#### TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE BETWEEN TORC AND DINIS

The N71 Ring of Kerry road between Torc Waterfall and the carpark for Dinis Cottage will be closed to all traffic from Monday, 24 June 2019 to Friday, 5 July 2019. The purpose of the closure is to facilitate emergency repairs to a section of the retaining wall and road at Dinis. The contractors engaged will also be carrying out night-time work to minimise the duration of the road closure. A diversion will be in place via the N22 (Cork Road) and Kilgarvan (R569) and advisory signage will be erected. Access will be maintained from Killarney to Muckross House, Torc Waterfall and the 'Cardiac Steps' walkway. Access to Ladies' View and Moll's Gap

will be maintained from the Kenmare/Sneem side. Businesses affected by the closure will be kept fully briefed on the works. Kerry County Council, in consultation with the contractor, is endeavouring to minimise the duration of the road closure, in particular for local businesses, tourism operators and the upcoming Ring of Kerry Cycle which is scheduled to take place on Saturday, 6 July 2019. Regular updates will be provided through local media, social media and the council's website. Kerry County Council regrets any inconvenience this road closure may cause.

## CONCERNS RAISED OVER RIVER DEENAGH

At the recent May 2019 meeting of Killarney Municipal District, Councillor Michael Gleeson proposed that:

(1) As I believe that the NPWS have stated that the situation / problem does not fall within its remit, has Kerry County Council made any progress in the matter of having the ever-growing 'island' adjacent to the Kingsbridge in the River Deenagh removed before it seriously impedes the river flow?

Kerry County Council replied that a meeting has been arranged with the NPWS and Inland Fisheries Ireland in order to

progress this matter and hopefully bring it to a successful conclusion.

(2) I ask that Kerry County Council would update the members and the public on the situation regarding the present and future status of the land at Dirreen that is intended for use by The Kerry Stars.

Kerry County Council replied that a Grant Application has been submitted under the Large Scale Sport Infrastructure Fund (LSSIF) for a development by the National Sports & Adventure Centre CLG at this location and a decision is awaited.

## Air Ambulance to go Airborne within weeks



Air lifting seriously ill patients from rural areas will be just one of the tasks of the new Air Ambulance following the announcement by the Department of Health that a service contract has been signed – and Ireland's first community Air ambulance will be airborne within weeks. Welcoming the announcement, ICRR said it looked forward to working is strong cooperation with the Department of Health and HSE National Ambulance Service (NAS) to deliver a world-class service which will save lives.

ICRR is a charity and needs to fundraise €2m annually to pay for the helicopter, the pilots, the airbase at Rathcoole, Millstreet in Co. Cork and the fuel. The ICRR is a 'community' Air Ambulance so to keep this service in the air, the charity will be reliant on the public's longterm support.

The HSE NAS is providing the medical staffing for the aeromedical service and it will be tasked centrally through the NAS 999 / 112 call system. While Munster based it will be available for missions nationwide and coordinate with the existing Athlone based Emergency Aeromedical Service. The Air Ambulance is expected to respond up to 500 calls per year, and bring the population of a 10,000 square mile area within 20 minutes of critical medical care.

Examples of incidents which the Air Ambulance is expected to respond to include:

Retrieval & Transfer: The airlift of a seriously ill patient from remote and rural medical hubs or accident scenes to specialist hospital care.

Trauma: Injuries sustained in road traffic accidents, equestrian, agricultural, industrial and sporting incidents, falls and impact injuries. Medical: Including cardiac medical events, strokes, anaphylaxis, etc.

Since 2008, ICRR has also developed a network of over 250 land based volunteer doctors and ten Rapid Response Vehicles (RRVs), across the country, to deliver critical medical interventions which prevent serious injury or death.

#### SHOULD YOU BE CONSIDERING SWITCHING YOUR MORTGAGE

Yes, because some of the Irish mortgage lenders have much lower mortgage interest rates compared to others. There has been a lot of discussion recently in the media recently as regards mortgage switching this is because there can be a very substantial difference in interest rates and monthly repayments between lenders. ## You have until 5.15pm on 1st July to avail of the CAO "Change of Mind" facility

With the state exams concluding on Tuesday, the thoughts of exhausted candidates are turning to holidays, travel or summer jobs. But there is still one important task to be undertaken. Applicants to the Central Applications Office (CAO) must now turn their attention to the "Change of Mind" facility which affords then an opportunity to register a change of course choices online by 5.15pm on Monday, 1st July.

Not all applications to CAO avail of the change of mind facility as many applicants are happy with the course choices they submitted by 1st February. On the other hand, you might have done further course research or you might have changed your mind about your earlier choices. Whatever your reason for submitting a change of mind form, make sure you know exactly what you are applying for. Don't list any courses which you haven't researched. Don't apply for any course that you won't accept. Never apply for a course in which you have no interest just because your friends are applying for it.

If you decide to submit a change of mind form, work on your choices before going online. Don't tinker with your original list while online as it's easy to make a mistake. Start from scratch and prepare a new list of courses. Then open your CAO account via the "My Application" facility. Click on "Add Level 8 Course Choices" and/or "Add Level 7/6 Course Choices." Then use the "New Courses" list to enter your new course choices. Every choice is important so fill up all ten choices in each category.

Check the minimum and special requirements for each course you intend putting on the change of mind form. Don't enter a restricted application course for the first time on a change of mind form as it won't be considered.

Restricted application courses are those for a which assessment procedures such as audition, aptitude test or portfolio submission have already taken place. The one exception to this rule is a restricted course which shares the exact same assessment procedures as a restricted course you have applied for by 1st February. Don't list any course which has been cancelled, but you may include any new courses which were announced after the 2019 CAO Handbook was published. All of this information is easily accessible on the CAO website, www.cao.ie.

The two course categories – Level 8 (Honours Bachelor Degrees) and Level 7/6 (Ordinary Bachelor Degrees/Higher Certificates) are totally separate for the purpose of submitting a change of mind form. You may change one category and leave the second category unchanged or you may change both. On the other hand, you may decide to stick with the choices you submitted by 1st February last.

If you make changes to your course choices online, an acknowledgement will be sent to your email address. Check that your courses have been updated by using the "My Application" facility. You may change your course choices free of charge as often as you wish up to the closing date. The final change of mind form that you submit is the one that will count for your CAO offers in August, so check online by 5.15pm on 1st July to make sure that all is in order.

After the 1st July you can make no further changes to your CAO application form. So, avail of the remaining days to give some serious thought to your course choices. With the State Exams done and dusted, you can give your undivided attention to submitting a "change of mind" form that truly contains your course interests. It will be time well spent if you

achieve your course of choice when the college offers are issued in August.

Next week, in the final article of the current series, I'll comment on the accommodation crisis and the soaring cost of college.

#### WHY A CREDIT UNION CAR LOAN IS BETTER THAN A PCP?

Close to four in ten consumers in Ireland will buy a new car in 2019. Over half plan to spend more than €10,000 on their new set of wheels, according to the most recent Carzone Motoring Report (2018). The study also found that one in four consumers who spent between €10,000 and €20,000 on their previous car, used a credit union car loan to fund the purchase.\*

Credit union loans have always been popular amongst car buyers for their straightforward terms and conditions and flexibility, and look set to be a top choice again in 2019. Helen Courtney Power, Business Development Officer of Killarney Credit Union explains why she feels there has been a renewed interest in the traditional car loan. "A credit union loan is transparent and carries no hidden fees or charges. The buyer owns the car outright once they buy it, while with other more complex finance options, such as a PCP agreement, the buyer has effectively hired the car for a period of time while they make payments. At the end of the PCP agreement, they will have to make a balloon payment in order to actually own the car, which can prove to be quite the financial sting in the tail if it hasn't been budgeted for."

The Carzone report however also found that 72% of people who had spent more than €20.000 on their last car had used a finance options such as a PCP agreement. Summer Gardening

## **Container Gardening**



A s gardens become smaller and apartment living more popular, many people are growing plants in containers to decorate patios and balconies. Three of the most useful kinds of container are: Window boxes, hanging baskets, large planters. The style and material used in their construction should fit in with the proposed environment. Wood, reconstituted stone and terracotta are suitable for older houses but good quality plastic, fibreglass and concrete may be more suitable for modern homes.

#### **Compost for Containers**

Ordinary garden soil is unsuitable for containers and special compost, either loam-based (i.e. soil based) or loamless is needed. Loam-based compost can be bought from garden centres (as John Innes mixtures) or made up at home. Four parts of sterilised loam can be mixed with 2 parts of peat and 1 part of sharp sand. It is important to use a good quality loam that is rich in organic matter and not heavy and sticky like clay soil nor light and gritty like sand. Peat based compost is light and easy to handle. Because it is light, containers are less stable and may blow over. Conversely, where weight is a problem e.g. in window boxes or roof gardens, peat is the preferred compost. Coir or bark may be used instead of loam or peat-based composts but results tend to be more variable

#### Preparation for Planting - Window Boxes

Window boxes made from softwood must be treated with a plant safe wood preservative before planting. The box should be fixed in place on the sill before filling and planting. Secure fixing is especially important for boxes on upstairs windows. Boxes must be at least 20 cm deep and 20 cm wide to prevent plants from drying out too quickly. Cover drainage holes with small stones, crocks or fine mesh to prevent blockage. If weight is not a problem add a 2 cm layer of gravel as an aid to rapid drainage and partially fill with compost.

#### Hanging Baskets

A hanging basket can weigh over 20 kg when planted so that it is important to ensure that the supporting hook or bracket is secure. To facilitate filling the traditional wire basket with compost, the round bottom should be supported in a bucket or large pot. A 2 cm layer of moist sphagnum peat should be used to cover the interior of the basket. A liner, placed in the open basket before filling with compost, is essential to reduce watering. Pre-formed liners are available for standard-sized baskets in a range of material including plastic, coconut fibre and bitumen paper.Waterproof liners greatly reduce the need for watering especially in summer. A small saucer can be placed at the bottom of the container to serve as a small water-holding reservoir. Compost is added to the basket during the planting operation.

#### 1. Exercise Boosts Brain Health:

Exercise produces acute improvements in executive function of our brains, the part of our brain that helps us manage our day and plan activities. Executive function also includes starting new tasks, handling behaviors and controlling emotions. #### About Me

My name is Brian, I run the **RunninginIreland.com** website and blog. I am not an elite athlete; I don't think I'd consider myself a fast runner either. I just love to run. But I have done a lot of races, including Killarney and I will draw on this experience to help you on your way.



#### Finding a training plan

Welcome to week 2 of our Run Killarney preparation column! There are a number of training plans available on runkillarney.com for both the 10k and half-marathon. I strongly recommend that you use a training plan. Although I've been doing races for over a decade, I still work through a training plan. Once it's written down, it's harder to avoid it. But don't just pick the first one that you see, read through it and see if it is going to work for you. Make sure that the times and days of the runs are practical for you, and if not, adjust accordingly. Like every plan, it must be achievable.

#### How to approach training

The two most important factors to consider are 'building slowly' and 'variety'. Building slowly means that you need to take your time adding in the mileage week over week. If you try to 'cram it all in' in the last couple of weeks, like the Leaving Cert, you will pick up an injury. Your body needs time to adjust and recover before pushing on further. The key here is rest. Rest after your runs allows your body time to prepare for your next runs.

Variety will become important as you go further into your training. If you go with the same type of runs, over the same routes, you will quickly get bored and give up your training, or start to skip sessions. Change it up.....rather than doing all runs at the same pace, mix in some shorter distances at a faster pace. These will have a huge benefit to you down the line, as well as keeping things fresh. There are lots of different training runs, some might feel tough, but the next run after them will make you feel like a 'super hero'. Try researching tempo runs, strides and hill repeats.

#### Other training tips

- Where possible, run with friends or a running group. There's nothing like company to keep you going
- Train for what you plan to do on the race day, e.g. if you think you might want to use energy gets during the race, test this during training
- Training isn't just about running. Try different foods before and after your training sessions to see which work best for you

## Know Your Rights:

#### QUESTION

Travelling to my office through city traffic is taking me longer because of increased congestion. Can I travel by electric scooter instead?

#### ANSWER

An electric scooter (sometimes called an e-scooter) is a small platform with two or more wheels that is propelled by an electric motor. The rider can also propel the electric scooter forward by pushing off the ground.

Electric scooters and electric skateboards fall into the category of 'mechanically propelled vehicles' (as defined in the Road Traffic Act 1961). If a vehicle can be powered by mechanical or electrical power alone, then it is considered to be a 'mechanically propelled vehicle'.

Under Irish road traffic law, people using such vehicles in a public place must have insurance, road tax and a driving licence. There are penalties under road traffic laws (including fixed charge notices, penalty points, fines and possible seizure of the vehicle) for not being in compliance with these requirements. As it is currently not possible to tax or insure electric scooters or skateboards, they are not considered suitable for use in public places.

However, the Road Safety Authority is carrying out research as to how electric scooters and other such vehicles are regulated in other countries, particularly in other EU member states. The goal is to understand the road safety implications of the use of such vehicles on public roads, especially when interacting with other vehicles.

## **THE LONGEST DAY**

Today is the summer solstice. At around 3.00 am Irish time the sun reaches the most northerly point of its oscillation resulting in just over 17 hours of daylight in Ireland.

## THINKING OF GETTING A TATTOO?

A 2016 report from the Joint Research Centre (JRC), which provides independent scientific advice to the European Union, chemically analysed a wide variety of tattoo pigments and listed the ingredients of most concern. The most dangerous are known as polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), a chemical group found in mostly black inks that contain carcinogens that can migrate from the skin to the lymph nodes. There are also azo pigments, which make up about 60% of the colour ingredients in tattoo inks. Though azo pigments are safe when they first enter the skin, they can degrade over time into potentially cancer-causing compounds.

A Swiss survey of 229 tattoo inks also found problematic preservatives. A quarter of the inks that survey analysed contained the skin irritant benzo-isothiazolinone and 7% contained formaldehyde, a carcinogen. Tattoo inks can also contain harmful metals such as nickel, chromium, and cobalt.

That doesn't mean all tattoos are unsafe. Modern high-quality pigments are typically made from various metal salts. Different metals pose different risks, which mean certain colours are inherently riskier than others. Red ink, in particular, is known to cause sensitivity reactions and other health problems more often than black ink, which can be easily manufactured from safe sources. Blues and greens made from high-quality copper salts tend to be safe as well but watch out for cobaltbased blues. White pigments made from titanium oxide are some of the least reactive pigments in the industry. While yellow pigments are often derived from natural sources like turmeric or curcumin, they commonly cause reactions because of how much pigment it takes to create a bright colour.

If you want to be safe about getting a tattoo, stick to reputable artists and don't be afraid to save up and pay a premium price. Cheap inks are cheap for a reason, and unscrupulous tattoo artists won't be able to offer evidence supporting their ink choices. You should ask your tattoo artist to provide as much information as possible about where the inks came from and what they're made of, and be specific about the colours involved.

## A CALIFORNIA STARTUP IS TURNING EXCESS FOOD PRODUCE INTO DRIED SNACKS

In an effort to capture some of the 1.3 billion metric tons of food wasted every year Treasure8 worked along with the University of California – Davis and the USDA to create a new kind of technology that can suck 97% of the moisture out of fruits, vegetables, and fungi.

Once dried, the produce still maintains the same



taste and nutrition – except it has a much longer shelf life without using any preservatives.

Treasure8 now sources all of their produce from various agricultural companies and manufacturing facilities for consumer packaged goods – and they hope to start collecting excess produce from local retailers and supermarkets in the US in the near future.

In addition to selling crisps made out of beets, sweet potatoes, and apples, the company soon plans on unveiling a new kind of biscuit that is partially made out of dehydrated vegetables.

For the first time in Quebec animal welfare charges have been made by way of indictment – a type of prosecution reserved for the most serious offenses and which opens the door to more serious penalties, in this case zoo staffers had already received a number of citations for animal neglect. Upon refusing to bring the facility up to code, the Quebec government ruled that all of the animals must be seized from the unaccredited zoo.

Roadside zoos, also known as backyard zoos, usually operate as unaccredited tourist attractions and generally fall short of animal welfare regulations, making them notorious for animal exploitation and neglect and many of the rescued animals were suffering from medical conditions and showed signs of distress from confinement.

Among the animals rescued were lions, tigers, zebras, bears, camels, monkeys, goats, and kangaroos – many of which were found to be endangered species, according to Humane Society International rescuers (HSI). The animals will be matched with species-appropriate facilities that are as close to their natural environments as possible. After that, the animals will have the opportunity to live happy and healthy lives in reputable sanctuaries.

HSI also urges travellers to be responsible and conduct proper research before visiting a zoo in order to make sure that it is accredited.

1970 - Brazil, led by soccer legend Pele, won its third World Cup championship with a 4-1 victory over Italy.

1977 - Birth of former professional boxer, Michael Gomez (born Michael Armstrong), in Co Longford to an Irish Traveller family. He spent his early years in Dublin before moving to London and later Manchester, England, with his family at the age of nine.

Friend, if you bear scars from wounds inflicted by your father or by others in authority who should have demonstrated the love of God to you, give those ashes (Isaiah 61:1-3) to Jesus and pray this simple prayer for freedom: Lord Jesus, please heal my heart from every wound and scar. I desire to leave the past behind, and to receive Your mercy, joy, freedom and peace. Show me the Father's Love, in the name of Jesus I pray. Amen (John 14:7-27).

## EMERGING Adulthood

Emerging Adulthood is known as the period of time between the age of 18 years and 28 years of age approximately. Unfortunately little attention is given to this period in an individual's life which is a pity because it can be quite a daunting, challenging and fearful time. They may or may not just be out of school and finishing the tail end of their turbulent adolescent years yet this is given little consideration. While it is healthy to encourage more detachment and autonomy and promote the need for more independence it is equally important to acknowledge the plethora of emotions that come with such a step. The fear of the unknown exists. It is part and parcel of this chapter hence parental guidance and support needs to remain steadfast. Emerging adults rarely confess their fears because the pressure is on to save face. They want and need to achieve independence but secretly harbour a lot of fear and confusion as they branch out. Emerging adulthood can extend into a person's late twenties so discussing this reality with our teenagers is necessary. They may change academic courses before finding the right one, take time out and travel, work different jobs, go through various relationships etc. on this journey of discovery ; but one thing is for sure they will grow and evolve as they do so. Being open to receiving them regardless of possible mistakes will make them more emotionally robust. They will more than likely seek you out for guidance or comfort and familiarize you with the context of their new world, be it courses, new friendships, problems etc.. They are unique individuals encountering unique experiences to them; we, on the other hand, may have forgotten how this feels. We must bear this in mind if they become derailed.

Creating a good foundation, before they eventually fly the nest, will provide a solid base for them to return to. This foundation is achievable via open and honest communication, gentle unconditional positive regard encouragement, and acknowledging the challenges which exist for them. Slowly but surely the need to save face and disguise difficulties fades and the emerging adult can discuss his/her experiences in a more realistic fashion, be it academic pressure, friendship/relationship worries, financial concerns and so on. This is a welcomed moment! Now we can visualize someone who is ready, willing and able to be in touch with their emotions and recognize the need to reach out for support. This can be an uphill struggle for emerging adults who don't want to disappoint. Remember, they remain vulnerable and sensitive to praise and criticism despite this outward appearance of emerging adult. As parents we can do a great deal to help them navigate any obstacles they may encounter without remaining so much in the forefront of their lives! Once they know that your support is consistent they can discover a world full of possibilities and, in turn, discover themselves!
