AND THE SHOW GOES ON....

Never one for resting on their laurels, the INEC have pulled out all the stops to ensure that festival goers in Killarney won't be disappointed this weekend.

Yesterday afternoon, Patrick O'Donoghue, MD of the Gleneagle Hotel announced that a number of the Irish acts, previously lined up to play The Killarney Festival of Food and Music, have confirmed they will now perform at the INEC this weekend with all proceeds going to charity.

"We have been contacted directly by a number of our regular artists who still wish to perform in Killarney this weekend" says Patrick O'Donoghue, Managing Director of The Gleneagle Hotel and INEC. "They are determined not to disappoint their loyal fans and, as our venues have no acts scheduled for this weekend, we are able to oblige."

Walking on Cars, Mick Flannery, Little Hours and Guests will perform on Saturday night at the INEC (tickets €20 including booking fee), while on Sunday, Damien Dempsey, Mundy and guests, will all perform at the INEC (tickets €20 including booking fee). The INEC Acoustic Club will host Aprés Match, Colm O'Regan and guests on Saturday night and Jason Byrne and Guests on Sunday night (tickets €15 per night). Stay tuned to INEC Facebook for further announcements throughout the day.

Proceeds from the weekend will be donated to the Oncology Unit in Tralee General Hospital & Cuan Counselling.

"The artists we have spoken to want to play Killarney and they are happy to donate the proceeds to charity, we feel that it is in the best interest of everyone to help make this happen," said Patrick O'Donoghue.

Walking on Cars have issued a statement saying "We're very disappointed to hear that Killarney Festival isn't going ahead. We've never cancelled a show before and we don't intend on starting now. We're putting on a show in the INEC on Saturday night. All of the proceeds will go to Cuan Counselling and the Tralee Oncology unit."

Tickets for all acts will be on sale through ticketmaster.ie and outlets nationwide shortly, alternatively you can call the INEC Box Office on 064 6671555.

The Kerry branch of the Irish Hotels Federation (IHF) also expressed its disappointment at the cancellation of the Killarney Festival of Music & Food. Tom Randles, Kerry branch representative, stated that local hoteliers will do their utmost to facilitate those affected and will waive any cancellation fees on rooms booked.

"Our immediate priority is to limit any inconvenience to visitors and guests. Local hotels will be as flexible as possible in this regard. While the cancellation is obviously very disappointing for those affected, we're encouraging those with travel plans to come to Killarney this weekend and experience the tremendous range of things to do and see in and around the town and further afield," says Mr Randles.



Competing with over 300 teams at the European Cheerleading competition, Killarney Scorchers have put Kerry on the European Cheerleading map this weekend when they won two gold trophies at the fifth and rapidly growing 'Jamfest Europe' Cheer Competition.

The club joined more than 300 teams at the Echo Arena in Liverpool to compete in the twoday event, the largest hosted in Europe. For the Scorchers it was a wonderful repetition of last year's success when they also brought home gold for Ireland.

Faced with strong competition from the UK and other European teams, the skill, determination and passion of the Kerry squad peaked in a stunning display of dance, tumbling and stunting. Adults who accompanied the team to the event at the 11,000 capacity arena were caught up in the jubilant scenes which followed the announcements of Killarney's success, the club marking firmly Kerry's place in European cheerleading history.

With a litany of gold medal wins firmly under their belt since their inception six years ago, the Scorchers will be making their way next year to the home of cheerleading when a number of team members will represent Ireland at the World Cheerleading Championships in Florida, USA. Danny Farkas and Hayley Murphy, coaches and co-founders of the club, are delighted with the opportunity to represent Ireland in America. Hayley, who first cheered for the Lakers basketball team at Killarney's Gleneagle Hotel in her early teens after watching the movie Bring it On!, welcomes the challenge: "Of course it is daunting to perform on American soil" she said, "because cheerleading is to America what hurling and Gaelic football are to us. But we will do what we always do" she added, "prepare, train hard, work together and have fun".

NEW MAYOR OF THE KILLARNEY MUNICIPAL AREA IS OLD HAND

O'CONNELL TO BE A MAN FOR ALL PEOPLE

Killarney's new Cathaoirleach is a Castleisland man. A fact clearly not lost on the incoming Cathaoirleach. Fine Gael's Bobby O'Connell who readily admitted, "That some people may see that as an issue and there may be some scepticism" but has vowed to work to represent the whole area of the new Municipal Council. "Areas like Gneevegullia, Rathmore, Currow and Castleisland are also part of the new municipal area and they deserve to be recognised on an equally footing as well".

O'Connell who has had previous experience as Chairperson of Kerry County Council was proposed by party colleague John Sheahan and seconded by outgoing Cathaoirleach John Joe Culloty who received a unified praise from all parties. "You were fair, upright and carried out your duties in an upright way," Cllr Brendan Cronin said.

The new Leas Cathaoirleach is SKIA's Michael Gleeson who said he "knew the importance of an extended panel from his playing days

and would be ready as needed to serve the people of Killarney". However, he along with Cllr Donal O'Grady said they would not be using the new term of Cathaoirleach and would always use the term of Mayor. "I was disappointed to receive a letter saying that the term Mayor is no longer allowed to be use. I can tell you now that it's the only term I will ever use," said O'Grady Speaking to the Outlook O'Connell said, "I will endeavour to promote the whole district in the best way possible. My Deputy Mayor will be the capable Cllr Michael Gleeson. As a former Mayor of Kerry myself and currently being the longest serving member of Kerry County Council, it is an honour to be granted the role and I will utilise the best of my experience to work for the people of the whole area. I am looking forward to working with and representing the people of Killarney and all the surrounding areas in order to boost tourism and industry in our world famous County"

While looking forward to his new role he is already looking forward to the 4th of July Weekend in Killarney. "The coming month will be a very busy time for the whole area. Team-mate Ewan, the son of Mike and Hilda Weldon, is a very accomplished basketballer and is a nephew of James Weldon who is considered one of the premier coaches in the game.

He stated that tourism is the very vital life-blood of Kerry's economy and that we must always do everything possible to ensure that it is looking its best all year



Even though daylight hours are increasing as we move towards summer, afternoons and the evenings are still a lonely time for older people. Senior Help Line, Ireland's only national help line for older people, has been reviewing its recent calls Typical quotes from callers include:

- \cdot 1'm very depressed as 1'm less mobile each year. This year shows me that I can get out and about even less' - 78 year old female caller
- · 'If I have seen nobody all day, the afternoon only emphasises how lonely I am' 80 year old male caller
- · 'I enjoy afternoon television, but they change the schedule in summer, and I miss my favourites' 71 vear old female caller
- · 'I am terminally ill, and I feel so alone. I know I will never see another spring 67 year old male caller
- · There seems to be a lot more people hanging around in summer, or knocking on your door wanting to sell you things. It makes me feel very vulnerable' - 77 year old male caller

Senior Help Line is a national confidential listening service for older people, provided by trained older volunteers. It is Ireland's only peer telephone service for older people, and one of the few worldwide. Senior Help Line is a programme of Third Age, a voluntary organisation with 1,400 trained older volunteers countrywide contributing to their communities variously as tutors, advocates, listeners and

befrienders. Third Age promotes the value of older people as volunteers, while offering services to more vulnerable older people, all geared to connectivity and social inclusion.

Senior Help Line is open every day of the year from 10 am till 10 pm, and many people phone regularly for valuable social contact. Aine Brady is Third Age CEO: "All our trained volunteers are older people themselves which means that they understand very well the feelings and problems of our older callers. Indeed this peer aspect is one of the aspects that callers comment on very frequently. They tell us they feel understood, that we feel they are listening to them.

"It may be surprising that summertime can be a lonely time for older people. But remember this is a time when families and neighbours go away and an older person can be left with little variation in their day, and little to look forward to. We would encourage anyone who feels lonely, whatever the weather, to give us a ring. Our volunteers are always happy to hear from you. You don't have to have a big problem to call us, but hopefully if there is something worrying you, we can help you look at that also," she says.



IS YOUR CHILD **SAFE IN YOUR CAR?**

4 IN 5 SEATS FITTED INCORRECTLY

Parents in Kerry are being urged to have their child's car seat checked as research from the Road Safety Authority (RSA) indicates that as many as 4 out of 5 child car seats are incorrectly fitted. The RSA 'Check it Fits' service will be visiting locations across Kerry between the 7th and 10th of July where child car seat installation experts will be available to ensure car seats and restraints are correctly fitted. The service takes between 10-15 minutes, is free of charge and offers parents and guardians reassurance that their child is safe while travelling in the car.

Since 'Check it Fits' began in October 2013, the RSA service has checked over 8,000 child car seats and restraints across Ireland. Of these, 82% required some adjustment. Worryingly, 75% of seats required a major adjustment, of which 4% were deemed not fit for purpose and condemned, meaning they have the

potential to cause injury or even death in the event of a collision. If your child's car seat or restraint is incorrectly fitted, the 'Check it Fits' experts will advise on how to fix the problem, demonstrate how to fit the restraint correctly and answer any queries participants might have to avoid potential serious or fatal injury in the event of a collision.

Ais ling Leonard, Senior Road Safety PromotionOfficer for the RSA commented "Almost 2 out of 5 children killed are passengers and Garda reports into collisions indicate that 1 in 10 children were not wearing a seatbelt or using a child restraint in 2014. More recent statistics have shown an increase in child passenger fatalities on the road. The reality is that if a child's car seat isn't fitted correctly, it could lead to a serious or fatal injury in the event of a collision. Having a correctly fitted car seat is a simple measure parents, grandparents and guardians can take to ensure children are safe while travelling by car."

Moyagh Murdock, CEO of the RSA, while speaking about the service said "The RSA 'Check it Fits' service is there to provide professional, trustworthy advice to parents and guardians around child car seat safety. Parents all over the country are availing of this service to get practical advice and expert fitting of their car seats. We would advise all parents to ensure that when they buy a new car seat, that they get the seat fitted by an expert. We would also advise that parents to check the label on their car seat to make sure it's appropriate for your child's age, weight and height, to make sure your seat is firmly installed in the car, and to always ensure that your child's harness is fitted snugly for every trip. Coming into the summer months you may need to tighten the harness as your children are wearing lighter clothes."

NEW GARDA POWER TO ARREST DISQUALIFIED DRIVERS TO COME INTO FORCE

Approximately 10% of drivers disqualified in recent years prosecuted for driving while disqualified

The Minister for Transport, Tourism and Sport, Paschal Donohoe TD, has signed an Order commencing new powers for An Garda Síochána, allowing them to arrest people who drive while disqualified. The Order, which commences section 6(b) and (c) of the Road Traffic Act 2014, comes into effect next Monday, 22nd June 2015.

Speaking this week, Minister Donohoe said: 'Drivers not surrendering their licences to the licensing authority (the RSA) and continuing to drive while disqualified has been identified as an issue that needs to be tackled. People who continue to drive after they have been disqualified commit a serious and unacceptable offence. They are blatantly disregarding the sanction imposed by the court for another offence or offences which has put them off the road and should be dealt with severely'.

'Driving while disqualified, like all forms of unlicensed driving, is already an offence. It is a particularly serious form of unlicensed driving, because people in such cases have been explicitly barred from driving, generally for road traffic offences, which means that they have posed a danger on the

disqualified to date in 2015. The number of prosecutions for driving while disqualified was 1,286 in 2013, 1,392 in 2014, and 592 to date in 2015.

'Before the new measures were commenced, Gardaí who identified people driving while disqualified were required to initiate proceedings resulting in a summons to court, and the case could take months to reach the courts. Under the new measures, Gardaí will be able to arrest drivers driving while disqualified, and bring them to court as early as the next day, or even on the day of the arrest, if a court is sitting.

"The new power of arrest, which comes into effect from Monday, represents the seriousness of the offence and provides An Garda Síochána with the necessary power to deal swiftly with this offence. I expect that this will have a very significant deterrent effect for persons who drive while disqualified and ultimately enhance safety on our roads."

The Kerry County Board confirmed at a meeting last Monday evening that Jack O'Connor will succeed Darragh Ó Sé as manager of the Kingdom's U21 side on a two-year term.

Currently O'Connor is also in charge of the Kerry minor side as they get set for a Munster final meeting with Tipperary on 5 July. Last year he guided Kerry to Munster and All-Ireland minor

O'Connor was in charge of the Kerry U21s back in 1998 and 1999, while since then he has been in charge of the county senior side for two stints -2004-2006 and 2009-2012.

In his first spell in charge he won All-Ireland senior titles in 2004 and 2006, while in his second tenure he also lifted Sam Maguire in 2009.

In between, O'Connor coached Kerins O'Rahilly's to reach the 2008 Kerry and Munster senior club football finals but defeat was their lot on both occasions.

Kerry have enjoyed a wretched record at U21 level in recent years, with only one Munster crown (2008) to their credit since 2002.

According to a Kerry GAA statement, O'Connor's appointment "is to oversee the putting in place of a programme of Strength and Conditioning for the Kerry U20 Development Squad in conjunction with the county's Coaching and Games Committee.

"Jack will name his U21 management team once his tenure with the minor team comes to an

Well the Kerry /Cork showdown in the Munster senior football final is just over a week away and already you can feel the excitement and anticipation building for what is surely going to be another sell out attendance at Killarney's Fitzgerald Stadium. One has only got to look at the huge Kerry support that travelled to Thurles last week for the semi-final to know that the demand for stand tickets in particular is going to be huge and as usual for Killarney, the demand is going to far outstrip the supply given that there are three counties involved with Tipperary of course taking on Kerry in the Minor final. OVER 32,000 SUCKLER FARMERS TO RECEIVE BEEF DATA PAYMENTS

Some 32,000 suckler farmers are to start receiving payment under the Beef Data Programme in the coming weeks.

It was announced by the Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, Simon Coveney.

"I am pleased that these payments will begin issuing to suckler farmers participating in this programme next week", the Minister said.

This year the payments will proceed in two tranches. The first is an 80% advance payment and the balancing payment will issue when information on autumn born calves has been finalised. The level of funding is similar to 2013. The Minister said the programme assists

farmers in improving the genetic quality of their livestock, while maintaining a flow of crucial data to Irish Cattle Breeding Federation (ICBF) that will generate advances in cattle breeding at national level

"I am delighted to say that there has been a 21% increase in the participation level in the Programme this year with 5,700 new suckler farmers being paid this year. There figures are a vote of confidence in the Irish beef industry and its future."

The Minister went on to say that the suckler herd is the seed bed for a quality beef industry involving more than 100,000 farm families, employing almost 8,000 people in processing, sales and marketing, and driving exports valued at approximately €2 billion per annum.

"The Beef Data Programme in conjunction with the Beef Genomics Scheme increases the breeding data available and harnesses

technology in a way that improves efficiency and ultimately profitability at farm level.

"I am convinced that the combination of these and other measures will make a major contribution to the expansion of beef output and greater market penetration."

GLAS ON COMMONAGES MUST BE IMPLEMENTED FLEXIBLY

IFA Hill Committee Chairman Pat Dunne has called on the Minister for Agriculture Simon Coveney to implement GLAS in commonage areas now that the first phase of the scheme is closed and with commonage plans due to commence shortly.

Speaking in advance of a meeting with the Department of Agriculture, Pat Dunne said with more than 4,000 farmers having applied for the GLAS scheme on 2,700 commonages it is clear that there are still many farmers who will want to join the scheme but are concerned about the criteria being imposed by the Department of Agriculture.

Pat Dunne also pointed out that there are some commonages where planners may not be in a position to carry out commonage plans and it is up to the Department of Agriculture to appoint and pay for planners to carry out plans in such

In relation to the min/max level of stocking, the period of time for this to be achieved must be extended in commonages where there is a low level of interest in the GLAS scheme. No individual farmer should have to reach a level of stocking that is unsustainable and impractical.

Guidelines

The IFA hill leader also asked for the publication of the guidelines to planners to carry out commonage management plans for 4,000 farmers who joined the first phase of GLAS. These guidelines must allow CMP's to be carried out in a flexible and simple format.

Pat Dunne said that many planners are ready to carry out these plans and must now be provided with these guidelines without further delay. He also said that the time period to carry out the plans, which has been set for the end of August. needs to be extended. However the 4,000 farmers who have applied for the GLAS must get a significant part payment for 2015 later in the year.

The IFA hill farmer leader said it is expected that many commonage farmers who did not join the first phase of GLAS are ready to join when the scheme reopens in the autumn when the CMP's are completed Many commonage farmers are still in AEOS, and as they are priority Tier 1 farmers are guaranteed entry to the scheme. In addition, the splitting parcel issue ensured that some farmers were better to wait until the autumn as they could maximise their payments.

COMMITMENT TO LOOK AT LEGAL STATUS OF PRE-NUPTIAL AGREEMENTS WELCOME -**DOWNEY**

Speaking after a meeting with the Minister for Justice Frances Fitzgerald, IFA President Eddie Downey said he welcomed the Minister's commitment to look more closely at the proposal to provide greater certainty to the legal status of pre-nuptial agreements.

Mr Downey said, "The uncertainty surrounding the legal recognition of pre-nuptial agreements, in the event of marriage breakdown, is a real issue which is impacting negatively on the timely lifetime transfer of the family farm".

He said, "IFA is supportive of measures that can remove barriers to family farm transfer, and I emphasised to the Minister that allaying the fears of parents would be an important supporting mechanism to facilitate the orderly transfer of the family farm. This is in line with other key policy measures required to address issues such as income security. This includes include IFA's priority taxation proposal for this year's

budget, which would provide an incentive, through the taxation system for parents and children to farm in partnership together, prior to the lifetime transfer of the family

He continued, "IFA is clear that prenuptial agreements are a matter for individual families, but believes that the main recommendations of the Study Group on Pre-nuptial agreements (2007) should be implemented by the Government as part of its reform programme for family law. This would require the courts to have regard to existing prenuptial agreements when making judgments in judicial separation and divorce proceedings".

Eddie Downey also raised the issue of rural security and the need for an increased mobile Garda presence in rural Ireland. He said IFA is working closely with Garda Siochana in developing services to assist in the fight against rural theft and crime.

OUESTION

I've heard that young children can now visit the doctor for free but that they have to get a GP visit card. How do I get a card for my child?

ANSWER

From 1 July 2015, children under the age of six are entitled to free visits to a GP (family doctor) that is taking part in the free GP care for children under six scheme. All children aged under six who live in Ireland or who intend to live in Ireland for at least one year are eligible.

To get a GP visit card for children aged under six, you must register your child. To register, you will need:

- Your Personal Public Service Number (PPSN)
- The PPSN of each child
- Your choice of participating GP

You are sent your child's PPSN when you register their birth. If you do not have a PPSN for your child, contact Client Identity Services in the Department of Social Protection on Lo-call 1890 927 999 or email cis@welfare.ie. If your baby is under two months of age and you don't have a PPSN yet, you can register and leave the PPSN blank and the HSE will write to you separately to get it.

You can get a list of GPs who are taking part in the scheme at gpvisitcard.ie. The list also tells you whether your chosen GP accepts online registrations. If they do, you can apply online at gpvisitcard.ie. If a GP doesn't accept online registrations, or if you prefer to use a paper form, you can download the registration form from gpvisitcard.ie, bring it to the GP to sign, and then send it to: GP Visit Card - Under 6s, PO Box 12629, Dublin 11.

Your child will be included in this scheme until the end of the month of their sixth birthday. The expiry date is shown on the card. You will be notified approximately three months before it is due to expire.

The card covers free GP visits, including home visits and out of hours, urgent GP care. It does not cover visits to hospital emergency departments.

WHAT ARE OUR CHILDREN WATCHING ONLINE?

Pornography is a subject which can evoke strong responses both for and against. But let's look at the issue of pornography use amongst teenagers and children - and specifically internet pornography. The difference between internet pornography and other forms of pornography is the speed at which the images are available, the ease at which the images can be accessed and the hardcore nature of the images.

We know that the average age globally that a young person first views pornography on the internet is 11 years and that mirrors our findings here in Kerry. We carried out informal research in 4 secondary schools in Kerry and young people (age 16/17) have told us that most of them will have seen their first image by the end of 1st year in secondary school and some will have viewed their first image by the age of 8, 9 or 10 years of age. Our statistics tells us that

54% of male students and 38% of female students viewed their first image on the internet. The majority just came across it and did not go looking for it. Most young people are viewing their first image on a mobile phone. A worrying statistic is that 9% of male students watch it once a day with 45% of male students watching it a couple of times week. 12% of male students watch it once a week and 13% of female students watch it a couple of times a month

Exposure to pornographic material at a young age can be a traumatic, confusing and disturbing experience. Add to this the actual content our young people are viewing - this is not just 'mild' pornography but rather images and videos of rape, sexual violence, degradation and extremes in sexually deviant behaviour. Pornography creates a powerful biochemical 'rush' in the user that actually mimics the brains' reaction to alcohol and drug use so therefore the viewing of pornography is highly addictive. The negative effects of pornography include modelling and imitation of inappropriate sexual behaviours, unhealthy interference with normal sexual development, residual feelings of shame, guilt, anxiety and confusion and development of misleading and potentially harmful attitudes toward sex.

So what can a parent do? Plenty!! First of all let's talk about the conversation with children (if we warn children, they will be more comfortable in letting you know when they come across an image. So the conversation might go like this:

'...you might come across something on the computer, or someone might shows you a picture on their phone that might upset you... the people might be naked or they are doing stuff that looks very strange! If you see something please let me know and we'll talk about it...'

Next week we'll discuss how to deal with the older teen who might be viewing pornography.

BREAST CANCER

Breast cancer is the second most common cancer in women and most cases occur in women over the age of 50. Around 1 in 9 women develop breast cancer at some stage in their life. Breast cancer can also develop in men but this is rare. If breast cancer is diagnosed early then there is a good chance of a cure. If you notice any lump or change in the breast then you should attend your doctor promptly.

The breast tissue is attached to the chest wall and extends as a 'tail' into the armpit. Many women find that their breasts become tender and lumpy before their periods. They also change in size in shape with age, pregnancy and weight changes. Therefore it is important that you get to know what is normal for your breasts and report any changes immediately.

Breast cancer occurs when an abnormal cell within the breast multiplies out of control. Malignant tumours refers to a group of these cells which has the potential to spread. Spread may occur to nearby organs but can also spread through the blood stream and lymph channels to distant parts of the body unrelated to the breast. If the tumour spreads to distant parts of the body then these are referred to as metastases (secondary tumours).

Breast cancer has many different subtypes. The type of breast cancer determines the treatment options as well as the prognosis. You may hear of the following terms:

INVASIVE OR IN SITU:

Invasive refers to cancer which has spread from within a particular compartment of the breast whereas in situ cancers are normally contained within a particular duct or area. Invasive cancers are divided into ones which have moved into local blood or lymph vessels. The most common in situ cancer is "Ductal carcinoma in situ" (DCIS) which refers to cancer which has remained within a particular duct. About 1 in 5 new breast cancers are DCIS.

GRADE:

This refers to how aggressive the cancer appears. The higher the grade the more aggressive the cancer.

Certain cancers contain receptors which allow proteins and hormones to attach to them. Finding this information out is important in deciding in a particular treatment plan.

This is a measure of how much the cancer has spread. In general the earlier the stage the better the outcome.

It is important to realise that identifying the exact type of cancer can take a number of weeks. This allows the specialists to discuss the case at meetings in order to determine the best treatment plan. Although the wait is frustrating, specialised treatment plans improve the overall outcomes.





YET MORE TAXES

- The French had a salt tax called the gabelle, which angered many and was one of the contributing factors to the French Revolution.

A BIT OF GOOD PUBLICITY FOR THE HUMBLE RAT

Most people hate the humble rat but, according to researchers in Japan, this much maligned creature has a Good Samaritan side. Nobuya Sato and his team at Kwansei Gakuin University divided a box into two compartments separated by a transparent partition. Water was poured into one of the compartments while the other remained dry. A rat, placed in the water, could be seen by

another from the dry side of the partition. The wet individual had to tread water to stay afloat but it wasn't in danger of drowning; there was a ledge to which it could cling. It could only leave the water, however, if the observing rat opened a door in the partition. Rats placed on the dry side soon learned how to do this and released their wet companions.

This is not the first experiment to reveal what seems to be altruism in rats. Four years ago, scientists at the University of Chicago, placed a rat in a small cage. Rats outside the cage soon figured out how to open the door of the cage and liberate the prisoner. In a refinement of the experiment, access to chocolate was also provided. Rats usually opted to free the trapped individual before gorging themselves on the chocolate. As in the Chicago experiment, the Japanese rats were placed in a box with two doors. Opening one door released a victim swimming in the water; the other door gave access to a piece of chocolate. Most of the rats released their wet colleague before going for the chocolate.

AFRICAN POACHERS TRADE WEAPONS FOR FARM TOOLS

At one time, Edson Zimba only took from his native land of Zambia. Now he gives back.

For twenty years he combed the bush of Zambia's Luangwa National Park, a remote reserve known to tourists as a place to experience wildlife undisturbed. He hunted buffalo, elephant and hedgehog.

Zimba was a poacher.

But he grew weary of hunting the increasingly barren brush. So when he was asked by a nonprofit environmental group to turn over his gun in favour of farming, he quickly accepted their offer.

Community Markets for Conservation (COMACO) is in the business of providing alternative life choices for would-be poachers, teaching them beekeeping, vegetable gardening and carpentry.

The group has taught Zimba sustainable farming techniques so that he now yields enough to feed his family and what's left, he sells to COMACO for its food processing facility.

In recent years, eighty percent of farmers in Zambia couldn't grow enough food to make ends meet. The fallback, according to COMACO's founder was poaching.

One reformed poacher says, before, he was a destroyer. Now, the farmer calls himself a human being.

A HELPFUL HINT FROM 100 YEARS AGO

• Keeping a plant watered while you are away on holiday - Fill a large pail with water, and stand it a little above the level of the plants and group round or near as many plants as practical. Loosely plait two or three strands of wool together, immerse completely in water, and place one end in the pail, weighted, and touching the bottom. Rest the other end on the soil: a separate plait of wool is advisable for each pot.

A FATHER'S LOVE:

40 year old Yu Xukang, a single Dad from the Sichuan Province in China, walks 9 miles every day with his son, Xiao Qiang, strapped to his back so that the boy can get an education. To support himself and his young son, Yu works as a farmer, and since last September, Yu has woken up every day at 5 a.m., prepared a lunch for his son and then secured Xiao Qiang -- who is about 3 feet tall -- in a basket that he attaches to his own back.


The pair makes the 4.5-mile trek to school across the rugged terrain, then Yu walks back home so that he can work. The devoted Dad then returns to pick his boy up from school and carries him all the way home - an 18-mile round trip,

"I know that my son is physically disabled but there is nothing wrong with his mind, however, I couldn't find any school here with the facilities to accept him and was constantly rejected" Yu said.

Once Xiao Qiang was accepted to the Fengxi Primary School, Yu vowed to do everything in his power to make sure his son would get there every day. His dream is for Xiao Qiang to one day go to college and as Xiao is already top of his class that is a definite possibility.


