

SHOULD YOU BE CONSIDERING SWITCHING YOUR MORTGAGE

Yes, because some of the Irish mortgage lenders have much lower mortgage interest rates compared to others. There has been a lot of discussion recently in the media recently as regards mortgage switching this is because there can be a very substantial difference in interest rates and monthly repayments between lenders. For example on a mortgage of €200000 over 30 years based on a property value of €300000 and comparing current fixed interest rates one lenders 2 year fixed rate is as slow as 2.30% (3.50% APR) which costs €770 per month whereas another lenders 2 year fixed rate is as high as 3.30% (APR 3.96%) monthly repayment €876 per month.

The monthly repayment for the lender with the higher rate is a staggering €106 per month more expensive. Over the term of the mortgage you could pay €38,271.60 (approx) more in interest, this figure will change depending on interest rate changes in the future. Of course you would need to qualify for the mortgage with the new lender and also there are many other considerations and information you need to know before proceeding further. Most lenders will also cover the cost of paying the legals fees for switching your mortgage. An experienced mortgage broker should be able to discuss your options with you in plain simple english and answer any queries you may have.

5 important employment law changes for 2020: Employers guide

1. EU Directive on work-life balance/family-friendly changes

Employers should consider how a new employee right to request flexible and remote working arrangements would affect their operations. Employers will need to update their policies to reflect a new EU directive.

2. Minimum wage increase deferred until March / PRSI increase

The cost of employing staff will rise in 2020. Employer's PRSI will increase from 1st January 2020. The national minimum wage will also increase after the outcome of Brexit negotiations becomes more transparent.

3. Working time records

Tracking your employees' working hours is particularly important given that failure to keep adequate employment records continues to be the most common breach of employment legislation identified by WRC inspectors.

4. Right to Legal Representation in internal disciplinary proceedings

In McKelvey v Irish Rail, the Supreme Court recently ruled that employees have no automatic right to bring legal representatives to internal disciplinary procedures.

5. Maternity leave discrimination

Gender was the second leading ground for discrimination claims in the first half of 2019. Many of these claims arise from the employer's failure to comply with their obligations surrounding the return to work after maternity leave.

Donie's Moment in Time...

Peter Doyle spoke to Mr. Donie Whitty O' Sullivan owner of Moments In Time, which is a vastcollection of old photographs of Killarney town. The photos are of the buildings and the people.

Donie O'Sullivan has been collecting photographs most of his life, and has a computer for over 25 years which has allowed him to collect photos off other people and digitally enhanced them.

Donie also collects postcards, posters and memorabilia but his passion is stories and photographs of Killarney town and its people. Donie believes that every person, every house and every street has a story to tell. These stories can be captured with a photograph and he only uses the photos as a reference to explain the history of Killarney."

Donie is especially fond of black and white images as he explains, "they can have more weight and power, as well as more of a sense of history, it's classic and elegant, even romantic and special." Donie said. "That black and white photographs are my time machine to go back in time to visit the past. It is a labour of love."

Donie grew up on High Street in the sixties. His father was Paddy Whitty O' Sullivan a well-known Jarvev and a former town councillor. Donie recalls kicking ball and playing in the street as there were still not a lot of cars even at that time. Donie said, "It was still a time of unlocked doors and helpful neighbours." Donie said there were a lot of characters. His own family had two houses (33 &34 High Street) next to the Alexandra Hotel which was owned by a Peggy Collins where Patsy Collins Car Sales was until recently. Donie's grandmother had a shop in 33 High Street (33 is still there today). His grandfather Daniel O' Sullivan originally purchased Shamrock House which is still there today. There used to be a blacksmith's forge next to it. Donie's grandfather fought in World War 1 and fought at the battle of Gallipoli. Donie said the lanes were run down in the sixties. The buildings were dilapidated (the good old stock of Killarney came from the laneways). The building that is Gaby's

restaurant today was once owned by Donal O' Cahill who played the part of Billy Malone in the film "The Dawn". The building that is Bricin today was once owned by an Andrew Moynihan. Mae Hearne had a sweet shop and her brother Billy Hearne had a cycle shop, where the Grosvenor Court apartments are today. There was an old Methodist church behind the shops. In the very back of the property there was an old tennis court. A famous Kerry footballer Tadghie Lyne whom donned the green and gold jersey in the 50's and 60's, winning 3 All Ireland's lived in the building where the Killarney Outlook had its office. He was known as "The Prince of Forwards". He sold chips from the back of the shop and his sister Nellie and Mother operated a teashop and it was renowned for chips and ice cream

On the opposite side of the road where Petit Delice is today, Dan Foley had the Park View shop which was owned previously by a George Godfrey. Next store there was of course Dermot Mangan's sweet shop which he ran with his sister Julia, how can I forget the Californian Orange and Buns from Dermot and Julia's drawers. For all those who grew up in the 80's and 90's Sheahan's sweet shop will of course be synonymous with childhood. The building that houses Killarney Carpet and Furniture today is where Daly's SuperValu had their first garage. . I remember my Grandfather bringing me into Husseys pub and it's still going strong to this present day. Crossing back over the street again Donie can recall the late Paddy Foley herding cattle and keeping pigs out the back where Foley's restaurant is today. The building that houses the Sportsman pub today was Mullin's shop and pub. The shop was in the front and the pub in the back similarly to both O' Meara's where Penney's is today. I remember Corkerys bar across the street with sawdust on the floor as well.

The original Eager's was next to Hogan's Lane (Hilliard's Lane) again where Penney's is today and was run by the O' Leary sisters after their aunt Nell Eager passed. They lived over the shop as many store owners did. Other businesses that people will recall are O' Donovan's shop where O' Donovan's apartments are today. McCarthys shop where Quill's Irish Gift store is today. Courtney's bar across the street where the Asian restaurant is today which had a very distinctive facade that was postcard perfect.

Donie is able to zig zag across the street often jumping through decades with relative ease as various photos prompt his memory. There was also pub called Step Ins which was owned by the O'Connors and known as the Aeroplane Bar, where Deirdre's Fashions is today. The building that is Dealz today was once TT O'Connors where they had a grocery shop and pub, with sawdust on the floor. When Dunnes first came to town it was originally located adjacent to the New Market Lane where Quills is today

Going further back in time Donie reveals that the building that is O' Shea's garage today was once the "Temperance Hall" in the 1920's, it was there the Legion GAA club was formed in 1929 Prior to that in the 1850's the Mercy nuns had a school there. Donie said one cannot talk about High Street without mentioning both Hilliard's factory and the Park Place Hotel. Donie shared a little known story about the original Richard Hilliard. He was married to an Ellen Saunders who was a haberdasher on 12 High Street in the 1840's where O' Meara's Pub was. So their union resulted in the foundation of Hilliards factory in 1846. Richard had a workshop out the back where he made his first pair of shoes. In 1940 the total turnover for the factory was 6,000 pairs of boots per week and employed up to 260 people.

As for the Park Place Hotel which was owned by Michael and Carmel O'Donoghue it was a hive of activity in the summer as the Kerry team would eat and have team meetings there after training in the Fitzgerald stadium.

Donie finished by saying that the most exciting events of the mid 1960's were always the Killarney Races, Munster Final, Kerry team training, Tourist season (which was a lot shorter than today) and Birds Bazaar particularly the now defunct Jarvey parade.

Growing up on streets and laneways of Killarney was special and especially when you had 25,000 acres of a playground behind you (National Park).

GROWING UP IN THE CAHERNANE

r. Michael Leane has a wealth of knowledge about Old Killarney. Michael is a member of Kerry's Historical Society. Michael almost has a photographic memory about the Killarney he grew up in.

Michael was born in 1934. He grew up in the Cahernane House Hotel. Michael's father Daniel was the head porter. Michael said that both his sister Marie.R.I.P. and his brother Patrick also grew up there.

Michael explained that, "in the summer when the hotel was open we lived in the lodge at the top of the driveway and in the winter we lived in the hotel." Michael said that when the new bridge was built the lodge was demolished. The hotels guests were mostly English.

Michael said, "the Muckross road was lined with Lime trees on either side from the Flesk bridge to the Golden Gates. Michael explained, "that there were very few houses on the Muckross road at that time." Michael added that there were in fact no B and B houses or hotels on the Muckross road.

Michael said the land that now belongs to the Glendale today was owned by a Mr. Edmund Bullock who was a photographer that worked with the infamous Louis Anthony. Mr. Bullock was also an entomologist. Michael said that one used to be able to see the salmon spawning in season from the Flesk bridge. Michael went to school with the Trants of Flesk bridge in the old Mercy Convent where the Pastoral centre is today. After 2nd class Michael went to the Monastery.

Michael said the first house after the bridge on the left side was the Lodge leading to the Priory which was sold to D.F. O' Sullivan in 1938. Michael said that Lord Kenmare sold property prior to the war and that most of his land outside of the Demense was sold.

The second house on the left hand side was a large house well off the road which belonged to a Mr. Peter Huggart. That is the origin of the name of Huggart lane on High Street. The house is where the Old Weir Lodge is today.

The third house at Woodlawn Cross belonged to a Mr. Patrick Burns who purchased lands on both sides from Lord Kenmare. The next house was a bungalow where Randles Garage is today. It belonged to a Mr. Con Casey. The next bungalow belonged to the McCarthys. The building is still there today. It houses the rent a bike.

Loughnane's Garage was at the top of the Ross road where the Amber petrol station is today. At the time petrol came in a barrell. Michael explained that Thompson's Garage on New Street supplied it. They were the first agents for petrol. There were very few cars at the time and during the war only Doctors, Priests and Hackney drivers could get petrol.

ORDER OF MALTA CELEBRATE 80 YEARS IN KILLARNEY

In a year that the Killarney Order of Malta celebrate 80 years Peter Doyle speaks to Captain Joseph M. Looney about the history of the Killarney Unit.

The Order of Malta can trace it's origins back to the Knights of Malta in 1099 during the Crusades. Nationally there are over 4,000 volunteers comprising of 80 units in most major towns and cities and this year, the Order of Malta in Killarney is celebrating it's 80th anniversary. It was founded in October 1939 by Father Moynihan and Commander O' Connell when Father Moynihan asked 20 sea scouts if they would be interested in a first aid unit. This started which has now become a hugely successful organisation in the town of Killarney. Following the initial first aid course conducted by Dr. Slattery and Commander O' Connell, this was followed by Dr. Ivo O' Sullivan followed when Dr. Slattery died. Lectures began in 1938. The group held their first exam at Easter in 1939 and this had a 12 member limit at the time. Initially all duties were conducted on foot but in case of a serious injury an ambulance was called from the hospital. During the war the Order of Malta conducted mock ambushes which took place at the Flesk Bridge.

Today the Killarney Unit has over 50 senior

members, youth members aged 16 - 18 yes and over 60 cadet members (under 16's) Their fleet includes 3 ambulances and one 4 X 4. The Order of Malta are active at all major events in the area including the Ring of Kerry cycle and the Killarney races.

Officers over the years included Joseph explained that Sergeant Jack O' Keefe 1st officer took over from Bishop Moynihan and Commander O' Connell, Captain John Tarrant who served for over 25yrs, Captain Sean O' Keeffe, Captain Donal McCarthy, Lieutenant Jeremiah McCarthy, Captain Joseph M. Loone Lieutenant Collete Kiely, Volunteer Geraldine Harnett, Adj. Noel A. Lucey who is currently in charge. Dr. John McCullough was the medical officer for over 30 years. Adj. Michael Leane is a member for over 70 years.

Joseph explained that the Order of Malta is funded through the generosity of local people who support their annual collection while donations are also received for major duties. The Order of Malta used to convene on the top floor of the Old Town Hall from 1939 until 1996 when they moved to St. Theresa's school at the back of the Pastoral centre. They moved again in 2017 to St. Mary's Parish Hall where they have the sole use of two rooms with kitchen facilities. Until recently they used to park their fleet in Fitzgerald Stadium but they now have the use of a shed at the old Ross Product site. New members are always welcome. Joseph added that if anyone has any information they would like to share they can send it to Killarney.@orderofmalta.ie















1949 IRISH OPEN AMATUER GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP

1949 irish open amateur golf championship, played at Killarney 18th to 23rd September.

The Irish open golf championship of 1949 was played at Killarney, and at that time local doctor Billy O'Sullivan was one of the principle club committee members, and because of his prominence within Irish golfing circles, he was totally responsible for bringing the championship to Killarney, the club in also recognising his involvement honoured by Dr Billy by making him the club captain for 1949.

The championship was played from the 18th to the 23rd of September and in the semifinal on the Thursday afternoon of the 22nd Dr Billy defeated Mick Power of Muskerry G.C. on the 18th green.

Dr. Billy then faced fellow Irish international Brennie Scannell of Woodbrook golf club in the final of Friday which was then played over 36 holes, with 18 holes played in the morning and a further possible 18 holes in the afternoon. The scene was set for a momentous tussle, and a huge crowd turned out to see the occasion what was thankfully a fine day.


The spectators and players had enjoyed the week long with evening entertainment each evening in the various hotels and what was then termed the new town hall to the likes of Mick Delahunty and his orchestra, admission was 5 shillings.

Billy was 4 up after the morning round but this was quickly reeled in in the early holes of the afternoon round, and after a dingdong battle the outcome was finally reached on the 18th green with Dr Billy emerging victorious.

The week closed with yet another dance in the townhall on the Friday with the music provided by the stardusters, admission was three shillings and ninepence

(Footnote, if you flew from London to Shannon to the newly built airport at Shannon via Aer Lingus for the championship, the far was a staggering sum of £15.10 fifteen pounds ten shillings, which would`ve been about 15 weeks of the average wage)



Killarney Legion ended 43 years of heartache by capturing the O'Donoghue Cup for the first time since 1976 with a tremendous display against a Dr Crokes side that had no answer to the winners intensity and supreme fitness.

Legion dominated every line of the field from start to finish and it would be fair to say that Dr Crokes were flattered to be within 6 points of their opponents at the games end. On a bitterly cold day that featured driving wind and rain, the game failed to live up to pre match expectations as Legion played a brand of football that their rivals couldn't live with on the day.

The game had a number of flash points as the Killarney town neighbours familiarity with each other boiled over at times. There were 6 yellow cards shown during the game (3 apiece), and reds handed out to Dr Crokes Cillian O'Regan, and Killarney Legion's Shaun Keane, in the 50th minute. To be fair to both sides though, the game was played in a predominantly good spirited manner. Dr Crokes opened the scoring in the 6th minute with a Shane Murphy pointed free, before Legion's Jack O'Neill equalised from play 2 minutes later. Jamie O'Sullivan and Micheal Burns traded points before James O'Donoghue nudged Legion into a 0-3 to 0-2 lead in the 13th minute. O'Donoghue had a fine game for Legion and his workrate and accuracy were to prove vital to the final outcome.

Conor Keane and Daithi Casey traded frees before the influential Jack O'Neill slotted over his second point of the game for Legion. Tony Brosnan pointed a free in the 22nd minute to bring Dr Crokes to within a single score once more. Legion then introduced Thomas Moriarty and he was to have a major influence on the game scoring a haul of 1-4 as her terrorised the Dr Crokes defence.

The remainder of the first half belonged to Legion as they began to completely dominate around the middle of the field. Kieran Slattery was ravenous around the breaking ball, and he fed the hard working Darragh Lyne for a point after a great run, Conor Keane slotted a free, Moriarty scored his first from play, and James O'Donoghue popped over a free kick to see the green and white take a 0-9 to 0-4 lead in at the half time break. Dr Crokes were expected to come out with all guns blazing for the second half but instead it was Killarney Legion who put the game to bed with a blistering 7 minute spell in which they rattled off 5 points without reply, to push 0-14 to 0-4 ahead. Jack O'Neill, Thomas Moriarty, Conor Keane, and James O'Donoghue (2) did the damage for the rampant Legion forward division.

Legion were completely dominating, and even when Dr Crokes managed to get some meaningful possession, Podge O'Connor was proving to be very effective in the sweeping role in front of the full forward line.

The black and amber eventually found a breakthrough in the 40th minute when Mark O'Shea finished to the net after Michael Potts effort was saved. Tellingly, it was Dr Crokes first

score in 18 minutes. Dr Crokes comeback didn't last long however as Legion's Thomas Moriarty had the ball in the back of the net 4 minutes later, after Shane Murphy had initially made a great save, but the ball rebounded kindly to Legion's super sub.

The game became rather scrappy for a period with tempers starting to fray, and O'Regan and Keane were sent to the line after a melee involving a number of players. Daithi Casey and Conor Keane (free) traded points, before Johnny Buckley, now stationed at full forward, punched Casey's long delivery to the back of the net. Casey (free) and Denis Sheehan traded points before Mark O'Shea scored his second goal of the game in the 68th minute to put a better gloss on the score line.

There was still time for Thomas Moriarty to score a point with the last kick of the game, and as he punched the air in triumph, the Legion supporters could be heard far and wide around Fitzgerald Stadium as they savoured a famous and well deserved triumph.

As Killarney Legion manager Stephen Stack basked in the glory of O'Donoghue Cup success, he reflected on how the club left no stone unturned in their quest for their first title since 1976, and said that former club greats had a huge part to play in the victory.

"The biggest problem of getting over a gap of 43 years is that it can be a milestone around your neck if you just refer to it in the negative. We never did that. Last week we did a 10 minute clip that was very good and we got the captain from '76 on it, and he said that it was' time to pass the baton'. He said that we have wanted the next team to be the team that's spoken about. They played Spa in '76 and were underdogs. He said what won them the match (in '76), was about 10 minutes into the first half when one of the Legion players won a 30/70 ball against, and it was those moments today that I thought were massive in the game".

Stack said that the players did everything that was asked of them and lauded his management team. He also said that a couple of special people had been on his players' minds throughout the season.

"I must pay particular tribute to Pat Flanagan. I've huge regard for Pat in the first instance as a person because he's a marvellous human being, and I'm so thrilled that Pat was with me on this journey along with Tomás, Peter and Enda, and I really could not pay a big enough tribute to him. If Pat and myself and the management team asked those fellas to go up Carrauntoohill 3 times in the one day they would do it, they wouldn't ask a question".

"I couldn't pay a big enough tribute to the memory of Weeshie and Niall McGillicuddy. We never forgot them. Sometimes fellas can think that that's pressure but from the very first time that we took the field this year we had a little bit of a routine and I'd say for about 150 sessions they were always in our mind. I'd also like to pay a tribute to a man that is thankfully with us and that's the great Johnny Culloty. What a marvellous moment for Johnny. He's been at Kerry training sessions and Legion training sessions, he's been absolutely incredible".

"I'm thrilled for the Legion club. They're a great club and a great bunch of players and they've given us everything".

James O'Donoghue has had his fair share of success over the years in a Kerry jersey and has accumulated every honour that the game has to offer, including the Player of the Year award in 2014. It was obvious after the game how much winning the O'Donoghue Cup with club teammates meant to him though.

"It means everything. You could see by the way we went about closing the game that there was a lot of nerves. We haven't won a lot as a team and the team are probably better than that. We built up enough of a lead that we could just hang on and that was all we needed to do. It does feel like a massive weight off the shoulders and just to be celebrating inside with those lads – we've gone to the well so often and just didn't come out the right side. To be in that dressing room there and to be so elated, it's why we put in the torturous hours and why we are still playing in December. You'd play every night of the week if you could enjoy success this much".

Like Stephen Stack, an emotional O'Donoghue remembered the people that had gone before and said that Niall McGillicuddy and Weeshie Fogarty had a special place in the hearts of the Legion players. He also reflected on what a huge influence his own family members had on him as a player.

"There's two people that have been unbelievably important to this training group all year, that's Niall McGillicuddy, who passed away, a young lad, a Kerry minor, he would nearly have been on this panel in the next year or two, we think about him every night. The same with Weeshie Fogarty, we know how passionate he was and how much he gave to the club. Those two people really drove us on"."On a personal point of view, there's two people, my grandfather Jameso was club president and he really inspired me and made me proud to be a Legion person, and my aunt Mary, my father's sister, Jameso's daughter, you know if we ever won anything she'd be down to the house and she'd be so delighted like. It's those people that you want to reward. It's so fantastic, we were waiting so long to get a trophy".

Dr Crokes selector Niall Botty O'Callaghan has seen some great days on the sideline with his club but said that on the day Legion were the much better side and deserved to win.

"Legion were outstanding today. They won every battle. They won all the lines on the field and we couldn't get a platform. They beat us fair and square. We were happy enough to be 5 points down at half time as we felt if we got one or two scores at the start of the second half ,if it gets close near the end and tightens up then they might get a bit jiggy because they haven't won it and we know we can but they came out all guns blazing and they got the scores that mattered. Our goals never really influenced the game. We got goals when we were 10 points down. We didn't get goals to bring us to 4 points and that's all down to the Legion, their performance, their coaching, everything about them today was top class"

Botty said that although his side were beaten fair and square that they would be back, and he challenged anyone to tell him any differently.

"We have to hold our hands up because we've had a lot of good days. They've beaten us twice in the last 8 or 9 years and fair and square on both occasions. The one good thing about the Crokes is when we win we win with class and when we lose we lose with a bit of class. This idea that the Crokes are finished, I dare anybody to say that to me. There's fellas in that dressing room that are only 30 or 31 years of age. We are going to get a rest. Anyone that says that the Crokes are gone or over the hill...I challenge them next year. You learn more when you lose, and losing to your biggest rivals than when you win so this year has been a learning curve".







If ingested, it can result in a foreign body obstruction to the gastrointestinal tract requiring surgical intervention. Glass ornaments can break, cutting pet's paws or face or if ingested, they can also cause internal

lacerations. Mistletoes also pose a serious risk to your pets. In fact, "in large amounts, consuming mistletoe can cause hypotension, ataxia, seizures, and even possible death and Poinsettias are toxic to animals.

*Chemicals like ammonia, bleach, and chlorine are dangerous to animals; make sure that your pet is in another room when you clean. Even allnatural products can cause stomach irritations. *If you have an outdoor pet, make sure they have some sort of shelter. Even just a makeshift plastic-container-turned-cat-shelter is better than nothing and don't assume that your dog's refusal to come inside means that they aren't freezing. Often dogs that are too cold will curl up in a fetal position and stay still in order to retain whatever body heat they have left.







Jardening with Killarney Outlook

FOCUS ON HEDGING

Hedges can make a much more natural background to a garden than a wall or a fence. They can provide shelter and are cheaper and require a small amount of maintenance. Because a hedge allows the wind to filter through it reduces its velocity. Tall or low growing, dipped or informal, there is a hedging plant for every purpose. One thing to remember about a hedge is that it is intended to be a permanent feature in the garden so therefore should be chosen with care and planted in well prepared soil. To choose the right hedge for your garden, here are a few pointers to think about:

- 1. The type of soil you have.
- 2. How exposed the garden is i.e. what direction is it facing.
- 3. The eventual height and width the hedge will be
- 4. Does it need to be evergreen.

When you have chosen the type of hedge that you want, it's time to prepare the soil. Start preparing the soil by digging thoroughly and forking in some well rotted farmyard manure. Hedges can be planted all year around but the ideal time is between November and March as all hedging plants will be dormant at this time.

What that means is when you go to buy your hedging plants, they are lifted straight from the ground and are called bare-rooted hedging. This enables you to replant straight back into the ground when you get them home. Just make sure that when planting that the roots are spread out well as this will encourage them to root quickly when the growing season starts. If you have missed the bare rooted season at the end of March, you can plant container grown hedging all year around.






