Some were forced to look at the realities of hospice care for the first time while others were well aware of what is involved having had personal experience of the daily routine of the hospice. But everyone recognised the play as poignant, uplifting and very positive. It fulfills the hospice philosophy of living to the end.

Dochas Drama Group did not set out to raise funds for Kerry Hospice.But, as the rehearsals progressed members recognised that the nature of this play forms a tribute to hospice care. # KILLARNEY STUDENTS ENJOY BRUSSELS TRIP

Transition Year students from Killarney were part of a group of 42 from across Ireland South who joined Seán Kelly MEP for a visit to the EU institutions in Brussels recently, having won the trip as a prize in Mr Kelly's essay competition. The local students had successfully penned winning entries under the title "Why the EU is important to me", in a competition the MEP organised to motivate young people to explore their relationship with the EU.

"I was delighted to host this inspiring, intelligent group of teenagers on their visit to the European Parliament, where I gave them a tour of the institution, and discussed Ireland's role in the European Union - EU, the work of the EU institutions and my role as their local MEP", Sean Kelly told the Killarney Outlook.

"Their contributions showed great intelligence and critical thinking, and we exchanged views on topics such as Brexit, EU expansion and candidate countries, the Renewable Energy Directive, and incentives and fines concerning EU legislation. The students also asked a great variety of questions on issues such as net neutrality, differences between Ireland and the rest of the EU in e.g. education, tax policy and Parliamentary systems, gender equality,

accessibility for persons with disabilities, and the Lisbon treaty," Mr Kelly added.

As well as their visit to the European Parliament, the students also saw the Future Classroom Lab by European Schoolnet, which is an inspirational learning environment in Brussels. On a visit to the European Commission, they met the EU Commissioner for Agriculture, Phil Hogan, who answered their questions on rural development, climate change, agriculture in developing countries, the effect of Brexit on Ireland's agricultural exports, and meat standards and traceability across the EU.

The teenagers also visited the other Belgian cities of Bruges and Ghent. "I believe it is crucial to engage with and inform young people on EU issues. This visiting group are full of enthusiasm and keen to enhance their knowledge of Ireland's place in Europe! Comhghairdeas to all who submitted entries to the competition, and thank you for taking an interest in your European Union," MEP Kelly added. The Kerry students were part of a larger group also representing Cork, Limerick, Wicklow and Clare.

# KERRY MOUNTAIN RESCUE TEAM CALLS FOR A SAFE CHRISTMAS

This year Kerry Mountain Rescue team responded to 29 calls for assistance and helped 29 people with one fatality. Along with 1144 rescue hours clocked up the 35 strong voluntary team also put in 1115 training hours. This Christmas they are asking people to put safety first if planning to go winter walking or climbing.

Snowy and frosty mountains can provide an incredible backdrop for winter walking or climbing.

With the short winter days, cold weather and dark skies, it's more important than ever to plan ahead to ensure you stay safe out there. As the winter sets in, there are a few key safety considerations for those heading into the mountains.

### Be Aware

Make sure you start your walk early enough in the day; be aware of what time it gets dark and allow for a change in the weather too.

### Plan

Plan your day and route taking into consideration a reliable mountain weather forecast. Leave a route plan with a responsible person. Don't forget to keep an eye on the weather during the day. Always be prepared to turn back or take a shorter route. The mountains will still be there another day.

### Prepare

Whatever your plans, you'll need a good torch and spare batteries in case you get delayed.



People sometimes prefer to carry a second lightweight torch so they don't need to change batteries in the cold or the dark if the head torch packs up.

### **Equipment Checklist**

- Sturdy footwear with a good tread
- Food and warm drinks
- Waterproofs

•

- Map and compass and ability to navigate
- Hat and gloves
- Torch and batteries
- Extra layers to keep warm and dry
- Fully charged phone and spare battery
- Bivvy bag or group shelter and first aid kit

Ice axe and crampons and winter skills

If you need to call out mountain rescue, first make a note of all relevant details:

- Location (with a grid reference if possible)
- Name, gender and age of casualty
- Nature of injuries or emergency
- Number of people in the party
- Your mobile phone number.

Dial 999 or 112, then ask for "Mountain Rescue'. Give all your prepared details of the incident and STAY WHERE YOU ARE until contacted by the rescue team.

# Health Matters... With Dr. Lynda O Gallaghan

### Old Wives Tales- Fact or Ficton?!

### I've the flu doctor, I was at a funeral and got a fierce wetting

Ficton! You did get the flu at the funeral but getting cold or wet cannot give you the flu. Having contact with many individuals at one time increases your exposure to all viruses, especially in winter. People carry the flu virus in their saliva so often they transmit this to their hands and shake your hand, or give a greeting by kissing so spread the virus.

### Sitting on a cold step gave me a urine infection

Ficton! Urine infections are very common in females because they have a short tube from the bladder to the outside.Bacteria that occurs naturally around the back passage can enter the lower urine system and cause infection. This can be triggered by constipation, diarrhoea, in adequate voiding, cleaning back to front.

### An apple a day keeps the doctor away

Fact. Apples contain Vitamin A and E which reduce your risk of heart attack. One study in the UK showed prescribing an apple a day (with other lifestyle changes with a healthy diet) prevented 8,500 strokes or heart attacks. Apples also contain free radicals which are thought to help reduce the risk of cancer.

### Feed a fever. Starve a cold.

Fiction! Both fevers and colds cause extra fluid loss through extra sweating and temperatures. It is important to drink extra fluids when unwell. Starving an illness only serves to make the patient nutrient deficient and so slows healing, so even in the case of vomiting and diarrhoea the patient should eat and drink as tolerated.

### Sucking your thumb can cause buck teeth.

Partially fact. Thumb sucking in early childhood years is entirely safe as are soothers. If your child continues to suck their thumb after 4–5 years of age it may alter the position of the developing adult teeth so this should be discouraged.

### Put a warm tea bag on a stye

Fact. A warm compress will draw out the infected fluid from an eye stye and help prevent further swelling.

### Squeeze the hard part of your upper nose during a nose bleed and hold your head backwards.

Fiction! The hard part of your nose is cartilage and pressing it does not affect blood flow. You should squeeze the soft part towards the tip of your nose as this is where the bleeding often starts (called Little's area). Packing the nose is another effective treatment. You should never hold you head back as this just allows the blood to flow into the back of throat and must be swallowed- which can be unpleasant and cause nausea.

Community and voluntary groups from across the county are being invited to apply for a fund of €750,000 for local community-based projects and initiatives. The 2018 Community Support Fund was launched by Kerry County Council the Tralee Bay Wetlands Centre by the Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr John Sheahan and Council Chief Executive, Moira Murrell.

The fund, which is now in its fourth year, has supported over 1,000 projects since 2015 to the value of  $\in$ 2.25million. As occurred in 2017, some of the Community Support Fund will be used again this coming year to target strategic projects in the four municipal districts and to co-fund projects which are in receipt of grants from other sources.

In 2017, almost €1million was leveraged from other grant sources such as Town and Village Renewal and the Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Fund as a result of the strategic allocation of resources under the Community Support Fund.

For 2018, the fund has been refocussed to target funding under five categories of support: Growing and Sustaining Communities

The party met last week in Killarney where they elected Mary Healy Whitling as secretary, Peter Pierse as constituency treasurer with their candidate at the last general election Michael Fitzgerald as their delegate to the party policy council. The Castlegregory man polled 1,011 votes last time in the 2016 General Election,

# TIPS FOR HOME SAFETY DURING THE CHRISTMAS SEASON

\* Carefully inspect holiday light strings each year and discard any with frayed cords, cracked lamp holders, or loose connections. When replacing bulbs, unplug the light string and be sure to match voltage and wattage to the original bulb.

\* Always turn off Christmas lights when you leave the house unattended or when going to bed.

\* When hanging outdoor lights, keep electrical connectors off the ground and away from metal rain gutters. Use insulated tape or plastic clips instead of metal nails or tacks to hold them in place.

\* Do not put candles on Christmas trees and keep decorations and cards away from fires and other heat sources such as light fittings. Don't leave burning candles unattended and keep them well away from drapes and decorations that may be flammable, such as greenery, also keep them away from on the edge of a table or counter and make sure you put them out before going to bed and.

\* Look out for small items that could pose a choking hazard to young children, including parts that have fallen off toys or from Christmas

#### trees, button batteries and burst balloons.

\* Give yourself enough time to prepare and cook Christmas dinner to avoid hot fat, boiling water and sharp knife accidents that come from rushing, and keep anyone not helping with dinner out of the kitchen. Wipe up any spills quickly

\* Have scissors handy to open packaging, so you're not tempted to use a knife, and have screwdrivers at the ready to assemble toys

\* Beware of trailing cables and wires in the rush to connect new gadgets and appliances, and always read instructions

\* Falls are the most common accidents so try to keep clutter to a minimum and have someone with you if you have to climb ladders etc. Make sure stairs are well-lit and free from obstacles, especially if you have guests.

\* Don't try to burn evergreens or wreaths in a fireplace or wood stove. Greenery and tree needles burn much faster than logs, creating sparks, which can fly into the room or onto the roof. They can also cause a build-up of creosote, a highly flammable compound, in the chimney. "And don't burn wrapping paper, because it can contain metallic materials that could be hazardous to breathe in apart from the harm it would do to the environment.

# A CHRISTMAS TRADITION FROM SCOTLAND:

Until at least the middle of the nineteenth century it was customary on the Island of Lismore in the Inner Hebrides to give a special breakfast to all animals upon the farm on Christmas morning. This was known as Nollaig do Spréidh ('Christmas for the Livestock') Horses and cattle were given a sheaf of corn in the stall; sheaves of corn were spread out for the sheep in the fields; the pigs and the poultry likewise had a special feast. If there was a suitable tree near to the dwelling-house a sheaf of oats was hung up on it. If not, a wooden pole was erected and the sheaf was fastened to the top of the pole for the birds.

# LONDONS BLACK CABS ARE GOING ELECTRIC:

London's first electric-powered black cabs hit the streets on December 5th. The British capital's iconic taxis are getting a facelift for the modern age that will help cut pollution in the city. The new-look cabs will meet the strict new emissions regulations required for all new London taxis from 2018 and will replace the old diesel cabs, with more than 9,000 electric taxis -- around half the current fleet size -- expected to be plying for trade by 2021.

"The vehicle is totally new from the ground up and it's a much better experience both for the cabbie and the passengers. The ride and handling is much better and it's very quiet." Chris Gubbey, chief executive of the London Electric Vehicle Company said.

The new cabs retain much of the familiar shape, but are marginally bigger, allowing a sixth passenger inside and have been brought up to date with wifi, USB chargers, a plug socket and a contactless payment card reader in the back. The new, transparent roof allows passengers to take in the cityscape above them.

\*Make sure all visitors know to close any doors, windows or gates to stop a panicked pet making an accidental escape

\*Don't give your pet turkey or chicken bones – they can splinter and cause serious issues for your pet

\*Keep up your pets regular feeding and exercise routines to minimise upheaval

\*Don't choose the festive period to try your pet on a new diet. Stick to their usual routine as much as possible to minimise stress at this busy time.

#### RATS ARE SAVING ELEPHANTS FROM HIDDEN LANDMINES ON THEIR MIGRATION ROUTES

African giant pouched rats, nicknamed "HeroRats", have made international headlines for their groundbreaking work in clearing minefields with their noses.

Because they are too small to set off the explosives, the rodents can sniff out the bombs and allow their human counterparts to safely disarm or detonate them.

APOPO, the charity that employs the clever creatures, has been tasked by the Zimbabwean Ministry of Defence with clearing the deadly landmines inside what is now the Great Limpopo Transfrontier Park (GLTP) – the largest conservation area in the world, spanning South Africa, Mozambique and Zimbabwe.

The mines don't just pose a threat to endangered wildlife species such as lions, tigers, and elephants – they have also proven risky to the Zimbabwean communities who are cut off from water sources, livestock grazing lands, and cross-border trading routes.

Additionally, clearing the mines could usher in millions of dollars worth of international ecotourism for Zimbabwe. Mozambique became the first of the 3 nations to be declared "mine-free", after 22 years of work with the government removed more than 171,000 landmines, and opened up more than 4,200 acres of land (1,700 ha) for safe passage to the local communities.

Over the course of the Belgian charity's 20-year career, the rats have safely located over 106,000 mines, and they have detected over 12,000 TB-positive patients who were missed by their clinics, and prevented almost 90,000 potential infections of tuberculosis.

If you're worried about how the rats feel about working in such dangerous fields, have no fear – the NGO has assured that their 300 bombsniffers and TB sniffers are treated like the heroes they are.

I have ordered a few presents from a Belgian website. Can I return them if I change my mind when I get them?

## **ANSWER**

Online purchases from businesses based in the EU are covered by the EU Directive on Consumer Rights. Under this Directive you are entitled to a cooling-off period of 14 days. During the cooling-off period, you can cancel distance contracts such as online purchases without giving a reason and without incurring charges or penalties, other than possible charges incurred in returning the goods. The 14-day cooling-off period begins on the day that you receive the goods.

Upon cancellation, the distance seller is obliged to repay you within 14 days, including delivery costs. If you chose a more expensive type of delivery than the seller's cheapest standard delivery, you are only entitled to be refunded the cost of the cheaper delivery type.

The seller can withhold the repayment until the goods are returned or until you supply evidence that you have sent the goods back.

You must send the goods back within 14 days of informing the seller of the cancellation. You may have to pay for the cost of returning them. The seller must inform you of such costs before you complete the purchase.

The seller should also have provided you with confirmation of the contract, as well as information on aftersales and guarantees, how to cancel the contract and a postal address for complaints. If the seller did not provide you with information on your right to cancel, the cooling-off period can be extended by 12 months.

Some purchases are not covered by the cooling-off period. These include customised or perishable goods and bookings for transport or accommodation.

# FOCUS ON HEDGING

Hedges can make a much more natural background to a garden than a wall or a fence. They can provide shelter and are cheaper and require a small amount of maintenance. Because a hedge allows the wind to filter through it reduces its velocity. Tall or low growing, clipped or informal, there is a hedging plant for every purpose. One thing to remember about a hedge is that it is intended to be a permanent feature in the garden so therefore should be chosen with care and planted in well prepared soil.

# To choose the right hedge for your garden here are a few pointers to think about

- 1. The type of soil you have
- 2. How exposed the garden is, i.e. what direction is it facing
- 3. The eventual height and width the hedge will be
- 4. Does it need to be evergreen

When you have chosen the type of hedge that you want its time to prepare the soil. Start preparing the soil by digging thoroughly and forking in some well rotted farmyard manure. Hedges can be planted all year around but the ideal time is between November and March as all hedging plants will be dormant at this time. What that means is when you go to buy your hedging plants they are lifted straight from the ground and are called bare-rooted hedging. This enables you to replant straight back into the ground when you get them home. Just make sure that when planting that the roots are spread out well as this will encourage them to root quickly when the growing season starts. If you have missed the bare rooted season at the end of March you can plant container grown hedging all year around. Next week I will focus on trees.
