

BRAIN INJURY NO OBSTACLE FOR BEAUFORT MAN AS HE PREPARES TO CYCLE THE RING OF KERRY FOR ABI CASTLEISLAND

A Mid Kerry man who acquired a brain injury following a rugby game in 2012 is appealing to the public to cycle with him in this year's Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle. Beaufort native Padraig Hallissey (24) is taking part in the iconic cycle to raise funds for Acquired Brain Injury Ireland to help fund their new Community Neuro Rehabilitation Resource Centre which will be constructed in the Cahereens West Estate, Castleisland. "I first engaged with Acquired Brain Injury Ireland in December 2013. In late 2012, I acquired a brain injury following a rugby game playing with Killarney Rugby Football Club against Kinsale. Kinsale had a penalty and the fly-half kicked the ball, it dropped short and I caught it. I ran with the ball but was tackled and fell to the ground. A player fell on my neck. I had a headache straight away but I played on as there was only five minutes left," said Padraig. Following the match Padraig still suffered pain. "I stood up but I fell back down on the bench. Luke, my trainer, walked me to my Mum's car. I rang my girlfriend Sarah but I couldn't talk for long as my head was very sore. When I arrived home my right hand and leg were numb. I went to bed but felt sick, the headache was getting worse and my hand and leg were

dead. I remember going to the bathroom and getting sick. Sarah called to see me. She sat on the bed and squeezed my left and right hands but my right hand was dead. I remember the ambulance personnel in my bedroom. Next thing I remember was waking up in Kerry General Hospital three days later." Padraig was transferred to Dublin and following 8 weeks of intensive Physiotherapy and Speech Therapy he returned home and now engages in one to one direct contact with Community Rehabilitation Assistant for ABI Kerry, Sandra Fitzgerald on a weekly basis. "Padraig is motivated and very much empowered to maximize his ability. Consistent speech and language support will enable him to beconfident and communicate in a way he was prior to acquiring a brain injury. He obtained a degree in CIT prior to the brain injury and has since returned to playing rugby, GAA with Beaufort, driving, cycling and socializing with friends. On the 5th of July he will be cycling with his girlfriend, Kerry GAA star Sarah Houlihan, his family and some friends. Why not join him on the day," said Sandra. All proceeds from the event will go towards supporting Autistic children in the Mid Kerry area, including private therapies in schools such as speech and language, occupational therapy and play and music therapy all of

which are vital therapies for children on the ASD spectrum. Autism affects many families and many of their needs are not met by central government.

Autism is a neuro-developmental disorder that affects the development of the brain in areas of social interaction and communication and is marked by severe difficulties in communicating and forming relationships with people, in developing language and in using abstract concepts. Characteristics include repetitive and limited patterns of behaviour and obsessive resistance to any changes in familiar surroundings or routines.

Autism is often referred to as the hidden disability because people who are on the autistic spectrum show no significant physical difference to their peers rather it is their behaviours that mark them out as different. The main four areas of difficulty for people with autism is social communication social interaction social imagination and sensory processing. The first signs of autism usually appear as developmental delay before the age of 3. Autism is described as a spectrum disorder this means that the symptoms and characteristics of autism can present themselves in a wide variety of combinations and can range from mild to severe. Two children with the same diagnose can act very differently from one to another you would never find any two children the same.

NOW AND THEN... BASKETBALLERS REUNITE AFTER 21 YEARS

AN All-Ireland winning basketball team that tasted success 21 years ago gathered together again this week for a nostalgic reunion event. The St. Pauls Killarney senior mens team, playing under the Revelles Nite Club banner, won the Irish Basketball All Ireland Regional League title in April 1993 and were united again for a 21st anniversary celebration and recreated a similar team photo that was taken 21 years ago.

It was the return of American coach Matt Vaughn back to Killarney for the first time since 1993 that sparked the idea of having a team reunion. Matt, who is currently head basketball coach at Lake Forest Academy in Illinois, was back in Killarney to coach at the St. Paul's annual Easter camp in Killarney Sports Centre. He was delighted to meet up with all his former players who made a special effort to come together.

The reunion also coincided with the anniversary

of the late Sean Coleman, who was Chaiman of St. Paul's Basketball Club in 1993. Sean, who was a great servant of Killarney basketball in playing and administration roles, passed away on April 21st 2001. Club officers and the players on the 1993 team were delighted that Sean's brother Kevin Coleman was able to join them for the photo and represent Sean.

Team sponsor Niall O'Donoghue, O'Donoghue/ Ring Hotels and formerly of Revelles Nite Club, was also a welcome guest at the 21st anniversary reunion.

Coach Vaughn and his squad enjoyed recalling stories and games from the 1992-93 season that reached its climax on the first weekend of April 1993 when St. Pauls Revelles were crowned Irish Basketball Regional League champions at the National Basketball Arena in Dublin. Earlier in the season, St. Pauls Revelles had enjoyed a remarkable senior national cup run as a nonleague side and they had spectacular victories

over Dungannon and Limerick before bowing out to cup champions Neptune at the quarter final stage.

The Killarney side then clinched the Southern Ireland section of the regional league and qualified for a semi-final against Dublin side Mid Sutton Baldoyle. They emerged victorious here on a 70-58 scoreline before meeting Blue Demons in the final. This was a closely contested match for a long time with St. Paul's leading 39-34 half time before going on to win 82-69.

It was this victory in April 1993 that secured St. Pauls Killarney a place in the National League for the following 1993-94 season. It marked a welcome return of national league basketball to Killarney following a long absence. The St. Paul's club competed in the the senior mens National League and Super League from 1993 until 2008.



Know Your Rights:

RENEWING A PASSPORT

QUESTION

I'm planning a trip abroad later this year but my passport will expire a couple of weeks before I'm due to travel. Will that leave me with enough time to renew my passport before I travel? Can I renew it before its expiry date?

ANSWER

The time it takes to renew a passport can vary, depending on how you make the application. The Passport Office recommends sending your application using An Post's Passport Express service. In general, this guarantees that you will get your passport within 10 working days, but it may take longer at busy times of the year. Check passport.ie for current turnaround times. The standard adult passport costs €80 through Passport Express, with a processing charge of €9 – a total charge of €89. You can hand in your completed application at any An Post office.

The Passport Office no longer accepts applications submitted by regular or registered post from applicants living in Ireland and it is not possible to apply online.

Applying in person at the Passport Office costs €95 and is only recommended if you are due to travel in less than ten days. In this case, you can use the Passport Appointment Booking Service, passportappointments.ie. There is an additional Urgent Fee of €55 if you need your passport issued in 3–5 working days. It is not usually possible to issue a passport in less than three days unless immediate travel is required due to the death or serious illness of a family member or because you need emergency medical treatment.

If you are concerned about forgetting to renew your passport in time, the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade provides a Passport Reminder Service, which sends you a reminder email before your passport is due to expire. You can register for this service at passport.ie.

You can apply for a new passport before your current one has expired. In this case your new passport will run from when you apply rather than from the expiry date of your current passport.

You can get a passport renewal application form at any Garda station or An Post office. It is not available online.



Everyone suffers from headaches from time to time which can be effectively and safely treated with simple painkillers such as paracetamol, ibuprofen etc. However, frequent use of painkillers can inadvertently become a cause of headaches

This phenomenon is known as Medication-induced Headache, which is one of the most common causes of headaches - after migraines and tension-type headaches. It can occur at any age, but most common in people aged in their 30s and 40s and is more common in women.

Medication-induced headache would be suspected if headache medication is required more than 15 days in a month or 3 days per week on a regular basis. For codeine-containing painkillers, it is lower at 10 days in a month or 2 days per week.

How does this type of headache occur?

It starts by treating a headache e.g. during a time of stress. You take painkillers to treat this headache, and over time your body becomes used to the painkillers. So within a day or so of the last dose of the painkiller, another headache comes on which you think is a recurrence of the original headache. This, in fact, could be a rebound headache due to the withdrawal effects of the last dose of the painkiller. So you take your headache medication, which relieves the headache but starts the vicious cycle all over again.

This type of headache is regularly described as oppressive and tends to be worse first thing in the morning, or after exercise. It may be a constant dull headache which sometimes gets worse. Some sufferers may start to take their painkillers every day to try to prevent the headaches but this actually makes the condition worse.

Medication-induced headache is much less likely to develop if you take painkillers regularly for other painful conditions, such as arthritis or back pain. It usually only occurs if you take painkillers for headaches and migraines and it is not clear why this is so.

What is the treatment for medication-induced headache?

The first step is to acknowledge that the cause of your headaches is the medication you are taking to treat your headaches and then develop a plan to stop the medication. This plan should be actioned under the care of your doctor.

Generally what is involved is the offending painkiller must be completely stopped for at least 1 month to cure the problem. Withdrawal symptoms such as headaches, feeling sick or problems sleeping will be experienced during the first 7-10 days or longer in some cases. It is important not to take any pain medication during this period unless your doctor prescribes an alternative painkiller for you. You will have to accept that, for a week or so, it will feel like things are getting worse before they start getting better and your pattern of headaches/migraine returns to normal.

How to prevent recurrence of medication-induced headache.

It is important that you also have a plan agreed with your doctor on how to treat headaches/migraine in the future.

- You might decide not to treat some attacks or if you need to take headache medication, as a rule it is ok to take painkillers for a day or so to treat an attack.
- Just make sure not to take for more than 2 days in any week. Consider preventative treatments to stop your headaches.
- · It is best to avoid any codeine-containing painkillers.





GEARING UP FOR THE RING OF KERRY CYCLE

WEEK 2 - WEEK BEGINNING **APRIL 21ST -EQUIPMENT/CLOTHING**

Here's to having kick started your Ring of Kerry cycle training programme and achieving the distance - 70km in week one - Congratulations!

The topic for this week is EQUIPMENT and the most important piece of equipment is YOU...So you have a choice to be smart enough to look after it!

Wearing a helmet is a very good idea and one that is highly recommended. It could make the difference between a minor injury and a serious injury should you fall off your bike. The main reason we wear a helmet is to protect our brains from damage in an unexpected impact. A helmet on the handlebars does nobody any good. An ideal road helmet will be comfortable and fit properly. Here are some pointers:

- · Helmet should sit level on the head, covering the forehead.
- · Chinstrap splitter should lie right under the ears.
- All straps should lie flat, not twisted.
- · Chin straps should be tight enough to allow only one finger between the strap and the neck - without choking.
- · Helmet should not rock from side to side, should only rock slightly forwards and backwards.

When deciding what clothing to wear, keep in mind comfort and practicality as key factors. Apart from the helmet, cycling shorts is the most important and essential item of clothing required for cycling. Cycling shorts are often frowned upon, scorned due to their lycra content and unflattering tight fit, yet this humble piece of clothing can make all the difference to your ride. Cycling shorts are available in a baggy style too. So know that a good pair of shorts with a padded chamois liner will help eliminate any saddle soreness, and allow for comfort when cycling. This will of course assist in increasing the mileage, which is the aim of the game!

Layering is vital for comfort on the bike. Layering means you are ready for heat, cold, rain, sun and even sleet! If you are comfortable on the bike you will ride better and for longer. The well-prepared cyclist has three layers. The base layer — sits next to the skin keeping it dry by wiping away sweat and helps regulate body temperature. The mid layer - adds insulation to keep you warm. The shell layer - is the body armour from the elements and this can be wind proof, waterproof or both. Of course you don't always need all three, yet it is easy to remove a layer if needed.

This weeks cycle training programme, is the same as last week, so knowing you can do it, see if you can increase your effort/speed ever so slightly, particularly on the shorter rides. Reason being is that this extra effort will lead to increasing levels of fitness.








PODIATRIST AT KERRY GENERAL HOSPITAL

At the recent Regional Health Forum Meeting, Cllr. John Joe Culloty put forward the following Question: "What is the delay in relation to providing the promised Podiatrist to Kerry General Hospital"?

For response, please see attached.

2) At this month's Council Meeting, John Joe Culloty put forward the following Motion:-

"To ask this Council:- a) How many septic tank inspections have been carried out? b) how

many of these inspections have failed? and c) what are the main causes of failure?"

62% of septic tanks failed inspection. Up to April, 8th, 55 domestic waste water treatment systems in the county had been inspected by Kerry County Council, and 34 of these, comprising 62% of the total, had been found to be non-compliant.

The figures were provided to Councillors on foot of a request for the information, by Cllr John Joe Culloty.

The principal reasons for failure were clean water entry into the units (10), de-sludging (7), grey water discharge (6), black water discharge (7), ponding of effluent (2) and others (2)

Cllr Culloty said that de-sludging and clean water entry issues could be rectified in advance of inspections, if people were aware of them. He asked that an advertising campaign, advertising this, should be undertaken.

TOURISM INITIATIVE & HELP TOWARDS LOCAL FESTIVALS

Cllr Sean Counihan has welcomed the new Community Tourism Initiative for the Diaspora which seeks to build on the legacy of The Gathering 2013. The initiative, a joint partnership between Fáilte Ireland, IPB Insurance and the 34 Local Authorities (under the auspices of the County and City Managers Association), will provide an annual fund of €1m over the next three years to support up to 700 local community-based events and festivals each year.

The Community Tourism Diaspora Initiativeis a direct response to one of the clear successes of last year's The Gathering where 5,000 communities mobilised to harness their diaspora links for the benefit of local and community tourism.

The initiative will be administered at county level where local authorities will seek applications for support from local community events. The objectives of the initiative are:

To provide support in the form of small-scale funding incentives to communitybased tourism events that have the capacity to carry through on the legacy of The Gathering in 2014 and beyond;

To create a national network of local events with the capacity to deepen diaspora links and networks that have been developed or reactivated during The Gathering year;

To foster the growth of strong county diaspora networks on the basis that diaspora relationships are rooted in 'people and place'.

MOTOR TAX COST

Cllr. Tom Doherty is calling on the Minister for the environment to reduce the amount paid in motor tax by drivers living outside of cities especially our capital city Dublin. Dublin has an excellent road network in perfect condition with a reliable quality of road surface to drive. They also have a public transport system with buses, the dart as well as the leus. The roads here in Kerry are in a deplorable state and a hazard to road users.

Cllr. Tom Doherty questions the purpose of paying the same price for motor tax as that in Dublin without receiving the same quality of road maintenance. It is costing the motorist more here with the added expenses of new tyres and other motor vehicle repair costs.

ROAD FROM COOLCORCORAN CROSS TO INCHYCULLANE CROSS KILCUMMIN

Kerry TD Tom Fleming has called on the Minister for Transport, Tourism and Sport, Leo Varadkar to make emergency funding available for the road between Coolcorcoran Cross and Inchycullane Cross Kilcummin. Deputy Fleming who raised the matter in the Dail this week said this road is in need of urgent restoration work. The Independent TD also stated the very bad condition of the road is now a danger to the public and a 'Health and Safety' issue.

REPLY: The improvement and maintenance of regional and local roads is the statutory responsibility of each local authority, in accordance with the provisions of Section 13 of the Roads Act 1993. Works on those roads are funded from local authorities' own resources

supplemented by State road grants.

The Department has allocated a total of €145 million to local authorities for the Restoration Improvement Grant Programme (RI) in 2014. Of this figure a total of €6.55 million has been allocated to Kerry County Council. The selection and prioritisation of works to be undertaken, taking into account available grant funding, is a matter for the local authority. Local authorities do have flexibility in relation to re-prioritising RI schemes as necessary.

It is, therefore, open to Kerry County Council to re-prioritise its RI programme to include these schemes, fund works from its Discretionary Grant or progress such projects through its own resources.

KILLARNEY TOWN COUNCIL

Cllr. Danny Healy Rae put forward the following notice of motion at the Kerry Co Council Meeting last Monday asking that the people of Killarney Town and the adjacent hinterland continue to be facilitated by retaining all the services they have had available to them in the town and the local area offices and that the staff would not be relocated from Killarney as this would disenfranchise all the people of the town and the entire area and to ask that the commercial rates collected in Killarney Town be left in Killarney to maintain the services, Cllr Healy Rae feels that this is vital to maintain services





OUTLOOK ON THE STATE EXAMINATIONS

Plan your approach in the final term

(By Billy Ryle)

The state exams begin on Wednesday, 4th June so it's vital to make optimum use of the remaining time. Manage your revision efficiently and sharpen your exam techniques. Concentrate on a final revision of your course material and practice answering past exam papers. Be organised in your revision plan. Set down priorities in the subject areas, which you intend to revise. Be patient and methodical in your routine.



Don't be over ambitious in your revision planning. Take a self-contained manageable unit of work in a revision session. Cramming – extended revision sessions with too much content – is the least effective way to prepare for exams. When answering past exam papers simulate exam conditions as far as possible. Using A4 paper, try to answer within the time period allowed for each question. Accurately number each question and part of question. Ensure that your handwriting is legible, that your diagrams are detailed and that your presentation is neat. Attend school each day up to the end of term as your best work is done under the expertise of your teachers, who will guide you through revision and exam techniques. Be familiar with the format of each exam paper. Be aware of the style of questions and the topics examined in each paper. Know how the marks for each paper are allocated and how much time should be spent on each question. As the final weeks are for revision and for answering past exam papers, avoid studying new unfamiliar material, if possible. If you have missed out on some part of the course, give that topic immediate priority. Study the topic, revise the topic and consolidate it by answering past questions based on it. The alternative is to omit that topic completely. In summary, an intensive revision period is the best prescription for effective exam preparation. Efficient management of your home study is vital. A regular routine is essential. Study for about four hours on each of the five weekday nights. Two sessions of about two hours each with a half-hour break in between will result in good quality work. Aim to do seven or eight hours of revision spread over Saturday and Sunday. Prepare a daily, weekly and full term study schedule. Review your progress at the end of each week. Be disciplined and organised in your approach to study. Stick to your routine and to your study schedule. Use short breaks between subjects. But avoid unscheduled breaks and beware of "time thieves" such as excessive TV watching and long telephone calls. Good working conditions are vital aids to effective study. A comfortable study environment at home is essential. If possible, study on your own where you will have peace and quietness. A comfortable room temperature, neither too hot nor too cold, aids concentration. You need a table or desk on which to write and a hard-backed chair on which to sit. Good lighting keeps you from getting tired. A desk lamp, if available, is a useful aid to mental application. Your total focus must be on your work, so don't allow yourself to be distracted. Use a reward system to reinforce your progress and to maintain your momentum. The aim of doing well in your exam is your greatest motivator but also build in a few treats. After an evening of study, your reward might be a favourite television programme or listening to some music. At the weekend treat yourself to a film or a swim in the local leisure complex. As a result, you will face the challenges ahead of you with confidence and renewed energy.

In the next article, I'll take a detailed look at mental preparation for the examinations.



RECIPES OF THE WEEK

SPINACH BACON AND CHEESE TARTS

This tart is delicious hot or cold. If you haven't got the correct flan tin use a similar sized small baking dish or roasting tin, which will do the job just as well. This is perfect for using up leftover ham or bacon from a joint.

SERVES 4

- 50g butter, plus extra for greasing
- 100g cooked ham or loin of bacon, cut into cubes
- 1 small onion, finely chopped
- 350g fresh spinach, washed, well drained and tough stalks removed
- 5 sheets filo pastry, thawed
- 75g cheese strong cheddar or blue cheese
- 3 eggs
- 6 tablesp. of reduced fat creme fraiche
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper
- Lightly dressed green salad and boiled new potatoes, to serve

то соок **METHOD**

Preheat the oven to Gas Mark 4,180C (350 F). Lightly butter a 35 x 11cm loose-bottomed flan tin. Heat a large non-stick frying pan. Add a knob of the butter and cook the onion for 4-5 minutes

until softened not coloured. Stir in the spinach and cook for a few minutes until wilted. stirrina. the Turn mixture into



a sieve and press well with a wooden spoon to squeeze out all of the excess liquid. Melt the remaining butter in a small pan or in the microwave. Lay one sheet of filo across the base of the tin with the edges slightly overhanging the sides. Brush with melted butter. Repeat with the remaining sheets, arranging them at different, overlapping angles.

Spoon the spinach and onion mixture into the pastry case and scatter the ham or bacon on top, then grate or crumble over the cheese. Beat together the eggs, creme fraiche and seasoning in a bowl, then pour into the pastry case. Bake for 30 minutes until the filling is set and the filo pastry is golden. To serve, cut into slices and arrange on plates with salad and new potatoes.





ORANGE AND CHOCOLATE ICE CREAM

This is a delicious dessert that will keep in the freezer for up to six weeks!

SERVES 8-10

INGREDIENTS

- Zest of an orange
- Juice of ½ an orange
- 4 large eggs, separated
- 100g golden caster sugar
- 300ml cream

• 100g chocolate, finely chopped

то соок **METHOD**

Line a 1 litre loaf tin with cling film. Put the orange zest and juice, egg yolks and sugar in a bowl. Beat until thick and creamy.

Beat the egg whites until stiff, set aside. Now beat the cream until it holds its shape.

Fold the cream into the egg mixture, then

carefully fold in the egg whites. Stir through the chopped chocolate and spoon into the loaf tin. Cover the surface with cling film. Place in the freezer for about two hours. When frozen wrap in tin foil.

ADVICE FOLLOWING ROAD TRAFFIC ACCIDENT

You need to know what to do if you have an accident. You want simple steps to deal with the situation and on how to stay safe.

What to do

- Stop as soon as you can
- Always stop at the scene if you think your accident has caused:
- injury to people or pets
- damage to other vehicles
- damage to roadside fixtures such as lampposts, fences and walls.

When to call 999

Which emergency service to ask for:

- if anyone needs urgent medical attention ask for an ambulance
- if the road is blocked or damaged ask for
- if someone leaves the scene without leaving their details - ask for the police

Exchange details

All drivers involved should swap names, addresses, telephone numbers, vehicle registration numbers and insurance company details and policy numbers. This will all help with any claims process.

Get witness details

Take down the names, addresses and vehicle registrations of any witnesses who saw the incident.

Make a sketch or take a photo



Draw or photograph the scene and remember to include as many details as you can. Note the road names, vehicle locations and any skid mark directions and collision points. Be careful of busy roads when you're making sketches or taking photos of the scene.

Make a note of any additional details

Try to recall any extra information if you can - for example, if a driver was using a mobile phone.

Avoid it

As well as following the Rules of the Road and driving sensibly, consider these tips to avoid driving accidents:

Car maintenance tips

Make sure that your car is well maintained, has enough fuel and oil and that your tyres are in good condition and the right pressure (including your spare).

Motorway driving tips

- Take care when approaching intersections where traffic joins the motorway and when joining the motorway.
- Follow motorway signals that warn drivers of dangers ahead including accidents and poor road or weather conditions.

Driving awareness tips

- Keep your distance at least a 2–second gap on dry roads and a 4 – second gap on wet roads or in poor visibility.
- Slow down in foggy conditions and use your lights. Keep a sensible distance. In very bad fog open your window slightly and turn off your radio so that you can hear other vehicles.
- Take regular breaks at service areas, but never on the hard shoulder. If you feel sleepy, get off the motorway at the first opportunity.
- Take extra care at road works and when approaching them. Reduce your speed and obey warning signs.

TOP TIPS FOR SAFE TOWING

Improvements in the weather traditionally mean more and more drivers will head out on the roads towing caravans and other loads.

Britain's most senior advanced driver is offering a few tips to help them tow as safely as possible. People should follow a series of techniques when towing other cars, boats, horseboxes and caravans, as they are obviously responsible for two vehicles rather than one.

The first check is to ensure that what is being towed is certainly no heavier than 85% of the kerb weight of the towing vehicle. Anything heavier is likely to be unstable and could easily lead to accidents.

Drivers should check that nothing is loose or disconnected before they set off and again a short way into their journey. All light connections should be tested with the help of another person and all towed units and vehicles must have an illuminated number plate.

Tyre pressures across all vehicles should be checked and drivers should naturally increase their stopping distances because of the extra load, leaving plenty of room from the car in front in case it brakes sharply.

Overtaking, turning, parking, lane changes and

motorway entrances and exits will all take more time and require more space.

Although the law doesn't demand the use of extended mirrors, these are extremely useful and make up for not being able to use the rear view mirror.

Towing vehicles often have to adhere to different speed limits and they should allow other drivers to pass wherever possible.

Read our simple guide to getting behind the wheel for the first time... You want to get your driving licence but don't know where to begin. You know you'll have to take a driving test, though you're not sure what learning to drive involves.

WHAT TO DO

- 1. Get your provisional licence. You can get an application form from any Post Office or Garda Station.
- 2. Find a teacher. Anyone over 21 who has had a licence for 3 years can teach you to drive, but the best and safest way to learn is to take lessons with an Approved Driving Instructor.
- 3. Automatic or manual? Decide what you want to drive. Automatic is easier but doesn't qualify you to drive a manual when you pass your test.
- 4. Book your first driving lesson. Most people need about 45 hours of instruction before they pass their driving test.
- 5. Make sure you are insured to drive any car that you intend to practise in.
- 6. Practice makes perfect. It's wise to get in about 20 hours of practice time before your test. By law, you need to be accompanied by someone over 21 who has had a full driving licence for at least 3 years.
- 7. Get your L plates. You'll need to display L plates prominently on the front and back of any car you drive while you practise.
- 8. Study for the theory test. You'll need to pass the theory exam before you take your driving test.

AVOID IT

Avoid breaking the law when you learn to drive. Make sure you:

- Do not drive unaccompanied
- Wear glasses or contact lenses if you need them
- Drive a car which is legal, roadworthy, properly taxed and insured for you

It's also worth remembering that it is illegal for anyone to charge you for driving lessons unless they are an Approved Driving Instructor.


















YOU ATTRACT WHO YOU ARE!

SPIN TO TRIM

Long considered a child's apparatus, hula hoops are making a comeback for a stronger core and smaller waist.

Hooping – the modern evolution of the hula hoop, is no child's play, although you've probably spun it around aplenty as a kid. It has become popular in some parts of the world and proponents promote the activity as a total body workout. According to a study conducted at University of Wisconsin-La Crosse in the United States, hooping burns an average of seven calories a minute and around 210 calories for a 30-minute workout. Plus you get a sleeker midsection without having to do spot training for the abs. The rhythmic nature of hooping can also be relaxing and meditative.

History states that hula-hooping dates back thousands of years to ancient Egypt and Greece when children used hoops fashioned from grapevines for play. It spread to England and the rest of the world as a recreational and dance activity before gyms and fitness centres started using it for exercise.

The community grew to be so big that in 2007, two hoopers founded World Hoop Day. Thousands of hoopers synchronised their steps and gyrated their hips on six continents, and continue to do so on the first Saturday of October every year.

The day also brings cost-effective toys that double as a portable gym to remote areas of the world where resources are limited.

Hoopers perform in many cities and countries to raise money for charity, and donate hoops to societies that can't afford them. The intention is for children to have fun, exercise their imaginations, and keep physically fit.

Weighted hula hoops for adults weigh between one to five pounds (0.5 to 2.3kg) and are made of wood, rattan or plastic tubing. In contrast, children's hoops are typically made of lightweight plastic, have a very small diameter, and are incredibly difficult for most adults to

With smaller and lighter hoops, it takes more energy to keep the hoop going, so it's sheer

wonder how the children spin it so well.

The added resistance created by a somewhat heavier hoop allows it to rotate around the body slowly, and has a remarkable way of sculpting and reshaping in all the right places. How to choose a hoop? The right size reaches anywhere between just below your belly button and the middle of your chest when it's resting vertically on the ground. The weight is up to you. Most weighted hoops have a diameter between 38 and 42 inches (96-107cm).

You don't need to be a whiz to learn to hoop. Start with one leg in front of the other, and loop the hoop over your belly. Hold the hoop parallel to the floor, contract your abdominal muscles, give it a good twirl to start spinning, and slowly rock back and forth in a circular motion until you get the rhythm.

If your hoop wobbles and starts to fall, lengthen your spine and move faster. Move side to side with your waist and hips or back to front with your belly.

It's best to spin in both directions so both sides of the abs get an equal workout, although, if you're right-handed, it's easier to spin anticlockwise.

THIS WEEKS GOOD NEWS

James Crane worked on the 101st floor of Tower 1 of the World Trade Centre. He is blind so he has a golden retriever named Daisy. After the plane hit 20 stories below, James knew that he was doomed, so he let Daisy go, out of an act of love. She darted away into the darkened hallway. Choking on the fumes of the jet fuel and the smoke James was just waiting to die. About 30 minutes later, Daisy came back along with James' boss, who Daisy just happened to pick up on floor 112. On her first run of the building, she led James, James' boss, and about 300 more people out of the doomed building. But she wasn't through yet, she knew there were others who were trapped. So, highly against James' wishes she ran back in the building. On her second run, she saved 392 lives. Again she went back in. During this run, the building collapsed. James hears about this and falls on his knees into tears. Against all known odds, Daisy made it out alive, but this time she was carried by a firefighter. "She led us right to the people, before she got injured" the fireman explained. Her final run saved another 273 lives. She suffered acute smoke inhalation, severe burns on all four paws, and a broken leg, but she saved 967 lives.

Daisy is the first civilian Canine to win the Medal of Honour of New York City.

WHEN YOU WERE A CHILD WERE THERE MAOL CATTLE IN YOUR HERD?

Irish Moiled Cattle are one of the most distinctive breeds of cattle in Ireland, and the only surviving domestic livestock native to Northern Ireland. The word moile (or maol) comes from Gaelic and refers to the distinctive dome on top of the animal's head. It is a hornless breed, usually red in colour with white features, such as the belly and a marked line along the back, though individuals' coats can vary. They are medium sized, and have a docile temperament. They are excellent converters of

forage, and thrive on the poorest of pastures, and can be easily maintained on less acreage than most other cattle breeds. It is believed that they have large stomachs to help them digest large quantities of poorer quality forage. A preference for willow ash and ivy makes them ideal for extensive grazing situations.

Irish maoled cattle produce tender, wellmarbled beef with a distinctive flavour. The average steer carcass weight is between 220 and 260 kg. Cows are able to produce a calf every 12 months until at least 10 years of age if kept in good health, and when raised in extensive systems may produce up to 5000 liters of milk per year.

Today, Irish moiled cattle are quite rare, with only a couple of hundred females in existence. Maoled cattle are referred to in myths and legends dating back to 640 AD, and were taken by the Vikings to Scandinavia. Because this breed thrives on wetter ground than most cattle, it was traditionally the animal of choice in eastern and southern areas of the province of Ulster. In the late 1970's the breed was down to 30 females and a couple of bulls owned by two breeders in Northern Ireland. Since then, there has been renewed interest in the breed and numbers are building, though today it is still quite rare, with only a couple of hundred females in existence throughout the entirety of Ireland. Beef from the breed can be found in a limited number of specialty shops.

WHAT'S BIGGER THAN A BUS BUT HAS PREY SMALLER THAN A GRAIN OF RICE?

Basking sharks are the world's second-largest fish (only the whale shark is bigger) and can grow to the length of a bus, more than 12 metres from tip to tail.

Basking sharks can weigh more than four tonnes — heavier than a couple of cars — yet they feed primarily on zooplankton, which are smaller than a grain of rice.

Although sometimes mistaken for great white sharks, basking sharks are gentle giants with tiny teeth and are harmless to humans.

The basking shark's highly adapted mouth and gill structure can filter enough water to fill an Olympic-size swimming pool every 90 minutes. The mouth of a basking shark is so unique that the structure of the mouth cavity has recently inspired the design of a more efficient hydroelectric water turbine.

Where are these basking sharks?

Do you wonder why you've never seen a basking shark? Despite being found along both the Pacific and Atlantic coasts of Canada, basking sharks are rarely seen in the wild. On the Pacific coast only about one a year is officially sighted, a stark contrast to 60 years ago when schools of hundreds of basking sharks could regularly be seen.

Basking sharks faced aggressive extermination in the 1950s and '60s, and because they are often found "basking" near the surface, they can become entangled in fishing gear and hit by shipping vessels. These threats have reduced basking shark populations to the point where some have disappeared and others need protection.

In January, Canada's Department of Fisheries and Oceans released a policy to assist in the recovery of the basking shark. It instructs vessels on how to operate around basking sharks and how to report a sighting if you are fortunate enough to see one.

DID YOU KNOW....

There are three species of zebra and in the wild they are only found in Africa. They include: Burchell's zebra, also known as the common or plains zebra; Grevy's zebra, named for Jules Grevy, a 19th century French president who received one from Abyssinia as a gift; and the Equus zebra. All three belong to the genus Equus, which includes horses and donkeys.

*Zebra's distinctive stripes are thought to offer protection – they provide camouflage against grasses and make individual animals difficult to single out in a herd when viewed by predators. But new research suggests that the stripes may have evolved as a deterrent to blood-sucking insects.

Each species of zebra has different types of stripes, varying in width and pattern distribution. Curiously, the farther south on the African plains the zebra lives, the father apart its stripes will be.

- Within each species, no two zebras have the same stripes; they are as unique as fingerprints.
- "Tijuana Zebras" are not zebras, at all. They are painted donkeys used in the Mexican town as a tourist gimmick.
- Zebras weigh anywhere from 400 to 850 pounds, depending on the species. The Grevy's zebra is the largest wild member of the horse family.
- Constantly on the watch for lions and hyenas, a herd helps with all of its extra eyes to monitor for danger. If a zebra is attacked, other zebras come to its defence and form a circle around it to ward off the predator.

FISHERMAN FINDS WORLD'S **OLDEST MESSAGE** BOTTLE

In 1913, 20-year-old Richard Platz wrote a note on a postcard, threw two stamps along with it into a brown beer bottle, closed it, and tossed it into the sea. More than 100 years later, Platz's words brought tears into his granddaughter's eyes. She had never known much about her grandfather until his message in a bottle.

Richard Platz was the son of a baker. In 1913, he was on a nature hike with a nature appreciation group along the Baltic Sea in northern Germany when he wrote his message. His postcard was dated May 17, 1913, and the message asked that whoever would find it, would put the two stamps on it – and please return it to his home address in Berlin.

More than 100 years later, Richard Platz's message in the old beer bottle was found by 65-year-old fisherman Konrad Fischer last month in Kiel, which is in northern Germany and not too far from where Platz had tossed it into the ocean. After finding the beer bottle, the fisherman gave his amazing find to the International Maritime Museum in Hamburg. Mr. Fischer used a wire to get the rolled-up

postcard out of the bottle and he knew the bottle was authentic because it had a picture of an old German brewery on it, the postcard was written in old German letters and many of them were faded because of the longtime exposure to the sunlight and the dampness. However, he was able to read the year 1913 he said.

Holger von Neuhoff from the International Maritime Museum described the beer bottle to be in the utmost perfect condition. Despite the passing of time and the dampness, many of the words on the postcard were still legible. "This is certainly the first time such an old message in a bottle was found, particularly with the bottle intact," he said. So far, Guinness World Records identified the oldest message in a bottle dating back to 1914. It had spent nearly 98 years at sea before being fished from the water.

Instead of returning the 100-year-old message to Platz's address in Berlin, researchers tracked down his 62-year-old granddaughter Angela Erdmann in Berlin. When Ms. Erdmann answered the knock on the door and discovered the person was a family researcher who had tracked her down, she could hardly believe that her grandfather had written a message in a bottle more than 100 years ago. Her grandfather Richard had died before she was born, and she never knew much about

After seeing the 100-year-old message and reading her grandfather's words, Ms. Erdman conducted her own family research and was able to find old diaries and letters from her grandfather Richard Platz who was her mother's father and who had died in 1946 at the age of 54.

SELF-ACCEPTANCE II

Last week we highlighted our tendency to be self-critical and extremely hard on ourselves. Self-acceptance on the other hand means accepting ourselves just as we are whilst acknowledging that there is always room for improvement. This can be very difficult however and requires a change in how we view and what we tell ourselves. By developing a 'selfaccepting' voice we focus on validating ourselves rather than paying heed to the automatic negative thoughts. Instead of listening to the thought that says 'I'm not good enough' or 'I'll never get it right' we validate ourselves (much as a parent might a child) saying something like 'I know your feeling useless right now. It's Ok. This is challenging and difficult and frustrating. But you are capable. How about taking a break and coming back to it later" Despite the feelings of guilt, self-criticism and negative put downs, we can start by telling ourselves, that we've done the best we could do.

We need to look at what is it within ourselves that we don't accept - and begin to bring more compassion and understanding to those aspects of ourselves. Perhaps there is a part of us that we are rejecting based on the internal programming (and not the actual reality) that we received as a child. Sometimes our lack of self-acceptance is due to our unwillingness to feel or experience uncomfortable emotions. At other times unrealistic expectations can lead to lack of self-acceptance. When we are unable to forgive ourselves for our 'humanness' then it is very difficult to develop selfacceptance.

Practicing mindfulness can be a great way to begin to become aware of the negative, self-judging thoughts we continuously tell ourselves. It becomes like watching a movie - where you are having these thoughts but these thoughts are not who you are.

Self-acceptance isn't about fixing anything in ourselves. Instead it is affirming who we are (warts and all) at this point in time. It's not that we ignore our faults or weaknesses we just view them as not relevant to our overall sense of acceptability. We accept ourselves today, just as we are, regardless of our shortcomings. Whilst we can commit to make changes in the future that will enrich our lives - it's about being Okay right now. The only thing we need to change at this moment in time is the way we view ourselves.

TRAVEL VACCINATION PART 2

Rabies: Rabies is a fatal disease, which humans can contract from the bit of a rabid animal. It is present in many countries but is higher risk in some developing countries.

• Rabies Vaccination pre-exposure course consists of three doses, one on day 0, then one on days 7 and 21 or 28. Single reinforcing dose every 2-5 years for those at risk.

Pneumococcal Disease: Pneumococcal Disease is an infection caused by bacteria. It can cause serious, possibly life threatening illnesses, notably: pneumonias (an infection of the lungs), septicaemia (blood poisoning) or meningitis (an infection of the linings around the brain)

Pneumonical Vaccine, for most patients a single dose is sufficient

Influenza: Influenza is an acute viral infection of the respiratory tract affecting all age groups. It can cause serious, possibly life threatening illnesses, the most frequent complication is bacterial chest infection.

A primary course is completed

Meningococcal Meningitis: A dangerous illness that is spread through coughs, sneezes and close contact .The types that are common in Africa , the middle east and some parts of Asia are mainly preventable .the Saudi Arabian government requires all pilgrims to the hajj and umrah to be vaccinated with a meningococcal vaccine A,C,W and Y strains. The certificate of vaccination is valid for 3 years from 10 days after the

 Meningococcal Meningitis Vaccine consists of a single injection which helps protect patients for at least 3 years and up to 5 years. The certificate is valid from 10 days after vaccination and for 3 years thereafter.

Japanese Encephalitis: A life threatening virus which affects the brain. It is spread by mosquitoes during the rainy seasons in SE Asia and the Far East.

Tick Borne Encephalitis: This disease is spread by ticks that live in forested areas of northern and central Europe especially during late spring and summer.

Hepatitis B: Hepatitis B is a highly infectious virus spread through blood, semen and other body fluids. Contact even through tiny quantities of an infected person's body fluid can pass the virus on.

Travelling tips: At least 2 months prior to travel, seek more detailed advice from your

Food and water: When travelling in countries where hygiene is poor:

- · Avoid eating shellfish , salads , unpeeled fruit and uncooked food, make sure cooked food is piping hot
- Remember "boil it, cook it, peel it or forget it".
- Drink either mineral water or branded / canned drinks at all times, including when cleaning your teeth.
- Do not have ice in your drinks, as it is usually be made from tap water stand your glass in ice instead.
- Ask your pharmacist about oral rehydration therapy to help you cope in case of dehydration.
- Carry anti diarrhoea tablets.

Sun: • Avoid sun exposure from 11.00 am — 3.00pm

- Always use appropriate strength sun block suiting your skin type.
- Remember: Slip your shirt, slop on some sunscreen and slap on a hat.

Insects: • Use Insect Repellents.

Take antihistamine tablets / cream to treat insect bites or skin rashes.
