

KERRY WELCOME HARDCORE ADVENTURERS

Competitors from all around the Globe will arrive in Kerry this weekend to take part in Quest

an endurance length adventure race, with two distances of 146km and 253km respectively and will take place on Saturday 25th and Sunday 26th of August. More than 250 hardened adventurers will take to the mountains, roads, paths and water in an attempt to complete their chosen course in the allotted time of either 12 or 24 hours.

The event will kick-off from the Sneem Hotel at 6am on Saturday 25th of August. The event is being run by Quest Adventure Series who operate other events around the country including Quest Killarney, Quest Glendalough and Quest Achill. The difference with this event is the endurance aspect. Many of those competing will have taken part in other Quest events but this is the first time Quest has produced a long-distance event. It is the first event of this kind in the south of Ireland.

Race Director, Oliver Kirwan said, 'We are very excited for our first long-distance endurance event to take place. Those who have signed up have made a serious commitment to train and prepare for it. We've run special training days and produced training plans as well as advice on all aspects of

preparation. There are some people doing the race to step it up a gear from our regular events, there are others who have never done an adventure race before. There are those doing it to raise money for charity and we have endurance athletes coming from all over the world for it. It's going to be a very exciting 24hrs.

"Participants start in Sneem and cycle to Carrauntoohil, ascend and descend Ireland's highest mountain, then carry on along the Ring of Kerry Road, kayaking in Waterville and back via the Kerry Way. It's a massive course and a real test for all of those taking part. We'd encourage anyone on the route to show their encouragement. Spectators can view participant's progress using a website that will track them using GPS on the route too. The hard work is done now in terms of training, best of luck to all the participants."

More than 250 participants will take part, approximately 100 on the 24 hr (258km) course and 150 on the 12hr (146km) course. Participants will travel internationally from as far afield as Australia.

Breda publishes her fourth book







EDUCATION OUTLOOK

CAO Round One of College Offers: Kerry's applicants deliver the goods

eaving Cert students have adapted seamlessly to the new grading system judging by this year's outstanding results. After a few days of waiting, any remaining uncertainty turned to unconfined joy on Monday morning as a large majority of Kerry's CAO applicants received a college offer.

The 1,802 candidates (910 females and 892 males) from Kerry who sat this year's Leaving Cert exam achieved outstanding results that paved the path to college. Kerry's CAO applicants did very well in Monday's first round of offers. On a pro rata population basis, Kerry's CAO applicants are top of the class in securing college places. More than 70% of students from the county, who sat the 2018 Leaving Cert, will progress to higher education. A further 20% will secure places in Further Education, Apprenticeships and Traineeships.

The overriding conclusion from the points' trends released on Monday morning is that CAO applicants were totally focussed on the jobs market in their course choices. They signed up in large numbers for courses in disciplines of strong employment growth. Courses in the build environment, engineering, construction, architecture and law are more competitive this year. Points' requirements for many teaching and nursing degrees are back up this year due to personnel shortages in these professions.

Science and Business courses remain competitive but are stabilising. Surprisingly, points' requirements are generally down for Physics, Information Technology and Computer Science courses despite the strong demand for graduates in these disciplines. Most Health Science courses continue to be available only to those who can reach 500 plus points. Dental Science in TCD, for example, requires a staggering 590 points this year – almost a perfect Leaving Cert exam result!

HASS (Humanities, Arts, Social Science) courses continue to be offered at modest point's levels as applicants have lost total confidence in the employment value of the liberal and creative arts.

School leavers continue to rush to college in unprecedented numbers. Despite the economic recovery, applications for college remain high. The steady flow also of mature and non-traditional applications is very much in line with government strategy to increase the skills and qualification levels of the general population. A quota of places was reserved by CAO for mature applicants and applicants from the QQI/PLC sector. The quota system is a very healthy development as everybody deserves a second chance.

50,746 CAO applicants received at least one of the 73,652 offers, which were issued on Monday. The offers consisted of 42,301 at Level 8 (Honours Bachelor Degrees) and 31,351 at Level7/6 (Ordinary Bachelor Degrees/Higher Certificates). CAO always issues more offers than there are places available in anticipation of a level of refusal by applicants. Offers are issued independently in respect of the two lists (Level 8 and Level 7/6), so that 22,906 applicants received an offer from each list on Monday.

About 80% of the 42,301 applicants, who were offered a Level 8 course, received one of their top three preferences. A phenomenal 98% of the 31,351 applicants, who were offered a Level 7/6 course, received one of their top three preferences. About 55,000 can expect to receive at least one offer of a college place before the end of the offers' season in October. Last year, out of a total of 80,766 applicants to CAO, 47,988 or 59% accepted a college place. Significantly, 32,778 or 41% of applicants to CAO last year either refused the course offered

or failed to get any course offer at all. That worrying statistic isn't going to change anytime soon.

The focus of those, who have secured a college place, now turns to finding accommodation and the money to pay for it. It seems that many students may have to make a daily return commute from Kerry to Limerick or Cork if they can't afford to meet the spiralling unregulated cost of student accommodation.








RATES OF USC 2018

In 2018, if your income is €13,000 or less you pay no Universal Social Charge (USC). (This limit was €10,036 from 2012 to 2014, €12,012 in 2015 and €13,000 in 2016 and 2017.) Once your income is over this limit, you pay the relevant rate of USC on all of your income. For example, if you have income of €13,000 you will pay no USC. If you have income of €13,001 you will pay 0.5% on income up to €12,012 and 2% on income between €12,012 and €13,001.














3 EXTRA USES FOR OLD PLASTIC PILL BOXES

*A portable sewing kit is an invaluable thing to have on you, and my own has saved me from a lot of embarrassment on numerous occasions. ONE MANS RUBBISH WAS ANOTHER MANS GAIN

Back in December 2014, Max Brown was rummaging through a rubbish skip for a community service project when he spotted a pile of ancient books hidden under some thrown-out cassette tapes.

As it started to rain, the 37-year-old gathered up as many books as he could carry and took them to safety and for six months, the collection of volumes sat on his shelf, until finally, he and his friend opened them to check out the delicate pages. It wasn't the books' contents that caught Mr. Brown's attention, however—it was the message that was written inside the front cover. In two of the books he found hand-written inscriptions that said: "From the library of Thomas Jefferson". Mr Brown contacted several appraisal experts to get the signature verified, some agreed it was whilst more said the writing was a fake. After some months he emailed an expert at Jefferson's presidential library and asked if she could verify the books' origins, the woman declared that they had, indeed, been purchased—in 1818—by the famous Founding Father who authored the US Declaration of Independence.

Mr. Brown auctioned off the books for \$8,000, saying the money was helpful to his financial state at the time.

WORLD'S 'OLDEST EVER HUMAN'

The Russian government claimed to have found the oldest woman in the world who was to be 129 years of age on June 1st last. Though there



has been no official report of her health since the 16th of May 2018, neither has her death been reported.

If it could ever be absolutely officially proven it would mean that Koku Istambulova was already 27 when Tsar Nicholas II abdicated, 55 when World War II ended and 102 for the dissolution of the Soviet Union in 1991.

The claim is made by the Pension Fund of the Russian Federation and is based on her internal passport, which shows her date of birth as June 1.1889.

Koku and her family were deported after World War II along with the entire Chechen nation to Kazakhstan and Siberia by Stalin who accused them of Nazi collaboration.

Asked how she lived so long, Koku, from a village in Chechnya, said in an interview: "It was God's will — I did nothing to make it happen. I see people going in for sports, eating something special, keeping themselves fit, but I have no idea how I lived until now." And she added: "I have not had a single happy day in my life. I have always worked hard, digging in the garden.

Relatives say five years ago she lost her only surviving daughter Tamara who lived until she was 104.

She doesn't speak about her family tragedy but she lost several children, including a son aged 6. She is articulate and able to feed herself and walk, but her eyesight is failing.

Koku said: "I survived through the (Russian) Civil War (after the Bolshevik revolution), the Second World War, the deportation of our nation in 1944 and through two Chechen wars.

"I remember tanks with Germans passing our house. It was scary. But I tried not to show this, we were hiding in the house."

Officials say all her documents were lost during the Second Chechen War from 1999 to 2009.

The pension fund, a state body, claims there are 37 people over 110 years of age in Russia.

But all these claims, including Koku's, are impossible to verify because of the lack of reliable birth or early childhood written records. The oldest documented woman in the world is regarded as 117-year-old Chiyo Miyako, born on

May 2nd, 1901, from Japan.

The oldest documented human person to have lived is Jeanne Calment, from France, who lived 122 years, 164 days, and died in 1997.

1949 - The North Atlantic Treaty Organisation (NATO) came into existence to counter the Soviet military presence in Eastern Europe.

A Word of Victory

Welcome back dear reader last week we looked at the Words of Jesus as He prophesied the end time before He comes back, and how He questioned would He find faith on His return? "Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God" (Romans 10:17) - studying and comprehending God's Word the Bible is crucial as the foundation for our faith. Some have taught that a person can receive favour from God by doing good works, but this is not true according to Hebrews 11:6"...without faith it is impossible to please God, Anyone who wants to come to Him must believe that God exists and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him". So you see it is faith that brings reward, not good works. God counts good works done by a person seeking favour as 'self-righteousness', and He equates them as 'filthy rags'! (Isaiah 64:6) Our deeds can never make us good or holy enough to have right standing with God. "He knows our weaknesses, that we are only dust" (Psalm 103:14). That is why He provided Jesus His Son to sacrifice His life to make us righteous - by the blood that He shed (1 Peter 2:24). Our foundation of faith needs to be established upon this rock.

When Jesus asked His disciples who people said He was, some answered that people thought He was "John the Baptist, or Elijah or just some other prophet", but when Jesus pressed them as to who they thought He was, Peter answered "You are the Christ (Messiah) the Son of the Living God" (Mathew 16:13-16). Jesus replied to Peter that man had not revealed this knowledge to him but Father God Himself. Then He went on to say that "you are Peter, and on this rock I will build My church" (vs. 18). Now here is where the translation of this Scripture has been misunderstood. In the original language, the name 'Peter' that Jesus gave His disciple Simon, translates as 'Petros' which means 'rock' as in a boulder or a stone; but the next use of Rock - in 'on this Rock I will build My church', translates as 'Petra' which is a mass of rock - the bedrock, Jesus was not talking about building His church on the person Peter (Petros), or elevating him to a special position, the rock (Petra) He would build His church on is the revelation of Jesus as the Son of the Living God the Messiah, our Saviour, and this needs to be the foundation of our faith - He is the Everlasting Rock that will never fail you friend! (Isaiah 26:4)



If you are disappointed about your results, remember that your goal does not need to change but how you reach it may be different.

Whether you are disappointed or delighted with the way things have worked out, you deserve a reward, so treat yourself sensibly. Be careful especially around your alcohol intake.
