



## TRIBUTES POUR IN FOLLOWING THE SUDDEN PASSING

## OF FR. KEVIN

Tibutes have been pouring in following the news that Fr. Kevin McNamara passed away suddenly and unexpectedly on Tuesday of this week.

Fr. McNamara who had recently celebrated his 66th birthday died at University Hospital



Cork where he was preparing to undergo a procedure.

Originally from Cooraclare, in West Clare, Fr. Kevin had served in the Diocese of Kerry for over 30 Years.

Following his ordination as a Missionary of the Sacred Heart in 1981, Fr. Kevin served in Liverpool befor returning to Ireland where he served in Cork.

He then moved to Kerry where he worked with communities in Moyvane, Knockanure, Asdee, Gneeveguilla, Rathmore, Killarney and finally Glenflesk

Fr. Kevin, who wrote a popular column for the Killarney Outlook for many years was a hugely respected member of every community he served in.

In a post on Social Media, Killarney Parish expressed their sadness at the news:

Killarney Parish extends our sympathies to Bishop Ray, the family, friends and parishioners & clergy of the Diocese of Kerry on the sudden passing of our colleague and friend Fr Kevin McNamara P.P.

Fr Kevin served in this parish for many years as a curate.

May he rest in the light and peace of the Risen Christ.

Fr. Kevin as he was affectionally was Parish Priest at Glenflesk where he quickly became part of the community since his appointment in July.

In a message on social media, the local community said that "The parish is shocked and deeply saddened with the news of the death of our Parish Priest and President of Glenflesk GAA. Fr Kevin came to our parish in July and in those few short months we came to see his diligence as a worker who sought to dedicate his time and energy towards helping the local community. The future was going to be bright with his plans for upgrading our churches, yet we can only presume God had bigger plans for Fr Kevin. May his soul rest in peace.

Cathaoirleach of Killarney Municipal Area, Marie Moloney also expressed her condolences:

It was with great sadness that I heard of the death of Fr Kevin McNamara, a larger than life character who would always leave you with a smile on your face. Fr Kevin was very popular among his parishioners and indeed in the far broader community, He was always engaging with the people and made a lot of people feel very special. His presence among the people will be greatly missed.

I extend sincere sympathy to his family and friends, to Bishop Ray Browne and all Fr Kevin's clerical colleagues, to his past parishioners and in particular to all the people in Glenflesk Parish. He has now moved on to his eternal reward, May he now Rest in Peace

Killarney Celtic were deeply saddened to learn of the passing earlier today of Fr Kevin McNamara PP Glenflesk, Clonkeen and Barraduff. Fr Kevin was well known and remembered fondly from his time spent in the Killarney Parish and was enjoying his new posting in the Glenflesk area. He will be remembered for his great wit, intelligence and his warm sense of humour. Those of us who encountered Fr Kevin will remember him as a friendly soul and above all a decent man. May he rest in peace.

Speaking to the Killarney Outlook, Danny Healy Rae, TD said "I am very sadened to hear of the untimely passing of Fr. Kevin McNamara RIP he was a very close and dear friend to all my family, we will forever miss him, he was a very special friend of my late Father and he officated at his funeral Mass and as late as last week at him Anniversary Mass in Kilcummin, he was a larger than life person, he did great work for individuals and communities and was so kind and straight with everyone, he is a huge loss to the Community and the County of Kerry. Rest in Peace Fr Kevin"

A close friend of Fr. Kevin McNamara, former Cathaoirleach of the Killarney Municpal Area, Michael Gleeson remembered the man who was known for his wit, commitment and love of his vocation.

"Yesterday in lovely Clonkeen Church I lit two candles in remembrance of Fr Kevin McNamara who died unexpectedly. We had known each other for many years and met regularly, particularly in a leisure centre where we both tried to limit the ravages of the onward march of time.

There are many in Killarney, Gneeveguilla, Kilcummin, Moyvane and Glenflesk who are mourning the passing of Fr Kevin. He was a mixture of rhyming couplets, some bluster and above all affection for his parishioners. He cared deeply and served loyally.

I recall our being in Cooraclare for his Dad's funeral and Kevin's happiness, in the midst of sorrow, that people had come form Kerry to share his grief and offer words of some comfort. He loved his years in Kerry and rejoiced in the many friends that he had made along his Kingdom journey. But his heart and his sporting affiliation lay where it should-in the Banner.

Today and for ever more more, the The Clare Shout will be heard in the Heaven in which he so deeply believed and loyally served.



## Akos designs the new face of Killarney



The new logo for the "Bithsféir Chiarraí" the Kerry Biosphere Reserve has the elements of a Killarney Christmas Tale. Shortlisted from over 30 entries it is the work of Akos Csontos.



Akos Csontos

The father of two is a native of Hungary who 14 years

ago, like hundreds of Killarney people now, made Killarney his home.

Until December 2020 with the pandemic his position became redundant, the in-house graphic designer worked in a five-star hotel close to the national park which always inspired him.

Akos and his wife Julia and six-year-old son Logan and nearly three months old Layla always try to spend as much time as possible in the park and in Muckross.

"Needless to say, I was only delighted to come across the competition details on line and I instantly felt connected with the call," is what Akos said.

The entries for the logo which will help rebrand the 65,000 hectare biosphere radiating from Lough Leane west to the Reeks and east to the Pap, arrived from designers all over the world.

In his design Akos aimed to fit in as much of the core values as possible "while maintaining a clean and modern look".

Three designs were shortlisted by the Kerry Biosphere Management Committee made up of representatives from South Kerry Development Partnership, Kerry County Council and the National Parks and Wildlife Service.

Akos' entry received the thumbs up from the majority of on line voters in October. He gets a cash prize of Euro 500 donated by The Killarney Hotels Group.

The cheerful green and blue logo which he hopes will help heal the devastating events of last year – the woodland fires and the ongoing rhododendron battle - capture the red deer to Killarney Fern to sessile oak and pearl mussel.

The new face of Killarney will wing its way across the world now, but it will also help cement the "bithsféir" in the minds of the 25,000 living in the reserve. "Bith" the old word for world and "beatha" life are after all one term.

## Hopes rise for third level college at Pretty Polly Site



Santa's elves have been working overtime for Killarney in the run up to Christmas it seems. Finally and hopefully, the town may get the green light for a third level college at the former Pretty Polly. The location Polly would be ideal not only as a strategic location but also as an enhancement to that whole area of town, is the thinking.

Councillors are staying very mum on the subject but a private briefing took place last week in which details were sketched.

New regional centres for training and further education are being looked at by Solas, the agency tasked with fuelling Ireland's future. On the cards for Killarney is a new build centre and in all likelihood the college would focus on the broad needs of the tourist industry from accommodation to history, to language teaching.

Broader skills training for other local industries and enterprises would also be looked at.

Tralee Cllr Jim Finucane (FG) who was a long time advocate for a third level college at the iconic St Finan's is the chairman of the Kerry Education and Training Board.

Ambitious new regional centres are being looked at by Solas and both the ETB and the council have been working on attracting the sanction for Pretty Polly, Cllr Finucane confirms.

"A significant amount of work has been done in conjunction with Kerry County Council on this," is what he said.

The 7.4 acre Polly/Sara Lee site – some of it will be used for housing – is "a key site" and is "in a strategic location in Killarney, the Tralee councillor said.

The big difference between it St Finan's is ownership, Jim explained: The Pretty Polly site is owned by the council, whereas the hospital is owned by the HSE. It had been advertised in 2020 for expressions of interest in how it could be developed. But the pandemic scuttled progress and earlier this year, interested bidders withdrew – perhaps luckily now if this comes to fruit.

A third level for Killarney will serve a need and will tie in nicely with the history of the town, not just as a place of beauty but as a place too of learning I- to reference the old "quill and deer and lake" logo for the town. Inisfallen island and its monastic school is where Brian Ború studied and some of the annals were penned .

## Will we yet get to stage the Rose of Tralee in Killarney?



The news that the Tralee Cinderellla Panto was to have be staged at the INEC in Killarney came as a great and welcome surprise. Tralee's Siamsa National Theatre producer Oliver Hurley took the brave step to comply with capacity guidelines last week. Alas and alack that has now changed again and the panto has had to be cancelled altogether.

But is the fact the Tralee event was to be staged in Killarney a signal of greater cooperation between the towns? One can't help recall how some decades ago, when there was a difficulty with the Dome an offer – partly tongue in cheek – was made by the late Maurice O'Donoghue to stage the Rose of Tralee in Killarney. There was shock at the whole idea as back then the two towns jealously guarded their territory.

The offer was politely declined in Tralee. Publicly at least. But behind the scenes there was consternation at Killarney's move on Tralee! Since then there has been much progress in the relationship between the two towns. The roses visit the Killarney Races for instance and it cannot be beyond the bounds of possibility any more that the greatest of Tralee annual events might be broadcast from the lakeside town.

The context of course has changed, and not just because of the pandemic. One of the key elements in the Farranfore to Killarney road improvement will be climate change, sharing of events and the need for connectivity.

Page 64 of the latest National Development plan lists the Farranfore to Killarney road roads project as needing further approval.

Whilst there is no cat fully loose among the pigeons yet, what it does mean is the project will have to be "green proofed" it was explained to me by a senior engineer. The ability of the road to cater for bus and cycle lanes and the rail service to and from the two towns will all be taken into account. But so too will be the need to share facilities and venues under the new carbon conscious world

The Department of Transport has told me that the decision will be taken in the coming months – early 2022.

The N22 Farranfore to Killarney project is included in the NDP under a list of projects which may be taken forward to construction, the Department said.

So when the curtain does finally go up, hopefully – sharing of venues as well as how to get to them will both be important decisive factors.

# PRESIDENT HIGGINS SIGNS PRESIDENTIAL PARDON

FOR MR JOHN TWISS

president Michael D. Higgins has signed a Presidential Pardon at an event in Áras an Uachtaráin for Mr John Twiss, who was executed in Cork Prison on 9 February 1895.

In line with articles 13.6 and 13.9 of the Constitution, the pardon has been granted following a recommendation by Government, which took account of a report by Dr Niamh Howlin which found that the nature and extent of the evidence against Mr Twiss could not safely support a guilty verdict.

The ceremony was attended by the Minister for Justice, Helen McEntee TD. Also in attendance was Ms Helen O'Connor, great grandniece of Mr Twiss, and her family as well as members of the Michael O'Donohoe Memorial Project, a group based in Kerry who have raised awareness of the case and worked with the Department of Justice on the pardon process.

President Higgins said:

"The case of John Twiss has been one of long standing concern for the people of Kerry, Cork and Limerick. Even before his execution, the

Fermoy Town Commissioners wrote to the Lord Lieutenant asking him to exercise his Prerogative of Mercy in a petition accompanied with 40,000 signatures, a very substantial number to collect at that time in rural Ireland. Furthermore, the Governor of Cork Prison and the Prison Chaplain both stated their belief that Twiss was innocent while the Jury in the Coroner's Inquest stated that they believed in Mr Twiss's innocence.

While we at this remove cannot undo what happened, we do have the power to acknowledge that what happened to John Twiss was a great wrong. I am pleased to be able to formally grant a Presidential Pardon to him today, and to at least set the record straight. I hope that my doing so will bring a

sense of closure to his family following almost 127 years. I commend them for their efforts.

I would also like to commend the Michael O'Donohoe Memorial Project for their work to bring the case of John Twiss to public attention and their help in bringing the process of obtaining a pardon to fruition."

The Presidential Pardon is only the sixth such pardon to be granted and the third posthumous pardon. It is just the second occasion on which a pardon has been granted for a case predating the establishment of the State, following the pardon which was awarded by President Higgins to Maolra Seoighe (Myles Joyce) in 2018.





## Golfer Lionel Munn and his connection to Killarney Golf & Fishing Club

Victor Mulcahy looks at the story behind the golfer who lived in Killarney and is buried at Killegy in Muckross

Lionel Oulton Munn 1887-1958.

Lionel O. Munn was born in Londonderry/ Derry in 1887, He took up the game of Golf at a very young age playing at The course known as "North West" in County Donegal. Lionel won his first competition in 1897 at just 10 years of age. Between 1897 and 1906 he won many Club competitions including the Coronation Cup in 1902. He was perfecting his Golf Game during these years.

Lionel's first appearance at Senior representative level was in 1906 when he represented Ulster in what was then the Interprovincial tournament which was played between Leinster and Ulster and he halved his match, played at a course known then as Dollymount, now known as Royal Dublin.

Lionel's phenomenal and meteoric rise in the game of golf was about to commence.

He won the Irish Amateur Close Championship of 1908 at Portmarnock Golf Club, Lionel went on to win that Championship on 4 occasions, the others were in Portrush 1911, Portmarnock 1913 and Hermitage 1914. He was runner-up in 1910 at Dollymount.

Lionel Munn won the Irish Open Golf Championship on 3 occasions, Dollymount 1909 then at Portrush 1910, and finally at Portmarnock 1911.

Lionel Munn studied Law at Dublin University (Trinity), and while there he Helped Dublin University to Win the Irish Senior cup in 1910 and 1911.

Lionel Munn won the South of Ireland Open golf Championship at Lahinch in 1911.

Lionel Munn's relationship with Golf in Killarney began in July 1911 when he and former Killarney resident Lionel Hewson brought a group of golfers known as "The Irish Zingari" (Zingari being the Italian word for Gypsies) to play golf at Killarney Golf Course at Deerpark Killarney, which was situated on what is today part of the main bypass in Killarney, and the Clubhouse is now the building for an Irish Language School.

They loved Killarney and Lord Castlerosse's Hospitality so much that they returned in 1912 and brought with them a very splendid silver cup which they presented to Killarney Golf Club to be played for on an Annual basis, "In commemoration of a pleasant visit of The Irish Zingari in July 1911".

The Zingari Cup was first played for in 1912 and won by a W.J. Madden,

Amongst its winners in the following years were the Brothers W.L.O'Sullivan in 1922 & 1925, and Dr Ivo O'Sullivan of New St. in 1927 & 1931, so whichever brother won it for a third time could keep the Cup permanently.

It was W.L. O'Sullivan who succeeded in 1933 and the Cup has resided in his home, "The Priory" on Muckross Rd. Killarney ever



since. W.L. O'Sullivan is known to us, longer residents of Killarney, as the proprietor of D.F. O'Sullivan's General Stores and Killarney's first ever Supermarket on High St. where Quill's is now located. My thanks to his son Billy for all of this information.

Lionel Munn was first appointed Vice-President of Killarney Golf & Fishing Club in the early 1940s by Lord Castlerosse, who by now had become the 6th Earl of Kenmare as his Father had died in 1941, Lionel Munn remained Vice-President of the Club until his death in 1958.

Lionel Munn joined "The Royal Inniskilling Fusiliers" in 1914 at the rank of Lieutenant and when retired from that regiment in 1922 he had been promoted to the rank of Captain.

Nothing much is known about Lionel Munn until 1929 when he resumed his Golf, and his playing career.

Lionel married Maud St. Leger who was originally from near Doneraile Co. Cork in 1933, Maud had two daughters from her first marriage, she and Lionel did not have any children.

Lionel had quite a record while competing in The British Amateur Open Golf Championship. He first competed in 1908 when he was beaten in the 3rd round at Royal St. George's Sandwich at the 10th tie hole. At Muirfield in 1932 he got to the semi-final. In 1936 at St Andrews, he went out in the 2nd round at the 8th tiehole. In 1937 at his then home course of Royal St. Georges in Sandwich Kent, he went all the way to the final only to be beated by Robert Sweeny of U.S.A. Playing out of St. Andrews. A quirk of fate saw Jimmy Bruen of Cork defeat

the same Robert Sweeny in the final of the same championship in 1946 by a margin of 4/3. He played in The British Open Golf Championship at Prince's Club which was next door to his own Club, Royal St. George's in Kent, England. He came in at tied for 29th place a very credible position but did not win the silver medal as leading amateur, as two other amateur's were ahead of him, the silver medal was won by Tony A. Torrance from Edinburgh. He became the Belgian Amateur Open Golf Champion in 1931 and again in 1932.

Lionel Munn retained Golf Club Membership of a number of Golf Clubs, Royal St. Georges in Sandwich, and Royal Cinque Ports both in Kent. He was an Honorary Life Member at North West, Portmarnock, Castleknock, Lahinch and Killarney.

He was selected to play for the British and Irish team to play in The Walker Cup in 1934 but "was indisposed due to illness and unable to play".

Lionel and Maud continued to live in kent for many years and then they moved to Killarney. They bought what was the old Church of Ireland Rectory in Aghadoe in 1950 and lived out their lives there. Maud passed away in 1954 and Lionel in 1958. Dr William O'Sullivan and Lionel had become very firm friends and Dr Billy was executor of Lionel's Estate when he died.

While residing in Killarney 1950 to 1958, Lionel is remembered as being somewhat reclusive, nobody can remember him playing golf here, but he was a keen fly fisherman and used to tie his own flies.

Local people remember him as "The man with the cats".

Dr Billy O'Sulllivan bought a number of Lionel's vast array of Golf Trophies and donated them as he saw fit to a number of recipients.

Both Lionel and Maud are buried at Killegy in Muckross right beside the The Herbert Monument with the huge Celtic Cross.

Many of Lionel's very fine Trophies can be seen on display in the Trophy display case in the foyer of the Killarney Golf and Fishing Club where they are on loan from John Cahill of Aghadoe, John also gave permission for the use of a photograph which he has in his possession.







Dr William O'Sullivan affectionately and universally known as Dr Billy, was born, reared, married and passed away all in Killarney his Family Home Town. Dr Billy passed away aged 89 in 2000 after a long illustrious and industrious life, which I hope I can do some justice to.



Dr William O'Sullivan Snr was very well known in Political Circles in the Fledging Irish Free State and in a photo taken in 1922 shows him with Michael Collins with the young Dr Billy also in the photo, taken at the back of Inch House.

Dr William O'Sullivan Snr was a very good sportsman in his younger days, He won an Irish International Rugby Cap in 1895 and he was a founder member and player with Dr Croke's Gaelic Football Club here in Killarney, this was prior to the enforcement of the infamous "ban". Dr Billy attended Cork University and while he was in Cork he became great friends with a young man by the name of Jimmy Bruen. Jimmy Bruen went on to win the British Amateur Open Golf Championship in 1946 when he defeated Robert Sweeny from the U.S. Iin the final by 4/3, Robert Sweeny was playing out of St. Andrews Golf Club at that time.

Dr Billy was also a very accomplished Rugby Player, while attending University College in Cork, He Captained their team and in the Season 1934/35, UCC won The Munster Cup in that season. Billy was also given a trial for the Irish team around that time.

Dr Billy represented Ireland as an International golfer from 1934 to 1954 on 68 occasions, amassing 76 International Points the third highest tally only behind Cecil Ewing of Rosses Point, Co. Sligo and the great Joe Carr of Sutton, Co. Dublin.

Dr Billy was a regular entrant in the Irish Open Golf Championship, he was defeated in the 1936 Final by Joe Brown of Waterford. Dr Billy won the 1949 Championship when it was played in Killarney in 1949, Billy defeated Brennie Scannell of Woodbrook in the 36



hole final. In the 1953 Championship, played in Killarney for the second time Dr Billy was defeated by Norman Drew Bangor Golf Club by a very slight margin of 2 Holes in the 36 hole final. His caddie on the day was a very young Michael Guerin who would himself go on to represent Ireland on a number of occasions as an International Golfer. Michael recalls that Dr Billy was severely handicapped on the day with Billy suffering from a crick in his neck and was unable to turn his head as normal.

Dr Billy Played Senior Cup with Muskerry Golf Club for a number of years in the 1940s & 1950s they won the All-Ireland "Senior Cup" in 1946, 1947 and 1953.

In 1955 Dr Billy married Phyllis Scott of Scott's Hotel in College St. they went on to have 5 Children, very sadly their eldest Daughter Norrie passed away 2 years ago.

Dr Billy was President of The Golfing Union of Ireland 1958-60.

Dr Billy was Captain of Killarney Golf & Fishing Club on 3 occasions 1941, 1949, and 1969. Billy's Captains prize in 1969 was won by his great friend Teddy Clifford the Dentist, also from New St.

Dr Billy was the first nominated President of Killarney Golf & Fishing Club 1985 & 1986.

Dr Billy was the driving force behind the changing of Killarney Golf Club from 18 Holes to 36 Holes, each course would have some of the original holes in their eventual make-up. Dr Billy almost single handedly created our magnificent Killeen Golf Course, he got some assistence in the early days of 1967/68 from Golf Course Architect Percy Hawtree, but he finished off the completion by himself. A feat for which we will be eternally thankful, and one that has tested the very best Golfers in the World particularly in the early 1990s. Killeen opened for play in 1972 and Mahony's Point in 1973.

Dr Billy's Wife Phyllis has very kindly loaned some of her specially treasured trophies won by Dr Billy over his long spanning Golf Career and they can be viewed in the display case which is located in the foyer of Killarney Golf & Fishing Club, Clubhouse.

Dr William O'Sullivan was granted Honorary Life Membership of Killarney Golf &Fishing Club in the 1980s and the Roll of Honour read as thus

"In recognition of your magnificent contribution that you made over many years to our Club, both as an International Golfer, and as our three time Club Captain, and as our first nominated Club President in 1985 & 1986. Your untiring involvement in the extension of our course from 18 holes to 36 holes, your involvement is simply immesurable, and our Killeen Course bears many testaments to your prowess as an "Ad-Hoc" Golf Course Architect and Designer" We hereby bestow on you Honorary Life Membership in recognition of the foregoing".

Dr Billy was quoted as saying when he was questioned as to the standards that Killarney was maintaining, Billy said that, "Killarney should never bow the knee to mediocrity!!!!





#### **Muckross Rowing Club**

1921 - Pictured are the winning Muckross Rowing Club Senior and Junior crews at Killarney Regatta in 1921, 100 years ago this year. The family names will be easily recognised with many descendants of the rowers pictured continuing the tradition and family association with Muckross RC today. The strength of the Killarney's rowing tradition and endurance of sport in the town was evidenced in the revival of the regatta from 1920 following apparent disruption between 1914-1919. Regatta records from the time are limited and it is believed the regatta was discontinued during the years that bore witness to World War I, the Irish War of Independence and the Spanish flu. The two crews pictured lived through these most challenging of times and there is a striking parallel with the present day that the men pictured also lived through a global pandemic. There is little doubt that the annual Killarney Regatta and Killarney's rowing rivalry brought some welcome relief and perhaps some sense of normality during a troubled period in Irish history. In the century that has followed, rowing has remained at the centre of sporting tradition in Muckross, which is home to three Irish Olympic rowers and over 30 national championship titles in the modern era.





## FOCUS ON CHRISTMAS HOUSEPLANTS This is the time of year when people

will give and receive gifts of houseplants such as Cyclamen, Azalea, Gardenia, Poinsettia etc. Christmas houseplants obviously give their best

display this time of the year but they have to be kept in the right conditions like the right temperature and humidity level to prolong their lives into the new year and longer.

The conditions of a house environment can be a challenging place for houseplants because of central heating which is very drying to houseplants especially for ones that come from humid tropical parts of the world.

There are several ways to improve conditions for your plants in the house. You can avoid placing them in draughts, especially in places where temperatures will fluctuate from very hot to very cold or in very hot areas like above or beside a radiator. Water your plants by placing them in a container of water for about twenty minutes.

For plants that need more humidity place them on a tray of gravel with some water but make sure that the plant is sitting on the gravel not the water.








## CYBERBULLYING

Cyberbullying refers to bullying which takes place using the internet, mobile phones or other technological devices. This may be in the form of sending nasty or threatening messages, emails or photos, videos or putting such materials up on social media web pages. It can also take the form of setting up fake profiles which say cruel things about an individual or accessing someone's account repeatedly to make trouble for them. Cyberbullying, can be difficult to detect and address and sometimes one may not know who the bully is when they are bullied online. Many people view the internet as 'not reality' - and it gives the illusion of being much more anonymous - thus allowing them to behave in a more aggressive way. Given the wide cyber audience, when a message is posted online, the information can be far-reaching and instantaneous.

If you are being deliberately harassed or bullied online, it is important that you tell someone about it. You can talk to your parents or someone you trust like a teacher or a friend. It can be very upsetting to be deliberately attacked or humiliated online.

The following is a list of some helpful things you can do if this is happening to you

- 1. You can unfriend or block the bully from your site whether it's a mobile phone, social networking site or chat room. No one has to tolerate bullying from another. Online you have the power to unfriend or block people- which removes the bully's power.
- 2. Don't reply. Never reply to a message the bully only gets satisfaction when they receive a response.
- 3. Keep the message. This will give you a record of the messages, dates and times - which may be helpful for reporting.
- 4. Report Problems to your Internet Service Provider or mobile phone provider. Look for the "Report Abuse" button or contact Customer Care. If you consider the cyberbullying to be of a serious nature or potentially criminal then you should contact your local Garda office.


For further protection and to prevent the problem happening again it is important to block unwanted contacts, change your password regularly and report any abuse on the site to mobile operators or social networking providers.


Welcome back dear friend and Happy Christmas. I pray that you would know the Shalom of God that Jesus the Prince of Peace, came to bring to all those who believe in Him (Isaiah 9:6-7). Shalom means complete peace and soundness in every area. God revealed Himself as Yahweh Shalom - The-Lord-Is-Peace, to Gideon who was living in great fear (Judges Chapters 6-8). God turned Gideon from a trembling man into a great warrior and leader through a face to face encounter. God proclaimed His Word over Gideon referring to him as a mighty man of valour, even though that was not the reality. God demonstrated the power in His Word to change circumstances simply by speaking His Truth, which always overrides what the facts

In the natural Gideon felt weak and overwhelmed, but God knew his potential, so He 'called those things that are not as though they already were' (Romans 4:17). God called Gideon into his destiny as an anointed deliverer. It is no different for you and me because "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8). Gideon was terrified because He had a face to face encounter with the Lord, but the Lord reassured Him that it was for peace that He had visited Gideon, not for disaster. Jesus said "you did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit" (John 15:16). God always looks for fruit in our lives. Much of what people are dealing with in the problems they face is fruit from bad decisions they have made in the past, or wounds from the past that they never recovered from. But that's why Jesus came (Isaiah 61:1-3).

We celebrate the birth of Jesus this week, but we cannot celebrate just His birth. The baby grew up! (Read Luke chapter 2) Jesus knew He was anointed to carry out God's plan of Salvation and defeat the works of darkness and curse (1st John 3:8). So you could say that Jesus was born to die, but the Good News is - He didn't remain dead. God raised Him from the dead after Jesus had paid the ransom for our sin with His sinless blood. He took back the authority and dominion that Satan had deceived Adam and Eve into giving him. After he had tricked them into disobeying God, the devil had a free run upon this earth to bring destruction - appointing himself as 'god of this world' (2nd Corinthians 4:4; John 10:10). But God sent His Only Begotten Son to come and save mankind out of His great love for us, because we were hopeless and needed a Saviour (John 3:16).

This Salvation through God's Son Jesus is so easy to receive. And everything in life will change when you receive His love and forgiveness. God longs for you to get to know Him, and to walk with Him through life to fulfil your destiny (Jeremiah 29:11-14). You are not alone. God promises never to leave you or forsake you. He desires to have a face to face relationship with you (Numbers 6:24; Psalm 34:4-9). I pray this Christmas that you feel God's face shining upon you and His peace filling you, in Jesus name, amen.
