NEW WALKWAY NAMED AFTER DOROTHY HENNGELER

The Mayor of Tralee, Cllr Tom McEllistrim, formally opened the new Rose Walk last Friday morning.

Among the guests at the ceremony were the 32 roses taking part in this year's Rose of Tralee. The Roses were attending their first event following their arrival in Tralee. Also on the guest list were members of Tralee Municipal Authority and the parents of Dorothy 'Dott' Hellenger, Dick and Eibhlín Hellenger, after whom the new Rose Walk is named.

Kerry County Council say that the new Rose Walk links the Riverside Walk at "Fels Point" to the Town Centre, leading visitors through the Rose Garden and the many commemorations located in the park to the Rose of Tralee. The walk takes you past the life size statues of the original Rose, Mary O'Connor, and the author of the Rose of Tralee ballad, William Pembroke Mulchinock, as well as the Rose Wall of Honour. Speaking on behalf of the Hellenger family, Dorothy's 's father Dick Hellenger thanked Kerry County Council for the honour they bestowed on their daughter, and added "I would like to say how Eibhlín and I and our family are honoured that the town of Tralee has given Dott this tribute. We're truly touched by that".

"Now she has been given this tremendous part to play, to be here welcoming the Roses on the walk. That's what Dott really would have liked to have done," he said.



IRENE RETURNS FROM A TRIP OF A LIFETIME

A young Zoology student from Killarney has just returned from a trip of a lifetime to Madagascar.

Irene Sullivan, from Glenflesk, spent six weeks gathering data on Coquerel's sifakas (a species of lemur) for her dissertation in a patch of dry deciduous forest in north-west Madagascar.

" I am over-whelmed with gratitude that I was lucky enough to have spent the time I did there, encountering indigenous species, making the friends I have made, and, it must be said, using a "jungle long-drop," with geckos and frogs for company", Irene told the Killarney Outlook.

"The country itself is magnificent, housing an enormous wealth of endemic species, and boasting similarly awe-inspiring variations in landscape", she added. Irene was one of several dissertation students who were joined by research assistants and visiting school groups who occupied three camps in Mariarano, all established by Operation Wallacea (a biodiversity conservation organisation). Madagascar is currently undergoing severe deforestation at an alarming rate. It's population is every growing, and more people are emigrating to forested regions. Slash-andburn agriculture, among other anthropogenic activities, has lead to the destruction of habitat of many species. Irene's project involved the observation of lemur activity which according

to Irene was all day, every day in an attempt to determine whether or not encroaching human presence will negatively affect their development and behaviour. Some highlights of Irene's trip included holding a leaf-tailed gecko, seeing a sifaka up close, catching frogs from rice paddies and holding a giant hognosed snake.

"I made friends with both local people and dissertation students alike and although I don't

miss showering with a cup and bucket every day or having beans and rice for lunch" said Irene, "I hope that the enigmatic and beautiful forests of Madagascar will be conserved, and that members of future generations will see Coquerel's sifakas swinging through the trees of their natural habitat, just like I did".

A student at UCD, Irene is a past pupil of St. Brigid's Secondary School, Killarney and is the daughter of Noreen O'Brien and Kevin Sullivan.





MOTORING OUTLOOK

MEDICAL ISSUES WHEN DRIVING

The medical conditions that will preclude you from driving a motorised vehicle and when you will need a medical report.

Irish and EU legislation requires that a driver should advise their driver licensing authority of any long-term or permanent injury or illness that may affect their safe driving ability.

This report outlines the circumstances in which a medical report is required and the medical conditions that will preclude you from driving a motorised vehicle.

When do I need a medical report?

Your driving licence application must be accompanied by a Medical Report Form (D501) if you:

Are applying for a driving licence in respect of a truck or bus, licence categories C, C1, CE, C1E, D, D1, DE or D1E (unless you have previously provided a medical report which is still valid) Will be 70 years of age or more on the first day of the period for which the licence for any licence category is being granted.

Suffer from any of the disabilities or diseases specified in the diseases and disabilities list.

Have ever suffered from alcoholism or epilepsy. Are a regular user of drugs or medication that would be likely to make your driving unsafe.

The medical report must be completed by a registered medical practitionerand you must sign the declaration in his/her presence.

MEDICAL GUIDELINES SLÁINTE AGUS TIOMÁINT: Medical Fitness to Drive Guidelines

(Group 1&2) for Group 1 licence categories AM, A, A1, A2, B, BE or W and Group 2 Categories C, CE, C1, C1E, D, DE, D1 or D1E i.e. truck and bus (with or without trailer have recently been revised and updated taking into account legislative changes made in relation to the standards for eyesight, epilepsy and diabetes, as well as internatioal best practice. The guidelines set out clear minimum medical requirements and all applicants presenting themselves for medical examination should be assessed on the basis of the minimum standards outlined.

As in the past Group 2 guidelines require a higher standard of physical and mental fitness on the part of these drivers in light of the duration of time they spend behind the wheel and the greater size and weight of their vehicles. The updated Group 2 guidelines have been drafted following a public consultation process, including associations representing Group 2 drivers.

Specified diseases and disabilities which need to be reported on application for, or renewal of, a driver licence.

A range of medical conditions, as well as treatments, may affect your driving ability.

Diabetes treated by insulin and or sulphonylurea tablets (your doctor can advise whether you are on these or not) no need to tell us if managed by other tablets and or diet. Epilepsy.

Stroke or TIAs(*1)(minor strokes) with any associated symptoms lasting longer than one month.

Fits or blackouts.

Any type of brain surgery, brain abscess or severe head Injury involving in-patient treatment or brain tumour or spinal injury or spinal tumour.

An implanted cardiac pacemaker.

An implanted cardiac defibrillator (ICD)(*2). Repeated attacks of sudden disabling dizziness. Any other chronic neurological condition such as multiple sclerosis, motor neurone disease, Parkinson disease and Huntington's disease. A serious problem with memory or periods of confusion.

Persistent alcohol misuse or dependency.

Persistent drug misuse or dependency.

Serious psychiatric illness or mental health problems.

Parkinson's disease.

Sleep Apnoea syndrome.

Narcolepsy.

Any condition affecting the drivers peripheral vision.

Total loss of sight in one eye.

Any condition affecting both eyes, or the remaining eye if driver only has one eye (Not including colour blindness or short or long sight).

A serious hearing deficiency.

Any persisting problem with arm(s) or leg(s) which needs driving to be restricted to certain types of vehicle or those with adapted controls. Adaption of the driver's vehicle because of a physical disability to enable you to drive. Severe learning disability.



*This list is not exhaustive

(*1) A transient ischemic attack (TIA) is an event, with stroke symptoms that lasts less than 24 hours before disappearing (sometimes called a mini-stroke). While TIAs generally do not cause permanent brain damage, they are a serious warning sign of stroke.

(*2) An Implantable Cardioverter Defibrillator (ICD) is an electronic device which monitors your heart continuously. The ICD is programmed to detect abnormally fast or slow heart rhythms.

(*3) If in doubt please consult your family doctor.

Note: A person who is dependent on or regularly abuses psychotropic substances, ie, those that can induce mood changes or distorted perceptions, is barred from holding any learner permit or driving licence.

A person who suffers from serious arrhythmia which has at any stageresulted in loss of consciousness is particularly advised to consult his/her doctor before applying for a licence.

If you have any doubts about your physical or mental fitness to drive you should consult a doctor.

CONTENT OF MEDICAL REPORT:

The medical report must specifically refer to your eyesight, hearing, general physique and your general medical condition insofar as it is relevant to your ability to drive. This is the case regardless of whether the report is needed for age reasons or for illness/disability reasons. If you are downloading this form(PDF) then it must be printed back to back on one page. **APPEALS:**

An appeals mechanism is available for drivers who have been refused a licence on medical grounds. The Driving Licence Authority will inform drivers of the appeals process when informing them of the licensing decision.





class when it comes to qualifying for higher education. In fact, on a pro rata population basis, Kerry probably has the highest take up of college places in the entire country. This year's 2,031 Leaving Cert candidates from Kerry - 1,024 females and 1,007 males - splendidly maintained the high achievement of their predecessors. Consequently, the vast majority of CAO applicants throughout the county secured one of the coveted 75,194 offers to 52,028 offerees, which were issued on Monday. More than 70% of students from the county, who sat the 2015 Leaving Cert, will progress to higher education in colleges throughout the country. A further 20% will secure places at Post Leaving Cert (PLC) courses, Apprenticeships, Traineeships and other further education courses.

Kerry's students are top of the

As was widely anticipated, points' requirements for courses linked to expanding areas in the economy such as business, engineering, construction, technology and law increased this year. In fact, the points' trends released by the CAO on Monday morning clearly show that applicants are totally focussed on the jobs market in their course choices. However, the increase in points for some courses has been counter balanced by an overall increase in Leaving Cert grades this year.

college Nationally, 2015 applicants did extremely well in CAO Round One offers. About 80% of the 40,599 applicants, who were offered a Level 8 (Honours Bachelor Degrees) course, received one of their top three preferences. A phenomenal 97% of the 34,595 applicants, who were offered a Level 7/ Level 6 list (Ordinary Bachelor Degrees/Higher Certificate) course, received one of their top three preferences. This year CAO received 79,214 applications, an increase of 1,489 on the 2014 figure. About 60,000 can expect to receive at least one offer of a college place before the end of the offers' season in October. Last year, 47,003 applicants accepted college places and that figure is highly likely to increase this year. This is great news indeed for 2015 applicants and proves conclusively that the CAO system works very hard to accommodate the maximum number of applicants.

Poor job prospects since 2008 have resulted in school leavers rushing to college in unprecedented numbers. Despite the recent sprouting of green shoots of economic recovery, applications for college continue to increase. The welcome increase, also, in the number of mature and nontraditional applications is very much in line with government strategy, aimed at increasing the skills and gualification levels of the general population, not just standard school leavers. Once again this year, a quota of places was reserved by CAO for the 12,195 mature applicants and 16,115 applicants from the PLC sector. The quota system is a very healthy development as everybody deserves a second chance. So, there are plenty college places on offer this year for all categories of applicants.

CAO always issues more offers than there are places available in anticipation of a level of refusal by applicants. Offers are issued independently in respect of the two lists (Level 8 and Level 7/6), so that 23,166 applicants received an offer from each list on Monday. Log on to the CAO website, www.cao.ie to view your offer/s. Enter your CAO Application Number, your date of birth and your Account Password, if you provided one with your initial application. If you didn't, simply leave that entry blank. You may accept a first round offer online until 5.15pm next Monday. An offer automatically lapse unless you accept it on time.

Applicants sometimes find it difficult to understand how the CAO course offers system works. The following key points might simply the process for you:-

 You were offered the highest course preference/s to which you are entitled on the basis of your points.

 When you were offered a course preference, you were excluded from any course preference lower than the one, which you were offered.

 In the second or subsequent rounds of offers, you won't be considered for a preference lower than that already offered.

 If you were offered a preference, which is not your first preference, you may subsequently be offered a higher preference if such a place becomes available.

 It's not necessary to accept an offer in order to be considered for a higher preference if it becomes available. As there is no guarantee, of course, that a higher preference will become available, it's in your best interests to accept your first round offer and hope for the best in the second round. As the saying goes, "a bird in the hand is worth two in the bush!"

 Finally, it's worth remembering that when you have accepted an offer you are not obliged to accept any subsequent offer.

In the next article, I'll explain why Post Leaving Cert (PLC) courses give you a firm footing on the ladder to skills and qualifications. I'll also have a few words to say about the current controversy surrounding college grants.

Kerry and Tyrone has certainly sparked a lot of debate and enthusiasm among GAA followers in the county.

To date, Kerry and the Red Hands have met on five occasions in championship battles, with the Kingdom recording just two wins, one in 1986 in the All-Ireland final of that year, and again in June 2012 when the Kingdom memorably defeated Tyrone in a Round 4 qualifier at Killarney's Fitzgerald Stadium.

Many of the protagonists from that latter game will feature again when the sides meet next Sunday. Kerry have eleven survivors from the outing while Tyrone have eight.

Tyrone were the Kingdom's bogey side in the early noughties, defeating Kerry in the 03 semifinal and the 05 and 08 finals.

In the lead-up to this year's semifinal, Tyrone's game tactics have been the subject of much media talk and scrutiny in particular the proposed 8-week suspension handed down to Tyrone's Tiernan McCann by the GAA's CCCC for an

alleged incident with Monaghan's Darren Hughes; an incident for which Hughes received a straight red card.

Kerry manager Eamonn Fitzmaurice refused to be drawn on the Tiernan McCann issue at his team's pre-match press conference.

Fitzmaurice who suffered disappointments as a player against Tyrone, is aware of the threat they pose and will have warned his players not to be provoked into conceding easy frees.

Still, Tyrone are in this semi-final on merit. They have impressed in the All-Ireland qualifiers with

wins over Limerick, Meath, Tipperary and Monaghan. They have reached this stage of the competition with five serious contests behind them including a first round Ulster championship defeat at the hands of Donegal. Manager Mickey Harte, one of the longest inter-county managers

in the game today, knows what it takes to defeat Kerry in a championship match and he will have the Tyrone players well primed for this one.

Harte has unearthed some strong young talent in the past few years including the likes of Darren McCurry, who has lit up this year's championship with some stunning displays, and his own nephew Peter Harte, he was listed at wing-back against Monaghan but lined out at wing-forward, is a speedy ball carrier who loves to run at the opposition's defence.

Tyrone goalkeeper Niall Morgan, who has some experience of playing in the Irish League, is very adept at kicking long-range frees so in a tight game that could be a key factor.

Veteran Sean Kavanagh is still playing some great football while Joe McMahon, a hero of those great Tyrone successes over Kerry in the noughties, could be an injury worry for Mickey Harte.

Kerry, meanwhile, will enter this semi-final on the back of a 7-16 to 0-10 thrashing of Kildare in the

quarter-finals.

It remains to be seen whether talisman James O'Donoghue will play any part in the semi-final. A back spasm has ruled out Mikey Geaney for the rest of the season. Apart from these two casualties, the Kerry panel is intact.

Kieran Donaghy who missed the guarter-final win over Kildare, will almost certainly start against Tyrone, his father's native county. Will Eamonn Fitzmaurice be tempted to start Colm Cooper who played with such devastating effect against Kildare? Kerry fans will have a mixed view on this one as Cooper has often been at the receiving end of some heavy Tyrone tactics in the past.

Kerry fans are eagerly looking forward to Sunday's tie but not without some apprehension as to whether Kerry has finally found the answer to Tyrone's end of season magic.

Can Kerry get this particular Tyrone monkey off their backs? That is the answer to the question many Kerry fans will be asking this week.

On form, Kerry should win and advance to another All-Ireland final but Tyrone's amazing record in exploiting back door opportunities must surely be a consideration.

ALL IRELAND QUARTER FINAL

Alan O'Neill's Kerry ran riot against Mayo in the second half of the TG4 All-Ireland Ladies Senior Football quarter-final to book their place in the last four.

Goals from Louise Ní Mhuircheartaigh and Megan O'Connell opened the floodgates as the Kingdom scored a comfortable eight-point victory at the Gaelic Grounds in Limerick.

Just five points were registered in the first half but the Kingdom outscored their opponents by 2-10 to 1-06 after half-time to advance, with Mayo managing a consolation 1-02 in the closing minutes.

And yet Mayo opened the second half in encouraging fashion and were level at 0-04 apiece, with Niamh Kelly kicking two early points, before Kerry pulled away.

Mayo goalkeeper Aisling Tarpey denied Denise Hallissey with a fine save but the goals did come for Kerry, who played into the breeze after the break.

After O'Connell rattled the crossbar with a fierce drive, Kerry's leading scorer Ní Mhuircheartaigh was on hand to palm home the rebound.

After being denied by the woodwork earlier, O'Connell made no mistake for Kerry's second goal with 17 minutes left and that was effectively game over.

Crucially, Mayo star Cora Staunton was held to just two of her four points from play, both of them late efforts, and was generally off-colour throughout.

Aislinn Desmond performed an excellent marking job on the Carnacon superstar but

once they got going, this was a powerful display from Munster champions Kerry, with seven players on the scoresheet.

Mayo, who trailed by 13 points in the second half, did bring a degree of respectability to the scoreboard with a brilliant late goal from Aileen Gilroy but Kerry were too good.

And yet the winners led by just a point at the end of a low-scoring first half, 0-03 to 0-02.

Mayo didn't help their cause with some bad shooting as Staunton, looking well below her usual high standards

and operating between midfield and attack, registered four of Mayo's six first-half wides, including three from scoreable frees.

Goal chances came and went at both ends, with Tarpey somehow keeping out tireless Bernie Breen from point-blank range when the former Kerry skipper looked certain to rattle the net.

Approaching half-time, Gilroy unleashed a shot across the boughs of Kerry goalkeeper Edel Murphy but the former All Star netminder somehow managed to turn the ball aside.

Kerry also survived the first half sin-binning of corner back Gina Crowley, for a foul on Niamh Kelly.

During the ten minutes that Crowley was off the pitch, Mayo had three

> wides and Kerry registered a point, Sarah Houlihan's second, to move 0-02 to 0-01 clear.

After ten minutes passed without a score, Ni Mhuircheartaigh kicked a close in free to put Kerry 0-03 to 0-01 in front.

KILLARNEY ATHLETIC IN THE '90S

Many young players dream of playing at the higher levels of the game and it is also the highest achievement for any club to have one of its players selected for an international team or offered the opportunity to play with a professional club. Killarney Athletic has had the remarkable privilege of having six of its players achieve this distinction and honour. This week we focus on two of those players Michael Moloney and Bryan Murphy.

1ST INTERNATIONAL CAPPED PLAYER

FOR THE CLUB In November 1990 Michael Moloney became the first Kerry soccer player to be capped at international level when selected to play for the Irish under 15 team in a friendly match away to Switzerland. Mike was born in 1975 and lived in High St. a mere stone's throw away from where Dan Harrington had first encountered a group of youngsters playing soccer in a car park back in 1965.

MIKE WAS A RAW TALENT Nowadays people talk about players coming through coaching academies run by paid coaching staff but Mike came through with a genuine, raw talent. He played gaelic with the Crokes following on from a long line of the O'Donoghue family who were outstanding footballers and he played schoolboy soccer with Killarney Athletic. Mike learned his skills training and playing 7-a-sides in the 'Áras Pitch'. He recalls scoring a hat-trick in his first game for the club played in the Half Moon in a team managed by Vince Casey.

KERRY KENNEDY CUP TEAM Michael caught the eye as part of the Kerry under 14 Kennedy Cup team that narrowly lost out in the May 1990 final that was played in Lansdowne Rd. before the FAI Cup Final that year. The Kennedy Cup at the time was played on a league basis and victories for Kerry over the Limerick, Tipperary, Cork and Waterford leagues put them through to the final against the tournament favourites from Dublin. Before his side played in the final, Michael's reputation as an outstanding centre back was well known as a result of some 'man of the match' performances and after scoring some vital goals for his side. His impressive 25 yard free kick in the final which passed the Dublin keeper not only levelled the scoring but also displayed all the natural skill of a Kerry player. However the Dublin side did score a second goal to ensure them victory. The Kerry team that year included another talented Athletic player Marc McCarthy, and Mike's central defence partner was Kieran Guerin who later transferred to Athletic and became one of the most impressive players to play at senior level for the club.

MOST SKILFUL PLAYER Following on from that final Michael was selected to play in a centre midfield role with a Southern League Selection in a tournament in Northern Ireland that July before being called up for the Switzerland match later in the year.

Michael went on to win numerous caps for Ireland as a member of Killarney Athletic with the highlight being part of the Irish under 16 team to win a bronze medal in the European Youth Olympics in 1991 hosted in Belgium. Ireland lost to eventual winners Portugal in the semi-final but had a decisive 5 nil win over Luxembourg to take the 3rd spot ranking. Playing in the Heysel Stadium was a particular highlight for Michael. The then Irish underage boss Joe McGrath described Michael as one of the "most skilful central midfield players he had seen at the time to wear the Irish jersey", a fitting tribute to a brilliant talent from the heart of Killarney.

BRYAN MURPHY

Bryan, a Beaufort native, joined Athletic in 1991 as a teenager after being encouraged to do so by his good friend Brian 'James' O'Shea who also played in the team led by Toirdealbhach Ó Lionáird and managed by Vince Casey.

Bryan recalls his first success with the club was when they won the under-15 cup in the 1991/92 season. Bryan attributes the development of his game to a number of people involved in Killarney Athletic at underage level at the time. "Mikey O'Sullivan, Vince Casey, Donie Murphy, Denny Hayes, Bill Davidson and Brian 'Mac' McCarthy contributed a huge amount to my development as a young goalkeeper and playing in the 7-a-side in the 'Áras' was always a pleasure".

KENNEDY CUP & INTERNATIONAL TRIALS Impressing with Killarney Athletic between the posts brought him selection on the Kerry Kennedy Cup team in the 1991 season that also included Toirdealbhach. Both were also part of a historical Kerry win over a Welsh under 15 national team in the 1992/93 season and together they attended Irish trials that same year. Bryan remembers the disappointment of losing the youths All Ireland final in the 1993/94 season when a late equaliser by the Leinster senior league brought the game to extra time and a penalty shoot-out that they lost.

His performances attracted the attention of Mick McCarthy's Millwall and he went on trial to them in 1993, but an injury he picked up worked against him.

1ST ATHLETIC PLAYER TO PLAY LEAGUE

OF IRELAND Bryan played in goal for the winning Kerry minor team in 1994 under the stewardship of Charlie Nelligan who himself had been sought after by League of Ireland clubs.

With the ambition of getting a US scholarship through soccer Bryan attended Colaiste Ide Senior College in Dublin for a one year course. The decision proved successful in every way as he won 3 Leinster Cups and 1 under-18 All Ireland title in the 1994/95 season. This drummed up interest from a number of League of Ireland clubs at the time but he decided to play for 1st division side Kilkenny City who were essentially made up of a 'team of amateur teenagers'.

As a 17 year old goalkeeper Bryan described his experience with Kilkenny City as being the "busiest goalkeeper in Europe".

Scholarship to Boston University

Bryan accepted a full four year soccer scholarship to Boston University in 1995 and made his collegiate debut in Las Vegas Nevada. Boston was the number one ranked college team in the US during that time and this was a very difficult ranking to achieve. Bryan won 3 championships with the college in 1995/96/97 and the side qualified for the prestigious NCAA tournament in each year.

INTERNATIONAL CALL-UP Bryan's success attracted him to be selected for the Irish team that competed in the 1997 World Student Games hosted in Sicily. Bryan remembers that a good victory against Holland secured a top 8 finish while he was also pleased with his own performance in the tournament. "The support I got from Killarney Athletic and some business people in Killarney at the time was very much appreciated".

When Bryan returned to Dublin in 1999 he again played with a number of Dublin first division sides before another brief spell with Kilkenny City. He soon returned to his Gaelic football roots and was on the Dublin senior football panel that won the 2002 & 2005 Leinster titles. He is presently involved in a coaching capacity with the Dublin Football management under Dessie Farrell.

Bryan has also played Leinster Senior League with Belgrove FC and more recently with his 'now' local team Templeogue Utd. and won the Tolikoff Cup with them in 2008/09 season. As well as running close to 3 hour marathons Bryan has recently qualified as an official FAI referee and is looking forward to this new challenge. Bryan's younger brother Sean was also a talented soccer player and also played with Killarney Athletic in the '90s. Finally it would be fair to that Bryan has been a great sporting ambassador for Beaufort, Kerry and Killarney Athletic A.F.C.

ROWING TO RIO

The Monika Dukarska Blog. The story of a Professional Athlete



It is official, I have secured another cap for Ireland. It will be my third consecutive time representing Ireland at the World Rowing Championships. This time I am departing to Aiguebelette, France on Wednesday, the 26th of August and I'm returning on the 6th of September.

This season has been a real roller-coaster with several ups and downs. Every season has its endeavors but this season in particular has turned out like no other. From racing in a double scull until December, trailing in a single and racing in a women's pair from March this season, I have ended up in the Women's Four, Although it is a non-Olympic category (the focus is to form a strong Women's Pair in the coming winter and compete in the Final Qualification Regatta in May 2016 in Lucerne with the aim of securing one of the top 4 Olympic places available) it is a world championship event and there is no doubt that it will be tough.

A team of 14 athletes will represent Ireland at Worlds this year. We have four boats which aim for Olympic qualification. These are the Women's Double, Women's Lightweight Double (up to 57kgs per athlete), Men's Lightweight Double (up to 70kgs per athlete) and the Women's Single Scull. The non-Olympic events entered include the Women's Four, the Women's Lightweight Single (up to 59kgs) and the Men's Lightweight Pair (up to 70kgs per athlete). The number of athletes racing internationally for Ireland has quadrupled since 2013 with only 3 travelling to Chungju in South Korea.

Now we are entering a phase of training called a 'taper'. Metaphorically I call it 'sharpening of the pencil'. This consists of short but very fast and dynamic pieces/ sessions which bust the anaerobic system and make us more 'racy'. Training continues.

FARMING OUTLOOK



I have no time for the alarmist view on climate change or global warming. All the sceptical commentators of note and there are many serious scientists among them, acknowledge that carbon dioxide is a greenhouse gas. They accept that it will cause some warming but they believe that it will reflect its chemical capacity to retain heat and that it will not morph into some

runaway monster. They have been right in their scepticism for the last thirty five years. They get very little airplay unlike the peddlers of alarm. Our resident preacher of climatic jeremiads Professor Sweeney was on RTE Radio One last Sunday. Eventually he turned his attention to Agriculture. It was obvious that the thought of increased output of food from Irish farmers was

more than he could stomach. His basic contention was that agriculture is irrelevant to modern Ireland, is only a tiny 1.5% of Ireland's GDP and is an embarrassment to the international efforts to stem climate change. He is entitled to hold whatever opinion he wants on climate change, but such a gross misrepresentation of agriculture's role in this economy or its carbon footprint is not acceptable from an individual in his position.

Agriculture's contribution to the Irish economy is enormous, 230,000 jobs, one in nine of all jobs in the country are accounted for by the agrifood sector. The nature of the industry is that inputs, services and value added components are almost all sourced and created in this country, it has proven itself resilient in the face of exceptional turmoil and an anchor for this economy in times of trouble. When 30% of our GDP is repatriated by multinationals each year, agriculture's

earnings are spent in villages and towns all over this country. Out of 24 billion of agrifood turnover in 2013, 20 billion was associated with the Irish economy, the equivalent for the pharmaceutical sector is 7 billion out of a turnover of 35 billion. Without the peasant producer Sweeney so arrogantly dismisses, none of this is possible.

I don't know what our carbon crime is according to Professor Sweeney but on an international league table of food producers we are among the most sustainable. I can never get my head around the carbon footprint allocated to farmed animals. Cows graze grass, they consume the carbon dioxide already absorbed by the grass, they convert that into milk,meat, bone, hoof and

hide. They also release carbon dioxide and methane back into the atmosphere, it is a small percentage of the total converted from the grass they

IFA SAYS REAL TIGHTNESS IN CATTLE SUPPLIES STILL TO KICK IN

IFA President Eddie Downey said cattle prices and supplies are on an extremely fine balance and the real tightness in the supplies of steers and heifers has yet to kick in. It is projected the kill could be back by 3,000/4,000 per week when the real tightness kicks in and this will leave farmers with steers and heifers in a much stronger position.

The IFA President said this should give confidence to the trade and with the improved weather this week, farmers are resisting the price pressure and agents are finding it much harder to buy stock at the lower quoted prices.

Eddie Downey said farmers are very annoyed with the recent price cuts from the factories which make no sense against the strength of the UK market and sterling.

The facts are cattle numbers in the 12-36 month age bracket are down 100,000 head on this time last year and this will defiantly tighten supplies for the next 12 months. In addition, the kill to date this year is down only 40,000, and this reduction is made up of young bulls and cull cows. He said the real tightness in steers and heifers has yet to materialise and this will leave prime cattle very tight, with the kill back 3,000/4,000

head over the coming weeks and months. On new markets, Eddie Downey said the announcements from the Minister for Agriculture Simon Coveney and the Government on access to the US and China must be turned into real delivery and increased exports.

Eddie Downey said Minister Coveney needs to take action now on removing the technical obstacles holding back exports to these new markets in order to deal with increased cattle numbers in the pipeline for 2017 and to prevent a repeat of the severe beef price

and income problems of 2014. He said there must be real delivery on getting real access to new markets.

Henry Burns said the factories are trying to buy cattle this week at a base of €4.10/4.15 for steers and €4.20/4.25 for heifers. He said a lot of deals have been done at €4.15/4.20 on steers and some deals at €4.25 for early this week.

He said agents are finding it much more difficult to buy at the lower quoted prices.



Know Your Rights: USING A JET SKI AUGUST 2015

QUESTION

I would like to buy a jet ski. What are the rules about their use?

ANSWER

Recreational boats are regulated in different ways depending on their size and what they are used for. The use of safety equipment on any mechanically-propelled pleasure craft is covered by the Pleasure Craft (Personal Flotation Devices and Operation) (Safety) Regulations 2005. This includes motorboats, powerboats, fast powerboats (those that can travel at a speed of 17 knots) and personal watercraft, known as jet skis.

Under the Regulations, you must wear a suitable personal flotation device (lifejacket or buoyancy aid) at all times when using a personal watercraft. If you are being towed behind a personal watercraft, you must also wear a personal flotation device.

It is illegal for child under the age of 16 to operate or control a personal watercraft.

The consumption of alcohol or drugs is also restricted by the Regulations. If you are operating a personal watercraft or being towed by one, you must not consume or be under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

If an offence is committed under the Regulations, an on-the-spot fine of €150 may be imposed or the offence may be prosecuted in the District Court.

Wherever you intend operating the personal watercraft may be subject to bye-laws which can regulate and control your use of a personal watercraft. An offence committed under such bye-laws can also make you liable for an on-the-spot fine or prosecution.

It is recommended that before operating a personal watercraft, you should attend a suitable training course. Information on training courses is available from Irish Sailing Association (ISA), 3 Park Road, Dún Laoghaire, Co Dublin, Tel: (01) 280 0239 and from their website, sailing.ie.

The transition from primary to secondary school can be a difficult one for many children. The change from being the most senior student to suddenly becoming a junior again may bring many challenges for your child. They are leaving behind a familiar world and entering a whole new domain with new teachers, subjects, classrooms, class mates, an increased workload and a longer day. As this change also tends to coincide with the onset of puberty, is it any wonder that it can be so daunting for your child? This can also be a difficult time for parents. The school day is longer and your child will be taking on more subjects. Some of these subjects are ones you may not be familiar with which may mean you won't be able to help out with homework. There are also more teachers involved in your child's schooling. Your child's social circle is widening and you may not know who their friends are.

As your child moves through this transition, your job as parent is to support them to negotiate the challenges posed. First and foremost it is important not to pass on your own fears to your child. Remember, children are extremely resilient and adaptable and before long these new surroundings will be familiar and comfortable for them. When talking to your child about the expected transition let them know that you have trust and confidence in their ability to master these changes. Tell them about your own experiences and ways that helped you to cope. Talk to them about the change in routine and the possible change of classroom and teacher every 40 minutes. To make this transition as smooth as possible, particularly in the early days, try to be as supportive and encouraging as possible. Ensure they eat well, sleep well and stay tuned for any signs of distress or difficulty. Listen to them when they relay stories from school and show an active interest in their friendships, the school, their teachers, their activities and their subjects.

As parents, we can often feel a little helpless – our role is to be supportive, interested and encouraging. Always keep the lines of communication open and if you have any concerns please contact the school. No one knows your child better than you.

As your child moves through their teens remember they are involved in a major life change. Your job as a parent is to nurture their confidence and enable them to become well-adjusted and fully functioning adults. If you are struggling with any aspect of parenting your teen, SouthWest Counselling Centre will run an **8 week course on Supporting Parents to Support their Teens – beginning Weds Sept 30th.** Call 064 6636416 to book your place.

OBESITY IN CHILDREN

CONTINUED

WHAT IS THE CAUSE OF BEING OVERWEIGHT OR OBESE IN CHILDREN?

• If you eat fewer calories than you burn up, you lose weight. Your body has to tap into its fat stores to get the extra energy it needs.

Most children are overweight as a result of an imbalance in the energy consumed and energy burned. Rarely conditions such as hypothyroidism (an underactive thyroid gland) or other hormone problems may also be a cause.

WHAT SHOULD I DO IF I AM WORRIED THAT MY CHILD IS OVERWEIGHT OR OBESE?

If you are worried that your child may be overweight or obese, you can discuss this with your doctor who can first access the severity of the problem and may make some suggestions to promote a healthy weight. Sometimes a referral to the hospital to see a pediatrician or a dietician may be needed.

HOW MUCH WEIGHT SHOULD A CHILD LOSE IF THEY ARE OVERWEIGHT OR OBESE?

In general, rapid weight loss or strict dieting is not recommended for children who are still growing, unless this has been specifically advised by a specialist. For most children, the aim is usually weight maintenance rather than weight loss. As they grow and their height increases, the child should either not gain any weight as well, or their weight gain should be slower than their height gain.

WHAT IS THE TREATMENT FOR A CHILD WHO IS OVERWEIGHT OR OBESE?

The main ways to treat a child who is overweight or obese is to look at changes that can be made to their lifestyle. Changes that involve the whole family are best. Other family members who are overweight may also benefit at the same time. Remember that as a parent or carer, you act as an important role model for your child and you can help them to stay healthy. The two main lifestyle changes that are advised are for your child to eat more healthily and do plenty of physical activity. Small, gradual changes may be best. Your child will then be more likely to stick to these changes in the long-term.

As a parent or carer, you should try to be involved as much as possible in helping your child make these changes. However, some older teenagers may prefer to take responsibility for themselves. Think about how your child's progress is going to be monitored. Discuss this with their healthcare professional. At every opportunity, give praise and encourage your child in what they are doing.

EATING MORE HEALTHILY

Overweight children should be encouraged to eat more healthily and to reduce the total number of calories that they eat. In most cases, as a parent, you will need to take responsibility for making changes to your child's diet, especially if your child is under the age of 12.

HOUSEHOLD TIPS:

1. Purify air with houseplants - Like trees, plants can provide a home with added oxygen. Specific species are able to remove toxins from the air. Try adding plants like bamboo palm, peace lilies, or rubber trees to your home to purify the air.

2. Remove furniture scratches with walnuts - Walnut oil can repair wood blemishes. You need to shell the nut and rub it over any marks on the wood. The oils penetrate the wooden surface and go to work fixing any stains, blotches or scratches.

3. Keep sponges clean by microwaving them - Make sure your sponges aren't breeding grounds for germs with this tip. Take your dirty sponge and squirt a little lemon juice into it. Warm this up in the microwave for several minutes on high. The heat will kill the bacteria and you can use the sponge again.

4. Ice cubes can remove carpet dents - Heavy furniture can leave dents in your carpet. Quickly resolve this by placing ice cubes over the divot. Let them melt and soon after the carpet will go back to being even. You can fluff the area with a toothbrush or fork to help expand the fibres if necessary. Finish by patting the carpet with a cloth.

5. Use Alka Seltzer to unclog drains - If your sink appears to be acting up try this trick to unblock it. Drop four of these fizzy tablets down the drain, followed by a tablespoon of vinegar. Then flush the sink with boiling water. The drain should become unclogged, and ready for use.

6. Clean windows with newspaper -Newspapers will do a more thorough job cleaning windows and mirrors because they have denser fibres than paper towels. Dense fibres allow the paper to absorb liquids used for cleaning. The density also makes them stronger so they are less likely to fall apart in your hands.

7. Aluminium foil can help with ironing - Cover your ironing board with aluminium foil and then put the ironing board cover over the top of it. The foil will reflect the heat so you will be ironing both sides at the same time, without the need to flip the piece of clothing over.

8. Remove chewing gum with peanut butter - Chewing gum has the tendency to get stuck to your shoe and other places where it doesn't belong. Remove this annoying litter with a couple of tablespoons of peanut butter spread. Afterwards, you can use a wire brush to help scrub off any remaining bits of the gum.

9. Use soap to fill a hole in the wall - Nail holes and nicks can leave a wall blemished. Instead of filling a white wall with silicone, use a soap bar. Simply rub the bar over the hole in a circular motion, until the surface is even.

IS THIS THE BEGINNING OF THE END OF BULLFIGHTING IN SPAIN?

The Spanish town of Villafranca de los

Caballeros, situated about 80 miles south of Madrid, has decided to cancel its annual bullfight and use the money saved on books and school supplies for local children.

"It's a question of priorities," said the town's newly elected socialist mayor, Julián Bolaños. "There is a lot of unemployment in this town and many people simply don't have money to buy school supplies for their children." He estimated that the town, which has a population of 5,200, was spending as much as \in 18,000 a year to hold the annual event.

Manuela Carmena, the new mayor of Madrid, a traditional bastion of the bullfight, has said publicly that "not one euro of public money" will go toward bullfighting; in the city of Valencia the mayor, Joan Ribó, has likewise stated that no government money will go to finance any event in which bulls are killed; in Alicante, the bull run which has traditionally been a part of the city's August festival was replaced by a cycling race, and the new government has said it plans to ban municipal land from being used in bullfights by 2017.

It began with a ban on bullfighting in Catalonia in 2011, but now the push to abolish the socalled "sport" is gaining steam.

In the resort of Gandia, bullfighting has already been banned because, according to local officials, it amounts to animal abuse.

In nearby Dénia, the annual bous a la mar, in which the bull eventually ends up being pushed into the sea, faces a local referendum before it will be staged again.

Further north in Zaragoza, organisers of toros embolados, where firecrackers are attached to the bulls' horns, have been told that they will no longer receive public money to put on their fiestas.

Animal rights activists in Spain have welcomed their actions but point out that more needs to be done, with more than 16,000 fiestas involving bulls being planned this year in some 3,000 municipalities across the country. Last week, in an historic move, the Spanish town of Trigueros del Valle voted unanimously to define dogs and cats as "non-human residents," giving them rights similar to men and women in the area. Let's hope that the move to modern day laws, which would outlaw bullfights and speak up for animal rights, will continue to grow, as Spain moves beyond its violent treatment of animals in the past.

DONKEY ESCAPES FROM BURNING FOREST:

Firefighters battling a section of the 7,000-acre wildfire in Arizona received a much-needed

glimmer of hope last week when a lone donkey — frightened but alive — emerged from the burning forest. He seemed to understand the firefighters could help, which they did by cooling his singed body with water from their hose, he then kept following them around. His friendly presence amid so much devastation quickly found the animal a place in the hearts of the rescue crews.

"Our firefighters have seen a lot of animals that were killed in the fire a spokesperson for the Fire Department said, so the situation has been hard on these guys, the donkey has really boosted their spirits. He really made their day". The donkey has since been evacuated to safety. If no owner comes forward to claim the animal, the American Wild Horse Sanctuary in California has volunteered to give her a home.

PLASTIC BALLS ARE CALIFORNIA'S WATER-SAVERS:

20,000 black plastic "shade balls" were released last week into the Los Angeles Reservoir to float and bob on the surface, in an effort to prevent sunlight-triggered chemical reactions that encourage algae — creating cleaner water and also to protect the water from wildlife. But the key benefit is that the floating ball will prevent evaporation. Los Angeles officials estimate the balls will save about 300 million gallons of water each year.

The release of this batch of balls into the 175acre reservoir was the culmination of a \$34.5 million initiative to protect the water supply that involved the deployment of 96 million plastic balls into the water.

The shade balls costing 36 Cent each are manufactured by minority, women-owned facilities in Los Angeles County, are BPA-free and should not release any chemicals and will require no parts, labour or maintenance aside from occasional rotation. They're recyclable and should last 10 years before they need to be replaced.

In addition to the Los Angeles Reservoir, the balls are floating at Upper Stone, Elysian and Ivanhoe reservoirs and other areas.

100 YEARS OF OPAL MINING IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA:

The South Australian Museum in Adelaide will unveil the first public display of the "Virgin Rainbow" in September. Worth more than \$1 million, this outstanding geological specimen is distinguished for its rich palette of colours and light-refracting qualities. Like other opals, the "Virgin Rainbow" is composed of silica and water and was formed over millions of years from the opalised fossils of dinosaurs.

This gemstone is just one part of the museum's larger "Opals" exhibition, which was organised to celebrate 100th anniversary of opal mining in South Australia. Although this region was once a silica-rich inland sea populated by marine dinosaurs, today it's a hot, arid region that's responsible for 90 % of the world's opal supply.

Although a number of the opals in the museum's collection have been refined into flawless jewellery pieces, many others are rough gems that are clearly embedded in rocks or the fossils of plesiosaurs and other ancient marine organisms from the time central Australia was an inland sea.

YOU CAN'T GO TO THIS BEACH WITHOUT A DOG:

Just a few weeks ago I was writing about the responsibilities of people that take their dog to the beach, now I am delighted to know that at one beach in Italy, dogs are getting their own back!

Located on the Adriatic Sea in the region of Emilia Romagna, Rimini has more than 10 miles of beaches and one section is turned over to the canines and their human friends. The two brothers who run the beach have the first and only authentic dog beach in Emilia Romagna" where people who are not there with their dog are not allowed to enter.

The Agostini brothers have said that they became aware that a growing number of people were asking for a pet-friendly beach and not only did they give these people a place to bring their dogs, they built a number of features that made this part of Rimini (located in Bagno 81) a special destination for dog lovers.

Dogs can run free in a fenced-in agility park and play with each other while their owners look on from the outside and there are umbrellas both inside the fences and on the beach itself so the four-legged visitors can get some shade alongside their owners if it gets too hot.

There are showers especially designed for dogs where owners can rinse the sand off their pets before they leave the beach. Rakes are on hand if visitors need to cover over urine spots and of course there are dishes from which the visiting dogs can drink, and fountains where the bowls can be filled. The beach has an onsite vet and a dog-sitting service, which people can use when they want to head over to the humans-only section of the seaside. Pets are allowed at a number of hotels in Rimini. Even higher-end places like the Grand Rimini Hotel and the Holiday Inn Rimini Imperiale allow dogs to stay. The choice of restaurants where dogs are welcome is not quite as widespread, but there are a few options in the Rimini area.

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 12TH WAS WORLD ELEPHANT DAY:


World Elephant day was launched in 2012 by Canadian documentary filmmaker Patricia Sims and the Elephant Reintroduction Foundation of Thailand.

Despite being a charismatic species loved by people of all ages, elephants in both Africa and Thailand are in serious trouble. Since the first World Elephant Day, individuals, celebrities and dozens of organizations that are working on solutions that will ensure their future survival around the world, have joined in support because the threat of losing them forever is becoming a very real possibility.

Poaching in Africa has reached unprecedented levels, which some believe could wipe elephants out entirely within the next 10 years if it continues at its current rate, and there are now estimated to be less than 40,000 Asian elephants left in existence and they continue to face the threat of poaching, habitat loss and being taken for the tourism industry.

Unfortunately, wild elephants aren't the only ones in trouble. Animal advocates have also been working to end their exploitation in captivity and entertainment and raise awareness about why elephants belong in the wild, not circuses, zoos or tourist attractions.


