

VODAFONE INVESTING IN ITS NETWORK IN KERRY

Vodafone Ireland's Kerry customers are set to enjoy greatly enhanced coverage after significant investments by the company to upgrade its mobile network throughout Kerry. The upgrades will see the company deliver mobile data services to areas where, to date, there have mainly only been voice services. This means that everywhere a customer can make a voice call today they will now get a really strong data experience. Already, as a result of the upgrades, Vodafone has seen that customers in the South West are now using 50% more data.

"We are investing in a major network enhancement programme in Kerry that will significantly improve the customer experience. Kerry will now have an enhanced mobile experience and cutting edge products and services", she said.

In tandem with these upgrades, Vodafone has also launched 4G services in parts of Kerry. WHITE-TAILED EAGLE CHICKS HATCH SUCCESSFULLY

White-tailed Eagles have successfully hatched chicks in Ireland in recent weeks. Fourteen pairs of eagles are holding territories across four counties with at least seven pairs nesting and laying eggs. In the last two weeks the first chicks of 2014 hatched in nests at Mountshannon, Co. Clare, and at Glengarriff in West Cork. Other pairs are nesting at sites in Kerry and Galway but have vet to hatch. In the last two weeks a pair was confirmed to have hatched chicks at a nest near Mountshannon, Co Clare. This pair created history in 2013 when they reared the first chicks to fly from a nest in Ireland in over 100 years. A new nesting pair at Glengarriff was the first pair to hatch chicks this year in late April. Unfortunately the breeding efforts of this pair and a pair nesting in Killarney National Park failed, probably due to a combination of poor weather and inexperience. Hopes are high that the Mountshannon pair and others around the country will successfully raise chicks that will go on to form the basis of a viable population in Ireland. These are the latest chicks of the high profile reintroduction programme which began in 2007 with the release of 100 young Norwegian eagles in Killarney National Park as part of the White-tailed Eagle reintroduction programme.

"We are delighted that White-tailed Eagles are now nesting across four counties, from Cork,

Kerry and Clare to Connemara, Co. Galway", said Dr. Allan Mee, project manager for the Golden Eagle Trust. "In 2013 we had our first chicks reared in the wild in Clare but this year we are excited to see that pairs are nesting as far away as Connemara, although Kerry remains the stronghold for the species. The increase in the number of pairs nesting is really encouraging and bodes well for the future of the species. Whatever the outcome of these nesting

attempts, the signs are good for future breeding in the area and at a number of other sites across Ireland in the near future. White-tailed Eagles can live for 25-30 years and generally mate for life with adult pairs remaining within their home range throughout the year. First time breeders, especially young birds, often fail at their first attempt. However, with the goodwill and support of local communities the species should have a bright future in Ireland.

TANÁISTE BACKS ACTION GROUP CAMPAIGN



IT was never the Government's intention to centralise all key local authority services in one area to the detriment of another, Tánaiste Eamon Gilmore has insisted.

Speaking at a meeting with the Killarney Local Government Action Group today (Friday), Mr Gilmore said the tourist town is "perfectly right" to protest at the transfer of essential functions from the town to a central base in Tralee.

He said it was always intended to retain an urban-based focus in the provision of local government services and there is no requirement in the new Local Government Act to centralise services.

"Several counties have kept their local offices and services have been retained. It seems to be an issue of interpretation in Kerry," he said.

Mr Gilmore, who met with the local action group for over 30 minutes, said the soon-toretire Kerry County Manager should not put a system in place that would pre-empt any decisions that will be made by the incoming council.

"It's really a matter for the newly elected council to decide," said Mr Gilmore who added that he would ask Environment and Local Government Minister, Phil Hogan, to give some direction on the issues that have arisen in Kerry.

"The minister can give recommendations in certain cases and he could do so in Killarney," he said.

The action group had raised concerns that Killarney was losing its planning office, town clerk, housing officer and its mayor and fears were also expressed that while rates will rise, services will be cut.

The Tánaiste said there is a strong case for a town like Killarney to have a separate planning function and decisions on matters like street cleaning and landscaping need to be made at a local level and not from a central base.

He further agreed that it "stands to reason" that Kerry County Council should continue to provide resort marketing funding to Killarney and development levies should be spent in the areas in which they were collected.

Mr Gilmore also backed the action group's campaign for the proposed new Kerry tourism unit to be based in Killarney as opposed to Tralee.

"That stands to absolute reason," he said.

He added that there is no reason why the title of Mayor of Killarney should be abolished as is being proposed by the Kerry County Council executive.

"There is no prohibition on that. Killarney need a mayor and I have no difficulty with it," the Tánaiste said. Sales: Des 087 659 3427 or Email: killarneyoutlook@outlookmags.com



INCREASE WILL AFFECT GROWTH WARNS KERRY IHF CHAIRMAN

Ahead of the local elections, Chairman of the Kerry Branch of the Irish Hotels Federation (IHF), Sean O'Driscoll warned that the proposed increase in local authority rates in Killarney will affect growth in the sector and could cost jobs in tourism.

Mr. O'Driscoll pointed out that tourism is one of the few sectors that have been creating jobs in the county over the last two years. He said that many hotels in the county pay rates, water and sewerage bills of anywhere between \notin 50,000 and \notin 350,000 per annum and that they cannot afford any increases. The hotel sector is still recovering from the massive losses incurred during the recession. The last thing the industry needs, as it is getting back on its feet, is more local taxes.

Mr. O'Driscoll also said that he hoped that the newly elected councillors would genuinely focus on improving economic activity and job creation in the county and avoid increasing business costs. He asked that they immediately review operating procedures in the new Local Authority Structure to ensure that tourism support services are at the centre of policy decisions. Mr. O'Driscoll slammed the decision to take services out of the towns and centralise them:"Our towns are the economic hubs within the county. In order to maintain standards and ensure continued economic growth, our key towns in the county need a dedicated budget and executive, planning offices and a continued commitment in relation to litter control & landscaping".

Mr. O'Driscoll welcomed Tánaiste Eamon Gilmore's comments last week when he said it was never the Government's intention to centralise all key local authority services. In particular, he welcomed Mr. Gilmore's comments that "several counties have kept their local offices and services have been retained. It seems to be an issue of interpretation in Kerry". Mr. Gilmore went on to say that the county manager should not put a system in place that would pre-empt any decisions that will be made by the incoming council and said that it's really a matter for the newly elected council to decide.

LOOKING AFTER YOUR SUMMER BEDDING

• If you look after your bedding plants throughout the Summer you will have colour until early autumn or the first early frost.

• A liquid feed of Tomato feed every 2 to 3 weeks is an ideal way to feed your hanging baskets , window boxes and containers.

• Make sure when you are feeding them to do it in the evening time and keep the liquid off the foliage as much as possible.

• As the summer goes on you will notice that some of the flowers will start to go off. All you have to do here is take the dead flowers off, a process called dead heading.

 It only takes a couple of minutes and it will ensure that new flowers will grow.

- Later in the Summer if a plant looks bad in the basket or window box, remove and replace it with something else like a trailing ivy. Otherwise the whole hanging basket, window box or container will look as it its gone off, and a new plant will give it a new lease of life.

Know Your Rights: VACCINATIONS WHEN TRAVELLING ABROAD

QUESTION

We are planning a round-the-world trip later this year. Should we think about getting vaccinations?

ANSWER

۲

You should consider getting vaccinations if you are travelling outside of Western Europe, North America, Australia, and New Zealand. Health risks vary from country to country, so you will need to get advice about this well before you travel – ask your family doctor, the Health Service Executive (HSE) or your travel agent.

You will also find relevant information on the World Health Organization Country List. The HSE website has information on the different types of vaccines, such as those for cholera or tuberculosis – hse.ie.

Travel vaccinations are not covered by the medical card so you will have to pay the full cost for them.

Start the process of vaccination in good time before you travel. Some vaccines take time to become effective, so give yourself at least 8 weeks for full protection.

An early start is particularly important if you plan to travel with children. The BCG vaccination against tuberculosis (TB), for example, should be given at least 3 months before your child travels.

Some countries require you to have certain vaccinations and you will need to show an International Certificate of Vaccination in order to gain access to these countries. Other vaccinations are recommended and you can decide yourself whether to get them.

If you feel unwell on your return to Ireland, you should see a doctor as soon as possible. Give full details of the countries you visited.



With the evenings longer and the mornings brighter, have you ever thought about cycling to work, or part cycling to work? Perhaps drive to a point along the route and cycle from there?


The focus of this week's column is cycling to work. Cycling to work is a fantastic way to include exercise into your daily life and in the process receive a lot of instant health perks and savings, both time and money.

Such health perks include a Healthier Sense of Well Being. Cyclists report an increased sense of well being, higher tolerance for stress and a clearer mental process after a bike ride. Simply spending time outside cheers one up. This is thanks to the daylight and sunlight to boost levels of the feel good hormone serotonin. So beat the depressing effect of sitting in an artificially lit office, by getting outside and expose oneself to more daylight.

The majority of more daylight in one's life results in better sleep. Exercising outdoors exposes one to daylight, and helps get ones' circadian rhythm back in sync and rids one's body of cortisol, the stress hormone that can prevent deep regenerative sleep. Therefore cycling to work can eliminate the feelings of tiredness and difficulties in sleeping are also reduced.

Cycling to work will save on the time ones spends commuting as short journeys in most towns are quicker by bike. Cyclists know exactly how long a journey will take, door to door, unlike to motorists' traffic and parking can be unpredictable.

So cycling to work can change your daily commute from something one hates to something one loves. If your commute is 20km, why not drive 10km, and cycle the remaining 10k to and from work – that is 20km daily exercise?! Fresh air, exercise, and the chance to take in the environs means that one often arrives at the desk more refreshed and revitalized.

The Cycle to Work scheme is a tax incentive scheme which aims to encourage employees to cycle to and from work. Under the scheme employers can pay for bicycles and bicycle equipment for their employees and the employee pays back through a salary sacrifice arrangement of up to 12 months. The employee is not liable for tax, prsi, and levies on their repayments.....A win win situation!





Rescue at the Gap: Following a serious motorbike accident in the Gap of Dunloe last weekend, Kerry Mountain Rescue Team attended the scene.

Two motorcyclists were thrown from their motorcycle onto a dry riverbed while crossing a bridge near The Turnpike in the Gap of Dunloe in the late afternoon. A HSE ambulance crew treated the casualties - one male and one female - for their injuries, both of which were serious. Both casualties were stretchered from the river bed back onto the road by members of KMRT. The Shannon-based Irish Coast Guard Helicopter also responded but could not arrlift the casualties from this location. The helicopter landed in a field in the Gap of Dunloe around one mile north of the accident scene. The female casualty was stretchered to this point by KMRT from where she was airlifted the male casualty to Kerry General Hospital.



RECIPES OF THE WEEK **PASTA WITH SALMON AND PEAS**

Pasta and fish are a great combination

This quick and easy dinner recipe is also healthy and delicious, what more could you want from a meal! This recipe is also great for other types of fish such as mackerel or even prawns.

Serves 4 Adults INGREDIENTS

 (\bullet)

• 350g / 12¹/₂ oz. of dried spaghetti

- 1 tablespoon of olive oil
- 240ml / 81/2 fl oz. of water
- 1 handful of fresh parsley
- Fresh ground black pepper, to taste
- 400g / 14 0z. of salmon fillets
- 300g / 10 1/2 oz. of fresh or frozen peas
- 1 lemon, juiced

METHOD

Half-fill a large saucepan with water and bring to the boil

Cook the pasta until firm, not too soft - the packet should have cooking times While that's cooking, cut the salmon into cubes

INGREDIENTS


- 225g Margarine
- 225g caster sugar
- 4 eggs
- 225g plain flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1 strong espresso or 4-5 tbsp coffee essence

INGREDIENTS - COFFEE BUTTER ICING:

- 1-2 tsp coffee essence or strong coffee.

INSTRUCTIONS

Preheat your oven to 180°C/350°F/Gas Mk 4. Grease and line a 20x30cm cake tin. Take a small bowl and whisk all four eggs



Heat the olive oil in a frying pan, and then add the salmon

Cook the fish for around 5 minutes – it should change colour but not go brown

Add the peas, water and parsley to the pan and cook for a further 2 minutes

Add the pepper and lemon juice; check according to tasteWhen the pasta is cooked, tip out all the water, and then add it to the pan with the sauce

Toss the spaghetti lightly in the sauce, then serve straight away

In a second small bowl, sieve your flour and baking powder together.

In a larger mixing bowl, beat 225g of margarine and sugar together until pale and fluffy.

Add your whisked eggs into the larger bowl, bit by bit, mixing until blended each time.

Now add your sieved flour and baking powder, again a bit at a time until blended.

Finally, stir in your coffee until everything is well combined.

Pour your cake mix into the prepared tin and place in the preheated oven.

Bake for 35-40 minutes, until the cake is firm to touch and has slightly shrunk in from the sides of the tin.

OUTLOOK ON THE STATE EXAMINATIONS

Parents play an important role at

exam time (By Billy Ryle)

Students are well aware that the world is their oyster if they produce a decent result in the state exam. When you are young and idealistic life is an exciting adventure. Parents on the other hand have more experience of the mundane realities of living in a world of ups and downs. It's natural for parents to want the best for their children. Parents are anxious for their children to achieve good results in exams so that they can available of opportunities in life. It's understandable then, as the exams approach, that some

parents might feel unhappy with the effort being made by their exam student or might tend to project their anxiety onto the student. While parents can't obviously go in and sit the exam for their children their role is to provide unobtrusive support at this time.

The parents' task is to provide a calm home environment. When a parent is supportive the exam student will sense that her status in the family is not conditional on achieving good results in the exam. Parents are fully entitled to let their children know that their best effort is expected. By the same token it's equally important also that children should be fully aware that their best effort is acceptable. Nothing less than their best effort is expected, nothing more than their best effort is demanded!

The exam period isn't a time for friction between parent and child. It's definitely not a time for recriminations about time wasted during the year. Disagreements of this nature may cause confrontation and create tension at home. At all times, but especially around exam time, every student is entitled to the emotional support of the family. A supportive home environment lessens the fear of failure and under-achievement. A student who knows that her position in the family is not dependent on exam results will approach the exam in an upbeat and confident manner.

Have realistic expectations of your child based on previous performance at school. Don't expect a level of achievement that your offspring cannot attain. Make yourself aware of the levels, which she is taking in each subject, the target grades she is aiming for, and her potential points score. Parents want their children to do well in whatever activity they participate in. It's important to realise, however, that parents can expect too much from their children. Parents must take care to keep their ambitions for their children off the agenda. Instead, priority must be given to the needs and concerns of the exam student.

Nothing annoys a student more than a comparison with a sibling, relative or peer. While such comparisons are understandable they can be very destructive. An unflattering comparison serves to undermine the self-confidence of the student and create doubts in her mind. No two people are exactly the same. Even children of the same parents can be totally different in their levels of cognitive ability. Parents can be reluctant to accept difference in their children. But accept it they must. Furthermore, they must let their children know that they love each one of them equally and unconditionally.

Encourage your child to make the most of the time available prior to the exam. Urge her to maintain her study schedule right up to the end of the exam period. Continue to remind her that good organisation, efficient time management and self-discipline will pay dividends. Make it your business to see that your child continues to work in a comfortable study environment.

Encourage your child to maintain a programme of exercise and recreation. Regular exercise is the best way to burn off pre exam tension and is a welcome break from the demands of a study schedule. Reward your child for effort by serving up little treats from time to time. A hard working student will always welcome a favourite meal or a social outing. Long hours of study into the night can be counter- productive so encourage her to go to bed early for eight or nine hours sleep.

Keep an eye on your child's diet. Serve up meals that are nutritious and appetising. An occasional reminder about personal hygiene won't go amiss. Regular washing, changing of cloths and footwear induce the feel good factor, which is psychologically uplifting and leads to better concentration.

In summary, the role of the parent is very important. It involves giving support and being discreet. It requires you to be a good listener rather than a talker. It means being prepared for a certain amount of irritability. To draw an analogy with a theatrical production, the parent is the backstage manager while the student is on stage in the lead role. You, the parent, can help to make it a good performance.



CYCLING SAFETY Advice and tips on how to stay safe while cycling on irish roads

Cycling is a common means of transport in Ireland. It's popular for several reasons: it's great exercise, it's cheap and it cuts down on travel time, especially during rush-hour.

But cyclists are also a vulnerable category of road user. Every year there are several cycling fatalities on Irish roads and countless collisions involving cyclists.

As a cyclist, you can reduce your risk of death or injury by following some simple advice:

- Never cycle in the dark without adequate lighting white for front, red for rear
- Always wear luminous clothing such as hi-vis vests, fluorscent armbands and reflective belts so that other road users can see you
- Wear a helmet

- Make sure you keep to the left. Always look behind and give the proper signal before moving off, changing lanes or making a turn
- Follow the rules of the road, never run traffic lights or weave unpredictably in and out of traffic
- Maintain your bike properly in particular, your brakes should work properly and your tyres should be inflated to the right pressure and be in good condition
- Respect other road users don't get into shouting matches with motorists; stop at pedestrian crossings; don't cycle on the footpath
- Watch your speed, especially when cycling on busy streets and going downhill
- Steer well clear of left-turning trucks: let them turn before you move ahead

CYCLING FOR CHILDREN

Using a bike for the first time and learning to ride has been a rite of passage for generations of Irish children. Cycling is fun and sociable and, like swimming, a life-skill that stands to children in later years.

Yet, like many activities, cycling carries an element of risk. Parents play an important role in minimising the risk by giving them proper guidance and instruction at an early age to ensure that basic safety rules are absorbed while young.

Do's and don'ts of safe cycling for children

Do ensure they:

- Cycle a bike matched to their height and experience
- Wear a safety helmet
- Use lights in dark or dusky conditions

Don't allow them to:

- Cycle on public roads unsupervised (if under 12)
- Wear loosely-worn scarves or other clothing that could get caught in the wheels or chain-set
 - Take unnecessary risks

SAUERKRAUT HELPED CHANGE THE WORLD

Scurvy, a disease caused by extreme vitamin C deficiency, plagued sailors aboard longdistance sailing ships for centuries, took its toll on nearly every voyage during the Age of Sail — the period of global exploration by sailing ships lasting from the 16th to the mid-19th century.

For instance, commodore George Anson, who set sail with six ships for the Pacific in 1740 with 2,000 able seamen, returned to England with less than 700, the rest consumed by the disease. According to Anson's chaplain, "those affected have skin as black as ink, ulcers, difficult respiration, rictus of the limbs, teeth falling out and, perhaps most revolting of all, a strange plethora of gum tissue sprouting out of the mouth, which immediately rotted and lent the victim's breath an abominable odour."

Simple, fermented sauerkraut played an important role in helping prevent scurvy — an affliction known in its day as the scourge of the seas, responsible for an estimated two million deaths between 1500 and 1800 — on sailing ships around the world.

In 1753, Scottish naval surgeon James Lind noticed scurvy was invariably linked to those whose diet had been severely limited. He began testing various foods and noted that citrus fruits provided the quickest and most effective cure for the disease, but fruit would rot before it could be eaten.

With no real cure available, the British crown outfitted four captains during the 1760s with various potential cures in an attempt to find a reliable method to prevent scurvy through trial and error.

Captain James Cook, one of these four captains, was given several different experimental foods to try aboard his ship the HM Bark Endeavour when he left England for the South Pacific in 1768. Among them, as noted in the victualing minutes — the log of provisions put aboard was 7,860 pounds of sauerkraut.

Three years after leaving England with his store of Sour Kroutt (as it was spelled then) and with not a single death attributed to scurvy, Cook returned home to report his findings. Although sour cabbage alone did not rid the seas of the disease — Cook's crew also dined on such delicacies as spruce beer, malt and portable soup — it certainly played a major part.

Asian cultures have relied on fermented cabbage to survive long winters between fruit seasons for thousands of years. Kimchi, sauerkraut's Korean cousin, was historically used during winter to stave off vitamin deficiencies, while early records show workers building the Great Wall of China ate fermented cabbage regularly when fruit was not available. In fact, the earliest sauerkraut recipes found in Eastern Europe are thought to have come by way of the hordes of Genghis Khan.

While raw cabbage contains moderate levels of the vitamin, the process of fermentation sees these levels rise considerably. Made by fermenting thinly sliced cabbage in its own natural juices, sauerkraut is rich in vitamin C, which — although unknown at the time — is the key to preventing and curing scurvy.

IN COLOMBIA AND PERU, PLASTIC TRASH WILL BE AS GOOD AS MONEY

To reduce poverty and save wildlife, the Plastic Bank offers goods and services in exchange for collected litter.

Self-proclaimed beach bum and business exec David Katz has visited many coasts, including those in poorer parts of the world where shores have "more plastic visible than sand." Moved by disadvantaged locals and wildlife glutted by trash, Mr. Katz put on his entrepreneurial thinking cap. Why not turn all the junk into something valuable?

Mr. Katz's idea, which became the Plastic Bank, is ambitious but simple: People collect plastic waste in exchange for basic goods such as food and shoes. The accrued mixed plastic material can then be sent to manufacturers, who instead of producing more synthetics can reuse the eco-friendly (and marketable) "social plastic."

The project aims to make an impact by decreasing poverty by 2035 and cleaning up plastic waste from the world's oceans—a worthy but tough goal. Centuries-old plastic litters the planet. By 2025, the World Bank estimates, 2.42 billion tons of plastic will be dumped every year.

Discarded by big corporations, most trash travels to faraway beachside communities in developing countries. "In a lot of places in the world, people are actually dumping plastic waste into the streets and pushing it into the waterways," Plastic Bank cofounder Shaun Frankson explained. "If we can just reveal value in plastic, it becomes too valuable to let it sit there. It's not just plastic they're collecting."

Plastic collectors can become their own bosses too. The banks will be equipped with 3-D printers made available to locals who bring in plastic waste, so they can print out items like water pumps and filters. Through the training offered on-site, they can start businesses and sell the products themselves.

The more plastic that is collected, the more will be removed from our waterways. And the more plastic they collect, the more they can lift themselves out of poverty.

FARMER GETS CHOOSY WHEN HE GETS TOO MANY REPLIES TO HIS AD

A German farmer says he "can't get any work done" because he has been inundated with offers since he hung a sign outside his farm in Freiburg indicating he was looking for a wife. At first his sign, which read: "Busy farmer is looking for a wife," didn't receive much attention, but since he was featured in a local newspaper report the amount of applications have gone through the roof and he has now confirmed he will only consider the younger women who apply.

The farmer who owns 20 hectares of land and his own farmhouse said he hope to choose a wife from the selection and then get back to living normally.

CRUELTY IS NOT ENTERTAINMENT

Every year, hundreds of fiestas involving the use of bulls take place across Spain. The animals are chased, injured, taunted and killed in public spectacles that desensitize those who witness them..

The type and scale of these events vary. Some are openly publicized to tourists and others are held privately for local citizens. At least one event has been declared "cultural heritage" by politicians.

At "fire bull fiestas," bulls have flaming torches attached to their horns. Unshackled once the torches above its head are ablaze, the bull dashes about the square trying to avoid roaring bonfires, as spectators rush in, trying to goad it. The animal tosses its head again and again, as it turns in one direction then the next, trying desperately to escape the fire burning above its head. As the fire burns, drops of the flammable liquid fall on to the head and body of the animal and loud firecrackers explode above the square. These events can last for up to 40 minutes.

There is much support locally for an end to these brutal spectacles. According to Spanish group PACMA, 84% of people who took part in a recent poll rejected similar events, known as correbous, in Catalonia.

In other instances, men on horseback with long spears pursue and corner bulls who, when finally exhausted, are stabbed to death.

And then of course there is the Bull fight -The bull is not an aggressive animal, and the reason he is angry and attempts to charge at the matador whilst in the bullring is mainly because he has been horrendously abused for the previous two days. In fact, what spectators see is not a normal, healthy bull, but a weakened, half-blinded and mentally destroyed version, whose chances of harming his tormentors is virtually nil. The bull has wet newspapers stuffed into his ears; vaseline is rubbed into his eyes to blur his vision; cotton is stuffed up his nostrils to cut off his respiration. A strong caustic solution is rubbed onto his legs which throws him off balance. This also keeps him from lying down on the ground. In addition to this, drugs are administered to pep him up or slow him down, and strong laxatives are added to his feed to further incapacitate him. He is kept in a dark box for a couple of days before he faces the ring: the purpose of this is to disorientate him. When he is let out of the box, he runs desperately towards the light at the end of the tunnel. He thinks that at last his suffering is over and he is being set free — instead, he runs into the bullring to face his killers and a jeering mob.

The sequence of events begins when the bull faces the picadors — these are the men on horseback, whose purpose it is to exhaust the bull. They cut into his neck muscles with a pica. This is a weapon of about 6-8 inches long, and 2 inches thick. Once it is thrust into the bull it is twisted round and a large, gaping wound appears. The bull then starts bleeding to death. After the picador has finished his sordid business, the assistant matadors then get to work with the banderillas (sharp, harpoon-like barbed instruments). These are plunged into the bull's body, and he may also be taunted by capes. Up to six banderillas may be used. When the banderillas strike the bull stops in his tracks and bellows madly.

The matador is supposed to sever the artery near the heart with one thrust of the sword in fact, this never happens. It often takes 2-3 times before the creature is mercifully released by death. By this time, the bull's lungs and heart will be punctured and he always vomits blood. Miraculously, he sometimes attempts to rise again, and gets up on his knees, only to receive further mutilation at the hands of his tormentors. He finally gives up, goes to his knees and lies down. Even then, he is not allowed a little dignity to leave this world in peace, his ears and tail are cut off (often when he is fully conscious), and his broken, bleeding body is dragged around the ring by mules, to which he is attached by an apparatus made of wood and chains. Not content with his suffering, which must be too horrible to describe by words, the crowds boo and jeer him. They even throw empty beer cans at him. His body is then taken away to be skinned, and even then he may not be dead when this happens.

The bull is not the only animal to suffer in the ring — hundreds of horses die long and agonising deaths as they are gored by the pain-crazed bull. Horses have their ears stuffed with wet newspaper, they are blindfolded and their vocal chords are cut so they are unable to scream in pain. It is not an uncommon occurrence for horses to stumble upon their own entrails after being badly gored. After a horse has been wounded it is led out of the ring, given crude surgery, and sent back in. Horses used in bullrings sweat and tremble from fear — they are forced to return to the ring time and time again. The picador's horses are generally animals whose working life is over, and which are, therefore, old, infirm and docile. Their reward for serving mankind faithfully is to end their days in the bullrings.

FINALLY THIS WEEK

If you are going on holiday to Spain and certain other countries please do not attend any events that support torture - bullrings are largely sustained by tourists who visit out of curiosity and a misguided belief that if they fail to visit this unique part of Spanish culture, their visit to Spain will not be complete.

EXAM STRESS

The last thing young people want is to be questioned about study. This can create even more anxiety and close off any further conversation. Young people want the respect and responsibility to manage their own study, their social life and the balance between the two. Health Matters.... With Dr. Michael Moloney SINUSITIS PART 2

Treatments for sinusitis

Most cases of sinusitis are due to a viral infection. Like with colds, the immune system usually clears the virus and symptoms go within a couple of weeks. In the proportion of people who are suffering from bacterial infection the immune system should clear this also. Therefore it most people antibiotic treatment for sinusitis is not needed.

Antibiotics can also cause side-effects. Side-effects can include diarrhoea, nausea, vomiting, skin rashes and thrush.

However, antibiotics are sometimes useful. Your doctor is not likely to prescribe an antibiotic for a mild bout of acute sinusitis. But a course of antibiotics may be prescribed in some cases, for example:

If your symptoms are severe or if you are very unwell.

 If you have another illness such as cystic fibrosis, heart problems or a weakened immune system.

If your symptoms are not settling within 7 days, or are worsening.
Treatment to relieve symptoms

Some treatments may help to relieve symptoms whilst waiting for your immune system to clear the infection. These include the following:

• Painkillers such as paracetamol or ibuprofen will usually ease any pain. They will also help to bring down any fever that you may have. Sometimes stronger painkillers such as codeine are needed for a short time.

• Decongestant nasal sprays or drops are sometimes used. You can buy these from pharmacies. They may briefly relieve a blocked nose. However, they are not thought to shorten the duration of acute sinusitis. You should not use a decongestant spray or drops for more than 5-7 days at a time. If they are used for longer than this, they may cause a worse rebound congestion in the nose.

Keeping hydrated can be helpful, so have plenty of drinks.

Warm face packs held over the sinuses may help to ease pain.

• Saline nasal drops may help to relieve congestion and blockage in the nose.

Steam inhalation is a traditional remedy but is now not usually advised. This is because there is little evidence that it helps. Also, there have been some reports of people burning themselves trying to breathe in steam from a kettle. However, some people say that their nose feels clearer for a short while after a hot shower.

If symptoms are not easing after a week it is best advised to see your GP who can advise regarding appropriate management. Thankfully serious complications from sinus infections are rare.


