€10,000 FOR CASTLEISLAND & KILLARNEY LIBRARIES

KERRY Fine Gael TD, Brendan Griffin, has this week received confirmation of the provisional allocation of \in 10,000 by the Department of Children for use at Castleisland and Killarney libraries.

The funding will be used to establish a library of toys and technology at Castleisland Library for children with disabilities and special needs which can be borrowed for home use. The funding for Killarney will be used for a Sensory Area for Kerry pre-school children (3-5 years) with sensory disorders, boys and girls with special needs, ADHD, Autism, DS etc.

Minister for Children, James Reilly, made the announcement as he sanctioned payments of €250,000 for children's play and recreation projects across Ireland. 19 local authorities will benefit from funding for projects under the Capital Grant Scheme for Play and Recreation for new and innovative play and recreation projects and the improvement of existing facilities. "Play and recreation are fundamentally important to children and young people for their development , creativity and wellbeing" said Minister Reilly.

Deputy Griffin has welcomed the allocation, having lobbied for the funding in previous weeks.

HAND, FOOT & MOUTH DISEASE

Over the last number of weeks, there has been a marked increase in the number of cases of young children presenting with Hand, Foot & Mouth Disease **(HFMD)**, which is most cases is a short mild viral infection. It is not related to the disease of a similar name, which affects animals.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF HAND, FOOT & MOUTH DISEASE?

HFMD most commonly affects children under 10 years of age and normally starts with your child feeling unwell and suffering with a high temperature. This is usually followed by a sore throat, with spots on the inside of the mouth. These spots will normally appear on the hands and feet and maybe in some cases on the buttocks, legs and genitals. The spots look similar to chickenpox but are smaller and though they can be tender to the touch, they are usually not itchy. These symptoms normally only last a few days but the mouth ulcers can be painful and can last up to a week.

Rarely, in a small number of cases, the virus can affect and cause inflammation of the major body organs, such as the heart, lungs and brain. This would require urgent medical attention.

WHAT IS THE TREATMENT FOR HAND FOOT & MOUTH DISEASE?

Treatment is making the child (or adult) comfortable and easing the symptoms of the **HFMD** virus until the virus goes away. This can be done by the following straight forward steps:

1. Temperature & pain control, using Paracetamol or if appropriate, lbuprofen. 2. Take off excess clothes if room is at normal temperature -this helps control the fever.

3. Plenty of fluids, as this prevents dehydration. If the child is still being breast fed, increase the frequency of feeds. If child starts refusing fluids because of a sore throat, you will need to contact your GP.

Do not use cold-sponge technique or fans to bring down temperature, as this can reduce heat loss and trap heat in deeper parts of the body. It can also be uncomfortable.

HOW LONG IS SOMEONE INFECTIOUS WITH HAND FOOT & MOUTH DISEASE?

It takes 3-5 days from when someone is infected until they first start to suffer **HFMD** symptoms; however they can still infect others during these 3-5 days. This why it is common to see small outbreaks occur in schools and child care facilities. A person will continue to be infectious until all spots and ulcers are gone. Young children can remain infectious for a few weeks after the symptoms are gone, as the virus is passed in their stools so ensure that during, and for a few weeks after infection:-

- Child washes their hands after using toilet
- Covers mouth and nose when coughing and sneezing
- Adults should take extra hygiene precautions when handling nappies & tissues
- Avoid sharing cups, eating utensils, towels etc.
- Use hot cycle to wash clothes, bedding & towels
- Do not pierce any blisters.

If a child is feeling well enough in themselves, they do not necessarily have to be kept home from school, however it is best to check your child's school or childcare facility policy in relation to this.

TRIP DOWN MEMORY LANE FOR LISSIVIGEEN NS PUPILS

At an event organised by Cllr. Michael Gleeson in his role as a Trustee of Muckross House, three past pupils of Lissivigeen National School came together in Muckross School House, Killarney, to indentify their fellow pupils in the picture that hangs in the school, dated from 1930.

Eugene Scannell, Arthur O'Keeffe and his brother Eugene O'Keeffe. spent hours recounting the names and told stories of their school days in the 1930's.

Pupils at the school at the time came principally from the townlands immediately adjacent to the school though one or two came from closer to Killarney Town.

The principal occupation of the parents of

The 'old' school was purchased by Eugene [brother of Arthur E in Photo] and Sheila O'Keeffe on their return from England and suitably adapted to become their residence. Eugene continues to live there.

DINGLE TO THE BUMBLEANCE MEGA PUSH!

This week saw the launch of a spectacular and challenging fundraiser, the first of its kind to be undertaken in Ireland. Kerryman and adventurer Mike O'Shea from Dingle, recently visited Tony Heffernan (originally from Cork) in his family home on the Dingle Peninsula to map out his plans to raise \in 250,000 to fund the development of "BUMBLEance", the National Children's Ambulance service.

The Event, launched by Broadcaster Miriam O Callaghan, is asking members of the public

to get involved and support this great cause. Aptly named the BUMBLEance Mega Push, involves pushing a special BUMBLEance vehicle from Dingle to Dublin, a total of 355 kilometres. KILLARNEY MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY JULY 2014 AREA MEETING

NOTICES OF MOTION

At the Killarney Municipal Authority July 2014 Area Meeting, Councillor Michael Gleeson asked that:

•"Positive action is undertaken, by whoever is responsible, in order to ensure smooth passage of vehicles through Minish Level Crossing. The present situation is a disgrace and presents a very poor image of Public Bodies".

Kerry County Council replied that this request has been submitted to the National Roads Authority (NRA) for consideration of the provision of Supplementary Maintenance funding.

This is a new scheme being introduced by the NRA whereby Local Authorities can request additional maintenance funding to deal with specific issues that would not be feasible from a financial perspective under the annual Ordinary Maintenance allocation.

Councillor Gleeson stated that very many drivers have complained about the uneven



nature of this crossing and of the possibility of damage to vehicles. He welcomed the reply and hoped that funding would be made available by the NRA.

DEADLINE FAST APPROACHING FOR STUDENT GRANTS

Senator Marie Moloney is encouraging students in Kerry to get their SUSI (Student Universal Support Ireland) applications in before Friday, August 1st 2014, which is the closing date for new applications and for students who are now progressing to a Post Graduate Course and who would have originally made application via a Local Authority or a VEC.

Students who have their applications in by this date will get priority and will be processed first. Students who miss the deadline may still apply, but may incur delays until all applications that were in by the deadline have been processed.

"I would urge all students to try and get in their applications at the earliest possible date so that they can be processed and go into payment on the first payment date after they go to college. Closing date for renewals was 13th of June, but SUSI are still accepting applications."

NOTICE OF MOTION: When will Kerry County Council repair the railway crossing at Minish on the N22 as it is now in a desperate state?

REPLY: This location on the N22 National Primary Route has been submitted to the National Roads Authority for consideration of the provision of Supplementary Maintenance funding. This is a new scheme being introduced by the NRA whereby Local Authorities can request additional maintenance funding to deal with specific issues that would not be feasible from a financial perspective under the annual Ordinary Maintenance allocation. A decision in relation to the funding is awaited.

NOTICE OF MOTION: That Kerry County Council ask the National Park to allow the Jarveys down the inside of the wall parallel to the Mission Road and give traffic a proper chance to move on.

REPLY: This is a matter for resolution by members.

NOTICE OF MOTION: To ask Kerry County Council to purchase the Torc site on the Park Road, Killarney, for an amenity park/playground and facilities for the elderly, also some of which could be used for car parking.

REPLY: The site of the former Torc Hotel on the

Park Road, given its location close to Killarney town would be an expensive site for an amenity area. Also, substantial progress has been made recently in upgrading and extending the car parking provision in the town of Killarney with car park resurfacing and extending the car parking provision in the town of Killarney with car park resurfacing and re lining. There continues to be a need for seasonal summer car parking which should ideally be provided on a seasonal rather than permanent infrastructure basis.

NOTICE OF MOTION: To ask Kerry County Council and the NRA again to resurface the bad sections of road on either side of Bealnadeige Bridge on the N72 and to seek funding to widen and realign the bridge also.

REPLY: Tenders were received by the Council at the end of June to undertake the pavement overlay scheme on the N72 National Secondary Road at Gortanahaneboy West. The section of road being overlaid is situated approximately between the junction to Lisnagrave (immediately west of Beheenagh Bridge) to a location immediately east of the railway bridge. The overlay works are currently scheduled to commence in September. A preliminary proposal for a road realignment scheme at this location on the N72 was submitted to the National Roa d S Authority а number of vears ago. However. this scheme was not identified as a priority scheme by the Authority.



Furthermore, due to funding constraints the Authority is not currently undertaking individual bridge widening schemes.

NOTICE OF MOTION: To ask Kerry County Council to put traffic calming measures on the Ross Road Killarney.

REPLY: A public consultation process has been completed for the provision of speed cushions on the Ross Road. There is no funding available at present to carry out this work. Kerry County Council will seek funding under the Regional and Local Road Low cost Safety Measures for these traffic calming measures.

HEALTHY OUTLOOK



Planning ahead, in whatever task we do, can help smooth the way and prevent problems from arising later on. VITAMIN D DEFICIENCY

PART 2

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF VITAMIN D DEFICIENCY?

Many people have no symptoms, or only vague ones such as tiredness or general aches. Because symptoms of vitamin D deficiency are often very nonspecific or vague, the problem is often missed. The diagnosis is more easily reached in severe deficiencies with some of the classical (typical) symptoms and bone deformities.

SYMPTOMS

• General vague aches and pains and a general sense of not being well are the common symptoms.

• In more severe deficiency (known as osteomalacia), there may be more severe pain and also weakness. Muscle weakness may cause difficulty in climbing stairs or getting up from the floor or a low chair, or can lead to the person walking with a waddling pattern.

• Bones can feel painful to moderate pressure (often more noticeable in the ribs or shin bones). Not uncommonly, people have a hairline fracture in the bone which is causing tenderness and pain. Bone pain often also occurs in the lower back, hips, pelvis, thighs and feet.

HOW IS VITAMIN D DEFICIENCY DIAGNOSED?

It may be suspected from your medical history, symptoms, or lifestyle. A simple blood test for vitamin D level can make the diagnosis. Blood tests for calcium and phosphate levels and liver function may also show changes linked to a low level of vitamin D.

WHAT IS THE TREATMENT FOR VITAMIN D DEFICIENCY?

The treatment is to take vitamin D supplements. This is a form of vitamin D called ergocalciferol or calciferol. Vitamin D can be given as an injection or as a medicine (liquid or tablets). Your doctor will discuss the dose, and best treatment schedule, depending on your situation, age, severity of the deficiency.

CAUTIONS WHEN TAKING VITAMIN D SUPPLEMENTS

Care is needed with vitamin D supplements in certain situations: If you are taking certain other medicines: digoxin (for an irregular heartbeat - atrial fibrillation) or thiazide diuretics such as bendroflumethiazide (commonly used to treat high blood pressure).

• If you have other medical conditions: kidney stones, some types of kidney disease, liver disease or hormonal disease. Specialist advice may be needed.

• Vitamin D should not be taken by people who have high calcium levels or certain types of cancer.

QUESTION

I bought a holiday home in October 2012. I paid the Local Property Tax for 2013 but I thought the NPPR had been abolished. Do I still have to pay it?

The Non-Principal Private Residence (NPPR) charge was payable for the 5 years 2009 to 2013 for residential property that was not the owner's only or main residence, so you will owe this charge in respect of 2013. The NPPR is no longer charged from 2014 onwards, but outstanding liabilities and payments are still being collected by the local authorities and these can be substantial.

The NPPR charge was $\in 200$ for each relevant property that you owned on the liability date each year and was due to be paid within 3 months. In general, the liability date was 31 March and the payment was due by 30 June each year. A late fee of $\in 20$ was charged for each month, or part of a month, after each due date. These late fees increased each month. They are shown on a table of charges at nppr.ie. If you owned your holiday home on 31 March 2013 and have not paid the NPPR for 2013, you now owe $\in 380$.

If you do not pay your liabilities in full by 31 August 2014, or agree settlement terms by that deadline, you will incur additional penalties and you will then owe \notin 750. There will not be any further increase.

To avoid these additional penalties, you should arrange as soon as possible to pay the 2013 charge plus the late fees that have accrued. You can pay online at nppr.ie or else use a paper form.

You should also check any other taxes and charges that may still be due on your holiday home – such as the Household Charge (payable for the year 2012 in addition to the NPPR), and the septic tank registration charge (if relevant).

Safety advice for driving during good weather!

The good weather does not always mean good driving conditions as the sunshine can melt the road surface making it extremely slippery. Also, rain at the end of a long dry spell can mix with dust, oil and rubber, producing a road surface like an ice rink.

Driving tips for summer motoring Servicing: A full service is necessary at least one full week before a long journey.

Last Minute Checks: Engine, oil, brake and clutch fluids, battery electrolyte, tyre pressure and the windscreen washer reservoir should be rechecked just before the journey Starts.

Spare Kit: Delays caused by minor faults can be reduced by taking a small spares kit comprising of a fan belt, radiator hoses, bulbs, points, a condenser, pair of spark plugs and a roll of insulting tape.

Balance: The load should be balanced, that is, heavy articles should be placed as near to the centre of the car as possible. Heavy articles must never be concentrated on one side of the vehicle, neither must luggage impede the drivers vision or prevent seat belts from being used.

Inside The Car: Loose or heavy items in the passenger compartment can move under braking or cornering - this can distract the driver or jam against the control.

Outside The Car: Roof racks must be firmly and loaded with as low a profile as possible to minimise the wind resistance and maintain stability. Also, make sure every-thing carried on the roof rack is securely tied down.

Care In The Country: Many city drivers feel free driving in the country - less restricted, however, you must remember, care and attention is still needed at all times - there may just be a herd of cows around the next corner!

Farm animals must be treated with patience. Drivers meeting them should slow down well in advance and leave as much space as possible between the car and the herd.

Fast driving past a horse and rider can also be dangerous - it may cause the horse and rider to shy and throw its rider. They should be overtaken very slowly, with as much space as possible between it and its rider.

RUNNING-IN A NEW CAR

Life with a brand new car

If you have just purchased your new 142 Reg car then here are some tips to keep it in tip top shape.

It used to be essential driving practice to follow rigorous running-in procedures to get maximum life and driving performance out of a new vehicle. Older drivers will perhaps remember the sight of a new car driving slowly in the nearside lane of a motorway with a 'running-in, please pass' sign on the vehicle's rear window!

While vehicle design improvements and oil quality mean that modern cars are much less dependent on these careful driving techniques, motorists are still recommended to take a little extra care with a new car, particularly if they plan on driving it for a long time. The vehicle's reliability, oil and fuel consumption can all benefit from a considered driving approach.

When collecting the car, motorists should ask the car dealer for driving advice and also check the vehicle handbook. Many still include pointers on 'running-in' the car.



A car's first thousand miles

Motorists should begin with gentle town driving so the car's major components can bed in.

New tyres have a thin oily coating, until this wears off, vehicle handling will feel different, especially when driving in wet weather.

Motorists should avoid harsh acceleration and heavy braking when driving a new car

Motorists driving a new diesel car shouldn't let the vehicle's engine speed exceed 3000 rpm however should make sure the revs regularly reach this limit

Motorists driving a new petrol engine should stick to a 3000 rpm limit for the first 500-600 miles and then increase the upper limit to around 4000 rpm. Again, revs should regularly reach this limit.

Motorists driving a new vehicle should avoid labouring the car's engine – by changing up too early for example

Motorists driving a new vehicle should check the car's oil and coolant levels (Click here to view our 'AA Rescue Guide to checking your coolant') at least once a week as they don't know how much oil it will use.

Motorists driving a new car should note that oil consumption can be high for the first 6000 miles or so but should slow, particularly if the car's been treated gently in the early days.

After the first 1000 miles, motorists can gradually use more of the car's performance.

IFA PUTS FORWARD TAXATION MEASURES TO COUNTER INCOME VOLATILITY AND SPEED UP FARM TRANSFER

Addressing the Oireachtas Committee on Agriculture on Thursday last (July 17th) IFA President Eddie Downey set out the Association's agri-taxation submission, which identifies a number of new and innovative taxation measures. If implemented, they would tackle two of the major challenges facing Irish agriculture: income volatility and barriers to lifetime farm transfers.

"The agri-taxation review provides an opportunity to ensure the taxation system delivers coherent support for achieving the goals in 'Food Harvest 2020'. We can clearly see the impact of volatility in the tillage sector, for example, which, in 2013, experienced a fall in incomes of 20% (to less than \in 30,000) due to a price collapse, despite improved yields. Prices in this sector have continued to fall through 2014,"

said Eddie Downey.

The proposals to manage income volatility and encourage lifetime transfer

* An income-smoothing mechanism that would operate within the income tax system, in addition to income averaging. This would allow a farmer place on deposit a portion of their pre-tax income, in a designated commercial farming account ('Tax Deposit Account'). This could then be drawn down by the farmer and used for the running of his business when required, and would be taxable in the year it was drawn down.

* A 'Phased Transfer Partnership' (PTP). This is a progression model in which there would a defined, phased transfer of the family farm over a set time period. It would require an agreed transfer contract where both parent and child would work together in partnership over the period of the phased and progressive transfer of assets. As an incentive to the farm holder to enter into the contract they would receive tax relief on a portion of their farm income, up to an agreed ceiling. In addition to these innovative measures, IFA has submitted a comprehensive set of proposals, covering all aspects of farming business.

In respect of income tax, IFA has proposed

* The introduction of an optional system of increased Capital Allowances. This would provide Capital Allowances of up to 50% over the first two years.

* Extending the 100% Young Trained Farmers' Stock Relief to all farmers, for a period of 4 years, up to 2020; * Extension of income averaging to farm profit: where the farmer or spouse has an additiona source of self-employed income; and

* Introduction of an Earned Income Tax Credit to remove the discrimination in the income tax system between employees and the self-employed.

In the areas of Farm Transfer, Succession anc Land Mobility, IFA has proposed

* Retention and index-linking of the Capita Acquisitions Tax tax-free exemption thresholds and retention of 90% Agricultural Relief.

* Improvement in the uptake of the land leasing tax exemption scheme through recognition o incorporated farm businesses as qualifying lessees and removal of the 40 year age limit for qualifying lessors.

* Reintroduction of indexation for Capital Gain: Tax and retention of CGT retirement relief.

KERRY DAIRY FARM NOMINATED FOR NATIONAL COMPETITION

A dairy farm from Kerry has been nominated for the 2014 National Dairy Council & Kerrygold Quality Milk Awards. The competition, which sets out to identify and reward our top dairy farmers, has been described as the 'Sam Maguire of Farming'. Aidan Dineen from Cleandries in Cause way, representing Kerry Agribusiness, is nominated for the 2014 NDC & Kerrygold Quality Milk Awards. The organisers explain that the nominated dairy farms can already be considered the 'cream of the crop'. Many of the dairy coops who nominate dairy farmers for this competition do so on the basis of selecting their top farmers each year, often from a supplier base of literally hundreds of farmers. Therefore securing a nomination for this award is, in its own right, a recognition of top quality farming by the nominating co-op. All of the farmers nominated for this national award are role models in their own right. Detailed technical forms related to each nominated farm are currently in the hands of the expert national judging panel – Professor Patrick Wall, (Associate Professor of Public Health at UCD), Dr David Gleeson (Milk Quality Research, Teagasc) and Dr. Jack Kennedy (Dairy Editor, Irish Farmers Journal). The judges will select a short-list of national finalists whose farms will be visited by the national judging panel for an inspection. The judging panel will combine the technical data with the inspection of the farm in order to select the overall national winner.

It is expected that the national results and the identity of our top dairy farmer will be announced in mid October. The overall winning dairy farmer will receive a prize of ε 5,000 and the NDC & Kerrygold Quality Milk Awards perpetual trophy. It is also at the discretion of the judges each year to select whether category prizes will be awarded – for instance in areas such as sustainability, animal welfare or care of the environment.

"WITHOUT AUTUMN TRADE, THE FUTURE OF SUCKLER FARMING IN THE REPUBLIC IS UNDER SERIOUS THREAT" -ICOS

At a meeting g with Minister Coveney this week, an ICOS delegation of mart managers and chairmen led by Michael Spellman, chairman of the ICOS Marts Committee, emphasised to the Minister the urgency of finding practical solutions to unjustified obstructions being imposed on the traditional trade between Northern Ireland customers and livestock marts across the Republic of Ireland.

There is an effective ban by Irish owned meat plants in Northern Ireland on killing live cattle from the Republic of Ireland. Irish (ROI) controlled meat factories in Northern Ireland either will not slaughter an animal, or they will impose a £150 fine per animal, if any farmer presents an animal for slaughter that was born in the Republic of Ireland.

"The maintenance of a vigorous live trade with Northern Ireland is a vital source of additional competition for livestock which helps underpin the autumn trade in marts," said Michael Spellman.

"Farmers in Northern Ireland who bought cattle from the south last Autumn are facing a major financial hit as they now go to sell these animals into the factories. It is a case of 'once bitten, twice shy' and unless the irrational and unwarranted \in 150 fine is removed by the factories, Northern Ireland farmers won't buy cattle from the south again this year.

"The immediate priority is the restoration of the traditional Autumn trade. Without this trade it is not an exaggeration to state that the future of suckling enterprises

in the Republic is under serious threat," he stated.

Michael Spellman said that the marts delegation had emphasised to the Minister the importance of immediately engaging with his counterpart in Northern Ireland, Minister Michelle O'Neill with a view to removing the obstructions to this trade.

ICOS (the Irish Co-operative Organisation Society) represents co-operatives and organisations in Ireland - including the Irish dairy processing co-operatives and livestock marts - whose associated businesses have a combined turnover in the region of €14 billion, with some 150,000 individual members, employing 12,000 people in Ireland, and a further 24,000 people overseas. Outside of ICOS member co-ops, it is estimated that over 3 million Irish people are members of at least one co-operative.

KERRY FOOD PRODUCER DIRECTORY LAUNCHED

A new Kerry Food Producer Book called 'The Kerry Food Story' was launched at the Institute of Technology, Tralee, by TJ O'Connor, Head of Section, Hotel, Culinary and Tourism Department and Tomás Hayes, Head of Local Enterprise, Kerry County Council. The 68-page book and directory which will be given out free of charge contains a listing of over 150 local Kerry food and drink producers and includes specially-created recipes by eight of the top chefs in Kerry using local produce. All of the chefs have studied at the IT Tralee. The aim of the book is to remind chefs. distributors, hotels, restaurants, retailers and local customers of the wealth of home-grown and homeproduced produce that Kerry has

to offer and to give them a direct way of sourcing it. The book also includes a list of cookery schools, information on farmers' markets and festivals where you can buy produce and useful Kerry websites to find out everything about local food and drink in the region. And of course, the book includes an extensive listing of producers who are geared up to sell local food and drink products to both businesses and consumers.

The Directory included in the Kerry Food Story book has details of over 150 producers in the areas of confectionery/baking, gluten-free baking, vegetables, honey, seafood and fish, meat products, dairy produce, organic produce, retail, drinks and vegetarian food.

IFA & FNSEA HOLD DISCUSSIONS ON FARMING ISSUES

Following a bi-lateral meeting with the President of the French farmers' union Xavier Beulin, IFA President Eddie Downey welcomed the strong support from FNSEA for issues of concern to Irish farmers.

Eddie Downey said the FNSEA is very supportive of IFA's position on trade deals and is opposed to any outcome that would damage family farming in Europe. "President Beulin agreed with us that we have to very vigilant on TTIP and Mercosur. European negotiators cannot be allowed to bargain away agriculture and will have to insist on quantities, equivalence of standards and end-use control to ensure our key European markets are not undermined." The two Presidents discussed the midterm review of CAP and stressed the importance of re-focusing the policy. "We both committed to working closely with the next EU Commissioner for Agriculture to ensure there is priority for active, productive farmers. Further research and development of the sector will also have to feature." Retailer regulation at EU level also featured in the bi-lateral, with Eddie Downey assuring the FNSEA that he would continue to press for robust legislation in his role as Chairman of the COPA Food Chain group. On climate change, the two farm leaders said the sustainable growth of the agricultural sector in Europe cannot be impeded by rigid limits on production. Eddie Downey and Xavier Beulin discussed a range of competitiveness issues, including input costs, EU bureaucracy and inspections, and concerns in relation to eligible land.

COVER LETTER WITH CV

Is your resume polished and ready? Did you practice your interview and your elevator pitch? Of course you did. Now comes the hard part - the cover letter. Written the right way, it could get you the interview. Include any of the following job-killers, however, and you can kiss your interview good-bye.

• Simply repeating the job title and saying how you love to work with people won't cut it. Neither will a multi-page tome of every job you've ever held. A good cover letter should be between 200 to 250 words. You need to briefly and succinctly show how your experience dovetails with the specific needs of the job. Include two most recent experience details that sell your ability to do the job better than other candidates.

• Recruiters and HR managers don't have the time to sift through your hang-gliding stories or your "scaling mountain peaks" adventures. Stay focused on your heroic work achievements - the more current the better. Do some due diligence and find out what the company makes and needs, and the problems it faces. Offer one solution to their most pressing problem.

Stay away from negatives and faults. Employers may ask for your perceived weakness in a face-to-face interview, but never volunteer any weaknesses in a cover letter. Don't talk about salary, bonuses, vacation time or work hours. Don't bad mouth your present employer or any employees. And stay away from personal issues - divorces, separations, alimony, etc.

• Your cover letter is no place for bragging (and neither is the interview). Don't pad your accomplishments with superlatives. Stick to the facts. Don't embellish. Sell your ability to cheerfully handle all aspects of the job. Write as if your closest friend will be evaluating your cover letter, someone who really knows when you're trying to "snow" them. And do avoid humour. (Unless you wrote comedy for a sitcom or a standup comedian, leave out the jokes and any attempts to be funny.)

• Right Letter, Wrong Company. You'd be surprised how often this happens. In these tough times, applicants are sending CV's and cover letters to multiple employers. And

sometimes cover letter A gets stuffed into envelope B. Check every cover letter you send out and make sure it's to the right prospective employer.

NEW ANIMAL RIGHTS AND PROTECTIONS ADDED TO UN CHARTER

The Protection of domesticated and companion animals, including stray and feral animals, from becoming a human food source. The Protection of wildlife, or species of recent wildlife origin born or brought into captivity, from being used for trade, display, for cultural purposes in temples, and for festivals where these animals are slaughtered for spectacle and for cultural aggrandizement.

The Protection of endangered species from being hunted for commerce and sport.

The Protection of animals from being the object of spectator sports wherein one or more animals are harmed.

The Right of animals not to be used in laboratory experiments.

HOW TO TREAT A BEE STING NATURALLY

First, it's important to note that if you are allergic to bee stings, a natural remedy alone is not enough. How do you know if you are allergic to bee stings? If you've been stung before and had an allergic reaction, or if you've never been stung before, the signs to look for are dramatic redness or swelling, hives, difficulty breathing and feelings of faintness or dizziness. Be sure to monitor the person who got stung for any of these signs while you're treating him. If those occur, head to the doctor's office. The first thing you have to do when you treat a bee sting is remove the stinger, if present. This can be done with the flat edge of a fingernail or other straight edge. (Tweezers or squeezing it between two fingers is not recommended, as it will squeeze the venom into the skin).

It's important to do this first because the stinger is attached to the venom-containing portion of

the bee's butt. If you don't remove the stinger, that little sac will continue pumping venom into the sting site, making it hurt even more.

Once you are sure you've removed the entire stinger, wash the site well with soap and water to prevent infection.

Then, you can try any of these natural bee sting remedies:

• Ice — Probably the most readily available tool, ice helps numb the site of the sting and reduce swelling by slowing blood flow to the area. Apply ice for at least 20 minutes.

• Garlic — Some people swear by crushing a couple of garlic cloves and putting the crushed garlic and its juices directly on the sting. Cover the site with a towel and keep it there for at least 20 minutes.

• Honey is known for its anti-inflammatory properties. Some suggest putting honey directly on the sting and wrapping the area in a towel for 20-30 minutes.

• Baking soda and water — Just mix into a paste, rub onto the sting site, wrap and leave on.

• Toothpaste - Like the baking soda, toothpaste is a base that will help neutralise the acidic bee sting. Apply, cover and leave on for — you guessed it - about 20 minutes.

With any of these remedies, it's important to wash the site thoroughly when the pain has subsided. For good measure, you can apply some antibiotic cream to prevent infection.

GOOD NEWS

A deaf teenager was saved from a potentially deadly house fire in Indianapolis, by his faithful dog, a two-year-old pit bull named "Ace."

The 13 year old boy was sleeping when a fire broke out inside the house located in Perry Pines Court. Tragedy was averted when Ace set out to wake the boy by licking his face. The boy quickly covered his nose and mouth with his T-shirt and exited the rear of the house with his faithful canine companion at his side and then called the fire brigade. The boy's mother arrived home from work shortly after receiving a phone call from her son about the fire. The teenager, Ace and the family's cat "Pixie," all survived the blaze which caused \$175,000 in damage to the home. The fire is believed to have started in the garage - possibly from an electrical problem.

TINY ISLANDS SUCK POLLUTION OUT OF WATER

Cleaning up dirty water has been on the agenda of many scientists lately. That's no surprise - water pollution poses a health risk everywhere, especially in developing countries, where children play among sewage, workers toil in muck daily, and millions die from drinking contaminated water every year.

Now Scotland-based Biomatrix Water offers one more innovative way to clean up the mess: installing islands that suck up pollution from the water they're floating in. The islands look and work like wetlands. Man-made structures hold together their vegetation; the pollutantsucking process works naturally. Roots suspended beneath the islands promote the growth of aquatic biofilm (the green slime you find on rocks) that "cleanses the water through the breakdown, sorption, and metabolic transformation of nutrients and impurities.

The islands come in different shapes and sizes and can be modified to grow local greenery. Besides increasing biofilm in the water, they also serve as fish refuges and feeding zones, creating low-maintenance ecosystems that could improve the area's biodiversity while thriving for more than 20 years. The buoyant structures are also nice to look at: They can hold trees, driftwood, and even sculpture. Partnering with conservationists and local governments, the company has already

installed the pseudo-wetlands in the Philippines, India, China, and other countries.

HOMELESS IN THE U.S.

In the United States today, thousands of government buildings — roughly 77,000, according to federal estimates - are either entirely empty or underutilized across the country. Many times, the power is still running due to safety requirements, but no one's inside. To make matters worse, taxpayers are footing the bill — and maintenance isn't cheap. These buildings are costing taxpayers \$1.7 billion a year in upkeep, and no one's even using the space. In other words, a massive amount of potential housing is going to waste while more than 600,000 people sleep on the streets every night. But instead of doing anything to help the homeless it is now illegal for Homeless People to sit on the sidewalk in more than half of U.S. Cities The National Law Centre on Homelessness & Poverty has tracked laws in 187 cities since 2009 to study the spread of measures that criminalize homelessness. The

latest report, released recently, found an uptick in nearly every type of different criminalisation ordinance. These anti-homeless laws can take a number of different forms. Fort Lauderdale recently moved to make it illegal for homeless people to have possessions with them, while Honolulu is considering a law to criminalize sitting or lying down on sidewalks. Last year, Tampa passed a new law to make it illegal to sleep in public and Palo Alto adopted a measure to prohibit homeless people from sleeping in their cars, for instance. 34% percent of cities impose city-wide bans on camping in public, an increase of 60% percent since 2011. 18% percent of cities impose city-wide bans on sleeping in public, unchanged since 2011. 24% of cities impose city-wide bans on begging

in public, an increase of 25% since 2011. 76% of cities prohibit begging in particular public places, an increase of 20% since 2011.

33% of cities make it illegal to loiter in public throughout an entire city, an increase of 35% since 2011.53% of cities prohibit sitting or lying down in particular public places, a decrease of 3% since 2011. 43% of cities prohibit sleeping in vehicles, an increase of 119% percent since 2011. 9% of cities prohibit sharing food with homeless people.

Although 42% of the homeless people in Clearwater and 83% of the homeless in Santa Cruz are without access to affordable housing and emergency shelter, these towns criminalise camping in public, sitting or lying down in public, begging in public, and sleeping in vehicles. In June a federal appeals court ended a 31-year-old ban on sleeping in cars in Los Angeles. A recent study in one Florida County found that local taxpayers had spent more than \$5 million over the last decade to repeatedly jail just 37 homeless people for quality-oflife offenses. A separate study showed that, when accounting for criminalisation and hospitalisation, leaving homeless people on the streets is over three times more expensive than simply giving them a place to live. The National Law Centre on Homelessness & Poverty studied laws in 187 cities and its report criticised cities for violating homeless people's basic rights such as the right to freedom of speech under the First Amendment, freedom from cruel and unusual punishment under the Eighth Amendment, and the right to due process of law guaranteed by the Fourteenth Amendment.

DID YOU KNOW.....

As it turns out, you can teach an old dog new tricks ... and as a leopard goes from infant to adult, it really does change its spots. The following myths are some of the more widely believed, but in truth, they're actually more fiction than fact.

• The ostrich is the largest known bird – and one that can run up to 40 mph and has a kick powerful enough to bend steel rods — but it does not bury its head in the sand as a defense mechanism. When threatened, along with running and kicking, these creatures do try to hide, but they do so by laying flat on the ground. That said, from a distance their tiny heads can appear to be buried when they are lifting themselves up from the ground. But is the head actually inserted into the sand? Not at all.

• While it's true that opossums have mighty tails and use them with great facility, they do not generally hang from them and they certainly don't sleep in such a position. While a baby may hang from its tail for a few seconds, adults are too heavy to do the same. And although opossums can't hang from their tails, they do have opposable "thumbs" to make up for it.

• Frogs and toads may have lumpy skin, but they can't give you warts. It's a human virus, not amphibian skin, that causes warts. But it's a good idea to avoid touching them anyway some toads' wart-like bumps contain parotoid glands, which contain a poison that can be rather irritating ... so be careful where you kiss them.

• Since at least the 19th century we've believed that lemmings engage in cult-like suicidal behaviour and jump off cliffs en masse during migration. While it's true that during population explosions, lemmings seek out new habitat and occasionally fall off cliffs on unfamiliar turf, but group suicide? Nope. Curiously, mass plunges aren't even the strangest false fact that poor lemmings have to endure. The 16th-century geographer Zeigler of Strasbourg proposed that lemmings fell out of the sky during storms, and then suffered mass extinctions when the spring grass began to sprout.

• If an earthworm is cut in two it will not become two worms. The head end of the worm may live and regenerate its back end if it was severed behind the clitellum; but the old tail will die. However, the super fascinating planarian flatworm – a tiny freshwater worm from a different phylum than earthworms – is able to reform its entire body from slivers as teensy as 1/300th of the creatures original body size.

Many bats may have small eyes, and about 70% of the species augment their vision with echolocation which helps them hunt at night – but blind? No way. Merlin Tuttle, founder and president of Bat Conservation International, confirms the truth in no uncertain terms: "There are no blind bats. They see extremely well."

FINALLY THIS WEEK

We all think our job stinks from time to time, but it really does for Julio Cu Camara. He swims through sewers in Mexico City to clear blockages and repair pipes by hand. Julio has notched up 1,400 dives in 30 years – each one lasting up to six hours in 7,500 miles of tunnels. He has to wear a 6.4 stone helmet and suit to protect him from the human, chemical and animal waste – and its stench.

Julio has found horses, pigs, guns and everything from "cigarette butts to car parts, furniture and fridges. But of one thing he is certain: "The worst thing of all to find is a human."
