20 NEW SOCIAL HOUSES OPEN AT'LIOS AN FHIA

The official opening of a new 20 unit social housing scheme in Killarney was performed by the Minister for Housing, Planning and Local Government, Mr Eoghan Murphy TD this week.

The new estate, called 'Lios an Fhia', which was completed by Kerry County Council under the Rebuilding Ireland Programme, is situated at Park, Killarney and is located approximately two kilometres from Killarney town centre. The \in 3.1m scheme of two-storey, three-bedroom units will provide homes for families currently in need of accommodation in the Killarney area and are finished to a very high standard.

The project was overseen by the Capital Infrastructure Unit of Kerry County Council and was completed by Ned O'Shea and Sons Construction Ltd. Construction began in February 2017 and tenants have moved into the new homes last week.

The Lios an Fhia scheme was designed by the Capital Infrastructure Unit of Kerry County Council.

Architectural, civil and structural engineering services were carried out by the in-house team, whilst QS services were provided by Kane Crowe Kavanagh Quantity Surveyors. The houses are of traditional cavity wall construction with excellent insulation and airtightness levels.

Each dwelling has an air to water heating system with underfloor heating to the ground floor and low temperature radiators to the first floor. All units have an A3 BER rating.

The facility, at Knockeendubh, on the outskirts of the town, will provide approximately 2,300 burial spaces or plots.

The opening of the graveyard on Wednesday morning was attended by the Cathaoirleach of the Killarney Municipal District, Cllr John Sheahan and the elected members of the Killarney Municipal District as well as the Minister of State at the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport, Brendan Griffin TD and Chief Executive of Kerry County Council, Moira Murrell.

Burial plots are now available to those of all faiths and none. A car park at the graveyard, just off the Killarney-Kilcummin road, has also been completed and in time, the facility will also incorporate a columbarium wall for the placement of urns containing cremated remains.

Cllr Sheahan thanked the staff of Kerry County Council who helped to bring the facility to fruition. He said it was important that the council provided a burial ground to cater for the needs of Killarney over the coming years and that a final resting place be made available for the people of the town and the surrounding area.

CLÁR funding of €165,999 to support first responders in Kerry- Griffin

Minister of State for Tourism and Sport, Brendan Griffin, has said that a new round of the Clár Programme will make funding available for first responder organisations in Kerry.

This is part of a €1.2 million allocation of funding announced this week by Michael Ring T.D., Minister for Rural and Community Development.

Speaking about the purpose of the funds Minister Griffin said: "The latest round of the Clár Programme will support First Responders who provide an excellent service in rural areas often under very difficult circumstances.

Kerry has been allocated €165,999 for first responder organisations. The groups to benefit include Kerry Mountain Rescue who get €50,000 for vehicle purchase, Kerry Irish Community Rapid Response receive €28,156 for purchase of equipment and Kerry Order of Malta receives €18,785 for equipment.

illarney Golf Club have taken steps to ensure their rangers are trained to deal with someone who is suffering a cardiac arrest.

The Club has recently taken delivery of a number of AED devices, many of which are now carried by the club's rangers while out on the course.

With the introduction of AED (Automated External Defibrillator) devices throughout Killarney, as well as the formation of a local first responder unit and public training initiatives, more and more people are becoming aware of how to recognise someone who's suffering a cardiac arrest and how to manage it.

Every year in Ireland there are approximately 3500 cardiac arrests out of hospital but just 1% of these victims survive. The statistics can be improved substantially as more people are trained in CPR and in the use of an AED. Last year, Killarney Golf & Fishing Club had a number of their staff members undertake training in resuscitation and in the use of these devices.

"We're delighted to have these devices on site and to know that should a situation arise with a golfer on the course, we have staff with the necessary training to look after them', said Cormac Flannery, General Manager of Killarney Golf & Fishing Club told the Killarney Outlook.

If an AED is used and CPR performed within 3-5 minutes of a cardiac arrest, survival rates increase by up to 74%.



New Brochure Highlights All Kerry Has to Offer

he Tourism Unit of Kerry County Council has launched a new, comprehensive and user-friendly brochure highlighting the wide and diverse range of activities and attractions on offer to locals and visitors in the county. The 170-page brochure was launched at County Buildings this week by the Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr Norma Foley.

The new guide is helpfully segmented into easily accessible categories including golf, angling, surfing, walking and hiking, cycling, art, crafts, adventure, family fun activities, food experiences, gardens and parks, water sports, equestrian, and more and includes a listing of contact details for over 300 tourism and activity businesses.

The Tourism Unit of Kerry County Council, working closely with adventure and activity providers as well as local communities, development groups and committees, designed and produced the guide 'in house' with the support of the Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme 2017. The publication of the brochure is an objective of the County Kerry Tourism Strategy and Action Plan which was published in 2016.

'County Kerry is more dependent on tourism than any other county in Ireland and future economic development and job creation in the county is more likely to be linked to tourism and hospitality than any other economic activity,' said the Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr Norma Foley.

'One in five jobs and businesses in Kerry depend on tourism and the county earns over €420 million annually from its visitors.

'County Kerry is gaining a reputation as one of the best places in Europe for those in search of an adventure or activity holiday. The county's natural attributes and man-made attractions

are hugely appealing for Ireland's visitor target markets. Kerry's countryside and coastal areas, mountains and lakes, woodlands and national parks provide outstanding environments for a range of activities and adventure pursuits,' said Cllr Foley.

The County Kerry Tourism Strategy and Action Plan 2016-2022 sets out the priorities and investment plans for the county and forms an integral part of Kerry County Council's Local Economic and Community Plan 2016-2022. It identified Adventure Tourism as one of the fastest growing segments of international tourism. Various groups who participated in the formulation of the Tourism Strategy including adventure and activity providers, sought to maximise, in a sustainable manner, the potential of adventure tourism, particularly during the offpeak season. The topography of the county is ideally suited to both soft adventure (e.g. walking, cycling, sailing and angling) and hard adventure (e.g. mountain climbing, trekking, surfing). The brochure will be widely distributed

and promoted both nationally and internationally. An on-line version will also be available (see www.kerrycoco. ie) which can be updated regularly to include further business listings.

5,897 KERRY FARMERS TO GET BASIC PAYMENT REFUNDS OF €653,887

The Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, Michael Creed TD announced that the payment of over €13.2 million to approximately 97,000 farmers has commenced. This money was deducted from their 2016 Basic Payment Scheme (BPS) payments under the Financial Discipline rule and is now being reimbursed in line with


the EU regulations.

In Kerry 5,897 farmers will get payments totalling €653,887. Ireland South MEP, Deirdre Clune said: "I am pleased to see that these payments are

being refunded to farmers in Kerry. In total across Ireland these payments will bring the total paid to Irish farmers under the 2017 Basic Payment Scheme to €1.19 billion.


Inaugural Trans-Atlantic telegraph message celebrated

The inaugural successful transmission from the western terminus of the trans-Atlantic telegraph cable was carried out between Heart's Contents, Newfoundland, to Valentia, Ireland on Friday 27th July 1866. Prior to this, messages would have taken up to 2 weeks to cross the Atlantic by ship.

On Friday 27th July 2018, Kerry Amateur Radio Group (KARG) will celebrate the anniversary of the connection of Europe to America, old connecting to new, by attempting to make both wired and wireless communication contact with Hearts Content Cable station in Newfoundland, from Valentia Cable station. It is planned to use various modes of communication including voice, morse code and data, to establish contacts on the day, with a collaborating Amateur Radio group at Hearts Content.


The occasion also acknowledges Valentia as a potential World Heritage site due to its importance in telegraph and radio communication and its historical influence in technology.

Councillor Gleeson stated that

Taxi availability. That same level of improvement does not, in many locations, apply for Wheelchair users. Many with disability still experience considerable difficulty in accessing a Wheelchair Accessible Taxi particularly when trying to do so at short notice.

The government grant of €7,500 towards the purchase of a Wheelchair

Accessible Taxi was meant to significantly increase the number of such vehicles and make them more readily available to people who use wheelchairs. Councillor Gleeson stated that life can be difficult enough for Wheelchair users and asked that every possible effort should be made to ensure that they have fair and ready access to the Taxi service.

Damien secures national title

FTER three podium finishes in the event in the last six stagings, including two third placed finishes in 2016 and 2017, Deerpark's Damien Fleming became only the second Kerry player ever to win a National Senior Gents Strokeplay title when he emerged with a one stroke victory in Glenville in Dublin last Sunday afternoon. 

FOCUS ON FOCUS ON HYDRANGEAS

Hydrangeas are a very popular garden shrub with delicate heads of flowers that come in shades of white, pink or blue and they flower from late Spring to Autumn. The mophead and lace cap Hydrangeas are well known for the ability to change colour in different soils. Hydrangeas thrive in moist but well drained soil, in the cool, semi shady part of the garden. Try to avoid dry sunny situations and east facing areas.

Feeding your Hydrangeas once in late Winter or early Spring is probably enough for the year as too much feeding will only encourage too much soft leafy growth and this will lead to the Hydrangeas not developing a lot of flower buds. Pruning your Hydrangeas is usually done in late Winter or early Spring, although the climbing Hydrangeas should be pruned after flowering in Summer.





TAX MATTERS

Health Insurance Tax Credit

If you are a member of an approved private health insurance scheme, you may get a tax credit. This tax credit is generally granted directly by the insurance company. Your premium will be reduced by the amount of the tax credit so you will probably not even notice that you have got a tax credit. This is known as Tax Relief at Source (TRS). However, in some limited situations TRS does not apply, for example, where an employer pays the medical insurance premiums on behalf of an employee. This is treated as a Benefit in Kind and PAYE, PRSI and USC are due on the total amount. This means that the employee does not benefit from the TRS on the medical insurance premium and can make a claim directly to Revenue.

The relief is limited to the cost of the policy up to a maximum of \in 1,000 per adult and \in 500 per child. A child is considered to be a person under 21 years of age, whether or not they are in full-time education as long as a child premium has been paid for them. For individuals 21 years of age and over, you can now claim relief at the amount set for adults, even if they are getting a child premium. The relief is given at the standard rate of 20%.

KERRY 1-10 GALWAY 1-13 At Croke Park

There could be no measuring the frustration, doubt, disbelief and in some places anger of Kerry supporters as they left Croke Park last Sunday evening after witnessing their sides first ever "Super 8" contest with Galway end in defeat.

In many ways, the result was probably not the most frustrating aspect of the day rather than the underwhelming performance by Eamonn Fitzmaurice's men who up to then really did not encounter a championship blow along the way with facile wins over Clare and Cork. It was Galway's first championship victory over Kerry in 53 years and there was little doubt about it the longer the game went on as Galway contained the Kerry forward line with relative ease and countered on the break with authority.

Kerry contributed with a huge amount of their own turnovers, while one of the telling stats of the game, being Kerry's return of only 11 scores from 25 chances.

In a first half in which the standard fare could only be described as poor at best Kevin McCarthy fired over Kerry's opener and despite it taking Galway all of 13 minutes to register their first score, it was the tribesmen who dictated the play as they pushed up on each Kerry restart.

Galway pushed ahead by 17th minute when Paul Conroy fired over but it was his last telling contribution as moment later his day was brought to an end by a serious leg injury suffered in an accidental clash with Sean O'Shea. It shook Galway for a stage but they finished the half with three points unanswered and headed to the dressing rooms 0-6 to 0-5 ahead.

Seemingly firing on dirty petrol Kerry hung on to the Galway challenge as David Clifford kept up the challenge for Kerry but the loss of Killian Young to a red card on the hour mark was to have a telling affect as Galway finally took a strangled hold on the game with Adrian Varley proving very effective from the bench with 0-2.

Galway finally pushed their lead to four before another Galway substitute Patrick Sweeney netted after Shane Murphy had brilliantly saved his first effort.

Fittingly for Kerry is was David Clifford with a stoppage time goal reduced the deficit to just three and in a group that may go to scoring difference it could well be the most crucial score that was ever scored for Kerry at Croke Park.

KERRY MUST TACKLE CLONES CYCLONE IN BID REDEMPTION

So here we are win and we have a chance and lose and it is all over. Simple enough so for Eamon Fitzmaurice who predicted that all sides in the group would take points off each other and it may well end up with smallest of margins dictating who progressed.

Clones has never been an easy place for Kerry to head to but considering it's the first time since 1935 that Kerry have to play an actual championship game in Ulster and added to the fact that Monaghan after their solid, if unconvincing win over Kildare sets up the Farney side to have a real crack off Kerry. The Kingdom are in doubt about the challenge ahead of them.

After what can only be described as a meltdown against Galway, Kerry have a lot of soul searching to but with little time to dwell on it, that in itself might be an advantage for them.

Monaghan who set up in many ways like Galway will certainly feel that Kerry are certainly more human than mortal have now two good cracks at reaching a semi-final but a trip to Galway in their last round might even at this stage look like a harder nut to crack. So will Fitzmaurice change his starting 15 in a radical way, or will he give so many of the players who failed to deliver another go. In all the decisions that the Finuge man has made over his term at the helm of the Kerry Senior team, this is the one most likely to define him as a loss will certainly increase the pressure on him and his management team.

So will it be personal changes or tactical changes that he will look to. Well consider that up to a game ago, Kerry were billed as the only team to tackle Dublin, it is more likely that tactics will need to change. A defensive set

up against Galway negated a lot of the good football that the team has the ability to play. In saying that not Fitzmaurice even could have adjudged for the poor handling and indeed poor shooting by Kerry. A repeat of this and its curtains. With only David Clifford departing Croke Park with a sense of delivery, the remainder of the forward unit will surely step up a notch. Kerry will need to improve their restarts, far too many kick outs went astray on Kerry in Croke Park and a bigger collection of breaks are needed from

the Kerry half back line who were certainly well below par against Galway.

So as Fitzmaurice and his selectors bunker down for the week away, they will have plenty to ponder on and like a war weary general the Kerry manager will have to make some tough decisions and choices and certainly it will be a make or break moment for him.

I think that while Kerry supporters feel let them, the players themselves will also have this feeling and in many ways they will have it magnified as they relaise that it was a bad day in the office. Certainly not the first Kerry team to have one and certainly won't be the last.

WELL DONE NORTHERN IRELAND:

More Than 1,000 Syrian Refugees Welcomed In NI 26th June

On World Refugee Day (June 20th) a further 78 Syrian refugees arrived in Northern Ireland, bringing the total number who have arrived in there to 1,010.

Head of the Civil Service, David Sterling, praised the humanitarian effort by organisations and people across Northern Ireland taking part in the Syrian Vulnerable Persons Relocation Scheme.

"It is fitting that during Refugee Week, we welcomed the 1,000th Syrian refugee to Northern Ireland", he said.

Over the last three years, organisations and people across Northern Ireland have played our part in this humanitarian effort and I am proud of everything we have achieved together to welcome these families into our society and offer them a new future.

Today we are recognising the considerable effort which has helped to ensure the transition has been as smooth as possible.

Ian Snowden, who leads the operational delivery of the programme in the Department for Communities, added: "It has been a challenging experience but is one of the most rewarding projects I have worked on.

"As a father of two boys, every time I see the mums and dads and their children arrive at the airport I am struck by how frightening it would be to move your entire family to a new country and start again. Despite the challenges they face, the refugee families who have arrived in Northern Ireland have embraced life here

"Some have gone on to study at University for the careers they wished to pursue but couldn't in Syria or the surrounding camps. Children are thriving in schools. We have had sporting success and many examples of how the Syrian culture is enriching the communities in which the families live".

HAPPINESS IN THE WORKPLACE



For many of us a great deal of our day is spent in the work place – or thinking about work, therefore it makes sense that we would aim to make our working lives a happy and pleasant experience. However, when faced with various frustrating challenges at work our stress levels can increase and lead to anything from burnout to boredom to distraction. Whilst some levels of stress at work are normal, excessive stress can interfere with productivity as well as our physical and emotional wellbeing.

In her book Real Happiness at Work, Sharon Salzberg discusses eight pillars of happiness in the workplace. These include balance; concentration; compassion; resilience; communication and connection; integrity; meaning; and open awareness. Throughout the book she presents formal meditations along with mini meditations and practices for the reader to try out. These exercises are simple, small and practical ways in which we can achieve greater calm and satisfaction.

The following includes some of the advice she gives us to have a more peaceful and happier day at work.

 Before starting a project, meeting or even a conversation, ask yourself: "What do I most want to see happen from this?"
 Before starting your day, set an intention. She gives the follow ing example: "May I treat everyone today with respect, remem-

bering each person wants to be happy as much as I do." 3. Try to perform a simple act of kindness every day. The following are such examples: "holding a door, saying thank you in a sincere manner, or listening to someone with a clear and focused mind."

4. Pay attention to your feelings. For example, if you're feeling irritated toward a co-worker, pay attention to your irritation, "not so much the story of why you're irritated, but the actual feeling of it." What does it feel like in your body? Where do you feel it? Identifying irritation as it starts helps you prevent an action you might later regret. "With a more immediate recognition of what we're feeling, we have a choice as to how we want to respond in that moment."

 Think about the people who make your job possible, such as a housekeeper, caretaker or fundraiser – and thank them.

These are just some simple measure we can take to generate more happiness in the workplace. Over the next few weeks we will take a closer look at Stress, Workplace Stress and how we car manage it in our lives.

Citizens Information

Know Your Rights:

QUESTION

Our neighbours often have noisy parties that keep us awake at night. We don't really want to call the Gardaí – what else can we do?

ANSWER

Noise nuisance can be a frustrating problem, especially if your family's sleep is disturbed. You should first talk to your neighbours about the noise and explain how it is affecting your family. Keep a note of these discussions. You could also keep a noise diary, noting the type of noise, time, date, duration and its effects on your family.

If this doesn't work, you can write to your neighbours, giving details of the noise and how it is disturbing you. You may suggest to them that you will take legal action if the noise continues. Keep copies of your communication with them.

If your neighbours are private tenants, they are not allowed to engage in anti-social behaviour – this includes persistent noise that interrupts the peace of other homes. You can complain directly to the landlord if you do not get a satisfactory response from the tenants. You can also complain to the Residential Tenancies Board (RTB) if the landlord does not deal with the problem. (The landlord must be registered with the Residential Tenancies Board.)

Tenants of local authority housing must also avoid any nuisance (including noise) to other people in the neighbourhood. If the noise persists, the tenants are in breach of their tenancy agreement and the local authority can take steps to enforce the terms of the agreement.

If the noise continues to be a problem, you could check if there are mediation services available in your area to help you resolve the dispute. You can also file a complaint in the District Court. At least seven days before the date for the hearing of your case, you must serve notice on your neighbours, using the Environmental Protection Agency Act 1992 - noise form of notice. If the court finds in your favour, it can order your neighbours to take measures to prevent or limit the noise.






