




Killarney Bids Farewell TO FR. TIDY

Fr. Michael Murphy's friend and fellow Tidy Towns Volunteer, **Cllr. Michael Gleeson** looks back at his life in Killarney

ichael Murphy retired from his position as Parish Priest of Kenmare and Archdeacon of Aghadoe in 2004 and shortly thereafter came to live in Cathedral Place, Killarney. He came with a rich pedigree of environmental achievement, having guided both Sneem (1987) and Kenmare (2000) to become overall National Tidy Towns winners.

Very soon after his arrival the Killarney Looking Good committee invited Fr Michael (this was how he preferred to be known) to become one of its members and he responded positively to the request. The committee knew that they had made a wonderful 'signing'.

Killarney people had for a number of years been working hard to enhance the appearance of their prime tourist town. The Looking Good members knew that litter strewn streets and unkempt approach roads presented a poor image of their special place. Strong action was needed and inspirational leadership was required.

Fr Michael never assumed a role as Chairperson or Secretary but became the exemplar who led from the front. He went out almost daily to gather up the litter on the footpaths and roadways near where he lived. No plastic gloves for this son of the soil; simply bend the back and pick up the rubbish left by some heedless passer- by. Sometimes we feared for his health but he seemed immune to infection or disease.


There was no rest for this man in the war that he waged on degradation and

when one location was improved, he quickly brought the attention of the volunteers and Council staff to another place that needed elbow grease and a sharp hoe.

In the year 2011 the supreme prize of Killarney being named Ireland's National overall winner was realised. Fr Michael had achieved his trinity of triumphs. His joy was complete and the people of Killarney rejoiced and were grateful. This great man's motto - Just Do It - had inspired and borne rich fruit. But there was no resting on laurels. His work with the Looking Good committee and also with An Meitheal continued. Ever onwards for this visionary who always sought to make our world a better place for local and visitor.

Fr Michael's final years were, following a most unfortunate accident, spent in a Nursing Home. He accepted his fate and never complained. He maintained his enthusiasm for the welfare of Killarney and frequently mentioned jobs that needed to be done. He loved to attend special occasions and it was my great privilege to welcome him to the annual Killarney Looking Good awards evening in November. It was a fitting setting for all to salute a man who had inspired us to make Heaven's Reflex a place worthy of its title.

May Fr Michael now enjoy, in an even better Heaven, the rich fruits of his dedication and leadership.



LEADERS GATHER

FOR KILLARNEY ECONOMIC CONERENCE

CONOMIC, civic and political leaders from Ireland, the UK and Europe will gather in Kerry today for the third annual Killarney Economic Conference.

The highly-anticipated event, at The Brehon in Killarney, will see former Taoiseach, Bertie Ahern, reflecting on the Good Friday Agreement and the likely impact of Brexit on the future of Northern Ireland.

The former Fianna Fáil leader will also share his views on the way forward for the North-South relationship.

Green Party leader Eamonn Ryan will take time out from the campaign trail to join in the debate and also in attendance will be Carwyn Jones, the former First Minister of Wales. Brexit is once again on the agenda, with key discussions based on its impact on Northern Ireland and Ireland's economic and diplomatic relationship with Germany in a post Brexit world.

Other topics for discussion include sustainable rural development and protecting the family business in the rapidly changing economy.

HUGH O'FLAHERTY SOCIETY SCALE DOWN ACTIVITIES

Collowing a highly successful 12 years promoting the good work of Hugh O'Flaherty, the memorial society has decided to scale down their activities.

When the society was formed in 2008 it set itself a number of key objectives which have now been achieved.

These included erecting a permanent memorial in Killarney, presenting a Humanitarian Award in the Monsignor's memory, increasing awareness of his humanitarian work through School Programmes/Student Projects and supporting related activities in the Media & the Arts.

Speaking this week, Chairperson of the Society Jerry O'Grady said, "Over the last 12 years, with the greatly appreciated invaluable support of our Patrons & Friends and helped by some fund raising events, all of these objectives have been achieved and indeed much, much more in terms of commemorating his life in places like Tralee, Cahersiveen and in the Collegio Teutonico in Rome. In Killarney in 2013, the members of Killarney Town Council dedicated a new road to his memory and important places associated with his life in Killarney, such as his school and his home were identified by the Society with appropriate plaques. Tralee Town Council oversaw similar work in Tralee,

his first home in Kerry. On the 50th anniversary of his death, October 30th 2013, a widely acclaimed bronze memorial was unveiled on Mission Road in Killarney. Contrary to a media opinion piece some months ago, we are happy to hear first hand from the National Tidy Towns Adjudication representative that they are more than happy with the manner in which the Monsignor is commemorated in his home town, which they view in a very positive way". Following the 2018 Memorial Weekend which marked a decade of Humanitarian Awards, the Society Committee met in early 2019 to review its activities and for a number of reasons such as resources, costs, logistics etc., a decision was taken to reduce the future Programme of Activities after the 2019 Humanitarian Award Ceremony.

Jerry O'Grady said, "Because June 4th 2019 marked the 75th Anniversary of the Liberation of Rome and the effective end of the Rome Escape Line, we decided to hold the 2019 Commemoration at that time. We also felt that as this would be the last Humanitarian Award for the foreseeable future, it was most appropriate to use the opportunity to acknowledge the incredible selfless sacrifice made by members of the Irish Defence Forces over the previous 60 years in their peacekeeping humanitarian missions with the UN – during which time 86

He added, "For the foreseeable future the Memorial Society will be confining its activities to continued interaction with Primary Schools in terms of competitions and, with students at 2nd and 3rd Levels as a resource for projects, dissertations etc. Also, we will continue to promote the Monsignor's story through the Media and the Arts. 

THE PENSION GAP

The issue of the retirement gap is one which comes up regularly from employers and has attracted much attention lately due to it being spotlighted in the election campaign on the back of the recent increase of the state pension age from 65 to 66, and the impending further increases to 67 and 68 in 2021 and 2028 respectively. This has resulted in some individuals having to avail of jobseekers benefit after retiring on their 65th birthday.

What employers need to be aware of:

There is no single fixed mandatory retirement age for employees in Ireland.

Employers should ensure that contracts of employment include a provision in respect of retirement. Where no retirement age is specified, it will be very difficult for the employer to defend a claim of discrimination if an employee can point to other employees who have remained in employment.

An employer is lawfully entitled to set individual retirement ages in the contract of employment. Additional contracts after retirement age can be an option.

The retirement age you set in an employment contract needs "to achieve a legitimate aim" and the means of achieving the aim should be appropriate, necessary and objectively justified. Some examples of these reasons:

- To create opportunities in the labour market
- Health and safety concerns for the public and employees
- · Encouraging recruitment and promotion of younger people
- Motivation through the increased prospect of promotion
- Preserving the dignity of older workers
- Intergenerational fairness












Complete the CAO application form thoroughly as the closing date looms large



Go online at www.cao.ie and click on "Apply" to open your CAO Account. Enter your personal details. Tick the qualifications and assessment section(s) that are relevant to you. Enter your payment option - Credit/Debit card or Fee Payment Form. If you are paying by credit/ debit card you will be redirected to a payment screen. Create your own account password. Click on "Proceed with application" to obtain your CAO application number and your application details will appear on screen.

Log into "My Application" by entering your CAO application number, date of birth and password. Provide the additional personal information. If you are applying on the basis of Leaving Cert (1985-2020) results enter the name and address of your second level school(s) and the years attended. If you are a Leaving Cert 2020 candidate tick the box provided. If you have previously sat the Leaving Cert, provide the year(s) in which you sat the exam and your exam number(s).

Add your Level 8 and Level 7/6 course choices by 1st Feb. by clicking on "Add Level 8 course choices" and/or click on "Add Level 7/6 course choices." You may apply for a maximum of ten course choices on each list. List your courses based on genuine order of preference.

If you intend to apply for a college grant, indicate this on your CAO online application form. CAO will then provide your identification, contact and offer/acceptance details to the grant authority, Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI).

If you wish to apply for an National University of Ireland (NUI) exemption, click the "Modify NUI Exemption Status" button and follow the instructions. CAO will then provide your identification and contact details to the NUI. This will allow the NUI to verify your CAO application number and provide CAO and the colleges with your

exemption details.

If you wish to disclose a Disability/Specific Learning Difficulty (SLD) and to apply to the Disability Access Route to Education (DARE) click the "Modify Disability/SLD and DARE Application Status" button and follow the instructions provided. If you wish to apply for the Higher Education Access Route (HEAR), a third level alternative admissions scheme for school leavers from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds who are resident in the Republic of Ireland, click the "HEAR Application" button and follow the instructions provided.

Check your course choices immediately via the "My Application" facility to ensure that they are correct. Use the online change courses facility on the CAO website if you need to amend or add courses. This facility is free of charge until 1st Feb. You may also use the online change of course choices facility from 5th February to 1st March (fee €10).

"Apply" is user friendly and secure and allows you to submit your application from the privacy of your own home.

MORE GARDA RESOURCES

needed in Kerry to tackle drugs - Moriarty

Fianna Fáil General Election candidate for Kerry Cllr. Norma Moriarty has outlined a series of measures to increase the powers and resources of local Gardaí in the fight against drugs.

"Unfortunately, Kerry is not immune to the scourge of drugs and related crime. It has seeped into too many communities in the county in the past few years and far too many families and young people have been affected," she said.

"The illegal drugs trade has been allowed to fester and grow at the same time as local Garda numbers were being depleted. Not enough is being done to support our local gardaí in preventing an escalation of this criminality, and we are failing to steer young people away from drug use.

"Not only have local garda numbers been cut, numbers in specialised garda units were also slashed by Fine Gael who have just buried their heads in the sand about the impact of the drugs epidemic on all communities. The entire nation has been left horrified by the brutal murder of a teenager in Drogheda last week. This is a symptom of an escalating drugs and gang



problem across this country that will continue to worsen unless we see radical action from our politicians.

"The fact of the matter is that all sectors of society and every user must bear responsibility for gangland deaths and the terror inflicted on communities by the drugs trade. Fianna Fáil has called for a national education and awareness

campaign to bring home to "recreational" users the role they play in gangland criminality.

"We need to see a significant increase garda numbers both here in Kerry and nationally. The force needs to stand at 16,000 gardaí across the country. Gardaí must be resourced to operate 24-hour around the clock surveillance of the gang leaders that are controlling the sale and supply of drugs in our communities. They know who they are – they just need the resources to monitor them.


"We also need to strengthen the laws around jailing gang criminals, giving gardaí the same powers with gang criminals as they have with the Provisional IRA. This would allow the "belief" of a Chief Superintendent that someone was involved in gangland crime to be introduced into evidence.

"The unavoidable fact is that there would be no drugs trade without the drug users. We need to target young people that are particularly at risk of being lured by drugs and the associated criminality", concluded Cllr. Moriarty.

REGULATIONS ON ERECTION OF ELECTION POSTERS

Kerry County Council is advising candidates for the forthcoming general election of the legislative requirements in relation to the erection and placement of election posters.

Election candidates are reminded that under Section 95 of the Road Traffic Act 1961, it is an offence to attach any sign or poster to any road traffic sign or pole. Traffic/road signs are specifically designed to be clearly read by passing motorists. Election posters attached to road signs can obstruct or obscure the sign making it difficult to read. In addition, Kerry County Council is advising against candidates hanging banners and posters from road overbridges and pedestrian bridges as they could become loose or be interfered with by third parties and could fall onto moving traffic.

The council is also asking candidates and their representatives to ensure that election posters are sited so they do not obstruct the view of traffic and pedestrians on public roads.

Under law, all election posters must bear the name and address of the printer of the posters.

Following polling day, candidates have seven days to remove all election posters and signage, as set out in statute. Candidates are also asked to remove cable ties which are often left behind when posters are removed, and which are unsightly and constitute litter.



Brassil calls for exclusive senior IDA executive to be appointed for Kerry

South West records just 37% growth compared with 86% in the South East



Speaking as IDA figures show a growth of just 37% in IDA supported companies in the South West region compared with an 86% increase in the South East of the

country, Brassil says that Kerry is depending

on scraps from the IDA table.

Brassil has also called for further clarification as to what is happening with the Central Pharma project in the Kerry Technology Park, a jobs announcement that was made by the IDA over 12 months ago.

"Kerry needs its own senior executive from the IDA with special responsibility for attracting companies and jobs to Kerry. Dublin is overheating at the expense of counties like Kerry. Unbalanced economic growth has been allowed to develop resulting in two separate economies on the one island.

"What we are seeing is a two tier recovery. We need to send a clear message to Fine Gael that Ireland doesn't end at the Red Cow roundabout. Kerry is not seeing the same benefits as the East of the Country. That is clearly spelt out in the IDAs

"Some 40% of Ireland's population live in the greater Dublin area. This is a dangerous trend for the future economic growth of the country as a whole.

"The presence of large multinational companies like Kerry Group, DairyMaster, JRI, Aspen Grove and Fexco show that Kerry is perfectly poised to become a powerhouse of job creation, culture and growth. We need a new focus from the IDA and the Kerry business and political community need to come together to exert this pressure on the IDA.

More than 3,500 children waiting on orthodontic appointments in Kerry & Cork

Fianna Fáil TD for Kerry John Brassil says the number of children and young people on waiting lists for orthodontic assessment and treatment across Kerry and Cork is shocking.

Figures released to Fianna Fáil reveal that 2,170 young people are waiting on orthodontic treatment across Cork and Kerry, with a further 1,496 waiting for an assessment.

Deputy Brassil said, "I am absolutely appalled by these latest figures, which merely confirm the dire situation that Fine Gael has left our health system in. It's appalling that there are now more than 3,500 children and teenagers waiting for an appointment, but worse is the fact that so many of them are waiting years to be seen. There are 162 under 18s waiting more than three

"Staffing is most definitely a factor. There are only two consultant orthodontists covering all of Cork and Kerry. There is no way that that is sufficient to cope with the demand on services – and these figures are clear evidence of this.

"I have real concerns about the outcomes for these kids and teenagers.



Based on these figures, a 14 year old needing orthodontic intervention could be 17 or 18 by the time they get called for an appointment. That is simply unacceptable. These should be routine appointments.

"Fine Gael has utterly failed in health - record trolley figures, spiralling outpatient waiting lists and serious deficiencies in services for children and teenagers. Despite record investment in health, services have never suffered as badly - and this is solely down to Fine Gael mismanagement. Things are getting worse instead of better and all patients in Kerry and across the country are suffering", concluded Deputy Brassil.



USING **SEAT BELTS**AND CHILD RESTRAINTS

Seat belts are your best protection in the event of a collision and it is especially important that any child in your vehicle is protected by a safety restraint suitable for their size and weight. By law, any child under 150cms or 36kgs must be fitted with the appropriate child car seat when travelling in a car or a goods vehicle. It is not a legal requirement to use a child car seat in a Taxi or Bus but seatbelts must be worn if fitted. Please click here to view the recommended safety restraint for your child's height and weight. Child car seats are best placed in the back seat of your vehicle. There is no law against children sitting in the front seat, as long as they are using the right child restraint for their height and weight, however it is illegal to use a rearward-facing child car seat (e.g. those used for babies up to 10kg) in the front of a car if the seat is protected by an airbag.

Roadworthiness and seat belt maintenance

It's important to keep up the maintenance of your vehicle's

seat belts both in order to fulfil roadworthiness requirements for vehicle testing and for occupants' safety. You should routinely inspect all seat belts in your vehicle, checking that:

- they are not cut or badly frayed
- they operate correctl y- when pulled out fully, they should retract automatically
- the buckles work properly

If a belt is damaged in any way or does not operate correctly, you should replace or repair it without delay at your local garage or an authorised dealer. Check to see if your seat belt has an 'e' or 'E' mark, meaning it meets with the EU regulations. If no markings can be found, your vehicle manufacturer or local authorised dealer should be able to tell you if your seat belts are compliant. For retro-fitting of belts, you should contact an authorised dealer for your particular make of vehicle.



WINTER EYE HEALTH

Driving in winter

In winter you may have more difficulty seeing clearly because of darker evenings .When it is dark your pupils become larger to let in more light. However this can results in your vision becoming more blurred. This is why you may be more reliant on your glasses at

The glare of a low-lying sun can also make it more difficult to see, so make sure your windscreen is clean. both inside and out. It is useful to have a pair of polarised sunglasses in the car to help with the glare from the sun, even in winter.

If you already have dry eyes, central heating may make them worse. Here are some simple steps you can take to minimise the discomfort caused by dry eyes in winter:

- · Lower the temperature in rooms when possible.
- · Blink more often.
- Use a humidifier. Opening windows for a few minutes on cold days will also help.
- Lubricants. Certain lubricating eye drops may be helpful for you.

Increased screen time

People tend to stay in and watch more television and spend more time using computers during the winter. Using a screen will not damage your eyes but prolonged use can make your eyes tired and dry. Remember to take breaks and operate the 20:20:20 rule; every 20 minutes, take a 20-second break and focus your eyes on something at least 20 feet away.

In cold and windy conditions, many people complain that their eyes water more than normal. Wearing glasses will provide protection against the wind, even if you don't usually wear them outdoors.

Winter sun

Snow and ice are reflective, so the sun's damaging UV rays can reach your eyes from below as well as above. UV exposure is cumulative, so although you may not feel any immediate effects, you could be putting yourself at risk of longterm damage and risk cataracts and age-related macular degeneration (AMD) if you don't wear good quality sunglasses or goggles.

DAVID CLIFFORD IS KERRY CAPTAIN

With East Kerry as County Champions having the right to nominate the Kerry captain, with respect to Jack Sherwood and Kerry panel newcomers Paudie Clifford and Ronan Buckley, the armband was always likely to be going to Fossa's David Clifford. The first Fossa man to captain a Kerry team, David has won two All Stars in his two years playing senior for Kerry, as well as two Minor All Irelands and a Hogan Cup with St. Brendans. He has also won County Championships at U16, Minor, U21, and Senior.

David himself is very proud to be nominated, but isn't going to allow it to distract from his focus. "I'm very grateful to my East Kerry teammates for the chance to captain Kerry. It's a huge honour for myself, my family, and my club. There are already very powerful leaders in our dressing room so they are going to keep doing what they are doing. I can't be changing my own game too much, but I suppose I will be a bit of a liaison between the team and management. It's all about the team."

"We would have some regrets after losing the replayed All Ireland Final to Dublin last year. In a way it was great to have the County Championship. Of course we are all looking forward to the year ahead, but right now our only focus is on Dublin next Saturday night and then we will concentrate on the League."

"The application of the new rules is going to be interesting. It will be tough for referees, but it might not make as big a change as people might think. As time goes on we will see."

For those intellectual giants among us who think that no Kerry player has ever lifted Sam Maguire as captain while wearing no. 13 (because piseoga are far more important than such mundane things as effort as skill) I will point out that nor has any Kerry captain ever

done so while wearing 9 or 7.

David is the first East Kerry nominee for the county captaincy since Seamus Moynihan in 2000 – given that the Shronedraugh warrior lifted the Munster Cup and the Sam Maguire and was named Footballer of the Year back then, in might be a good omen!

David might also be the last Kerry captain to be nominated by the county champions. The right of the County Minor Champions to select the minor captain was changed last year and a similar motion regarding the senior captaincy goes before the Kerry County Board at next Monday's Monthly Meeting.

At SouthWest Counselling Centre we are meeting more and more elderly people who are feeling isolated and alone. What strikes me is that whilst there is a lot of emphasis on help and support for younger people there is less awareness of the availability of supports for older people. As we all know, life is an on-going journey that can present challenges at any stage along the way. Bereavement, loneliness, declining health, fear of crime and loss of loved ones through emigration are issues that many older people are dealing with. Counselling can provide a clear space to do this and offers support and gives us a fresh perspective on things.

Many older people are feeling lonely and isolated due to a lack of social contact and connection. Social isolation has been shown to have a detrimental effect on health and wellbeing. It is vital therefore that we stay connected, and whenever possible reach out to others and remain actively involved in life. As social beings, most of us feel the need for social contact and relationships. Therefore I would encourage someone who is feeing lonely to establish what opportunities for social connection already exist in their community. It doesn't matter initially whether they get anything out of the actual activity, as they may meet someone of like mind and it is a great opportunity for social connection.

There are many activities in which they can join. Adult education classes can be a great way to meet like-minded people whilst also acquiring new skills. They can also help to boost our confidence and make social interaction more pleasurable. Getting involved in Community Action Groups, Local History Groups or Sporting Activities can all be very enjoyable. Participating in local church activities, organised outings or book clubs can also help to feel more connected to others. Treating ourselves to massage or reflexology can also help to relieve loneliness. Another useful activity is letter writing, perhaps for a worthy cause - such as Amnesty International. Technology forums such as the internet may provide relief from boredom and loneliness. Perhaps you could enlist the help of a young person to learn these skills. If you are feeling lonely, reach out and talk to someone today.


