NATHAN'S FAMILY LAUNCH DARKNESS INTO LIGHT WALK

The family of Nathan Carroll launched this year's Darkness into Light - Nathan's Walk at the Porter House in Killarney this week.

Every year the walk in Killarney remembers Nathan Carroll who lost his life to suicide at the age of 14. Nathans's parents Marie and Denis are the driving force behind the fundraising event for Pieta House and this week they were joined by a large group os supporters to launch the event.

The walk which takes place in the early hours of Saturday 6th May is a beautiful, symbolic event which raises funds for suicide and self-harm charity Pieta House. Starting while it's dark and finishing as dawn is breaking, the 5km route can be walked or ran. This year, Darkness into Light will celebrate its ninth birthday, it takes place in over 120 venues around the the country and internationally. There were an estimated 4,500 people at last years event at Killarney

racecourse. The relationship between Pieta House and the community, although forged in tragedy, provides so much hope for individuals and families throughout the country. Pieta House tackles the issues of suicide and self-harm which have touched every community in Ireland. Pieta relies on the generosity of the public, whose donations and fundraising make up nearly 90% of their income and they also rely heavily on the support and encouragement of volunteers. 

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME FOR KILLARNEY STUDENTS

Leaving Cert students in Killarney who are hoping to study Business at UCC can avail of a new scholarship programme that was announced this week.

KEEPING KERRY'S YOUTH SAFE BY KEEPING THE RACE IN ITS PLACE"

Killarney and District Motor Club and the Road Safety Authority (RSA) have joined forces to organise a road safety seminar for our next generation of road users. The initiative organised to coincide with the running of the International rally of the lakes over the May holiday weekend is specifically targeted at Transition year students and is scheduled to take place at St Brendan's College Killarney on Tuesday April 25th. Speaking from rally headquarters earlier this week Mr Anthony O'Connor clerk of the course of the rally emphasised that the raising of awareness and increasing understanding of road safety issues among new road users is very much the primary focus on the day.

Safety of competitors, spectators, pedestrians and general road users is very much our main priority when planning such major sporting events such as the rally of the lakes and with national statistics indicating that young first time drivers particularly male drivers being among the highest at risk category in terms of likelihood of being involved in a road traffic accident we are delighted to lend our support to any initiative which addresses these issues.

inexperienced Many drivers overestimate the capabilities of a standard road car and during the hour long presentation from the R.S.A, The Gardai and the fire service students will be informed of how the lack of understanding of the affects of factors such as driver distractions, change in road surface, underestimating braking distances etc can result in very serious consequences for all road users. Experts will also be on hand to detail for the students the very specific performance and safety components built in to modern competing rally car, which allows crews competing in the rally to



travel at such high speeds in a safe and controlled environment. This year participants will be treated to a much more hands on experience of understanding these modifications as the club have arranged to have a one of the rally cars competing in this year's event to be present on the day for each student's personal inspection.

We very much want to get the message out there that there is no possible way that any standard road car can in any emulate the performance of the competing rally cars and we encourage all road users to keep the "race in its place" before, during and long after the rally weekend and to be ever mindful of the responsibility to yourself and all other road users each time you drive your car. We are very much looking forward to welcoming our future generation of road users to what promises to be a very informative and enjoyable event. Future plans for the service are to install a lift to utilise all the building in order to maximise its potential. There is also a plan to build a covered area in the back garden so that the children will be able to get out in all weathers.

Home from Home set up at The Padocks, Ballydowney Killarney in 2009. This service began in the grounds of St Marys of the Angels in Beaufort but the room the children were using at 'Tig Roisin' was needed for other services and so the parents got together to form a committee to set up a standalone after school service for their children.

Resilience Care take care of the day to day running of the service and they run Summer camps, Easter camps, mid-term camps, Halloween and Christmas camps. The majority of the children come from St Francis special school, Beaufort from where they are collected daily at 2:30pm and brought to Home from Home. They have the support of Kerry County Childcare, the HSE, Pobal and South Kerry Development Partnership without whom they would not be able to stay open. The time spent


SHOCK AT POPULAR PRIESTS PASSING





This article focuses on a crucial element involved in all relationships which is trust.

All of us have some idea of the meaning of trust in an emotional sense, I trust my mother meaning I can rely on her or my friend is trustworthy, I can share personal information and he does not tell everyone. In psychological terms trust is believing that the person who is trusted will do what is expected, and this starts in the family and grows to others. Erik Erikson, a developmental psychologist, helped understand human behaviour by describing trust as the very first relationship building block that develops over the first two years of life. If this is successfully done by the primary caretakers of a child by being consistent, reliable and caring then security, trust and optimism develop in the child. If this is not done successfully it can lead to children feeling insecure and mistrustful making it difficult for the child to bond with family members and later in life with friends and intimate relationships. Barbara Miztal, in her book Trust in Modern Societies, points out three basic things that trust does in the lives of people. It makes social life predictable, it creates a sense of community, and it makes it easier for people to work together.

As a counselling centre we are witness to the breakdown of trust in relationships, sometimes from early childhood due to a number of reasons often in circumstances outside of their control, sometimes the trust was broken in later life in an adult relationship, and at times people experience a breakdown of trust with financial situations. The Centre offers a trusting space to explore these feelings and to work through the trust being broken. In order for a good working relationship to ensue trust is at the core of the counselling process. We ask that you trust us as a charity as well.

TAX MATTERS

Cycle to Work Scheme

Benefits of the scheme for employees/directors?

As the bicycle and/or safety equipment are exempt from tax the employee/director will not be liable to income tax at his or her marginal rate, employee's PRSI or USC on the cost of the benefit, as reflected in the amount of the salary sacrificed.

Benefits of the scheme for employers?

The employer benefits in that the employer's PRSI is not payable on the cost of the bicycle and/or safety equipment.

Note, however, that employers will not be able to reclaim the VAT paid on the bicycle and/or safety equipment.

Do all employers have to participate in the scheme?

Participation in the scheme is voluntary for employers. However, employers choosing to participate in the scheme must make it generally available to all employees/directors who wish to avail of it.

How often can an employee avail of the scheme?

The tax exempt benefit-in-kind may only be provided to an individual employee once in any period of five consecutive tax years. The tax year in which the bicycle is provided is counted as

Employees should note that if they avail of the scheme for even a small amount of expenditure relating to the provision of bicycles and/or safety equipment they will not be able to avail of the relief again for five years.

Know Your Rights:

PRESCRIPTION CHARGES

OUESTION

I have a medical card but I seem to be paying more than the monthly cap for prescription charges for my family. Why would this happen and how can I get a refund?

ANSWER

If you have a medical card, there is a charge for each prescription item you receive. The prescription charge is €2.50, up to a maximum of €25 per month per person or family. For medical card holders over the age of 70 there is a reduced prescription charge, from 1 March 2017, of €2 per item up to a maximum of €20 per month.

Usually your pharmacy keeps records of how much you have paid in prescription charges and makes sure that you do not pay more than the limit each month. However, you may use different pharmacies in the same month, or your family members may not be set up as a family group, and you may end up paying more than the maximum.

If this happens, the Health Service Executive (HSE) will issue a refund without the need for you to apply for it. This is done on the basis of the information received from pharmacies. Refunds are issued every six months for amounts over €10. Amounts that are less than €10 are carried over to the next refund date.

You can set up your family as a family group on medicalcard. ie and print off a family certificate to give to your pharmacist. This will show all of the members of your family so that your pharmacy will not collect charges above the monthly limit. Your family is defined as you, your spouse or partner, any children under 16 years of age and any children between 16 and 21 years of age who are in full-time education.

If you do not have access to the internet you can ask your Local Health Office to help with setting up a family group. You can also call the HSE on 1890 252 919 or ask your local pharmacist who may be able to help you.

Galway put paid to Kerry's hopes of clinching the final Electric Ireland All-Ireland u21 football championship title when they were runaway winners over Jack O'Connor's side in a one-sided semi-final at Cusack Park in Ennis on Saturday.

With a lovely, vibrant style of football, the Tribesmen bamboozled the Kingdom with a series of pacey, impressive attacks that led to a series of scores.

The Tribesmen should and could have won by a wider margin. Things went from bad to worse for Kerry when Barry O'Sullivan was dismissed on a second yellow card with 12 minutes of normal time remaining.

With the advantage of an extra man for the remainder of the game, Galway were never going to be denied despite the best that Jack O'Connor's side could throw at them. Kerry did get a consolation goal of their own when Jordan Kiely netted but Colin Brady sealed Galway's place in the final when he finished an opportunity created by Eoin Finnerty.







DONKEY FOALS RESCUED FROM MEAT TRADE ARE NOW AMBASSADORS FOR CHANGE

Hamish, Clover, and Darcy were tiny foals, not yet weaned, when they were taken from their mothers and sent to be sold illegally at a market in Great Britain. Huddled together for warmth and comfort, the little donkeys were destined for the donkey meat trade - a little known but widespread and lucrative business which operates the world over. Thankfully, the three young donkeys, thought to be no more than ten weeks old when found, were rescued from the market by British charity, The Flicka Foundation, which cares for and rehabilitates horses and donkeys at its sanctuary in the South West of England. The three youngsters now act as ambassadors in the organization's fight against the trade in donkeys as food."Sick, elderly or abandoned donkeys are bought by dealers in Europe for pennies and traveled to the UK in filthy, cramped lorries. Those that make the horrendous journey enter the UK meat markets, to be sold and cruelly shipped back to the continent for European corporate dinner plates. Thankfully, Hamish, Clover, and Darcy were rescued before it was too late, but so many millions of other donkeys are not so lucky" said Judy Giles, Flicka's Director.

TURNING FLIP FLOPS INTO **ART**

Every year three billion people around the globe purchase a new pair of plastic flip flops. The problem with these affordable and easily accessible sandals is that once buyers are done using them - which takes place quite soon after the purchase – they throw them away. Once in landfills, the flip flops make a long journey into the oceans - and there they stay, posing a huge threat to marine animals. Every year, around 8.8 million tons of plastic end up in the oceans. 700 species of marine animals are now in danger of extinction because of the threat of ingesting and getting entangled in plastic waste. It is estimated that by 2050, 99% of all seabird species will have ingested plastic - which has already happened to 50% of sea turtles who now have plastic in their stomachs.

Due to the enormity of this problem, we now, fortunately, hear about more and more initiatives and enterprises aiming to take action against the plastic waste overflow. Ocean Sole, an organisation from Nairobi in Kenya, takes the discarded flip flops washed up on the shores and turn them into art.

Around 100 artists working with Ocean Sole turn the throw-away flip flops into beautifully crafted colourful animals varying in size from tiny to very large ones.

The lovely carefully created pieces - elephants,



giraffes, rhinos, dolphins, and more - are then being sold all around the world - and teaching each person buying them about the story behind their coming into being.

This pioneering organization is turning trash into treasures and helping to divert a whole lot of waste from the world's oceans.

While this is certainly impressive, not all of us have to start a recycled art company to make a positive impact on the planet, you can start by simply rethinking your consumer choices. Instead of picking up a pair of cheap flip flops that will barely make it through the summer, invest in a better quality, more sustainable sandal – Birkenstock, for example, now makes vegan sandals! On top of that, celebrate the summer by choosing to cut plastic out of your

REPOSSESSION MAN WHO PAID OFF ELDERLY COUPLE'S CAR RETURNS NOW TO CARE FOR WIDOW

Last year Jimmy Ford had to repossess Pat and Stanford Kipping's 1998 Buick because they couldn't afford the last five car payments due to their ever-growing list of expensive medications. Jimmy managed to raise roughly \$25,000 on GoFundMe and last November paid off the Kipping's car and medical bills.

In the following months, the Illinois repossession man stayed in touch with the couple. The three chatted on the phone once or twice every week and even occasionally went out to dinner together.

Then, towards the end of March, Jimmy was heartbroken to hear that Stan had passed away due to complications involving a nasty fall.

Mr. Kipling had to be airlifted to St. Louis by helicopter, leaving his widow Pat with yet another mountain of medical bills. According to Jimmy, she had still had roughly \$8,000 saved away from his original crowdfunding campaign until the incident.

"The money that she had - the money that the people had donated - was pretty much everything that she had left and it all went to the funeral," Jimmy said. "But luckily, she had that money to begin with; otherwise, she would have been in really bad shape. It's been tough on her." Jimmy has since reopened the GoFundMe page



for donations in hopes that the community can come together once more to support Pat with her strenuous situation. Jimmy says that he is ready to be there for her every step of the way.

YOUR OLD MASCARA WAND CAN HELP ORPHANED WILD ANIMALS

The next time you finish a tube of mascara, you don't have to throw the cover away. Instead you can send the mascara wand to Appalachian Wildlife Refuge, a non-profit organization that helps to rehabilitate injured and orphaned wildlife in Western North Carolina. What do they do with old mascara wands? The refuge uses the wands to help clean the rescued animals' fur. That's right – your mascara wands can help baby animals!

The bristles from a mascara wand are able to catch fly eggs, as well as the larva without causing any damage to the fur.

Appalachian Wildlife Refuge plans to open a new triage facility in Western North Carolina that is likely to see over 2,000 injured and orphaned wild animals in its first year alone. So all those mascara wands are going to come in very useful. Before posting, Appalachian Wildlife Refuge asks that you wash the wands with soapy water to help remove residual mascara then parcel up and send to Wands for Wildlife, Appalachian Wildlife Refuge, P.O. Box 1211, Skyland, North Carolina 28776, U.S.A. Why not ask your friends to contribute as well?

Appalachian Wildlife Refuge also has the following advice for all readers - "if you come across an animal that appears to be abandoned or injured and have your phone handy, do a quick online search to find the number of the nearest wildlife rehabilitation agency or Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals to ask them what you should do and they add "Volunteering your time towards a wildlife organisation is also a wonderful opportunity to get involved and assist a cause you care about"!

EDIBLE WATER BOTTLES

Skipping Rocks Lab's goal is to make plastic packaging disappear. Their first product, Ooho!, is a sustainable packaging alternative to plastic bottles and cups, made from a seaweed extract. It is entirely biodegradable and so natural you can actually eat it.

Created by Rodrigo García González, Guillaume Couche, and Pierre Paslier of Skipping Rocks Lab in London, the orb is created by taking a frozen ball of water, then covering it in layers of membrane made from seaweed extract.

Back in 2015, Ooho! received a €22,500 sustainability award from the EU, and now it looks like these water blobs could be ready for tossing into your bag on the way out the door in the not too distant future as the company plans to begin testing out their water bubbles at major sporting events in 2018.

Ooho! does have serious potential when it comes to environmental efforts: In America alone, 50 billion plastic bottles are used annually, and the spherical Ooho! packaging could one day knock petroleum-based plastic from store shelves. But if you don't fancy the idea of biting into a water blob, don't worry, it's not a must.

Mr. Paslier says "Our packaging is cheaper than plastic and can enclose any beverage including water, soft drinks, spirits, etc and people are really enthusiastic about the fact that you can create a material for packaging matter that is so harmless that you can eat it".

AUCTION HOUSE THOUGHT **VASE WAS A COPY**

One lucky seller has become an accidental millionaire after the Chinese vase they wanted to auction sold for 450 times its valuation.

Auctioneers at Fellow and Son in Birmingham were amazed after the piece, originally thought a copy, turned out to be a 500-year-old antique. It was made during the reign of Emperor Jiajing of the Ming dynasty, who ruled from 1521 to

FOCUS ON ALPINES

The vast majority of Alpine plants are easy to grow in any reasonably well drained garden soil. Alpines are ideal plants for rockeries and gaps in stone walls and they will give you colour from early Spring right through the summer. The most important thing when choosing your alpine plants is to make sure you find out the growth rates so that one Alpine plant won't take over other alpine plants in the rockery.

A good example of this would be an alpine called Cerastium (Snow in Summer) which is quite a quick growing Alpine and spreads quickly in a short space of time. It can tend to take over small rockeries. Having said that it is a beautiful plant with silver foliage and is covered, as the name suggests, in beautiful white flowers.

It can be pruned back to keep it under control.

There are also lots of alpines which are compact and can make perfect mounds and shapes. Alpines are also great fillers for stone walls. An ideal plant for this would be a Campanula or Aubrieta.

The Aubrieta is a pink flowering plant that you see growing out of a lot of grottos. Alpines can also be used in containers such as in troughs or window boxes but try to choose ones that are evergreen so that you will have some colour all year round.


