## LEGION ADOPTS ONE CLUB CONSTITUTION



egion GAA Club in Killarney has unanimously approved the adopting of a new constitution which will bring the GAA club and LGFA together.

The Club members recently unanimously approved the adoption of this new Constitution and Killarney Legion are now likely to be the first club in the country to incorporate and formalise the One Club concept into the official Club Constitution.

PRO of the club Enda Walshe looks at what it means.

The Club Constitution is the document in which members describe the processes by which we interact with one another and is intended to ensure that the Club is organised in a fair and equitable and transparent manner.Up to very recently our Club operated under a Club Constitution which was passed at a Special General Meeting in December 2002. That 2002 document was largely based on the template provided by the GAA with some slight amendments to suit the Club requirements at the time and also specific Club Bye Laws in the preceding years.

two club situation, one affiliated to the GAA and another affiliated to the LGFA. How would this pan out in a balanced manner in relation to allocation of facilities ,sponsorship/revenue and membership rates amongst others was one of the biggest considerations. To that end in 2017 the GAA in association with the LGFA and the Camogie Association published a "One Club Guidelines" document which was intended to address this .As a Club Killarney Legion did adopt some of the recommendations which proved very welcome and successful but as a Club which always strives to treat all our members equally and fairly we agreed, at the 2020 AGM, that a total redraft of the Club Constitution was needed.A steering committee of Pat Moynihan, Selina Looney, Tom Griffin, Elizabeth Mohan, Tim O Leary and John Doona met on numerous occasions during 2021(remotely) and using the GAA Club Constitution,LGFA Constitution and One Club Recommendations as reference they eventually came up with a very unique document which they believe will serve all members of Killarney Legion GAA well .In effect it is bringing together the two

organisations,GAA and LGFA,in the Club,something that had always been strived for,a shared approach for the benefit of everyone. The Club members recently unanimously approved the adoption of this

It's the talk of the town ......

have quietly been trying to raise the status of women who work in this town – the town has one of the oldest branches in Ireland and one of the most distinguished – to the first citizen, a woman, Mayor of Killarney, Marie Moloney, to the gathering at the racecourse, the town reflected its sadness and outrage.

But the invisibility of women in the Killarney public realm is something that has been apparent for decades, pardon the contradiction.

It is becoming more glaring as we continue to put up yet more monuments that reflect one gender only.

About the only town centre monument to women in Killarney is the "spéir bhean" – the supernatural version of Ireland which appeared as a beautiful young woman in 18th century "aisling" or dream vision poetry of the great poets.

Away from the centre, we have a bench by the Flesk River to Beatrice Grosvenor, and we have the Grotto in Rock Road.

We have still no prominent public monument to the real women that mostly built and mostly worked and had the vision for the successful modern tourist industry in this town.

We have some very noticeable monuments - fighting stags, the vulture eagle, the Monsignor, the Friar, the solider, the Fusiliers cross, ploughing, the musician, the wheel in the fern garden and so on , but alas none to women.

It would be great for instance to see a few women, teachers, nuns or lay volunteer, added to the men's on the monument of Mission Road. Perhaps readers have names of women who went on the missions?

A woman in a black and white Victorian waitress dress uniform with a notebook and a tray energetically stepping out from the Market Cross, a bit on the lines of Alan Hall's wonderful Monsignor O'Flaherty statue, might be a fitting and a fetching tribute to the contribution to the women of Killarney.

#### A direct link between bus and rail stations is vital

A Walkway link between rail station and bus station in Killarney may be "low priority" in the funding streams of two semi-state bodies. But the link is very much a top priority among local representatives. And strangely, this week after Barry Kenny of larnród Eireann witnessed there was a full council, not just Killarney based representatives, behind the request, there is renewed hope he will convey a strong message to management.

No pedestrian link is in place to link the Victorian train station and the bus station in Killarney. The whole site was once part of the same yard. The two companies were at one stage one.

That there is no direct link is "ludicrous" to use the words of a local councillor. A few things are keeping the door open, however, and this week the chink in the fence was widened.

A pre Christmas letter from larnród Eireann, to Cllr John O'Donoghue outlined three main options "to improve connectivity".

The rail company identified three options.. A pedestrian route through the Bus Eireann public car park and the train station at the end of the rail platform was one: a new underpass was another and then there is the possibility of building a footbridge.

The investment is "low" on the list of priorities – but it has not been ruled out.

The easiest and least costly is obviously the gap in the fence. But a footbridge , would also do, John said.

Saying it was ludicrous to see people hauling cases through the whole shopping centre to get next door, he will settle for functionality in the footbridge, " and the aesthetics can wait!", he told me.

He is not letting go and is energised by the backing of the full council for the suggestion. Barry Kenny may not have realised until this week how important an issue this was, John said.

" I think he will take the concerns of the council back again," the councillor said.

## Road Lining promised to ease congestion at McDonalds

We live in strange times. Travel in and out of the county which plummeted during 2020 is slowly returning according to new figures.

Kerry Airport has recorded better than expected passenger numbers for 2021.

At the end of 2020 after the first year of the pandemic, the airport's numbers dropped to just under 83,000.

Last year, the early part of 2021 looked no less promising, with predictions of similar low numbers.

But this week, chief executive officer John Mulhern , revealed that passenger figures for 2021 year have hit 115,000, "well up" on 2020.

But still a long way off the almost 370,000 passengers flying to and from Kerry in 2019. Rail numbers too been released. The Mallow to Tralee line ferried almost 360,000 people last year. Most of these will have got off, naturally, in Killarney. This was up on the abysmal 256,000 of 2020 but still a long way from the heady climb to 686,000 in 2019.

What then are we to make of the increased traffic congestion in Killarney everyone is complaining about?

McDonald's themselves have "chipped" into identifying the solution, which is also linked to the pandemic.

A new filter lane is necessary at McDonald's , and it may be time to think about towing cars off double yellow lines and entrances to ease the traffic jams for McDonalds on one of the main roads in and out of the town, a council meeting was told by Mayor Marie Moloney.

"We are constantly receiving telephone calls from the residents who are frustrated and concerned at the dangers being encountered at this junction and not being able to access their homes," she said.

The problem arose because "the vast majority were using McDonalds as a Drive Through as distinct from going into the outlet itself, " the town engineer, John Ahern, said. This appears to be the case.

A return to normal trading conditions including dine on February 1st "if the pandemic regulations are eased as planned", will ease matters, the outlet's manager Martin Hoban said, responding very quickly to media queries. He has had discussions with town engineers too.

A road lining contractor has been awarded lining and other works, the council says.

It's not just Killarney: Traffic congestion leading to McDonald's Tralee last year led to appeals to motorists by Gardai not to block the way to the hospital.

## She was going for a run..... Ashling Murphy remembered

There was a tsuamni of grief throughout the country and across the world following the tragic death of 23 year old Ashling Murphy from Tullamore in Co. Offaly last week.

A wave of grief, shock and anger was felt by everyone as details of the shocking death were announced and many groups and clubs held vigils in the days following her death.

Hundreds attended a vigil in Killarney at Ross Golf Club which was organised by Lily MacMonagle from MACademy and Nave Yoga on Friday afternoon, while clubs like Kilcummin GAA Club and Spa GAA Club held walks and lit candles in memory of Ashling.

Leading the tributes in Killarney to the 23 year old Primary School student, Cathaoirleach of Killarney Municipal District. Cllr Marie Moloney conveyed her sincere and genuine sympathy to the family, friends, work colleagues and pupils of the Late Aisling Murphy.

"I was with great shock and horror that I learned of the brutal and untimely death of Aisling. A young innocent woman who was simply going for a jog in broad daylight. I have attended a vigil and seen the many vigils from all over this country, attend by both women and men, which indicates the abhorrence that all feel about the brutal and cold murder of this young woman and indeed the level of fear that women, in particular, live with.

No woman, nor indeed men, but predominantly women, should have to live in fear, not to have to keep looking over their shoulder every time they are out for a walk or run.

Change is needed both by government and by the courts. Sentencing needs to be strengthened with proper and lengthy confinement for assaults on women and for episodes of Domestic Violence.

Violence against women must be stopped and I am calling on Government to commit to radical structural reform in the implementation of the 3rd National Strategy on Domestic, Sexual and Gender Based Violence (DSGBV), which is scheduled for publication later this year. I am also calling for more funding for the Psychiatric services which may alleviate a lot of domestic and

#### public violence", Cllr. Marie Moloney said.

ADAPT Kerry also responded to the horrific murder of Aisling Murphy who was killed as she was out running along the canal in Tullamore in Co. Offaly. Offering their condolences, the general manager at ADAPT Kerry said "This shocking killing of a young talented woman has shaken the whole country. And it has left many people feeling unsafe in their communities. Aisling Murphy's murder is a stark reminder that as a society we are a long way from having true equality in our Country. We know that one in four women in Ireland experience some form of abuse in their lifetime. ADAPT Kerry reiterate that the way to combat violence against women is to provide true and equal access, and full participation to all women. Perpetrators and Abusers need to be held accountable for their actions across all systems. It is not good enough that women feel unsafe in their homes or their communities.

Ashling was a lover of traditional Irish music and a member oh her local Comhaltas branch. She was among the finest exponents of the concertina and fiddle and was also learning the uilleann pipes before her untimely death.

"All of us in Comhaltas and the world of Irish traditional music are shocked at the untimely death of Ashling Murphy. She was an exceptionally talented young lady who made an unforgettable impression on all who had the good fortune to know her" a statement from the organisation said.

Education Minister Norma Foley also sent her sympathy to the Murphy Family saying All of us are united in grief as we offer our heartfelt and sincere condolences to the Murphy family and the school community at Scoil Naomh Colmcille in these most trying of times. We are mindful of the

## *Time to give women more protection to defend themselves*

In the wake of the recent tragedy of the murder of Aisling Murphy and the everincreasing assaults of women in Irish society, Deputy Michael Healy Rae TD has called on the Irish Government to open a real debate in legalising the use of Mace so women in particular would be able to defend themselves against unprovoked attacks and assaults.

"Like everyone I was devasted when I heard of the death of Aisling Murphy and as a father of two daughters myself, I just cannot start to begin to know the grief of the Murphy family to have such a bright light quenched so cruelly in a middle of the day in such a rural setting.

"It is time that we open a discussion in Irish society with a view to giving women in particular more protection by legalising the use of Mace or pepper spray as it is more commonly known" Deputy Michael Healy Rae has said. Currently the European Union does not regulate

pepper spray, leaving member countries free to regulate it themselves. Pepper sprays containing noxious substances are currently prohibited in Ireland, the UK, Belgium and Sweden but In Switzerland, Germany, and Portugal, pepper spray is permitted with a license.

"I know from answering a lot of calls at my office in the last two days, that this is not just a whim issue, it is a real issue as you can see with the number of women across all walks of Irish society now sharing their often-terrifying stories on social media. How long as we just going to push the issue under the carpet. The very least we should do is open a real debate in making Pepper Spray a legal alternative for women to defend themselves in such violent situations.

he mother of a young man who was murdered in Killarney almost 13 years ago has said that empathy needs to be taught to children to help bring an end to violence.

Stephen Lyne was only 17 years old when he was stabbed to death on Ross Road just yards from his home.

"As I watched the funeral of Ashling Murphy from home this week, it brought back painful memories of my son Stephen's funeral", Lotte Lyne said.

"This whole week has brought up all the emotions I Stephen Lyne was only 17 years felt after my sons murder and I have been reflecting old when he was stabbed to with the nation and the world on what happened *death* to Aishling Murphy and how it brought the reality

to the forefront, that we as women, do not feel safe in this world of ours. The fact that we have to watch over our shoulder when we are out alone, how we have to make decisions based on staying safe in our daily lives it is not right and it is not ok", she added.

"However, I think it is not just a gender issue, it is much bigger than that, it is a reflection of our society today. Humanity has been desensitized and violence is on the rise, taking a life has become an every day happening, without remorse or regret", Lotte said.

Feeling angry is a natural reaction and across the world people are saying ENOUGH, this has to stop. But how do we change the tide of this tsunami of violence across the globe?

"I believe that the only way is to change the heart - behind the violence. We have to raise empathy and compassion in the worlds children and young people so that we will create a safer, more compassionate world", Lotte added.

## COMPLETE THE CAO APPLICATION THOROUGHLY AS THE CLOSING DATE DRAWS NEAR

Whether the standard Leaving Cert exam or the hybrid combination of written and accredited grades option is provided by the State Examinations Commission (SEC) this year, CAO applicants will still be keen to secure a coveted college place. As the 1st February, the closing day for applying to the CAO looms large, its due time to make sure that the application form is thoroughly and accurately completed.

Almost all applications to CAO are made via "Apply," the interactive online application facility, which remains open until 1st Feb. on the CAO website, www.cao.ie . "Apply" is user friendly and easy to follow, particularly as CAO provides an 'Interactive Demo' to enable you make a trial application.

Go online at www.cao.ie and click on "Apply" to open your CAO Account. Enter your personal details. Tick the qualifications and assessment section(s) that are relevant to you. Enter your payment option – Credit/Debit card or Fee Payment Form. If you are paying by credit/ debit card you will be redirected to a payment screen. Create your own account password. Click on "Proceed with application" to obtain your CAO application number and your application details will appear on screen.

Log into "My Application" by entering your CAO application number, date of birth and password. Provide the additional personal information. If you are applying on the basis of Leaving Cert (1985-2022) results enter the name and address of your second level school(s) and the years attended. If you are a Leaving Cert 2022 candidate tick the box provided. If you have previously sat the Leaving Cert, provide the year(s) in which you sat the exam and your exam number(s).

Add your Level 8 and Level 7/6 course choices by 1st Feb. by clicking on "Add Level 8 course choices" and/or click on "Add Level 7/6 course choices." You may apply for a maximum of ten course choices on each list. List your courses based on genuine order of preference.

If you are a mature applicant, click on 'Mature Application Form' to update your mature application form.

If you wish to disclose a Disability/Specific Learning Difficulty (SLD) and to apply to the Disability Access Route to Education (DARE) click the "Modify Disability/SLD and DARE Application Status" button and follow the instructions provided. If you wish to apply for the Higher Education Access Route (HEAR), a third level alternative admissions scheme for school leavers from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds who are resident in the Republic of Ireland, click the "HEAR Application" button and follow the instructions provided.

If you intend to apply for a maintenance fee grant, indicate this on your CAO online application form. CAO will then provide your identification, contact and offer/acceptance details to the grant authority, Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI).

Once you are satisfied with the detail you have submitted, click 'Log Out' to exit. All of your details will then have been submitted to CAO.

Check your course choices immediately via the "My Application" facility to ensure that they are correct. Use the online change courses facility on the CAO website if you need to amend or add courses. This facility is free of charge until 1st Feb. You may also use the online change of course choices facility from 4th February to 1st March (fee  $\in$ 10).

"Apply" is user friendly and secure and allows you to submit your application from the privacy of your own home.

## NEW ONLINE PLATFORM OFFERS FREE COURSES TO MIGRANTS AND REFUGEE

A new online platform that provides free access to education and training courses for people from refugee and migrant backgrounds in County Kerry has been launched. SaorEd is a collaborative initiative between three Irish non-profit organisations; Doras, New Horizon, and Dignity Partnership. It is built on the Kiron online learning platform which has been designed specifically for refugees and underserved communities and is already widely used in the Middle East and Europe.

SaorEd, available at www.saored.com, aims to provide free access to a range of entry-level and advanced courses. Initial offerings include English language courses, information technology (IT) skills, healthcare, and career preparation courses. The courses on offer are mostly in English, with some in Arabic. Navigation interfaces are available in Arabic and Farsi and those behind the venture hope to expand the range of courses and languages on offer.

SaorEd is intended to fill the gaps in existing education and training programmes. While free English language classes are provided by the 16 Education and Training Boards (ETBs) and others, for example, places

on these are often difficult to obtain. Yet, language skills are essential for the integration and wellbeing of protection applicants and refugees.



Initial language courses provided on

SaorEd include an introduction to the English language, intermediate English for University, English for Arabic speakers, and advanced English for the workplace. The IT Skills study track will cover basic digital skills (in English and Arabic), intermediate IT skills (including a course on 'Living in a Digital World'), as well as more advanced courses like web design with HTML, CSS, and Javascript.

SaorEd provides study programs using open online courses (MOOCs) from reputable education providers. The initial offerings are based on a survey of over 100 people who are in or have transitioned out of Direct Provision. Over the coming months, the platform will be extended to include courses in other areas that will help open pathways to employment and further education.

### POLITICAL VIEW



#### A Kerry County Councillor has claimed that the future of Caherciveen and South Kerry is bright.

After many generations in the doldrums, the people living in the vast area covering South Kerry, that includes the Gaeltachts of Ballinskelligs and Dromid, Knightstown to Kenmare, Caherdaniel to Kells and especially the town of Cahersiveen, are at long last seeing hope for the future and are feeling excited about a number of proposed projects currently in the pipeline. That is according to local Fianna Fáil Councillor, Michael Cahill.

"The Caherciveen, Iveragh region has suffered more than most at the hands of forced emigration and has been a blackspot not just in Kerry but in Ireland" stated the Deputy Mayor of Kerry County Council and Cathaoirleach of Kenmare Municipal District.

"The town of Cahersiveen has been on it's knees for decades, with closed businesses, for sale signs, empty houses and dereliction, now thankfully, this is all changing. There is a buzz about the place now that we had not experienced before and we must ensure that this hope is delivered upon" stated the Rossbeigh based Councillor.

"While the perception might be out there that the bounce came when the creators of 'Star Wars' decided to film on Skellig Michael while basing themselves in Portmagee, the reality is that there are many more fantastic ingredients



in this successful recipe" said the Deputy Mayor of Kerry County Council and Cathaoirleach of Kenmare Municipal District.

"Eleven years ago, the South Kerry Development Partnership commissioned a feasibility study into the creation of a 32km Greenway along the disused railway line from Glenbeigh to Caherciveen and onto Renard. Following a Deputation from the town that I led, including the then Chairman of Cahersiveen Chamber Alliance, Jack Fitzpatrick and Phil O Sullivan of the Shebeen Bar, Cahersiveen has been included as a project in the Rural Regeneration and Development Fund at a total cost of €19.5m. This is a huge investment in Caherciveen and is hugely exciting and will be transformative for the town. Following another campaign that I led, Cork/Kerry Primary Healthcare announced that the development of a Primary Care Centre was at an early stage, centred in Cahersiveen, which they described as 'a one stop shop' for a raft of health services for the town and the Iveragh region" said Councillor Cahill.

"We have the development by local entrepreneurs of the Skellig Six18 Distillery and Visitor Experience. We have the expansion of Quinlan's Kerry Fish. There is the imminent arrival to the area of Aldi grocery store that created 80 construction and 20 permanent jobs. This store is now due to open its doors on the 31st of January next. And just recently, the National Transport Authority confirmed increased services for the region, including a Hop on, Hop off two way bus service on the Ring of Kerry, with a minimum of five services, both ways every day" stated Councillor Cahill. This was another project that Councillor Cahill had strongly lobbied for over the past number of years, raising it at Kerry County Council meetings and with Government Ministers and Departments.

"All of this feeds in to additional jobs and livelihoods available to our sons and daughters who previously would have had to emigrate to survive. All of these are building blocks in what will be a modern South Kerry/Iveragh with proper facilities, where people can live in some comfort while raising families, looking after loved ones, all in the area they were born into or have now chosen for its beauty and lifestyle" said the Fianna Fáil man.

"I am convinced however, the one essential ingredient to ensure continued success for the generations after us is, The South Kerry Greenway, the Gamechanger as I have said before. We look forward to a positive ruling to allow this lifeline to proceed" stated Councillor Cahill.

"When developed, the South Kerry Greenway will transform Caherciveen and all of South Kerry for the betterment of its people and for generations to come" added Councillor Cahill, an ardent supporter of the project since day one.

## DENTAL MEDICAL CARD SCHEME **IN CRISIS**

. . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . .

Cllr. John O'Donoghue has called on Kerry County Council to contact the Minister for Health and the HSE to urgently intervene in the Dental Medical Card Scheme which is reaching crisis point with many Dental Practices refusing to take on new patients due to it being financially unviable.

"I have spoken to numerous dentists in recent weeks about this issue and they paint a very bleak picture of the problem which has hit crisis point", Cllr. O'Donoghue told Killarney Outlook. The Dental Medical Card Scheme has not been updated in years and it has led to a situation whereby it is no longer financially feasible for Dentists to take on patients who are on the scheme. Some are still seeing their original patients but not taking on any new cases, while many more have simply stopped treating any patient who comes in to them with a Medical Card. It has led to a situation whereby I do not believe that at present, there is any Dentist in the county of Kerry taking on new patients who wish to use their Medical Card. In recent days I have rang Dentists in Killarney, Tralee, Cahersiveen, Kenmare, Kilorglin, Listowel, Dingle and many more places in between and I

could not find any who were willing to take on a new patient who wishes to use their Medical Card. The fault in this issue lies not with the Dentists as although I am not a business man, I know the guickest way to go out of business is to operate at a loss. Indeed, I have huge sympathy for all who work in the Dental surgeries in our county, and beyond because this is a nationwide problem, as they are the people who have to face members of the public and tell them they can't give them the treatment they so badly need. Many unfortunate people when faced with being unable to use their Medical Card for their treatment, and being unable to afford to pay for the treatment privately, are now opting to suffer the indignity of having the offending tooth or teeth extracted rather than treated. This is an appalling situation and I am horrified to think that any individual living in our County, or Country would be treated so poorly. It is a shocking indictment on the HSE that such a situation would still exist in 2022, and I call on the Minister for Health and the relevant bodies to intervene immediately and revise the scheme without delay. In my first ever speech to this chamber I guoted Mahatma Gandhi when he famously said "The true measure of any society can be found in how it treats its most vulnerable members". If we were to apply that quote to this problem, then we would be found to be failing miserably, and I feel it is symptomatic of our world where the gap between the 'haves' and the 'have nots' continues to widen. Dental Care is no different to any other Medical Care and in any society which likes to consider itself civilized, it should be accessible to all. Whilst we here in this chamber are not directly involved in the decision making behind such schemes, I am ashamed to think that I am part of a greater body politic which treats its citizens in such an undignified manner and I call on this Council to contact the Minister without delay, and not ask, but demand that this issue is sorted out immediately.

### WHEN CAN YOU ACCESS YOUR PENSION & WHAT ARE YOUR OPTIONS WHEN YOU WANT TO RETIRE?

You can normally get access to your pension from age 60, a lot of the rules depend on whether you are an employee or self employed. If you are coming close to retirement then you are probably wondering what options you have when you want to get access to your pension. It depends on what type of pension you have but generally there are four options: **Tax Free Cash:** Most people will be entitled to a tax free lump sum, the amount varies however generally you will get at least 25% of the value of your pension in a tax free cash lump sum.

Taxable Cash: You may also be able to take sum of your pension in taxable cash.

**Annual Pension:** This is a guaranteed income usually paid monthly for the rest of your life that is purchased with the money left after your tax free lump sum, this is subject to taxation.

Approved Retirement Funds: You may be entitled to keep some of your money in an approved retirement fund, money can be taken from the fund to give you a regular income, usually monthly. This is subject to taxation also. Taxation at retirement is often much lower than when you are working.

It is extremely important that you take your time and have all the options explained to you in plain simple English and that you understand all your options clearly before you make your final decision. As well as the above there is much more to be discussed about your pension. You should discuss your retirement options with a financial advisor who has access to a number of different pension providers before making any decisions, he or she will help you with the above options and any other queries you may have.

If you can see these hairs and they bother you it is best to remove them as they will keep growing. Removing these dark hairs will not encourage new hair growth. Just avoid removing vellus hairs (the fine hairs you were born with) as you do not want to stimulate blood supply to these hairs.

If it's just a few hairs tweezing is the best option to start with. Do not cut or shave the hairs as they will reappear like stubble because you are removing the fine hair tip. Shaving and hair removal creams will not increase your hair growth but the blunt edge left from cutting the hair makes it appear darker and thicker. Hot peel off wax done professionally in a salon is inexpensive, quick,



painless and it will lighten your hairs and hair growth over time. Threading is another option like tweezing using thread to pluck the hairs but it can be painful. Laser hair removal can be expensive, however it will permanently reduce your hair growth especially if your hairs are dark in colour. Electrolysis is the only permanent solution to removing hairs as it destroys your hair follicle in its growing stage. This can work well on a small area like the lip.

### Winter eye health

Here are some of the ways winter can affect your vision, or worsen an eye condition, and tips for prevention.

### Driving in winter

In winter you may have more difficulty seeing clearly because of darker evenings .When it is dark your pupils become larger to let in more light. However this can results in your vision becoming more blurred. This is why you may be more reliant on your glasses at night.

The glare of a low-lying sun can also make it more difficult to see, so make sure your windscreen is clean, both inside and out. It is useful to have a pair of polarised sunglasses in the car to help with the glare from the sun, even in winter.

#### Dry eyes

If you already have dry eyes, central heating may make them worse. Here are some simple steps you can take to minimise the discomfort caused by dry eyes in winter: • Lower the temperature in rooms when

- possible.
- Blink more often.
- Use a humidifier. Opening windows for
- a few minutes on cold days will also help.

• Lubricants. Certain lubricating eye drops may be helpful for you.

Increased screen time

People tend to stay in and watch more

television and spend more time using computers during the winter. Using a screen will not damage your eyes but prolonged use can make your eyes tired and dry.

Remember to take breaks and operate the 20:20:20 rule; every 20 minutes, take a 20-second break and focus your eyes on something at least 20 feet away.

#### Watery eyes

In cold and windy conditions, many people complain that their eyes water more than normal. Wearing glasses will provide protection against the wind, even if you don't usually wear them outdoors.

#### Winter sun

Snow and ice are reflective, so the sun's damaging UV rays can reach your eyes from below as well as above. UV exposure is cumulative, so although you may not feel any immediate effects, you could be putting yourself at risk of long-term damage and risk cataracts and age-related macular degeneration (AMD) if you don't wear good quality sunglasses or goggles.

from the ground and are called bare-rooted hedging. This enables you to replant straight back into the ground when you get them home. Just make sure that when planting that the roots are spread out well as this will encourage them to root quickly when the growing season starts. If you have missed the bare rooted season at the end of March, you can plant container grown hedging all year around.

Welcome back dear student of God's Word, continuing on from last week where Jesus calls us to have God's kind of faith. "Have faith in God. I tell you the truth, you can say to this mountain, 'May you be lifted up and thrown into the sea,' and it will happen. But you must really believe it will happen, and have no doubt in your heart. I tell you, you can pray for anything, and, if you believe that you've received it, it will be yours. But when you are praying, first forgive anyone you are holding a grudge against, so that your Father in heaven will forgive your sins, too." (Mark 11:22-25 NLT). Jesus revealed these spiritual keys to us so that we could receive the freedom and deliverance that He paid for with His blood.

Firstly Jesus notes that this is Truth. "Those who worship the Father must worship Him in Spirit and in Truth" (John 4:23-24; John 17:17). God's Word is Truth and you can trust in, and believe Jesus for He will never lead you on. The mountains He mentions are not just physical mountains, but those problems that have risen up like mountains affecting our lives whether sickness, relationship problems, trauma, poverty or fear. Jesus speaks symbolically throughout the Word of God. Proverbs says "It is the glory of God to conceal a thing: but the honour of kings is to search out a matter." (Proverbs 25:2). This is where the Holy Spirit comes in. Jesus told His disciples that when the Holy Spirit came upon them He would baptise them with fire, and fill them with God's power, and that He would reveal the Truth to them (John 14:26; John 16:13-15; Luke 24:49; Acts 1:8). It is the Holy Spirit Who discloses the knowledge of the Truth to us and gives us the ability to believe God and see His promises come to pass.

The faith to speak to and remove those mountains of affliction only works as much as we abide in God's Truth though. For instance, it's pointless for me to proclaim faith in God and pray and believe for miracles and for things to change on the one hand, while my other hand is holding onto doubt and unbelief, or strife and bitterness towards another person (Luke 6:37-49). Mountain moving faith is made possible by first 're-moving' the mountains of doubt, offence or hurts that have accumulated. This is not an easy task. It can be a process of peeling off layers. It can make you cry, especially where someone has caused you deep pain. But as we said last week it's futile to do the same old thing over and over expecting to see different results. So, will you trust God and let it go? It's just not worth holding onto. Will you allow the Lord to bring healing to those wounds, so that you can be set free and receive breakthrough? Will you release forgiveness to that one by cancelling the debt that they can never repay anyway? Because Jesus made it quite clear - to the same extent that we are willing to forgive others we will be forgiven (Matthew 6:12-14; Ephesians 4:26-27). Let's not give the devil a foothold through any open doorway of offence, how about it?
