

KILLARNEY NATIVE TO DEVELOP YOUTH CHOIR

Creative Ireland Kerry, in collaboration with Kerry Music Education Partnership, are rolling out a new initiative to give young people, aged between six and 18, greater access to choir and youth choral music.It will see the development of youth choral projects guided by professional artists in the four municipal towns of Killarney, Caherciveen, Tralee and Listowel with workshops for young people commencing this month and running to December. Killarney native, Gemma Sugrue, will be developing a choral group that will meet weekly in the town. Gemma is a vocalist and vocal coach based in Co. Cork and is director and co - founder of the Voiceworks Studio. She is the only Irish member of Vocology in Practice, a global network of voice experts and is constantly seeking to deepen her knowledge in all matters singing, performance and teaching related.Gemma is also a sought after session singer and backing vocalist and in 2016 has provided backing vocals for albums including Brian Deady's Non-Fiction and Jack O'Rourke's Dreamcatcher. She was the soloist with Jenny Greene and the RTE Concert Orchestra's performance of 90s dance classics at Electric Picnic, the 3 Arena and the 2fm ball and she's the vocalist on this year's Home Focus TV

advert. She has toured Australia, The Caribbean, Europe and the UK as the soprano soloist with various Irish dance productions. She has performed live on programmes including Audio Sunshine and Arena on RTE Radio 1 plus live sessions on Today FM, Newstalk, Cork's 96fm and Redfm and has appeared on The Late Late Show and Ireland Am. Gemma looks forward to recording and releasing her own material in 2017. The Choral sessions will take place every Wednesday at Holy Cross Mercy National School in Killarney."The aim is that our young people will grow in confidence as singers, musicians and performers through the process", said Gemma .The need for increased access to Youth Choral Projects was indentified by Kerry Music Education Partnership (KMEP), of which Kerry County Council is a partner, (Kerry Education and Training Board is the lead partner). KILLARNEY AID WORKER URGES SUPPORT FOR MILLIONS **STARVING IN EAST AFRICA**

Trócaire's Martina O'Donoghue from Barraduff in Co. Kerry urged people to get behind the appeal and support the agency's efforts to save lives in the affected areas.

Special collections will take place at all masses across Co. Kerry next weekend (July 22/23) as part of a national appeal to help people caught up in the current food crisis in east Africa. Trócaire, the overseas development charity, says that 25 million people in east Africa are facing starvation in the coming months and millions could die unless they receive immediate assistance.

The Irish Catholic Bishops' Conference has called for a national church collection to support Trócaire's work in the region. Severe drought, driven by climate change, is currently affecting Kenya, South Sudan, Somalia and Ethiopia and this has resulted in failed harvests and the widespread death of livestock.

"With the failure of successive rains and a prolonged drought having taken hold of the region, just surviving has now become the main challenge facing the people of east Africa," she said. "Millions of people in the region are facing starvation. The crops have failed and animals are dying because of a lack of grazing and water."

The United Nations has described the situation in the drought-ravaged parts of Africa as the greatest humanitarian crisis since the Second World War but Trócaire says steps can be taken to reduce the number of people at risk if action is taken now.

"Trócaire is working on the ground and providing vital aid to hundreds of thousands of people," said Martina. "We are targeting particularly vulnerable groups including the elderly, people with disabilities and those living with HIV. Our health centres in Somalia are treating 19,000 people each month for malnutrition and associated illnesses. We are also supporting health clinics in places like Turkana in northern Kenya, where 12 per cent of children under the age of five are severely malnourished and at immediate risk of death.

The clinics weigh and examine the children and the mothers of those who are identified as high-risk are given a high-protein, high-vitamin supplement to feed them.

"What we are providing at the moment is quite literally 'life-support' for people. In the coming months in Kenya, Somalia, South Sudan and Ethiopia Trócaire is hoping to reach hundreds of thousands more people with emergency food, water and drought tolerant seeds but this can't be done without the generosity of people in Co. Kerry. I would urge parishioners to please give what they can to the church collection."

President Michael D. Higgins last week issued a statement praising the Irish Catholic Bishops' Conference for organising the appeal and urging people to give what they can to support life-saving efforts in the region.

Council. This road forms part of the Kerry Way walking trail.

Councillor Gleeson stated that both of these roads are much used tourist routes and that their proper upkeep is of vital importance to tourism and, therefore, to the economy. He urged both the Council and the NPWS to ensure that the roads in their charge are kept to the highest possible standard.

Specially adapted beach wheelchairs are now available for wheelchair users and people with disabilities at two Kerry beaches this summer. The Hippocampe wheelchairs are designed to make it easier for beach users with a disability or mobility restrictions to access and enjoy local beaches and have been introduced by Kerry County Council.

With the support of funding from the Department of Children and Youth Affairs, two wheelchairs have been purchased and are now available at Inch and Ballinskelligs beaches. A third will shortly be made available at Ballyheigue Beach with the ambition of further chairs being provided at other Kerry beaches in the years ahead.

The wheelchairs are designed for ease of movement on uneven ground and soft sand.

Due to their balloon wheels, they cannot be self-propelled, therefore, all users will be required to bring someone with them to assist with transfer and pushing.

The service is free of charge, but it is essential to book in advance. They can be booked in slots of up to three hours and users will be asked to complete a booking form and present a valid photo ID.

Director of Services with Kerry County Council, John Breen said the wheelchairs have the approval and support of the Irish Wheelchair Association, Enable Ireland and the Disability Federation of Ireland. "The aim to is to allow wheelchair users to enjoy our wonderful beaches during the summer months and to ensure their carers can bring those they care for to the beach in a safe and enjoyable

atmosphere," he said.

"I would like to acknowledge the support and assistance of local community operators who are taking responsibility for bookings. We are very grateful for this support," he said.

Cllr Terry O'Brien, Service Coordinator with the Irish Wheelchair Association welcomed the new Hippocampe wheelchairs. "A regular wheelchair would get stuck in the sand but these chairs are very ease to move and to manouevre on the sand. This is a great initiative in Kerry and hopefully we can see more of them available at Kerry beaches in the years ahead." The chairs are available through July and August from noon to 7pm Monday to Friday and from 11am to 7pm at weekends. East Africa stands on the brink of what the UN has described as potentially the worst humanitarian crisis since World War II.

Drought and conflict has left approximately 25 million people reliant on food aid for survival, with shockingly high rates of severe acute malnutrition among children across the affected regions of Somalia, Ethiopia, Kenya and South Sudan.

Governments and humanitarian organisations across the region are responding. Through urgent and

robust action, they have helped stave off extreme levels of death from famine that have loomed over East Africa throughout this crisis. But appeals for international support have been met with a wholly insufficient response, and levels of funding across the region are now desperately low.

Humanitarian aid saves lives. South Sudan has been pulled out of famine because of aid. But failed rains, continued conflict, and disastrous outbreaks of cholera mean the situation in South Sudan and Somalia in

particular is more desperate now than ever. Without adequate support, the humanitarian crisis across these regions will become a humanitarian catastrophe.

Irish aid agencies are saving lives across the region but to do so until the next harvest will require significant resources. As two of Ireland's largest development humanitarian agencies, Concern Worldwide and Trócaire are delivering food, water and healthcare to hundreds of thousands of people in east Africa. We welcome President Michael D

Higgins' call on the Irish people to respond to this crisis with urgency, compassion, and generosity, and we the urge the Irish public to support our efforts to get aid to people caught in this appalling crisis.

The time to act is now, before it is too late.

OUTLOOK RECEIPES

CITRUS SUMMER CHICKEN (Serves 4)

INGREDIENTS

- 4 boneless chicken breasts
- Salad to serve
- (try it with low-fat and low-salt sauces)
- For the marinade
- Zest and juice of 1 orange
- Zest and juice of 1/2 lime
- 1 inch of fresh ginger
- 2 cloves garlic, peeled and crushed
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- Freshly ground black pepper

METHOD

- 1. Put the zest and juice of the orange and the lime (or a drop of lemon juice if you haven't got a lime) into a bowl. Peel the ginger, grate it finely and add it to the bowl with the garlic.
- Whisk in the olive oil and then stir in the black pepper. Using a large knife, cut each chicken breast in half. Add these to the marinade and make sure that each portion is well coated.
- 3. Cover the bowl with cling film and put it on the bottom shelf of the fridge for at least 1 hour.
- 4. Cook the chicken on a hot barbeque for 25 to 30 minutes, turning it often.
- You can also use chicken thighs or drumsticks for this recipe. Adjust the cooking times depending on the meat.
- Before serving, check that the chicken is properly cooked by removing it from the heat and cutting into the thickest part of it with a clean knife to make sure that it is piping hot all the way through, there is no pink meat remaining, and the juices run clear

POTATOES AND SCALLION BURGERS WITH FRESH SALSA Suitable for Vegetarians

A tasty variation on the traditional summer burger, this filling family dish will also appeal to vegetarians. Cooked potatoes are required in advance for this recipe.

INGREDIENTS

- Serves 4 Adults

Burgers

450g / 1lb of cooked, mashed potatoes

8 scallions, finely chopped

1 medium egg

4 tablespoons of semi-skimmed milk

75g / 3 oz. of wholegrain breadcrumbs - around 2 slices

Salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste

225g / 8 oz. of firm, ripe tomatoes, peeled and chopped

1 clove of garlic, peeled and finely chopped

1 small red onion, finely chopped

2 tablespoons fresh coriander leaves, finely chopped

¼ teaspoon dried, ground coriander

¼ teaspoon dried, ground cumin

Juice of 11/2 limes

Salt and freshly ground pepper, to taste

METHOD

BURGERS

- Preheat the oven to 180°C / 350°F / Gas Mark 4
- To get them at the right constancy, prepare the mashed potatoes several hours in advance and refrigerate
- Mix the scallions into the chilled potato
- In a small mixing bowl, beat the egg and milk with a whisk. Stir half the egg and milk mixture into potatoes and season with salt and
- Shape the potatoes into four burgers. Ensure they are relatively flat so that they fully cook in the oven
- Dip each one first into the remaining egg and milk and then into the dried/toasted breadcrumbs to coat
- 7. Place the burgers on a baking tray or grill and place in the oven for approximately 15 minutes, or until the burgers are golden brown and piping hot throughout

SALSA

- Pour boiling water over the tomatoes, and let sit for one minute. This helps to remove the skin easily
- Drain and cover with cold water
- Peel the skin off each tomato and chop
- In a mixing bowl, combine all the salsa ingredients Serving Suggestions

Serve the burgers immediately with your fresh homemade salsa and a crispy side salad



We all look forward to the first signs of Summer; the stretch in the evenings, warmer weather and the mouth-watering aroma of a BBQ being grilled. If you are planning to cook outdoors, don't let your good habits in the kitchen go up in smoke when you light the barbeque — an evening alfresco should bring memories of friends, family and food, not tummy bugs! Here are 7 golden rules from safefood for how to get it right every time.

- 1. Keep perishable foods like salads, coleslaw and quiche in your fridge until you are about to serve them.
- 2. BBQ foods like burgers, sausages and kebabs, pork and poultry must be cooked and piping hot all the way through. You know they are cooked when there is no pink meat and the juices run clear. Steaks or whole meat joints of beef or lamb can be served 'rare' as harmful bacteria are on the outside only (and not in the centre).
- 3. If you like to marinate your meat, make sure any marinade used on raw meat is not then used as a sauce to coat vegetables or cooked meat as it will contain raw meat bacteria.
- 4. If you choose to barbeque any frozen food, it must be completely thawed on the bottom. shelf of your fridge before you cook it.
- 5. When handling raw meat and poultry, wash your hands thoroughly and frequently, most importantly before going on to prepare salads and other ready to eat foods.
- 6. Once your meat is cooked thoroughly, make sure to keep cooked meat separate from raw meat and to use separate chopping boards, cooking utensils and plates. Harmful bacteria raw, meat, poultry and their juices can contaminate cooked food and lead to food poisoning, something your guests won't thank you for.
- If there are leftovers from your barbeque, allow the food to cool before refrigerating, however make sure to refrigerate food within two hours of cooking. Always remember with leftovers - if in doubt, throw it out.



DRIVING FOR WORK SUMMER SAFETY TIPS

The HSA reminds employers and employees of key seasonal tips for safer work related journeys over the coming months. Summer months bring more bicycles, motorcycles, caravans, agricultural vehicles, visiting tourists and seasonal traffic congestion to our roads. During school holidays, there are more children about, so extra vigilance is needed on journeys, during deliveries and collections as there are vulnerable road users around who are not aware of the dangers associated with vehicles and their actions are not predictable.

We urge employers to bring the following tips to the attention of their employees who drive for work. With school holidays and tourist season in full swing, now is a good time to remind staff of safe driving for work practice in summer.

By following simple guidelines before travelling and en-route, you will ensure your safety while driving for work.

Before travelling, make sure your vehicle is roadworthy: even the slightest doubt about how it's running needs checking. Make sure that vehicle maintenance is up to date, and if in doubt arrange to have it looked at by a qualified mechanic.

Then, check the following at least daily (especially if the vehicle is hired or loaned):

- Tyre tread and pressures.
- Oil, water and fluid levels.
- Head, brake and indicator lights.

Plan the route beforehand, and travel during off-peak periods if possible leaving 'more than enough' time to negotiate the holiday congestion. Check the weather forecast and travel news before and during journeys.

Timely route and traffic information is available from a range of organisations.

On the road, make sure everyone is buckled up, including rear seat passengers, and drive defensively by:

- Being prepared for unsafe actions by others or for poor driving conditions.
- · Obeying the road signs and signals.
- Never ever use alcohol and drive.
- Be extra careful in the early morning or at dusk and during the night, when animals and agricultural vehicles are most likely to be on the road.

IF DRIVING A VAN, TRUCK OR FOUR-WHEEL **DRIVE:**

- Take extreme care reversing.
- · Check carefully for elderly people and children where you make deliveries or collections.

Slow down in built up areas Slow down near cyclists

IF DRIVING A CAR:

- Keep out of others' blind spots.
- Be seen: don't let larger vehicles hide yours from view
- Use daytime running lights.

DRIVER FATIGUE: Don't give in to the temptation to 'push on'! When you feel tired, have a good sleep. Rest breaks every 2 hours keep drivers alert by promoting blood circulation, make trips more pleasant for you and your passengers, let the vehicle cool down. Have a good summer, and please put safety first when driving for work

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

Road-wise pedestrians are safe pedestrians. Find out how to put your best foot forward and stay safe on Irish roads. Better safety, step-by-step THE BASICS Although you can't be responsible for the way people drive, you can take a number of steps to make yourself safer as a pedestrian: STOP, LOOK AND LISTEN Don't try to cross the road between parked cars. If possible, cross at a pedestrian crossing or traffic lights

NEVER CROSS AT A BEND If there is a footpath use it. If there is no footpath, walk/run/jog on the right hand side of the road, facing oncoming traffic and keeping as close as possible to the side of the road

Walk no more than two abreast and if the road is narrow or there is heavy traffic, walk in single file **INCREASE YOUR VISIBILITY** More than twothirds of fatal pedestrian collisions happen at night. Although you can hear a car coming and see its lights, the driver may not see you (and certainly won't hear you).

TO PROTECT YOURSELF MAKE SURE YOU

Always wear a pair of reflective armbands, highvisibility belt or other reflective or fluorescent clothing which will help you to be seen from a distance. Carry a torch on country roads

SOBERING FACTS Drunken pedestrians are a source of danger to themselves and other road users. If you have had one too many, don't attempt to walk - hail a taxi, use public transport or get a lift from a (non-drinking) friend. Pubs and clubs also have a responsibility to prevent intoxicated customers walking out on public roads where they could be hit by passing vehicles, or cause a crash through their own behaviour. To prevent this happening, bar staff or anyone serving alcohol should decide if the person is fit to walk. If not, they should arrange to get them home safely.

10 SUMMER DRIVING HAZARDS TO AVOID

CAR KEYS It's easy to lose your car keys in the sand, or ruin your remote control with water by accidentally taking the fob for a swim. Keep your keys safe and dry and check your handbook - on most cars, there's an alternative way to open the doors that you can use if the remote stopped working.

PUNCTURES If your tyres are already damaged or they're at the wrong pressure, the higher temperatures of summer will increase the risk of a blowout. Make sure you check tyres regularly - for condition and pressures - and increase pressures to suit extra loads, as advised in your handbook.

Check caravan tyres too, and replace those that show any signs of cracking in the sidewall or tread grooves...

OVERHEATING When driving in hot climates, high temperatures can aggravate cooling system problems too. It's important to check the coolant and cooling system regularly to avoid overheating.

GLARE Dazzle from the sun causes lots of accidents but you can reduce the effect by keeping your windscreen nice and clean, and by replacing worn or damaged windscreen

It pays to keep a clean pair of sunglasses in your car year-round but avoid lenses that darken in strong sunlight.

TRACTORS The driver of that slow-moving tractor in front of you may have a soundproofed cab or could be wearing ear protectors, so may not be able to hear approaching cars.

Be aware that tractors only have to have brake or indicator lights if driving at night, so they may stop or turn suddenly and without warning in daylight hours.



TAXATION OF BENEFITS FROM EMPLOYMENT

Most benefits from employment that are provided in addition to your salary are subject to income tax. Generally, there are two types of benefits that an employee may get in addition to a salary:

- Benefits-in-kind. These are benefits that an employee receives that cannot be converted into cash but have a cash value. Examples include provision of a company car, loans given at a special rate or provision
- Benefits (other than benefits-in-kind). Examples include vouchers, holidays, payment of an employee's bills and prizes.

An employee can reduce the amount of benefit-in-kind assessed on a car if they incur a certain amount of mileage for business purposes

Benefits that are exempt from tax or can be received tax efficiently

There are some benefits that an employee can receive that are not subject to tax or can be received tax efficiently. These include:

- Provision of bus/train passes for one month or more
- Bicycle and safety equipment under the Cycle to Work Scheme
- Certain share and approved profit sharing schemes
- Canteen facilities
- Reimbursement of expenses necessarily incurred in the course of employment
- Some accommodation provision
- Lump sum and certain redundancy payments
- Working clothes
- Non-cash personal gifts not related to employment
- Employer's contribution to statutory or revenue approved pension schemes.
- Mobile telephones, computer equipment and home high-speed internet connections where those benefits are provided for business use. (Private use is incidental.)
- Private use of company van which is essentially for the purposes of employee's work and where there is an employer requirement to bring the van home and where other private use is prohibited and the employee spends most of their working time away from the workplace to which they are attached.

Small benefit relief

You can receive a small non-cash benefit from your employer without paying PAYE, USC and PRSI. Such a benefit must have a value of €500 or under. This treatment does not apply to cash payments, which are taxable in full. You can only avail of this relief once in a tax year. If the benefit is more than €500 in value the full value of the benefit is subject to PAYE, USC and PRSI.



Citizens Information

Know Your Rights: PASSPORT RENEWAL

OUESTION

I have booked a family holiday and checked my passport to make sure it's still valid. It is, but it's due to expire a couple of weeks before I travel. How can I make sure that I can get a new one in time?

ANSWER

You don't have to wait until the expiry of your passport to renew it. If you apply for a new passport before your current one has expired, the period that your new passport is valid for begins from when you apply, rather than from when your previous passport expires.

The website of the Passport Service, passport.ie, lists the current average processing times for different types of passport applications. The quickest way to renew your passport is by using the online application service, which was introduced earlier this year. You can use the online service if your passport expires any time in the next 12

You must submit a digital photo with your application. You can get a friend to take your photo with a digital camera or smartphone or you can go to a photo provider, for example a pharmacy or a photographer, who will give you a copy of your digital photo to upload. Alternatively, you can go to one of the photo booth services listed on passport.ie, which will take your photo and provide you with a code. If you enter this code when you apply, you don't need to upload the photo yourself.

Online renewal isn't available for children's passports, so if you wanted to renew your family's passports together, you would have to use Passport Express, the postal application service. Alternatively, you could renew your own passport online and use Passport Express for renewing any passports


When you get your new passport you can set a renewal reminder. The passport.ie website offers a passport reminder service, which will send you an email three months before the passport expires.

FOCUS ON HERBS

There are a lot of different types of herbs but the most commonly grown herbs for culinary use are the basil and dill which are annuals and have to be sown every year.


Parsley and Chervil, which are biennials and last for two years while herbs like fennel, mint, tarragon are perennials.



FEW WAYS T₀ MAKE **BIODEGRADABLE POTS** FOR **SEEDLINGS**

If you are going to start seedlings, why not do it in little biodegradable pots? They can be planted out in the garden without having to remove them from their pots and disturb those fragile young roots. The pot will then decompose right in place, often attracting earthworms, and as the pot weakens in the ground, the plant's roots will be getting stronger and bust through the sides.

* The Newspaper Pot - Newspapers aren't around quite as much as they used to be; however, there are still plenty of flyers, free journals, and other paper products that can be rolled into plant pots. Cut the paper into strips around four or five inches wide and roughly a foot long. Then, use an old bottle to roll up the newspaper into cylinders and fold the one end to make the bottom of the pot. Fill it with a fine potting mix, and there you go.

*The Toilet Roll -Toilet rolls (or paper towel rolls) are even easier than newspapers, though it will require more time to collect enough for a full crop of stuff. Cut them in half (about three-inch sections) and then cut four one-inch slits in the bottom side of the roll. Fold the resulting tabs of paper as you would the top of a cardboard box. These are great for early spring planting and you can begin collecting them now.

* Egg Carton Pots – Cardboard egg cartons are easy plant pots. Cut up the side where the eggs sit into individual little pots and use the lid as a carrying tray for them. The pots can then be planted right in the ground, and the top can be composted.

* Fruit Rind Halves - With a little forethought, citrus fruits like mandarins and lemons (especially when juiced) can make perfect seedling cups. Just be sure to cut them in half so that the two pieces of rind are well suited to hold enough soil for seeds to get going. Then, by the time the rinds get a little questionable, the plants — pots and all — can go into the ground.

Homemade biodegradable pots make a lot of sense, they save gardeners a lot of money, and they make good use of waste. Ultimately, you get to eat the results.

WORLD'S FIRST BATTERY-FREE PHONE

By eliminating the need for phones to convert analog sound into digital data, researchers at the University of Washington were able to create a device that required little to no energy to perform basic functions. Additionally, the phone is only constructed out of cheap, offthe-shelf parts, and a circuitboard.

The phone is powered by a few microwatts of ambient radio signals and light that are harvested from the surrounding area. The team was also able to make Skype calls on the phone, proving that it could be used to contact a base station.

The current prototype only performs the basic functions of sending and receiving calls, and transmitting speech. The phone conveys speech by detecting the vibrations of the speaker's voice and translating the words into analog data, rather than digital. While the prototype currently needs a base station within 31 feet in order to operate, the team is next looking to integrate the technology into WiFi infrastructure.

FIXED WILD TURTLE'S **BROKEN SHELL, TURTLE ALIVE** AND WELL IN THE WOODS YEARS

Being a vet is such a difficult, yet amazing job. The things they do and have to see is so hard, but most of them love animals, and they push through it because it is one of the most rewarding jobs. And this veterinarian just found that out after taking a walk in the forest. Several years ago, a person had brought in a little box turtle that had been hit by a car to Hocking Hills Animal Clinic, asking the vet there to help him. And of course, she did what she could.

She used fiberglass to try and fix the broken shell. And luckily she succeeded. Afterward, she released him back into his natural habitat where he was safe and sound.

Now, several years later, the vet took a walk in the very same woods. But to her amazement, she saw something strange on the ground. As she got closer, she couldn't believe what she was seeing. It seemed almost impossible.

"Recently, while walking on my hillside, I spotted an odd pattern in the leaves. To my amazement, there was my old patient with the fiberglass still on...years later! Sometimes, being a vet is the best thing there is," said the vet.

She then added that if people ever see a turtle with a cracked shell, it's best if they seek veterinary assistance.

BEACHGOERS BANDED TOGETHER TO SAVE DROWNING

Roberta Ursrey was with her family enjoying a fun and relaxing day on a Florida beach when she noticed that her sons were missing. She couldn't find them, and didn't know where they had gone. After looking for them for quite some time she heard the screaming. The boys were trapped by the current, and couldn't escape. Being a mom, she wanted to help her children and keep them safe. She was warned not to go in, but did anyway. She had 5 others join her, but they also then were trapped in the 15-feet of water. The odds were not looking good for any one of them.

Jessica Simmons had been out with her husband when she saw people pointing at the water. When she realized that it was children drowning, she grabbed a discarded boogie board, and ran to the water, doing her best to swim and get them out. While Ms. Simmons' swam out, her husband and other men got together and started forming a human chain, in an attempt to bring everyone back. And eventually, there were 80 people involved and before they knew it, everyone was back safe on shore.

Ms. Ursrey's mother had a major heart attack during the ordeal, and had to be hospitalised, along with a nephew who had a broken hand. But no one drowned, and everyone is still alive and well.

THE EXTRAORDINARY SEA WOLVES:

For thousands of years, wolves in Canada had a unique relationship with the coastal First Nations peoples, for whom the wolf was considered as a revered animal treated with

admiration and respect.

Sea wolves are a unique breed of wolf found in the Great Bear Rainforest along the Pacific Coast of Canada. Swimming between islands like fish, they are genetically distinct from their inland cousins or from wolves in any other part of the world and they're smaller in stature than gray wolves in other parts of Canada.

We associate wolf meals with meat, but Sea Wolves live on salmon for nearly a quarter of their diet and forage on barnacles, clams, herring eggs, seals, river otters, and whale carcasses for the remainder and when hunting for food they can swim miles between islands and rocky outcrops.

More populations reside in southeastern Alaska, though overall sea wolves have declined in number over time. They once roamed all the way down to California to its former temperate rain forests, now they only go down to just north of Vancouver.

British Columbia has a relatively low human population where sea wolves enjoy an isolated wilderness - an area of 21-million acres, often described as a "bastion of biodiversity and for now, these coastal wolves live mostly unmolested in a wild landscape. However, there are currently no regulations in British Columbia forbidding the hunting of wolves, and furthermore, over 60% of the Great Bear Rainforest's old growth which is also home to grizzly bears, black bears and spirit bears is currently open to extensive logging, with energy giants wanting to send huge oil and gas tankers through the coast's narrow and vulnerable winding channels.

The rescuers renamed him Cocos and had him treated by a Vet, when his infections and sores had healed up Cocos was, luckily, adopted by a woman named Elena who was able to give him the love, affection, and attention he deserved. Everything was finally looking up for sweet Cocos, and he deserved nothing less, now he's as happy as can be in his forever home.

LUCKILY WE DO NOT NEED "CLOUD SEEDING" IN IRELAND

A popular Instagram/Twitter account from the

Emirates documents the extreme and stormy weather hitting the Gulf countries this summer. The page, called "Storm Center," publishes startling footage taken by local storm chasers, showing how the Middle Eastern desert deals with rainfalls, strong winds, and floods in what should be one of the driest months of the years. The gulf is witnessing a rare weather event and rainfall in peak summer due to a combination of cloud seeding (the process of spreading either dry ice, or more commonly, silver iodide aerosols, into the upper part of clouds to try to stimulate the precipitation process and form rain) and natural weather phenomena. According to a meteorologist at the UAE National Centre of Meteorology and Seismology NCMS, cloud seeding successfully brought rains over parts of the country. The rains were a result of the towering cloud formation brought about by winds coming from the mountains of Oman and the UAE, combined with high humidity from the seas and the prevalent high temperatures.

The rains come only a week after a brutal wave of heat scorched other parts in the region. Summers in the Gulf States can reach temperatures of around 54.5 degrees Celsius.

81-YEAR-OLD WOMAN IS INSPIRING A NATION TO

Zeinab Mokalled is making an effort to better her community through waste disposal. Based in Lebanon, she single handedly created a recycling system in her town and has made a huge impact on the cleanliness of her community. For nine months straight, rubbish piled up in Beirut because the country was lacking landfill sites. The country's response? Dump it into the ocean.

Ms. Mokalled went to the regional governor to ask for help. His response was "What do we care about looking nice? We aren't Paris". With that, Ms. Mokalled turned away disappointed, but certainly not any less motivated and decided that if you want a job done right, you have to do it yourself.

Ms. Mokalled reached out to the women in her community herself and her small group of friends and volunteers began going door to door, spreading the word of their project and recruiting new women to come and assist with the effort. Ms. Mokalled's friend Khadija Farhat bought a rubbish truck with her own savings.

Ms. Mokalled herself turned her back garden into a storage area for recyclable waste.

With an effort being made, soon the women had a great system going for sorting through recyclables and getting rid of rubbish. The volunteers began paying for rubbish removal themselves and the group has scraped together enough money to pay a researcher to try and find the most efficient way to compost in the arid environment of Lebanon. She named her programme Call of the Earth. After 10 years, they received a grant from the Italian embassy to build a warehouse, which is where Ms. Mokalled now receives visitors – schoolchildren, students and activists – who come to study how Call of the Earth works.

A CLOTHING LINE THAT IS DESIGNED TO STRETCH WITH CHILDREN AS THEY GROW

After a few wears and an ill-timed growth spurt, a baby's cute garments need to be swapped for clothing that's slightly bigger and just as expensive. Now a Royal College of Art graduate Ryan Mario Yasin has designed a practical alternative


Items in Mr. Yasin's Petit Pli clothing line are built to grow at the same rate as their young wearers. In their initial form, the pleated shirts and pants are small enough to fit a 4-monthold child. As they get bigger the material can be unfolded, ultimately expanding to the size of a wearer who's 2-and-a-half years old.

Mr. Yasin was inspired to develop the concept after ordering clothes for his nephew that were too small by the time they arrived. When searching for a solution to this problem, he tapped into his background in aeronautical engineering. Petit Pli uses a similar design to the collapsible structures made for the outsides of small satellites. The material also has a space-age feel: It's windproof, waterproof, and breathable, which means it should survive a few years of toddler wear-and-tear.

Petit Pli is currently in the fundraising stage. When he's attracted the attention of investors, Mr Yasin plans to start manufacturing the product in Great Britain.






