The Flower doesn't dream of the bee - it blossoms and the bee comes...

The importance of the bee to the planet is one of the aims of The Killarney Looking Good Committee and this year it is gearing much of its 2019 programme towards educating and raising awareness of the tidy towns themes in the community.

"We are not only litter pickers and painters but we have a common aim of developing and promoting sustainability, biodiversity and enabling all residents and locals to work together for the common good of Killarney", a spokesperson for the committee told the Killarney Outlook.

This year the group are trying to raise awareness around the plight of the humble bee. 90% of the world's food comes from one hundred crops and 70% of these are pollinated by bees so they play a very important and vital part in the food chain. Our bee population in Ireland is declining and we need to work together to stop this decline.

"Late last year many of you will remember the planting of bluebells and snowdrops

on the Mission Road by over 50 Tidy Towns volunteers over 2 days. We'll have to wait for next year for the snowdrops but we are now beginning to see the fruits of our labour with the bluebells beginning to bloom. Snowdrops and bluebells while in keeping with the landscape of Mission Road are also great pollinators for the bees. Tidy towns intends to continue similar bee friendly planting schemes later in the year", they added. In order to embrace biodiversity we may need to change our perception of beauty and embrace the wildflowers growing on our roadside verges and not accept tightly mown grass as beautiful. Dandelions must be seen as beautiful and sustaining life and not as a weed to be treated. We need to embrace "Don't mow, let it grow" To raise awareness of our message a new bee and wild flower meadow mural is in place on Park Road. Tidy towns will also be working with the schools raise awareness and to help stop the decline of bees.

A Killarney woman who works with Debra Ireland has recently led a fundraising trip to the Arctic.

Claire Concannon, a former student at St. Brigid's Secondary School was among more than 30 of Ireland's top business women to take on the Arctic challenge to raise money for charity.

Claire had to learn the skils to survive in temperatures of -20c while trekking across the polar region in March.

Over 300 in Ireland are living with EB a condition with no cure.

The condition causes the skin, both inside and out to blister and wound at the slightest touch. ""I never thought I would say this, but living in minus 20 degrees for a week was one of the best things I have ever done! The arctic tests you in every possible way you can be tested and brings you back to what's really important. I certainly came home better for it", Claire told the Killarney Outlook.

From the Arctic Challenge 2019 we have raised over €200,000 - with funds still rolling in!



SHOULD YOU BE CONSIDERING SWITCHING YOUR MORTGAGE

Yes, because some of the Irish mortgage lenders have much lower mortgage interest rates compared to others. There has been a lot of discussion recently in the media recently as regards mortgage switching this is because there can be a very substantial difference in interest rates and monthly repayments between lenders. For example on a mortgage of €200000 over 30 years based on a property value of €300000 and comparing current fixed interest rates one lenders 2 year fixed rate is as slow as 2.30% (3.85% APR) which costs €770 per month whereas another lenders 2 year fixed rate is as high as 3.30% (APR 3.90%) monthly repayment €876 per month. The monthly repayment for the lender with the higher rate is a staggering €106 per month more expensive. Over the term of the mortgage you could pay €38,271.60 (approx) more in interest, assuming the interest rates don't change over the term of the mortgage. 



Good time management and smart study will pay dividends at the State Exams

The 2019 State Exams begin on Wed., 5th June so make the most of the remaining six weeks. Manage your revision efficiently and sharpen your exam techniques. Concentrate on a final revision of your course material and practice answering past exam papers. Be organised in your revision plan. Set down priorities in the subject areas, which you intend to revise. Be patient and methodical in your routine. Don't be over ambitious in your revision planning. Take a self-contained manageable unit of work in a revision session. Cramming – extended revision sessions with too much content – is the least effective way to prepare for exams.

When answering past exam papers simulate exam conditions as far as possible. Using A4 paper, try to answer within the time allowed for each question. Accurately number each question and part of question. Ensure that your handwriting is legible, that your diagrams are detailed and that your presentation is neat.

Attend school every day up to the end of term as your best work is done under the expertise of your teachers, who will guide you through revision and exam techniques. Be familiar with the format of each exam paper. Be aware of the style of questions and the topics examined in each paper. Know how the marks for each paper are allocated and how much time should be spent on each question.

As the final weeks are for revision and for answering past exam papers, avoid studying new unfamiliar material, if possible. If you have missed out on some part of the course, prioritise that topic. Study the topic, revise the topic and consolidate it by answering past exam questions based on it. The alternative is to omit that topic completely. In summary, an intensive revision period is the best prescription for effective exam performance.

Manage your home study well. A regular routine is essential. Study for about four hours on each of the five weekday nights. Two sessions of about two hours each with a half-hour break in between will result in good quality work. Aim to do seven or eight hours of revision spread over Saturday and Sunday. Prepare a daily, weekly and full-term study schedule. Review your progress at the end of each week. Be disciplined and organised in your approach to study. Stick to your routine and to your study schedule. Use short breaks between subjects. Avoid unscheduled breaks and beware of "time thieves" such as excessive TV watching and long telephone calls.

A comfortable home study environment is essential. If possible, study on your own where you will have peace and quietness. You need a table or desk on which to write and a hardbacked chair on which to sit. Good lighting keeps you from getting tired. A desk lamp, if available, is a useful aid to mental application. Your total focus must be on your work, so don't allow yourself to be distracted.

Use a reward system to reinforce your progress and to maintain your momentum. Your greatest motivator is to do well in your exam but also build in a few treats. After an evening of study, your reward might be a favourite television programme or listening to some music. At the

weekend, treat

yourself to a few hours of active leisure. As a result, you will face the challenges ahead with confidence and renewed energy.

- Ingredients (serves 4)

- Nutmeg

For the beetroot and walnut salad • 400g Roast baby beetroot-

- 20g Toasted walnuts chopped
- 15g Toasted sunflower and pumpkin seeds
 3g Chopped flat parsley
 Cider vinegar dressing (optional)

Method for Bally Goat's cheese parfait

Take the goats cheese out of the fridge and bring to room temperature. Soak the gelatine in cold water to rehydrate. 
€350,000 and Counting raised from Nathan's Walk





This motion was debated in council yesterday requesting the minister for finance to alleviate financial pressure from small rural pubs across the country by A) To increase the VAT threshold from €75,000 top €150,000 i.e. meaning any business that reaches €150,000 sales in the year would be exempt from paying VAT on sales.

B) That the accelerated capital allowance for small pubs would be reduced from 8 years to 3 years meaning a larger tax rebate on improvements & renovations than the original. This has been forwarded on to the minister for finance and also to Deputy John Brassil to raise this as a PQ at the house of Oireachtas.

We await the response. I would ask other councils across the country to support my motion.

PRESBYOPIA

What is presbyopia?

Presbyopia is the normal loss of near focusing ability that occurs with age. Most people begin to notice the effects of presbyopia sometime after age 40, when they start having trouble seeing small print clearly. Presbyopia is caused by an age-related process. This differs from astigmatism, myopia and hyperopia, which are related to the shape of the eyeball and are caused by genetic and environmental factors. Presbyopia generally is believed to stem from a gradual thickening and loss of flexibility of the natural lens inside your eye. These age-related changes occur within the proteins in the lens, making the lens harder and less elastic over time. With less elasticity, this means the eye has a harder time focusing up close and we may have to hold material further away to see it clearly.



Presbyopia is a natural part of ageing and there is no cure for it. The solution is generally to wear glasses for reading. Contact lenses are also available for presbyopia if you do not want to wear glasses.

Are there exercises I can do to stop needing reading glasses? Will I make my eyes worse by wearing glasses?

No. As presbyopia is caused by the lens stiffening, and not the muscles weakening. Wearing glasses will not make your eyes worse and there are no exercises that can help this. However, you may notice that when you take your glasses off, things appear to be worse without them than before you had them. This is simply because you are noticing how clear and comfortable vision should be. Before you had the glasses, you were unaware how blurry your vision really was because it changed slowly over the years.

Presbyopia will get worse as you age until you reach your late fifties, when you will have no natural focusing ability left. Unfortunately there is nothing you can do to stop it.

For any vision changes it is important to have a sight test to determine the cause.

The Cycle Against suicide arriving into local secondary school



 $Students\ at\ Killarney\ Community\ College\ will\ welcome\ the\ Cycle\ Against\ Suicide.$

This May the Cycle Against Suicide Cycle will return to Kerry. Local secondary school, the Killarney CommunityCollege will act as a host school for the event. The Cycle Against Suicide initiative began in 2013. The cycle begins on the 27th of April and finishes the 6th of May in Dublin. With over 800 people dying by suicide in Ireland each year, and

research indicating that thousands more contemplate it, we all have a role to play, and together we can collectively address the challenges that suicide presents. The majority (335) of suicide deaths last year were among men. This high male to female ratio has been a consistent feature of deaths by suicide over the years. The highest rates of suicide were observed among 45-

54 year-olds (men) and 55-64 year olds (women). Ireland's overall suicide rate in 2015 was 10th lowest of 33 European countries. Although for young people (aged 15-19), it was seventh highest.

Four hundred hours of wellbeing have been allocated to all junior cycle students entering secondary school. We are delighted with the opportunity to host such an important and worthwhile event that raises awareness about such a sensitive subject and whose central message highlights the fact that it's ok to not be ok. Hopefully students will realise that there is always help available to them with regards to their emotional needs." On Wednesday the 1st of May, the evening the cyclist arrive, volunteers are needed to cater for homestays for cyclists. 

The 54th annual John Drumm Cycle race will take place in the Kerry village of Currow on Sunday April 28th. As always a very exciting programme of racing has been planned by the host club Currow CC who take pride in putting on racing for all categories from the elite riders to the under 12 race. In fact it is the underage riders that kick off the day's racing with their events at 10.30am with the Senior events following then at 12.30pm.

The feature event is seven circuits of the now familiar circuit that takes the riders from Currow Village, to Castleisland passing by Davy Roche's cross and returning to Currow on the main Killarney Road from Castleisland totalling 108.5km. The finish line is 800 metres at the Castleisland side of Currow and

spectators are reminded there is no parking at the finish area so please allow enough time to walk to the line if you wish to do so.

As an event, that was first held in 1966 almost a year after the untimely death of Johnny Drumm who was tragically killed in an agricultural accident, it has produced a list of winners that is as impressive as any in Irish cycling.

This goes back to the first winner Gene Mangan, a RÁS Tailteann winner where he is not unique in winning both events.

There were many more famous names to be added to the cup down through the years such as the Lonergan brothers, Johnny and Joe from Tipperary, Colm Nulty of Meath, John and Denis Mangan of Killorglin and Adrian Byrne a Dublin based Garda.

The 30th race in 1995 was won by German Patrick Rives Maye who was a student at the University of Limerick at the time and a former junior champion of West Germany.

Séamas Kennedy of Meath won the event as did Mick Cahill of Banteer, Bobby Power of Tipperary, John O'Sullivan of Kanturk, Batty Flynn and Jack Lacey of Kerry.

There was a unique result in 1972 when the event resulted in a dead heat between Limerick man Gearóid Costello and Anthony O'Halloran of Kerry.

John Blackwell, Billy Reidy and Paul Griffin won the race more than once to again keep the cup in Kerry but in recent years Corkmen Mick Fitzgerald, Richard Hooton and Paidi O Brien have won the race. Tipperary man Simon Ryan added the Drumm Cup victory to a very successful season in 2015.

Eoin O Connell the 2016 winner will be back sporting the colours of Blarney CC who are always prominent at this event. Limerick man Mark O Callaghan was a very worthy winner in 2017 and has since moved to Italy where he races with the US Fausto Coppi Gazzera teamhaving he won the event in the colours of the Aqua Blue Academy Team.

This has always been a race that cyclists really wanted to win and many competitors going on to be professionals with Sam Bennett winning the race three times and is now competing successfully with the world's elite cyclists.

Eddie Dunbar was second in 2014 and has since gone professional having a massive win at the Tour of Flanders U23 in 2017.

Michael O Loughlin is no stranger to the roads of Currow and maybe one day he could emulate his father Martin in winning the race with Michael also now embarking on a professional career.

The 2018 Kerry Group RÁS Mumhan winner Conor Hennebry of the Dan Morrissey-Mig-Pactimowill take part The Kerry Clubs will also be to the fore on home roads.

Cathal Moynihan always does well in Currow where he had his first victory as an A4 when he was a newcomer to the sport.

Cormac Daly is another flying the flag for Kerry and he is having a very good season already this year having won in Newcastlewest recently. Killarney will be lead by Conor Kissane to name a just one of their squad is capable of victory.

Other Kerry Clubs will also travel with a strong squads in their bid to win the cup with the likes of Manor West, Killorglin, Lee Strand, Sliabh Luachra as well as the host club Currow also competing.

TRAVEL AND SUBSISTENCE PAYMENTS (COUNTRY MONEY)

It is important that employers in the construction sector are fully aware of the conditions that apply to the payment of tax-free expenses.

Employees in the construction industry are often required to travel to work at different sites. Expenses of travel and subsistence may be paid tax free to a site-based employee, up to the 'country money' rates below. This only applies where the employee is working at a site that is 32km (20 miles) or more from the employer's

€181.68 per week for more than four €36.34 per day for four days or less

€168.26 per week for more than four days

€33.65 per day for four days or less

EXCLUSIONS

Expenses may not be paid tax free where the employee is:

- provided with transport to and from the site by the employer
- provided with board and lodgings by the employer
- recruited to work at one site only

Records relating to the payment of country money should be held by the employer for

'EATING ON SITE' ALLOWANCE

An 'eating on site' allowance is paid to site-based employees in some sectors, including construction. If this allowance is paid it may be tax free if:
facilities for making tea or coffee are not provided on the site by the employer

- the employee does not receive another tax-free subsistence payment
- the employee works on the site for at least 1.5 hours before and 1.5 hours after normal lunch break
- the allowance is no more than €5 per day.

Know Your Rights:

OUESTION

My daughter is starting secondary school in September and we live 5 kilometres from her school. Am I eligible for the School Transport Scheme?

ANSWER

school bus service and the Department of Education and Skills decides the annual fares.

The service is only provided where there are at least 10 eligible pupils in a distinct locality that can be economically serviced by a bus route. Even when a pupil meets the age and distance criteria for school transport, there is no legal

Transport Scheme if she is attending her nearest school nearest school with regard to ethos and language.

Parents must arrange to bring their child to the nearest pick-up point on the bus route. Generally, bus routes are organised so that no pupil has more than 3.2 kilometres to travel to a pick-up point.

There is a single annual charge of€350 per pupil. However a family does not pay more than €650 per year. The charge is due to be paid in full by the end of July or else in 2 instalments: by the end of July and the start of December. Pupils who are eligible for school transport and who hold a valid medical card are entitled to free school transport to the nearest school.

Since your child is enrolling in post-primary school for the first time, you should either apply for school transport online or download the form from Bus Éireann's website. Applications are now being accepted for the 2019-2020 school year. You should apply by Friday, 26 April 2019.

DO YOU LOVE GRILLED FOOD?

*Achieving the perfect burger is hard, however, with this trick, you'll manage. When your raw patties are cooking on the grill simply put a pad of butter on top of them. Or, for a healthier option, use an ice cube. This will melt into the burger as it cooks making it your juiciest burger ever.

*Wooden skewers tend to get burned or light on fire when they are cooling on the grill. To avoid this, soak the skewers in a bowl of water for 15 to 20 minutes before cooking to avoid any dangerous flames. When the teen approached the counter, Mr. Singh asked him to reveal all of the merchandise hidden in his clothes – otherwise, he would call the police.

The teen responded by saying that he was only stealing food because he and his younger brother were hungry and had nothing to eat.

Cedric Bishop, who is a regular customer at the store, said that he was stunned as he watched the event unfold. "The cashier had the 911 operator on the phone and the owner told her to hang up, the owner then told the teen to go and collect more pizzas, chicken, sandwiches, fruits, and meals from the aisles so he could take them home – all free of charge" recalled Mr. Bishop who also felt inspired to give the youngster \$10.

"I thought that was an amazing thing the owner did," said Mr. Bishop. "Some young people just need to know that someone cares."

DID YOU KNOW?

The Myotonic Goat takes anxiety attacks to the next level. This type of goat, also known as the Wooden Leg Goat and the Tennessee Fainting goat, has an interesting defence mechanism. Whenever it feels panic, the muscles in its entire body tend to freeze, almost perfectly mimicking death.

Their origin has been hunted after by a number of people but it only traces back to the early 1800's when a farm worker appeared in Marshall County, Tennessee, with three females and a male that fainted. It was thought by the way he dressed that he might have come from Nova Scotia. He was a quiet man and wouldn't talk to anyone so whatever he knew remained a secret. He eventually moved from Marshall County but before he did he sold his goats to Dr. H. H. Mayberry who bred them and tried his best to research their history. He could find no proof of such a breed anywhere else in the world, but was convinced they were a breed because their unique traits are hereditary.

Shepherds often kept the goats in with their flocks as insurance in case a predator would attack. The theory was that as wolves would come down from the hills to attack a flock of sheep, the goats would become startled and they would faint. The sheep would make a clean getaway, as the wolves would focus on the stunned goats rather than follow the fleeing sheep.

1975 - In the run up to a national referendum on June 5th, the British Labour Party voted by almost 2-1 to leave the European Economic Community. In the national referendum in June British voters backed the UK's continued membership of the European Economic Community with just over 67% of voters supporting the campaign to stay in the EEC, or Common Market.

Welcome back dear reader why did Jesus die on the Cross? Because of sin, mankind had been separated from God and a sacrifice was required - a pure, sinless, blood sacrifice, to pay the penalty due for sin. Because of the sin nature handed down from Adam, no human could be found without sin - "all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23), so God Himself came down, born as one of us, through a supernatural conception. So Jesus had no human father with sin-contaminated blood. This is why He could offer His Blood as the perfect, sinless offering for our sins. In the Old Testament when God instituted the Passover (when His people were slaves in Egypt), He instructed Moses to have each family take a perfect, unblemished lamb and slaughter it (see Exodus chapter 12). They then put the blood of that lamb over the doorposts of their houses which marked them as off limits to the Angel of Death. They were told to cook the lamb and eat it, each family group together and to remain inside the house as the Angel of Death passed through the land. This lamb that was sacrificed provided protection and healing for each family and not one of them was harmed by the plaque of death that night, and not only that but they were all healed by eating the meat, and the next day they walked into freedom out of bondage and slavery. This was a prophetic foreshadow of Jesus the Lamb of God and what He would do for you and I and everyone who would accept His sacrifice (see Isaiah chapter 53). When Jesus told His disciples 'you must eat my flesh and drink my blood' He was not instituting an act of cannibalism (which is forbidden in the Bible), rather we symbolically take a piece of broken bread as a reminder that His body was broken so that we could be healed. We take the cup of grape juice as a reminder that He shed His perfect Blood for the cleansing of our sins to bring us back into right relationship with Father God accepted as His children as if we had never sinned. Jesus brought His Blood to the Father and placed it on the mercy seat before the Throne - the one-time sacrifice that forever takes away our sins (Hebrews 10:10) and brings us freedom.
