Kerry Mountain Rescue Team bring seven to safety

Ferry Mountain Rescue Team rescued seven walkers on the Macgillcuddy Reeks in two separate incidents last Saturday night. In the first incident, the Team were called to the assistance of six walkers at 6.00pm. The walkers, 3 men and three ladies had been climbing 11.00am, ascended since Carrantuohill and got into difficulty while descending the mountain. The Team reached the group at 8.00pm. and provided them with warm and dry clothing, food and drinks. Weather conditions on the mountain were dark and cold with wind and snow at the top of the descent routes. Protecting the group with ropes, the Team walked them off the mountain via the Devils Ladder route. While descending the Devils Ladder with the initial group, the Team discovered a 38 year old female climber in difficulty with a bad head injury. She was was brought down the mountain by the Team and driven by KMRT LandRover to an awaiting ambulance for further treatment. Twenty two members of the Team were involved in the callout. The Team returned to base at 12.00am.

In a seperate incident, the team were called to Mangerton Mountain on Monday afternoon after a hillwalker in his 60's died of a suspected heart attack.

Date set for annual Strickeen Climb


alkers in their droves are set to take part in this year's annual charity climb of Strickeen Mountain on Saturday March 3rd.












Project Ireland 2040 will deliver real investment and proper planning for Kerry



Speaking about Project 2040 which was launched by Government last Friday, Minister Griffin said:

"In the first version of Fine Gael's Republic of Opportunity document, we said it is time to plan for what Ireland is going to look like in 2040.

- · Project Ireland 2040 seeks to enhance regional connectivity competitiveness, environmental sustainability and build a fairer, more equal Ireland where everyone has the opportunity to live in a strong community and reach their full potential.
- · Kerry will play a key role in implementing Project Ireland 2040, building on its strong performance as a self-sustaining county with both an internationally renowned tourism and business eco-system and a

very strong network of towns and associated rural surrounds, to be strengthened through enhanced connectivity and infrastructure.

Selected highlights for Kerry include:

Tralee Northern Relief Road

• Investment for the Tralee Northern Relief Road scheme will provide a new link to join the completed N22/N69 Tralee bypass to the Bracker O'Regan Road - completing the Relief Road project. The project is at appraisal stage with an expected completion date of end-2021.

N69 Listowel Bypass and Dingle Relief Road

• Investment in roads in Kerry also includes the N69 Listowel Bypass, which will combat congestion through Listowel town and crossing the River Feale. This is currently at contract stage and will also improve access to Shannon Foynes Port. Additionally, the Dingle Relief Road project is ready to commence construction and is likely to be completed by the end 2019. This work will complete the 4th phase of a ring road around Dingle to relieve congestion

N22 - Ballyvourney/Macroom

· Investment in the roads network in Cork also includes the N22 Ballyvourney Macroom Project, which will also be hugely beneficial for Kerry.

The Following Section of the national road network will be progressed through pre-appraisal and early planning in 2018 to prioritise projects which are proceeding to construction in the National Development Plan

- · N21 Newcastle West Bypass
- · N21 AbbeyfealE

Regional Airports Programme

• The Government will continue to support the Regional Airports Programme, which involves financial support to the smaller regional airports including Kerry.







Higher Education

• Eleven major infrastructure projects will be delivered around the country as part of a Public-Private Partnership Programme for the Higher Education sector, including Institute of Technology Tralee in Kerry.

Kerry Central Regional Water Supply Scheme

• The Kerry Central Regional Water Supply Scheme involves a €33m investment to build a new water treatment plant for Central Kerry which, when complete, will provide treated water to communities including Tralee, Killarney, Castleisland and Castlemaine. The completion of this scheme will see approximately 62,000 customers removed from the Environmental Protection Agency's Remedial Action List.

Investment in National Heritage

• Project Ireland 2040 will see a €285 million investment in our national heritage. This includes Killarney National Park (investment in outdoor recreational facilities), Skellig Michael and Valentia Cable Station.

Flood Risk Management

- Tralee has been identified for investment in a large flood relief scheme as part of the National Development Plan.
- Fisheries Harbour Centres (FHC) Dingle
- Capital investment programme across all six FHCs encompassing ongoing safety and maintenance and necessary new developments the FHCs. This is required to provide suitable, safe, efficient and hygienic facilities to further develop a modern offshore Irish fishing fleet and increase landings into our Fishery Harbour Centres.



Social Housing

• Of the 2,000 additional social housing units in current delivery, specific examples include projects at Rathmore/Barraduff 20 dwellings, The Park, Killarney 20 dwellings; Ardbhearna, Kenmare 22 homes.

Rural Regeneration and Development

• Investment projects in towns and villages with populations of less than 10,000 in Kerry will be in a position to benefit from a new Rural Regeneration and Development Fund which will invest €1bn in promoting rural renewal in Ireland, to help towns, villages and rural areas to grow in a sustainable way.

Gaeltacht Investment

• Project Ireland supports Gaeltacht areas across the country, for example by prioritising investment in the development of tourism facilities in the development of Sli Chorca Dhuibhne walking route in Co Kerry. Increased investment to enable the creation of 1,000 jobs every year in Gaeltacht areas across the country including Kerry.

Court Services

• Provision of further new or refurbished courthouses in provincial cities and county towns will be progressed, including at Tralee.

Tourism - Investment in Fáilte Ireland

• Almost €108 million has been allocated to Fáilte Ireland for capital investment in Tourism Product Development over the next four years and it is intended that this level of funding will, at a minimum, be maintained over the lifetime of the National Development Plan. Fáilte Ireland will continue to invest in the priority areas that will deliver sustainable growth in the Irish tourism sector resulting in higher revenue and more jobs.

Atlantic Corridor

- A particular priority in this is substantially delivering the Atlantic Corridor, with a high quality road network linking Cork, Limerick, Galway and Sligo.
- Important elements of Strategic Investment Priorities set out in other sections of this National Development Plan will also have a central role to play in achieving Strengthened Rural Economies and Communities. For example investments in ... further upgrading of the national roads network including improving accessibility and connectivity on the emerging Atlantic Economic Corridor that links major centres on the western seaboard.

IDA

• IDA property solutions, strategic sites and grants in all regions will deliver new Foreign Direct Investment and high-quality jobs. Since it is more challenging to win new investment outside metropolitan areas, advanced planning and provision of property solutions will be expanded in all regions. Ireland's ability to secure significant new large-scale capital investment in all regions is partly dependent on the ready availability of serviced sites of scale with appropriate zoning and capacity for required utilities to match the needs of large capital intensive projects.

Senior cycle subject choice is the first step on the road to college



Students study one of three Leaving Cert programmes at senior cycle. The majority prefer the traditional Leaving Cert (LC). The Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme (LCVP) is similar to the traditional Leaving Cert, except that students also take three Link Modules (Enterprise Education, Preparation for Work and Work Experience). The Leaving Certificate Applied (LCA) is strongly vocational, meaning that its job and employment focused. The subject areas are more practical than academic.

Subject selection for Leaving Cert is very important because the subjects you choose will influence your further study and career. Give this process serious consideration and decide what senior cycle subjects suit you best. Leaving Cert students usually take seven subjects. Mathematics, Irish and English are compulsory. It's advisable to study a modern language, which many third level courses have as an entry requirement.

Your task is to select three optional

subjects – four if not taking a third language. Make sure that your subjects fulfil the entry requirements for your courses of interest. Many colleges also impose additional subject requirements which are course specific. It's also worth knowing that a number of third level courses use criteria of selection, such as art portfolio, interview, audition and suitability test, in addition to Leaving Cert exam points.

Six subjects are used from any one sitting of the Leaving Cert exam to calculate total points' score. The potential maximum points' score in the Leaving Cert points' scale is 600 or 625 if Higher Level Maths is one of the six subjects counted as 25 bonus points are awarded for Higher Level Maths for H6 or above.

Students studying the LCVP may include the points awarded for the Link Modules as one of the six subjects used for calculating points - 66 points for a Distinction (80% to 100%), 46 points for a Merit (65% to < 80%) and 28 points for a Pass (50% to < 65%).

Keep the following criteria of subject selection in mind when making your choice. Firstly, if you have a flair for - a special ability in, an aptitude for - a particular subject, you will get tremendous personal satisfaction from studying that subject.

Secondly, note the subjects in which you are achieving good grades. The Leaving Cert exam is a test of achievement. Grades and points determine entry to higher education. There is little benefit to you in taking a subject which

you find difficult and are unlikely to do well in. Points' potential at higher (H) level is far greater than at ordinary (O) level. For example, H3 is worth 77 points while O3 is worth only 37 points. Study as many of your subjects at higher level as you can cope with.

Thirdly, select subjects you are interested in because you will work harder at those. Of all the variables that determine success at school, at college and in your career, interest is the most critical. It's likely that the subjects that interest you at school will influence your college course choices in two years' time.

Fourthly, be aware of subjects that are required for any particular career interests you may have. Each college has a system of general and specific entry requirements which you must satisfy before you are considered for a place in a particular course. For example, the minimum general entry requirements for UCC are 2H5 and 4H7/O6. A pass in a laboratory science subject in the Leaving Cert exam is a specific entry requirement for a degree course in Nursing.

The task facing you, therefore, is to select a subject grouping that will satisfy the four criteria of Flair (aptitude), Achievement, Interest and Required. It may help you to remember that you need to make a FAIR choice of subjects. Study the information carefully, give careful consideration to your subject choice, think about your course options and the related careers. TAX MATTERS

EMPLOYER END OF YEAR RETURN (P35)

You must make an end of year return for every person employed at any time during the year. End of year returns must be submitted even if no tax or Universal Social Charge (USC) was deducted from an employee.

If you are registered for Revenue Online Service (ROS) you can file your P35 return electronically.

Form P35 - This is your annual declaration and certificate for Pay As You Earn (PAYE), Pay Related Social Insurance (PRSI), Universal Social Charge (USC) and Local Property Tax (LPT) for each employee.

Form P35L - This is the form on which you record PAYE, PRSI, USC and LPT details for each employee.

P35L/T - This is the form on which you record PAYE, PRSI and USC details for any employee who does not have a Personal Public Service Number (PPSN).

Form P35LF - This is the form you use to record taxable benefits.

The deadline for filing your P35 return is 23 February if you file online using ROS.

A P60 template is available on the ROS online and offline application, and through Payroll Software providers. You should not give a P60 to an employee who was not in employment on 31 December.

If an employee was in employment and ceased that employment on 31 December you should give them a form P45 and a form P60.





HILLWALKERS WARNED NOT TO WEAR GARMENTS WITH MAGNETIC CLOSURES

Mountain safety experts have warned against a worrying trend in the outdoor clothing market. Magnetic closures on gloves and jackets, rock climbing helmet closure straps etc are being marketed as the modern alternative to Velcro or poppers but magnets are well-known for deflecting compass needles.

In a recent incident in the mountains east of Glen Shee in Scotland a group of walkers were caught in low cloud and headed east instead of west, becoming totally disorientated and ending miles away from a road when their compass had been stored in a pocket next to a mobile phone in a case which had a magnetic closure on it, and the magnet had reversed the polarity of the compass needle, so that the north arrow pointed south.

Popular outdoor brands are producing mitts/ gloves with fold-back flaps using magnetic closures and there is a wide choice of outdoor jackets out there replacing Velcro with magnets hidden away in folds of the garment and in pockets, hoods, front fastenings, wrist closures etc. People are also advised to keep their compasses well away from all mobile phones regardless of whether they have magnetic closures or not.

AUSTRIA IS A SMOKERS PARADISE

As we know most Western countries have banned smoking in bars and restaurants, but Austria is bucking that trend.

Under a law passed in 2015, Austria was due to bring in a total ban this May, but now its new government of the Conservatives and the farright Freedom Party have scrapped the plans.

The move was spearheaded by the leader of the Freedom Party, Austria's Vice Chancellor Heinz-Christian Strache, himself a smoker, who told parliament last month that it was about freedom of choice.

He said restaurants should be free to decide if they want to have smoking sections, where "a citizen has the possibility to decide perhaps to enjoy a cigarette or a pipe or a cigar with their coffee".

THE TOWN OF MONOWI, NEBRASKA

Five miles from the South Dakota border in the remote northern reaches of the US state of Nebraska is the town of Monowi which as the green road sign that stands at the town limits, proudly displays has a population of 1.

When Elsie Eiler's husband Rudy died in 2004, she became Monowi's last and only resident, she is also the Mayor of her town, which entails granting her own liquor license to run the Monowi Tavern, paying taxes to herself and producing a municipal road plan every year in order to secure state funding for the town's four street lights.

Founded in 1902 when the Fremont, Elkhorn and Missouri Valley Railroad was extended

to the area, the farming town which is said to be named after a Native American word for "flower" developed into a thriving community despite reaching its peak in the 1930s, when it had only a population of 150, but like many other small communities in the Great Plains, the Monowi area couldn't hold on to its younger residents including Elsie and Rudie's children, who moved to growing cities in search of better jobs.

Elsie is also the town's librarian and there's a small collection of Monowi's history amongst the impressive 5,000 books available for loan in the building named after her late husband.

THE WORLD'S TALLEST CHURCH BUILDING IS DISSOLVING

Ulm Minster, a Lutheran church a 14th-century church finished in 1890, holds the record for the world's tallest church tower at 161.53 metres (530 feet), the fourth largest structure in the world built before the 20th century and the 12th largest church by area. And even though Ulm, which lies on the River Danube in Baden-Württemberg, Germany was heavily bombed during World War II, the church was miraculously left untouched.

But now in its 639th year, the Gothic structure with a steeple that reaches 530 feet into the air above the city for which it is named could be laid low by too many people ducking into the church's alcoves to relieve their full bladders and queasy stomachs against the ancient walls. The local building preservation agency worry that corrosive chemicals in the bodily fluids are wearing away the sandstone blocks that form the church's foundation.

In an effort to stop the flow of expelled waste, police patrols have increased in the area and city fines for public urination have been doubled to €100.

NOSTRADAMUS ALSO WROTE COOKERY RECIPES AND GAVE ADVICE ON BEAUTY TIPS

Michel De Nostredame was a 16th-century French writer, astrologer, and prophet. In his 1555 book Les Propheties, he laid out predictions for centuries to come which according to believers, successfully predicted the French revolution, the World Wars, and the election of Donald Trump amongst other events.

He was, among other things, an apothecary. Combining herbalism and pharmacy, he devised and recorded remedies. It's said he was kicked out of university when his past career as an apothecary was revealed as Tradesmen were considered sordid, but Nostradamus bounced back to travel Europe as an indemand apothecary and famed plague fighter, though his remedies failed to save his wife and two children who died of the disease.

Some of Nostradamus's Beauty treatments from the book The Elixirs of Nostradamus seem poisonous, such as lye for giving hair blonde highlights and crushed crystal for a teeth scrub. To make a beard darker and softer, or to dye whiskers the colour of "black amber" he recommends soap mixed with ashes and walnut juice.

FOCUS ON HERBACEOUS PERENNIALS

What we mean when we call a plant an Herbaceous Perennial is that in most of the them the stems are soft, succulent and green as opposed to being brown and woody. With most Herbaceous Perennial they will sprout growth from ground level in Spring and will grow and flower right through the Summer and into the Autumn. With most Herbaceous Perennials in late Autumn and early Winter they start to look a bit ragged. But depending on the severity of the Winter some will hold on until the first real cold snap. The maintenance for most Herbaceous Perennials isn't a lot really. During late Autumn early Winter cut the majority of them down to ground level and mulch over with some compost. Some Herbaceous Perennials such as Lupins and semi hardy Fuchsias will have woody stems because of the milder climate here so when pruning back cut right back to just a couple of inches above ground level.

Herbaceous Perennials are a valuable plant in the garden for a number of reasons.

Because of the length of time they flower for.

2. Because of the short length of time it takes them to grow to the maximum height and spread.

When planting a Herbaceous Border always remember to plant the taller ones to the back or middle and the smaller growing ones to the front. When choosing your plants pick one plant that you can repeatedly plant in the border to create a sense of continuity to the planting scheme. Herbaceous Perennials flower from April until October/November so you have a wide range of flowering times and colour to choose from. The secret to having a good flowering Herbaceous Border is every few years in the Winter to lift and divide the plants that are suitable for this. Next week I will focus on Roses.

SELF-ACCEPTANCE

One of my favourite Oscar Wilde quotes says 'Be yourself, everyone else is taken'. So why is it so difficult for us to do just that? Liking ourselves and being ourselves has to do with self-acceptance. Self-acceptance refers to our ability to embrace all facets of ourselves and not just the positive, acceptable parts. Whilst we may recognize our limitations and weaknesses – accepting ourselves fully means we accept these aspects of ourselves too. We stop judging ourselves and being so hard on ourselves.

Research shows that before the age of eight we are unable to form a sense of ourselves separate from that which was transmitted to us by those who care for us. So often I hear clients say to me that their parents were unable or unwilling to communicate the message to them that they were totally okay and acceptable. In addition to this we may have received much disapproval and criticism from teachers, siblings, other relatives and/or our peers. Is it any wonder then that we come to see ourselves as inadequate in many ways? A consequence of this is that we may go on to regard many aspects of ourselves negatively. We 'beat ourselves up' often telling ourselves the very same thing that an overly critical parent or teacher may have said.

So how then do we become more self-accepting?

Developing self-acceptance requires that we develop more self-compassion for ourselves. The Buddhist teacher Pema Chodron says that "Compassion isn't some kind of self-improvement project or ideal that we're trying to live up to. Having compassion starts and ends with having compassion for all those unwanted parts of ourselves, all those imperfections that we don't even want to look at". However learning to be self-compassionate and kind to ourselves can seem like quite a new idea and represents a deep change in our attitude and way of being. In order to ensure our survival our brains have been designed in such a way as to give attention to the negative stuff. Self-criticism has in fact played an important role for us. However, this criticism needs to be tempered with kindness and not allowed to be a habit based response formed from patterns laid down in our early childhood. Whenever we criticise ourselves we are triggering the same threat and protection systems in the body and brain that get activated when threatened by other people.

By cultivating more self-compassion we come to like ourselves more and to view ourselves as deserving of love and respect. This in turn can lead us to showing not just more kindness and goodwill toward ourselves but towards others as well.

Next week we will look further at developing and cultivating self acceptance.

Welcome back dear reader, "today if you hear His voice do not harden your hearts....See to it that none of you has a sinful, unbelieving heart that turns away from the living God" (Hebrews 3:7-12). Last week we saw that God is Love (1st John 4:8). Do you know that God loves you? He does. Passionately! He is proud of you and He knows what's in your heart. But our enemy the Devil - the father of lies, twists and perverts our relationship with God through sin so that people feel condemned and afraid to approach Him, fearing that they are not good enough. "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast" (Ephesians 2:8-9). When we acknowledge Jesus as Lord and ask Him to come into our life we are released from the burden of having to make ourselves right with God. He gives us the free gift of Salvation under the New Covenant which He established based on the sacrifice that Jesus made, and that Salvation opens the way for us to become children of God loved and cherished, blessed, healed, protected, healthy and secure in the knowledge of eternal life in Heaven with Him when we die.
