KILLARNEY LIBRARY LECTURE

Franz S. Haselbeck was a pictorial artist who worked with the Killarney-based photographer Louis Anthony before moving to Limerick in the early part of the last century. As a professional photographer he made a record of Captain Robert Monteith's safe houses and Limerick hiding places in 1916 before escaping to the U.S.A.

In the 1920s he was contracted to record the Ardnacrusha scheme, which was the largest construction project in Europe at the time. His granddaughter, Patricia Haselbeck Flynn,

will give a fully illustrated lecture, organised by the Kerry Archaeological and Historical Society, on her celebrated ancestor's works in Killarney Library on Tuesday next, April 26, at 7.30pm.

It is Kerry's first League final since 2009 when they defeated Derry having been defeated by the same county in the previous year's final and of course 2009 will be fondly remembered as a year when Kerry went on to complete the double with victory over Cork in that year's All Ireland final. It is hard to believe that we have to go all the way back to 1987 for the last meeting between Kerry and the Dubs in a League final and on that occasion a star studded Kerry side were beaten on a 1-11 to 0-11 scoreline. We did not know it at the time maybe, but that defeat was the beginning of the end for the greatest team ever to grace Croke Park.

It will be interesting to see how both managers will approach Sunday's showdown. Will there be a bit of shadow boxing ahead of the championship or will one or both sides want to lay down a marker ahead of a possible championship meeting in August? Dublin have put together an extraordinary run of victories in the both League and Championship and they now stand one game away from achieving a 4-in-a-row of League titles, a feat last achieved by Kerry from 1971 to 1974. Kerry for their part will not want to concede further ground to their opponents given that Dublin have had the upper hand in Championship meetings between the sides in the last few years and no doubt the Kingdom will want to head into a seven weeks break before the Munster Championship in a positive frame of mind.

While Dublin have been steamrolling all before them en route to the final, Kerry have been quietly impressive themselves putting together a run of six League victories on the trot culminating in a rather facile victory over Roscommon in the semi final and Eamonn Fitzmaurice and his management team must have been on tender hooks this last weekend with all their squad involved in the various Club Championships on Saturday last.

James O'Donoghue and Anthony Maher are back doing gym work and they are the only long term injuries but Johnny Buckley remains a doubt having picked up an injury against Roscommon in the semi final, otherwise Eamonn Fitzmaurice and his management team's biggest task is who to leave out of the 26 man match day squad for Croker.

Sunday's encounter promises to be another epic battle between these age old rivals and hopefully, when the dust settles, Kerry will have gained their 20th League title.

WATER WORKS:

Cllr Maura Healy Rae and Danny Healy Rae TD are glad to announce that €51,000 has been made available by Irish Water for the replacement of water mains at Shronedarragh, Headford, Killarney, they both have had motions down about this water main and Danny has been asking for it for a very long time, the funding for the water main is of major importance as there is funding already in place to get the road done, this work would be in jeopardy if funding for the water main had not come through from Irish Water, Maura Healy Rae says "we are absolutely delighted that this funding has been granted as the water main will be put in place very soon and works on the road will be done before the end of the year, this is very welcome news for the people of this area and indeed all the people who use the road"

APPROPRIATE SIGNAGE

At the April Municipal area meeting Councillor Michael Gleeson asked: That some form of internationally recognised signage would be put in place on the approach roads to Killarney indicating to large truck and coaches that have no business reason for doing so, that they should not enter the actual town and very especially not enter Plunkett Street.

The Council replied that advisory signage can be located at key junctions in the town advising drivers of the preferred route that they should follow in order to avoid the immediate town centre.

Councillor Gleeson stated that this was an urgent matter as on occasion large vehicles unnecessarily access the town centre and cause considerable upset to traffic flow."

2. The 1.5km Aglish to Coolbane works will begin in July.

3. The 500 meter pipe replacement from Faha NS junction towards Rockfield will begin in June. The effective tax rate on interest earned on savings can be as high as 45% as both the new higher rate of Deposit Interest Retention Tax (DIRT) tax and the PRSI levy on unearned income have both come into force. If you invested €20000 over 12 months at 1.50%, taking into account DIRT tax and the levy you may only get €165 after DIRT tax and the PRSI levy. STRUGGLING TO SHIFT THOSE EXTRA FEW STUBBORN POUNDS, & NEEDING SOMETHING TO HELP GET MOTIVATED?

Here are some helpful inexpensive Tools that I often recommend to my clients to help them stay on track & often use myself, so Im delighted to be sharing them with you this week.

Take a full length "Selfie": Selfies are all the rage at the moment. However this particular type of selfie I don't think is one you will like to share as I recommend taking it in minimal clothes & full length to see all your lumps and bumps so you can visible see results happening and track your progress. If you can see your progress visually it really helps motivate you to do more & stay on track. Take one every 2weeks or every month and keep record or each photo in a private file that can not be accessed by anyone else unless you want to brag about the progress your making!!!
Measuring tape: investing in a simple measuring tape can be a great tool if you don't like the thought of scales or photos but still want to track some progress. The Main measurements I take are; waste, hips, chest, arms, thighs. But don't worry if your confused and don't get it right just take the measurements of the largest diameter of the area you want to reduce, make a note of it and compare in about 4 weeks again. Just make sure to measure the exact area again eg. use the belly button as a marker or a birth mark etc.

Im sure when you see the inches dropping you will think twice before ditching the next workout or reaching for the takeaway menu.

 Skipping rope: having a skipping rope by the bed or back door and setting yourself a small daily challenge of 300 skips in morning and evening can make all the difference. Then gradually increasing it to more reps or increased time, this will add extra activity to your daily calorie burn and especially if you do it first thing as it will get those metabolic engines revving for the day so you turn into s calorie burning machine!!! This does not however mean eat like a machine. Remember these calories you are burning you want them shifting from your stubborn fat zones and not from your daily food intake. You will burn more than 200 calories in 2x 10minute skipping sessions per day which equals 1400 calories weekly which is nearly hitting half a pound!

NATIONAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE DIVISION 1 FITZMAURICE APPEALS FOR STRONG SUPPORT FOR KERRY

KERRY O'SHEA LOOKS AHEAD TO SUNDAY'S ALLIANZ FL DIVISION 1 DECIDER BETWEEN OLD PROTAGONISTS KERRY AND DUBLIN

KERRY V DUBLIN ALLIANZ LEAGUE FOOTBALL FINAL CROKE PARK SUNDAY 3.30PM

Kerry have another chance to gain redemption for last September's All-Ireland final loss to Dublin when the counties face off in the Allianz League Division 1 Final at Croke Park this Sunday.

It will be the first time since 1987 that the sides have met in a League decider. On that occasion, Kerry lost on a 1-11 to 0-11 scoreline. Dublin, of course, are defending league champions and are going for four league titles in a row, a feat last achieved by Kerry between 1971 and 1974.

Fitzmaurice made a strong plea for the Kerry supporters to turn out in large numbers at headquarters for the important clash. He added that strong support always gives the team more confidence especially so since Dublin are on home ground.

"We've a huge following for all our games. There's a great difference in following a team and supporting a team. To support a team, you have to be prepared to travel. We have the core group of Kerry supporters that travel to all the games and we are very grateful for whatever support we get. Of course, we are hoping to have a large attendance in Croke Park on the day."

Fitzmaurice is hopeful that Sunday's league decider will be a higher-scoring game as he reflected on his side's losses to Dublin in September's All-Ireland final and the initial league outing in Croke Park in January.

"Conditions played a big part in the All-Ireland final, with that monsoon-like rain. We hit a lot of wides in the first half and should have been closer going in at half-time then again, Dublin also hit the post."

Apart from the long term injuries of Anthony Maher and James O'Donoghue, Fitzmaurice reported that his Kerry squad were eager, fit and ready for the task and was happy to let

the players back to their clubs for the opening rounds of the club championships.

Fitzmaurice was keen to allay rumours surrounding the availability of Maher this year and was hopeful that the Duagh man would have a role to play come championship time.

"Everyone is fine bar the long-term absentees. Hopefully, the lads will all come through the club championships, 'touch wood'. The Club championships are big games for the lads and the clubs, it's not an issue with us, and they have to be as professional as they can with regard to their preparation and to warming up. To be tuned into your team and your game is important.

It's not always easy for players to settle back with their clubs after spending time away on county duty so they need every opportunity they can avail of with their clubs."

Fitzmaurice refused to be drawn on Kerry's plans for the final and their tactics in coping with Stephen Cluxton's kickouts which are vital to the success of Dublin as a unit under Jim Gavin. "Stephen is back to his best form, we all know he is the best keeper in the country and what an important weapon he is to Dublin. We will have plans to cope with him, sometimes they work, sometimes they don't, then again, similarly they will be analysing our kick out strategy as kick outs play a vital part in the game."

Fitzmaurice expressed satisfaction with Kerry's scoring rate in the current league campaign (scoring 8-124 and conceding 5-91 ahead of the final) and in particular, the form of Darran O'Sullivan.

"Darran has worked hard over the last while. He was one of our best players in the All-Ireland final and he has taken his opportunities very well. You have to be very happy with the form of all the players going into the final and the good spread of scorers shows that they can all deliver for us."

The form of Colm Cooper, Aidan O'Mahony, Marc O'Se, Kieran Donaghy and Bryan Sheehan has caught the eye.

"A majority of the senior players were late in returning last year. This year has been different, since we started training in January everyone was back bar one or two. I think we have used 30 plus players during the league. There are still others who haven't played so far this year and we are anxious to give them a chance. We need to have as strong a squad as possible available to us going into the championship."

Fitzmaurice has stated that plans to add some of Kerry's u21's to the panel are on hold for the moment. "We have given them a bit of down time but we will be reviewing this at the end of the league when we will have a management meeting."

Dublin go into this joust, unbeaten in the league and championship since they lost to Kerry last year in Killarney. They will be hoping to keep their unbeaten run going, while the Kingdom will be hoping to bring Jim Gavin's side's winning sequence to a halt.

HAPPINESS IN THE WORKPLACE



For many of us a great deal of our day is spent in the work place – or thinking about work, therefore it makes sense that we would aim to make our working lives a happy and pleasant experience. However, when faced with various frustrating

challenges at work our stress levels can increase and lead to anything from burnout to boredom to distraction. Whilst some levels of stress at work are normal, excessive stress can interfere with productivity as well as our physical and emotional wellbeing. In her book Real Happiness at Work, Sharon Salzberg discusses eight pillars of happiness in the workplace. These include balance; concentration; compassion; resilience; communication and connection; integrity; meaning; and open awareness. Throughout the book she presents formal meditations along with mini meditations and practices for the reader to try out. These exercises are simple, small and practical ways in which we can achieve greater calm and satisfaction.

The following includes some of the advice she gives us to have a more peaceful and happier day at work.

1. Before starting a project, meeting or even a conversation, ask yourself: "What do I most want to see happen from this?"

2. Before starting your day, set an intention. She gives the following example: "May I treat everyone today with respect, remembering each person wants to be happy as much as I do." 3. Try to perform a simple act of kindness every day. The following are such examples: "holding a door, saying thank you in a sincere manner, or listening to someone with a clear and focused mind."

4. Pay attention to your feelings. For example, if you're feeling irritated toward a co-worker, pay attention to your irritation, "not so much the story of why you're irritated, but the actual feeling of it." What does it feel like in your body? Where do you feel it? Identifying irritation as it starts helps you prevent an action you might later regret. "With a more immediate recognition of what we're feeling, we have a choice as to how we want to respond in that moment."

5. Think about the people who make your job possible, such as a housekeeper, caretaker or fundraiser – and thank them.

These are just some simple measure we can take to generate more happiness in the workplace.

THIS SUNDAY NIGHT IS CENSUS NIGHT

On this Sunday night, 24th April every household in the country is required by law to complete a census form.

Amongst the questions that must be answered you have to account for all persons (including visitors) who spend the night of Sunday, 24th April at your address and on List 2 on page 3 of the form you have to account for all persons who usually live at your address but were temporarily absent on Sunday 24th April.

When you have completed the form, please read and sign the declaration and keep your completed form in a safe place until the enumerator calls to collect it. You are obliged by law to complete and return the form, any person who fails or refuses to provide the required information or who knowingly provides false information may be subject to a fine of up to \in 44,440.

CENTENARY TOMORROW IS LOST DOG ON AWARENESS DAY

When a dog goes missing, many families give up looking for their lost pet. Lost Dog Awareness Day was created to give hope to the families still looking for their dogs and remind the public that not all stray dogs are homeless. Please take a second look if you see a dog wandering, if the animal is uninjured and hungry, please feed it with appropriate food, and make water available and if it doesn't have visible ID then please bring the animal to your local vets, animal shelter or dog pound so they can scan them for a Microchip. Maybe he has a home waiting for him!

If you cannot keep the dog in your home please bring him to the local pound or ring your local animal shelter to see if they have room to take the dog in. If the pound or animal shelter is closed you can bring the dog to your local Garda station. The Gardai can then ring the emergency Dog Warden.

If you choose to keep the animal in your home until you find the owner:

• All found dogs MUST be reported to the local dog warden - number can be located from Directory Enquiries.

• Place an ad in the lost and found section of www.irishanimals.com, http://www. lostandfoundpets.ie and www.petsireland. invisionzone.com

• Create a poster with the animal's details, where found, your mobile contact number and a picture of the animal and give this to your local Garda stations, vets, etc. Put this poster up around the area where you found the pet. It is a good idea not to give a full description of the animal so that if someone contacts you saying the animal belongs to them you can check those extra details.

Owners of lost pets please check with your local Pound and animal shelters, get as much publicity as possible, for instance contact Club PRO's and Correspondents that write for Outlook Magazines, I am sure most if not all will include a description of your pet in their notes. Sean and Eileen Reilly presenters of "Irish Favourites" on Radio Kerry every Sunday night from 10pm until 1am always read out messages of lost / found / straying animals and I am sure many of the other programme presenters would do the same. Place notices on shop windows, notice boards etc with a photo if possible, take out a small ad, if you can afford it.

IDENTIFY AND ENCOURAGE BENEFICIAL INSECTS

Our insect allies far outnumber the insect pests in our yards and gardens. Bees, flies, and many moths help gardeners by pollinating flowers; predatory insects eat pest insects; dung beetles, flies, and others break down decaying material, which helps build good soil. Honeybees are called the "spark plugs" of agriculture because of their importance in pollinating crops, but other wild bees are also important pollinators and natural pestcontrol agents. There are approx. 20,000 species of bees worldwide, some of these are vital as pollinators of cultivated crops. Many others are crucial to wild plants. Pesticide use, loss of habitat, and pest problems such as mites have vastly reduced wild and domestic bee populations. The best way to encourage native bees is to tend a flower garden with as long a bloom season as possible and provide a shallow water source where they can drink. The best way to protect beneficial insects is to avoid using toxic sprays or dusts in the garden. Even organically acceptable sprays such as insecticidal soap and neem can kill beneficial species, so use them only when absolutely necessary to preserve a crop and then only on the plants being attacked. Be careful when you hand pick or spray pest insects, or you may end up killing beneficial insects by mistake, while many beneficials are too small to be seen with the unaided eye, it's easy to learn to identify the larger common beneficials.

NOT SPENDING MONEY ON MENTAL HEALTH COSTS THE WORLD \$1 TRILLION A YEAR

Spending on counselling or medication to treat mental health issues can be an expensive, but new research from the World Health Organisation indicates that the global community cannot afford to not treat mental illnesses. Every dollar invested in mental health treatment sees a \$4 return based on better health and ability to work, according to a WHO study published recently. Researchers calculated treatment costs and health outcomes in 36 countries of varying wealth from 2016 to 2030. Applying a meta-analysis of past studies regarding depression and anxiety's impact on workplace productivity and absenteeism, they estimated that a failure to scale up mental health programmes would lead to 12 billion days (or 50 million years globally) of lost work annually over the next 15 years.

MARGARET'S RAMBLINGS

AN ENTIRE VILLAGE ESPECIALLY BUILT AS A CARE HOME

The Dutch village of Hogeweyk looks like a normal sleepy village. With shops, restaurants, parks and even a theatre, you wouldn't suspect that this town is a progressive care home for those with dementia and Alzheimer's. The 152 elderly residents living there enjoy complete freedom and privacy and are cared for around the clock. The younger residents of the town are geriatric nurses and specialists, who work to provide the citizens with a more natural yet facilitated life. They wear everyday clothing to make the residents feel more comfortable and fulfil a range of roles around the village including cashiers, post office clerks, and grocery store attendees. To the residents, they seem like caring neighbours, or hired help.

The village was especially designed to look less institutionalized and make residents feel like they are autonomous. The village has 23 houses, each with varied lifestyles. The 7 styles they can choose from include Upper Class, Homey, Urban, Christian, Artisan, Indonesian or Cultural. There are no locks on the doors and residents are free to wander around the village by foot or bicycle. A staff of 250 is always around to ensure they are cared for and safe. There are other leisure facilities such as a café, restaurant, theatre, bar, to make the experience seem as life-like as possible. In each house, the residents have their own bedroom and share the living room, dining room and kitchen with 6 other residents. Residents manage their own households,

Residents manage their own households, with support from carers. At home, they are responsible for cooking, washing and cleaning. Residents can do their grocery shopping at the Hogeweyk supermarket. There is no currency exchanged in the village. The stress of finance is removed from residents' lives as all expenses are covered in their monthly payment.

SOFT VEGETABLES? MAKE SOUP!

Last few carrots lingering limply in the fridge? Half a turnip or squash unused from last week? Just about any vegetable can be transformed into a gorgeous warming soup. This is a great way to use leftovers for maximum nutritional value. As a basic rule, gently fry one onion and two garlic cloves before adding a few handfuls of chopped vegetables. Top up with 1-2 litres of hot stock and cook for 10-20 minutes before blending smooth. Using vegetables of similar colours will give you a more vibrant soup - combining too many colours will turn it a muddy shade of brown. Add turmeric to orange and yellow soups for a golden hue, and red lentils for an extra protein boost to keep you full. Green vegetables combine well with creamy ingredients like potato, soy cream, or cauliflower which give the soup bulk.
