# LETTER TO THE EDITOR

A Chara,

Some months ago I placed a Motion on the agenda for a meeting of Kerry County Council calling on the HSE to clarify its proposals, if any, for the former Saint Finan's Hospital attached grounds in Killarney. I also asked that it would detail the ongoing cost of maintaining the property. The following reply to that Motion has recently issued and is as follows: "The HSE has met with Kerry County Council in regard to the St Finan's campus. It is envisaged that the HSE will continue to develop part of the Saint Finan's campus to meet its requirements in relation to its Older Persons Accommodation Programme. In relation to the remainder of the campus, the HSE has asked Kerry County Council if it offers any strategic opportunities to them relation to Kerry County Council requirements. Discussions are ongoing with the Council in this regard. In addition, the costs in 2015 of ensuring adequate security, heating and general maintenance of the building were as follows:

Annual CCTV monitoring contract including key holding: €2,100 Annual Fire Alarm maintenance contract: €1,216 Annual grounds maintenance contract: €2,767."



The above response from the HSE is most welcome as it firstly clarifies the intention of that body to provide a new building for the care of older people. It is also welcome as it clearly affords an opportunity to KCC to acquire some or all of the remainder of the property for the benefit of the general public. For many years the members of the former Killarney Town Council sought clarity from the HSE with regard to the future of this magnificent building and attached lands. It is good that that clarification has been forthcoming. It is my intention to place the matter on the agenda for an upcoming meeting of Kerry County Council in the hope that by then there will be at least some clarification available on the possibilities afforded by this property to the Council on behalf of the wider population.

It was good news this week for those on Council has appointed contractor, Ned O'Shea the housing list in Killarney, as Kerry County & Sons Ltd to construct 20 new housing units in the town. The houses are being provided under the government's Rebuilding Ireland programme at a cost of €3.1m. The units, which will be constructed at The Park, Killarney, will be two-storey three-bedroom units which are due to be completed in February 2018. The contract for the project was signed at County Buildings in Tralee in the presence of the Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr Michael O'Shea, the Cathaoirleach of Killarney Municipal District, Cllr Brendan Cronin and the Chief Executive of Kerry County Council, Moira Murrell.

Welcoming the signing of the contract, the Cathaoirleach of the Killarney Municipal District, Cllr Brendan Cronin said the additional housing units would greatly assist in providing homes to those on the local authority waiting list. "It is wonderful to see Kerry County Council being in a position to construct houses again and this is particularly welcome in Killarney. These 20 units will help to address the needs of applicants on the housing waiting lists in the area and I look forward to their completion at the earliest opportunity," said Cllr. Cronin.

The current campaign being pushed by Minister Ross to change the legislation with regards to the permitted blood alcohol levels in drivers appears not to be looked for by any other body, not even the Road Safety Authority (RSA).

If zero tolerance was enforced this would mean that a priest would be breaking the law if he drives home after mass once he has received the blood of Christ (wine) in the course of saying mass.

This would also mean that people taking certain medicines, e.g. some cough bottles, could be deemed unfit to drive depending on the person's consumption and when they took their medicine. They could suffer disqualification under this proposed legislation.

# BARRADUFF CARDIAC RESPONSE UNIT GOES LIVE TO SAVE LIVES



BARRADUFF CARDIAC RESPONSE UNIT WHICH WENT LIVE WITH THE NATIONAL AMBULANCE SERVICE THIS WEEK.

When Patricia Murphy's son Brian was diagnosed with a minor heart condition, it spurred the Barraduff woman to form a Cardiac Response Unit in her local area.

Now one year on, the Barraduff Cardiac Response Unit are live with the National Ambulance Service and this weekend attended their first call out. "I decided I needed to do something when Brian was diagnosed with a minor heart condition" Patricia told the Killarney Outlook. "With the help of businesses in Barraduff and a number of private donations, we raised €5,000 to get us up and running".

"It is great for the village of Barraduff to have this amazing facility and we work within a 6km radius of the village", she added. The group will work within a 6km radius, with their centre point being Headford Post Office. The dedicated group of volunteers which include 16 responders and two new recruits have spent countless amounts of hours on training and fundraising to make this service possible. A service that could just be the difference between life and death for the residents in the area. "We are extremely grateful to our sponsors, both business and individuals and to the Order of Malta in Killarney, the Killarney Cardiac Response Unit and the Doneraile/Buttvent/ Mallow Community Responders who took the time to help us and who gave us great confidence with out training", Patricia said.

The Barraduff Cardiac Response Unit is now

linked in with the National Ambulance Service and will be on call 24/7 to attend urgent and life threatening calls such as strokes, heart attacks, choking, cardiac arrests and chest pain. The Unit is made up of a team of locally trained volunteers, from all sectors of society, who respond to 999/112 emergency phone calls. They are activated once a Cardiac call is made to Ambulance control and cover an area of 6km. The Responders have a Pager/Radio on them which is linked in with a control phone through the National Ambulance Service. They work alongside and under the control of the National Ambulance Service and aim to complement them by providing care and utilising those vital few minutes as every second counts, until Ambulance Service arrive on scene. It is Vital that resuscitation is started as soon as possible following a cardiac arrest. Cardiac arrest can happen to anyone at any age. Young or old. Fit or not. And the chances of recovery decrease by 10% for every minute that proper care isn't administered. The Cardiac First Responders object is to be on the scene within 10 minutes of receiving the emergency call from Ambulance Control. Dozens of cardiac response groups have already been set up around the country but with the ambulance services stretched, it's crucial that rural areas have a fast response unit. This amazing service could not be provided, only for the dedicated group of volunteer responders who make it all possible. The community is in safe hands as Barraduff Cardiac Response Unit's mission is to give valuable assistance to patients in the area.

# IRISH WATER PROPOSE €3 MILLION INVESTMENT IN KILCUMMIN

Irish Water is advancing plans to develop a new Sewerage Scheme for the village of Kilcummin, which will have major benefits for the local environment whilst also facilitating future development in the area.

This represents an investment of €3 million for the village, involving the construction of a new pumping station and all the additional infrastructure needed to connect Kilcummin to the Killarney Wastewater network at Derreen. This project will ensure that the local environment is protected by improving the quality of groundwater and facilitating an improvement in the quality of water in the River Deenagh and Lough Leane. It will also allow for future residential and commercial development within the area.

A planning application for the project is being lodged with Kerry County Council to facilitate a range of work including the construction of a



new pumping station, a below ground peak flow holding tank and an access road to the pumping station from the back of the Páirc Chuimín estate. The application also relates to the construction of a gravity sewer crossing of the River Deenagh within Killarney National Park. A Natural Impact Statement (NIS) to facilitate an assessment of potential impacts on the Killarney National Park, Macgillycuddy's Reeks and Caragh River Catchment Special Area of Conservation will be included in the planning submission.

Joe Kennedy, Irish Water's Wastewater Lead for the Southern Region said: "This is a very significant project for Kilcummin, in providing a very critical wastewater infrastructure in this rural area close to the town of Killarnev. This will help protect the environment and improve water quality in this very scenic area while also providing the scope and flexibility to facilitate future development within the catchment area." 



# TAX RELIEF ON THE COST OF EMPLOYING A **HOME CARER**

You can claim tax relief on the cost of employing a carer either if you employ one for yourself, or for another family member. A family member is a spouse, civil partner, child or a relative, including a relation by marriage or civil partnership.

You can employ the carer directly or you can use an agency that employs carers. If you employ the carer yourself, you should register as an employer and you will be responsible for your employee's tax and social insurance (PAYE, Universal Social Charge and PRSI). You will also have other duties and obligations as an employer, for example regarding hours of work, contracts of employment, payslips, holidays and the minimum wage.

If you pay an agency to provide the carer, the agency will employ the carer and be responsible for their tax and social insurance etc. You can still claim tax relief on the cost of paying the agency to provide a carer.

Tax allowances and reliefs reduce the amount of tax that you have to pay. The amount by which a tax allowance/relief will reduce your tax depends on your rate of tax. You can claim tax relief (at your highest rate) on the lower of the following two amounts:

- · The actual cost incurred or
- The maximum deduction of €75,000

The maximum amount of relief for employing a carer is €75,000 in 2017 (It was €75,000 in 2016 and 2015 and €50,000 in 2014 and previous years).



### HOME RENOVATION INCENTIVE SCHEME

'he Home Renovation Incentive (HRI) scheme enables homeowners or landlords to claim tax relief on repairs, renovations or improvement work that is carried out on their main home or rental property by tax-compliant contractors and that is subject to 13.5% VAT. The HRI is paid in the form of a tax credit at 13.5% of qualifying expenditure, which can be set against your income tax over 2 years. This effectively reduces the rate of VAT to zero on qualifying work, up to a value of €30,000. In order to qualify for the HRI, the work must be done between 25 October 2013 and 31 December 2018 for homeowners and between 15 October 2014 and 31 December 2018 for landlords. (Budget 2017 extended this closing date from 31 December 2016.) To qualify for the HRI as an owner-occupier, the work must be carried out on your principal private residence. As noted above, landlords can qualify in respect of work done on their rental properties. Whether you are a homeowner or a landlord, you must be up to date with your obligations under the Local Property Tax and, if applicable, the Household Charge. You must be paying income tax – whether under PAYE or self-assessment - to avail of the HRI. Any contractor you use must be registered for Value Added Tax (VAT) in Ireland and be taxcompliant. Revenue has published FAQs for contractors.

If several contractors, such as a builder, a plumber and an electrician, carry out qualifying work on your home or rental property, you can combine the cost of the works to make up the minimum qualifying amount. The type of work that qualifies for the HRI is repair, renovation or improvement work that is subject to VAT at 13.5%. This includes extensions, garages and attic conversions; the supply and fitting of kitchens, bathrooms and built-in wardrobes; fitting of windows; garden landscaping; plumbing, tiling, rewiring, plastering and painting. If you are having your septic tank repaired or replaced, or are installing a radon gas mitigation solution, these types of work also qualify for the HRI. Work on driveways and on rainwater harvesting systems can also qualify. There are more examples of qualifying work on revenue.ie. If you are unsure about whether your works will qualify, contact your Revenue office. Work that is subject to VAT at 23% (such as architect's fees) is not covered. Neither are items such as furniture, white goods or carpets. Revenue has published general information about the HRI and specific information for homeowners and landlords, as well as a guide for homeowners and landlords and a guide for contractors which can be found on www.revenue.ie



# Know Your Rights:

### PART-TIME WORK AND PRSI

### **OUESTION**

I work part-time in a local restaurant from Thursday to Saturday. The number of shifts I work can vary depending on the time of year. How does this part-time arrangement affect my social insurance (PRSI) contributions?

### **ANSWER**

The number of social insurance contributions you make can affect your eligibility for the range of social insurance benefits that are available.

It is called Pay Related Social Insurance (PRSI) because the amount of social insurance you pay depends on your earnings and the type of work you do.

In general, you pay a PRSI contribution in respect of each PRSI contribution week in which you work. The PRSI contribution week starts on the first day of January every year. Because this may fall on any day of the week, the PRSI contribution week may differ from the working week. You must be working on at least one day in each PRSI contribution week in order to pay a contribution.

In 2017, the first of January fell on a Sunday. This means that each PRSI contribution week this year runs from Sunday to

As your part-time work arrangement requires that you work part of every week between Sunday and Saturday, you will have your full 52 PRSI contributions for 2017. Even if, due to the seasonal nature of your work, your working days were reduced to one or two of those days per week, you would still have your full contributions.

However, if your work pattern was to change to the same days for one week on, one week off, you would only get 26 weeks of contributions in 2017.





# NSOMNIA

Sleep is as important to us as air, water and food. Anyone can suffer from insomnia, which can be frustrating, exhausting and depressing, affecting both our mental and physical health.

#### Different types of Insomnia:

• Transient insomnia - which lasts for a short time period only, typically this can be associated with a stressful event e.g. an exam, a bereavement. • Chronic insomnia - lasting for several weeks, months or sometimes years

Signs of insomnia? • Difficulty falling asleep - common in young people • Being a restless and light sleeper - waking often, lying awake in the middle of the night. In younger people it may be associated with depression. • Waking early and being unable to get back to sleep.

### Symptoms:

feeling tired during the day, headaches, feeling irritable or finding it hard to concentrate. Here are some typical causes of insomnia:

- states of mind anxiety, depression, anger, grief, preoccupation with a future event e.g. a child's leaving certificate exams

- environment noise, jet lag... pain medical conditions heart, breathing, stomach, digestive, high blood pressure, arthritis, anorexia. • recreational drugs (e.g hard drugs like LSD) -but this also includes nicotine, caffeine. • other prescription drugs including some contraceptives, diuretics, slimming pills,

beta-blockers, stimulants.

### Suggestions:

Consider...Your Environment

• You need a comfortable bed and a room that's quiet, not too cold or too warm and dark enough.

Your lifestyle • Cut down on all stimulants. These include: coffee and tea, alcohol, nicotine, fizzy drinks, food additives, 'junk food', slimming pills or appetite suppressants • Try to avoid heavy, rich foods within two hours of bed.

- Get regular exercise. Aim for 30 minutes or more of daily activity, but not too close to bedtime. • Avoid stimulating activity and stressful situations before bedtime. This includes vigorous exercise, big discussions or arguments, or catching up on work.
- Turn off screens one hour before bedtime. The light emitted from TV, tablets, smartphones, and computers suppresses your body's production of melatonin and can severely disrupt your sleep. Instead of using technology try listening to a book on tape, a podcast, or reading by a soft light.

### TODAY IS - INTERNATIONAL STAND UP TO BULLYING DAY:

Bullying isn't confined to the school gates and its victims aren't limited to young people.

It also exists at home and in our wider communities. And of course, bullying exists online: The result being a constant and unrelenting attack. Research shows that bullying can have long-lasting and devastating effects.

\*Be someone that cares about others and encourage your peers to do likewise. If you see someone being bullied in your school or workplace, try to help them or speak to a staff

\*Ask your teacher / supervisor if it ok to create a notice board about your anti-bullying work. Make it obvious to students / workers where they can get help or report concerns.

Your support can help shape attitudes and behaviours early on, ensuring no one should have to suffer the devastating effects of bullying, at any point in their life.

\*Parents - When children are being bullied, whether it's online or face to face, they can find it very difficult to talk about. Particularly as children become teens many don't want to tell their parents as they feel ashamed, scared, helpless and worried about the repercussions. So it's important to recognise the signs.

If your child tries to avoid school or socialising, becomes withdrawn from family and friends and seems depressed, then these may be symptoms that they are being bullied. In the case of physical bullying you may also find damaged or missing belongings and injuries that your child can't explain or tries to brush off.

Cyberbullying can be an extension of bullying that's going on during the school day. What makes online bullying or cyberbullying particularly tough for children is that it can be hard to get away from. Young people could be bullied anywhere, anytime - even when they're at home - and this can be devastating. As so much



communication happens between children by mobile phone and online, cyberbullying can occur through many channels.

Zhao Delong, a college student from Henan, China suffered from polio when he was young, which made him unable to walk. However, thanks to his parent's support, he was able to undergo surgery, get treatment, and regain his ability to walk.

An Australian man from Point Cook in Melbourne's west became an instant multimillionaire after accidentally entering a Tattslotto draw twice on February 4th with the same numbers. "At first I thought 'wow I've won (\$1 million)' so at first I was lying in bed shaking," the man said but then after an hour or so I realised I hadn't checked the rest of my tickets so I looked at the next one and to my surprise I found that I'd played the same game twice. I wasn't expecting to win once let alone twice."

For an invention that has been around for almost a century, nothing much has been changed about the band aid, especially on how it is made

Now a Japanese Twitter user is going to change the way people use popular adhesive bandages. The post, which has a simple step by step illustration on how to make bandages more securely plastered on a finger wound, has so far racked up over 88,000 retweets since it was tweeted. The helpful instruction posted by @ ponzuyo simply shows how to cut the two sides of the sticky part of a bandage through the middle as far as the bandage, The mini bandage can then be tucked securely in the shape of an X allowing it to have a better way to wrap them around the finger. The simple method makes sure the bandage won't easily fall off as it is more tightly wrapped and the wound is even more protected from dirt.

### **NEIGHBOURS COVER LAWN** OF REFUGEE SCHOOL WITH **LOVING SIGNS:**

The International Community School in Atlanta is a charter school that has been educating refugees from all over the world for 15 years and neighbourhood families are making sure that their young refugee population aren't scared away by the nation's current political status.

# CRITICALLY ENDANGERED BLACK RHINOS WELCOME TWO NEWBORN CALVES:

The mothers of the calves, Grumeti and Zawadi, were both bred in captivity at the Aspinall Foundation's Port Lympne wildlife park. In 2012, they were moved from the centre in Kent, England, to Mount Kilimanjaro in Tanzania where they mated with another offspring of the park named Jamie.

Damian Aspinall, chairman of The Aspinall Foundation said: "These births illustrates perfectly our passionate belief in the true role of modern conservation as being committed to the survival of threatened species in their natural territories. We believe this is preferable, wherever possible, to simply keeping them caged in an existence which does little for prospects of long term survival."

Altogether, The Aspinall Foundation has successfully released eight black rhino back into the wild, as well as more than 60 gorillas and scores of other smaller primates including lemurs, langur and gibbons. Further releases are planned as part of The Aspinall Foundations vision to re-stock the wild with endangered species.

# FRANCE HAS ISSUED A SOVEREIGN GREEN BENCHMARK BOND:

France has issued its first "green bonds" with a record seven billion euro sale, paving the way for the establishment of a genuine market in renewable energy bonds.

Proceeds from the sale of the 22-year bonds will

be used to finance projects to address climate change. The initiative was first announced in April 2016 by President Francois Hollande who has championed his country's role as a leader in energy transition and though the issue of these bonds were reserved for institutional investors such as banks and pension funds, it was oversubscribed with total demand exceeding 23 billion euros.

Poland was the first country to enter the green bond market with a 750 million euro issue in December. Previously they had only been issued by companies or finance institutions such as the World Bank.

### JUDGE DISMISSES "RIDICULOUS" TICKET WHEN WOMAN PARKS 2 SECONDS EARLY:

A woman named Sarah was contesting a parking ticket in a Providence, Rhode Island court. When Judge Frank Caprio read the charges aloud, he couldn't believe his eyes.

Sarah had received a ticket for parking in a noparking zone with restrictions from 8:00AM to 10:00AM and the traffic warden wrote the ticket at exactly 9:59:58AM, two seconds before the zone restrictions were up.

# WORLD'S LAST WILD FRANKINCENSE FORESTS ARE UNDER THREAT:

The Cal Madow mountains, which rise from the Gulf of Aden in sheer cliff faces reaching over 2,440 meters (8,000 feet), are part of Somaliland, an autonomous republic in Somalia's northwest. Here men rise at dawn in search of the prized sap of wild frankincense trees, growing high on cliff edges, shallow roots gripping bare rock, some with slithering and venomous snakes, harvesters often slip and tumble down canyon walls as bracing against high winds they chip off bark with metal scrapers to allow the tree's white sap to bleed. Once the resin is collected, women sort the chunks by colour and size. The various classes of resin are shipped to Yemen, Saudi Arabia and eventually Europe and America. When dried and burned, the sap produces a fragrant smoke which perfumes churches and mosques around the world and along with gold and myrrh, was brought by the Three Kings as gifts in the Gospel account of the birth of Jesus. Besides its use as incense, frankincense gum is distilled into oil for use in perfumes, skin lotions, medicine and chewing gum.

But now these last intact wild frankincense forests on Earth are under threat as prices have shot up in recent years with the global appetite for essential oils. Overharvesting has led to the trees dying off faster than they can replenish, putting the ancient resin trade at risk.

Now over-tapping is destroying the trees across the Cal Madow, as tappers try to extract as much sap as possible and make too many cuts per tree. They also tap the trees year-round rather than seasonally, preventing the trees from recovering. The death rate of the adult trees is alarming and while there is potential for regeneration, it takes about 40 years or so for these trees to become viable for tapping if it's done right.

The frankincense trade is Somaliland's largest

source of government revenue after livestock and livestock products and officials worry the ancient trade could disappear.

"Frankincense is something that is literally given by God to humanity, so if we don't preserve it, if we don't take care of it, if we don't look after it, we will lose that," said Shukri Ismail, Somaliland's minister of environment and rural development.

# INMATES BROKE OUT OF THEIR CELL TO SAVE LIFE OF OFFICER GUARDING THEM:

When their armed guard suffered a heart attack, a group of prisoners broke the lock on their holding cell to rescue him — putting their own lives in danger.

The inmates were awaiting court appearances in Parker County, Texas when the lone armed guard fell over, unconscious, in his chair. They tried calling for help, but no one came.

The men realized if they broke out to help the guard, their actions might be mistaken for a jail break, and police could come rushing in with guns drawn—but their instinct to help was stronger. Throwing their combined weight against the cell door, they forced it open. Still handcuffed and shackled, they continued yelling for help and this time officers in the courtroom upstairs could hear them. As one of them reached for the guard's radio to call for help, police rushed into the holding room and corralled the inmates before realising there was a medical emergency. Officers say the inmates' action likely saved the guard's life — without their help it might have been another 15 minutes before anyone found him.

# 4 FRIENDS STARTED AN EPIC PLASTIC CLEAN-UP MOVEMENT AFTER FINDING A DEER WHO DIED EATING PLASTIC:

In 2011, Gopal Jhaveri and three of his friends came across a dead deer during their walk at Sanjay Gandhi National Park in Mumbai, India. After investigating, they discovered that over seven pounds of plastic were removed from the dead deer's stomach.


Driven by the death of the deer, Gopal and his friends began picking up plastic in an attempt to restore the park to its former glory and managed to collect nearly 80,000 kg of plastic between 2011 and 2012."

What began as a simple clean-up project between friends has sparked a passion in the community. River March, an organisation which seeks to raise awareness about the importance of preserving the park's natural flora and fauna, was founded by noted water conservationist Raiendra Singh.

Not only does River March make the waterways beautiful again by eliminating rubbish and planting new trees, they have also sparked an initiative to discourage the use of vehicles in the park by providing visitors with rentable bicycles. We could all take a page from the people of River March. The plastic problem may seem daunting to take on alone, but when united, we have the power to make great things happen.





# GARDENING

### **FOCUS ON HEDGING**

Hedges can make a much more natural background to a garden than a wall or a fence. They can provide shelter and are cheaper and require a small amount of maintenance. Because a hedge allows the wind to filter through, it reduces its velocity. Tall or low growing, clipped or informal, there is a hedging plant for every purpose. One thing to remember about a hedge is that it is intended to be a permanent feature in the garden so therefore should be chosen with care and planted in well prepared soil.

To choose he right hedge for your garden here are a few pointers to think about

The type of soil you have.

How exposed the garden is, i.e what direction is it facing?

The eventual height and width the hedge will be

Does it need to be evergreen?

When you have chosen the type of hedge that you want, its time to prepare the soil. Start prepping the soil by digging thoroughly and forking in some well rotted farmyard manure. Hedges can be planted all year round but the ideal time is between November and March as all heding plants will be dormant at this time. What that means is that when you go to buy your hedging plants they are lifted straight from the ground and are called bare-rooted hedging. This enables you to replant straight back into the ground when you get them home. Just make sure that when planting that the roots are spread out well as this will encourage them to root quickly when the growing season starts. If you have missed the bare rooted season at the end of March you can plant container grown hedging all year round. Next week I will focus on trees.


