Lifelong dream fulfilled as Oisin is crowned Champion Jockey

Ballyhar man Oisin Murphy was born with horse-racing coursing through his veins and last Saturday his family gathered at Ascot to see him crowned Champion Jockey, fulfilling his life-long dream.

The 24 year old became the youngest competitor to win the title since a 23 year old Ryan Moore in 2006. Oisin has amassed a staggering 166 wins for the season, 35 more than his nearest rival.

Oisin is the son of Maria Culloty and John Murphy and brother to Blathin and Siabh. He had an eventful start in life, arriving into the world at 27 weeks and in a recent interview on the British Champions Series, Oisin's mum spoke of her son's start in life. "Oisin was born with determination and that steely detrmination is with him so far", she said.

He had his first horse riding lesson at the tender age of four and continued with lessons until his his uncle Don bought him a three year old pony. This started him on a successful road in the showjumping circuit.

Oisin was also influenced in his career by his uncle, three-dimensional Cheltenham Gold Cup winner Jim Culloty and spent a lot of his time at Jim's yard in Churchtown in Cork.

He also spent a summer when he was 15 at Tommy Stack's yard and it was there that Oisin's mother Maria said he was taught how to ride a race-horse properly. At 16, following his Leaving Cert, he went to Aidan O'Brien's yard as a trainee and then it was onto Andrew Balding's yard in the UK.

Oisin has made great strides in the world of horse racing since 2013, when he claimed 41 wins and 2016, he became number one jockey to Qatar Racing and won 10 Group races on 10 different horses.

He gained his first Group 1 victory at the 2017 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and has since gone on to ride eleven more winners at the highest level, notching his first two Group 1 winners in the UK. Over the years in various interviews, Oisin has spoken of his admiration for older jockeys such as Kieren Fallon as well as contemporaries like Silvestre De Sousa and Jim Crowley, but his idol is Frankie Dettori after whom he named his dog and whom he credits as being the best jockey he has raced against.

Oisin has already accomplished remarkable success and given his youth he is destined

Preparations underway for Let's Talk Tourism Conference

Peter Doyle spoke with Margaret Cahill, the Republic Of Ireland President of SKAL in order to learn more about the organisation.

SKAL president, Margaret Cahill is also the chairperson of the organising committee for the upcoming Let's talk tourism conference to be held in Killarney, which is now an annual event and indeed a by-product of SKAL.

SKAL is a travel and tourism organisation, that was founded in Paris in 1932." Mrs. Cahill told the Killarney Outlook. "It was formed in order to build bonds with

both suppliers and competitors and now has 15,000 members in over 80 countries. In Ireland there are four clubs, Dublin, Cork, Kerry and Galway, totalling 150 members", she added. The members meet about ten times a year, usually in a social setting, but the objective is to conduct business. It is a self-funded organisation, therefore it is dependant on members. The membership is diverse comprising of Hoteliers, Tour operators, Guest house owners and visitor attractions. Mrs. Cahill added, "that it is because of this diversity in membership that SKAL is viewed as the trusted voice in tourism."

SKAL has undertaken a major initiative to digitally transform both it's I.T. and web capabilities in order to attract younger recruits. This project will be rolled out from next year.

The Let's talk tourism conference due to be held in the Great Southern hotel in Killarney on Friday the 8th of November is now in it's fourth year. The conference was originally conceived by members of SKAL for two reasons. Firstly to promote awareness of SKAL and secondly to spearhead a conference that was entirely industry lead and independent of the Government.

The conference is a national event which is expected to be sold out. Minister for Tourism Brendan Griffin will open the event that features many guest speakers including renowned journalist Olivia O' Leary who is the moderator for this year's event. The main issues affecting tourism today will be discussed.

This year's theme is "Sustainability, the foundation for our future."The idea behind that is the challenge of adapting business practices in a manner beneficial to the planet. Mrs. Cahill cautioned, "that long after Brexit is resolved, climate change will remain the burning issue of the day."

"Telling Kerry's Story.....

Kerry Friends of Motor Neurone host Public Information Evening

An informative evening, with stories from people both affected by Motor Neurone Disease and those living with someone who is, was held in the Killarney Plaza Hotel on Thursday 17th October last.

The theme of the meeting was "Telling Kerry's Story" of people's association with Motor Neurone Disease. Following a short introduction the meeting was addressed by Irish Motor Neurone Disease Association's Regional Development Officer Marie Reavey who informed the meeting of the work the Association does for Motor Neurone Sufferers like providing home visits by MND nurses, providing financial assistance towards home care, provision of specialised medical equipment and funding for counselling and research. Marie Reavey also informed the meeting that 86% of their annual budget is reliant on fundraising and explaining where this money is spent. Alan MacDonnell formerly from Kilgarvan gave a very moving account of his mother Mary's 7 year's battle with Motor Neurone Disease. Mary was diagnosed with MND in 2005 and passed away in August 2011. USING A PENSION TO PAY LESS TAX:

Pension contributions provide a way of paying less income tax. Up to Revenue Limits, contributions to a pension qualify for relief from income tax. This effectively means that, where the higher rate of income tax is 40% and you are a higher rate taxpayer, a \in 100 contribution to a pension will only have a net cost to you of \in 60 (had you not made the contribution, the other \in 40 would have gone to the government as income tax).

Pensions carry another tax benefit: they grow free of tax, unlike deposit accounts in Banks etc (which are generally subject to tax on interest in the form of DIRTTax) or investment in property or shares (where rent or dividends are liable to income tax and gains in value are subject to Capital GainsTax).

When your pension benefits are drawn down, a Retirement Lump Sum of normally at least 25% of the value of your pension can usually be taken either completely free of tax. The rest of the benefit, is usually taken in the form of a retirement fund or a pension for life, is taxable. However many people will find themselves in paying much less tax in retirement than when they were working and making pension contributions, and so will often not pay a lot of tax on their pension income when they retire.





PRESBYOPIA

WHAT IS PRESBYOPIA?

Presbyopia is the normal loss of near focusing ability that occurs with age. Most people begin to notice the effects of presbyopia sometime after age 40, when they start having trouble seeing small print clearly.

Presbyopia is caused by an agerelated process. This differs from astigmatism, myopia and hyperopia, which are related to the shape of the eyeball and are caused by genetic and environmental factors. Presbyopia generally is believed to stem from a gradual thickening and loss of flexibility of the natural lens inside your eye.

These age-related changes occur within the proteins in the lens, making the lens harder and less elastic over time. With less elasticity, this means the eye has a harder time focusing up close and we may have to hold material further away to see it clearly.

WHAT IS THE TREATMENT FOR PRESBYOPIA?

Presbyopia is a natural part of ageing and there is no cure for it. The solution is generally to wear glasses for reading Contact lenses are also available for presbyopia if you do not want to wear glasses.

ARE THERE EXERCISES I CAN DO TO STOP NEEDING READING GLASSES? WILL I MAKE MY EYES WORSE BY WEARING GLASSES?

No. As presbyopia is caused by the lens stiffening, and not the muscles weakening. Wearing glasses will not make your eyes worse and there are no exercises that can help this. However, you may notice that when you take your glasses off, things appear to be worse without them than before you had them. This is simply because you are noticing how clear and comfortable vision should be. Before you had the glasses, you were unaware how blurry your vision really was because it changed slowly over the years.

Presbyopia will get worse as you age until you reach your late fifties, when you will have no natural focusing ability left. Unfortunately there is nothing you can do to stop it.

For any vision changes it is important to have a sight test to determine the cause.



Anthony is the son of Mary and Paul Darmody and brother to James and David.



It was a great experience, and one to remember as the course that John Treacy won the World Cross Country Championship back in 1979 in very similar conditions.



Welcome back dear reader, we've recently looked at how we and our children are being affected by demonic things dressed up as innocent fun and entertainment in what we are watching and part-taking in. It is up to you friend to do what you like with that information, but I urge you to call upon the Lord Jesus, and ask Him to reveal the truth about these things to you. God warns in Ezekiel chapter 33:1-9 that the watchmen - those who preach the Gospel, are to tell people the truth of His Word and sound the alarm of the enemy's approach. In His Presence there is fullness of Joy (Psalm 16:11). Those who live without God's Presence are likened as "a lonely flagpole on a hill...a tattered banner on a distant mountaintop" (Isaiah 30:17-22). But those who come to Him will receive His love and compassion, their lives directed by God's peace, forever changed and hlessed
