LORETO TAKE COMMUNITY CHAMPIONS AWARD AT JEP SHOWCASE AT RDS

ore than 3,500 Primary School Pupils participated in Ireland's first Junior Entrepreneur Showcase with Scoil Bhride Loreto NS winning the Community Champions Award.

Run by 10 to 12 year olds, the primary school businesses that took part in the project around the country turned over more than $\leq 220,000$ with a profit of $\leq 140,000$.

Ireland's leading entrepreneurs including Bobby Kerr, John Brennan, Alison Cowzer, Brian Lee, Peaches Kemp, Niall McGarry and Paul Galvin among others were on hand to support #JEPKidsinBiz at the RDS and mingled with the children.

The JEP programme was co-founded by Jerry Kennelly who spoke at the RDS on the day.

There was huge delight when Loreto Pupils were announced as winners of the "Community Champions Award" for their "Tick Kit" Project.

"Winning a national prize is a huge achievement and this is a proud day for Loreto. Great credit is due to 5th and 6th class and their teacher Mr. Looney for all their hard work with the Junior Entrepreneur Programme", Principal, Mary O'Sullivan told the Killarney Outlook. The whole process was a wonderful experience for the children in how to develop a business – empowering young people to turn ideas into reality.

The idea originated when 6th class pupil Ali O'Donoghue was bitten by a tick and discovered what little information was available to treat tick bites. She and her class mates researched the topic and came up with the idea of the Tick Kit.

The Junior Entrepreneur is all about working as a team and this was a great team effort. Every child in 5th and 6th class was involved in making the Tick Kits and was well able to explain the product and sell it.

The Tick Kit will also ensure that everyone is more aware of what a tick is; how to remove it safely and also teach others while, as entrepreneurs, hopefully making a profit.

It will be useful on walks, runs and days out. It can be used by people and on pets and cost only €8 per Tick Kit

The Tick Kit comes in a small plastic container and it contains: • 2 tick twisters

- 2 circle plasters
- 2 anti-septic wipes
- A pair a rubber gloves

• Instructions on the inside of the lid

" From an early stage we saw huge potential in the idea as being of benefit to the community and as a future fundraiser for the school.

-The children made a presentation to the Muckross Community Association public meeting on Lyme Disease. People were very interested to note that the correct way to remove a tick safely is to use a tick twister.

We were very proud of our pupils who were well able to handle media interviews, queries and sales on their stand. There were nine awards and it was a huge achievement for Loreto to scoop the" Community Champions Award.

"We would like to thank David Rea, producer of Celtic Steps who visited the children and gave them great advice about setting up a business, our secretary Margaret, our SNA Noreen and our parents who also gave great help and support. It has been a great learning experience for the children in how to develop a business. They have shown initiative and learned skills of teamwork and co-operation", Mrs. O'Sullivan added. Looking to the future we are very grateful to parents who have come on board to market the Tick Kit. It will be for sale locally with profits going to the school.

I have no doubt it has saved lives, as it makes us all think about driving behaviours. Our young people were delighted to take part." John added, "We also play host to the Road Safety Authority on June 28th to reinforce the message to our young people that they are invaluable to us. We need to do all

we can to protect them."

Killarney Youthreach was set up in 2001 as part of the Kerry Youthreach Programme a partnership programme between the KDYS (Kerry Diocesan Youth Service) and the Kerry Education and Training Board, in order to meet the needs of young people from Killarney and South Kerry, who have left school early. This full-time educational programme is based in the KDYS Youth Centre and offers a range of QQI subjects allowing students to progress on to further education, training and employment. A small training allowance is on offer as well as a chance to avail of professional counselling.

Significant Opportunities for Rural Communities in Sustainable Energy Initiatives

There are significant environmental and economic opportunities available for rural communities through engaging in the development of project in the sustainable energy sector. This was the key message being delivered during the EU organised Sustainable Energy Week conference held recently in Brussels. The event also highlighted the movement taking place at an EU level towards empowering citizens across the region to become involved in the renewable energy sector.

Many speakers from across Europe made presentations as to how communities, both large and small, were able to derive significant benefits from undertaking projects using new sustainable energy technologies in areas such as heating and energy generation. Some showcased how islands of the coast of Scotland were able to become self-sufficient from an energy point of view through developing a number of different generating projects such as wind and hydro. Other communities showcased

that through working with local farmers, communities were able to develop heating systems to heat all of their homes and community buildings at a fraction of the cost of normal heating methods.

Attending the event as part of the INTERREG "ECCO" (Energy Community Co-Operatives) project in which they are a partner, South Kerry Development Partnership's Seán de Buitléar said that the moves being made at an EU level to enable community participation in the renewable energy market have significant potential to be exploited for the benefit of communities in South Kerry.

"There is clearly a change in understanding at both EU and indeed a national level that if targets are to be met in terms of the amounts of renewable energy being generated and the required reductions in CO2 emission levels are to be met, then communities will be front and centre in terms of delivering these goals" Seán said. We hope to enable the communities of South Kerry to be at the forefront of this initiative through the ECCO project, he added.



THE PRINCE OF WALES & THE ROME ESCAPE LINE

uring the recent visit to Killarney House & Gardens by The Prince of Wales and The Duchess of Cornwall, Prince Charles met briefly with members of the Hugh O'Flaherty Memorial Committee.

To mark the Royal Visit and the 75th Anniversary of the creation of the WW2 Rome Escape Line by Killarney native Monsignor Hugh O'Flaherty, the Memorial Society presented the Prince with a boxed first edition copy of Major Sam Derry's book "The Rome Escape Line".

As a brief background to the book's story, Memorial Society Chairman Jerry O'Grady brought Prince Charles through an album of images of the main characters from the time and from Nazi occupied Rome. These included an April 1945 copy of the London Gazette announcement by his grandfather King George VI, that Monsignor Hugh J O'Flaherty was being awarded a CBE (Commander of the British Empire), for his services to the Forces in Italy.

"The Prince was delighted to accept this special edition of Sam Derry's book and had a particular interest in the involvement of Sir D'Arcy Osborne, the then British Ambassador to the Holy See, saying that he had been a friend of his mother, Queen Elizabeth. He was also aware of the part played in this incredible story by Gestapo Chief Col. Herbert Kappler show him some images of the and quickly identified his image within the Memorial and we were delighted to

album", Jerry O'Grady told the Killarney Outlook.

"We were hoping that it might have been possible for the Prince and Duchess to pay a short visit to the nearby Hugh O'Flaherty Memorial, but Garda security considerations ruled this out. However, we did

have had the opportunity to share our story with Prince Charles and introduce him to the Monsignor's niece Pearl Dineen", he added.

Plans are being prepared to hold a special commemoration on June 4th, 2019 to mark the 75th Anniversary of the Liberation of Rome and the effective winding up of The Rome Escape Line.

Annual River Bank/Lake Shore Clean Up Proposed



At the June 2018 monthly meeting of Kerry County Council, Councillor Michael Gleeson proposed the following Notice of Motion: "In view of the ongoing outstanding success of the County Clean-Up Day, that Kerry County Council would examine the feasibility of promoting and coordinating an annual River Bank/Lake Shore Clean-Up Day". Kerry County Council replied that they will examine, in conjunction with the Local Authorities Water and Communities Office (LAWCO), the possibility of arranging and promoting such an annual event subject to available staffing and funding resources being made available. The LAWCO office is charged with assisting and facilitating implementation of the various aspects of the recently publiished Second Cycle River Basin Management plan which seeks to improve and enhance the publics recognition of the importance of our rivers, lakes and estuarine waters and to mobilise community action for the protection and enhancement of these water courses. Councillor Gleeson very much welcomed the response and hopes that the resources will be made available.





What is benefit in kind?

A benefit in kind is any non-cash benefit of monetary value that you provide for your employee.

These benefits can also be referred to as notional pay, fringe benefits or perks. The benefits have monetary value, so they must be treated as taxable income.

You must deduct Pay As You Earn (PAYE), Pay Related Social Insurance (PRSI) and Universal Social Charge (USC) from your employee's pay on the value of a benefit.

Conditions for taxing benefit in kind

If your employee's total income, including benefits, is more than €1,905 in a year they must pay tax on their benefits. Income from a previous job is not counted towards the €1,905 limit.

Your employee may have worked for a number of businesses under one parent company. If this is the case, their combined income from these jobs is measured against the €1,905 limit.

If you give a benefit to an employee's husband, wife, civil partner, family members, dependants or guest, they must pay tax on it.

A company director must pay tax on any benefit in kind, regardless of their total income.

Small benefits

You can give your employee a once-off benefit of up to ϵ 500 per year (ϵ 250 up to 21 October 2015), tax free.

EDUCATION OUTLOOK You have until 5.15pm on 1st July to avail of the CAO "Change of Mind" facility

ith the state exams concluding tomorrow, Friday, the thoughts of exhausted candidates are turning to holidays, travel or summer jobs. But there is still one important task to be undertaken. Applicants to the Central Applications Office (CAO) must now turn their attention to the "Change of Mind" facility which affords then an opportunity to register a change of course choices online by 5.15pm on Sunday, 1st July.

Not all applications to CAO avail of the change of mind facility as many applicants are happy with the course choices they submitted by 1st February. On the other hand, you might have done further course research or you might have changed your mind about your earlier choices. Whatever your reason for submitting a change of mind form, make sure you know exactly what you are applying for. Don't list any courses which you haven't researched. Don't apply for any course that you won't accept. Never apply for a course in which you have no interest just because your friends are applying for it.

If you decide to submit a change of mind form, work on your choices before going online. Don't tinker with your original list while online as it's very easy to make a mistake. Start from scratch and prepare a new list of courses. Then open your CAO account via the "My Application" facility. Click on "Add Level 8 Course Choices" and/or "Add Level 7/6 Course Choices." Then use the "New Courses" list to enter your new course choices. Every choice is important so fill up all ten choices in each category.

Check the minimum and special requirements for each course you intend putting on the change of mind form. Don't enter a restricted application course for the first time on a change

of mind form as it won't be considered. Restricted application courses are those for which assessment procedures such as audition, aptitude test or portfolio submission have already taken place. The one exception to this rule is a restricted course which shares the exact same assessment procedures as a restricted course you have applied for by 1st February. Don't list any course which has been cancelled, but you may include any new courses which were announced after the 2018 CAO Handbook was published. All of this information is easily accessible on the CAO website, www.cao.ie.

The two course categories - Level 8 (Honours Bachelor Degrees) and Level 7/6 (Ordinary Bachelor Degrees/Higher Certificates) are totally separate for the purpose of submitting a change of mind form. You may change one category and leave the second category unchanged or you may change both. On the other hand, you may decide to stick with the choices you submitted by 1st February last.

If you make changes to your course choices online, an acknowledgement will be sent to your email address. Check that your courses have been updated by using the "My Application" facility. You may change your course choices free of charge as often as you wish up to the closing date. The final change of mind form that you submit is the one that will count for your CAO offers in August, so check online by 5.15pm on 1st July to make sure that all is in order.

After the 1st July you can make no further changes to your CAO application form. So avail of the remaining nine days to give some serious thought to your course choices. With the state exams done and dusted, you can give your undivided attention to submitting a "change of

mind" form that truly contains your course interests. It will be time well spent if you achieve your course of choice when the college offers are issued in August.

Next week, in the final article of the current series, I'll comment on the accommodation crisis and the soaring cost of college.

Are you getting the best deal **ON CAR FINANCE?**

hinking of buying a new car in the coming months? Then you've no doubt heard about Personal Contract Plans or PCPs. These car finance agreements have been getting a lot of attention – and not always for the right reasons. The Competition and Consumer Protection Commission (CCPC) recently released the first public analysis of PCPs in Ireland. The report found that a third of new car purchases in Ireland are now financed by PCP agreements.

In 2016, a significant €805 million was extended to consumers in PCP finance – a considerable increase of 65% on 2015. The CCPC says however that because of the complexity of these agreements, there is a concern that consumers do not fully understand how they work. In particular, they say there is a doubt that consumers are fully aware of the balloon payments at the end of a PCP agreement. The CCPC is of the view that further protection is needed in Ireland for consumers availing of these agreements.*

Speaking about this, Helen Courtney Power, Business Development Officer of Killarney Credit Union said "For many, headline rates on PCP agreements can at first look more attractive, but these can easily distract from the range of additional charges and a good deal of inflexibility. Essentially PCPs are lease schemes. The buyer has in effect, hired the car for a particular period of time



while they make payments. At the end of the agreement, they will have to make a balloon payment in order to own the car. With a traditional car loan, the person simply borrows the money to pay for a car, which they own immediately. They can also sell the car on at any time they wish, should they need to, whereas they do not have this option with a PCP."

There is further detail in the 'small print' of a PCP agreement which consumers should be aware of. They will, for example, need to be conscious of the mileage they are clocking up, because the balloon payment at the end of the

agreement will have been calculated with their annual mileage in mind. If on the other hand a consumer takes out a car loan before purchasing a car, they are effectively going as a cash buyer to the car dealer and are in a far better position to negotiate a deal.

Helen continued "At Killarney Credit Union we offer a car loan with an APR rate of 7.8%** which is typically approved within 24 hours. There are no hidden fees or administration charges with our loan, and we are always happy to work with our members to arrange repayments in a way that best suits their individual circumstances. We would really encourage anyone thinking of buying a new or used car in the coming weeks to contact us at Killarney Credit Union before making any decisions. We are happy to see all our members, no matter how long it has been, and of course we are always happy to chat to anyone who has never been a credit union member."




Most herbs are very easy to grow. They can be grown in the garden in vegetable beds or raised beds or in containers like a window box on a window sill.

There are a lot of different types of herbs but the most commonly grown herbs for culinary use are the basil and dill which are annuals and have to be sown every year.

Parsley and Chervil, which are biennials and last for two years while herbs like fennel, mint, tarragon are perennials. If you want to grow mint make sure you plant it in a container and not in the ground as it is a very invasive herb. Even if you are not using your herbs for culinary use, it is important to pick them regularly otherwise they tend to go to seed very quickly.

SLOW DOWN, TO GET MORE DONE

Yes we need to give it our all when we work out and move as fast and as hard as we can but we also need to concentrate , think about what we are doing and make sure we are doing it right. "Slow down and get more done" is this weeks workout theme. Quality over quantity and you may actually surprise yourself at how many reps you can bang out Try this method out in your next workout and reap the rewards. You will not only get stronger but you will look and feel much better.

Advice on running gear

Forces on the feet can be one and a half times our body weight when walking and two to three times when running. It is crucial that your shoes fit correctly to prevent many foot conditions, alignment problems and possibly major injury.

The right fit

Only you can tell if your shoes fit properly. If they aren't comfortable, don't buy them! Don't plan on shoes stretching with wear, because feet spread with age. Have your feet measured every time you buy shoes. Both feet should be measured as they are often different sizes. Go shoe shopping in the late afternoon and always buy shoes for the biggest foot. Most sports shops will offer good advice regarding running shoes so don't be afraid to ask!! Size depends on shoe brand and also the many different type of type of shoe. For example there are really lightweight shoes to shoes with more cushioning to help with support. I wear Adidas and always have to buy a half size bigger as they a smaller fitting. The internet is a great place to get information too on this topic.

To ensure that you are wearing the correct pair of runners, it is important to have your gait analysed. All good sports shops offer video and gait analysis.

Replace old runners

Running shoes should be replaced every 300 to 500 miles. Wear and tear in runners may not be not always be evident at a quick glimpse but turn them over and inspect the outer sole. All wear will be visible and can be a good indicator that a trip to the sports shop is inevitable.

MARGARET'S RAMBLINGS

SIGNS YOUR CAT MAY BE HIDING AN ILLNESS

If at any time you see the following signs or your cat just isn't acting himself, consider scheduling a check-up with your vet without delay.

*An increase in vocalization is one of the first signs many owners notice when their cat is ill. A cat may walk around meowing or yowling aimlessly at objects or at the air, or may seek you out and follow you, never stopping even if his needs are taken care of.

* If your cats start suddenly hiding they may want to hide themselves from the commotion of daily activities in order to reduce stress or not alert others to a visible injury or pain. Hiding behaviour may also be linked to stress or anxiety which can be addressed by your vet.

*Cats in pain may have a hunched back as they walk, or may protect their abdomens from being petted if they are experiencing stomach pains. They may also sit or lay more frequently to minimize use of a limb that does not feel well.

*A sudden change in your cat's personality can indicate that something isn't right. Your cat may suddenly become more aggressive towards you, striking out and biting or scratching when you attempt to do things that he loved previously or he may become clingy or more affectionate than usual due to not feeling well or in an attempt to tell you something is wrong.

*Cats experiencing pain from arthritis or illness may miss or stop using the litter box. Cats with digestive or internal pain may also have changes in how often they urinate, or may change stool consistency. Be sure to also bring in a sample of urine or stool to your vet if there are accidents occurring, as they can provide clues to what is causing your cat to feel ill.

THIS MAN IS TRAVELING TO ALL 50 US STATES MOWING LAWNS FOR PEOPLE IN NEED

Rodney Smith Jr. is on a mission to mow lawns for those in need in all 50 states. His goal isn't really about lawn care - it's about letting people know he cares about them.

Every time he visits a new state, he sends out the same Tweet: "If you know of anyone who is elderly, disabled, a single mother or a veteran who needs their lawn mower let me know. It's free."

Mr. Smith is the founder of Raising Men Lawn Care Service, a lawn care nonprofit he launched in his hometown of Huntsville, Alabama. It helps young people give back to their communities. The youth in the programme visit people in need and help them with their garden work. They mow people's lawns, shovel show, rake leaves and more -- free of charge.

Then he came up with "The 50 Yard Challenge", which challenged youth across the country to mow 50 lawns for people in need. They join by posting a photo of themselves on social media with a sign that says they accept the 50 Yard Challenge, and then they get to work.



DID YOU KNOW?

Scientists have determined that the reason the 14,500-tonne Leaning Tower of Pisa, the freestanding bell tower of the cathedral of the Italian city of Pisa has managed to stay standing is the very same thing that caused it to lean in the first place. The tower is positioned between the Arno and Serchio rivers, making the ground loose and soft, being composed of silt, clay, fine sand, and shells. It's all due to an effect called dynamic soil structure interaction (DSSI), which describes how stiff buildings supported by soft soil are cushioned against earth tremors, and prevented from experiencing the kind of vibrations that can cause the worst damage.

If the researchers' calculations are correct, then the Leaning Tower of Pisa actually has the world record DSSI effect.

Construction of the tower began in 1172, and by the time the third story was built in 1178, it was already starting to tilt. Construction was put on hold for about a hundred years due to warfare and the 55:86 metre (183.3 ft) tower was completed around the mid-1300s.

TWO PILOTS SPENT THEIR COMBINED LIFE SAVINGS ON A PLANE TO RESCUE MIGRANTS AT SEA

José Benavente and Benoit Micolon are the French altruists behind the volunteer rescue group Pilotes Volontaires. The two men launched the effort after they pooled their hard-earned money to purchase a \$150,000 plane to be used for rescuing migrants at sea.

José is no stranger to humanitarian efforts – for 25 years, he's worked for the Red Cross and witnessed the challenges faced by Syrian migrants. , Benoit who first met Mr. Benavente in 2006 when they were earning their pilots' licenses, became interested in the cause after his friend described the refugee crisis firsthand.

Every year, thousands of refugees pile into boats as a means of reaching safety in Europe. Unfortunately, many of those vessels don't make it to dry land. "It is very difficult to locate these small boats, sometimes carrying hundreds of people, and often the vessels ready to help them arrive too late," said the pilots. Our mission is to provide air support, thanks to our aircraft adapted to search at sea."The duo are now able to spot lifeboats from the air and direct rescue ships towards their location.

The industrious little plane is named "Hummingbird" after a Native American story about a hummingbird that attempts to stop a forest fire by scooping up drops of water with its beak and dropping it on the flames. When the other animals ask what the hummingbird is doing, it says: "I'm doing what I can."





Know Your Rights:

QUESTION

My partner and I own our home and want to extend it this year. Would we qualify for a tax credit for the work, and if so, how do we apply?

ANSWER

The Home Renovation Incentive (HRI) scheme lets homeowners, landlords and local authority tenants claim tax relief on the cost of repairs, renovations or improvement works carried out on their main home or rental property. To qualify for the HRI, you must be paying income tax and be up to date with your Local Property Tax (LPT). The work must be carried out by a contractor who is registered for Value Added Tax (VAT) and is tax-compliant.

Any repair, renovation or improvement work subject to VAT at 13.5% qualifies for the scheme, so your proposed extension would be covered. Work that is subject to VAT at 23% (such as architect's fees) is not covered. Neither are items such as furniture, white goods or carpets.

The HRI is paid as a tax credit at 13.5% of the cost, effectively reducing the rate of VAT on qualifying work to zero. The qualifying work must cost at least €4,405 before VAT at 13.5% (€5,000 including VAT). The credit can be claimed up to a maximum of €30,000 (before VAT) of the total cost of works. The work must be carried out and paid for before 31 December 2018. However, this can be extended if you need planning permission. If this is the case, planning permission must be in place by 31 December 2018. You will then have until 31 March 2019 to complete the work.

To apply for the HRI, your contractor(s) must enter details of the work and payments on the HRI online system on revenue.ie. You should access the system to check that these details have been entered correctly. You claim the credit after the end of the tax year in which you have the work done. In general, the tax credit is applied over the two years following the year in which the work is carried out and paid for.

Well over half way through exams now it is

essential to stay calm and keep positive. It is important to put your exams into perspective and remember that whilst the results will have a bearing on your future the results are not a measure of your worth. Be sure to continue eating a well-balanced diet, do some exercise and get sufficient sleep each night. If you are finding it difficult to cope or don't feel you have the necessary support, be sure to seek professional advice.

FOR PARENTS

It's important that your child knows that you are interested in their work. Tell them that they can only try their best and even if they don't do as well as they'd hoped, you still love them just as much. Whilst we're not suggesting bribery it's fine to provide small treats by way of encouragement – and be sure to celebrate the end of exams with a treat that everyone can look forward to, such as a meal out or a trip to the cinema.

Your sympathy and support is all important at this time – so recriminations about the past and 'I told you so' speeches will not be welcomed at this time. Professor Aidan Moran advises parents to "avoid doing post-mortems with your children after the exam – it's neither helpful nor accurate" (as students don't always remember what they wrote in an exam). He also states that "parents should praise their children for doing their best and for staying in the exam until it's over."




Continue to focus on the exams ahead remind ing your teen that it's 'never too late, and a lot can be achieved in a short time'. Encourage them to continue trying and that it's worth 'having a go' and it will all be over soon. Let them know that you love them uncondi-

tionally. Let them know that this time will pass and they will get through it. Let them know that no matter how the exams go, you will be there for them. study in blocks of time which do not exceed your concentration span. For example, break up a study session into periods of about 50 minutes each." They also offer valuable advice to gain control over the exam situation as follows: "Ignore what other people do in the exam. Do not look around you in the exam-hall when the papers are handed out and do not pay any attention to students who request extra paper from the exam supervisors. Remember that it is the quality rather than quantity of the answer that attracts good marks. In any case, many "hand raisers" write on only one side of a page or perhaps skip every second line of their answer book. So, be selfish in an exam ignore everyone else."

A WORD OF VICTORY
