

New York calling for Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council

athaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr John Sheahan, has concluded a very successful visit to New York as part of the St Patrick's Day Parade celebrations. On Saturday, he joined the Mayor of New York, Bill de Blasio, for an early morning reception at his official residence, Gracie Mansion. Among the other invited guests were the Taoiseach Leo Varadkar and current Rose of Tralee Jennifer Byrne.

Later he joined Kerry Patriotic and Benevolent Association President, Frank O'Keefe, in leading the 1,500 strong Kerry Association down Fifth Avenue in the annual St Patrick's Day Parade

On Friday (March 16th) the Mayor laid a wreath in remembrance of the

almost 3,000 victims of the World Trade Center and 9/11 attacks at the memorial site in New York . The inscription on the wreath reads: 'In Remembrance. From the People of County Kerry, Ireland.' One in six of those who died were either Irish born or of Irish descent.

Mayor Sheahan and his wife Mairead, were welcomed by Jerry Leary, senior security supervisor at the Memorial, and given a guided tour of the 9/11 museum. The \$3 billion Memorial and Museum were built at Ground Zero by Navillus, the construction company headed up by Donal O'Sullivan from Ballinskelligs.

The Mayor also met current members of the New York Fire Department of Kerry heritage. Queens Battalion Chief Stephen Sullivan, whose family comes from Cromane and Beaufort, recalled how a delay in getting to The Bronx Fire House that morning probably his life. All his colleagues in the Brooklyn Unit perished when trying to evacuate people from the South Tower when it collapsed on them.

On Monday (March 18th), the Mayor visited the Yonkers Fire House and the Kerry Hall, headquarters of the Kerry Association. He also had engagements with Tourism Ireland, IDA Ireland and the Consul General of Ireland, Mr Ciarán Madden, in Ireland House.

The Mayor was accompanied by Kerry County Council Tourism Officer, Mr John Griffin.



"As Mayor of Killarney, I am delighted to be in a position to organise an event that will help good causes", Mayor Kelleher said.


The gala event, was a key part of this year's St Patrick's Weekend Festival and included

New Garda initiative introduced in Killarney

new initiative aimed at creating more awareness around crime and enhancing the personal safety of vulnerable people within the community is being delivered in Kerry for the first time. Killarney Gardai Michael Milner and Diane Collins will deliver the Streetwise Programme over an eight week period. The Streetwise Programme was launched at the Kerry Parents and Friends Centre in Killarney last Friday and will provide vulnerable learners with greater

understanding about crime awareness which in turn enhances the personal safety of individuals involved. The training will be lead by these two Killarney based Gardai and will help break down barriers between Gardai and members of the community. A range of topics will be covered including the role of An Garda Síochána, increased vigilance in both the home and when out in the community and how to access emergency services. It would also teach the consequences of vandalism

and social media abuse.

"The programme will foster a greater awareness around responsibility of attitudes to alcohol and the legal consequence of substance abuse", Garda Michael Milner told the Killarney Outlook.

At the end of the eight week course Gardai will detail the participants on the first hand happenings and runnings of a Garda Station. All participants will receive a certificate on completion of the course.

Off court events sour Lakers clash with Carlow

Scotts Lakers St Paul's 85 IT Carlow 89

Despite losing a closely contested game, Scotts Lakers league cup quarter final clash with IT Carlow in Cork on Monday will be remembered for events that happened off the court in the lead up to this fixture.

As Division 1B winners Scotts Lakers had earned the right of home advantage against Carlow (fourth place in Division 1A) and this was fixed for Killarney Sports Centre on Sunday evening at 5.30 pm. However Carlow withdrew from fulfilling the fixture on Sunday morning claiming that adverse weather and snow conditions made it too difficult to travel. Basketball Ireland readily accepted their decision despite the fact that Dublin Lions travelled to Killorglin on the same day and the Carlow senior football team manged to make the journey to Belfast. Under Basketball Ireland rules, when a League

fixture is to be rescheduled, the home team must offer their opponents three alternative dates. With Killarney Sports Centre unavailable on Monday, Scotts Lakers offered Carlow several other options to play the match in Killarney this week. All options were rejected. When Carlow refused to accept the offers, Basketball Ireland fixed the match for Neptune Stadium Cork on Monday afternoon at 3.00pm. The governing body also stated that if Scotts Lakers refused to give up home advantage and play in Cork, the match would be awarded to Carlow. The Killarney side reluctantly agreed to play the match in Cork rather than give a walkover and having experience of the difficult appeals process in Basketball Ireland that rarely gives any satisfaction.

Within a matter of hours, Scotts Lakers had been stripped of home advantage and the opportunity of playing in front of an estimated crowd of 600 people in the final home game of the season. The new scenario was playing in front of less than 30 people in an empty Neptune Stadium in a match that was fixed at short notice.

The game itself started brightly for Scotts Lakers and they led 15-11 at an early stage and were 27-20 in front at the end of the first quarter.

The Killarney side stayed in front to lead 45-40 at half time but Carlow enjoyed a productive third quarter to take the advantage, 59-62, at the end of the third quarter.

The Lakers trailed by 10 with 6.47 remaining but had a late rally to claw it back to 74-80 with 43 seconds left before narrowing it to just a single basket, 82-84, with 13 seconds left.

Carlow went six points clear again before a huge three-pointer from Antuan Bootle cut it to 85-88 with four seconds remaining. However it was too late and Carlow held on to win a match that will be remembered for all the wrong reasons.

In any sporting decider, a team can accept being beaten by the better team on the day and Carlow won the match to advance to the semi-final. Certain factors can go against teams and these are often accepted too as part of the game. Inconsistent and questionable refereeing decisions is under scrutiny in every sport. Referees have a thankless job and teams just accept the mistakes and hope that matters will even out over the course of a game or the season. Scotts Lakers didn't enjoy too many of the officials calls on Monday and the stats figures tell their own story. Carlow had a total of six fouls called against them in the entire 40 minutes compared to 19 fouls called against Scotts Lakers.

Unfortunately this is part of the game and referees can often be inconsistent. Last week, some observers would suggest that Scotts Lakers appeared to benefit from some questionable officials calls in the match against

Kilkenny in the final quarter. The foul count that night was 27 against Kilkenny and 20 on Lakers. To win any match, a team has to beat the opposition and hope that the foul count is favorable and consistent. Scotts Lakers may have come up short here and would accept that on any day but having to deal with frustrating decision making by Basketball Ireland officialdom just makes the situation so disheartening and demoralizing.

St. Paul's Basketball Club and Scotts Lakers will feel that their huge efforts to promote national league basketball deserve better. The biggest crowds at any national league venue have been at Killarney Sports Centre all season. Indeed the crowds have been consistently bigger than any superleague team apart from Tralee Warriors. The Killarney Sports Centre hosted a crowd of 950 people for a clash with Killorglin last October. This was a record crowd for a national league or superleague game in the history of Killarney basketball.

If the home game had gone ahead last Sunday or any other day this week, Scotts Lakers may not have brought in 950 again but an estimated crowd of 600 plus would have turned up for the knockout last home game of the season. Instead of playing before a crowd of 30 people in Cork, Scotts Lakers had earned the right of a home game and the opportunity to receive the national league shield in front of their own supporters. Nobody can control the weather but Basketball Ireland's decision making leaves a lot to be desired on this occasion.

SAFETY FOR PERMIT HOLDERS

How learner drivers can ensure their driving experience is a safe and enjoyable one

SAFETY FOR PERMIT HOLDERS

To ensure your safety and that of other road users, learner drivers are bound by certain laws.

DRIVING ALONE:

You can't be alone in the vehicle when driving, regardless of how long you have been driving and how many learner permits you have held. And the person who's with you must hold a full driving licence for the category of vehicle you are driving for a continuous period of 2 years.

THE ONLY EXCEPTIONS TO THIS ARE WHEN YOU ARE:

Driving a work vehicle (eg, agricultural tractor or JCB), unless it has been adapted to carry a passenger, and the passenger holds a full driving licence for a work vehicle for a continuous period of 2 years.

Riding a motorcycle, if you obtained your first learner permit on or after the 6 December 2010 you need to carry a Certification of Satisfactory Completion with your permit in order to drive.

ACCOMPANYING OTHER LEARNERS:

You may not act as an accompanying driver, ie, holder of a full licence, for a person driving on a learner permit. The Certificate of Competency you receive on passing your driving test does not qualify – you must hold a full licence to be an accompanying driver for a continuous period of at least 2 years.

'L' PLATES:

Your vehicle must display an 'L' plate front and rear. The plate should consist of a red 'L' on a white background.

MOTORWAYS:

No driving on motorways even if you possess a certificate of competence.

TRAILERS:

If you hold a learner permit to drive vehicles of



categories B, C1, C, D1 or Dyou may not drive the vehicle when drawing a trailer.

PASSENGERS:

No passengers can be carried for payment or other reward.

VEHICLE SAFETY

Safe driving alone does not ensure road safety. The vehicle you are driving must also be fit to be on the road. In fact, it is a serious offence to drive an unsafe vehicle on a public road.

Laws exist to enforce vehicle standards. One of the most important of these is that your car, if more than four years old, must undergo a regular health-check called a National Car Test (NCT).

As a driver, it is your responsibility to ensure your vehicle is in good working order. You must ensure that the steering, brakes, front and rear lights, reflectors, rear view mirrors, safety belts, speedometer, tyres, windscreen wipers, horn and silencer are all checked regularly to ensure they are in good condition and working properly.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS

Not all of the following are legal requirements but they are all important to adhere to:

CHILDREN IN MOTOR VEHICLES

You must not leave young children on their

own in a motor vehicle, even if you are away for a short time. The children may face a number of hazards, such as:

A FIRE BREAKING OUT

Dehydration and heatstroke on a warm day (if all windows are closed)

Being trapped in electric windows, which could result in serious injury or death

ANIMALS IN MOTOR VEHICLES

You should never leave animals alone in vehicles. It is cruel and unsafe and can result in injury to the animal and/or damage to your vehicle.

USING A MOBILE PHONE

You must not drive a vehicle or ride a motorbike while using a handheld mobile phone. It is an offence that can result in your receiving up to fourpenalty points.

Cyclists should never use a mobile phone when cycling; pedestrians should be careful when using one.

IPODS ETC

Personal radios and MP3 players can be distracting and cause you to lose concentration while driving or crossing the road. Cyclists in particular should avoid these devices, as they, more than most, rely on their hearing while on the road.

BASIC CAR CHECKS

Here's a simple way to remember what to check.

RAIN OR SHINE, it pays to give the car a good check over every couple of weeks – you could prevent a breakdown and perhaps a large, unwelcome bill.

FUEL

Top up when you pass a filling station rather than delay looking for one until the fuel light comes on – particularly if you're driving in an unfamiliar area.

OIL

Cars can consume as much as a litre of oil every

1,000 miles. Check the oil level regularly (your handbook will show you how). Don't wait for the red oil pressure warning light to come on engine damage may already have occurred by then.

LIGHTS

Clean all exterior lights regularly and check for blown bulbs and cracks in the lens.

ELECTRICS

Battery problems are the number one cause of breakdowns at any time of year. Renew an old, tired battery before it lets you down. Also make sure that your electric radiator cooling fan starts running when the engine gets hot – you can check this by running the engine with the car stationary.

WATER

Overheating is a common cause of breakdowns, especially in hotter weather. Check the coolant level regularly (the handbook will show you how) and if the level always seems low, check for leakages. Top up thewindscreen washer fluid too.

RUBBER

Incorrectly inflated tyres are not only unsafe, they wear out faster and can increase fuel consumption by around 5%. If you're driving with extra passengers or luggage, remember to increase your tyre pressure accordingly (see your handbook).

EARTH HOUR IS THIS SATURDAY

Earth hour is all about helping to protect the planet and everyone doing their bit to reverse global warming. While the idea is partly about saving electricity during that crucial 'Earth Hour', it is actually more about the symbolism and getting people to be more wary about what they use.

To take part all you have to do is just switch off your lights and stop using electronic things like computers and iPads between 8.30 and 9.30pm on this Saturday, March 24th. Lights that are on for safety reasons and medical equipment, fridges and freezers obviously need to stay on.

CHANGE TO SUMMER TIME THIS WEEKEND

Ireland is in the Western European Time Zone, which is the same time as Greenwich Mean Time, so to make sure you don't oversleep or mess up your daily routine on Sunday, before you go to bed on this Saturday night or on Sunday, 25 March at 01:00am be sure to set the time forward by one hour on your clocks, watches and all other manually controlled timer devices.

Brighter evenings are wonderful to look forward to and lets hope we will get the dry, mild weather to enjoy them.

RESCUED BY THE NAVY

An 18-month-old German Shepherd named Luna fell off a fishing boat in the Pacific Ocean, swam two miles to a nearby island used by the U.S. Navy for target practice, and is believed to



have survived there for five weeks by eating mice.

Luna was first reported missing the morning of February 10th, 2016 by her owner, Nick Hayworth, a fisherman who was out fishing near and island about 80 miles off the coast of San Diego.

"He told us Luna was a very powerful swimmer and that he was 90% sure she'd head for shore," said Sandy DeMunnik, public affairs officer for Naval Base Coronado. "So our staff searched the island, but with no luck. He stayed in the area for two more days to look for her, and after a week, we considered her lost at sea and presumed dead."

Over a month later, Luna showed up to greet Navy staffers arriving on the island for work. "They saw Luna just sitting on the side of the road, wagging her tail, it was a stunning sight for them as there are no domesticated animals on the island." Ms. DeMunnik explained.

Luna who was presented with a Navy "Dog Tag" engraved with the dates she was on the island was examined by a wildlife biologist at the San Diego Zoo who determined she was "perfectly healthy, other than being a little undernourished," Ms. DeMunnik concluded.

WISDOM, THE WORLD'S OLDEST KNOWN WILD BIRD, IS A MOTHER AGAIN

Year after year, Wisdom, a Laysan albatross who is the oldest known banded bird in the world, has continued to surprise wildlife officials and her fans by reappearing at the Midway Atoll National Wildlife Refuge to meet up with her mate Akeakamai – and this year is no exception.

Wisdom was believed to be just five-years-old when she was first banded back in 1956 by biologist Chandler Robbins when Midway Atoll was an active U.S. Naval Air Station. In 2002 Mr. Robbins caught her again by chance and her story took off.

She has since outlived many of her mates and relatives whose lifespans are estimated to be between 12 and 40 years in the wild, Wisdom and her mate, Akeakamai, return each year to the Papahānaumokuākea Marine National Monument to nest and raise a single chick and she's also believed to have logged two to three million miles of flight time since 1956—or four to six round trips to the moon.

On December 13, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service confirmed the pair were incubating a new egg and this has since hatched out. It will be another few months before this little newcomer fledges, and the pair will continue taking turns caring for it until it's ready.

Wisdom is believed to have successfully raised as many as 36 chicks in her lifetime, with each one being precious to the survival of the Laysan albatross, who are listed as Near Threatened on the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species.

Today, the refuge, which is about 1,200 miles northwest of Hawaii, is home to the largest population of albatross on earth, including 73% of all Laysan albatross, 36% of all Blackfooted albatross and endangered Short-tailed albatross.



Know Your Rights: PARENTAL LEAVE

OUESTION

What is parental leave? Can both parents take it?

ANSWER

Each parent of an eligible child may take up to 18 weeks of unpaid parental leave from work. Leave can be taken no later than the child's eighth birthday. However, if your child has a disability or a long-term illness, you can take parental leave up to their 16th birthday. If you adopt a child between the ages of six and eight, you can take leave for that child up to two years after the date of the adoption order. (Your contract of employment may also provide for an extended age limit.)

You can take 18 weeks of leave per child in one continuous period or in two separate blocks of a minimum of six weeks. If taken in two separate blocks, there must be a gap of at least 10 weeks between the two periods of leave per child. However, if your employer agrees, you can separate parental leave into periods of days or even hours.

Taking parental leave does not affect your other employment rights. Apart from the loss of pay and pension contributions, your position remains as if no parental leave had been taken. This means, for example, that while on parental leave you will continue to accumulate your annual leave entitlement. While you are on parental leave, a public holiday that falls on a day when you would normally be working is added to your period of leave.

When you return to work after taking parental leave, you can ask for a change in your work pattern or working hours for a set period. Your employer must consider your request, but is not obliged to grant it.

Both parents have an equal entitlement to 18 weeks' parental leave each. Unless you and your partner work for the same employer, this leave is non-transferable; you can only claim your own parental leave entitlement of up to 18 weeks per child. However, if you both work for the same employer and your employer agrees, you may transfer up to 14 weeks of your parental leave entitlement to each other.

Whilst we may often think of grief resulting from the death of a loved one, any loss can cause grief. These losses may include divorce or the break up of a relationship, a miscarriage, loss of a pet, loss of our health, a job, a cherished dream, a friendship, financial security, or selling the family home.

Grieving is a highly individual and personal experience and the way in which we grieve can depend on many different elements. These include our personality, our life experiences, our faith, the nature of the loss, our resilience and coping style. Grief can be like a roller coaster - with ups and downs. Powerful feelings can come unexpectedly some more intense and longer lasting than others. Feelings can range from shock and disbelief, to guilt, sadness, anger, fear and frustration. Physical symptoms are also common such as weight loss/gain, insomnia, fatigue, nausea, aches and pains. Forgetfulness and poor concentration are also symptoms of grief. All of these feelings are perfectly normal and there is no right or wrong way to feel. Sometimes people can feel guilty about their anger - but it is okay to be angry.

It is important not to go through this alone and to talk and share your feelings. This may be with family and friends or you may prefer the support of a counsellor. Counselling can offer the space and time to talk through your feelings and overcome obstacles to your grieving. Allowing yourself time to experience your feelings is very important even if, at times, they are difficult. For many people their faith, prayer, meditation or going to church can be a great solace in times of loss. Support groups where you can share your sorrow with others who have experienced similar losses can be also be of tremendous help. It is vitally important that you take care of yourself when you are grieving. You are coming to terms with a major upheaval in your life so give yourself permission to take things a bit easier. Your energy may be low, so do not place too many demands on yourself and make sure you get enough rest and sleep. It is important to look after your physical health by eating healthily and getting some exercise each day. Don't rush things and put off making major decisions such as moving home or changing jobs for at least six months to a year.

INCOME TAX CREDITS AND RELIEFS

Tax reliefs reduce the amount of tax that you have to pay. The tax reliefs to which you are entitled depend on your personal circumstances.

HOW TAX CREDITS WORK

Tax is calculated as a percentage of your income. Your tax credits are deducted from this to give the amount of tax that you have to pay. A tax credit has the effect of reducing your tax by the amount of the credit.

Everyone is entitled to a personal tax credit. There are personal tax credits for single people, people who are married or in a civil partnership and people who are widowed or are surviving civil partners. If you are in employment, getting a pension or getting a taxable social welfare payment (such as Jobseeker's Benefit) you are also entitled to the Employee Tax Credit (formerly known as the PAYE tax credit) of €1,650.





GARDENING OUTLOOK



with John O'Sullivan

PLANTS FOR SHADE

Most gardens have a shady spot, a north facing wall, under a tree or in the shadow of the house.

There is a huge range of plants to suit shaded areas including broadleaved foliage plants, to spring flowers and ever green flowering shrubs. Ferns are probably the first plant you would think of when it comes to shade – you can choose from a wide range of ferns from dwarf, medium or large. Ferns look very natural when planted under a tree or beside a wall. Most ferns will die back for the winter so if you want all year round foliage you will need to plant something evergreen near the ferns i.e something low growing like the Viburnum Davidii which is a great plant when planted in groups of three. Another good evergreen plant for the shade is the Heuchera which comes in lovely shades including dark to light purple and green to light green.

There is also a wide range of flowering plants for shade. A good example is an Astilbe, an Astilbe has a good range of flower colours and foliage to choose from. An Astilbe has a good range of flower colours and foliage to choose from. Sometimes when an area is shaded, the ground can be quite dry – even in the winter time. A good plant for this would a plant called Vinca Minor which is an evergreen flowering ground cover plant. But remember to water until established.
