












FAMILY AND FRIENDS WALK TO REMEMBER CIAN

Cian O'Donoghue was swimming in the lakes three years ago when he got into difficulty and drowned on Lough Lein.

His parents Billy and Joanie, along with his brother Keith and sister Klara will be joined by family and friends of Cian's to walk in his memory.

Meeting at the Demesne Gate, tomorrow, Saturday July 23rd at 4.30 the walk will take place in the National Park. Donations will be accepted on the day for the Killarney Water Search and Recovery Team who were involved in the recovery of Cian's body after the tragedy.


DON'T FORGET SHAVE FOR AMY

There will also be an auction with some fantastic prizes on night the and tickets are €10 and will be available on the door.



CARDIAC RESPONSE UNIT HOLD DEMO TO RAISE AWARENESS

The Killarney Cardiac Response Unit held a three hour demonstration at the Killarney Outlet Centre last weekend in an effort to raise awareness about the work that they do. The met with members of the public, answered questions and showed people how to perform CPR. The Killarney Cardiac Response Unit is a voluntary Unit of approximately 40 volunteers, from all sectors of society, who respond to 999/112 emergency Cardiac Phone calls. "We are activated once a Cardiac call is made to Ambulance control and cover an area of 6km from the centre of Killarney Town. The Responders have a Pager/Radio on them which is linked in with a control phone through the National Ambulance Service", a spokesperson for the organisation told the Killarney Outlook. "We work alongside and under the control of the National Ambulance Service. We are not here to replace the Ambulance Service but to complement them by providing care and utilising those vital few minutes as every second counts, until The National Ambulance Service arrive on scene. An out of Hospital Cardiac arrest has the worst possible outcome for survival, mainly because resuscitation is often delayed or not given. It is Vital that resuscitation is started as soon as possible following a cardiac arrest".

A sequence of steps has been developed to provide the best possible chance for survival for a patient with a cardiac arrest, these are described as the links in the chain of survival,

BEAUFORT YOUTH CLUB SHOWCASE AT YOUTH AWARDS

Young people from Beaufort Youth Club were recognised for their participation at the Irish Cancer Society X-HALE Youth Awards 2016. The group's short film "Smoking Slows Us Down!" was showcased at the recent event in the Lighthouse Cinema in Smithfield. Over 300 young people came together to showcase their anti-tobacco films and projects which they have created to contribute towards establishing Ireland's first smoke-free generation.

Smoking rates among young people have plummeted to their lowest rate yet with only eight per cent of young people between the ages of 10 and 17 now smoking. The rate of smoking among young people in Ireland has seen continuous decline in recent years. X-HALE is an initiative of the Irish Cancer Society which aims to empower young people to work towards reducing smoking among their generation, by raising awareness about the dangers of smoking and encouraging their peers to be smoke free. Since its inception in 2011, the X-HALE Youth Awards has seen almost 1,200 young people attend the annual event, with over a quarter of a million views for the young people's smoking prevention short films and projects online.

Kevin O'Hagan, Cancer Prevention Manager at the Irish Cancer Society said: "I would like to congratulate Beaufort Youth Club for taking part and for making a positive impact on their health and that of their peers. We greatly

appreciate the exceptional effort in their project. We need to look at what Beaufort Youth Club and the rest of the #theXgeneration are saying. They can be Ireland's first smoke-free generation and they are telling us in their own way that the time is up for the tobacco industry in this country. They are educated on the issue of smoking and are refusing to let their health be affected by tobacco."

This is the sixth year of the X-HALE Youth Awards which began in December 2010 when the Society invited applications from youth groups from all over Ireland for funding under the scheme. Since its inception, the Society has invested approximately €130,000 in support for youth groups across the country to tackle smoking.

Many Killarney people are familiar with the Mercy Hospital in Cork having received treatment there either themselves or members of their family.

Now a Tralee woman is hoping to raise funds for the hospital.

Back 2 Back is the action-packed challenge you've been waiting for - run two miles in each of the 26 counties in just 26 hours - in aid of the Mercy Hospital Foundation. Back 2 Back is the brainchild of Tralee woman, Brenda Doody, who last year ran 12 marathons in eight months

Join Brenda on the Back 2 Back team bus on Saturday, September 24th, and travel the length and breadth of Ireland, running two miles in each county, covering 52 miles on foot around the country. The challenge, which was officially launched by athlete and Rio Olympic hopeful Michelle Finn, will begin at the Mercy Hospital early on Saturday, September 24th and the aim is to arrive back to Cork within the 26 hours. This innovative endurance challenge will raise funds for a new Fluoroscopy X-ray Unit for the Regional Centre for Gastroenterology at the Mercy University Hospital, which will assist doctors in staging and treating patients with tumours in the oesophagus, stomach, bowel, pancreas and liver. Fluoroscopy is the method that provides real-time X-ray imaging that is especially useful for guiding a variety of diagnostic and interventional procedures.

To be part of Back 2 Back, participants must raise at least €350. The first €50 covers the registration fee, and the remaining €300 and anything further raised goes towards funding the new Fluoroscopy X-ray Unit.



OFFICIAL OVERNIGHT ASSESSMENT AS KILLARNEY VIES TO RETAIN ITS PURPLE FLAG



for a better night out

The Gold Standard for Early Night Time Destinations, The Purple Flag is due for renewal in Killarney with a visit planned by judges for early August. The Killarney Purple Flag Working Group has just finalised its renewal application to the Association of Town and City Management for retention of this prestitious Purple Flag. This is a 'gold standard' for Early Night Time Entertainment destinations. Like Blue Flags for beaches, towns that meet the stringent criteria can proudly fly the flag. Purple Flag aims to raise the standard and broaden the appeal of night-time destinations from 5pm to 5am. Town centres that achieve a Purple Flag are those which are vibrant and well managed in the evening and night-time. Over 65 town and city and town centres have been awarded Purple Flags in the UK and Ireland since the scheme was launched by ATCM in October 2009. The total number in the Republic of Ireland is 14. On Friday, 5th and 6th August independent assessors will visit Killarney to review the progress the town has made since its initial accreditation in 2014. Killarney's official assessment will take place overnight on Saturday 6th August between 4.00pm and 4.00am. The Killarney Purple Flag Working Group is seeking the support of all businesses in Killarney for the evening and night of the assessment, 6th August and indeed the previous night of the 5th. Businesses are being

DUGGAN DOMINATES WALES - NICKY GRIST STAGES RALLY

A dominant display by Killarney and District Motor Club 23 year old Robert Duggan Ireland's Young Rally Driver of the Year and current DMACK Junior British Rally Championship leader, saw him take his third win of the series on a very challenging Nicky Grist Stages Rally. Undoubtedly the toughest event on the rally calendar contesting 18 special stages as a dual surface event, the rally provides a unique challenge with the stages of the opening day taking place on gravel before the cars are changed to tarmac specification for the second day. Behind Rob, his team mate Mattias Adielsson reeled in Furuseth to take second but at the end of the event it was Duggan and co-driver Ger Conway who took the spoils by over half a minute, taking their third junior win from 4 events. The result now means that Duggan has a 25 point lead in the championship with his double points joker still in hand.

Speaking after the event a very pleased Rob commented; "This was one of our best performances in the championship to date and I'm delighted with the result. We pushed very hard on the opening day on the gravel on Saturday and managed our lead on the Sunday. Vauxhall Motorsport UK gave us a fantastic car and for the team to get a 1-2 on the podium was brilliant. The stages were incredibly challenging and the stages on Epynt in particular were really difficult. It's great to see the hard work myself and Ger are putting in between events is now paying off. This win leaves us in a really good position in the championship heading to the Ulster Rally next month. The Ulster Rally this year will be another new rally for us as it has moved base and all the stages will be new to us but that's been the case on most rallies this year.

The 2016 John Mulholland Motors Ulster Rally moves to a new base in Derry City and plans to take in some classic stages to the south east of the city. The event will take place on the 19-20 of August and will have the added difficulty of stages held in darkness.

MAIREAD RECALLS AMAZING TRIP

Killarney student Mairead O'Sullivan from Lissivigeen recently returned from a trip to an orphanage in Kenya. Here she tells the Killarney Outlook about her trip.

'Sawa sawa, pole pole' was the first thing we were told on arrival at St. Paul's children's home, Nairobi, or as Simon and Garfunkel would put it 'slow down, you move too fast'. A slower pace of life was a rather positive cultural difference I encountered during my two weeks in Kenya (26th June to 10th July). There was however, plenty work to be done and I took on the task of organising the centre's library (to re-work a phrase - 'give a child a book, you teach them for a day, give them a library and you teach them for a lifetime'). I also helped other volunteers re-decorate the children's dormitories. Most importantly we spent time with the children who came from a variety of different backgrounds, some quite harrowing. There were nine Irish volunteers in total and collectively we bought the children new

blankets, sheets, toys and shoes. While St. Paul's sells some of the water from their well and produce from their small farm these orders are sporadic and they receive no government funding. Therefore our initial placement cost will help provide some of the centre's basic necessities such as food and clothing, as well as electricity.





Help free animal hostages.

The ISPCA is calling for a complete ban on the use of wild animals in circuses in Ireland but they seriously need our help. Animals are beaten, shocked and whipped endlessly to do painful, unnatural acts that they will never understand. Many of the animals were stolen from their mothers. These animals literally go insane. They try to cope with this mind blowing suffering with repetitive actions like head bobbing, pacing etc. These behaviours are only seen in captivity. Wild circus animals all roam vast areas in the wild. In the circus they are caged most of the time in cramped filthy cages or lorries where they eat, defecate and sleep all in one place. These animals all naturally have families yet in the circus they can be constantly alone. Usually no animal act lasts more than 10 minutes yet the negative affects last the animals a lifetime! Many countries have already banned circuses e.g. Greece.

Also peta are calling for a complete ban on fur farms in ireland. Minks are also living the nightmare! Being surrounded constantly by other animals is horrifically stressful for them as minks are naturally solitary. They too go insane. They are killed at 6 months of age having never, never left their cage. They are thrown into a box filled with up to 70 other dead or dying mink and gassed. Tip 7: Basketbell, Tennis, & Golf are all great outdoor activities and have a certain amount of resistance in themselves, certainly if you haven't played tennis for a while and you go out whacking a ball for an hour your will certainly feel it.

Tip 8: Turning up the gears on your Bike and adding in some challenging hills is a great way of simply adding resistance for cyclists.







FOCUS ON SUMMER GARDENING

LOOKING AFTER YOUR BEDDING PLANTS

Most composts for containers and baskets contain limited amounts of food. Within four to six weeks of planting, fast-growing, hungry bedding plants will have lost most of the goodness in the compost, especially with the Summer we are having this year.

So, you'll need to add more nutrients to improve your plants' flowering performance and encourage stronger growth. The best thing to use when feeding baskets, boxes or containers is a mixture of water and tomato food. Use this feed every three weeks and water every day. Make sure the water goes straight onto the compost and not onto the plants. If the tomato food does go onto the foliage – rinse it off with clear water.

After watering deadhead any of the plants that have gone.

Pick off old flower head as soon as they fade. Some bedding look after themselves dropping their old petals to keep displays looking clean. Just shake the basket or pot or brush over lightly to keep them tidy.

If any of your containers have a plant that is dead – take it out and replace it with something in season like a trailing ivy or whatever is looking good at your garden centre.

We have been looking at self-esteem for the past two weeks, and we spoke about the relationship between parents and children and how to build self-esteem. This article focuses on a crucial element involved in all

relationships which is trust.

All of us have some idea of the meaning of trust in an emotional sense, I trust my mother meaning I can rely on her or my friend is trustworthy, I can share personal information and he does not tell everyone. In psychological terms trust is believing that the person who is trusted will do what is expected, and this starts in the family and grows to others. Erik Erikson, a developmental psychologist, helped understand human behaviour by describing trust as the very first relationship building block that develops over the first two years of life. If this is successfully done by the primary caretakers of a child by being consistent, reliable and caring then security, trust and optimism develop in the child. If this is not done successfully it can lead to children feeling insecure and mistrustful making it difficult for the child to bond with family members and later in life with friends and intimate relationships. Barbara Miztal, in her book Trust in Modern Societies, points out three basic things that trust does in the lives of people. It makes social life predictable, it creates a sense of community, and it makes it easier for people to work together.

As a counselling centre we are witness to the breakdown of trust in relationships, sometimes from early childhood due to a number of reasons often in circumstances outside of their control, sometimes the trust was broken in later life in an adult relationship, and at times people experience a breakdown of trust with financial situations. The Centre offers a trusting space to explore these feelings and to work through the trust being broken. In order for a good working relationship to ensue trust is at the core of the counselling process. We ask that you trust us as a charity as well.

As a Charity we are appalled by the recent revelations relating to the abuse of charitable funds and lack of governance in evidence in the high profile case currently in the media. Know Your Rights: PRE-SCHOOL EDUCATION FOR CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES

My child is almost three years old and has a disability. Will he be able to access the free Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) year?

ANSWER

Yes, he will. A new programme – the Access and Inclusion Model (AIM) – was launched on 15 June 2016 for enrolments in September 2016. AIM ensures that supports are available for children with special needs so they can fully benefit from the free pre-school year in mainstream pre-schools.

AIM is a child-centred model, involving seven levels of progressive support which offer tailored, practical supports based on the needs of the child and the pre-school provider. It does not require a formal diagnosis of disability.

Levels 1-3 provide universal supports designed to promote and support an inclusive culture in pre-schools. If a preschool provider and a parent think that additional support may be needed to meet the needs of a particular child, they can apply for additional targeted supports under levels 4-7 of the model. These targeted supports include expert early childhood care and educational advice and mentoring (level 4), specialised equipment, appliances and minor alterations (level 5), therapeutic supports (level 6) or additional capitation to fund extra assistance in the ECCE pre-school room (level 7).

You access AIM supports through your pre-school service provider. If you have not identified a suitable pre-school for your child, your local City or County Childcare Committee will be able to help you. When you have identified a pre-school for your child, your service provider will consider, in consultation with you, what supports may be needed to ensure that your child can participate fully in pre-school. Applications for supports under AIM are made by the service provider via the Pobal website. Pobal are the current administrators of the ECCE programme so your service provider will be familiar with the Pobal website. The application process is now open and will remain open throughout the year.



PAY AND FILE EXTENSION DEADLINE FOR 2015 INCOME TAX RETURNS



Income tax returns for 2015 are due for filing by 31 October 2016. Taxpayers, who file their Form 11 income tax return for 2015 and make the appropriate payment for preliminary tax for 2016, and income tax balance due for 2015 through ROS, can avail of the extended deadline of 10 November 2016.

PAYE taxpayers who are required by Revenue to file a Form 12 for 2015 and who opt to use the 'e' version, the due date is also extended to 10 November 2016.

Beneficiaries who received gifts or inheritances with valuation dates in the year ended 31 August 2016 who make a CAT return and the appropriate payment through ROS, the due date is also extended to 10 November 2016.

WISHING GOOD HEALTH TO KRIS KRISTOFFERSON

Kris Kristofferson, still singing and gorgeous at 80, is a Country Music Hall of Famer who ranks among the most versatile of American talents. He's been a Golden Gloves boxer, a Rhodes scholar, a college football player, an acclaimed actor, a military officer, a helicopter pilot, a Grammy-winner, a self-described screw-up and an icon. Kris and his wife Lisa were on tour in Great Britian and Ireland when they got the good news that he had been diagnosed with the disease. To say that being told that you have Lyme Disease is good news may seem strange and insensitive, but it was for the Kristofferson's as Kris had been misdiagnosed on several occasions over the past 12 years and treated for Fibromyalgia, moderate to severe sleep apnoea, having to take so much Advil for headaches that he got anaemic and was finally misdiagnosed with Alzheimer's by two different neurologists in the final three years before the correct diagnosis was made. Now with the proper treatment, the legendary country musician, singer and songwriter born on June 22, 1936 in Brownsville, Texas who has also acted in almost 100 different movies is back on the road, doing all the things he loves, and being his blazing, irreverent self again.

ADVICE FROM 104 YEAR OLD DOCTOR - CONTINUED FROM LAST WEEK

Dr. Shigeaki Hinohara was born in 1911, and is probably the world's oldest and longestserving physician and educator. After World War II, he had the vision to establish a world class hospital and college, and today his St. Luke's International Hospital (Seiroka International Hospital) Tokyo and St. Luke's College of Nursing are the top medical organisations in Japan. The following is just some of Dr. Hinohara's advice:

 Always plan ahead, keep busy - There is no need to ever retire, but if one must, it should be a lot later than 65 - The current retirement age was set at 65 half a century ago, when the average life-expectancy in Japan was 68 years and only 125 Japanese people were over 100 years old. Now Japanese women live to be

around 86 and men 80, and 10 years ago we had 36,000 centenarians in our country Dr. Shiqeaki Hinohara said.

- Share what you know. At the age of 94 Dr. Hinohara was giving 150 lectures a year, some for 100 elementary-school children, others for 4,500 business people. He usually spoke for 60 to 90 minutes, standing, to stay strong. At 104 he was still treating patients and teaching medical students.
- When a doctor recommends you take a test or have some surgery, ask whether the doctor would suggest that his or her spouse or children go through such a procedure. Dr. Hinohara added "Contrary to popular belief, doctors can't cure everyone. So why cause unnecessary pain with surgery? I think music and animal therapy can help more than most doctors imagine"
- To stay healthy, always take the stairs and carry your own stuff.
- Pain is mysterious, and having fun is the best way to forget it. "If a child has a toothache, and you start playing a game together, he or she immediately forgets the pain. Hospitals must cater to the basic need of patients: we all want to have fun. At St. Luke's we have music and animal therapies, and art classes.
- Don't be crazy about amassing material things. Remember: you don't know when your number is up, and you can't take it with you to the next place.
- Hospitals must be designed and prepared for major disasters, and they must accept every patient who appears at their doors.

"We designed St. Luke's so we can operate anywhere: in the basement, in the corridors, in the chapel. Most people thought I was crazy to prepare for a catastrophe, but on March 20, 1995, I was unfortunately proven right when members of the Aum Shinrikyu religious cult launched a terrorist attack in the Tokyo subway. We accepted 740 victims and in two hours figured out that it was sarin gas that had hit them. Sadly we lost one person, but we saved 739 lives. (Continued next week).

HAPPY ANIMALS CLUB

9-year-old Ken from the Philippines, fulfilled a wish he's had since he was 8 - to open and run a no-kill dog shelter. Most dogs are put down because only 20 to 30% of owners claim their dogs, and because no animal welfare organisation is doing something about it, Ken's goal is to save as many dogs as he can from being killed for no reason. Upon posting photos of himself feeding stray dogs online, strangers from all over the world expressed their support and helped him achieve his dream, alongside his father who also supports his son's project.

EVERYTHING IN NATURE IS INTERCONNECTED

Much of New England is suffering from a gypsy moth infestation that has denuded trees of leaves on about 150,000 acres in Massachusetts alone. Their population exploded this spring across large areas of Massachusetts, Connecticut, and Rhode Island after drought conditions impeded the spread of a fungus that usually keeps the number of gypsy moth caterpillars under control. Removing the forest canopy can make it too hot for nesting birds, which abandon their nests, and it eliminates habitat for insects that

feed many bird species. Exposed nests are also subject to infiltration by cowbirds, which, like cuckoos, lay their eggs in the nests of other species. When cowbird hatchlings emerge, they force the other chicks from the nest.

Gypsy moth caterpillars also devour oak pollen that produces acorns, an important food source for wild turkeys, deer, bears, and other animals. Acorn shortages can eradicate large numbers of white-footed mice, which depend on the nuts to get through the winter. In springtime, the mice feed on gypsy moth caterpillars, helping to control their population. Two years of gypsy moth infestation have caused trees to weaken because of vast defoliation, the leaves can grow back the same year if the trees are healthy, but they are stressed out from not getting enough moisture and if it continues for a couple of more years there is going to be a lot of tree mortality a spokesperson for forest health programme said. The last big gypsy moth outbreak was in 1981, when 3 million acres in Massachusetts and 15 million acres in New England were affected. In 1989, a fungus from Japan was accidently introduced that proved highly lethal to the caterpillars, it can kill 50% of caterpillars and 80 to 100% in high-density areas as long as there's some rain in May and June, which hasn't happened in the past two years. Gypsy moths were introduced to Massachusetts in the 1860s by a French immigrant who wanted to crossbreed the moth with silkworms to create a species that would not be dependent on mulberry trees. The experiment failed, and the moths quickly spread, infesting much of the Northeast and Midwest. The gypsy moth caterpillar is also susceptible to a certain virus and Labs are now producing the virus to use in aerial spraying on affected areas

MAINE COON CAT BECOMES DEAF SAILOR'S EARS AND HELPS HIM NAVIGATE AT

MEXICO CITY TO PLANT 18 MILLION TREES

Many people are waking up to the reality that we cannot live healthy, sustainable lives without the help of trees and are taking action to restore formerly destroyed forests. Most recently, Mexico City announced plans to plant 18 million trees around the city bounds and surrounding suburbs. The primary goal of this reforestation is to reduce the air pollution in the region. This past spring, air quality had become so poor that authorities were forced to restrict the traffic of the usual 5.4 million vehicles in the city. Adding more trees to the environment can help "scrub" the pollution from the air - but it won't necessarily solve the pollution crisis all together. The city also plans to replace 1,000 taxis that are more than 10 years old with hybrid cars and step up a program to renew cargo and passenger transport vehicles.

RUSSIA MAY INTRODUCE LIE DETECTOR TESTS FOR **POLITICIANS**

Russian President Vladimir Putin may approve new laws that will require all politicians in Russia to undergo "anti-corruption" polygraph tests in order to weed out liars. The Russian public chamber has proposed the scheme in which all civil servants and politicians will undergo the lie detector tests in order to purge anybody connected to corrupt schemes. "We propose that these tests are taken by all candidates for positions in the civil service before they are officially employed and also by any public figures, as well as Lower House MPs" the deputy head of the Public Chamber's commission for public control and expertise said. Another important part of the plan is that the specialists who run the tests will not know in advance who they are testing, in order to prevent corruption in the polygraph system. During the police reform that took place in 2011-2012 the Russian Interior Ministry issued an order stipulating that anyone who wanted to join the police should undergo a lie detector test for illegal drug use and alcohol abuse. The tests were done with the candidates' written

consent, and submitted together with their

requests to join the police force. The results of the test were considered by the psychological selection commission that either approved or barred the candidates. To rule out technical mistakes the rejected candidates were allowed to appeal the commission's decisions.

BUDDHIST MONKS **PURCHASED HUNDREDS OF** LIVE LOBSTERS IN ORDER TO RELEASE THEM

Hundreds of lobsters avoided being boiled alive thanks to a group of Buddhist monks from Prince Edward Island, The monks, who are from the Great Enlightenment Buddhist Institute Society, bought the 534 lobsters solely with the intention of returning them to their rightful home in the ocean. Venerable Dan, a spokesman for the monks who were involved in the mission said the purpose of the effort was to demonstrate the ease in which a collective group might "cultivate compassion" on Earth for all living beings. It doesn't have to be lobsters he continued, it can be worms, flies, any animals, we can show compassion by driving slower so we don't run over little creatures on the street and by being just a little bit kinder to animals and others around us. Venerable Dan concluded his interview by saying "This whole purpose for us is to cultivate this compassion toward others and to promote the idea of respecting all creatures on Earth. After acquiring the lobsters from a local market, the monks held a ceremony with a prayer and chant to the Buddha of compassion and before the release; they blessed the lobsters with purified water and later gently removed the bands that bound their claws. Their liberation project has been positively received by most of the community and even fishermen helped the monks find better locations to release the lobsters so they won't be captured again.

SAFE CAR PARKING TIPS FOR DRIVERS

Stay safe when parking alone

Have you ever felt nervous returning to your car in an enclosed car park when no one else is around? Most drivers would probably answer yes to this question. Underground or multistorey car parks can be dimly lit with plenty of shadowy pillars and dark corners to hide behind so it's natural for drivers to feel nervous when alone in a car park. Not all car parks are sinister or dangerous places, in fact far from it, however we do advise motorists to err on the side of caution when it comes to their personal safetv.

SAFE CAR PARKING TIPS TO DRIVERS:

- Drivers should choose their car parks carefully - Opt for ones that are well lit, have plenty of traffic and are monitored by CCTV or security personnel.
- Drivers shouldn't leave anything on the back seat of the car while parked in a car park that might attract unwanted attention. Female motorists in particular, should inspect their car

for tell tales signs that their car is driven by a woman. Any giveaway items should be placed in the car boot.

- During winter time, drivers should keep a can of de-icer and a scraper in their car to minimize time spent clearing the vehicle's windows.
- Drivers should consider parking their car as close as possible to the car park lift area as there'll be more people circulating in this area of the car park.
- Drivers should also where possible, choose a well lit car parking space.
- Drivers should take note of where they park their vehicle to avoid needlessly wandering around the car park when they return.
- Drivers returning to their car should keep both hands free amalgamating everything into a shoulder bag if possible before entering the car park. Drivers juggling bags are an easier target for attackers.
- Drivers should always have their car keys to hand before entering the car park.
- Drivers who feel unsafe should ask the car park security guard to walk them to their

vehicle

- Drivers should check around and under their car followed by the vehicle's back seats before
- If feeling intimidated drivers should get into their car as quickly as possible, lock the car doors and exit the car park without delay.
- If a transit van with side sliding door parked on the driver's side of their vehicle, drivers should consider entering their car from the passenger side just in case.
- Drivers should think twice before responding to another motorist who is looking for assistance in a car park. If you have any reservations refer them to the car park security guard.
- Drivers who find you have a flat tyre or your vehicle won't start in a car park shouldn't hang around the car park.
- Drivers who find their vehicle has been broken into should immediately go to the car park security guard for help, call the Gardaí and inform the car park management. Don't hang around the car park alone waiting for them to

HAZARDS OF SUMMER DRIVING

SAFETY ADVICE FOR DRIVING DURING **GOOD WEATHER!**

The good weather does not always mean good driving conditions as the sunshine can melt the road surface making it extremely slippery. Also, rain at the end of a long dry spell can mix with dust, oil and rubber, producing a road surface like an ice rink.

DRIVING TIPS FOR SUMMER MOTORING

Servicing: A full service is necessary at least one full week before a long journey.

Last Minute Checks: Engine, oil, brake and clutch fluids, battery electrolyte, tyre pressure and the windscreen washer reservoir should be rechecked just before the journey starts.

Spare Kit: Delays caused by minor faults can be reduced by taking a small spares kit comprising of a fan belt, radiator hoses, bulbs, points, a condenser, pair of spark plugs and a roll of insulting tape.

Balance: The load should be balanced, that is,

heavy articles should be placed as near to the centre of the car as possible. Heavy articles must never be concentrated on one side of the vehicle, neither must luggage impede the drivers vision or prevent seat belts from being

Inside The Car: Loose or heavy items in the passenger compartment can move under braking or cornering - this can distract the driver or jam against the control.

Outside The Car: Roof racks must be firmly and loaded with as low a profile as possible to minimise the wind resistance and maintain stability. Also, make sure every-thing carried on the roof rack is securely tied down.

Care In The Country: Many city drivers feel free driving in the country - less restricted, however, you must remember, care and attention is still needed at all times - there may just be a herd of cows around the next corner!

Farm animals must be treated with patience.



Drivers meeting them should slow down well in advance and leave as much space as possible between the car and the herd.

Fast driving past a horse and rider can also be dangerous - it may cause the horse and rider to shy and throw its rider. They should be overtaken very slowly, with as much space as possible between it and its rider.

MUNICIPAL AREA NEWS

SURVEY OF FOOTPATHS CALLED FOR



the recent Killarney Municipal District Meeting, John Joe Culloty again requested that Kerry County Council begin a full survey of the footpaths, paving and kerbing in Killarney town. As Killarney is the top tourist town in the

country with the majority of employment being tourist related, the current standard of footpaths etc is totally unacceptable. Disability access needs serious consideration in this survey. Due to great efforts made by Kerry County Council staff and voluntary groups, Killarney continues to feature at the top of Tidy Towns and IBAL competitions.

Replacing this infrastructure would greatly assist all involved in these competitions in the future.

"I want to thank our Municipal Manager, Ms. Angela McAllen and Killarney Town Engineer, Kieran O'Halloran for accompanying me through the streets of the town recently, where the Manager observed the extent of the work which needs to be undertaken. I received an assurance from Ms. McAllen that she would give serious consideration to providing funding for this work. I also pointed out that in excess of nine million euro is paid out each year in Killarney by businesses, through rates and by the public, through parking fees. I will continue to advocate for this very necessary and comprehensive improvement works to be carried out at the earliest possible date." he said.

FARMING CONDITIONS IN 2016

Danny Healy Rae recently spoke in Dail Eireann about farming conditions, Here is what he had to say.

My question is on behalf of the farming community in Ireland. It was never worse off and I hope the new Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine is aware of that. There are many issues at present. The first is the price of milk. Never before has a community had to work for an amount below what it costs to produce a product. People are getting less than what it costs them to produce it.

Another issue is that if the blue card of an animal states that the animal moved more

than four times into four different herds, one will get €50 or €60 less for that animal in the factory. This is simply because there were more than four movements for that animal. Then there is the price of fertiliser, plastic, tyres and batteries, even though oil has never been at a lower price. We were always told that the price of oil dictated the price of these items. Why is it that the costs have gone beyond the beyond? Farmers are being driven down into the ground. They are in a desperate state. They do not have a bob or a copper, and the new Minister should know that.

CLLR. CRONIN CALLS FOR ACTION ON TOMIES WOOD

Cllr Brendan Cronin is calling on the National Parks and Wildlife Service to begin construction of the 1km new western access road to the Killarney National Park at Tomies, Beaufort as a matter of urgency. Tomies wood is very popular with walkers as it has spectacular views of the lower lake and is widely advertised in tourist information booklets but is currently not accessible which is causing confusion and disappointment to visitors to our County. In January 2015 the Elected members of Killarney Municipal District voted in favour of a Material contravention of the County Development

plan to allow this access road proceed, An Bord Pleannala rejected third party appeals and upheld the Council's decision granting permission. It is now time for the NPWS to construct this access road into our National Park so that the general public and tourist can once again enjoy the natural beauty of Tomies Wood and O ' Sullivan cascade. "I will be bringing this before the July County Council Meeting to highlight the importance of providing this western access to the National Park", he said.

CONCERNS OVER RIVER FLESK

"At the recent Municipal area meeting, Councillor Michael Gleeson asked that, as the Council has recently become the riparian owner of a portion of river bank west of the Flesk Bridge it would do everything possible to ensure that the Flesk river can flow as freely as possible from the bridge towards the Killarney lakes.

The Council replied that this stretch of river is located in a Special Area of Conservation and that discussions are ongoing with the NPWS and Inland Fisheries in regard to what In-Stream works will be allowed. Kerry County Council will carry out allowable river- bank clearing and allowable clearing works on the island during August.

Councillor Gleeson welcomed the positive response and hopes that the work when completed will ensure reduced flood levels east of the bridge."
