# KILLARNEY CAMPAIGNERS LAUNCH PAINT IT PINK

Members of the Killarney Branch of the Irish Cancer Society came together this week to launch the Paint it Pink breast cancer campaign. Paint it Pink is a fun way for companies and people to raise money for the Society's work across breast cancer funding, vital research, advocacy and services to those affected by breast cancer.

The campaign calls on the public and companies to do something to 'Paint it Pink' throughout October. People can hold a 'Paint it Pink' fundraising event, big or small, in your home, workplace or community. Visit www. paintitpink.ie to donate or to find ideas on how to get involved. You can also donate by texting Pink to 50300 to give €4 to the Irish Cancer Society. All €4 goes to the Society unless a provider applies VAT when a minimum of €3.25 will go to the Society. Money raised during this fundraiser will be used for research funded by the Irish Cancer Society which is paving the way for a new breast cancer treatment to be trialled for the first time in Ireland. As the Irish Cancer Society launches its 2015 breast cancer campaign, Paint it Pink, it is delighted to showcase a significant research study that brings fresh hope to breast

cancer patients with a particularly aggressive form of the disease, who are resistant to current therapies.

Research carried out by Irish Cancer Society Research Scholar, Naomi Elster, is bringing hope to a significant proportion of patients with HER2-positive breast cancer, an often more aggressive form of the disease. Ms Elster, under the guidance of Professor Bryan Hennessy and Dr Alex Eustace at the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland (RCSI), tested the efficacy of a new type of cancer drug, copanlisib, developed by pharmaceutical company, Bayer.

Through this research, she found that the drug acts as a signal blocker in cancer cells and holds promise of stemming the growth and spread of cancer cells when used in combination with standard therapies (see footnote). This discovery is now paving the way for this drug to be tested in advanced HER2 breast cancer patients when a clinical trial gets underway in Ireland later this year. It will be the first time that this promising new treatment combination will be made available to treatment-resistant breast cancer patients in Ireland.

The commencement of this new clinical trial comes as the Irish Cancer Society launches its breast cancer campaign, Paint it Pink.

# MATERIAL WANTED FOR NEW BOOK ON **KERRY AND THE 1916 RISING**



BRIDGET MCAULIFFE AND OWEN O'SHEA WHO ARE SEEKING MATERIAL FOR INCLUSION IN A NEW BOOK ON KERRY AND THE EASTER RISING OF 1916, PICTURED AT THE PADRAIG PEARSE MONUMENT IN TRALEE.

Two Kerry journalists, Owen O'Shea from Milltown and Bridget McAuliffe from Duagh along with history editor, Dr Mary McAuliffe of University College Dublin, a native of Duagh are looking for Kerry people's involvement in the events leading up to and during the 1916 Rising for a new book. The book will be published to coincide with the State commemorations next year and the editors are asking anyone whose family members were involved in events during this period to bring relevant material to the Revolutionary Decade Roadshow which takes place from 11am to 5pm on Saturday, October 3rd at the Kerins O'Rahilly GAA club, Strand Road, Tralee.

The book will present detailed biographies of the many Kerry people who were involved not only in Kerry, but around the country and in Dublin, in the actual Rising. These biographies will be accompanied, where possible, by photographs of the participants.

They are asking the public to bring along any material - photographs, pamphlets, poems, songs, memoirs, notes - relating to those involved in the Rising, in Dublin, Kerry and elsewhere. Items will be scanned and returned to the owners on the day.

'Frequently local and national histories

intersect,' Dr McAuliffe said. 'In order to fully understand the socio-political context of 1916, local histories are vital. We are inviting anybody who has information on their relative's involvement in this period in Kerry to come along to the Revolutionary Roadshow and bring any relevant items of interest with them on the day.'

Dr McAuliffe, who is an expert on Cumann na mBan and revolutionary women, will be available at the Roadshow on October 3rd to discuss any queries regarding women and their roles in the Rising period. She is also happy to look at and evaluate the historical association of material and artefacts brought in on the day. The book, which will be published early next year, will contain essays by historians on Austin Stack, Roger Casement, The O'Rahilly, Thomas Ashe, Fionán Lynch, Thomas MacGreevy, Cumann na mBan, the Kerry GAA and revolution, the drownings at Ballykissane Pier, and the Irish Volunteers in Kerry. The book will contain an overview of the Rising and also of the socio-political and cultural life in Kerry at the time.



# 2016 REVOLUTIONARY DECADE ROADSHOW

The first official event of Kerry's 2016 Centenary Programme is the Revolutionary Decade Roadshow at the Kerins O'Rahilly GAA club, Strand Road, Tralee from 11am-5pm on Saturday 3 October 2015.

The event will focus on 1916 and anyone who has documents relating to that time is invited to bring them along and meet with professional archivists and expert historians.

It will be formally opened at 11 am by Cllr Pat McCarthy, Cathaoirleach of Kerry and Minister Jimmy Deenihan.

Organised by Kerry County Council and The School of History at UCC and hosted by Kerins O'Rahilly GAA club, the event is aimed at anyone who has an interest in the history of the 'revolutionary decade' of modern Irish history which includes the defining event of the 1916 Rising along with the First World War, and the War of Independence, and the great causes of the time, such as the labour movement and female suffrage.

Local choirs will sing songs from the period and there will be a re-enactment of the speech given by Maud Gonne at the unveiling of the foundation stone for the Pikeman Statue in Denny Street.

Also present on the day will be a number of local and national historical groups with a particular



specialism in this period, including the Irish Volunteers Commemorative Organisation as well as an exhibition featuring uniforms, medals, photographs, insignia, documentation, prisoners' autograph books and artefacts relating to the Crown Forces.

Dr Mary McAuliffe, lecturer in women's studies at UCD and past president of the Women's History Association of Ireland, will attend the Revolutionary Roadshow. Dr McAuliffe, who is an expert on Cumann na mBan and revolutionary women, will be available to discuss any gueries regarding women and their roles in the Rising period. She is also happy to look at any evaluate the historical association of material and artefacts brought in on the day.

'Virtual Visual' helps the visually impaired navigate unfamiliar surroundings by using Near Field Technology (NFC) similar to that found on many of our our ATM cards now that allows us to pay for items under €20 by simply touching our card off the payment machine. These can currently be commonly found in Aldi, Lidl and McDonalds.

Liberty Global, the parent company of many household satellite & broadband suppliers across Europe and a stakeholder in many TV stations, hold an annual Tech Summit each year. This year they were very impressed with the CoderDojo network in Ireland and invited five students who were addressing social issues to showcase their talents and meet with their top coders in Amsterdam. This was a fantastic opportunity for Timothy and Liberty Global flew him and his family to the event and treated them like VIP's for the two day event.

The 'Appathon' which the five were invited over to formed a key part of the Tech Summit and was designed to allow the students access to top developers to mentor them. Liberty Global used the opportunity to try to encourage their company executives and developers to set up a string CoderDojo network in Holland using the Irish model as 'best practice'.

"It was an honour to represent my school and my country at such a high profile corporate event. I learnt a lot from the coders and made good links for the future. There is a long road ahead of me to follow my dream of fully developing this but Im ready to put in the hard work." Timothy McGrath told the Killarney Out-

The school has had a very successful year at various local, national and now european events and competitions. This success has caught the imagination of many other students and at the moment there is a lot of work being done on the BT Young Scientist proposal forms.

"The students that we have now with us are very eager to learn. They are really excelling from our different, varied and modern teaching techniques. 

## FLAT KERRY DISAPPOINT AS SAM STAYS IN THE CAPTIAL

### **KERRY 0-09 DUBLIN 0-12**

Croke Park, September 20th

Kerry's hopes of a first All-Ireland double-double since 1931-32 were dashed when a relentless Dublin side defeated them in a rain soaked Croke Park in front of a full house to take the All Ireland title for their twenty firth time.

Throughout the game Dublin's work rate was very high with close attention directed at all possible threats and this made it very difficult for Kerry's big name players to perform to their full potential.

Another area that concerned Kerry fans was Dublin's delaying tactics especially in the last quarter of the game.

Cluxton wasted crucial minutes in moving up field for free and in delaying his kickouts. Another example came towards the end of the game when Diarmuid Connolly took at least two minutes to execute a free at the hill end.

Indeed, many felt that referee David Coldrick would have been correct in allowing for another four or five minutes of additional time on top of the official four which were added.

When they run the match video, the Kerry management will look back on the crucial opening 20 minutes of the game we failed to capitalise on an early dominance and kicked some five wides many of which were within scoring distance.

Colm Cooper, so often the hero for Kerry on big match days, was held scoreless and at times found it difficult to match the pace of Dublin's Philly McMahon.

Kerry had legitimate claims for a penalty waved away at a very late stage of the game when Kieran Donaghy was fouled and eye gauged by Dublin's Philly McMahon.

Kerry also missed a great goal chance very late on when a delightful pass from Donaghy to Killian Young on the edge of the box was mishandled by him and somehow cleared by the Dublin

Understandably and largely due to the horrible conditions the game itself was a disappointment and failed to live up to its pre-match hype and expectation.

After an initial settling period, Dublin grew in confidence and bit by bit Jim Gavin's side began to dominate as the game wore on.

Indeed, Dublin were very unlucky not to have added a couple of goals to their tally as the woodwork and a fine Brendan Kealy save proved crucial in keeping a struggling Kerry side in contention.

Dublingot off to a dream start when midfielder Brian Fenton, RTE's Man of the Match, pointed from play inside the opening minutes. They doubled this advantage in the fifth minute when Dean Rock pointed a free.

Kerry responded with scores from James O'Donoghue and Paul Geaney. The Kingdom led for the first time when O'Donoghue landed his second of the game in the 16th minute thanks to good approach work from Colm Cooper. Dublin responded with frees from Dean Rock and Stephen Cluxton but Kerry replied with a fine Paul Geaney score to level things at 0-4

However, the Dubs were growing in confidence and tagged on four points between the 23rd and 35th minutes from Bernard Brogan, Jack McCaffrey, Paddy Andrews and Philly McMahon to give them a 0-8 to 0-4 interval lead.

Kerry needed to put their first-half performance behind them and settle early if they were to remain in contention.

The introduction of Darran O'Sullivan at half-time brought a much-needed pace to the attack, and when O'Sullivan and Jonathan Lyne added quick points, Kerry were back to within two.

However, all that good work was wiped out with points from Bernard Brogan and Paul Flynn to restore Dublin's four-point cushion.

James O'Donoghue and Darran O'Sullivan cut the gap to two again. Kerry were pressing hard but the Dublin defence stood up to everything that was thrown at them, and when Paul Flynn and Alan Brogan added late points, Dublin's grip on the trophy was secure.

Kerry needed a miracle at this stage but a late Bryan Sheehan point deep in added time proved the final score.

## MINORS TEACH TIPPERARY A PREMIER LESSON



Croke Park, Sunday September 20th

For the second final in a row a powerful scoring display by Dingle's Conor Geaney paved the way for a second successive Minor All Ireland title for Jack O'Connor's Kerry. In many ways, it was to complete the perfect record for the departing manager who over the course of his two year term went unbeaten capturing both provincial and national titles.

Geaney hit 1-5 in the Munster final and ended the day with 2-4 as Kerry retained the Electric Ireland All-Ireland Minor title with a 20-point win over Tipperary at Croke Park.

In the first all-Munster minor All-Ireland final, Kerry were 2-08 to 0-04 up at half-time as Bryan Sweeney hit their first goal and Geaney also found the net before the break.

Mark Foley got Kerry's third and by the time Geaney a fourth the result was beyond doubt. Kerry dominated the opening half, as they did in the Munster final, but it could have been more after Kerry hit seven first-half wides.

It was 2-08 to 0-04 at the break, Geaney kicked 1-0-3 as they ran into an emphatic ten-point

Sean O'Shea slotted a sensational opener with the outside of his right boot to set the tone after three minutes.

They hit four points before Tipperary got on the scoreboard - Sweeney, John Mark Foley and Geaney were all on target.

Michael Foley could almost found the net when he saw his fisted effort crash against the bar, but Tipperary survived.

Sweeney hammered home Kerry's goal in the 19th minute, he tapped down a high delivery to Sean O'Shea, O'Shea returned the pass and Sweeney made no mistake.

Brandon Barrett quickly added another point, and when Tipperary corner-back Tommy Lowry pushed Geaney in the large rectangle, referee David Gough pointed to the spot.

Geaney stepped up and calmly put Tipperary goalkeeper Charlie Manton the wrong way.

Another point, this time from captain Michael O'Connor, gave Kerry a 2-07 to 0-2 advantage after 25 minutes.

Two wonderful efforts from Tynan kept Tipperary's challenge alive, but Geaney rounded off the half with a free.

Mark Foley tapped home Kerry's third goal with 20 minutes left, and Kerry showed their ruthless streak, with Geaney's penalty four minutes later.

In the meantime, Jack Kennedy added to Nolan's point as Tipperary sole efforts of the second-half.

But Kerry claimed their 13th All-Ireland minor crown, and inflicted further pain on the Tipperary youngsters.

## **END OF AN ERA AS THE ÁRAS** PITCH IS SOLD

Right throughout the history of the club and indeed the playing of soccer in Killarney the Áras Phádraig Pitch was an iconic location for young and old to gather and enjoy participation in the sport particularly during the annual 7-a-side. So when the field was sold in a private deal in 1999 by the Franciscan Friars to the Killarney Urban District Council one would have hoped that the history of the pitch would have ensured that it would have continued to be used as an amenity into the future for the benefit of the local community. But its prime location in town meant it was always destined to become a car and bus park for the local authority in the tourist town.

Club officials felt surprised by the manner of the deal done by the swift-moving council representatives and those representing the Franciscans at the time. But the land was owned by the Franciscans and it was their right to sell the field to finance the building of their new residence situated next to the Friary church. The club did attempt to have a 'sports ground' status remain on the field but the die was cast and the deal was done and the 1998 7-a-side tournament marked the end of play on this prime soccer ground.

#### CLUBHOUSE IS READY 2002

The building and opening of the clubhouse in 2002 was a significant development for the club and reflected the basic need to provide a suitable dressing room facility for the large number of players male and female that was now being catered for by the club as well as for the visiting teams, and the annual 7-a-side was now also being hosted in the Woodlawn ground. The club benefitted in part through the National Lottery Grant Scheme through the support of former Minister John O'Donoghue with a sizeable amount of money raised through various fundraising events that were very well supported and appreciated by the club at the time.

#### **RETURNS BILLY** TO CREATE A RECORD IN CLUB MANAGEMENT

Having served the club very well in the committee and as a senior team manager for a number of years John O'Connor made way for the return of Billy Doyle to join up with Sean Hanrahan in 1998. Billy and Sean teamed up together for three vears and when the season of 2000 kicked-off Billy wrote himself into the club's history books by managing the Athletic senior team for some part in all four decades of the Kerry District League.

A new era of young players were coming through from the underage ranks to play at senior level and they included the previously mentioned O'Connor, Gleeson and O'Reilly who is also the longest serving player for the club. Brian recalls playing for the club all the way from under 10s up to senior level, starting in the early '90s. "I remember Paudie, David and myself playing with the under 16s on a Saturday morning and playing with the youths (under 18) on a Saturday evening and then playing with either the A or B team on a Sunday— it was great! Eamonn Aherne, Nicholas Murphy, Martin Crowley and Marc Pyne also started playing for the senior teams around the same time and this was also great as we had all played together at schoolboy level for the club". Incidentally Brian is still a key member of the senior team this season.

## **KOSOVARS CONTRIBUTE TO CLUB SUCCESS**

In 1999 Ireland welcomed many Kosovars refugees into the country as a show of support for the many ordinary Kosovar people ravaged by the effects of war, and Killarney hosted over 200 people of different age groups. In spite of their dreadful plight many quickly integrated into the local community with some joining and playing with Athletic and also in the 7-a-side. Arben Humolli became part of Billy and Sean's successful squad in the 1999/2000 season as the side playing in the 1st division of the KDL at the time won the Reserve Cup and more importantly won the league to gain promotion for the club back into the premier division where it rightly belonged. Arben started out the season as unknown from a

war torn land but by the end of the season he was 'Benny' and one of the most popular members of the squad . Such is the beauty of soccer as a recognised sport in so many parts of the world that for so many that it can break barriers and make people feel part of the community.

### SIGNIFICANT CUP VICTORIES

The club's senior team continued to enjoy success in cup competitions as Billy and Sean saw their side defeat a fancied Park side to reclaim the Castle Bar Cup for the second time. A Mick O'Connell special from 25 yards proved to be the difference between the sides. As well as many of the aforementioned players, the O'Sullivan brothers JP and Mike along with the outstanding Kieran Guerin also deserve credit for their significant contribution to many of the good Athletic teams throughout this period.

In 2004 under the management of Shane Foley and James Cronin the club captured its 1st Greyhound Bar KO Cup when the side overcame a competitive Ratoo Rovers side in the replayed final. Previous schoolboy lead scorer Mark Pyne scored the decisive winning goal to ensure Killarney Athletic's name was etched on the KO Cup for this historic 1st time. Other star performers on the night of a great team effort were Mark Griffin, Enda Prendergast and Shane Bunyan with Conor O' Riordan proving his worth between the posts. Two of the most outstanding players to play in this team and with the club were Kieran Cahillane RIP and Conor Spellman RIP both died too young in the following years. May they rest in peace and in our memory always.

## **AUTUMN DRIVING** ADVICE

### **DON'T GET CAUGHT OUT BY THE SEASONAL CHANGE IN DRIVING**

Autumn isn't all about blackberries and crunchy leaves - it also brings many changes for road users, from dazzlingly blinding sunlight to the first icy windscreen of the season. Be prepared – plan ahead to avoid being caught out.

Autumn is particularly bad for dazzle from low sun. Improve vision by making sure that the windscreen is clean - inside and out. Even non-smokers find a hazy film builds up on the inside surface of the windscreen over time. Scratches, abrasions and chips on the outside can intensify the sun's dazzle too.

#### **WINDSCREEN WIPERS**

Blades will last for two years at the most. New blades clear the screen more effectively and so help reduce dazzle from the sun. Now is a good time to renew worn blades.

#### WINDSCREEN WASHER FLUID

Top up and treat with a good quality, purposemade additive to reduce the chance of freezing. Don't use ordinary engine anti-freeze

but do check the handbook carefully to make sure you fill the right reservoir.

**BATTERY** This is one of the most common causes of breakdown at any time of year, but particularly in the winter when electrical loads are higher. If there's any sign of the battery struggling now, the likelihood is that it'll let you down at some time during the winter, particularly if it's more than five years old. It makes sense to renew the battery now to avoid the hassle and inconvenience of an unplanned failure later.

#### **BULBS**

Check all bulbs regularly (at least once a week) not forgetting brake lights and number plate lights. The handbook will show you how to change bulbs, though some headlight bulbs may require a visit to the garage. Carry some spare bulbs.

#### **TYRES**

Check all tyres for condition, pressure and tread depth. We recommend at least 3mm of tread for winter motoring, so if the treads are getting low think about buying new tyres now before the colder weather sets in.

#### **ANTIFREEZE**

Not just for winter, antifreeze is important all

year round as it contains additives to prevent corrosion and improve summer cooling too. It should be checked as part of the regular service schedule.

A frozen engine is very expensive to repair so if there's any doubt now is a good time to check the concentration. The handbook will give details of the correct antifreeze to use for your car — there are different types and mixing them could cause engine damage. If in doubt get a garage to check for you — many offer cheap or even free winter checks at this time

**DRIVING AT SUNSET** How to reduce the risk and possible consequence of being dazzled Keep your windscreen clean inside and out Renew wiper blades if worn

Keep a pair of sunglasses in the car, but make use of the sun visor too

Slow down immediately if dazzled Bear in mind:

if the sun is behind you, it's in the eyes of those approaching you

if the sun is in your eyes it's probably affecting those following you too

Use headlights to help others see you

### **DEER DANGER**

#### **AVOIDING ACCIDENTS INVOLVING DEER**

Twice every year, in May/June and then in October/November you need to be aware of the risk of Deer running into the road.

This is during the rutting season in October/ November and then, in May/June, the time of year when young deer disperse from their breeding areas.

These accidents kill car occupants too, as well as injuring hundreds and causing thousands of euros worth of damage to cars.

#### **TENTIPS ABOUT DEER**

If you understand a little about deer then you can think about how you can change your driving to avoid them and know what to do if you hit and injure one.

- 1. Accidents involving deer peak in May, October and November.
- 2. Worst times of day are around sunrise and between sunset and midnight.
- 3. Some areas have bigger problems than others. Deer accident hotspots include areas around the Killarney National Park

- **4.** 'Deer'' signs warn you that deer accidents happen in that area.
- 5. A deer can appear almost instantly nature makes them hard to see and they don't follow the green cross code!
- 6. Use high beam head-lights when it's dark, but dip them if you see a deer, otherwise it may freeze in your path. Don't dazzle other drivers though.
- 7. If a deer appears suddenly it's safer to continue on your normal track rather than swerve or brake hard to try to avoid it. Sudden manoeuvres can result in a loss of control and increase the risk of hitting a tree or another
- **8.** If you do hit a deer, try to stop somewhere safe. If you can't then do your best to ensure that your accident isn't hit by other vehicles.
- 9. Report the accident to the police who will contact someone who can help the injured
- 10. Bear in mind that if you miss the deer (or any other animal), but hit something else, it will be very hard to prove that the deer ever

## TAX Matters with

If you are an Airbnb host you should be aware that Airbnb are providing Revenue with details of Irish homeowner's income derived through Airbnb from 1st May

Revenue have clarified that short-term lets to guests, including accommodation provided through online accommodation booking sites, do not fall within the terms of Rent a Room Relief and are therefore fully taxable.

#### **HOW WILL AIRBNB HOSTS BE TAXED?**

Income tax will be applied at the host's marginal rate (standard or higher rate) on Airbnb earnings.

#### **CAN I CLAIM ANY RELIEF?**

Allowable expenses can be off-set against Airbnb income so hosts are advised to retain all receipts in relation to expenses incurred in connection with Airbnb hosting.

#### WHAT DO HOSTS NEED TO DO?

If you do not receive an Income Tax Return Form from Revenue, it is your own responsibility to complete and submit a return.

The income from Airbnb is considered trading rather than rental income so should be detailed under the "Self Employed Income" section of the return.

The 2014 return is due to be filed by the 31st October 2015 or if filing online via the ROS system by 12th November 2015.

## **Know Your Rights: MEANS TEST FOR FARM ASSIST**

### QUESTION

How is my income from different sources assessed for Farm Assist? I work on the farm but I also do a bit of contracting and my wife works part-time.

The means test for Farm Assist takes into account virtually every form of income you may have but assesses it in different ways.

Your income from farming and any other self-employment (like contracting) is assessed as the gross income that you or your spouse may be expected to receive minus any expenses you incur to earn that income. When you apply for Farm Assist, a social welfare inspector will call to see you and ask to see various documents. The inspector will then assess the costs incurred in connection with the running of the farm. You are entitled to receive a copy of this farm income calculation. All of your means from self-employment are assessed (there are no disregards for dependent children).

Payments under the Rural Environmental Protection Scheme (REPS), the Agri-Environmental Options Scheme (AEOS) or the Special Area of Conservation (SAC) scheme are assessed separately from other farm income. The first €2,540 per year is deducted from the total amount of all these payments and 50% of the remainder is disregarded. Expenses incurred in complying with REPS/AEOS/SAC measures are then deducted and the balance is assessed as means.

Income from an occupational pension or leasing of land or milk quotas is assessed in full. Capital (including any property that you do not live in) is assessed using the formula applied to all means-tested social welfare payments.

If you have an off-farm job, €20 per day (up to a maximum of €60) is deducted from your assessable weekly earnings and then 60% of the remainder is assessed as weekly means. Your spouse's income from employment is assessed in the same way. If you have seasonal work, you are assessed on your earnings only during the period you are actually working.

You can get detailed information on how farm income is assessed from the Department of Social Protection's website.

## **TEACHING YOUR CHILD** EMOTIONAL INTELLIGENCE

Emotional intelligence can be a key to success in life and the ability to developing good relationships. Therefore El is a very important skills for parents to teach their children. When parents have it themselves, their child will automatically learn El. Parents with EI will naturally attune to their child and understand what their child is feeling. This in turn helps the child to learn how to read and respond to his own feelings and those of others in a healthy way.

However parents who struggle with EI themselves may lack the necessary skills to teach their child. This can set up a cycle of low El within a family across the generations. When we ignore a child's feelings, don't notice when they are upset or anxious or tell them that their feelings are irrelevant, we are teaching them to ignore their own feelings. The child therefore grows up to believe that feelings are irrelevant. As adults they can struggle with emotions and in their relationships.

The following are ways in which parents can enhance their Child's Emotional Intelligence.

- Know your child's true nature: Pay attention to see what your child likes, dislikes, gets angry about, is afraid or struggles with. Communicate these observations to your child in a non- judgemental way. This helps your child to begin to see themselves through your eyes - and they can feel how well you know them. Your child will see themselves reflected in your eyes, thus helping them to know who they are. This can boost their confidence and make them resilient to life's challenges.
- · Connect emotionally to your Child: Make an effort to empathise with your child and feel what they are feeling. Your child will feel an instant bond with you when your feel their emotion. This in turn helps your child to learn how to be empathic with others and to form healthy relationships. When your child sees you trying to understand their feelings or feel their feelings, they receive a powerful message.
- Respond non judgementally. When you child is emotional do not judge their feelings as right or wrong - instead look beyond the feelings to the source of this emotion. Help them to name and manage the emotion rather than judging it. This will help your child to develop a healthy relationship with their own emotions. It also teaches them to regulate and manage their emotions.

# **Health Matters....** With Dr. Michael Moloney

## **PNEUMONIA**

Pneumonia is a serious lung infection. Treatment with antibiotics is usually needed. If you are normally well, it is likely that you will make a full recovery. Some severe cases are life-threatening. When someone is in poor health or very old, pneumonia can make them very ill and the infection is more likely to be life-threatening.

#### WHAT IS PNEUMONIA?

Pneumonia is an inflammation of the lung tissue. It is usually due to infection. Pneumonia tends to be more serious than bronchitis. Bronchitis is an inflammation or infection of the large airways - the bronchi (see diagram). Sometimes bronchitis and pneumonia occur together which is called bronchopneumonia.

#### ARE THERE DIFFERENT TYPES OF PNEUMONIA?

Pneumonia is commonly caused by an infection with a bacterium or virus. There are 3 or 4 different bacteria that are the most common causes of pneumonia. There is also a well-known group of bacteria that causes pneumonia in about 3 out of 10 cases. They are called atypicals. Other germs such as fungi, yeasts, or protozoa can sometimes also cause pneumonia. Rarely, non-infective pneumonia is caused by inhaling poisons or chemicals.

#### WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF PNEUMONIA?

Typical symptoms are cough, fever, sweats, shivers, being off your food and feeling generally unwell. Headaches and aches and pains are common. You usually make more sputum. This may become yellow/green coloured and is sometimes bloodstained.

You may become breathless, breathe fast and develop a tight chest. A sharp pain in the side of the chest may develop if the infection involves the pleura. (This is the membrane between the lung and the chest wall.) A doctor may hear crackles in the chest when listening with a stethoscope.

#### **CAN PNEUMONIA BE PREVENTED**

Pneumococcal vaccine helps to protect against infections such as pneumonia and meningitis. The vaccine will be injected into a muscle or under the surface of your skin. The most common side-effects are tenderness at the site of the injection, mild fever, feeling tired, and head/muscle aches. These should soon pass.

Pneumococcal vaccine stimulates your body to make antibodies against pneumococcal bacteria. These antibodies then help protect you from illness should you become infected with pneumococcal bacteria. It provides protection against many (but not all) types of pneumococcal bacteria.







## UNUSUAL USES FOR **POTATOES - CONTINUED:**



- \* Potatoes are great for your skin, so making yourself a potato face mask once a week can reap rewards. - \* If you have over-salted your pot of soup or pasta by mistake, then throw in some potato slices or cubes to restore the balance. Leave the potatoes in while the mixture simmers for ten minutes or so, and then scoop them back
- \* Are your old tools or kitchen utensils starting to look like antiques? Restore them to former glories by chopping a potato in half, adding a liberal amout of soap or salt to the cut end and rubbing it over the affected surface. Rinse and dry the object thorougly afterwards. This works great on along the edge of large carving knives!

#### BIZARRE HISTORICAL **COINCIDENCES:**

\*Dennis the Menace is a comic book creation about a fictional boy who likes to get in trouble. There is an American version, as well as a British one, which bear a striking resemblance. #### THE **WORLD'S BIGGEST** WILDLIFF MAN-MADE **RESERVE:**

On Friday, September 11, the European Commission together with representatives from the British Government opened the ground-breaking Jubilee Marsh, marking the end to the first phase of what has been dubbed the Wallasea Island Wild Coast project which, when complete, will be the biggest man-made wildlife reserve of its kind.

The project, which is being developed just north of Southend, Essex, is backed by the RSPB group BirdLife and Crossrail, the company that is responsible for developing new trainlines across London. The initiative was devised as a way to fuse redevelopment of transport together with repurposing now unused land for conservation and general habitat improvement. When it is completed the project will provide a habitat for migratory

wetland species who have been displaced or face being displaced due to climate change. The project also takes into account what might happen after climate change warms Europe and is ideally placed to provide habitats for birds that leave Europe as a result.

Wallasea Island was originally home to farmland but because Wallasea was below sea level it was becoming increasingly harder to protect from rising sea waters. In order to combat this, more than three million tonnes of material that was excavated as part of Crossrail's railway network overhaul has been shipped to Wallasea where it and other donated materials were then put to use for the Jubilee Marsh project.

#### THE MOST WELL-TRAVELLED WOMAN IN HISTORY:

When Audrey Walsworth first left America to visit Lithuania in 1969, she just wanted to learn more about her family's history. She didn't expect, more than 40 years and 300 countries and territories later, to make history of her own.

She didn't make her second trip until 1980, to China, during one of the first years the People's Republic opened its border to tourists.

In the years since, Ms. Walsworth has visited all 193 United Nations member states, including all 324 territories listed by the Travelers' Century Club (an organization for the world's most widely travelled people), which counts separately regions that are geographically, politically, or ethnologically removed from their parent country. The club, which requires its members to have visited at least 100 territories and which Ms. Walsworth joined in 1994, estimates that fewer than 10 people in the world have accomplished the feat. To do so, Ms. Walsworth has made as many as eight voyages a year, every year since she joined.




