





BALLYHAR CAR PARK NEARS COMPLETION

CALL FOR JOBSPLUS TO EXTEND TO FARM ASSIST RECIPIENTS

KERRY Fine Gael TD, Brendan Griffin, has called for recipients of farm assist to become eligible for participation in the JobsPlus Scheme.

The JobsPlus Scheme provides a direct monthly financial incentive to employers who recruit employees from those who are long-term on the Live Register, and the incentive is worth between €7,500 and €10,000 over two years.

Deputy Griffin says that he has come across many recipients of Farm Assist in Kerry who are long-term looking for employment but are currently not able to avail of JobsPlus, which has so far supported 2,634 people returning to full-time employment from its launch in July 2013 to the end of June 2014. 60% of those people had been on the Live Register for at least two years. Deputy Griffin added that JobsPlus should also be open to fishermen and women on Fish Assist.

Minister Joan Burton has responded to Deputy Griffin's call by saying that while Farm Assist recipients are currently not eligible for JobsPlus, the workings of the scheme are being reviewed and this review will inform any proposals for its development and expansion.



KILLARNEY MOURNS THE LOSS OF PADDY MAC

Killarney town is this week mouning the loss of one of its most respected sons. Renowned author, photographer, printer and publisher Paddy MacMonagle who recently celebrated his 94th birthday, died peacefully surrounded by his loving family at his home at Countess Road, Killarney, on Wednesday morning.

Paddy's father Daniel was a master printer and photographer who founded the Killarney Printing Works and The Kingdom Newspaper in St. Anthony's Place, off College Street in 1913. Following his education at Presentation Monastery National School, St. Brendan's College and Salesian College, Pallaskenry, Limerick Paddy joined his father Daniel in Killarney Printing Works in 1938.


With his father Daniel and brother Sean, they perfected the art and soon became one of Ireland's leading printing houses with customers from all over Ireland and some international clients. They specialised in colour postcards, brochures, calendars, letterheads, invoice books, calling cards etc.. and won many accolades at the annual printing awards in Dublin. A hat-trick of awards was a particular highlight at the Irish Print Awards in 1980.

Paddy MacMonagle was the author of several books and publications including 'Paddy Mac's Collection of Vintage Postcards' in 2006, 'Louis Anthony's Killarney' and 'Paddy Mac's Shreds & Patches'. Paddy was involved in many groups and organisations in Killarney most notably he was a founder member of Killarney Chamber

of Commerce, he was the very first Chamber President from 1975 until 1980 and was an honourary life member. He was a Trustee of Muckross House since 1976 and was a former Chairman and Vice President.

Paddy was particularly well known as the doyen of Ireland's print industry and he spent four terms as President of the Irish Master Printers Association and his portrait hangs in the Printers Hall of Fame in Dublin.

An active sportsman in his earlier years Paddy was a member of Dr. Crokes where he played senior hurling and also St. Brendan's Rowing Club. In recent years he received a Killarney Regatta Club Hall of Fame award and was honoured by St. Brendan's with the launch of the 'Paddy Mac' boat. Paddy had a deep love of gardening and growing all his own vegetables with a penchant of sweet peas. He enjoyed fishing, films, fine wines and whiskies, the annual Killarney Regatta, but most of all hiking in the mountains and outback around Killarney He was passionate about the Irish language and enjoyed talking fluently 'as Gaeilge'. He was a regular traveller to London for The Chelsea Flower Show, The Annual Wine Fair, The Postcard Fair and the Killarney London Reunion. The eldest son of the late Daniel and Catherine MacMonagle, Paddy was also predeceased by his brothers Sean, Donal, Louis and Harry MacMonagle and his sister May Walsh. He is survived by his wife Lil (nee Dillon), to whom he was married to for almost 65 years,

daughters Catherine (Candy), Lile and Eileen, his sister Kathleen (Keogh), ten grandchildren, 14 great-grandchildren, extended family and many friends.

Johnny Maguire, President of the Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce speaking on behalf of the business community of Killarney has said: "we are indebted to Paddy macMonagle for his lifetime commitment to the economic development of our town. He was the founding father of Killarney Chamber of Commerce in 1975 and served as president for five years 75 – 80 and he laid the solid foundation which has created the success that the chamber currently enjoys.

The way he combined business and culture was hugely significant in creating an ethos that still exists today in the Killarney chamber.

PADDY OCALLAGHAN RIP

A NOTED SPORTSMAN AND COMMUNITY WORKER

On last Friday morning the sad news filtered through of the passing of one of Kerry's outstanding sportsmen and community activists Paddy O'Callaghan Cromane, Born in Ballyhar Firies in 1933 attended Faha National School and later Tralee Technical College. The 1940's and 50's was a period marked by huge unemployment and in his younger days Paddy worked in various occupations in Killarney and Millstreet where he played football and hurling with the local club. He later declared for Listry with whom he won an East Kerry title with the side which defeated Spa in the 1952 final in Fitzgerald Stadium On taking up employment as a trainee psychiatric nurse in St Finan's Hospital Killarney in 1954 he fully immersed himself in all the sporting activities of the hospital and was a member of the side which won the Connolly Cup in Croke Park in 1959.

However it was as a Cyclist with the all conquering Kerry cycling team of the mid 195O's that he really came to prominence. This team which included such noted cyclists as the legendary Gene Mangan, Johnny Switzer, Paddy Moriarty, Jackie O'Connor, Paudie Fitzgerald and Mick Murphy dominated the annual Ras Tailteann between 1953 and 1958. This was also the era which on occasions was

marked by high political drama which included clashes with the RUC as the team rode through Cookstown in Co Tyrone. This was also an era which was marked by much fragmentation in Irish Cycling and Athletics and after his retirement from cycling Paddy played a major part in the unification of the various grouping engaged in National Cycling and Athletics, and became President of the National Cycling Association and later International President which involved travelling to many countries in the Continent and further afield in organising the sport at international level.

On leaving his employment at St Finan's Hospital in the early 1960's he became a successful businessman in the motor business and with his partners the Mangan Brothers ran a very successful Opel Dealership in both Tralee and Killorglin for many years and on retiring from this business he commenced work as a very successful cycle dealer in Killarney and later Killorglin. In later years he made a major contribution to many voluntary and cultural organisations. He was a founder member of Killorglin Credit Union and the Mobile Education Unit, a member of the Board of Radio Kerry and was very much involved with Killorglin Mountain Rescue club. Throughout his entire life he maintained a keen interest in local and national politics and served as a Sinn Fein member of Kerry County Council

and made a huge contribution to having the late John Joe Rice elected to Dail Eireann in 1957 recording 5,5883 votes. Paddy always maintained that if John Joe Rice had decided against abstaining from sitting in the Dail after his election he would have been a permanent Deputy for South Kerry for many years.

On his marriage to Rita Sugrue Cromane he continued he continued his involved with many local organisations in that area and made many friends through such involvement which was demonstrated by the huge turnout at his funeral Mass on Sunday during which both his life long friend Frank Lewis and chief Celebrant Fr Dan O'Riordan paid due tributes to his many achievements in the world of sport and community activities. Sympathy is extended to his wife Rita and sons Ciaran, Micheal and Sean. May the sod Rest Lightly on you Paddy O'Callaghan you served your native Kerry and Ireland well.

SUPERB PERFORMANCE BY KERRY'S LEAVING CERT CANDIDATES

(By Billy Ryle)

Kerry's students are top of the class when it comes to qualifying for higher education. In fact, on a pro rata population basis, Kerry has the highest take up of college places in the country. This year's 1,976 Leaving Cert candidates from Kerry – 1,029 females and 947 males - magnificently maintained the high achievement of their predecessors. As a result of their excellent performance in the exam, the vast majority of applicants throughout the county secured one of the coveted 50,848 offers, which the CAO issued on



Monday. More than 70% of students from the county, who sat the 2014 Leaving Cert, will progress to higher education in colleges throughout the country. A further 20% will secure places at Post Leaving Cert (PLC) and further education courses.

Nationally, 2014 college applicants did extremely well in CAO Round One offers. About 78% of the 39,398 applicants, who were offered a Level 8 (Honours Bachelor Degrees) course, received one of their top three preferences. A phenomenal 90% of the 34,615 applicants, who were offered a Level 7/ Level 6 list (Ordinary Bachelor Degrees/Higher Certificate) course, received one of their top three preferences. This year CAO received 77,725 applications, an increase of 1600 on the 2013 figure. About 60,000 can expect to receive at least one offer of a college place before the end of the offers' season in October. Last year, about 46,150 applicants accepted college places and that figure is highly likely to increase this year. This is great news for 2014 applicants and proves conclusively that the CAO system works very hard to accommodate the maximum number of applicants.

Poor job prospects since 2008 have resulted in school leavers rushing to college in unprecedented numbers during the last few years. The welcome increase, also, in the number of mature and non-traditional applications is very much in line with Government Strategy, aimed at increasing the skills and qualification levels of the general population, not just traditional school leavers. Once again this year, a quota of places was reserved by CAO for the 11, 210 mature applicants and 15, 298 applicants from the PLC sector. The quota system is a very healthy development as everybody deserves a second chance. So, there were plenty college places on offer on Monday for all categories of applicants.

CAO always issues more offers than there are places available in anticipation of a level of refusal by applicants. Offers are issued independently in respect of the two lists (Level 8 and Level 7/6), so that about 23,000 applicants received an offer from each list. Log on to the CAO website, www.cao.ie to view your offer/s. Enter your CAO Application Number, your date of birth and your Account Password, if you provided one with your initial application. If you didn't, simply leave that entry blank. You may accept a first round offer online until 5.15pm next Monday. An offer automatically lapse unless you accept it on time.

Applicants sometimes find the CAO course offers system mind boggling. However, it's important to understand how it works. The following key points are well worth your attention.

- 1) You were offered the highest course preference/s to which you are entitled on the basis of your points.
- 2) When you were offered a course preference, you were excluded from any course preference lower than the one, which you were offered.
- 3) In the second or subsequent rounds of offers, you won't be considered for a preference lower than that already offered.
- 4) If you were offered a preference, which is not your first preference, you may subsequently be offered a higher preference if such a place becomes available.
- 5) It's not necessary to accept an offer in order to be considered for a higher preference if it becomes available. As there is no guarantee, of course, that a higher preference will become available, it's in your best interests to accept your first round offer and hope for the best in the second round. As the saying goes, "a bird in the hand is worth two in the bush!" 6) Finally, it's worth remembering that when you have accepted an offer you are not obliged to accept any subsequent offer.

In the next article, I'll explain why Post Leaving Cert (PLC) courses give you a firm footing on the ladder to skills and qualifications. I'll also have a few words of practical advice for "Freshmen."

JARDENING DUTLOOK

FOCUS ON PLANTING BULBS.

Most bulbs are suitable for growing in containers especially the likes of tulips, daffodils, lilies and aliumns. When planting up a container or window box with bulbs plant them at about three times their depth and about one bulb width apart and don't forget to water them especially when the foliage is on and they are growing.


When planting bulbs in the garden dig over the area well where you are planting and add some compost. Always plant your bulbs in groups of about six depending on the type of bulbs.


If you would like to add some colour to some areas of the garden for Spring and into summer, it would be advisable to grow your bulbs now in small pots and grow them on until early spring. You can then plant them in their pots in the areas you want and after flowering you can dig them up and keep them until next spring.

A good dwarf daffodil for this is Tete-a-tete.

THANK YOU TO ROBIN WILLIAMS!



RUSSIA BANS FRUIT, VEG, MEAT, FISH AND DAIRY IMPORTS FROM EU AND US

There was devastating news for Irish farmers last weekend with the announcement that Russia is to ban fruit, vegetable, meat, fish, milk and dairy imports from the EU, US, Australia, Canada and Norway. Russian Prime Minister Dmitry Medvedev said the ban will last for one year. The move is in response to the latest round of penalties imposed by the US and the EU on Russia over its actions in Ukraine. Ireland's agricultural exports to Russia in 2013 were worth €235m. Last year Ireland exported €4.5m worth of cheese to Russia. IFA President Eddie Downey

said the impact of a ban on Irish food exports into Russia is another example of external shocks that can lead to uncertainty and volatility on Irish farms. As an export-led sector, any threat to a market for Irish food is a concern. "Price volatility, extreme weather events and political instability are all elements that have an influence on commodity prices. With increased exposure of the agricultural sector to world markets, the impact of these factors is greater, with negative consequences for the viability of family farms." At European level, the IFA President said this latest

development underlines the importance of the Common Agricultural Policy in providing a secure supply of food for Europe's 500 million consumers. "This has to be the focus of future reviews of

SAFE HANDLING OF CATTLE ON FARMS

The Teagasc National Farm Surveys have indicated that farmer injuries associated with livestock herding and handling have increased and now account for 65% of all on-farm injuries. The trend of increased injuries when herding or handling cattle is attributable to the facilities used, less contact with animals arousing fear and inadequate attention being given to breeding for docility.

Teagasc, in association with the Health and Safety Authority and ICBF, are working to reduce the level of injury associated with livestock, while at the same time improving

animal welfare.

Teagasc participated in a European Union Leonardo da Vinci livestock safety project where safety and related welfare issues of cattle handling were examined. Understanding the concepts of 'flight zone' and 'point of balance' will help cattle handlers to be able to move animals more easily. The point of balance is at or near the animal's' shoulder and it is determined by the animal's wide-angle vision. Animals will move forward if the handler stands behind the point of balance. They will stop if the handler stands in front of the point of balance.



ICMSA SAY FARM TAXATION **REVIEW MUST PLAN** FOR PRICE AND INCOME **VOLATILITY**

Speaking following a meeting with the Dail Committee on Agriculture, Food & Marine, Lorcan McCabe, Chairperson of ICMSA's Farm Business Committee, said that he welcomes the cross-party support for a number of the proposals put forward by ICMSA and said that this across-the-board support must now turn into real action through implementation of these proposals by Government.

"ICMSA's Submission focussed on two key areas: farm income volatility and land mobility. In relation to farm income volatility, we made two specific proposals. Firstly, a farm deposit scheme where farmers can pay tax efficiently by saving surplus income generated in a good year that can be subsequently drawn down in a poor income year. ICMSA believes that such a scheme, with appropriate controls, can play a major role in assisting farm families through period's farm income. Price volatility is now a fact of life for farmers with the milk price

a prime example, where milk price has varied from 20 cents per litre to 40 cents per litre since 2009," said Lorcan McCabe. "If farm families are to survive this volatility, the taxation system needs to provide innovative ways that will allow farmers to tax efficiently save funds for the leans In relation to the income averaging relief, we think, that farmers who work part-time should not be excluded from this relief going forward. On land mobility, ICMSA put forward proposals in relation to Capital Gains Tax, Capital Acquisitions Tax and Stamp Duty to encourage the early transfer of farmland and in addition, the extension of the land leasing incentive to family leases. While Government may say, and may genuinely believe, that agriculture is full of opportunities, but if those opportunities are to be seized then the Farm Taxation Review must deliver a taxation regime that will allow farm families to go forward and survive through the periods

ahead when all the indicators are that farm income will continue to be under pressure and subject to fluctuations."







PROMOTING RECYCLING AND FEEDING STRAY ANIMALS

Istanbul, Turkey recently unveiled awesome new machines that help both the environment and needy animals. Each time a person recycles a plastic bottle in the designated receptacle, pet food is ejected into a bowl at the bottom so hungry stray animals have something to eat. So far, the machines have been a hit with residents. Many people who would normally throw bottles in a rubbish bin now dispose of it in the recycling bin to assist animals.

In addition to increasing the local recycling rate, the machine ensures that the unfinished water in bottles doesn't go to waste either. Before depositing the bottle, users can dump the remainder of their water into a slot, which funnels it into a dish from which animals can drink.

Turkish officials readily agreed to allow Pugedon to set up the machines once the company pledged it wouldn't cost the government anything. Instead, the company uses the money collected from the recycled materials to purchase more pet food.

In general, the machine raises awareness of the ongoing homeless animal epidemic in Istanbul. An estimated 150,000 stray cats and dogs live in the city. Part of the goal is that when people are reminded of the problem and can do a little something to help out, hopefully they will then feel inspired to do a little more, too, and adopt some of the animals in need.

While feeding the animals is an act of kindness, it's not a permanent solution for these formerly domesticated animals, many of whom were abandoned by their previous owners on the streets.

Even if the machines don't solve the problem altogether, it does give starving animals something to eat. It's certainly better than how some other countries have handled their growing stray animal populations. Both Brazil and Russia have faced major controversy for their inhumane ways of handling street dogs in conjunction with the World Cup and Olympics, respectively.

RECYCLING 6 WAYS TO COMFORT A STRAY DYING CAT

Responsible pet owners must realise that illness and even death is just as inevitable for our feline friends as it is for the human ones. To make our furry loved ones as comfortable as possible, it's necessary to know the signs of death, and how to deal with them in a way that's compassionate and medically-sound.

If you've got a young cat, rest assured that you probably won't need to implement any of these ideas for a long while. The notion that 1 cat year is equivalent to 7 human years is a myth. Now that more cats are "indoor only," it's not uncommon for some cats to live to be 18 or 19 years old. Still, this means it's likely your cat will become elderly and pass on long before you do. If you can't bring yourself to euthanize your cat when the time comes (and there are medical reasons why you might), keep these tips in mind.

- 1. Pay attention to the signs. Cats can't tell us when something hurts or when they're feeling sick. So it's up to us to pay attention to the clues in their behaviour. Loss of appetite and rapid weight loss, lethargy and abnormal lack of interaction, obvious signs of discomfort or crying when touched, urinary and/or faecal incontinence, and breathing difficulties are all signals that something is wrong. A trip to the vet is in order.
- 2. Consider pain medication. If the ailment isn't something that can be treated, our job is to make the cat as comfortable as possible. In many cases, this means administering pain medication. Sometimes, this can provide relief and extend the cat's life. However, if you can't afford meds or they don't seem to work, euthanasia must be considered. After all the love your cat has given, why prolong her suffering to ease your own?
- 3. Emphasize hydration. Since it's likely that a dying cat will be reluctant to go get food and water, make sure to bring it to him instead. Add water to your cat's food (both wet and dry) to make it easier to eat. Also use a medicine dropper to keep your cat hydrated if he's no longer making it to the water bowl.
- 4. Be quiet. When we're not feeling well loud noise and chaos just makes everything worse,

and the same is true for your cat. Make it a point to keep household noise to a minimum, or reposition the cat bed in a quiet corner of the house so that other animals can't bother her.

5. Give warmth. "Very unwell cats, especially senior cats are often not as good at maintaining body temperature. Make sure your cat has a warm and comfortable place to rest. It should be easy to clean as very sick animals often have elimination problems.

6. Say Goodbye. Cats love it when their human friends talk to them and say their name. Especially if your cat is an old friend, now is the time to speak to her in low, reassuring tones. Speak to her in a calm manner, say her name, and remind her of your love.

DID YOU KNOW...

*A cama is a hybrid of two animals from different worlds — camels from Asia, and llamas from South America. The two species exhibit many differences, but camels and llamas are both camelids descended from a common ancestor that evolved in North America during the Palaeogene period. Camas were produced via artificial insemination to create an animal with the size and strength of the camel, but the more cooperative temperament of the llama. The unlikely fertilisation was a success, but the result wasn't quite what breeders had hoped. Camas exhibit a camel-like temperament, but they are attracted to female llamas.

*Beefalo are the fertile offspring of domestic cattle and American bison. Crosses also exist between domestic cattle and European bison (zubrons), and yaks (yakows). The name given

to beefalo might be the most suggestive, since the breed was purposely created to combine the best characteristics of both animals with an eye towards beef production. A USDA study showed beefalo meat, like bison meat, tended to be lower in fat and cholesterol. They are also thought to produce less damage to rangeland than cattle.

*A cross between a sheep and a goat is rare because goats and sheep each belong to a different genus. Though matings between the two are known to occur, the offspring most often is stillborn. Even so, live births have occurred, the most famous of which happened in Botswana in 2000. Called the Toast of Botswana, the animal was infertile.

*Narwhals and beluga whales are the only two living species of the Monodontidae family, though narwhals are distinct in that they have a long, straight, spiraled tusk extending from their upper left jaw. Though extremely unusual, at least one hybrid between the two species has been documented from west Greenland.

*Perhaps the most widespread and useful of hybrids are mules (from a male donkey and a female horse) and hinnies (from a male horse and a female donkey). Reputed for their hard work and strength despite their medium size, mules are dependable and often exhibit higher intelligence then their purebred parents. All male mules and most female mules are infertile, so their continued existence depends entirely on human intervention.

6 WAYS TO USE EXPIRED **SPICES**

Before you throw that jar of spice that's been sitting in your cabinet for longer than you can remember, consider these tips. Spices that aren't worth eating may still have some use around your house and garden.

The good news is that spices don't spoil in such a way that will make you sick, but they can lose their flavour, the best way to know if the spices on your shelf are still good is by colour and smell. If either has faded, it may not be worth cooking.

- 1. Brewed potpourri Even if a spice doesn't smell as strong as it once did, heat can release the last of its volatile oils, giving off a lovely aroma. Boil a pot of water on your stove and add whichever spices you want your house to smell like—cinnamon, cloves or ginger. You can also throw in some citrus peels.
- 2. Spicy soap The granular texture of ground cloves and pepper can act as a gentle exfoliator in your next batch of homemade soap.
- 3. Deter animals Spicy peppers like cayenne or chili are good for keeping creatures away from bulbs, just sprinkle the spice on the bulb itself or the topsoil around it. Black pepper can also be used to fight ants, which are repelled by the smell. Keep in mind that older spices may be less potent, and you may want to pepper plants lavishlv.
- 4. Nontoxic fungicide Cinnamon is an organic

way to fight fungus, particularly on seedlings and houseplants. It's easy to apply as spray, just mix the cinnamon with warm water.

- 5. Sachets Many spices have deodorizing effects. Sage, thyme, oregano and clove are particularly powerful. You can put this power to work in any musty parts of your home by making spicy sachets.
- 6. Homemade ornaments Another goodsmelling option is to make some biscuit-like ornaments, which use cloves, cinnamon and

In San Jose, California, the homeless are being hired to clean the city streets in exchange for food, housing and job placement.

This programme comes from a novel partnership between Groundwerx, a group that provides cleaning services to downtown San Jose, and the Downtown Streets Team, a nonprofit that works to combat homelessness in Silicon Valley.

Everyone wins with this approach since it helps reduce the city's litter while providing much-needed assistance to people who are down on their luck. Although the programme only launched earlier this month, it's already seen its share of success stories. Participants such as one 53 year old man who helped clean San Jose's downtown, was finally able to find housing after being on the streets for four

Not only that, but participants are also learning all-important job skills, too a former high school peer counsellor says that thanks to the regularity of his job as a trash collector and working with others who also want to get back on track, he was able to find his footing and secure employment.

It's initiatives like these that prove those without homes need a second chance.

MELTING ICE MEN

Crowds flocked to Birmingham to see a moving artistic commemoration to the millions who lost their lives in the First World War.

5,000 frozen statues were left to simply melt away in the summer sunshine ahead of the anniversary of Britain's entry into the war.

Minimum Monument by internationally acclaimed Brazilian artist Néle Azevedo was organised by Birmingham Hippodrome and each ice sculpture was in memory of life's lost who do not have a monument.

SAVED FROM EXTINCTION

Wood bison are some of the largest mammals in North America and while they were once prevalent throughout parts of Alaska, they are now listed as a threatened species under the Endangered Species Act (ESA) and have not freely inhabited the Alaskan wild for many years. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) are working to re-establish a population of

wood bison in Alaska so the species may once again thrive in the Alaskan wilderness.

Once listed as endangered under the ESA due to their extremely low population numbers, wood bison have rebounded in Canada in recent years. Thanks in large part to conservation efforts from government agencies as well as concerned activists, the wood bison population has grown to the point where the FWS deemed the species could now be listed as threatened. Alaska currently has a captive herd of over 100 of these wood bison. According to the FWS, the Alaska Department of Fish and Game will carry out and maintain responsibility for the actual reintroduction of the wood bison into their historical habitats in central Alaska.

TEMPERATE CLIMATE

With an average annual high temperature of 17 °C and yearly average nighttime low of 13°C, and with only slight variation in temperature throughout all of the months of a given year, Viña del Mar, on the central coast of Chile, ranks as the best weather place in the world for humans. Flushed by the cold Humboldt current of the Pacific Ocean, Viña del Mar sees an average daily high temperature of just 75.2°F during its warmest month of January, with an average nighttime low of 59°F in that month. The coldest month at Viña del Mar, July, experiences a mean daily high of 59°F and an average nighttime low of 50°F. Each year, Viña del Mar receives just under 19 inches of rain, with most falling in the winter months of June and July. Globally renowned for its white sand beaches (and absolutely beautiful weather), and free from the threat of ferocious cyclonic storms and tornadoes, Viña del Mar is not quite an Anthro-Weathertopia, however, as fog can occasionally envelop the region.

FINALLY THIS WEEK

More than 64 million women and girls leave their homes every day to find jobs as domestic workers in cities around the world. But when they show up for their first day of work, some find out they've been deceived. Locked in the homes of strangers, their passports taken away, often beaten and sexually abused, they are caught in a nightmare of modern slavery.

For the first time ever, there's a global standard to protect domestic workers—the Domestic Workers Convention. It has already been signed by 15 key countries, and momentum is growing for an international surge of support I am proud to say that on the 9th July 2014 the Minister for Jobs, Enterprise and Innovation, Mr. Richard Bruton, TD, announced the Government's decision to ratify the International Labour Organisation (ILO) Convention on Decent Work for Domestic Workers (No. 189), 2011.

This decision puts Ireland among the small group of ILO member countries who have ratified this Convention and Ireland was only the third EU country to ratify.
