





## **MERCY ORDER CELEBRATES 170 YEARS**

THE remarkable contribution made by the Sisters of Mercy in the areas of education and health care is being celebrated in Killarney, Co Kerry where the order is marking its 170th anniversary. The milestone event will be marked at a special Mass in St Mary's Cathedral this Friday where Bishop of Kerry, Ray Browne, will be the principal celebrant and his immediate predecessor, Bishop Bill Murphy, will deliver the homily. The celebrations will continue throughout the afternoon at the 391-pupil Holy Cross Mercy primary school which was established by the order several decades ago. The Mercy sisters were first invited to set up a base in Killarney in the mid 1800s when the Mother Superior in Limerick accepted an invitation from the then bishop Dr Cornelius Egan. Four sisters duly arrived in the town at a time of difficult economic and social circumstances, when there was no convent, no back-up services and real community poverty. They set up home in a small house owned by Mr and Mrs Galwey on High Street and they later opened classrooms on College Street on the site currently occupied by the Arbutus Hotel. The Earl of Kenmare later donated a site where the convent and primary school now stands, on the Rock Road/New Road junction. The nuns soon established primary and secondary schools and old workhouses and a Famine hospital were developed into St Columbanus' Home for the elderly and St Anne's District Hospital, both of which are still

The last sister teaching at the Holy Cross Mercy primary school, assistant principal Sr Colette Dennehy, formerly retires this Friday after a long and distinguished career.

Prior to her departure, the Fossa, Killarney native had the honour of raising the school's seventh Green Flag which is the culmination of several months of hard work and dedication by the school's environmentally conscious Green Team





## MOLONEY WELCOMES ARRANGEMENTS FOR PAYMENT OF THE BACK TO SCHOOL ALLOWANCE

administrative arrangements for the 2014 Back to School Clothing & Footwear Allowance (BSCFA) Scheme are similar to those that applied in 2013. This year, a large proportion of BSCFA entitlements (114,300 customers and 203,100 children) will be fully automated with no application form required.

"Letters will be issued to the people concerned over the next week informing them of their entitlement and notifying them that payment will issue in week ending 18 July. The automated process was introduced by Minster Burton when her Department took responsibility for directly administrating the payment. This arrangement has helped to reduce the number of claims not processed until after September, which puts significant pressure on parents."

"If anyone does not receive the payment automatically and who is in receipt of certain social welfare payments and is claiming for a child between the age of 4 and 18 years, 22 years if in full-time second level education, will need to complete an application form. Forms will be available in all local social welfare offices, on the Department's website (www.welfare.ie) or by texting 'Form BTSCFA' followed by their name and address to 51909. Applications can be made from Monday 16th June. As stated before, I would urge parents to submit their application forms as early as possible to receive prompt payment."

Many years ago I was privileged to visit New York with the U.C. D. Sigerson Cup winning side. Through the medium of your newspaper may I, a Eagarthóir, once again call on Minister Hogan to undo this further damage to Local Government and allow for the use of the term Mayor by Kerry's recently elected first citizen. For my part it is my stated intention to continue to use that term in Kerry County Council Chamber.



# CHOOSING A PRESCHOOL FOR YOUR CHILD


Choosing a school for your child, even a preschool, means being particular and asking a lot of questions. Start your search at least several months before you want your child to start: In some areas, families need to get on wait lists years ahead of time to get a spot at a top preschool. As you search, use the following list as a guide. A good preschool should have:

A GOOD REPUTATION: A good preschool should have a welcoming, friendly atmosphere and be known for its nurturing environment and stimulating curriculum. Try not to form a definite opinion about a school until you see it for yourself. If you don't hear many good things about a certain school, or if it doesn't feel right when you visit, keep looking. Established ground rules: It's important for a preschool to be flexible - letting you pick up and drop off your child at different times, for instance – but it should also have clearly established regulations for everything from operating hours to how to handle emergencies. That way you know the staff takes its responsibility - your child - seriously. A preschool that doesn't have an open-door policy could have something to hide. Keep looking. A great preschool will go beyond merely letting you in: It will invite you to become part of the community by encouraging you to help out with activities, go along on field trips, and so on.

A STIMULATING CURRICULUM: The best preschools have daily schedules that include plenty of time for physical activity, quiet time (including regular story time), group programs, socializing, crafts, individual activities, meals, snacks, and free time. A well-designed curriculum stimulates your child's development and makes daily life more fun. The curriculum should change over time, giving your child the chance to try something new. Look for a school with a wide range of age-appropriate toys to encourage your child's development and, as she gets older, stimulate creative, imaginative play.

A QUALIFIED, CARING STAFF: Preschool teachers should have at least two years of college and a background in early childhood development (though many states don't require this) as well as CPR and other emergency training. Good teachers will ask detailed questions about your child to help determine whether their preschool is a good match for you. Make sure the preschool has a staff large enough to give your child the attention and care he needs. Look for a preschool with staff members who are happy with their job. Clean, safe facilities: A good preschool is clean and safe. Toys and play equipment should be in good condition. The outdoor play area should be level and secure.







### HOW DO I CHOOSE THE BEST PRESCHOOL FOR MY CHILD?

Think about choosing a preschool the same way you would think about finding a new job or a new pediatrician for your child. In either situation you would expect to invest lots of time and energy in making the right decision. You would ask around and seek the advice of others. The same goes for preschool.

So much is riding on your choice. After all you want your child to spend their days in an enjoyable and nurturing environment.

- Once you zero in on a few choices based on cost, distance from your home or work, and other basic factors, call each school and see whether you can whittle down your list to a select few by asking questions.
- Find out whether the school's accredited and whether it has clear regulations; a good one should have consistent rules that it makes clear to parents so they know what to expect.
- You should also ask about the teacherto-student ratio. A teacher, no matter how good she/he is, can't really effectively run a classroom and give the children the attention they deserve if he/she has to care for more than 10. You also might

want to ask about staff turnover, since this is a good indicator both of how happy the staff is and how happy your child will be over the long term.

- Find out the school's philosophy on educating toddlers. The fundamental principle they subscribe to may be traditional or a hybrid; it may follow the teachings and ideas of Jean Piagét, Rudolf Steiner, or Maria Montessori. Whatever its leanings, it's important that the preschool have a plan in mind for how to teach and care for its students, and that you agree with the general drift of its philosophy.
- When you have your short list, schedule visits to the schools that made the cut. You will need to meet the preschool directors in person and observe the teachers with the children. They are the ones your child will interact with most, so it's important that you find warm people with lots of experience caring for preschoolers.
- You also might ask the school for the names of some parents you could speak to — a staff that's proud of their school's success will be happy to connect you with fellow parents.
- Bring your child along for a visit. See

how he/she responds to the school and the teachers. Do they seem interested in getting to know him/her? Are the activities ones your child will enjoy? By watching how she/he reacts you'll have a better idea whether a preschool is a good fit

- Most important, trust your instincts.
   A preschool may boast new books and toys, have a gleaming new building, and be affordable to boot, but if it doesn't feel right then it isn't.
- It's essential that you feel comfortable with the school's director, who runs the establishment and sets guidelines for your child and with whom you'll be interacting should issues or questions come up in the future
- You should also feel secure and pleased with the teachers, who will be spending many hours with your child day in and day out. At its best, this will be a long and productive partnership.





### **GEARING UP FOR THE** RING OF KERRY CYCLE

#### (By Cora Carrigg, Kerry Recreation and Sports Partnership)

#### WEEK 10 – Week Beginning June 16th - Iniury Prevention

A total of 150km minimum cycled during the week - so well done!! We are on the last leg of the journey now... so keep focused. With the weather being favourable, our aim this week is to complete 160km total.

This week's focus is on cycling injuries. I will preface by saying that I am not a medical doctor; however I am willing to share my experiences and knowledge gained, as a means of positively assisting your own cycling experience.

Cycling injuries come from a variety of sources, however ones that I have selected include the following: -

**Back Pain Numb Hands Lactic Acid** 

**BACK PAIN** - is a common problem in cycling and there are many causes of back pain. Lower back pain, without any other problems or history of back pain, is often due to mechanical factors versus intrinsic problems inside your body. The mechanical factor being incorrect bike fit. Many cyclists are riding bikes that are too big for them and perhaps lack the proper flexibility and core strength. So if experiencing back pain, related to the bike, the advice would be to take the time and have your bike fitted to your body.

**NUMB HANDS** - A poor bike fit with too much bodily forward pressure, or indeed riding on rough terrain under constant handlebar vibrations, can send a sensation of pins-and-needles through the hands. This pressure or vibration disturbs the nerves and ultimately decreases grip strength and muscle tone.

This is a common affliction among cyclists, often called Cyclist's Palsy or ulnar neuropathy, which is an injury to the ulnar nerve in the hands causing a rider pain, numbness or muscle weakness.

When you encounter such symptoms, it is important to correct the problem. Possible suggestions may include: -

Bike Fit - Make sure your bike fit is accurate. Avoid holding all of your weight on your hands and wrists - pay special attention to the fact that the nose of the saddle is not slanted forward.

**Bar Tape** – Use bar tape that absorbs

vibrations and provides some cushion to the wrists and hands. Try properly fitted gloves with some gel protection to give cushion and decrease vibratory force.

Hand Position - Change your hand positions as often as possible and avoid extending your wrist.

However, if the symptoms persist, time to consult a doctor.

**LACTIC ACID** – Not wanting to get too technical, lactic acid is the end product of anaerobic metabolism, which occurs when there is insufficient oxygen to produce the energy that is required by exercise. Glycogen stored in the muscle cells is the sole fuel used for anaerobic work. It breaks down to glucose, then pyruvate, and finally into lactic acid, when there is not enough oxygen present in the muscle cells. Because of a lack of oxygen, the result is muscular pain.

On the other hand, a sufficient supply of oxygen will allow some lactic acid to be burned and some to be converted back to glycogen, fuelling the muscles.

Why does it hurt? At high lactic acid levels, muscular contraction is inhibited. This happens because proteins in muscle cells can function only within a certain range of acidity. Excess lactic acid simply shuts down cellular reactions. During exercise and for a time afterward, lactic acid escapes from muscles into the blood. The liver is involved with the removal of some lactic acid from the blood. The liver transforms lactic acid into glucose, which is either stored as glycogen or sent out as blood sugar. So the advice is to always keep pedalling after a hard effort... and it would be worth going out for a short spin one to two days after the Ring of Kerry cycle!

This week's cycle training programme, according to the Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle Training programme, presents another  $160 km \, schedule \ldots enjoy \, the \, mileage!$

## **Know Your Rights:**

#### THE ENERGY ENGAGE CODE

#### **OUESTION**

What is the 'Energy Engage' Code?

#### **ANSWER**

The 'Energy Engage Code' is a new code of practice which aims to protect energy customers who are in financial difficulty, particularly those in arrears on their bills. It applies to five energy suppliers with effect from 1 June 2014 – these are Bord Gáis Energy, Electric Ireland, Energia, Flogas Natural Gas and SSE Airtricity.

Under the Energy Engage Code, suppliers guarantee that no customer engaging with them will be cut off. The energy suppliers will seek to identify vulnerable customers at an earlier stage. They commit to treating each customer individually and offering realistic and achievable payment plans to customers in difficulty. The Energy Engage Code will be independently audited to ensure that the participating energy suppliers are complying with it.

In addition to the new code of practice, all energy suppliers must comply with certain mandatory consumer protection standards that are set out by the Commission for Energy Regulation (CER).

All suppliers are obliged to establish a register of vulnerable customers and to keep it updated. Customers listed on this register cannot be disconnected during the months November to March. A customer in arrears must be offered a payment arrangement, which can include the installation of a Pay As You Go meter, while avoiding a situation where the debt becomes worse

"At risk" customers must be referred to MABS, The St Vincent de Paul Society or a representative of the Department of Social Protection (formerly called the Community Welfare Officer). A supplier can consider applying for a disconnection only if these measures fail, and only after at least four separate attempts to contact the customer have been made.

## Outlook on third level education

You have until
5.15pm on 1st July to avail of the
"Change of Mind" facility

The state exams are coming to an end, the sun is shining and the thoughts of exhausted candidates are turning to lazy days on the beach. But before you take off for a summer of relaxation and travel, there is one very important task to be undertaken. The 80,000 or so applicants to the Central Applications Office (CAO) must now turn their attention to the CAO "Change of Mind" facility which affords each applicant an opportunity, if s/he wishes, to register a change of course choices online by 5.15pm on 1st July.

Not all applications to CAO avail of the change of mind facility. Many applicants are very happy with the course choices they submitted by 1st February and are content to leave well enough alone. On the other hand, you might have done further course research in the meantime or you have simply changed your mind about what course you would like to study. Whatvever your reason for submitting a change of mind form make sure you know exactly what you are applying for. Don't list any courses which you haven't researched. Don't apply for any course which you know in your heart and soul that you won't accept if it's offered to you. Most important of all, never apply for a course in which you haven't the slightest interest simply because your friends are applying for it.

If you do decide to submit a change of mind form, work on your choices before going online. Don't tinker with your original list while online as it's very easy to make a mistake. Start from scratch and prepare a new list of courses. When you have finalised your choices, open up your CAO account and lodge your choices online. Remember that every choice is important and it's advisable to fill up all ten choices in each category.

Check the minimum course requirements and the special requirements for each course you are including on the change of mind form. Don't enter a restricted application course for the first time on a change of mind form as it won't be considered. Restricted application courses are those for which assessment procedures such as audition, aptitude test or portfolio submission have already taken place. The one exception to this rule is a restricted course which shares the exact same assessment procedures as a restricted course you have applied for by 1st February. Don't list any course which has been cancelled but you may include any new courses which were announced after the 2014 CAO Handbook was published. All of this information is easily accessible on the CAO website, www.cao.ie.

The two course categories — Level 8 (Honours Bachelor Degrees) and Level 7/6 (Ordinary Bachelor Degrees/Higher Certificates) are totally separate from each other for the purpose of submitting a change of mind form. You may change one category and leave the second category unchanged or you may change both. On the other hand, you may decide to stick with the choices you submitted by 1st February last.

If you change courses online, which is now the standard way of doing so, the CAO will send an acknowledgement to your email address. You can check that your courses have been updated by using the "My Application" facility by 5.15pm on 1st July. Subject to a few restrictions, you may change your course choices free of charge as often as you wish up to the closing date. The final change of mind form that you submit is one that will count for your CAO offers in August, so be very careful that you check online before 1st July to make sure that all is in order.

After the 1st July you can make no further changes to your CAO application form. So the remaining ten days provide you with a valuable window of opportunity. Use the time to put some serious thought into your choice of college courses. With the state exams now done and dusted, you can give your undivided attention to submitting a "change of mind" form that truly contains your course interests. It will be time well spent if you achieve your course of choice when the college offers are issued in August.

The Leaving Certificate Examination results will be delivered to schools on Wednesday, 13th August. The results will also be available via internet and telephone from 12 noon on that day. Round One offers of college places will be available on the CAO website, www.cao.ie from 6am on Monday, 18th August. The reply date for acceptance will be 5.15pm on Monday, 25th August. Meanwhile, enjoy the summer!







## **MELTING NACHOS WITH SHREDDED GAMMON**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 200g plain tortilla chips
- 175g shredded cooked ham or gammon
- 2 x 200g tubs tomato salsa
- 100g grated cheddar
- 2 sliced jalapeños
- guacamole and soured cream, to serve



Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Empty the

- 1. Heat oven to 220C/200C fan/gas 7. Spread the sausages in a roasting tin and cook for 20-25 mins, turning, until golden and cooked through.
- 2. Meanwhile, fry the onions in a splash of oil over a high heat until almost softened and browning. Stir in the sweet chilli sauce and tomato purée with some seasoning, and cook

for 1 min more.

3. Split the hot dog buns, add a spoonful of the sweet chilli onions, top with a sausage, then a spoonful more onions.

- 4 slices of thick crusty wholegrain bread
- Half a clove of garlic

- 2. Put the slices under the grill, taking care not to overcook them
- 3. Hold the cut side of the garlic towards the bread and rub it lightly





4. Chop some tomatoes and mix with olive oil 5. Place loosely on top of the cooked bruschetta 6. Eat and enjoy!

## KERRY FARM LEADER CALLS FOR MOVEMENT ON RURAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN IN ADVANCE OF BRUSSELS SUBMISSION

There have calls on the Minister for Agriculture Simon Coveney to immediately commence detailed discussions on the CAPRural Development Plan 2014-2020, which is of critical importance to farm income over the next seven years. There are many outstanding issues to be resolved such as clarity on the stocking of commonages including opposition to the 80% stocking rule, payment levels for GLAS measures and details of eligible items for grant aid under TAMS II.

IFA Rural Development Chairman Flor McCarthy from Kenmare has urged the Minister for Agriculture to change the GLAS ranking system in favour of low income farmers and to remove any specific reference to an organic nitrogen limit in the selection criteria. "Favouring farmers in the selection criteria where the organic nitrogen limits exceeds 140kg of nitrogen per ha and for farmers with over 30 ha of tillage is discriminatory against farmers who may be either below this nitrogen limit or are on smaller tillage farms. There should be no reference to such categories within the GLAS criteria and that all farmers and in particular those who are on low incomes must get priority."

On TAMS, Flor McCarthy said grant aid must apply across all sectors with a broad list of eligible items for grant aid. The tranche system must be flexible with a front-loading of support in the early years of the Programme.

On hill farmers, Pat Dunne Chairman of the IFA Hill Farming Committee said that other than the commonage issue, he wants to see a higher GLAS payment in hill areas, higher ANC payments and a specific measure for hill sheep under the knowledge transfer criteria.

Tractor sales, which amounted to some 1,900 units in 2013, are set to rise by an estimated 4% this year according to industry figures released at a conference of Zetor main dealers held in Portlaoise last week.

Fuelling this is the improvement within the agricultural economy generally, in particular the growth that is taking place within the dairy sector.

Continuing to dominate the market is the 100 - 120hp segment which, in 2013, accounted for some 34 percent of all tractors sold. Already this year, sales in this segment have increased by some 44 percent.

## ICMSA SAY COVENEY'S BVD MEASURES DON'T GO FAR ENOUGH

New compensation measures for the removal of BVD Persistently Infected Animals (PIs) announced by the Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, Simon Coveney, show a lack of awareness that some farmers are retaining these animals even against best practice and advice, according to Pat McCormack, Deputy President and Dairy Committee Chairperson of the ICMSA.


While acknowledging that the compensation is a welcome development and that the amount of €75 for the removal of the second and subsequent dairy breed heifer PI may encourage those retaining PIs to remove them, Mr McCormack stressed that dairy and beef herds should, as an absolute minimum, receive the same level of compensation of €120. In addition, the decision to exclude beef animals from dairy herds for compensation is, in ICMSA's view, both ill-advised and illogical in that it doesn't take account of the fact that BVD does not discriminate by breed or sex of the animal. The ICMSA Deputy President noted that ratio of PI retention between dairy


and beef herds is close to 50:50 and the exclusion of males and beef breeds from the dairy herd from the compensation scheme is a major oversight.

"The Minister also needs to look at other measures in his effort to remove Pls. This starts with the notification of neighbours who bound farmers retaining PIs for more than 7 weeks after the birth of that animal. This is essential as there are more herds that have a BVD free status and they are entitled to all aid in taking the precautions necessary to stay that way. Informing the vets of those farmers who have retained PIs is another vital move so that the vet can take any decontamination measures they deem wise before going onto a BVD-free farm straight from dealing with a potential PI animal in another herd. It is acknowledged by all that the removal of PIs is absolutely essential, the Minister's compensation package needs to go further and must apply equally to all PI herds if we're to get on top of this problem," said Mr. McCormack.

## KERRY FARMERS CHARGED OVER €600,000 IN SINGLE FARM PAYMENT PENALTIES

Senator Mark Daly (Kenmare) has revealed that farmers in Kerry were forced to pay out over €600,000 in penalties under the Single Farm Payment scheme in 2013.

In reply to questions, the Department of Agriculture has admitted that more than €5 million was taken in penalties from farm payments last year. Farmers in Kerry were charged one of the highest amounts in penalties, totalling €633,106.

"These fines are extremely harsh and totally unnecessary in most cases. Many of the penalties imposed are for innocent errors made because the process is overly complicated and bureaucratic. I know many smaller farmers

across Kerry who are already struggling with cuts to supports and increasing operating costs. On top of all of this, they are being hit with hefty fines for errors mainly caused by the unreasonable level of red tape they must go through to receive their Single Farm Payment. Many farmers are choosing not to apply for supports because of the enormous amount of paperwork and procedures involved. Others are fearful of being hit with a penalty because of a minor mistake."

## FARMERS - FURTHER INFORMATION ON DONKEY MILK

Pierluigi Orunesu, the founder of Eurolactis, a company based in Switzerland and Italy is originally from Sardinia and grew up seeing donkeys around his native village. Fascinated by this "gentle and special animal," in 2007, he found a farm that had bred donkeys for over 20 years and launched Eurolactis. At that time, the farm had 350 donkeys. Today, Mr. Orunesu says, the number has grown to over 900, in response to the increased demands Eurolactis is getting for donkey's milk, both for cosmetic reasons (the firm supplies the milk to a large French cosmetics company that makes soaps and creams) as well as for dietary ones, since a number of studies have shown that donkey's milk is ideal for those who suffer from traditional dairy allergies. The ratio of casein to whey protein in donkey's milk is almost identical to human milk and like human milk; donkey's milk is also rich in lactose and low in fat. These similarities inspired Eurolactis to produce powdered donkey milk formula in Europe for babies and children with allergies to both dairy and soy milks. Earlier this year, the company also experimented with ultra-high temperature (UHT) technology to package liquid donkey milk in Tetrapaks. Donkey's milk is light and easy to digest, and across Europe, demand continues to increase, in the first four months of this year, he says he has doubled his business and now is actively looking in the U.S. to connect with companies interested in using donkey's milk for cosmetic purposes. Raising donkeys is much easier than raising either horses or cows, says Jean-Francois Wanbeke, a computer engineer-turned-donkey breeder.

He and his wife, Benedicte, were novices the field: They started raising donkeys in 1997 and today run a successful farm in the foothills of France's Pyrenees mountains, where they not only produce and sell donkey's milk at 30 euros a litre and experiment with it in their cooking, but also educate visitors to their farm about the animal.

#### INVISIBLE MONSTERS IN YOUR PET'S BOWLS?

If you simply top off your pet's water dish, you could be creating a monster that will attack your pet from the inside out. If indoor bowls aren't palatable, pets won't hesitate to drink rainwater from unsafe sources. Many of us are guilty of simply refilling the water bowl when it gets close to empty, but the water that sits around will form a slimy residue that hosts dangerous bacteria and fungus that can begin to grow. Some pet guardians may not even notice that their pet will start shying away from a dirty water bowl and become mildly dehydrated or, worse yet, seek water from unsafe areas indoors or out. Food and water dishes should be made from stainless steel, heavy glass or ceramic and should be washed daily but Do NOT use harsh cleaners that can leave behind residue and odour. Plastic dishes may contain a hazardous substance called BPA which leaches into your pet's water and is a known carcinogen. This can break down further in the dishwasher. Plastic also absorbs odours and become unpleasant to a pet's sensitive sense of smell. If you have bowls that are already beyond salvaging, why not start fresh with a new set of bowls and choose from one of these easy daily washing techniques.

- \* Run them through the hottest cycle of the dishwasher to get them really clean and sterilized.
- \* Wash and thoroughly rinse with washing up liquid and a clean abrasive sponge to release all organic material from the sides of the bowls. \*Try scrubbing with a mix of equal parts baking soda, salt and warm water.

#### **URBAN WILDLIFE**

Accommodating wildlife in towns and cities doesn't necessarily require massive investment. You can bring in more birds, just by breaking up endless lawns with the right kinds of shrubs, to create structure and variety. Mowing those lawns a little less often — not weekly but every two or three weeks — will increase the population of native bees and other pollinators. In Britain allotments, or community gardens, in urban areas make a major difference for pollinating insects, probably because they tend to feature fruit trees and bushes and because the weedy corners tend to be a little more insect-friendly than private gardens. Concern about dwindling pollinator species has also led to the recent proliferation of 60 wildflower meadows in British cities, modelled after the extensive meadows planted around the site of the 2012 London Olympics. A recent study looked at the relative wildlife-friendliness of 10 sample cities and boiled the differences down to a series of numbers indicating how well

each city accommodated nine representative species. While the study scrupulously avoids an overall ranking of cities, it would be easy enough for local partisans to look at the numbers and make invidious comparisons on civic pride and competitiveness.

#### WHY THERE'S A BLACK MARKET FOR WILD GARLIC IN QUEBEC

These sought-after alliums are the first forgeable to poke their slender leaves through the chilly soil each year. And like the first signs of spring after a long winter, these plants which only grow for a maximum of six weeks attract a lot of attention. Springing up from Georgia to Quebec, wild leeks, also known as wild garlic, wood leeks, ramps and ail des bois, are coveted throughout their range, spawning a full spring calendar worth of celebratory feeds and festivals dedicated to this smelly wild onion. However, although ramps have traditionally been an annual indicator of the changing seasons, reckless foraging and wanton consumption have all but destroyed wild growth in regions throughout their expansive range. Mary Ruth McDonald, research program director at the University of Guelph's Department of Plant Agriculture says that on average patches of ramps increase in size by less than 10% a year. Therefore if more than 10% of the patch is picked it will not be able to come back the next year. "They just grow very slowly," she says. "It takes four years for the plant to mature to the age where it can produce a flowering stalk." Nowhere has the impact been more pronounced than in Quebec. In 1995 foraging of wild garlic (known as ramps in Canada) for commercial purposes was banned in the province and the plant was listed as a vulnerable species. Under the ban, anyone caught with more than 50 bulbs is subject to a minimum \$500 fine. In the past few years there have been several notable arrests of ramp smugglers caught red handed with hockey bags filled with freshly picked blubs. Although it may seem odd that someone would risk a hefty fine for a bushel of smelly bulbs, ramps can fetch over a dollar per plant in neighbouring Ontario, where the plant is legal. This has created a veritable black market in bulb smuggling as thieves pillage ramp patches throughout Quebec and carry them across the border to legally sell them at markets and fairs for a handsome profit. Quebec is not the only place to limit harvesting. In 2004, parts of the Great Smoky Mountains National Park in North Carolina and Tennessee banned the harvest

Almost everybody that have ever watched a film

based in the southern states of north America will be familiar with the chirp of male crickets as they attempt to woo a prospective mate, but scientists have stumbled upon two species of cricket that have stopped "singing" altogether, providing a remarkable example of adaptation and evolution in action. Male crickets usually rub the top of one of their wings along a line of small teeth like protrusions on the bottom of their other wing to create that unmistakable chirping song. This is a call to females in the area that the male wants some romance, but there is one main disadvantage to this: if there are predators about, this cricket song will put the male in danger of being discovered and killed. A parasitoid fly's larvae burrow into the cricket and then grow inside the insect until they emerge a few weeks later, killing the cricket in the process. This presents a problem: how do the cricket's genes survive when the very act of passing on those genes has become so very dangerous? Almost a decade ago, male crickets appeared on the Hawaiian islands of Kauai and Oahu that, suddenly, were eerily silent. Upon closer inspection by University of St Andrews researchers, it turned out that the crickets' wings had been altered by subtle genetic variances that meant they were now flat and, while still allowing the crickets to fly, didn't produce sound. The scientists had first assumed that the silent crickets evolved on one island and somehow migrated to the next, for instance by hitching a ride with tourists. Yet, what they found was that the so-called "flatwing" trait actually occurred through similar but different changes to the two species on the two islands, with no intermingling having occurred. You might be wondering one important thing, though. How do the silent crickets manage to attract a female if they can't sing? Well, they can't attract females so they have to be devious. On both islands there are still crickets without the mutations that give them silent wings. As a result, the silent crickets have to position themselves near to the still singing males. They then wait for a female to turn up and try to intercept. This might be slightly more circumspect and cumbersome than the song method, but because it means they do not attract the fly larvae, it's a great deal safer.

## Sex Education and

For parents, the whole area of 'sex education' can feel like a minefield. How do you bring it up? What do you bring up? What do they need to know? How much do they need to know? Considering that most parents' own experience of sex education may have been either sparse or non-existent, the whole area can be a bit over-whelming.

Quite often we approach the area of 'sex education' as something to get done (and over with!!). Have you ever asked your friends 'Did you give him the talk yet?' Have you ever breathed a sigh of relief when you have received a note from the school asking for your permission for your child to attend an RSE (Relationships and Sexuality Education) talk! If only it were that simple. We now know that RSE needs to encompass so much more than just biology and facts. This is vital as our young people are bombarded with messages from media - TV, movies and social media. In fact we now know that for many young people the internet has become the 'default sex educator'.

Our approach to RSE therefore needs to counteract and challenge these influences. Our experience at SouthWest Counselling in delivering workshops in secondary schools is of having to correct misunderstandings and re-educate young people. Often we hear that young people would like parents to be able to talk to them about relationships and sex however our experience is that many parents baulk at the idea of it .. 'Oh God that is embarrassing' they say or 'sure they don't have a clue'. This is why the ideal scenario is for schools and parents to work together to support and educate our children.

So where does the parent begin - remember don't let the phrase 'you don't have a clue' put you off. First of all - have faith in your ability to influence your child. You are doing it already. Sex education is happening continuously in the home where your messages and values are absorbed by your children. They learn through our relationships where respect and empathy are valued, through touch and behaviour, and through messages spoken and unspoken.

SUGGESTION FOR THE WEEK: Take time to link with your teenager and look for 'teachable' moments. So for example take time to watch a TV programme with them. Maybe you could make a comment on something you are seeing - the story lines in Home and Away should give you a lot of cues - e.g saying 'I'm not sure that was a respectful or healthy way to deal with a relationship problem'.

From our work with young people, it appears more and more young people are viewing pornography at an earlier age. The average age globally that a young person first views pornography on the internet is 11 years – 'but here in County Kerry that can't be the case. can it? We will discuss this in more detail next week and how to address the topic of pornography with young people

## **Health Matters....** With Dr. Michael Moloney

### ACNE PART 2

#### TOPICAL TREATMENTS

Various gels, lotions and creams are used to treat acne. Different preparations work in different ways.

#### 1. Benzoyl peroxide

This is a common topical treatment. It has three actions — it kills bacteria, reduces inflammation and helps unplug blocked pores. It comes in different brands and strengths. It is useful to start with lower strength.

#### 2. Retinoids

These are good at unplugging blocked pores. They also have some effect on reducing inflammation. Most dermatologists recommend early treatment with a retinoid to unblock pores and to treat comedones and mildly inflamed spots. Your skin may be more sensitive to sunlight, therefore it is best to apply at night and wash off in the morning.

#### 3. Topical antibiotics

There are various antibiotic preparations. They reduce the number of bacteria and reduce inflammation. However they have little effect on unplugging blocked pores.

#### Tablets

#### 1. Antibiotic tablets

Antibiotics work by killing bacteria that contribute to the cause of acne. They also have a direct effect of reducing inflammation. If you have a lot of blackheads and whiteheads as well as inflamed acne spots, you may be advised to use a topical treatment such as benzoyl peroxide in addition to taking an antibiotic tablet.

#### 2. The pill

The combined oral contraceptive pill may help some women if their acne seems to be partly related to their hormone changes.

#### 3. Isoretinoin tablets (Roaccutane)

Isotretinoin greatly reduces the amount of sebum that you make by the sebaceous glands. It works very well, and usually clears spots even in severe cases. However it is usually only prescribed by a dermatologist and only after other treatments have been tried first.
