NEWS DESK Stockton's Wing return to Milltown after 20 years

Milltown-Listry hen Comhaltas hosted their first County Fleadh Cheoil in Milltown in 1998, a live openair performance by trad supremos Stockton's Wing was the undoubted highlight. Now, 20 years later, they return to the Fleadh in Milltown with a special open-air concert on the Gig Rig on Saturday, 23 June at 9.00pm. The six-strong line-up for the concert performance includes Mike Hanrahan (vocals and guitar), Paul Roche (flute and tin whistle), Tommy Hayes (percussion, bodhrán, spoons), Tara Breen (fiddle), Paul McSherry (guitar) and Karol Lynch (banjo and mandolin). Following the critical success of their reunion tour to celebrate 40 years of Stocktons Wing in 2017 the band are continuing to wow audiences. A new song written by Mike Hanrahan 'We had it all' was released in May 2018, the first Stockton's Wing release for many years and plans are in place to record a new CD before the end of the year. 'To be hosting such an internationally renowned group as this is a great coup for the Fleadh,' said festival chairman, Owen O'Shea. 'We had the honour of introducing Stockton's Wing to the stage way back in 1998 and to have them back 20 years on

makes it a very special anniversary milestone for the Fleadh in Milltown and the band itself.

'We decided to have the performance on the Gig Rig in the Square and free of charge to bring the very special Stockton's Wing experience to the masses. This has been thanks to the very warm generosity of the local business community and sponsors from further afield who have made this wonderful concert possible,' said Owen.

Stockton's Wing began their career in Ennis sometime in 1977 with Kieran Hanrahan on banjo, mandolin and

harmonica, Paul Roche on Flute and whistle, Maurice Lennon on fiddle, Tommy Hayes on bodhrán, spoons and bones and Tony Callinan on guitar and vocals. The name Stockton's Wing came from a Bruce Springsteen song, 'Backstreets' from the album 'Born to Run': 'Slow dancing on a moonlit street at Stockton's Wing, where desperate lovers park to meet the last of the Duke Street Kings.'The group's hit, Beautiful Affair was voted into the top 75 songs in the history of RTÉ radio, and Today FM voted the song no. 7 in a top 20 all time poll of Irish songs.

Kerry Gardener wins Silver Gilt Medal at **RHS Chelsea Flower Show**

The Wild Atlantic Garden created by Kerry man Billy Alexander has been awarded a Silver Gilt Medal at the RHS Chelsea Flower Show, the world's most prestigious flower show.

The garden showcases rare and exotic ferns grown and matured in Kerry at Kells Bay House and Gardens. The garden was named 'The Wilde Atlantic Garden' thanks to the very generous sponsorship and support by Wilde Aparthotels by Staycity.

The theme of Billy's exhibit this year was to give garden enthusiasts an example of his uniquely curated, densely matured and extensive tree-fern forest. Billy said: "I chose the tree-fern theme for this years' show because I wanted to display the significance of their preservation around the globe."

Billy went on to say: "We were truly honoured to be chosen to exhibit at Chelsea this year and winning the Silver Gilt medal was the icing on the cake. Our main objective was to showcase the magnificence and beauty of ferns from around the globe. The exhibit was revolved around the exotic, natural environment of the fern and their vital role in the evolution of plants." Garden enthusiasts will have the chance to see Billy's garden up close this year when he exhibits it at the Bloom in the Park festival, in Phoenix

Park over the June Bank Holiday weekend.

Originally developed by the Blennerhasset family in the 19th Century, Kells Bay's 44-acres of wildly overgrown *Robinsonian heritage gardens and ongoing restoration was started by Billy and his wife Penn in 2006. It is now a true piece of heaven on earth, containing some of the rarest and most exotic plant species in the world.

n award in memory of a hugely popular personality in the Killarney tourism trade, has been presented to a student at IT Tralee. The Skal Club of Kerry in cooperation with the Irish Academy of Hospitality and Tourism at the Institute of Technology Tralee, awarded first year student, Michelle O 'Sullivan 'The Eckhard Gogsch Service and Skills Award 2018'. Eckhard, who passed away in May 2016, spent his entire life working at different levels in the industry. Eckhard was born and reared near the spectacular Lake Constance in Germany and moved to Killarney in 1968 to take up a position in the Hotel Europe as head waiter, also working in the sister hotel Dunloe Castle. In the mid 1980s

Eckhard took up a position with Failte Ireland and the State agency Cert and was centre manager in many of their training schools including the former Torc Great Southern Hotel and Dromhall Hotel and it was in these schools that students were prepared for careers in the tourism industry. Students acquired a range of skills such as ; food preperation, restaurant service, accommodation service, bar and front office as well as business operations and communications . Eckhard always stressed to students that working in the hospitality industry was rewarding and that there were ample opportunities for career progression. In addition to formal training and practical experience Eckhard had the ability to inspire,

motivate and demonstrate excellent customer skills to the students and the value of the customer, he used to always say 'a satisfied customer tells at least 3 people where an angry customer tells 3000'. Later he started a freelance tour company with his wife Patricia bringing visitors from all over the world to Ireland and leading them on great adventures through out the country. He was a very active member of the Kerry Skal Club since is inception twenty one years ago attending all their functions . It is because of his active involvement in the hospitality and tourism industry, Skal kerry have decided to present this award in his memory. Eckhard's wife Patricia and son Dieter attended the presentation at IT Tralee.

that Kerry has retained its 14 Blue Flags at 13 of the county's beaches as well as Fenit Marina. The decision of the Blue Flag jury announced this week sees the following beaches retain their flags for 2018: Rossbeigh, Ballybunion North, Ballybunion South, Ballyheigue, Fenit, Maherbeg, Kells, Derrynane, White Strand, Ballinskelligs, Banna, Ceann Trá (Ventry) and Inch. Fenit Marina also retains it Blue Flag this year. Four Green Coast awards have also been announced for Béal Bán, Castlegregory, Littor and Ballinskelligs.

Welcoming the announcement, Cllr Sheahan said: 'Blue Flags are an important indicator of the quality of our beach environment and it is encouraging that Kerry is continuing

to set a very high standard in this regard". Kerry County Council invests tremendous effort in working to keep County Kerry at the top of the Blue Flag Awards Programme, and will continue to invest the necessary resources to ensure the sustainable management of the magnificent beaches along the Kerry coast,' he said.

As beaches become busier over the coming months, Kerry County Council asks all beach users to ensure they leave no litter on the beaches of Kerry or damage the wonderful coastal areas in any way so that the county can maintain and improve on its Blue Flag complement.

Killarney Basketball legend and former Mayor Paudie O'Connor was fondly remembered at his funeral mass in St. Mary's Cathedral, Killarney, last Saturday morning.

Killarney Parish Administrator Fr Kieran O'Brien, chief celebrant, recalled Paudie's outstanding sporting and political career. There were also emotional tributes from Paudie's daughter Morgan and his brother Seamie O'Connor.

The huge crowd in the Cathedral included several people from all parts of Ireland as former teammates and opponents gathered to pay their respects.

Killarney came to a standstill as the hearse went through the streets.

Paudie's former club and International teammate Tim Regan led the Basketball guard of honour while Dr Crokes GAA Club Chairman Patrick O'Sullivan led the GAA one. A Dr Crokes flag and Paudie's famous No. 12 basketball singlet with St. Vincent's Killarney adorned the urn in the hearse.

At Aghadoe Cemetery, Seamie O'Connor released two white doves in memory of his late brother.

Paudie O'Connor passed away on May 1st at his home in Las Vegas at the age of 66. He is still ranked as the greatest Irish basketball

player of all time and represented Ireland over 100 times. A former Irish captain, he was the first and only Irish player ever to be selected on a European All Star first five in 1977. His visionary skills and ambition brought Irish basketball to a new level in 1979 when he brought the first American professional players to the Irish league. He was also a driving force of the popular John Player and Pretty Polly Ladies Basketball Championships that used to attract over 120 teams from all over Ireland to Killarney every Easter in the 970s and 80s. A funeral service also took place in Guardian Angel Cathedral, Las Vegas

recently. Predeceased by his parents Mai (1987) and Dan (2001) and brother Benny (2009), Paudie is survived by his beloved daughter, Morgan (nee O'Connor) Mauro, her mother, Marty; son-in-law, Marcello Mauro; grandson, Luciano Connor Mauro; brothers, Seamie and Mike; sistersin-law, Fidelma and Peggy; and nephews, Patrick, Richard and Philip O'Connor, relatives and a large circle of friends.



Cllr Cronin receives commitment on Listry Bridge

At this week's Council meeting Cllr. Brendan Cronin proposed and got confirmation from C.E. Moira Murrell that Kerry County Council are making an appraisal application to the Dept. of Transport Tourism & Sport seeking approval for funding for a new two lane bridge on the R563 at Listry under the attached Dept. Guidelines for projects on regional roads for projects costing less than €5 million and more than €0.5 million.

A preliminary new bridge design complete with footpaths has been costed in a recent feasibility study at €2.632,139 plus vat. The commitment given today by Ms. Morrell is that the appraisal application will be prepared and made to the Dept. of Transport tourism & sport by Mid July 2018 for Department approval.

"In making the proposal today I highlighted how

important the construction of a new bridge at Listry is for local residents, road users, Tourism, business, and road safety. It is the main transport access for tourism and business from Killarney to west Kerry, it would provide improved transport efficiency, enhance regional access and provide a major opportunity to strengthen and enhance our rural economy, it is also within the Clar area and on examining the Dept. Guidelines complies with much of the criteria required", Cllr. Cronin told the Killarney Outlook.

"I wish to acknowledge the commitment given today on Listry Bridge by the Council C.E Ms. Morrell as a major step forward. I have also requested that our council follow up the application with a deputation to the Department of Transport supporting the project", he added.

PAYE MODERNISATION CHANGES FROM 1 JANUARY 2019

A Revenue Payroll Notification (RPN) will replace the current Tax Deduction Card (P2Q). From 1 January 2019, you will be required to: -request the most up to date RPN before making payments to employees

-report employee payments in real-time -reconcile Revenue's response to the payroll submission. At the end of each month, you will receive a statement from Revenue with payroll submission totals. You will need to either:

-accept the statement as your monthly return

-correct payroll data if the statement is incorrect.
A variable direct debit option will also be available, subject to Revenue approval.
What is a Revenue Payroll Notification (RPN)?

What is a Revenue Payroll Notification (RPN)? The RPN will provide you with the necessary information to deduct from the employee the correct: Tax - USC - UPT

You will be able to request an RPN using third party payroll software or through ROS. RPNs will be available to you before 1 January 2019.

New employees

You can request an RPN for a new employee, except where the employee: -does not have a PPSN - is not registered for PAYE.

You will have to apply emergency tax in these cases.

Employees must register their first employment in Ireland, using the online service Jobs and Pensions. You will then be able to request an RPN.

How to report in real-time

If you use payroll software, there are two methods of reporting payroll in real time: -Direct Payroll Reporting -allows payroll software communicate seamlessly with ROS to exchange the required information.

-NOS Payroll Reporting — allows you to use files created by payroll software and upload these through ROS. Payroll software companies have been working with Revenue to make sure software will be compatible with Revenue's requirements. If you do not use payroll software, you will be able to retrieve RPNs and complete a form through ROS. This reporting process will contribute to a significant streamlining of existing business processes by eliminating the need to file:

•P30 • P35 • P45 •P45 • You will also no longer have to produce a P60 for employees.

To help address this problem, the RSA 'Check it Fits' service will be visiting venues in Waterford where child car seat installation experts will be available to ensure car seats and restraints are correctly fitted.

The service takes between 10-15 minutes, is free of charge and offers parents and guardians reassurance that their child is safe while travelling in the car. If your child's car seat or restraint is incorrectly fitted, the 'Check it Fits' experts will advise on how to fix the problem, demonstrate how to fit the restraint correctly and answer any queries participants might have to avoid potential serious or fatal injury in the event of a collision

Aisling Sloyan, Senior Road Safety Promotion Officer for the RSA commented:

"Almost 2 out of 5 children killed are passengers and Garda reports into collisions indicate that 1 in 10 children were not wearing a seatbelt or using a child restraint in 2014. More recent statistics have shown an increase in child passenger fatalities on the road. The reality is that if a child's car seat isn't fitted correctly, it could lead to a serious or fatal injury in the event of a collision. Having a correctly fitted car seat is a simple measure parents, grandparents and guardians can take to ensure children are safe while travelling by car. I would encourage people to visit the 'Check it Fits' when it comes to Kerry and give yourself the peace of mind that your children are travelling safely."

Moyagh Murdock, CEO of the RSA, while speaking about the service said:

"The RSA 'Check it Fits' service is there to provide professional, trustworthy advice to parents and guardians around child car seat safety. Parents all over the country are availing of this service to get practical advice and expert fitting of their car seats. We would advise all parents to ensure that when they buy a new car seat, that they get the seat fitted by an expert. We would also advise that parents to check the label on their car seat to make sure it's appropriate for your child's age, weight and height, to make sure your seat is firmly installed in the car, and to always ensure that your child's harness is fitted snugly for every trip. . Clothing can affect how the harness fits so coming into the summer months you may need to tighten the harness as your children are wearing lighter clothes. Make sure that the harness is making contact with your child's body and you should check this before every journey."

CAR KEYS - It's easy to lose your car keys in the sand, or ruin your remote control with water by accidentally taking the fob for a swim. Keep your keys safe and dry and check your handbook - on most cars, there's an alternative way to open the doors that you can use if the remote stopped working.

PUNCTURES - If your tyres are already damaged or they're at the wrong pressure, the higher temperatures of summer will increase the risk of a blowout.

Make sure you check tyres regularly - for condition and pressures - and increase pressures to suit extra loads, as advised in your handbook.

Check caravan tyres too, and replace those that show any signs of cracking in the sidewall or tread grooves.

OVERHEATING - When driving in hot climates, high temperatures can aggravate cooling system problems too. It's important to check the coolant and cooling system regularly to avoid overheating.

GLARE - Dazzle from the sun causes lots of accidents but you can reduce the effect by keeping your windscreen nice and clean, and by replacing worn or damaged windscreen wipers. It pays to keep a clean pair of sunglasses in your car year-round but avoid lenses that darken in strong sunlight.

DRIVING TIRED - If you feel tired, stop and take a short nap (up to 15 minutes) or drink two cups of strong coffee. It's best to avoid getting tired in the first place if you can.

These tips can help:

Include a 20-minute break in journeys of more than 3 hours n longer trips, take a break every couple of hours You're better off taking several short (at least 20 minutes) stops than one long one Don't drink alcohol or eat a heavy meal before driving Don't stop for a nap on the hard shoulder, and make sure you check parking restrictions before putting your head down at a motorway service area as you could get a ticket for overstaying your welcome.

HAYFEVER - If your hayfever is particularly bad, it's best to get someone else to drive if you can. Also:

- Make sure any medication you're taking
- doesn't cause drowsiness Close windows and air vents to reduce pollen

• Wear sunglasses to block out bright sunlight LOOSE CHIPPINGS - Roads repaired with tar and loose chippings are a common sight in the summer but they can cause cracked headlamps and windscreens, and damage paintwork if you're not careful. Stick to any temporary speed limit that's been put in place and keep your distance from the car in front.

FIRE - If you're a smoker, don't just throw your cigarette out of the window when you've finished it. Verges and embankments can become bone-dry and a smouldering cigarette may be enough to ignite roadside grass.

TRACTORS - The driver of that slow-moving tractor in front of you may have a soundproofed cab or could be wearing ear protectors, so may not be able to hear approaching cars.

Be aware that tractors only have to have brake or indicator lights if driving at night, so they may stop or turn suddenly and without warning in daylight hours.

When you're driving in the countryside:

SIMI Motor Industry Q1 Report finds Change in Fueltype Market Share and an increase in Average Car **Emissions**

The Society of the Irish Motor Industry (SIMI) has issued the SIMI **Quarterly Motor Industry Review** Q1 2018.

Car registration figures for the first guarter of show that new car registrations are down -5.5% (71,805) compared to Q1 2017 (75,982). New Light Commercial Vehicle registrations (LCV) were up 5.3% (12,529) when compared to last year (11,900), while New Heavy Commercial Vehicles (HGV) have declined 11.2% (916) year to date. Imported Used Cars year to date are 9.5% (26,116) ahead of 2017 (23,862)

The Report shows that in the first quarter of 2018 new diesel registrations accounted for 56.3% of the market a decline from 66.7% on quarter one last year while petrol accounted for 37.5% of the total up from 29.6% on Q1 of 2017. Average CO2 emissions for new cars sold were 1.4% higher in the first quarter of 2018 when compared to a year earlier. The recent move away from diesel to petrol has resulted in average CO2 emissions now trending upwards again after a prolonged period of desirable decline.

The SIMI Report highlights a number of price decreases in the cost of motoring. The average price of a new car in Q1 2018 was 1.9% lower

than a year earlier; interestingly consumers are spending more on higher specification cars with the average OMSP (Open Market Sales Price) up 4.1% on Q1 last year. The cost of Motor Insurance in March 2018 was 13.8% lower than it was a year earlier; however average Motor Insurance costs in March were 37% higher than in March 2013. While the cost of fuel decreased slightly in Q1 of 2018 with Petrol prices down 0.7% and Diesel prices down 0.5% last year.

For 2018 new car registrations are forecasted to reach around 120,000 which would represent a decline of 8.6% on 2017 while used car imports by contrast are projected to grow by around 15% to reach 107,470. Similar to last year Brexit related uncertainty looks set to continue, largely due to the uncertain performance of sterling and the impact of used imports from the UK.

The HSA reminds employers and employees of key seasonal tips for safer work related journeys over the coming months. Summer months bring more bicycles, motorcycles, caravans, agricultural vehicles, visiting tourists and seasonal traffic congestion to our roads. During school holidays, there are more children about, so extra vigilance is needed on journeys, during deliveries and collections as there are vulnerable road users around who are not aware of the dangers associated with vehicles and their actions are not predictable. We urge employers to bring the following tips to the attention of their employees who drive for work. With school holidays and tourist season in full swing, now is a good time to remind staff of safe driving for work practice in summer.

By following simple guidelines before travelling and en-route, you will ensure your safety while driving for work.

Before travelling, make sure your vehicle is roadworthy:

Then, check the following at least daily (especially if the vehicle is hired or loaned):

- Tyre tread and pressures.
- · Oil, water and fluid levels.
- · Head, brake and indicator lights.
- Safety equipment including warningtriangle, torch, hi-vis jacket, first-aid kit, sunglasses and maps.
- Plan the route beforehand, and travel during off-peak periods if possible leaving 'more than enough' time to negotiate the holiday congestion.
- Check the weather forecast and travel news before and during journeys.
- Timely route and traffic information is available from a range of organisations.

On the road, make sure everyone is buckled up, including rear seat passengers, and drive defensively by:

 Being prepared for unsafe actions by others or for poor driving conditions.

- Obeying the road signs and signals.
- Never ever use alcohol and drive.
- Be extra careful in the early morning or at dusk and during the night, when animals and agricultural vehicles are most likely to be on the road.

If driving a van, truck or four-wheel drive:

- Take extreme care reversing.
- Check carefully for elderly people and children where you make deliveries or collections.
- Slow down in built up areas
- Slow down near cyclists

If driving a car:

- · Keep out of others' blind spots.
- · Be seen: don't let larger vehicles hide yours from view.
- Use daytime running lights.

Driver Fatique:

Don't give in to the temptation to 'push on'! When you feel tired, have a good sleep. Rest breaks every 2 hours keep drivers alert by promoting blood circulation, make trips more pleasant for you and your passengers, let the vehicle cool down.

GARDENING OUTLOOK



LOOKING AFTER YOUR HANGING BASKETS

Having colourful plants growing in containers is a great way to add colour anywhere in the garden, patio or window sill. However, plants in containers will require a lot more care than plants which are planted in the ground. The first and most important thing when looking after your containers is watering. If you don't water regularly it will cause plants to gradually dry-up and die. On the other hand over-watering is also damaging as most plants don't like sitting in water. Remember to check drainage holes at the bottom of containers to make sure that the water is draining away properly.

Some plants, like geraniums like to dry out before being watered again, but if you have other plants mixed with them then water as normally.

Feeding your plants in containers is also very important. Use a liquid feed of tomato feed or something with a high nitrogen feed. Always feed when the compost is moist and preferably in the evening time as this will stop any scorching from the sun.

LONELINESS AND SOCIAL ISOLATION MAY POSE A GREATER PUBLIC HAZARD THAN PEOPLE REALISE

In order to prove their hypothesis that being lonely is just as bad as smoking 15 cigarettes a day, researchers at Brigham Young University analysed data from different health studies that included more than 3 million participants that included data from social isolation, loneliness, and living alone.

The lead author of the study, Julianne Holt-Lunstad, explained that "the result of this study is comparable to obesity; something that public health takes very seriously." She added that people need to start taking social relationships more seriously. Ms. Hold-Lunstad said that the results from her 2015 study were "Comparable to the risk of smoking up to 15 cigarettes a day. It exceeded the risk of alcohol consumption, it exceeded the risk of physical inactivity, obesity, and it exceeded the risk of air pollution."

The study also found that increased social connection was linked to 50% reduced risk of premature death.

Dr. Nasreen Khatri, a clinical psychologist and gerontologist at the Rotman Institute at Baycrest Health Sciences in Toronto explained that being around others is the easiest way to try and deal with isolation and loneliness. Dr. Khatri added that the presence of others can alter a person's cortisol levels and stress hormone levels. Social connections protect people and help maintain exercise and healthy eating routines.

According to Dr. Oren Amitay, a Toronto psychologist, one of the ways people can deal with chronic loneliness is to try and keep themselves busy with a hobby or project which gives them purpose. Dr. Amitay added that for seniors who are isolated because of lack of mobility, a pet can help.

3 TIPS FOR DRIVING SAFELY WITH YOUR DOG:

*Keep your dog's window up - No matter the distance of your trip, Vets say that dogs are at high risk of eye, ear, face and mouth injury from airborne objects when their head is out the window. A dog can also be thrown out the window in the event of a collision or can lose his or her balance and fall out the window during an abrupt turn. In addition, dogs can jump through windows to get at another dog or animal.

*Restraining devices can save your dog's life - You may think there's no need to restrain your dog, if he or she sits or lays quietly on the seat, but remember if a car crashes at a speed of 25 mph, an airborne dog can develop projection forces equalling 40 times his or her weight. Imagine the injuries when that dog hits the dashboard or crashes through the windshield. Restraining devices for dogs when traveling in cars range from



special harnesses and seat belts to crates and barriers.

*Leave your dog at home when running errands - the temperature inside your car can rise almost 30 degrees within 20 minutes. Even on days that don't seem hot to you, leaving your pet in a car can put her at serious risk of illness and even death.

The small cat was standing on Brenda's chest, biting Brenda's chin, batting Brenda's face, and shrieking at top volume! At first Brenda, in her sleepy state, just told Missy, "leave me alone, I'm trying to sleep" but Missy didn't leave Brenda alone and as she became more fully awake, she realized that she really wasn't feeling well. Know Your Rights: CARER'S SUPPORT GRANT

QUESTION

I'm a full-time carer and getting Carer's Allowance. Last year I got a Carer's Support Grant – will I get it again this year?

ANSWER

The Carer's Support Grant is an annual payment made to full-time carers. The payment for 2018 is \leq 1,700. It is paid on the first Thursday of June each year.

If you are still getting a carer's payment on the first Thursday in June, the Department of Employment Affairs and Social Protection (DEASP) will pay the grant to you automatically, and you don't need to apply.

People getting Carer's Allowance, Carer's Benefit or Domiciliary Care Allowance are paid the grant automatically. Full-time carers who are not getting one of these payments need to apply to the DEASP (unless they got the grant last year, in which case the Department will contact them about this year's payment).

To qualify, you must be ordinarily resident in the State and caring for someone on a full-time basis for at least six months (including the first Thursday in June) and living with the person being cared for (or, if not, be contactable quickly by a direct system of communication, for example, telephone or alarm). The person you are caring for must not normally live in a hospital, convalescent home or similar establishment.

You won't qualify if you are working, studying or training for more than 15 hours a week, getting Jobseeker's Allowance or Jobseeker's Benefit or signing on for credits.

To apply, fill in one application form (form CSG1) for each person being cared for (a grant may be paid for each person). Forms are available on welfare.ie. You can apply for the 2018 grant until 31 December 2019.

In recent years we have been hearing much about the benefits of Mindfulness and living mindfully. Put simply mindfulness is "Bringing our attention to what is happening in the present moment". The goal of mindfulness is to live life more fully and to appreciate the moments of our lives that pass by all too easily. One author states that "Mindfulness helps us to weather the difficulties we encounter in our lives. It teaches us to steady ourselves in the present moment when we feel stressed". Ruminating about the past or worrying about the future can be exhausting and takes up a lot of energy. Mindfulness allows us to put on the brakes and spend time just being with what is. It also teaches us to interact with ourselves in a less judgmental and more compassionate way. Research shows that Mindfulness is very helpful for problems such as anxiety, panic, stress and can help people who are prone to recurring depression and low Studies in neuroscience - using brain scans mood. demonstrate how practicing mindfulness meditation can impact on the brain thereby creating beneficial changes in health, mood and behaviour. Mindfulness helps us to explore ways of freeing ourselves from old habits and choosing a different way of being. So what does it involve. There is a common perception that meditation involves sitting down and not doing anything. However, that is not the case. Meditation is an active training of the mind - where awareness is increased. There is an emphasis on relaxating the body and mind, and the acceptance of feeling and thoughts without judgment.

Mindfulness allows us to become master of our own mind instead of being slaves to our mind. It can be practiced in a regular 'formal' meditation setting – but the great news is, it can also be practice throughout the day – at work, whilst driving, while we are cooking dinner or doing the dishes. Al these situations and many others provide an opportunity for this simple exercise. One simple mindfulness exercise might be when you're stopped at a traffic light. Rather than wishing and hoping the light will change to green – just bring your attention to your body and your breathing. Take one breath in, one breath out. Breathe in to a count of seven and out to a count of eleven.

One of my favourite quotes "life is not measured by the number of breaths we take, but by the moments that take our breath away". Sometimes our lives are so busy or we are wrapped up in worry and thinking we don't recognize those moments. Being a little bit more mindful everyday can help us to attend to these breath-taking simple moments in life.

Welcome back dear reader, last week we looked at the sixth commandment of God "you shall not kill" (Deuteronomy 5:17) and saw how innocent blood cries out to the Lord for justice, but it is not only the one who commits the sin of murder who will be judged, but those who permitted it. Elijah was the only remaining prophet of God who had not been killed or run out, and the Lord used him to challenge the King on Mount Carmel. He alone took on the false prophets who were spewing out these sinful laws. He challenged the people on their apathy, but they remained silent, and this same silence is what is going on today when people blindly follow the herd, afraid of speaking out against what they know inside is wrong. God showed up that day in a mighty display of strength and when the people saw the power of God in operation they all fell face down and cried out 'the Lord - He is God' (verse 39). Leaders, make no mistake -- if the laws or rules that you bring in are against God's commands, you are bringing judgement on yourself and those under you.
