The Kerry GAA gala presentation night at the INEC on Saturday last to honour the seven Kerry Teams who won senior All Irelands between 1997 and 2014 was billed as a night to remember and the occasion certainly lived up to the billing. In all there were 87 medal winners and 25 management team members in that period and a surprisingly high percentage of those made it to the Killarney venue. Master of ceremonies, Marty Morrissey welcomed the players on stage in groups of three and there for all to see in the flesh were players who would have graced any of the great Kerry teams in the Kingdom's glorious history. It was indeed a who's who

of Kerry football with icons such as Maurice Fitzgerald, Seamus Moynihan, the three Ó Sé brothers who got a mighty welcome, Declan O'Sullivan, Mike McCarthy, Colm Cooper and Kieran Donaghy to mention but a few.

The management teams led by the likes of Jack O'Connor, Pat O'Shea and Eamonn Fitmaurice were also introduced and all those honoured were presented with a painting of Kerry and Cork in action on Munster final day in Fitzgerald Stadium by Kerry Group CEO Stan McCarthy and the Chairman of Kerry County Committee Patrick O'Sullivan. Replying on behalf of players and management, Kerry manager Eamonn Fitzmaurice gave a passionate speech and promised to return the Sam Maguire to the Kingdom.

While there were players with various numbers of All Ireland medals, All Star awards, Players of the Year etc and managers with equally high profiles, at the Kerry GAA Gala night on

Saturday last, the only man to get a standing ovation on the night was a guietly spoken Mayo man! Vincent Linnane, or "Vince" to all those who know him, started off as kitman for the Kerry Minor hurlers and soon after came on board with Charlie Nelligan and the Minor footballers in 1993. Very soon his brief expanded to the Under 21's and the seniors and since then he minds the various team kits with meticulous attention. The Kiltimagh native, who has made Ballyduff his home since returning from Manchester in the early eighties with his Kerry born wife Noreen, picks out the 2008 All Ireland quarter final with Galway for special mention; "It was an absolutely desperate evening and if we hadn't had the second set of jerseys that evening, we'd have been in trouble. Normally, the second set would be thrown on at half-time if the weather was very bad, but, on this occasion, they were put on before the throw-in as the players were drenched during the warm-up. We probably could have done with a third set, now that I think of it" he recalls. Vince of course is also the caretaker of the Austin Stack Park, a role he has filled since 1989 and has seen many great Kerry footballers and managers come and go in his time involved with the senior team; "It was a privilege to be involved with them all. They were all very genuine people. The biggest character of the lot was my old friend Páidí. I always had the craic with Páidí. He was a character. I always had great conversations with Maurice Fitzgerald, he wasn't as quiet as most thought. Seamus Moynihan, the three Ó Sé's and Declan O'Sullivan, too, were very easy get on with. I'm privileged to be able to call all of them my friends." Anyone who thinks that Vince will hand in the keys of Austin Stack Park or indeed fold away the Kerry jerseys for the last time any day soon following this special presentation would be very much wide of the mark. "I wouldn't be doing what I'm doing for all this time if I wasn't enjoying it. I'll stay at it as long as the Lord lets me". Long may he continue to share in the glory of successful Kerry teams.

DR CROKES FACE THE NIRE IN SENIOR FINAL

Dr Crokes left no one in any doubt that they were the best team in Kerry when regaining the Bishop Moynihan Cup last month and they now go in search of the seventh Munster club title when they take on Waterford champions The Nire in Mallow at 3:30pm. The Nire have proved themselves to be a tough nut to crack in their two previous final outings and both against Kerry opposition. Just two years ago they held Austin Stacks to four points (3-5 to 2-4) and back in 2006 they gave Sunday's opponents, Dr Crokes a right fright before going down by three points (2-5 to 0-8). Both sides have been busy over the last couple of months and the Killarney outfit are playing for the 8th weekend on the trot, That sort of schedule often leads to injuries but the Kerry standard bearers have been very lucky in that respect.

They had tough encounters against Clare champions Kilmurray-Ibrickane and Tipperary representatives Loughmore-Castleiney but

were probably more comfortable winners than the final scorelines would suggest. The Deise men, who come from north Waterford not far from Clonmel, surprised many in the semi final a week after winning the county title when accounting for Cork's Carbery Rangers who

had the benefit of a quarter final tie. That is sure to give them confidence going into Sunday's game but popular opinion is that Dr Crokes will have too much firepower up front with plenty reserve talent also on the bench to come into the fray if needed.

ROAD SAFETY ISSUES

Councillor Gleeson stated that we dump up to €700 million worth of food annually. Much of this food is of perfectly good quality and should be given to local charity groups. The Council replied that Food Share Kerry was launched in the Institute Technology Tralee last March. It is an initiative of North and East Kerry Development, Kerry County Council and Saint Vincent de Paul. It is a not for profit organisation that aims to combat food poverty. Quality surplus food is rescued from the supermarkets and made available to organisations who know best how to redistribute it to those in genuine need.

The aims are firstly to have an impact on a major social need and secondly to benefit the environment by preventing the needless dumping of perfectly good food.

As yet not all retailers in Kerry are committed to the scheme. Councillor Gleeson welcomed the reply and its positive message and expressed the hope that the others will be inspired to become involved as donors.

COUNCIL INVITES APPLICATIONS FOR €750,000 COMMUNITY SUPPORT FUND

Kerry County Council is inviting applications from community and voluntary organisations for a fund of €750,000 for local projects and initiatives. The 2017 Community Support Fund was launched on Monday by the Cathaoirleach and members of Kerry County Council. The Fund, which is now in its third year, has supported 700 projects since 2015 to the value of €1.5million. It recognises the valuable contribution of the community and voluntary sectors in Kerry and the vital and beneficial work that those organisations do. Applications are now invited from community groups, residents' committees, Tidy Towns groups, Chamber Alliances and other organisations across the four Municipal Districts in Kerry. This year, it is intended that some of the Community Support Fund will be used to target strategic projects in Municipal Districts and that it will be used to co-fund projects which are in receipt of grants from

other sources. It may also be used by groups to help leverage grants under programmes such as the Town and Village Renewal Scheme and the Rural Economic Development Zone Scheme (REDZ). A portion of the fund will also be retained to provide matching funding for approved LEADER projects that have a broad community gain associated with them.







TODAY IS INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR THE ELIMINATION OF VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN

Women's activists have marked 25 November as a day against violence since 1981. This date came from the brutal assassination in 1960, of the three Mirabal sisters, political activists in the Dominican Republic, on orders of Dominican ruler Rafael Trujillo (1930-1961).

On the 17 December 1999, the United Nations General Assembly designated 25 November as the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, and invited governments, international organisations and NGOs to organise activities designed to raise public awareness of the problem on that day. There are several forms of violence against women including physical, mental and psychological abuse, rape, sexual assault, genital mutilation, human trafficking, forced marriages etc. According to a report from Amnesty International, violence against women in this country is widespread. Another survey on violence against women reveals that 26% of Irish women have experienced physical and/or sexual violence by a partner or non-partner since the age of 15. The survey by the European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights (EU FRA) reveals that violence against women is pervasive and extensive across the 28 EU states, including Ireland. Almost one in three Irish women have experienced some form of psychological violence by a partner, according to the comprehensive survey. If you have experienced violence, you may feel shock, fear, sadness, and confusion. You may even feel numb, or think that what happens to you doesn't matter. But no one has the right to hurt you or make you feel afraid. Many groups and people want to help you live a healthier, happier life.

• If you are in immediate danger, call the Gardai

• Learn more about different help hotlines. Hotlines provide support and resources. They also can help you create a safety plan for leaving an abuser. Women's Aid offer a National Freephone Helpline, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week on 1800 341 900.

Reach out to people you trust. People who care want to help. You can start with family, friends, or community organisations.

• Talk to a health care professional. Doctors, nurses, and counsellors can offer physical aid, emotional support, and resources. Go to a hospital emergency room if you need immediate help for injuries.

HANDY HINTS

• Don't over cook fish, it's better to take it off the heat and let it continue to cook for up to 2 minutes in the pan.

• If you accidentally over-salt a dish while it's still cooking, drop in a peeled potato. It absorbs the excess salt.

• To get the most juice out of fresh lemons, bring them to room temperature and roll them under your palm against the kitchen counter before squeezing.

To prevent eggshells from cracking, add a pinch of salt to the water before hard-boiling.
 Wrap celery in aluminium foil when putting in the refrigerator to stop it wilting.

• When peeling vegetables put a colander in the sink to catch the scraps, you can lift straight up with much less mess.

• Cleaning your blender is much quicker if you fill it about a third with hot water and add a couple of drops of your washing detergent, then turn it on.

• Stuck-On Food in Pots, Pans, and Casserole dishes - : Fill the pan with water and place a fabric softener sheet in the water. Allow the pan to soak overnight. The food will wipe right out! Wash well before reusing.

• Dusting artificial flowers - put into a large paper bag containing salt and give them a good shake.

• Burnt your tongue? Sprinkle a few grains of sugar on the sore spot to alleviate the tenderness.

THE MONRACH OF THE GLEN PAINTING LOOKS SET TO STAY IN SCOTLAND

Whisky giants Diageo have agreed to sell the Monarch of the Glen to the National Galleries of Scotland. The company has now gifted more than half the value of the piece to NGS in the hope it can raise the remaining £4m to put it in public hands for the first time. Originally commissioned for the House of Lords, the painting now valued at £10m never went on display there and was sold to a private collector. It changed hands several times before being snapped up by whisky firm John Dewar and Sons and has since been in the hands of the industry. The sale of the 1851 painting of a stag set against a remote Highland backdrop, which had not been available on the market for 100 years, had sparked concerns that it would end up going overseas. The National Galleries of Scotland will launch a multi-million pound fundraising campaign to secure Sir Edwin Landseer's work, which was due to be sold by auction in London next month. The move, described as a "part-gift" by galleries officials, will ensure that the painting - which was previously on longterm loan to the National Museum of Scotland - will remain on public display.

DAVID ATTENBOROUGH 'REPORTED TO FBI' OVER REMARKS HE MADE ABOUT DONALD TRUMP

Sir David Attenborough has been targeted with death threats and faces a possible FBI investigation after suggesting that Donald Trump could be shot. Speaking before the US Presidential election, the broadcasting legend was asked how he would feel about America voting for Trump who has claimed that climate change is a "Chinese hoax", in comments reported on inews Sir David answered: "We could shoot him. It's not a bad idea." A giggle indicated that the natural history presenter was not being serious. However the more fanatical pro-Trump supporters failed to see the joke. Sir David, whose new Planet Earth II BBC series is entertaining 11m viewers, has been the victim of online abuse, including death threats, following the remark. Others contacted the FBI and Secret Service feeds on Twitter, urging the authorities to open an investigation into Sir David, citing any threat to assassinate the President as a Class E felony. Sir David, who recently celebrated his 90th birthday, was also accused of "incitement to murder".

U.S.-BORN PANDA TWINS HAVE FOOD AND LANGUAGE PROBLEMS IN CHINA

Two United States-born giant panda twins, currently in China, are struggling to adjust to the local food and language as they only know English, state-media has reported. Three-yearold Meilun and Meihuan are struggling to follow Chinese, specially the Sichuan dialect as they can only understand English and prefer American crackers to Chinese bread. The pandas arrived at Chengdu Research Base of Giant Panda Breeding on November 5 from Atlanta Zoo. The pair of twins was born in the U.S. Their mother, Lun Lun, gave birth to another set in September. The giant pandas are on loan from China to the U.S. as part of the agreement, all adult offspring are sent to China when they're of age. Pandas are shy with strangers and need company, explained Luo Yunhong, a breeder at the panda base. His main worry about the transition is that they both love American crackers so much that everything they eat - from bamboo to apples and even water - must be mixed with the crackers and to help them get used to food in China, Luo has been gradually replacing the crackers with Chinese bread. Another problem is that Meilun and Meihuan cannot understand Sichuan dialect; only hearing their names can make them raise their heads, whereas they react to a number of basic words in English, such as "Come here". Their carer says the sisters are gradually getting used to their new lives and Meilun is very lively, often jumping onto the roof and hanging upside down from a rail unlike her elder sister Meihuan who prefers to sit still and observe her new environment, occasionally snacking on bamboo.

TEEN CREATED APP SO BULLIED CHILDREN NEVER HAVE TO EAT ALONE

Natalie Hampton from Sherman Oaks,

California knows what it is like to be completely ostracized by all of her classmates, and she had to eat lunch alone every day. It felt lonely, embarrassing, and so awful that Ms. Hampton had to leave. It doesn't happen to her at her new school and she felt that if she was thriving but didn't do anything about the people who felt like she had every single day, then she was just as bad as the people who watched her eat alone. She felt that it was her job to prevent other children from ever having to experience it and so the 16 year old created "Sit With Us," an app that helps children find a friendly spot to sit. Willing children sign up as ambassadors for a Sit With Us club and agree to post open lunches so that anyone who has the free app and has nowhere to go can find a table and, hopefully, make some new friends.

MORE ENVIRONMENTALLY FRIENDLY KRATHONG THIS YEAR

JUST OVER 93% of nearly 662,000 floats collected from Bangkok's waterways after this years Loy Krathong celebrations were made of natural materials, officials said. A total of 661,935 floats were collected, which was 19.8%, or 163,676, less than the 825,211 collected last year, Bangkok Governor Aswin Kwanmuang said. "Compared to last year, krathong made of natural materials rose from 91.4% to 93.3%, and the Styrofoam ones dropped from 8.6% to 6.7%," he said, adding that 2015 saw 754,587 floats made with natural materials and 71,027 made with foam. "This shows that Bangkok residents prefer natural materials and also reflects their and sellers' concern for the environment," he added. The Environment Department, Drainage and Sewerage Department of the Bangkok Metropolitan Authority (BMA) and district offices deployed 210 members of staff, along with 45 boats to collect floats and floating candles from waterways and parks for 4 hours immediately following the end of the festivities. On the evening of Loy Krathong, people gather around lakes, rivers and canals to pay respects to the goddess of water by releasing beautiful lotus shaped rafts, decorated with candles, incense and flowers onto the water. Every year, it falls on the night of the twelfth lunar month (usually in November), at the end of the rainy season when the full-moon lights up the sky. The history behind the festival is complex, and Thais celebrate for many reasons. The main rice harvest season has ended and it's time to thank the Water Goddess for a year's worth of her abundant supply, as well as an apology for polluting the waters. Some believe that this is the time to symbolically 'float away' all the anger and grudges you have been holding onto, and including a fingernail or a lock of hair is seen as a way of letting go of the dark side of yourself, to start anew free of negative feelings. If your candle stays alight until your Krathong disappears out of sight, it means a year of good luck.

MARGARET'S RAMBLINGS

SOUTH KOREA TAKES STUDENT EXAM VERY SERIOUSLY

To clear the roads for the 606,000 students to ensure they arrived on time, government offices, major businesses and Seoul's stock market opened at 10am, an hour later than usual and police cars offered rides for students who might find it difficult to get to their destination on time. Transport authorities halted all airport landings and take-offs for 30 minutes in the afternoon to coincide with the main language listening test. Work at many construction sites was suspended and large trucks were banned from the roads near the 1,183 test venues nationwide. Teenage South Koreans spend many years preparing for success in the National exam which is taken over one day, a good result means a place in one of the elite colleges seen as key to a future career and even marriage prospects. From elementary school ages, South Koreans will spend many hours in private cram schools after their regular classes. For a senior high school student, the study routine includes self-study sessions during their almost 8 hours a day at school, cram school classes and more selfstudying hours late into the night at private cubicles. To encourage the students to rest, the current Lee Myung-bak administration placed a ban on operating private classes after 10pm. Government officials routinely patrol areas and crackdown on illicit classes. The pressure to score well in the exam has been blamed for teenage depression and suicide rates that are among the highest in the world.

EAGLES V DRONES - THE EAGLES ARE WINNING FOR NOW

Unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV) have become unlikely prey for wedge-tailed eagles in Western Australia's Goldfields, costing a mining giant more than \$100,000 to replace its newest surveying tool. Ten UAVs (Drones) have been lost since South Africa's Gold Fields, the world's seventh-biggest gold producer, began operating the Trimble UX5 systems at its St Ives operations near Kambalda. One crashed as a result of human error, while nine have been taken down by wedge-tailed eagles, which are known to have wingspans more than twice that of the 1-metre-wide UAVs. The Drones are constructed from foam and carbon fibre, and fly at an altitude of about 125 metres with cameras attached; they reach speeds of up to 92km/h and for some unknown reason are built to resemble an eagle or other large bird and the drones remote control operators must pass a five-day course to fly them, The UAVs cost about AU\$10,000 per body and another AU\$10,000 per camera and capture large-scale photographs, down to 2cm resolution, and computer-generated, high-detail contouring of mined areas that are incorporated into future plans.



Know Your Rights:

CHRISTMAS BONUS

QUESTION

I'm getting a social welfare payment. Will I get a Christmas Bonus?

ANSWER

The Christmas Bonus is paid to people getting a longterm social welfare payment. Long-term social welfare payments include the following:

• State Pensions and Widow's/Widower's/Surviving Civil Partner's Pensions

• Invalidity Pension, Blind Pension, Disability Allowance, Carer's Allowance, Carer's Benefit, Domiciliary Care Allowance and guardian's payments

• Jobseeker's Transitional payment, One-Parent Family Payment, Farm Assist, Deserted Wife's Benefit and Allowance

• Community Employment, Rural Social Scheme, Tús, Gateway, Back to Work Enterprise Allowance and Job Initiative

• Back to Education Allowance (BTEA), VTOS and Further Education and Training (FET) training allowance (people coming from jobseeker's payments must have been on their payment and/or BTEA or VTOS or FET training allowance for 15 months)

For Jobseeker's Allowance or Basic Supplementary Welfare Allowance, you must be getting the payment for 15 months to get a Christmas Bonus.

In 2016 the Christmas Bonus will be 85% of your normal weekly payment (including the Living Alone Increase, the Island Allowance and the Over-80 Increase). Fuel Allowance is not included when calculating the Christmas Bonus. The minimum Christmas Bonus payment is \in 20.

For Domiciliary Care Allowance (DCA), which is paid monthly, the bonus is 85% of the weekly payment. The DCA portion of the bonus is calculated independently of other payments. So, for example, if you are getting DCA for one child, 85% of the weekly payment is €60.70.



ASPECT QUERY LETTERS FROM THE REVENUE COMMISSIONERS LINKED TO 'PATRONAGE SHARES' ISSUED BY KERRY CO-OP FOR THE YEARS 2011 TO 2013

The Revenue Commissioners are seeking income tax on part of the 600,000 'patronage shares' issued by Kerry Co-op for the years 2011, 2012 and 2013. Revenue have estimated values for the shares issued in 2011 at €65, 2012 at €75 and 2013 at €90.

It is Revenue's position that the shares need to be included in the accounts as additional trading income subject to income tax, USC and PRSI at the appropriate rates, based on the market value of the shares when received.

Correspondence from the Revenue states:

"This affords you the opportunity of making an Unprompted Voluntary Disclosure under the Code of Practice for Revenue Audit and other Compliance Interventions thereby minimising potential penalties together with avoiding publication and prosecution if all conditions attaching to making such a disclosure are met.

"To enable you to avail of the opportunity to make such a disclosure, please respond with your computation of the tax liability together with the appropriate payment." Significantly, the Revenue has declared that the patronage shares are to be regarded as trading income and subject to income tax, USC, and PSRI. Moreover, the scale of these liabilities must be based on the market value of the shares, not their par value. The recipient farmers have been given 21 days to reply.

So far 400 out of a total of 3,400 suppliers have been contacted, prompting fears that this may be an initial move by Revenue before they spread the net wider within the region and beyond.




