogarty, Sean Murphy and the Lyne brothers. However, Sean was also on the losing side in a good few finals with quite a few of them being at the hands of Dr Crokes and he remembers some great rival players in Johnny O'Donoghue, Denis O'Donoghue and Colm Galvin whilst also mentioning his own clubmates Diarmuid and Donal O'Donoghue along with his two brothers as being his standout players of that time.

Sean's footballing reputation stood him in good stead when he decided to head off to USA with Tommy Montgomery and the Clare Gaa Club in New York taking Sean under his wing while he settled in his newly adopted hometown, with Sean repaying them with years of great displays and dedication, not only helping them to win two senior B New York Championships as a player [captain for the first one] during his time but also held the positions of club President along with being senior team manager and senior team selector at various stages down through the years. "Shining" recalls some great Sundays playing for Clare in Gaelic Park in the days when a lot of Kerry lads went out to New York for a weekend just to play football and over the years, he has played alongside the likes of Eoin Liston, Maurice Fitzgerald, Timmy Dowd, Brian Looney and Mike Murphy. At one stage he remembers fourteen of the starting team being from Kerry - The Clare Kingdom, he used to refer to them as. 

to winning friends or perhaps winning arguments, however it is at times necessary. Challenging anything to do with green energy or environmental causes in todays world is akin to supporting elder abuse or paedophilia. In itself this attitude has become a charter for extraordinary concessions to be granted to industries operating in this area. Planning permissions for wind turbines on skylines was a foregone conclusion, no other industry could be so presumptuous or so successful in their applications. Let me say at the outset that if individuals wish to invest in such technologies it is their own business and they have a right to a fair hearing.. But it must always be recognised that these companies are commercial entities and the public good is not their responsibility.It is not their job to make a balanced submission or offer impartial information or advice. That is the job of public representatives, civil servants and ultimately those affected by proposed turbines. There is an issue which has not been dealt with properly in the past and that is the location of these turbines. Last week a Cork couple whose life has been turned upside down by the siting of a wind farm, only 520 metres from their house, told their story on this page and that story raises very

fundamental questions, once again, about the quality of regulation on this island. The rights of the general public should have been paramount in the drafting of regulations, particularly those of the people living in the immediate vicinity of the proposed wind farms. This did not happen last time around.. During the past week the Irish Doctors Environmental Association called on Environment Minister Alan Kelly to review the wind energy planning guidelines, with particular reference to noise levels and distance of turbines from dwelling houses. They say maximum noise levels are currently four times those acceptable to the World Health Organisation (WHO) and that a minimum distance of 1500 metres should be observed from houses. The 500 metres currently in force is not sufficient. The submission validates everything Pat and Claire outlined here last week. The damage done to human health from the current guidelines was stated and it is significant. The words used in their submission are impulsive, intrusive and incessant. The reality is that the sleep deprivation caused by exposure to badly sited wind farms has serious repercussions for those affected. Professor Alun Evans of Queens University says that children deprived of sleep in this fashion exhibit impaired learning ability and are more likely to end up obese. Adults similarly deprived are at increased risk of heart attacks, stroke, cognitive dysfunction and mental problems. When Pat and Claire tried to raise their concerns over the years absolutely nobody wanted to listen. Finally in order to protect their families health they left their own home. The problem has not gone away and it is incumbent on rural dwellers to ensure that new wind developments are sited, as the doctors said, a minimum 1500 metres from rural dwellings. There are still plenty of sites available for turbines. **By Tommy Roche.**

# **FARMERS MUST BE** ALLOWED TO MAXIMISE **GLAS PAYMENTS**

IFA Rural Development Chairman, Flor McCarthy has said that farmers must be given every opportunity to maximise their payments under the GLAS scheme.

Speaking following a meeting with the Department of Agriculture in Athlone, Flor McCarthy said that the splitting of parcel issue between area based and linear measures must be resolved so that farmers can pick the most appropriate measures to secure the maximum payment. The Rural Development Chairman said that the Minister for Agriculture must now make a clear statement that the GLAS scheme will open again in autumn for those farmers who will be in a better position to maximise their payments following their 2015 BPS application.

# MCCORMACK SAYS "CLEAR ONUS" ON IDB TO KEEP UPWARD TREND OF INDEX GOING

The decision of the Irish Dairy Board to increase the Purchasing Price Index for first time since December 2013 following 12 consecutive declines is a welcome development and shows further signs of returning confidence in the dairy product market, according to Mr. Pat McCormack, Chairperson of ICMSA's Dairy Committee. "It's just as significant that other market indicators are positive including the Global Dairy Trade Auction - which rose for the sixth consecutive time including two separate substantial increases of 10.1% and 9.4%. We'd be looking as well as the kind of gains made by specific products at the most recent GDT auction, where cheddar increased by 10.8%, SMP increased by 5.9% and butter by 2.5. There is a clear onus on the IDB - given their sales of premium products - to guarantee the upward trend of the index in the coming months by ensuring full returns are gained from the market", concluded Mr. McCormack.

# IFA ACCUSES MINISTER BURTON OF HOUNDING FARMERS ON FARM ASSIST

IFA Rural Development Chairman Flor McCarthy has accused the Minister for Social Protection Joan Burton of hounding farmers on Farm Assist with new and more rigorous means testing. The assessment is failing to take account of the volatility in farm incomes resulting in farmers' payments having been cut back or removed totally.

Flor McCarthy said that the Department of Social Protection had introduced this reassessment procedure without any consultation. The new form that farmers are being asked to fill out is more onerous and is not taking account of the costs associated with farming. He is now calling on Minister Burton to withdraw this flawed assessment document.

The IFA Rural Development Chairman said that Farm Assist is a vital support to low income farmers. Currently, around 10,000 farmers receive support worth €95m from the scheme. The scheme has suffered over the last number of years when the income disregards were removed in the 2011 and 2012 Budgets.

Flor McCarthy said, "The scheme must be capable of dealing with the changing farm income environment and the means test must be done a fair and accurate way".

IFA has sought an urgent meeting on this issue so that when the assessment is done, the farmer is confident that it takes account of the overall situation on the farm.





#### U.S. TINY BUG THREATENS **AVOCADO SUPPLY:**

Californian farmers already dealing with drought and high water prices are now battling a mysterious beetle that's destroying their trees.

The polyphagous shot hole borer is no bigger than a sesame seed and so new to the U.S. that entomologists at first struggled to identify it, but the damage it can wreak is huge. The beetle is drawn to 138 tree species and it attacks 13 agricultural crops, but can only reproduce on avocado trees.

Trees on about 1,000 acres in San Diego have been infected in just a few months. That represents 5% of the county's avocado groves. Researchers expect those trees to die, based on what happened in Israel when the beetle invaded groves in that country.

California grows 95% of the United States' avocados.

\* One of the lions used as the Logo of the Metro-Goldwyn-Meyer Film Sudios was Cairbre and he came from Dublin Zoo. The lion was born there in 1927 and was named after Cú Chulainn's charioteer. He became famous the world over as the mascot for Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer (MGM). The man who was responsible for bringing Cairbre to the big screen was Cedric Gibbons who worked for Sam Goldwyn,

Cedric Gibbons was born in Dublin in 1823 and emigrated to the US, he was considered MGM's top set designer from the twenties right on through the fifties, working on over 1,500 films. Mr. Gibbons was also the man who designed the first Oscar which was modelled on his future wife, Delores Del Rio, besides designing the coveted prize, Mr. Gibbons managed to win a dozen of them himself.

Cairbre is a medieval Irish name which means 'charioteer'. It was borne by a number of mythological figures including Cairbre, son of Ogma, a poet and satiricist of the Tuatha Dé Danann and Cairbre Nia Fer, a legendary Ulster warrior.

#### **GOOD NEWS:**

A beloved pit bull, with an unmistakable face and an awe-inspiring story has passed away. When this dog named "Oogy," was a 16 week old puppy, he was used as a bait dog in the blood-lust sport of dog fighting. Half his head, including his ear was bitten off and his jaw partially crushed. He was then thrown in to a cage to bleed to death. He was found and rescued after approximately a week. The vet did not know whether he would make it.

But somehow he survived and he went on to become a symbol of courage and resilience after being adopted by the Levin family.

Oogy's face was disfigured from the trauma of his violent past - but his family loved him unconditionally - until his dying breath. Many people from around the world fell in love with the gentle dog after owner Larry Levin wrote a best-selling book titled, "Oogy: The Dog Only a Family Could Love."

Mr. Levin said immediately after his death "We covered Oogy with kisses. He kissed us back. This morning I fed Oogy a bison filet. I put moisturiser on his big fat nose and drops in his

eyes so they wouldn't itch, just like I do every day, and I put his warm orange coat on him, the one that Linda gave him, and we went for a ride. He kept our spirits up through the whole ordeal but he's gone from us. He didn't suffer.

We went through so much together and I can't tell you how much he meant to me. He gave me the life I have. He brought me joy every single day for the last 12 years. Every single day. Think about that. I know this profound sadness is inevitable, and I don't know how the hole will be filled, or even if it can be, but I wouldn't have had it any other way".

Messages of love, sympathy and anguish have been pouring into the Facebook group, 'Oogy the amazing dog who has touched so many hearts', since the sad news was released.

A bait dog is a dog that dog fighters make their fighting dogs practice on. The bait dog is made helpless by having it's jaw taped shut and it may also be tied down.

These dogs cannot defend themselves and are terribly injured or killed. Dog fighters are known to use cats with their claws and teeth torn out in advance and rabbits as bait animals too.

Dog fighters acquire bait animals in a variety of ways. They steal people's pets, they respond to "free to good home" adverts, they obtain the animals from pounds, shelters, rescues and other re-homing organisations, and they trap wild and feral animals.

Dogs that are not willing to fight, or no good at fighting, are also used as bait dogs.

Dog fighting is illegal in Ireland. Unfortunately, that does not stop it happening, it just happens in secret.

In the fight the dogs are badly wounded, suffering heavy bleeding, ruptured lungs, broken bones, and other life threatening injuries. If the losers of these matches do not die of their injuries, they are tortured to death for humiliating their owners. The only rare exception is if the owners feel the dogs are worth trying to salvage because they make them money.

If you have any animal of any age for rehoming and do not know the people that are willing to offer it a "home" please do the decent thing and get a Vet to put it to sleep, it might be heart breaking in the short term but you will rest easy knowing your pet is not being slowly tortured to death.

# **BIRDS HELP CONTROL GARDEN**

A Gardeners worst nightmare is watching helplessly as hordes of destructive insects attack your plants. With a little planning and simple landscaping, however, you can help moderate garden pests naturally in your yard. Your weapon: bug-eating birds. During the late spring and summer months, insects make up the great majority of many avian species' diets. The trick to enticing these birds to your



property, first to learn which of them range in your area, and then to plant appropriate types of native cover that provide insect- and bird-attracting natural foods--leaves, fruit, pollen and nectar--to sustain both adults and their insect-dependent nestlings. The most important thing to do to attract birds to your yard is to provide an enticing habitat, not just a nest box. Birds choose a nest site based on its surrounding habitat.

Along with native vegetation, offer birds a water source and a few different nesting sites: brush piles, ledges, nest boxes, shrubs and various types of trees--including dead tree limbs and trunks. As long as they don't create a safety hazard for people, dead trees provide nesting areas and are a great food source for insectivores.

Needless to say, birds will not completely rid your yard of insects, and even if they could, you wouldn't want them to do so. Some insects are imperative for a healthy garden, and birds do not discriminate between destructive and beneficial bugs. But they can help keep insect populations in your neighbourhood at a stable, balanced level, benefiting both you and your neighbours. Subsequently, you'll have a nicer garden to show for it throughout the summer.

### A FULLY FUNCTIONING MOBILE HYGIENE BUS FOR HOMELESS IN THE ALBUOUEROUE AREA?

State Rep. Stephanie Maez (D), who represents a section of Albuquerque, recently introduced a bill that would put \$200,000 toward constructing and deploying a former bus equipped with showers and restrooms. HB 585 would fund a pilot project for one year, tracking data on usage, staffing, and expenses to run the bus.

At last count, there were 1,170 homeless individuals living in Albuquerque. More than 10% of them were children, and an even larger percentage were war veterans.

Restrooms can be a difficult challenge for officials trying to balance the desire to prevent public urination and defecation with the fact that bodily functions don't magically cease to exist for homeless people. Many cities lack a

sufficient number of public restrooms to serve their homeless populations, and most have even fewer (if any) public showers.

With no bathroom of their own and few public options, the result is entirely expected: people have no choice but to go in public. But rather than providing more facilities for the homeless, most governments are instead seeking to throw people in jail for needing to use the bathroom.

# **Know Your Rights: GETTING MARRIED ABROAD**

**MARCH 2015** 

#### OUESTION

My partner and I are getting married next year. We are planning to travel abroad for the ceremony. What do we need to do?

#### **ANSWER**

If either your or your partner are Irish citizens and you are thinking of getting married outside Ireland, the legal validity of your marriage is governed, in part, by the laws of the country in which you marry. In most, if not all cases, the legal formalities abroad are very different to those in Ireland. For example, a Church marriage abroad is usually a purely religious ceremony with no legal effect. Because it is not recognised in law in the country in which it takes place, it cannot be regarded as a legal marriage in Ireland. This is the case even though a marriage in the same church or denomination in Ireland is legally binding. This is because the religious ceremony is recognised in Ireland as a civil contract.

It is very important, therefore, that you make sure to meet all the legal requirements of the country you are marrying in. You should contact the civil registration office in that country to find out what is required. You may decide to have a civil marriage in Ireland followed by a religious ceremony abroad.

Although you must meet the foreign requirements, you are still bound by Irish law as far as the capacity to marry is concerned. For example, your marriage abroad will not be recognised under Irish law if one or both of you was ordinarily resident in Ireland and one or both of you was aged under 18 at the time of the marriage and did not have a Court Exemption Order.


Marriages that take place outside the State are not normally registered in Ireland. They are usually registered in the country where they occur. Your foreign marriage certificate will usually be accepted for official purposes in Ireland if you need to show evidence that you are married. If the certificate is in a foreign language, you must provide an official translation or a translation from a recognised translation agency.

You may require a Certificate of Freedom to Marry to get married in some foreign countries. This may also be called "Certificate de Coutume" or "Certificate of Nulla Osta". You apply online to the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade for a Certificate of Freedom to Marry.
