

fter raising an amazing €47,874 by running a After raising an amazing content of the marathon in October, Patrick Eviston is set to take on the Cork City Marathon on Monday June 5th in aid of the **Kerry Cancer Support Group.** 

Patrick, who recently undertook the Vancouer Marathon has now set his sights on the Cork City Marathon.

When the family, Patrick, his son Erik and daughter Alannah decided to fundraise in memory of their beloved wife and mother, Linda Lucey Eviston who lost her brave battle with cancer in October 2020, they were blown away by the support the marathon received, raising almost €48,000 for the Irish Cancer Society, specifically, the palliative care night nursing service for families, caring for their loved ones at home. "The nurse's support and compassion is

indispensable", Patrick said and we wanted to support clinical trials for new cancer treatments. These trials offer hope for patients when all other treatments are exhausted", he added.

"I decided to continue to fundraise in Linda's memory following the success of the marathon in October", Patrick told Killarney Outlook.

"This time I am concentrating on raising funds for the Kerry Cancer Support Group which is an amazing charity who ensure that nobody should face their cancer journey alone", Patrick said.

They have been providing healthlink transport and related supports for the last 11 years. In that time they have transported over 6.000 service users to nearly 50.000 appointments and have become affectionately known as a travelling support group. 2) To maintain the Trust as a permanent legacy of Kevin

3) To sustain the Trust by having on-going fundraising activities.

4) To recruit members of the Trust to sustain its purpose and ideals. The trust appreciate any donations which will tremendously help other families who find themselves in such difficult circumstances.

### BACK ON THE ROAD

After a three year absence the Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle Committee are delighted to announce that this great event will take place on July 2nd, 2022.

The first ever Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle took place 40 years ago when a small group of Killarney cyclists had an idea to cycle the Ring of Kerry to raise money for charity. Today, the vision hasn't changed but the enormity and success of the event has grown exponentially. This fundraising event brings together thousands of cyclists making it Ireland's largest one day charity cycle event and has raised over €17 million for 160 Charity and Voluntary Community Organisations making a powerful and meaningful impact for people in need across our communities.

The great news is that we are "Back on the Road" for real on Saturday, July 2nd, 2022 and Registration will open via the website on February 14th at 12 noon. Last year, whilst we did not run the event in its usual format, cyclists from all over the country registered for the "Ring of Kerry Cycle 170 kms My Way" cycling the distance in their own neighbourhoods and fundraised via the iDonate platform for their selected Charities.

Tony Daly, Acting Chair of the organising committee says "The cycling community of Kerry and beyond are so thrilled and so looking forward to coming back and feeling the energy and excitement of the day. It is always such a special time, perhaps best described as a Carnival for cyclists and their families and the many volunteers who gather year after year to be part of this great day. We have come a long way from those early days when cyclists dusted off their push bikes, no helmets or lycra then, and you were doing well if you had a gear on your bike! Van loads of volunteers would follow

and with buckets in hand they could collect up to €15,000 on the day. The principal has not changed and this year we will be supporting six charities, four specific to Kerry and two national and we hope we can raise a €1,000,000 Euro for the nominated charities"

In years past the event has seen 10,000 and more cyclists participate, for safety and to better manage the catering this year's cycle will be restricted to 8,000 cyclists and with a significant number of registered cyclists already on the books deferred from 2020/21

- Cathal Walshe PRO of ROKCC commented "we know there will pent up demand for this years cycle, so it will be a case of "the early bird catches the worm" so cyclists be on the ready when Registration Opens at 12 noon on Valentine's Day!"

Cyclists signing up to complete the scenic 170 km fun cycle, will be raising money for 6 carefully selected main beneficiary charities this year and choosing one to fundraise for. Funds raised to date have contributed towards new hospital extensions, special needs facilities,

care for the elderly, suicide prevention, sea and mountain rescue, cancer, kidney and end of life support and more.



### **CRACKDOWN ON SHORT TERM LETTING** "A WITCH HUNT"

Someone needs to ask how it is at all acceptable in tourist town Killarney - a town built on enterprise in a small and often add on way how it is that people can now be hounded out of this type of home grown business?

There are signs, Brendan Cronin, Killarney the councillor, was one of the first nationally. policy is beginning to highlight the unfairness of to be questioned, and not before time.

Brendan Cronin, Killarney councillor, was one of the first to highlight

the unfairness of it in Killarney and has to his great credit been pursuing the matter relentlessly.

He has called the crackdown on short term letting "a witch hunt".

Some 187 "warning letters" have been sent by Kerry County Council to Airbnb operators and other short term tourist lets in Killarney Municipal District. The urban area of Killarney is being targeted particularly with a number of property owners likely to be hauled into court for daring to let an apartment or a couple of rooms. And this is happening in Killarney, a town built on the efforts of women running b&bs, long before the modern notion of airbnbs!

( Some of our many high minded solicitors in Killarney must surely be chomping at the bit to take a constitutional case on interference with private property rights)

The council can be said to be simply implementing the cack-handed rent pressure zone legislation which is meant to free up private accommodation for long term letting. Of course we won't mention that the crisis in long term is because of the failure to build enough social and affordable housing either for those living here with generations, or the very many now being invited to live here.

(The pressure on small private operators is unlikely to ease if Sinn Fein gets into Government as they will especially target private property for the common good)

Cllr Cronin says Kerry County Council are "the whipping boy" here - obliged to implement legislation suitable for the cities but not for tourist towns.

"It should be reviewed. They are going to lose on the double - the policy will not work in Killarney as people do not want to long-term

let. And people providing accommodation for tourists in Killarney are going to get out of the market," he said.

The money from the short term letting makes up "a critical part" of the income of many families in Killarney as well as providing much sought after accommodation in the tourist town.

Several people have told him they are either going to sell or mothball the property.

By the way, the distress felt by honest people in receipt of those warning letters, and in the midst of a very trying pandemic too for everyone should not be underestimated, we hardly need to remind the enforcers.

Meanwhile of the figures released to Cllr Cronin, only twelve of the 187 have actually switched to long term letting - proof if ever there was one that the national policy is not working in Killarney

But what is most worrying is that 39 so far have pulled out of any type of letting.



There is some progress we are told on one part of what is being called the cycle and walkway the Lough Leane Loop, on the Dinis to Torc section which of course is around the Muckross lake. The fire of last year has interrupted the sensitive and key Dinis to Tomies section, and the Fossa / Gap side is stalled over failure so far to reach agreement with landowners.

A visit to Dunboyne and County Meath recently in which I did the Hill of Tara, (finally), Newgrange and the Battle site of the Boyne got me thinking how full of history from the most ancient to the most modern County Meath is.

I had not seen half of it, and a return visit is much anticipated.

How full of history Killarney is too, except we seem to be too blinded by our spectacular scenery to acknowledge it properly or even to profit from it.

The Hill of Tara is not in great shape, it has to be said, with people running up and down over the hill of the hostages and the coronation stone hurled against by photographers!

There isn't a path anywhere and some of the rings of the forts have been clearly damaged and you really would want waterproof shoes

site that attracts, believe it or not, 200,000 a year.

We have lots of history in Killarney in a mix of private and public ownership. It is just as ancient and as up to the moment. Driving them would be a pleasure as in Co Meath. Driving loops we could consider could take in Milltown's neolithic tombs, the Dunloe ogham stones, the stone circles at Lissivigeen, a stop at the Copper Mines, Aghadoe and a view of the Inisfallen monastery and Muckross Abbey, before heading to the Victorian era Muckross House.

While we are speaking of "drives" Cllr Donal Grady made a very interesting interjection at this week's county council meeting about the traffic situation in Killarney.

"Killarney is now a slow moving car park," he said.

As with mayor of Killarney, Marie Moloney previously, Donal is calling for badly needed electronic boards to tell people where the car spaces are and how many there are available. It is not rocket science and surely it can be done before July?

There is no indication yet when the park and ride as inserted now into the county development plan might be realized. However it cannot be soon enough. The town's appearance is suffering badly with vast areas like Beech Road and Fair Hill and the Glebe full of cars. So much surface parking is not the most sightly image in a tourist town. A local has put forward to me the suggestion that now that the outlet centre has changed hands might it be a good idea to build a large multi-storey car park there?

# KILLARNEY SCHOOLS WIN AT ANNUAL YOUNG SOCIAL INNOVATORS OF THE YEAR AWARDS

Two Killarney schools were honoured at the Young Social Innovators of the Year Ireland (YSI) Awards for their positive impact in helping to create a more equal, fair and sustainable world.

Picking up the national Bronze Award, the team from St. Brigid's Secondary School, Killarney was recognised for its Operation Red project. The team's focus was on raising awareness about the lack of knowledge surrounding menstrual disorders and encouraging an open discussion on these issues, so no woman ever feels alone. Concerned about misinformation on social media platforms in relation to dealing with menstrual disorders, the team aimed to educate their peers about their reproductive health, highlight some of the most common warning signs that can potentially disrupt daily life, and signpost available supports should they be needed.

The team will receive a prize bursary of €750, which can be put towards developing their idea and increasing the impact of their innovation. Picking up the Make Our World Safer Award, a team from St. Brendan's College, Killarney was recognised for its One Punch Can Kill project, which aims to combat toxic masculinity and raise awareness amongst young men of the seriousness of 'one punch attacks'. When researching the issue, the team found that many perpetrators rarely reoffend and the

percentage of male-on-male violence in society is extremely high. The group examined the route cause of the issue, which stems from a variety of factors, and wanted to raise awareness that spontaneous and random 'one punch attacks' can have serious and life-changing consequences. Amongst its many actions, the team embarked on media outreach, designed and delivered student workshops, created a poster campaign, held an Anti Violence Week and is currently working on a children's book in an effort to promote the important message that 'One Punch Can Kill'.

Today's Awards ceremony was compered by Virgin Media's Zara King along with former Hometown member, and YSI Speak Out Tour Host, Dayl Cronin. ### KERRY FESTIVAL REACHES OUT TO UKRAINE AND ITS PEOPLE

A Kerry festival has devised an innovative and practical way to support Ukraine by booking and paying a highly-rated act from the war-torn country but fully acknowledging that she will not be in a position to fulfill the engagement.

K-FEST 2022, a four-day festival that celebrates emerging artists and musicians, returns to the town of Killorglin on the June bank holiday weekend with an exciting roster of events.

The festival team has booked hip-hop star and songwriter Alyona Alyona to play in the Kerry town in the full knowledge that she won't be able to do so but the fee will still be forwarded to her.

Considered the top new rap star of Ukraine, in an article titled '15 European pop acts who matter right now' the New York Times likened Alyona Alyona to gifted American rapper Azealia Banks.

Festival Chairman Tim Clifford said K-FEST will reach out to those in Ukraine by booking and paying the star but not expecting her to honour the gig.

"We would encourage other festivals all over Europe, who are in the business of booking artists, to do likewise and support Ukrainian artists." he said.

The creative festival team will reach out to Ukraine at this year's festival and musicians and artists from that country, who were among those to flee to Ireland to avoid the conflict, will be invited to perform and fully participate alongside local artists.

In keeping with the theme, brilliant Dublin-based artist Aches – who specialises in large-scale murals and graffiti and is frequently referred to as the Irish Banksy – will transport his magnificent portable portrait of President Volodymyr Zelenskyy to Killorglin for the festival.

In patriotic shades of blue and yellow, the giant mural is currently on show at the Central Hotel on Exchequer Street in Dublin.

The Killorglin celebration of the arts, from June 3rd through to June 6th, will feature a gallery trail of over 70 visual artists, 30 live bands, spoken word artists, film, crafts, buskers, dancers, workshops, photographers, street entertainers and a myriad of family activities.

All the events at K-FEST are offered at no or low cost to the public and several unused buildings in the town will come alive as venues for the various activities.

Selected artists at K-FEST will show their work in curated, bespoke popup galleries in the town's disused commercial and private spaces and, to date, the festival has housed over 800 visual artists and approximately 4,000 original works of art.

With an anticipated attendance of more than 10,000 over the bank holiday weekend, K-FEST affords new and emerging performers the ability to showcase their work to a diverse audience, providing opportunities for patronage, partnerships and community building with fellow artists and local residents.

Engaging acts lined up include Lemonade Shoelace, Naked Lungs and Everything Shook while, also on the music front, the festival is collaborating with the BIMM Institute Dublin to bring seven student bands to K-FEST where they will perform and also have a live video production made.

The family and street programme this year will include buskers, art demos, a children's market, circus skills, science, yoga, dance and more. 

# GOOD EXAM TECHNIQUES WILL IMPROVE YOUR GRADES

IN THE STATE EXAMS

With the state exams on the horizon, it's time to focus on your exam techniques. By planning your approach to answering the exam papers you will perform better. Begin by highlighting your exam subjects on your personal copy of the exam timetable.

The State Examinations Commission (SEC) is gradually rolling out online marking. Twentyfive Leaving Cert. subjects and two Junior Cycle subjects will be marked online this year. To facilitate the scanning of the scripts, there are some changes to the appearance of both the exam papers and the stationery such as the addition of barcodes to the cover and to each page, L-shaped marks in the four corners of each page and 'hatching' along the centre spines. A new 36-page answerbook will be used in all Leaving Certificate subjects where a separate answerbook is required. In addition to the front cover and some instructions on page 2, the answerbook has 34 lined pages. Candidates must shade in fully the circle for the subject, the level, and the language that they are answering through. They must also fill in their exam number and date of birth on the front of the answerbook. Specimen answerbook and specimen exam paper design can be viewed at www.examinations.ie.

Be familiar, well in advance of each exam session, with the format of each paper you will be sitting. Know how the paper is presented. What topics are examined? How many questions must be answered? What styles of question can you expect on any exam paper? Familiarise yourself with the choice available on the paper. Are some questions compulsory or is there an open choice? Be careful with a paper, which is subdivided into subsections. Without prior knowledge of such a paper you could easily fail to address the relevant number of questions. Over the next few weeks, as you do past papers, and again at the exam, read the instructions carefully.

Write your answers in blue or black pen. Use pencil for graphs and diagrams and work neatly down the page. Write clearly and legibly. Use diagrams, sketches and illustrations if they enhance your answer. Use decent size diagrams, as they are quicker to draw and allow more detail. The presentation of your answering won't merit extra marks but a well-presented script makes a favourable impression on the corrector.

The core of any exam is the quality of your answering. The content of your answer must be relevant to the question asked. Read each question carefully before deciding which ones to answer. Tackle a good question first to settle you down. Before answering a question, list the key points around which you will build your answer. Be concise, accurate and relevant. Don't be long-winded or wordy. Waffle and repetition will not impress the corrector.

Doing well in any exam involves knowing the course material but also in presenting your answers within the time allowed. Attempt the required number of questions. If you don't attempt a question, you can't possibly earn any marks for it. Be familiar with the marking scheme for each paper and work out in advance the approximate time you can spend on each question. The time allocated to each question should be in direct proportion to the marks available for that question. The candidate who attempts the required number of questions is the one who has the best chance of maximising her/his grade in that subject.

When your exam paper is handed to you read the instructions. Then spend about five minutes reading the entire paper. This preliminary scrutiny of all the questions gives you the feel for the paper. It allows you to settle down and gather your thoughts. Stick to your own preprepared answering plan and once you have made your choice of questions, start with a question you can answer well. As you warm to your task, you will be pleasantly surprised at

the font of information that comes to mind, as you need it.

When you have finished answering each question, reread it to ensure you haven't omitted any part. Allow at least five minutes at the end of the exam to read back over your answers and to check your overall presentation.

#### **CHECKLIST**

- It's now time to focus on your answering strategy
- A planned approach to answering leads to success
- A well-presented script makes a favourable impression
- Number your questions clearly and write neatly and legibly
- Read the entire paper before deciding which questions you will answer
- Keep your answers concise, accurate and relevant
- Familiarise yourself with the logistics of each exam paper
- Be careful with a paper which is subdivided into subsections
- The time spent on a question must be in proportion to the marks for the question
- Proper allocation of time will enable you to attempt the required number of questions
- Reread the question when you have answered it to ensure you haven't left out a part
- Remain in the exam hall until the end of each session

### Killarney and the Arts World mou

A sense of shock, sadness and disbelief enveloped Killarney last weekend when the news broke that renowned actor, drama coach, playwright, producer, director and performer Donie Courtney had passed away after a short illness.

Donie was a director of The West End School of Acting, which was opened by his close friend Hollywood Actor and Killarney native Michael Fassbender.

In an emotional post on Social Media, Michael Fassbender paid tribute to his close friend and mentor Donie.

I met Donie when I was 17 years old. The encounter was something that would change my life immeasurably. We remained firm friends ever since

The first thing that struck me about Donie was how he engaged with me as a peer and not a teenager. He had a positivity to him that was absolutely infectious and an endless generosity both as a performer and human being. His talent was as much a force of nature as it was eminent. His sense of human nature was uncanny.

He would make himself the butt of the joke so everyone around him could gain confidence from it. He understood people's insecurities very well because he wore his own on his sleeve. Showing personal vulnerabilities so you could feel safe revealing yours. He was kind, just and honest, with a wicked sense of humour.

He is remembered by his family first and foremost, which for him was where his inspiration, joy and heart belonged. The rest of us will feel blessed and lucky for whatever time we've been able to share in his company.

West End House School of Arts is Donie's legacy and we will do our very best to honour him through our work in this unique Place that he created

For me he will always be my mentor. I will call on him in times of hardship and crisis and celebrate moments of joy with him. He stays with me always.

A native of Ardshanavooly, Donie is the son of the late Cllr. Michael Courtney and his wife Sheila, he is married to Adeline, and they have two chidren Fíla and Jonah.

Not only was Donie an accomplished actor with many productions under his belt, including RTE's Fair City and BBC's The Tudors, he was also a writer, producer and playwright.

He was known throughout Killarney through his involvement with youth clubs and the theatre company Bricriú.

He went on to study theatre at the Gaiety School of Acting and continued to work there as a tutor for many years.

In late 2012, Donie, contacted the O'Flaherty Society to advise them of his intentions to write, produce and perform a "one man play" on the life of Monsignor Hugh O'Flaherty.

Donie is the son of the son of society's founding Chairman the late Cllr Michael Courtney, and the group were delighted to assist him.

"The society learnt of Donie's untimely passing with great shocking sadness" Jerry O'Grady from the Society told Killarney Outlook.

From our archives and through the O'Flaherty family contacts, we assisted Donie with whatever background information we could source in his quest to produce "God Has No Country".

It was his intention to have the play ready for its Killarney Premiere during the Hugh O'Flaherty Memorial Week in late October 2013, to coincide with the 50th anniversary of the Monsignor's death and the unveiling of the Memorial on Mission Road. The title of the play would be the Monsignor's motto of "God Has No Country". True to his word, Donie performed his play for a three-night run in the Mangerton Room theatre at the Great Southern Hotel. It was a remarkable piece of writing and acting, attracting high praise from all who saw it.

Donal went on to perform "God Has No Country" around Ireland, the UK, Europe and the USA. This included a very special performance in Rome at the invitation of the Irish Ambassador to the Holy See. In February 2019, the play had its 100th performance during a short run at the INEC in Killarney. Prior to that performance, we presented Donie with one of Monsignor O'Flaherty's golf clubs. He makes extensive use of a golf club throughout the play and from



then on, he could do so with one used by the Monsignor during his golfing exploits in Rome and Kerry.

"Donie's last performance for us was during the June 2019 Memorial weekend when we presented the Hugh O'Flaherty Humanitarian Award to members of the Irish UN peacekeepers. The centrepiece of the Ceremony in St Mary's Church of Ireland was "God Has No Country", performed before Government Ministers and Officials, Defence Force Senior Staff Officers, UN Veterans and several foreign Ambassadors", Jerry O'Grady told Killarney Outlook.

Before the onset of Covid19 we were in regular contact with Donie, discussing his plans to extend the touring programme. Through his play he has dramatically extended the reach of the Hugh O'Flaherty story, in particular throughout the student population of Ireland. The members of the Memorial Society will greatly miss Donie – a true friend of the Society, using his great creative talent to help us spread awareness in a most unique way.

To his wife Adeline and his two young children and to his siblings and the wider Courtney family, we extend our deepest Sympathies and sincere Condolences. A master dramatist has left us, but his legacy remains.



Kerry publicans have been urged to sign up to the first ever apprenticeship to train a new generation of bar managers, launched to tackle the crippling shortage of hospitality staff.

The three-year degree course, backed by State and employer funding, has been officially unveiled.

The Vintners' Federation of Ireland (VFI) and Griffith College, with the support of Solas, the state agency for further education, have joined forces to reverse the pub sector's post-Covid struggle to retain staff.

A Fáilte Ireland survey released in February indicated that as many as nine out of ten hospitality businesses have problems recruiting staff, with many employers linking the shortage to a lack of training.








#### WHY SHOULD YOU REVIEW YOUR PENSION?

- 1. To check the performance of your pension and what funds you are invested in. This is VERY IMPORTANT, for example, if your pension is investedin high risk funds your total pension fund could substantially reduce over a short period of time and if you are coming close to retirement this could result in you having much less of a pension when you retire.



#### COMMON EYE CONDITIONS

#### Glaucoma

Glaucoma represents a number of eye conditions where the optic nerve at the back of the eye is damaged. It is often asymptomatic and is often linked to raised pressure within the eye.

When the nerve is damaged, it starts to cause problems with peripheral vision and, if left untreated, can cause permanent damage.

#### Cataract

A cataract happens when either all or part of the lens in the eye becomes cloudy. There are different types of cataract, but the most common is age-related cataract.

Cataracts are very common, being the main cause of impaired vision in the world. If left untreated they can lead to partial or total sight loss.

Cataracts are very easily diagnosed by optometrists.

#### Age-related macular degeneration Age-related macular degeneration

(AMD) affects the central part of the vision and is caused by damage to the macular region of the eye, which is the part of the retina that provides high-resolution, central vision.

There are two main types of AMD - dry and wet. AMD is the most common cause of sight-impairment that affects older people.

#### Dry Eye

Dry eye syndrome is a common condition that occurs when the eyes do not produce enough tears or they evaporate too quickly.

Dry eye can lead to the eye becoming red, swollen and irritated, and in certain cases cause considerable discomfort for the sufferer. In very rare cases dry eye can be a sight threatening condition.

#### Red eve

Red eye comprises a number of conditions such as conjunctivitis or burst blood vessels in the eye and are usually nothing to be unduly concerned about.

However, if the eye is painful this could be a sign of something more serious such as iritis (inflammation) or acute glaucoma.

While the majority of red eye conditions are short-term issues, they could be a symptom of other more serious conditions, such as acute glaucoma which is medically urgent and could result in loss of sight in that eye.

#### Watery eye (epiphora)

Watery eye is a condition that is usually caused either by tears not draining correctly from the eye or, paradoxically, as a result of an underlying dry eye condition which results in irritation.

This can cause blurred vision, sore eyelids, swelling and vision impairment. Severe cases of watery eye can cause significant discomfort for sufferers.





## KERRY SEE OFF TOOTHLESS CORK

Munster Semi-Final: Kerry 1-16 Cork 0-5

A Thursday night game is an awkward one for print deadlines. I couldn't preview it as even the panels hadn't been released (it's almost impossible to preview the U17's first game anyway – with the U18s, you had the U16 and minor leagues and championships, the development squads, the Corn Uí Mhuirí, and most of them were playing senior with their clubs). By the time you are reading this, you'll know whether we are playing Cork or Tipperary in the Munster Final; at time of writing, I don't. It'd make a decent plot for a Doctor Who episode, now that I think about it.

Michael O'Brien's Cork charges were absolutely blown away by Kerry in the first game for either side in the Munster Minor Championship. It's no secret that Cork football is on a downer at the moment – when their seniors are beaten by 12 points by their old enemy, and people are happy that Cork put up a battle....well, that's not exactly a ringing endorsement. The silver lining, we are told, that they have revamped their underage structures and are building towards a better future. On the evidence of this game, we'll be waiting a fair while. I'm always sceptical of such pronouncements anyway promises about the future are always easier that creating improvements in the shorter term.

The thing is, I don't think James Costello will be thrilled with Kerry's performance either. Flattering scoreline, facile opposition....but I thought there were plenty of cracks to work on. Let's face it, both sides were incredibly defensive for the opening quarter. God be with the days when we used to lambast Tyrone for their blanket defence – they looked like high wire thrill junkies compared top either side here early. I understand the need for it, you can't really kick adventurous ball into a massed defence – but it's undeniably ugly football to watch.

In fairness to Kerry, they were facing a very strong wind in that first half. But seventeen minutes for the first score from play? Ah, no. You'd be tempted to switch over to the

Eurovision Song Contest - and there's a statement I never thought I'd make. A worry for me, and a huge one, was that on those very rare occasions when Cork players decided to run at our pack ranks of defenders, they got through them far too easily. It felt to me like defenders who would have attacked the ball in a oneon-one situation were much too comfortable standing off when they had team-mates in numbers. It's all very well understanding that you have to close down channels, but please remember that actually putting in a tackle is a little bit important as well. On one occasion Cork corner forward Mark Kelleher went past no less than seven Kerry players, none of whom laid a hand on him. I actually wanted him to score – I wanted an important lesson learned sharpish. Instead, for some reason, he turned around and passed backwards, something Cork were doing all night. It was almost as if they were told that actually shooting for a score is always the wrong option. Hey, I'm antipollution myself and support and encourage recycling, but this was a tiny bit ridiculous.

Kerry were a bit more eager at the other end – only a bit. Jack Clifford imposed himself very well on the game, and a foul on the excellent Fionn Murphy (black cat, black kitten, mar a deireann an seanfhocal) saw Cormac Dillon open the scoring. Cork replied in kind after Darragh Gough won a free for Olan O'Donovan. Clifford was involved again as Dillon confidently kicked over his second free, but again O'Donovan responded. Brian Hayes slotted over a long distance free....Hollywood are not going to buy the rights to this movie.

Jack Clifford with a pass into Paddy Lane, and the Mounthawk star smoothly split the posts. A point from play! I'd suggest that they should count double, but of course it would only increase defensive fouling.

Cork were beginning to creak, though – Kerry's work-rate was impressive. Dillon punished afoul on Niall Collins and then an off-the-ground slip. Then came the game's magic moment. Fionn Murphy made a good interception as Cork tried to break out and slipped it to Paddy Lane before they could get that defensive screen back in place. Cormac Dillon timed his run well, gathered, and finished beautifully to the net. A very good goal.

If this was a children's story, this is the point where I'd say "and they all lived happily ever after". Once Kerry had that lead, Cork had to come out and hunt scores, and that game suited Kerry far more, as evidenced by Lane getting the space to coolly notch his second point.

Half-time Kerry 1-6 Cork 0-3

Kerry had the wind now, and Cormac Dillon kicked the opening score of the second half. Brian Hayes won and converted a free. And then we can switch the match report into fast forward mode, as Kerry kicked seven points on the trot. Cormac and Paddy had two each, with Clifford, John Burke (he impressed me a lot) and Darren Allman all on target as well. To be fair, it took a stunning save by Shay O'Meara to deny Alan O'Connell a Cork goal. Would that have made a difference? Arrah no. Brian Hayes pointed a last free for Cork (seriously, no score from play? I normally try to watch these games twice, because you often spot new things the second time around. There is zero chance of that happening). Dillon, deservedly, closed out the scoring with a brace, the final point one of the best of a night with few enough highlights. To be fair, this was a long way from Cork's full hand. Their hurling contingent (they have four dual players this year) will be available plus at least two players who were injured will more like ly be available. Kerry's 2019 minors beat Cork first day by a cricket score and won a fairly tough battle in the Munster Final... but Cork won that All Ireland. This Cork team have that kind of potential if they open up in attack a bit more. Last night's game against a Tipperary side with three wins already under their belt will have been a serious banana skin for them (minor teams improve hugely over a couple of games), but I'll expect us to be facing a different and more battle-hardened Cork on our next pouting.

Easy win for Kerry, I was slightly less enamoured by the display. But throw in the likes of Colin Browne in defence, dual stars Evan Boyle (Liam's son) and Odhrán (Mairtín's son)around the middle, and South Kerry sharpshooter lan O'Sullivan into the mix, and I think this could be a very potent brew. Early days.

#### LIMERICK TO MEET KERRY IN MUNSTER FINAL

Funny how wheels turn. A decade ago Tipperary looked like growing into a real power in football. They had beaten a star-studded Kerry side in the 2010 Munster U21 Final to lift the Corn na Casca for the first time. A Tipperary minor team that included Colin O'Riordan and Michael Ouinlivan had beaten Dublin in the 2011 Minor All Ireland Final (eight of that Dublin team won multiple All Irelands at senior).

Limerick have simply never had that kind of pedigree. But last weekend it was Limerick who pulled away from Tipperary in the second half to win by 2-10 to 0-10 to qualify for the Munster Football Final, while Tipperary will play Carlow in the opening round of the Taillteann Cup. Cordal's Seán O'Connell was excellent for Tipperary, while Firies' Pádraig de Brún came off the bench late on for Limerick.

I remember Limerick giving us a very real frights in 1991 and 2010. Speedsters Stephen Lucey and Stephen Kelly were deadly threats in Mickey Ned O'Sullivan's 2010 side, while midfielder John Galvin not getting an All Star that year remains one of the sorrowful mysteries of the GAA. Will this be a classic to match that encounter?

Arrah, no. Look, I'll write a proper preview beforehand, but for now I'll just say that I don't see Limerick putting up a big challenge to Kerry. While this was a momentous win for them, guaranteeing that they will be one of the last twelve teams standing (who would have predicted that at the start of the year?), this wasn't a good game of football. Both teams were very negative in approach and ultra defensive. We all know at this stage that it increases effectiveness, but at the cost of entertainment . Limerick were the better side and pulled away in the second half, but without ever looking like they would have the firepower to trouble Kerry.

That's not good for us. The last thing we want is an easy Munster Final; we got a harsh reminder of the real cost of that when an untested Kerry came up against a battle-hardened Tyrone last year. This year teams through the back door will have played more recently than us and met tougher opposition (the introduction of the Taillteann Cup takes those teams out of the Sam Maguire back door).

Incidentally, we all know that the Manager of the Year will have a team in the All Ireland Final, and that won't be Limerick, but I hope that Billy Lee is at least in that achievement. When it comes to Team or Manager of the Year, I genuinely believe that it should be about expectations surpassed rather than achievements. Limerick getting promoted to Division Two and reaching a Munster Final? I have no doubt that if Billy Lee met the likes of Jack O'Connor, James Horan, or Brian Dooher tomorrow morning, he'd politely pick their brains. But I have no doubt that the reverse is also true.

#### **HURLING**

Offaly Goals End Kerry Hopes McDonagh Cup: Offaly 4-23 Kerry 2-28

After the opening round defeat to Down, I had more or less written off Kerry's chances of winning the McDonagh Cup this year. If you had said to me then that it would come down to a one point defeat to Offaly after scoring 2-28, I'd have snapped your hand off for the

Kerry did well to get their campaign back on track and went into this one with a very strong chance of qualifying for the final. In the circumstances, it's not the fact of the defeat



that hurts me....it's the manner of it. We can bemoan our fate or claim that we were unlucky all we want. The plain fact is that while we did play very well and showed real heart for the fight, we coughed up four goals and all of them were very preventable. We were the better team overall, but we were landing jabs while Offaly were nailing up haymakers.

They landed their first one early on to take a 1-3 to 0-2 lead, Luke O'Connor slipping to Killian Sampson for a great shot. Kerry's defence were caught on the hop.

Padraig Boyle had already set up Fionán Mackessy for our opening score and Fionán Mackessy added another. Offaly were playing a sweeper system (something that has troubled Kerry all through this campaign) but their main focus was on successfully curbing Shane Conway's influence. Kerry's main weapon, though, was aerial bombs down on the youngest Boyle brother. He was absolutely magnificent, landing four points on the trot to make it 1-6 to 0-6.

There was high drama as Kerry got in for a real goal chance, Fionán O'Sullivan fouled before he could pull the trigger. Shane Conway stepped up to the penalty but the shot lacked conviction and Stephen Corcoran made a great save. I disagree with most match reports; it wasn't any turning point for me. It's not as if we left too many scores behind us on the day.

Pádraig, despite being double-teamed by now, continued his tour de force from play and frees. His influence in general play, especially as a target-man, was invaluable. His brother Mikey and Eoin Ross in the half back line were almost as influential. Kerry were actually playing the better hurling despite trailing on the scoreboard.

And then their Achilles heel was exploited again as David Nally struck for an Offaly goal. Three points from their own sharpshooter, Eoghan Cahill, helped them into a 2-10 to 0-10 lead. Kerry responded with four points on the trot -Colin Walsh's great run ended with a blistering shot over rather than under the crossbar. Offaly pulled two back but the irrepressible Boyle closed out the scoring.

Half-time Offaly 2-12 Kerry 0-15

Kerry started ringing the changes, most notably bringing in Jordan Conway. He was superb, notching two points off his first two chances. Pádraig and Eoghan Cahill swapped frees before Jordan Conway found Niall Mulcahy in space – once again, Stephen Corcoran made a brilliant save. Nonetheless a free from Pádraig brought Kerry to level terms, 0-19 to 2-13, and things looked good for Kerry to take over.

Shane Conway brilliantly cut over from the sideline and Jordan Conway hit his third point. Kerry two points in front.

Offaly had some famous surnames on the field from their glory days, and while they might not have the same panache, the steel and grit of that famous team of Dooleys, Pilkington, et al., but under the cosh and trailing for the first time, their response was powerful. Killian Sampson swooped for his second goal and, with subs to the fore, they picked off a disastrous six points on the trot before John Murphy rattled in goal number four. 4-18 to 0-21.

To be fair, Kerry did rally and bolt that stable door, albeit while the horse of a potential victory was rapidly disappearing over the horizon. Maurice O'Connor struck for two well-taken goals. Should he have started? Arrah, isn't hindsight great, the way it never lost a game? Easy to be wise afterwards.

From ten points down and dead and buried, Kerry were suddenly closing within touching distance. Shane Conway with two points. Pádraig with a free. 4-21 to 2-25. David Nally put a goal between the sides but there was time left.

Boyle and Conway with points. Colin Walsh, leading light of a bunch of young players just coming on stream for the senior team (the likes of Darragh Reen have bright futures as well) snapped over to bring us level.

Level pegging and just seconds left. A brilliant revival by Kerry, one that will linger long in the memory. Unfortunately, it was also one that was futile, as David Nally picked off a winner for Offaly. You couldn't begrudge the Faithful county, they earned this one the hard way. But it's hard not to think of what might have been, as well.

Kerry can still qualify in theory if they beat Antrim (unlikely – unbeaten Antrim have been red-hot favourites all along) and other results go their way, but I wouldn't exactly hold my breath. It looks very uch like another year where Kerry show an awful lot of potential... without actually fulfilling it.

That victory opened the door for Clare, who had fifteen points from another of the real greats of the modern era, Tony Kelly, as they earned a hard-fought draw against All Ireland champions, a result that sees both those teams into the Munster Final.

It was also a great weekend for Rathmore with the camán, as their cailíní won the Division One Camogie Final.


#### **RUGBY**




Welcome back dear student "be strong in the Lord (draw your strength from Him and be empowered through your union with Him) and in the power of His boundless might. Put on the full armour of God so that you may be able to (successfully) stand up against all the schemes and the strategies and the deceits of the devil. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood (contending only with physical opponents), but against the rulers, against the powers, against the world forces of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of wickedness in the heavenly places. Therefore, put on the complete armour of God, so that you will be able to (successfully) resist and stand your ground in the evil day of danger and having done everything, to stand firm." (Ephesians 6:10-13 Amplified Bible)

We have been studying healing recently. It's not easy to stand firm in the midst of sickness, disease or pain. But you have to realise that there is a battle going on between light and darkness, good and evil. Last week we reminded you of the Scripture "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge" (Hosea 4:6). Lack of knowledge of God's Word, His character and His power are destructive. Why? Because our enemy the devil and his demon hordes capitalise on people's lack of knowledge to visit sickness, trauma, despair and destruction upon those who are empty. These are intelligent people - often highly educated, but without knowledge of Who God is and how His Kingdom operates, are at a complete disadvantage and in peril. An easy get-out is to laugh and say 'nonsense' when they hear about spiritual warfare — but one day they will find out the Truth. Others will look for their own supernatural strength through means of new age or occultic practices — trying to connect with a higher power within themselves or the universe, or calling upon and talking to the dead. This is called witchcraft in God's Word and is a dangerous dimension to enter because it opens the door to the demonic and must be repented of. You cannot search for the Light of the world on the dark side, but the devil will gladly answer you to pull in more victims (John 8:12).

In order to successfully stand against the traps of the devil we are to 'be strong in' (or get our strength from) the Lord. The more we press in to know God by seeking Him, the larger we become in spirit (Jeremiah 29:13; James 4:6-8). Strength to withstand and overcome the attacks of the devil comes only from how strong our relationship with God is, and the posture we take standing upon His Word. When dealing with sicknesses, mental oppression, weakness or pain of any kind the first thing to know is that God is not the One making you sick! "He sent His Word to heal them and deliver them from their destructions" (Psalms 107:20). God sent His Son Jesus — also known as the Word of God - to deliver us from every snare and trap the devil would try to set up (Acts 26:18; 1 John 3:8). We must recognise that we have an enemy and he operates by constantly enticing people to believe his lies (1 Peter 5:8; John 8:43-44). But he has already been defeated by the blood of the Lord Jesus, so that we can stand strong in Christ! (Colossians 2:10-15)

- 1 tablespoon of sunflower seeds

Preheat the oven at 180 fan

- 1. Get a large mixing bowl
- 2. Pour the course flour, self raising, baking powder, bread soda and salt into the bowl and mix
- 3. Pour the beer and brown sugar into the dry ingredients and mix together

## FOCUS ON ALPINES

The vast majority of alpine plants are easy to grow in any reasonably well drained garden soil. Alpines are ideal plants for rockeries and gaps in stone walls and they will give you colour from early spring right through the summer, the most important thing

when choosing your alpine plants is to make sure you find out the growth rates so that one alpine plant won't take over other alpine plants in the rockery.

A good example of this would be an alpine called Cerastium

(snow in summer) which is quite a quick growing alpine and spreads quickly in a short space of time. it can tend to take over small rockeries, having said that it is a beautiful plant with silver foliage and is covered, as the name suggests, in beautiful white flowers. It can be pruned back to keep it under control.

There are also lots of alpines which are compact and can make perfect mounds and shapes, alpines are also great fillers for stone walls, an ideal plant for this would be a Campanula or aubrieta.

the aubrieta is a pink flowering plant that you see growing out of a lot of grottos. alpines can also be used in containers such as in troughs or window boxes but try to choose ones that are evergreen so that you will have some colour all year


