



A spectacular parade, with marching bands, striking custom-built floats, baton-twirling cheerleaders, colourful movie characters and leather clad bikers, will be the highlight of this year's Killarney 4th July celebrations which will make a welcome return, in some style, following a two-year interruption.

Main Street in Killarney will take on a Disneylike magic for a day and night of celebrations to mark the town's special centuries-old link with America

Thousands of visitors from Stateside choose Killarney as their favourite holiday destination every year and this is the town's way of giving something back to mark the big US occasion.

"Just as our American friends celebrate St Patrick's Day in style, we will do likewise to mark their Independence Day," said 4th July Festival Chairman Diarmuid Leen.

The festivities on Monday, July 4th will get underway with the formal raising of the American Flag at the town hall with the Mayor of Killarney and the President of Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce presiding. The Statue of Liberty will keep a close watch over Main Street with face-painters and street entertainers roaming the town while Killarney will be turned into Hollywood for a few glorious hours with everybody from Marilyn Monroe, Charlie Chaplin, Bonnie and Clyde, The Greatest Showman's Bearded Lady and even a posse of fun-loving cowboys on the loose.

Big bands and top quality singers will perform throughout the town all afternoon while a funfilled street party will get into full swing with street fireworks and flame-throwers ready to light up the sky.

Thousands of people, many waving American flags, will line the streets of the town for the big parade, commencing at 7.00pm, and that will be followed by a lively hour-long Beat on the

Street from 8.00pm.

HOPING TO FIND BREAKTHROUGHS IN

CANCER CARE TREATMENTS

Jessica Walsh from Headford in Killarney is among five third level students who will spend the summer researching increased understanding and possible new treatments for cancer patients in Ireland. Their research, across a range of cancers, is being funded by Breakthrough Cancer Research' Summer Scholarship Programme. The charity strives to ensure that patients have access to the best treatments for cancer and never have to be told that there is "no hope."

Projects include increasing early access to new medicines from pharmaceutical companies, researching what makes high-risk Multiple Myeloma (cancer of the bone marrow) cancer cells different to find new therapies that can target these differences, the effects of Vitamin D receptors in oesophageal cancer (cancer of the food pipe), and the benefits of pre and post operative exercise and nutrition programmes for people with various cancers.

Jessica Walsh, University College Cork will research the effects of particular molecules on Vitamin D receptors in oesophageal cancer (cancer of the food pipe). In Ireland, approximately 500 people are diagnosed every

year with this disease and if current projections continue, by 2045 annual cases of oesophageal cancer in men will increase by 115% and 109% in women.

Ms Walsh says, "In oesophageal adenocarcinoma (the most common form of oesophageal cancer) we can see an increase in vitamin D receptor protein expression. In this study, we hope to identify important products created by the body that activates the vitamin D receptor in oesophageal cancer cells. The significance of such findings would contribute to a better understanding of the causes of oesophageal cancer and aid in the development of therapeutic strategies."

Breakthrough is an Irish medical cancer research charity, which aims to inspire and enable financial support for exceptional research into cancer in Ireland leading to more effective treatments for patients in Ireland and Internationally and to improve cancer care and patient survival.

This new Summer Scholarship programme will further promote and drive more patient focused cancer research within Ireland, through education of the next generation of cancer researchers.

TIME TO PUT KILLARNEY ON STAGE

950 people from 92 countries became Irish citizens at the INEC Monday, in emotional ceremonies presided over by Minister for Justice Helen McEntee and two judges including retired High Court Judge Bryan McMahon who has strong Killarney connections

All parts of the Globe were represented as usual - Europe, Africa, South America, the UK and the US, China, India and probably Russia and the Ukraine too.And they travelled from the four corners of Ireland to Killarney.

The citizenship ceremonies were introduced in 2011 by Minister Alan Shatter and held in Dublin. Before this, being awarded citizenship was a fairly miserable affair with the oath of loyalty to the State taken in the witness box of the regular sitting of the often draughty and run down District Courts.

The ceremonies have been held in the INEC in Killarney since 2018 but like everything else were shut down during Covid.

The 45-minute ceremonies are quite formal. There is a colour party standing to attention on stage with the Tricolour, the army band plays (the harpist Deirdre Granville played O'Carolan tunes on Monday as well), there are addresses by the Minister and the judge before and after the oath. The national anthem is played and there was a round of applause and cheers by the new citizens on Monday for this. Everyone is given a copy of the constitution.

These huge events are organised by the Department of Justice staff from Tipperary, Dublin and sometimes Killarney. There is also huge input by the INEC itself. And there is garda traffic management and this was seamless on Monday under Sgt Dermot O'Connell . In other words, this is Ireland at its best and ever since they moved to Killarney they have gone without a hitch.

They can be quite emotional also. I had a doctor from Pakistan now living in Wexford dissolve into tears at the end of the morning ceremony, and say she just could not understand why she was so emotional.

Lord David Puttnam 81 - the renowned film director and recently retired from the House of Lords (The Mission, The Killing Fields, Chariots of Fire, Midnight Express, etc) and his wife Patsy took Irish citizenship at the afternoon ceremony and practically danced into the hall. It was their first time in Killarney and Patsy could not get over how beautiful it was and also that she had never visited.

A woman from Sicily was completely astonished to learn Killarney was twinned with Castiglione di Sicilia, a town she knew of!

And all this prompts me to remark: Official Killarney should be accorded a central role at these ceremonies. The mayor and local councillors should be invited (it was a matter of some disappointment to them they were not and some told me they did not even know

about it until the media reports).

Think about it: Killarney is renowned for its ability to organize huge events and throw a party- we could have a jarvey parade, we could have a formal address by the mayor and put official and fun Killarney on stage as an equal citizen with official and fun Ireland.

Becoming a citizen "is like being adopted" by a new warm country, the Sicilian woman living in Dublin remarked to me. Killarney, the fairy godmother of these important ceremonies plays an important part and needs more of a role in all of it, I suggest to the Department of Justice and its minister.

CARS AND PLANES

The cost of car hire in Kerry is simply prohibitive. I am told of cancellations in hotels throughout Kerry and low take up of other accommodation all because of the crazy car prices - 1400 euro a week is about the average for the smallest car - crazy prices and twice or three times that of other countries.

I mentioned it to Taoiseach Micheal Martin in Tralee last Friday and he says it is such a pity given all the supports the tourism industry got to keep it going that it is being undermined.

Can anything be done? He had no solution on the day, but I see where there are soundings, finally, on the vexed issue this week from Tourism Minister Catherine Martin.

It seems astonishing that a tourism minister or some such person cannot come along and take the steering wheel on price gouging. But I have a problem with Tourism Minister Martin. For some reason I don't think she gets tourism and its importance to Killarney (where some of her staff work). I see no big ideas by her and her inputs into major issues on travel and tourism seem to me late and tardy. In contrast, I see plenty ideas from her on her brief in the arts, and culture but, alas, next to nothing on tourism.

Meanwhile, Brendan Griffin, TD a former tourism minister does get tourism. He is receiving a pat on the back for his intervention on sorting what this column has been writing about ad nauseam: a single check in for regional flights. There is now just to be one check in for same day connecting flights. Fantastic news and time, energy and hassle are all saved, hopefully.

I have been onto Dublin airport to see how that will work and they tell me there is a corridor between the terminals for flight connections. This should mean the beleaguered Kerry traveller will no longer have to go out of Terminal 2 and negotiate their way to the next - and circle back practically the same route again inside Terminal 1. The single check in is for same day only and for those who have nothing other than a cabin bag. It may ease the dissatisfaction with flight times to and from Dublin for Kerry people.



Drive on!

Maura Healy-Rae got the following update on the Farranfore to Killarney road at this week's council meeting.

The scheme is currently at Phase Two and that means it is at the options selection stage. The "Draft Options Selection Report" is in preparation and will be peer reviewed by Transport Infrastructure Ireland in mid-2022, she was told. It will come before the council members later.

This and the expected acceleration of the Macroom bypass will hopefully ease some of the awful traffic problems in getting to and from Killarney.

Overlay work has commenced on the section of the Ballyvourney/Macroom scheme, which bypasses Macroom town, and that may open to the public early, Transport Infrastructure Ireland told Brendan Griffin.

Overall construction works are about 75% complete at end of May 2022. But while sections of the scheme may open to the public early, there remains one overall completion date for the 22km scheme - the final quarter of 2023.

CAO APPLICANTS HAVE A LAST CHANCE TO REGISTER A CHANGE OF COURSE CHOICES ONLINE

BY 5PM ON FRIDAY, 1ST JULY



The state exams conclude next Tuesday, 28th June and the thoughts of exhausted candidates are no doubt turning to holidays, travel or summer jobs. But there is still one very important task to be done. The 83,785 applicants to the Central Applications Office (CAO) must now turn their attention to the CAO course change of mind facility which gives each applicant a last chance, if s/he wishes, to register a change of course choices online by 5pm on Friday, 1st July.

Not all applicants to CAO avail of the change of mind facility. Many applicants are happy with the course choices they submitted by 1st February. On the other hand, others will have changed their minds about the courses they would like to study. Whatever your reason for submitting a change of mind form, make sure you know exactly what you are applying for. Don't list any courses which you haven't researched. Don't apply for any course which you know that you won't accept if it's offered to you. Most important of all, never apply for a course in which you haven't the slightest interest just because your friends are applying for it.

If you decide to submit a change of mind form, work calmly on your choices before going online. Start from scratch and write out your new list of courses. Don't tinker with your original list while online as it's very easy to make a mistake. Check the minimum and special requirements for each course you are including on the change of mind form.

When you are happy with your revised choices, open up your CAO account via the "My Application" facility. To make changes to your existing course choices click on the 'Change Level 8 Course Choices' tab and/or the 'Change Level 7/6 Course Choices' tab. If you haven't entered any courses on your application up to this

point this tab will be called 'Add Level 8 Course Choices' and/or 'Add Level 7/6 Course Choices.' Your current course choices are listed to the left and you are given a blank preference list, headed 'New Choices,' to the right.' Enter all the courses that you wish to apply for in your order of preference on this list. Your existing choices are cancelled out. The same process applies for the Level 7/6 list. Every choice is important so fill up all ten choices in each category. Then click on 'Continue with Course Changes' to save the information. You will then be brought back to the screen containing the updated details CAO has on file for you. Check that your course choices are listed in correct order and that the codes are correct.

The two course categories – Level 8 and Level 7/6 are totally separate from each other for the purpose of submitting a change of mind form. You may change one category and leave the second category unchanged or you may change both. On the other hand, you may decide to stick with the choices you submitted by 1st February last.

If you change courses online, CAO will send an acknowledgement to your email address. Check that your courses have been updated by using the "My Application" facility by 5pm on 1st July. You may change your course choices free of charge as often as you wish up to the closing date. The final change of mind form that you submit is the one that will count for your CAO offers. So, be sure to check online before 1st July to make sure that all is in order.

After the 1st July you can make no further changes to your CAO application form. So, the remaining days provide you with a valuable window of opportunity. Use the time to put some serious thought into your choice of college courses. With the state exams done and

dusted, you can give your undivided attention to submitting a 'change of mind' form that truly contains your course interests. It will be time well spent if you achieve your course of choice when the college offers are issued.

- Don't apply for any course which you know that you won't accept

- Check the requirements for the courses you are including on the change of mind form
- The two course categories are separate from each other on a change of mind form
- The remaining days provide you with a valuable window of opportunity
- After the 1st July you can make no further changes to your CAO application form
- The Leaving Cert (LC) exam concludes on Tuesday, 28th June

SEPTEMBER 2ND DATE FOR LEAVING CERTIFICATE EXAMINATION RESULTS

The State Examinations Commission (SEC), intends to issue the 2022 Leaving Certificate and Leaving Certificate Applied examination results to candidates on Friday 2 September.

Details of the arrangements for the 2022 certificate examinations were announced on 1 February 2022. Since that time, the SEC has been



engaged in the planning and delivery of all aspects of the examinations across Leaving Certificate, Leaving Certificate Applied and Junior Cycle. This has been a significant undertaking in the current year in light of the ongoing effects of Covid-19 on schools; candidates; contract staff and the staff of the SEC. Some 131,000 candidates are undertaking examinations this year, an increase of 6% (+7,000) compared to the last time a full set of examinations was run in 2019.

There are a number of significant factors which have made providing a date for the issue of the Leaving Certificate results challenging. The SEC has an absolute responsibility to examination candidates to ensure that their work is marked to the highest standards of quality and integrity and the Commission must be able to stand over the results it issues each

Results will issue to candidates through the Candidate Self Service Portal available at www.examinations.ie and on www.gov.ie/leavingcertificate. The SEC will issue a direct communication to candidates by email about the planned date for issue of the Leaving Certificate results.





BLURRED VISION

When you have blurred vision, : your eyesight is less sharp and objects, images and words seem to be out of focus.

Who is affected by blurred vision?

Anyone can be affected by blurred vision. It could be a sign of getting older and/or needing new glasses, tiredness, or too much sun. ALL IRELAND QUARTER-**FINAL PREVIEW**

Kerry v Mayo

Dublin have been the team of the past decade. obviously. Mayo just about pip us into second place, depending how much currency you place on that 2014 All Ireland. But that's the big three, no question about that, and this weekend at least one of them (let's face it; Cork beating Dublin would be a bigger shock than David versus Goliath) will be out.

It won't be us. Or, to include a necessary caveat, I don't think it will be us. We have Mayo twice this year already, a good league contest and then a ducks and drakes League Final hammering. It's true that Mayo were missing serious players that day, the likes of Mullin, Durcan, the O'Connors....and they have certainly steeled on a tough road in the back door. But I don't see that kind of improvement that fast against a team like Kerry.

Tommy Conroy was the deadliest forward in the Sigerson series, but unfortunately that was his last action this year after injury. Ryan O'Donoghue will probably be fit to play, but not 100%. Cillian O'Connor will play, but is not as yet the threat of old. And we all know the old joke - "If Lee Harvey Oswald had been from Mayo JFK would still be alive". The implication being that a Mayo shooter would have missed from that grassy knoll - Mayo's greatest weakness going back generations has been a lack of scoring forwards.

They are fine for defenders, and great ones. Lee Keegan is up there with Michael Murphy and James McCarthy, a true great. Oisin Mullin, Eoghan McLaughlin, Paddy Durcan...fast, rangy defenders who can stick or twist with the ball. Mayo have fierce impetus from their defence; almost like a league rugby wave of attack. The question for James Horan, of course, is who marks David Clifford? Funnily enough, in his shoes I'd give the job to Pádraig Ó hÓra again. You need a player with serious muscle to hold David; he's just so strong. Of course, Mayo will surely accept the necessity for a sweeper. Mullin is expected to pick up Seán

O'Shea, while I imagine that Paddy Durcan will be detailed on playmaker Paudie Clifford in a far-ranging duel. Lee Keegan has been penned in at full back in recent times; it reminds me of Seamus Moynihan filling the role for Kerry even though I never saw a player who could influence a game from the half backline like Moynihan. Keegan needs to be part of Mayo's engine room, not their guard rail - look at how he cut loose against the Dubs last year when unshackled in the second half.

Mayo could actually have the edge on us in midfield. Ruane and Flynn are two big, strong men, and fine footballers with it. I'd expect Jack and Diarmuid starting for Kerry – Diarmuid has been guieter than usual in our last couple of games but is a proven performer, while Jack has turned into an old-fashioned dominant midfielder, big fetches and big hits. Of course, that starting midfield leaves Horan with another familiar conundrum - where to play Aidan O'Shea? The big man has been both talismanic and unlucky for Mayo for over a decade - he is simply the opposite in playing style to their fast-paced running style. Personally - and this might be a little left field - but I would put the big man in at full forward. With respect, Carney at full forward would suit Jason Foley all day and leave our defensive screen to rebuff forays from outside.

Anchored by Tadhq Morley to rebuff Mayo sprints. But put Aidan in there as a route one option? Mayo will be looking for goals and, while I don't expect Aidan to be scoring them (great ball-winner, but he isn't fast on the trigger at kicking), he can open that door.

Jack O'Connor has no great conundrums. To me, his only real choice is between ball-winner Dara Moynihan or line-breaker Stephen O'Brien in the half forward line. The defence basically pucks itself at this stage - Graham O'Sullivan and Brian Ó Beaglaíoch have really seized their chances and nailed starting jerseys ahead of a bunch of contenders. Midfield likewise - I don't see David Moran starting. I'd be expecting Dara Moynihan, Seán O'Shea, and Adrian Spillane in the half forwards. With the two Cliffords and Paul Geaney virtually certainties to start (Paudie's energy will be vital against high octane Mayo, like the older Spillane's muscle) it means that the out and out scoring forwards Tony Brosnan and Killian Spillane will have to be patient - I expect both to be on before the finish.

I'm not being disrespectful to Mayo – far from it, I admire them greatly, especially their ability to start all over again with the same heart and passion and their incredible ability to unearth new talent just when you start to think they are reaching the end. But when I look at their starting forwards, I just don't see where they are going to get the scores to stay with Kerry. I think they will need at least two goals, and I think we are as likely to score them at the other

Verdict: Kerry with a bit to spare.

I have been covering inter-county minor matches with over twenty years and never saw a crowd abuse or intimidate them. And if ye are that worried about it, then you should have left it at U18. Honestly, I think that minor as a development grade is starting to disappear, especially if it goes 'non-competitive'. These players, on both sides, deserve to play in front of big and passionate support. Far from being detrimental,

After all, look at Roy's own career - his career was based on doing the basic things right all of the time rather than the spectacular every now and again.

That goal by Nathan Collins against Ukraine... in fairness, that was absolutely sumptuous. Not just the skill to beat a series of defenders - did he really mean that flick off the inside of his left leg? I'm not certain – but the sheer confidence to go for it, that was unusual in an Irish shirt and glorious to see.

I had forgotten it, but Collins and Jason Knight actually played in the 2015 Kennedy Cup Final against Kerry, or first and only victory in the competition. While DDSL players have gone on to greater things, with most of them still playing at some level, the same can hardly be said of Kerry. This year's Kennedy Cup saw us continue a recent trend and finish in the bottom tier.

Hopefully the incentive of a Kerry League of Ireland team can reverse that tide.

CORK - KERRY ROAD COULD OPEN EARLY

✓ ERRY Fine Gael TD and Deputy Government Chief Whip, Brendan Griffin, has received positive indications that part of the new N22 Cork-Kerry road could open early.

In response to Deputy Griffin's latest Dáil question, Transport Infrastructure Ireland said that overlay work has commenced on the eastern section of the scheme, which bypasses Macroom town, and that discussions are currently ongoing between the contract parties regarding certain sections of the scheme that may open to the public early.

TII told Deputy Griffin that the N22 Baile Bhuirne to Macroom Road Development commenced construction in January 2020 and significant progress has been made, with overall construction works about 75% complete at end of May 2022. TII said that this comprises structures that are c.90% complete, earthworks that are c.83% complete and pavement works that are c.15% complete, with various works such as installation of crush and environmental barriers, signage and drainage also progressing. Deputy Griffin was told that the blasting of rock cut near the western tiein, where approximately 500,000m3 of rock is being extracted, is nearing



completion and that processed rock material is being hauled across the Bohill Bridge and the new bridge crossing of the existing N22 at Cúil na Cathrach, to create road embankments in the low-lying middle section of the road, adjacent to the River Sullane.

TII said that while discussions are currently ongoing between the contract parties regarding certain sections of the scheme that may open to the public early, there remains one overall completion date for the 22km scheme, and that based on current progress, it is anticipated that the scheme will be completed in quarter 4 of 2023.

Deputy Griffin was told that the eastern section of the scheme, which bypasses the town of Macroom, is the most advanced section, where the laying of mainline road pavement recently commenced.

Deputy Griffin, who is a long-time campaigner for the new Cork-Kerry road, is welcoming the rapid progress on the project and is calling on TII to do everything possible to open the Macroom Town bypass element of the project before the end of the current year.

Code of Best Practice for Greenways

ianna Fáil Councillor, Michael Cahill has said that the new Code of Best Practice for Greenways announced recently by Transport Infrastructure Ireland and the IFA, is a large step in the right direction in ensuring that all users and facilitators of these projects are treated fairly and equally.

"I have said from day one, when the South Kerry Greenway project was proposed by the the South Kerry Development Partnership, all possible accommodation works must be put in place to ensure that everybody gets fair treatment and can employ an agronomist or property advisor to ascertain fair compensation" stated Councillor Cahill, Chairperson of South Kerry Development Partnership.

"A crucial part of the framework is a new sustainability payment for each farmer impacted by a greenway project; this once-off goodwill payment will be given for early sign-

on and co-operation during construction.

The sustainability payment rates for farmers are split into five band lengths based on the metres of land impacted by a greenway, ranging from €6,750 to €22,500" stated the Rossbeigh based Councillor.

Tim Cullinan, President if the Irish Farmers Association has said that the farmer's statutory rights are fully protected if they participate in this voluntary process and that they still have full access to mediation and arbitration if there is no agreement on the valuation of the land and compensation for other impacts on their farms

"I am now calling on the Minister for the Environment, TII and the IFA to include landowners along the route of the South Kerry Greenway in this newly agreed Code" stated the Deputy Mayor of Kerry County Council.

"This is the single, biggest Tourism project ever for our county and it is only right and fitting that all farmers and landowners along the route benefit" added Councillor

Cahill, an ardent supporter of the South Kerry Greenway from day one.

Minister Foley welcomes over €200,000 for community first responders in Kerry

inister for Education and Kerry TD Norma V Foley welcomes the announcement of €223,022.87 in CLÁR funding for four community first responder groups in Kerry.

The funding will be used to purchase vehicles designed to transport people who have mobility issues or people being treated for cancer.Community groups that perform roles such as transporting blood samples from hospitals and delivering medication, will also be supported under the initiative.

Mountain Rescue Teams, Air Ambulances and Sub-Aqua Groups are also to receive funding. The four Kerry groups allocated funding are: Kerry Cancer Support Group will receive €100,000 for the purchase of a wheelchair accessible vehicle. Baile Mhuire CLG will receive €50,000 for the purchase of a vehicle.

Banna Community Rescue Boats Ireland will recieve €28,4222.87 for the purchase of a vehicle. Killarney Water Rescue will receive €44,600 for the purchase of a vehicle.

Minister Foley said: "This is welcome funding that will ensure that four vital first responder community groups in Kerry can continue to provide excellent care and key voluntary services to some of Kerry's most vulnerable, enhancing the communities they serve."

FOCUS ON HYDRANGEAS

Hydrangeas are a very popular garden shrub with delicate heads of flowers that come in shades of white, pink or blue and they flower from late Spring to Autumn. The mophead and lace cap Hydrangeas are well known for the ability to change colour in different soils. Hydrangeas thrive in moist but well drained soil, in the cool, semi shady part of the garden. Try to avoid dry sunny situations and east facing areas. Feeding your Hydrangeas once in late Winter or early Spring is probably enough for the year as too much feeding will only encourage too much soft leafy growth and this will lead to the Hydrangeas not developing a lot of flower buds. Pruning your Hydrangeas is usually done in late Winter or early Spring, although the climbing Hydrangeas should be pruned after flowering in Summer.



Welcome back dear student, in the Old Testament the Angel of the Lord is mentioned a lot. The word 'angel' is a form of 'Mal'ak' the Hebrew root of which means 'deputy, king, priest, prophet, messenger, ambassador, and teacher'. Many struggle with a demonic spirit of fear in all kinds of ways. Some of these fears are visible, and some are hidden deep within, but all manifesting in behaviours that bring turmoil and anguish to the one who is battling the spirit of fear. There is a way out! (2 Timothy 1:7) The Lord Jesus said 'I Am the Way, the Truth and the Life...' (John 14:6). When a person repents of sin, and asks Jesus to come into their life as Lord, and lives for Him by obeying His Word, God promises that one that no matter what kind of difficult circumstances they are enduring, He will deliver them and make them whole. Healing comes as we deepen our relationship with Jesus by spending time in His Word. Remember - Jesus is the Word of God. "The Word was made flesh and dwelt amongst us" (John 1:14). And the Word of God is alive - because He is a Person not a thing! So when we study the Scriptures we are getting to know Jesus and learning to see life from His perspective. And His perspective is very different from what the world proclaims as truth.

Some people have a big problem with the Bible. They say things like 'it's just a load of myths – passed down from generations that had no TV to watch at night so they made up all these stories'. No - the Bible is the manifested Word of God inspired by the Holy Spirit breathed full of the Life of God (2 Timothy 3:16; 2 Peter 1:21). Jesus said 'the Words I speak to you they are Spirit and Life' (John 6:63). You can trust the Scriptures because Jesus is alive and this can be proved because when you believe Him and learn how to pray, His Word protects and delivers you. Daniel was a man who loved and trusted God. His prayer life bothered some who worked with him in King Darius' kingdom, so they devised a plot to get rid of Daniel. They were jealous of the different spirit in Daniel — the Spirit of God. They tricked the King, and Daniel got thrown into the lion's den. The King was devastated because he really liked Daniel. When he went to retrieve Daniel's bones from the lion's den - he was overjoyed to find him alive and well - completely unscathed.
