

Volunteers are advised to dress appropriately in waterproof gear and and all equipment will be provided.



LOCAL MAN AIMS TO BE TOP OF THE WORLD

Adventurers Mike O'Shea and Clare O'Leary who are hoping they will be the first people to reach the North Pole in four years.

Local Kerry man, Mike O'Shea, is setting his sights high this year. In fact he's hoping to be on top of the world in early 2014 by embarking on an expedition to the North Pole. The expedition itself is part of larger mission called 'The Ice Project', where the aim is to cross as many of the world's icecaps as is possible with the aim of educating children about the world, climate change and getting active themselves.

Along with his expedition

partner, Dr. Clare O'Leary from Cork, Mike is hoping they will be the first people to reach the North Pole in four years and perhaps even more significantly the first Irish explorers in history.

Both Mike and Clare having been preparing themselves for the long walk by already crossing the North Patagonian Icecap in Chile in 2012 and Lake Balikal in Northern Russia in 2013. To get an idea of what the adventurous explorers will be facing here are a few North Pole facts that might help you thinking again about our own 'warm' winters. Temperatures can reach – 60C with only 3 hours daylight, the effort required is the equivalent of two marathons, perhaps because the ice they are walking on is drifting 18 miles a day in the wrong direction, away from the pole, and if that wasn't enough there is always the Polar Bears to avoid.

Mike has a very impressive track record when it comes to having an adventurous spirit starting with climbing the McGillicuddy Reeks at only 13, through to the Alps in Europe, and as recently as last summer where he guided seven Irish groups up Kilimanjaro in Africa.



'CARE TO DRIVE' NOW AVAILABLE TO KERRY CANCER PATIENTS

Irish Cancer Society provides free transport service

A new service for cancer patients who are attending Kerry General Hospital for chemotherapy treatment has been announced. Patients are being encouraged to avail of free transport which is now available to bring them to and from their treatment. The Irish Cancer Society's Care to Drive service offers patients transport from their front door to the door of the hospital and home again which will help to alleviate some of the stress or difficulty associated with getting to their appointments. The service opened in Kerry General Hospital in November



2013. The service is also available to Kerry people who are getting their treatment at Cork University Hospital and the Mercy Hospital Cork, depending on what part of Kerry they come from.

Care to Drive is a volunteer delivered service where the Irish Cancer Society recruits and trains volunteers who give their time free of charge to drive patients to and from



Kerry General Hospital.

hospital. Cancer patients may need to use Care to Drive for a number of reasons: they may have been advised not to drive by their doctor due to the aggressive nature of treatment or the patient may have no family in the immediate vicinity or it may be that family members will be unable to take time off work to transport them to the hospital. The Society currently has over 1000

trained volunteer drivers nationally who are available for those travelling to our partner hospitals for cancer treatment. The volunteers are fully trained and ready to transport patients to their chemotherapy treatments and anyone who is interested in using the service should ask their social worker or oncology nurse in hospital for further details.



Lough Leane Loop Trail Project



Proposals to develop a full looped amenity trail around Lough Leane and Muckross Lake are currently being examined.

As part of this, a steering group, comprising of Fáilte Ireland, the National Parks & Wildlife Service, Kerry County Council and local walking and tourism groups has been established.

The aim of the steering group is to examine the possibility of linking up a number of the existing trail sections to create a full circuit around Lough Leane and Muckross Lake, starting and finishing in Killarney town.

It is proposed that the route will provide accessible trails, both walking and cycling, to a wide range of users, with differing abilities, as it combines a number of different sections to form an overall trail product.

Given the unique landscape and scenery that Killarney, its lakes and the National Park have to offer, this project has the real potential to deliver an internationally renowned and iconic trail.

The project is currently at the design stage, which is being funded by Fáilte Ireland and a Constraints Study is currently underway.

As part of the design and project planning process, a number of Route Options for the proposed trail will be developed. These options will be put out on display later in the year in order to gather the views and opinions of the public in relation to these options.



Access to Killarney Library



"At the January 2014 meeting of Kerry County Council, Michael Gleeson asked that Kerry County Council would make financial provision for the development of graded access to Killarney Library from Rock Road in order to facilitate ease of movement for wheelchair users, people with disability and people

with children in buggies.

Councillor Gleeson stated that the library service is one of the great treasures of our county. The local Library enriches and greatly enhances lives. It should do so in particular for people with disability.

Killarney Library has since its beginning presented difficulties for wheelchair users, people with disability and people with children in buggies as they had to gain access from the rear of the building.

The requested graded pathway from Rock Road would allow all to access the Library freely and with dignity.

Kerry County Council replied that the Kerry Library Service will draw up a proposal for a graded access from Rock Road and that the work will be done during 2014. Councillor Gleeson very much welcomed the reply to his request and asked that the work be done if possible before the busy traffic of the summer commences.

TD opposes closure to Court Houses

Kerry TD Tom Fleming has objected to any proposal to close Court houses at Kenmare, Cahersiveen, Killorglin and Dingle. Deputy Fleming said the closure of any Court house would be of great inconvenience to the citizens of the county and that there will be no savings to the State. The Independent TD called on the Minister for Justice and Equality, in the Dail this week, to take into consideration the excellent submission from the Kerry Law Society.

He has also called on the Justice Minister to increase the number of new Garda Recruits to 1,000.

The Kerry Independent TD said the Minister should take into consideration the fact that no recruits have been taken on for a number of years. The Kerry TD said there has been a drop in the number of full time Gardaí from 334 in 2010 to 297 in 2013. Added to this, Deputy Fleming said a number of Garda Stations have been closed in County Kerry since 2010 and measures should be put in place to combat crime and enforce sufficient security for the residents of the county.

Funding allocated to KCC

€1,431,022 has been allocated to Kerry County Council under the Housing Adaptation Grant Scheme.

This figure is approximately the same amount received by last year, when the grant was reduced by 56%.

Minister Jimmy Deenihan and Senator Marie Moloney have welcomed the grant which will be used to improve accessibility for the homes of the elderly and the disabled.

Save the date! Elections set for May

It's official – Irish citizens go to the polls on 23rd May to decide who will represent them at local and EU level for the next four years. Environment Minister Phil Hogan confirmed the date this week and encouraged voters to make sure they are eligible to vote.

A new register of electors will be published on 1st February and will come into force on 15th February. If you check this register and cannot find your name, it will still be possible to apply for the supplementary register of electors. However, application forms must be received by the registration authority no later than 26th April. Polls will open between 7am and 10pm on the day.



Tyre Life and Age

Tyre Life and Age is influenced by many factors:

Tyres are designed to meet different criteria. Long life tyres are made from a harder compound and may be noisier as a result. Others may be made from a softer compound which are quieter but will wear out quicker. It's often the case too that a car's original tyres will last longer than later replacements.

Tyre life is influenced by several factors:

- · Driving style. For example, aggressive cornering and harsh braking
- Position. Front tyres wear faster because of movement through steering.
- · Speed. High speed driving increases temperature and increases wear.
- · Load. Heavy loading increases wear.
- · Pressure. Both under inflation and over inflation increase wear.
- · Alignment. Incorrect wheel alignment results in rapid and uneven wear.

Generally on a front-wheel-drive car you'd hope for a minimum of 20,000 miles for front tyres, and double that for those on the rear.

The legal minimum limit for tyre tread depth in Ireland is 1.6mm. This is because, tyre performance, particularly in wet weather gets worse as the tread wears down.

The greater the wear to your tyres the worse its wet weather grip will be. Tread depth should be checked more frequently once it reaches 3mm. Tyres should be replaced before their tread depth wears below 2mm. This is especially important if heading into autumn and winter months.

Tyre age:

Age is a separate issue to wear. Tyres deteriorate naturally through exposure to heat, sunlight (Ultraviolet/UV) light and rain. Degradation depends on the amount of exposure and the severity of the weather. This is a more common problem for caravans, trailers and vehicles which are often only used occasionally. In everyday vehicles, tyres almost certainly will wear out before they degrade to such an extent they're unserviceable.

UV cracking tends to occur in tyres that are four or five years old. Tyres should be replaced irrespective of age if cracking becomes severe.

FLU AND FLU-LIKE ILLNESS

WHAT ARE FLU AND FLU-LIKE ILLNESSES? Influenza (flu) is caused by the influenza virus. However, many other viruses can cause an illness similar to flu (flu-like illness). Each winter a different type of influenza virus causes an outbreak of flu which affects many people. This is called seasonal flu..

WHAT ARE FLU SYMPTOMS (OR FLU-LIKE ILLNESS SYMPTOMS)? Common flu symptoms in adults and older children include high temperature (fever), sweats, aches and pains in muscles and joints, a dry cough, sore throat, sneezing, and headache. You may also feel sick. Even if you are young and fit, flu can make you ill enough to need to go to bed. Typically, symptoms are at their worst after 1-2 days. Then they usually gradually ease over several days. An irritating cough may persist for a week or so after other symptoms have gone. Most people recover completely within two to seven days.

HOW DO YOU CATCH FLU? Flu is passed from person to person by droplets created when someone with the infection sneezes or coughs. You can also catch it by touching a surface where the virus has been deposited. Flu can spread quickly in these ways.

WHAT IS THE TREATMENT FOR FLU AND FLU-LIKE ILLNESSES? Your immune system will usually clear viruses that cause flu and flu-like illnesses. Treatment aims to ease symptoms until the infection goes, and to prevent complications.

GENERAL MEASURES: Stay at home as much as possible to prevent passing on the infection. Paracetamol and/or ibuprofen can lower your temperature, and also ease aches and pains. Drink plenty of fluids to prevent dehydration. It is best not to smoke. Decongestant drops, throat lozenges and saline nasal drops may be helpful to ease nose and throat symptoms. **Note:** parents and carers should not use over-the-counter cough and cold medicines in children under 6 years old. There is no evidence that they work and they can cause side-effects such as allergic reactions, effects on sleep or even hallucinations.

ANTIBIOTICS: Antibiotics kill germs called bacteria, but not viruses. Therefore, they are not routinely prescribed for viral illnesses such as flu or flu-like illnesses. However, they may be used if a complication develops like a chest infection caused by a germ (bacterium) or pneumonia (see below).

ADMISSION TO HOSPITAL: A small number of people with flu become ill enough to need hospital admission. This is usually because they have developed complications from flu.

DR SARAH JARVIS TALKS ABOUT FLU & FLU VACCINE: What are the possible complications of flu and flu-like illnesses? If you are normally well then you are unlikely to develop complications. You are likely to recover fully. However, complications are more likely to develop if you are in any of the at-risk groups listed below. The most common complication is a chest infection caused by a germ (bacterium). This may develop in addition to the viral infection (that is, a secondary infection **Note:** with flu or a flu-like illness it is common to have a cough that lingers for 1-2 weeks after other symptoms have gone. Green sputum does not necessarily mean that you have a secondary chest infection. The symptoms to look out for that may indicate a secondary chest infection include a recurrence of a high temperature (fever), worsening of cough, shortness of breath, fast breathing, and chest pain. Other complications that sometimes occur include a sinus infection and an ear infection.

WHO SHOULD BE IMMUNISED AGAINST THE SEASONAL FLU VIRUS? Seasonal flu is the strain of flu virus that arrives in Ireland each autumn. The actual strain varies from year to year. A new vaccine (often called the flu jab) is developed each year to protect against the strain that is most common that year. The flu vaccine will protect 7-8 out of 10 people against infection with flu. This protection lasts for around one year. The flu vaccine has also been shown to reduce the risk of developing a complication from flu, especially in the elderly.

VACCINATION IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED FOR Persons aged 65 and over, Those with a long-term medical condition such as diabetes, heart or lung disease, People whose immune system is impaired due to disease or treatment, Very obese people (body mass index (BMI) over 40), Pregnant women (can be given at any stage of pregnancy), Residents of nursing homes and other long stay institutions, Healthcare workers, Carers,

People with regular close contact with poultry, water fowl or pigs. If you are healthy, aged under 65 and do not fall into any of the above categories, then you do not need immunisation against seasonal flu. This is because you are unlikely to develop complications from flu.

Bullying

Bullying is defined as the tendency of individuals or groups to use persistent aggressive or unreasonable behavior against an individual. It can take different forms including physical, verbal, cyber, social and mental bullying.

There is a common misbelief that the victim of bullying somehow brings bullying on themselves. Some victims wrongly believe that if they were stronger or different in some way then they wouldn't be bullied. But I cannot stress strongly enough that anyone can be a target of bullying and the responsibility for bullying always lies with the bully. There are many reasons why people are targeted by bullies and these can vary from personality characteristics to personal vulnerabilities. People can be targeted by bullies because of physical features, an illness or disability, sexual orientation religious or cultural beliefs or belonging to a particular racial group.


Bullies often bully as a means to exert power over others and to make themselves feel better. They are most likely doing it as a way to deal with their own problems, insecurities and low self-esteem. And not because of anything you've done. No one deserves to be bullied and it should not go unchallenged. Dealing with bullying can be tough yet it is really important to do something about it.

If you are being bullied - verbally, physically, socially, psychologically or online - telling someone about it and seeking advice can help. There is nothing weak about reporting a bully or getting advice and just confiding in someone can help to lighten your load. If you don't feel you can talk about it out loud or face to face, then write it down in a letter or an email. Many bullies want attention so ignoring them or walking away is your best bet. Be assertive and confident; adopt a 'Don't mess with me attitude' (even if you are trembling inside). It is important to not take anything bullies say to heart. Show them that their words have no effect on you. Some bullies may be jealous of you because of your success or popularity - so be proud of who you are. Over the next few weeks we will look at workplace bullying, cyber bullying and how we can deal with these.

Munster's Keith Earls did receive a heavy blow to the knee but despite the early concerns the scan results came back positive with the Irish international only being ruled out for six to eight weeks allowing him sufficient time to be back to play

against Toulouse in the quarter final.

After being reduced to fourteen men on the stroke of half time following a head butt by Cornell Du Preez, Edinburgh seemed to lose interest and Munster were glad to take full advantage. After being introduced in the first half following Keith Earls knee injury, Simon Zebo brought a spark to the Munster backline that had been missing his absence with Connor Murray crossing for a third try on the 44th minute following a storming midfield break by Tommy O`Donell. With Zebo and Laulala linking up with extreme potency the Munster midfield seemed to be making in roads on the Edinburgh's defence at will and the Munster men didn't have to wait too much longer for the all important fourth try. Following more good forward play at the lineout, Munster's patience came to fruition when O`Mahony blasted the Scottish defence to dive over the line and send the Thomand crowd into wild celebrations. The dream of another cup journey is now well under way, with the fourth try securing a home quarter final berth. Zebo dived over in the left hand corner for Munster's fifth try and his ninth in sixteen European appearences a record up there with the best of European wingers. Zebo's try was just reward for a performance which sent a message out destined for a certain Mr Schmidt who had excluded him from the provisional six nations squad. The scoring was completed in the 76th minute when Felix Jones crossed the whitewash for Munster's six score with Ian Keatley adding the extra's to cap off a complete team performance. Let the ticket scramble commence for the home quarter final.

RUGBY NEWS IN BRIEF

Keith Earls has signed on for a further two years with Ireland resulting in the Limerick native remaining with Munster until the summer of 2016.

Munster`s Peter O`Mahony and Paul O`Connell have been nominated for ERC`s player of the year along with fellow Irish internationals Sean Cronin and Cian Healy. Simon Zebo has been added to the Irish squad as injury cover for Keith Earls.

DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING DAY:

Just to prove the above statement - I am also late with the news - January 20th was the date of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr's birthday and Monday last was a national holiday in the US in his honour.

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. became one of the most revered social-justice advocates in history by helping African-Americans win legal equality in the United States. And while those victories will likely always be what Mr. King is best remembered for, his love for others and his advocacy for their rights went far deeper than skin colour. Mr. King also fought for workers' rights. And one of his closest mentors, civil-rights activist Bayard Rustin, was gay—and keep in mind, this was in the early 1960s. Mr. King's pursuit of justice extended to all disadvantaged people, because, as he maintained, "Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere."

Carrying his torch, his widow, Coretta Scott King, along with his son Dexter Scott King and friend Rosa Parks, went on to advocate for disadvantaged species. Ms. Parks went vegetarian, Mr. King's widow and son went vegan, and they all became

passionate advocates for the inherent rights of animals to be free from persecution, subjugation, and abuse.

They and many other civil-rights advocates, including Archbishop Desmond Tutu, Paul McCartney, Russell Simmons, Alice Walker, Nelson Mandela, César Chávez, Joan Jett, Bill Clinton, Ellen DeGeneres, Rev. Al Sharpton, and Sen. Cory Booker, realized that if we are going to advocate for an end to injustice, we have to stop being unjust to anyone—and that includes animals.

If we have learned anything from the past, it is that we can't pick and choose who we think deserves justice and who doesn't. As Dr. King said, "Whatever affects one directly, affects all indirectly."

If we are to honour Dr. King, we must continue to seek justice for everyone who is disadvantaged. We must be determined, and brave. We must bear in mind Mr. King's words "In the end, we will remember not the words of our enemies, but the silence of our friends." And thus, until all injustice is ended, we must never be silent.

One of his lessons was to always help others. Do something for someone else. It doesn't have to be a big thing or too time consuming, just do something; take something to a charity shop, go and visit some home bound seniors and help them with chores or errands or even take the time to just talk and listen to their stories. Teach somebody who doesn't know about Dr. King's legacy and great work by sharing stories of what he did. If these are children, read them stories, or search the internet for information and news clips on Dr. King.

Plant something or nurture something. In addition to seeking social and economic justice for all, Dr. King advocated for environmental justice and worked on urban environmental and public health issues that were so prevalent in urban areas. While you can certainly get involved in an organized planting or cleanup project, you can also beautify your own environment or part of your local community in his honour at any time of the year.. Not only by planting flowers, but by planting healthy food, or nurturing a neglected garden.

Martin Luther King is best remembered for his words "I Have a Dream" what are you doing to make your own dream happen? Make a step-by-step plan, break it into small and doable steps and take the first step now.

DID YOU KNOW

Many young women in Kyrgyzstan are currently falling victim to a practice of bride-kidnapping, in which a man sets out to kidnap a woman of his choice and force her into marrying him. Because of a general lack of awareness on the issue, as well as traditional customs which discourage victims from reporting the crime, kidnapped women often feel that they have no choice but to submit to their abductor's will. Distressed by their fate, many women have even been driven to suicide, and yet the practice continues to this day.

Though bride-kidnapping is outlawed, the Country Report for Human Rights Practice states that as many as 12,000 cases of bride-kidnappings occur each year in Kyrgyzstan, sometimes with girls as young as 14. Any attempts at rejecting the marriage or escaping are nearly impossible, as victims of bride-kidnapping are taken into the abductor's village and held captive by the locals until they "consent" to the marriage. The longer she refuses, the more chances she will stay overnight, which is often seen to others as their "consummation of marriage." As a result, escaping after having consented to the marriage or after an extended period of time will only earn her reproach from her community.

Laws alone are not enough to stop this practice. The Kyrgyz Republic needs to act now, and give these women the resources they need to combat this practice. Take a stand now toward womens' rights and demand that the government of Kyrgyzstan implement methods to enforce current policies.

When natural disasters happen, many people rush to express their support through social media, publicly sending digital thoughts and prayers to survivors or posting inspiring headlines. Some text donations to the rescue agencies. These have become the common responses to disasters that claim dozens of lives and destroy hundreds of others. And yet, even as the world is becoming more aware of disasters through near instantaneous media coverage—and asks what role climate change may play in their frequency—there is, simultaneously, a growing industry in which vacationers experience hi-tech simulated disasters for fun.

For instance a new theme park in China is set to open in 2016, and its chief attraction will be a €165 million (approx.) simulated experience of being on the Titanic as it sinks into icy waters. Disaster tourism is nothing new, as early as the 1820s, Americans were visiting the site of a landslide in New Hampshire to "put themselves in the landscape of death." At Coney Island in the early 1900s, you could watch a tenement building burning down, complete with faux rescuers saving faux victims from a fiery death. For many years, Universal Studios in Orlando has been entertaining vacationers with a tornado ride that promises you'll find out what it's really like to go through

a tornado. The ride is tied to the 1996 movie Twister, but the park promises that the experience is just like a "real" tornado.

If you're looking for a quicker, cheaper disaster fix, there are now "hurricane simulator" machines at arcades nationwide in the US. Standing in a large cylinder that resembles a phone booth (remember those?), you can get pummeled by wind for a few minutes for a "real" hurricane experience.

The earliest examples involved bearing witness to a particular event and feeling compassion for those who suffered. The newer incarnations of disaster tourism are all about immersive, multimedia experience, but they pull out the physical aspects (stunningly high winds! shaking ground! sinking ship!), and present them as experiences divorced from emotional impact. It may seem strange that at a time when we react with such empathy to disaster victims, we also have an industry that turns their horror into fun.

How is it possible that people are on one day posting about sending prayers to disaster victims as though we know them personally and the next day spending money to "experience" the disaster ourselves.

DOG OPERATED WASHING MACHINE:

A new washing machine has been invented which can be controlled by dogs to help their disabled owners. The Woof to Wash machine has a knotted rope door handle for the dog to pull with its mouth, a paw print button to turn it on and a voice-activated switch so it starts a cycle when the dog barks.

The dog is trained to take clothes one at a time from the basket to the washer by

UK Appliance firm JTM Service made the machine to help disabled people live a more independent life. Made in partnership with Miele, the machine automatically dispenses the right amount of washing liquid.

The dogs are trained by national charity Support Dogs to strip beds, fill laundry baskets, load washers and now bark on demand too.

A STORE LETS YOU PAY WITH YOUR TALENT:

If you've got some mad dance skills, or even just some mediocre ones, you can purchase a variety of goods at The Merit Shop in San Francisco.

The mobile store allows patrons to pay for items such as candy, clothes, crayons, and even iPods with talent instead of cash. Singing a song, reciting a poem, telling a joke, and drawing a picture are all among the acceptable forms of currency at the store that refers to itself as "the little corner shop of anarchy."

The Merit Shop is based on the belief that not everybody has money, but everybody

has talent. It's a way of rethinking how culture uses money as a divider-classifying those who have it as worthy, while those who don't are often viewed as inadequate or inconsequential.

Daniel Soares, one of The Merit Shop's co founders, says that what started out as a collaborative art project was inspired by San Francisco's massive income divide. We never saw so many homeless people before and that was our thought starter, even though it is intended for all the people. Mr. Soares and his group have been purchasing the store's stock using their own money, but their goal is to pair with sponsor companies to supply those goods to keep their shop going. The shop is more interested in people than it is in profits and the joy it brings to its customers is immeasurable.


