





t's the final countdown as the last outing for the Tidy Towns volunteers takes place this Monday, 26th August.


This will be the 45th outing from these amazing volunteers who strive weekly to keep Killarney looking its best ahead of the final judging of the annual Tidy Towns Competition.




























## KILLARNEY CYCLING CLUB CLAIM ALL IRELAND TITLE







## Kerry's CAO applicants sweep the board in Round One of College Offers

#### **HIGH ACHIEVERS**

Kerry's young people are high achievers and swept up a copious supply of offers in last Thursday's CAO Round One of offers. Any remaining self-doubt turned to unconfined joy as a large majority of CAO applicants received a college offer. Kerry's 1,858 Leaving Cert candidates (926 females and 932 males) achieved outstanding results that paved the path to college. On a pro rata population basis, Kerry's CAO applicants are top of the class in securing college places. More than 70% of Kerry's 2019 Leaving Cert cohort will progress to higher education.

#### **TRENDS**

The overriding conclusion from the points' trends is that CAO applicants were totally focussed on the jobs market. They applied in large numbers for courses with strong employment growth, especially STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) courses, which are regarded as job friendly. UCC's flagship Biological and Chemical Sciences degree hit the heady heights of 498 points which UL's Engineering degree increased to 434 points.

#### **DEMAND**

There was strong demand for Business, Psychology and Environmental Science with IT Tralee's Honours Business degree increasing to 307 points and UCD's Economics and Finance degree crashing the 600 points' barrier. Courses in the build environment, construction and architecture are in demand again this year. Points' requirements for teaching held steady while some nursing and law degrees saw a slight decrease in points.

#### **ARTS**

HASS (Humanities, Arts, Social Science) courses continue to be offered at modest point's levels as applicants have lost total confidence in the employment value of the liberal and creative arts. The Arts Degrees at UCC, MICE Limerick and NUIG were each offered at a comfortable 300 points.

#### **HEALTH**

Most Health Science courses continue to be available only to those who can reach 500 plus points. Dentistry at UCC, for example, requires a staggering 590 points this year – almost a perfect Leaving Cert exam result! There was a significant decline in agriculture, dairy, nutrition and food-based courses. The uncertainty around Brexit could be a factor here

#### **RUSH TO COLLEGE**

School leavers continue to rush to college in unprecedented numbers. Despite the economic recovery, applications for college remain high. The steady flow also of mature and non-traditional applications is a very healthy development as everybody deserves a second chance. A quota of places was reserved by CAO for the 8,943 mature applicants and the 12,403 applicants from the QQI/PLC sector.

#### **OFFERS**

51,513 CAO applicants received at least one of the 74,657 offers, which were issued on Thursday afternoon. The offers consisted of 43,851 at Level 8 (Honours Bachelor Degrees) where demand is strong and 30,806 at Level7/6 (Ordinary Bachelor Degrees/Higher Certificates) where interest continues to decline. CAO always issues more offers than there are places available in anticipation of a level of refusal by applicants. Offers are issued independently in respect of the two lists (Level 8 and Level 7/6), so that 23,144 applicants received an offer from each list on Thursday.

#### **PREFERENCES**

53% of the 43,851 applicants, who were offered a Level 8 course, received their first preference, while 81% received one of their top three preferences. A phenomenal 89% of the 30,806, who were offered a Level 7/6 course, received one their first preference, while 98% received one of their top three preferences. About 60,500 can expect to receive at least one offer of a college place before the end of the offers' season. Last year, out of a total of 77,425 applicants to CAO, 46,603 accepted a college place. Significantly, 30,822 applicants to CAO last year either refused the course

offered or failed to get any course offer at all. That worrying statistic isn't going to change anytime soon.

#### **ACCOMMODATION**

The focus now turns to finding accommodation and the money to pay for it. It seems that many students may have to make a daily return commute from Kerry to Limerick or Cork if they can't afford to meet the spiralling unregulated cost of student accommodation.





## AN EYE EXAMINATION SHOULD MAKE THE BACK TO SCHOOL CHECKLIST



A comprehensive eye examination is as essential for back-to-school success as supplies for learning.

Studies have consistently linked school performance to poor vision and visual disorders. More than one in 10 children in every classroom is estimated to have an undiagnosed common vision problem that affects their learning and development.

Some eye conditions do not display any signs or symptoms, so the only way to know for sure is to take your child for a sight test.

Signs which may show there is a problem with a child's sight include:

- an eye appearing to drift inwards or outwards;
- difficulty concentrating;
- headaches;
- sitting too close to the television; or
- rubbing their eyes a lot.

Some parents avoid taking their children for a sight test, because they do not want them to wear glasses

#### ONE CAT'S OBSESSION WITH HUNTING BIRDS LED TO INVENTION THAT HAS SAVED HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS:

Cats kill a staggering number of birds every year—estimated to be in the billions—but one feline's affinity for hunting them has inadvertently led to the salvation of hundreds of thousands of other feathered prey.

Back in 2008, Nancy Brennan was sick and tired of her cat George bringing dead birds into her home, it was also heartbreaking for the enthusiastic birdwatcher. She recalled reading an article about how birds notice bright colours, so she grabbed some rainbow fabric and sewed up a bright collar that fitted over a quick release collar that he could wear around his neck as an early warning system for the birds and after one month knew her little invention actually worked.

She also knew that she wasn't the only pet owner who was tired of finding dead birds on their doorstep, so Brennan launched a website called "Birds Be Safe" and crafted 500 colourful collars to sell online from her website birdsbesafe to her fellow cat lovers and for the next six years, sold the quick-release collars from her home to hundreds of customers describing similar success with the product.

Then in 2015, an ornithologist and St. Lawrence University professor named S.K. Willson conducted a a 12-week studies, divided between Spring and Fall which showed that the cats donning the colourful Birds Be Safe collars were, in fact, killing 19 times fewer birds than those who did not.

While George passed away some years ago, his antics have saved hundreds of thousands of birds so far.

Readers please be aware that I do not under any circumstances recommend normal collars for cats but the Birdsbesafe cat collar cover is on a tube with breakaway buckles as has the cat collar inside it, so both release for your cat's safety, the collar also has stretch elastic to help with cat comfort and easy use, your cat can eat, drink, or even catch a cat nap and wear it when going outdoors or all the time,

on the Birdsbesafe® website the collar has to be bought separately to the cover - both together cost around \$18 ( $\in$ 7 + P. & P) and if anybody knows if they can be purchased in Ireland I will be very grateful if they will let me know.

## MISSING CHILD RESCUED THANKS TO HIS LOVE OF HORSES:

2 year old Courtlund Barrington-Moss went missing during a family reunion in Aneroid, Alberta recently. When his mother noticed that he had disappeared, over 400 people were recruited for the search and rescue mission, from volunteers and family members to emergency crews and a search plane.

After 12 Hours, the Search and Rescue Crew finally found the trapped toddler in a neck deep hole by following his giggles through the woods – the youngster wasn't giggling over his predicament, however—he was giggling with delight at the sight of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police riding horses to his rescue as he was just able to see the rescuers and laughing at the sight of the horses he wanted to pet. After spending a little over a decade in the Canadian credit card market, US-based Chase Bank opted to retire their Amazon.ca Rewards Visa and their Marriott Rewards Premier Visa in March 2018.

Canadian cardholders who were making payments on their outstanding card debt—but Chase, rather than selling the debt to third party-collectors, sent letters to all of their Canadian customers explaining that their debt had been forgiven.

Though Chase declined to say how much debt had collectively been wiped out by their decision, their former Amazon credit card boasted a 19.9% interest rate—and some Canadian cardholders said that they had been forgiven for as much as \$6,000 in debt.

"Ultimately, we felt it was a better decision for all parties, particularly our customers," Chase spokesperson Maria Martinez said.

## THIS PLANTER DISPLAYS YOUR HOUSEPLANT'S NEEDS AND FEELINGS ON A SCREEN:

The Lua planter is embedded with various sensors that can measure soil moisture, temperature, and sun exposure. If the plant is too hot, the cute little face on the screen will start to sweat. If it's thirsty, it will start to pant. If it isn't being exposed to enough sunlight, it will turn into a vampire.

In addition to having 15 universal "moods", the planter also has motion sensors so that it can be entertained by activities.

Furthermore, the planter is connected to an app that allows the user to identify exactly what kind of plant it's carrying. This way, it can adjust its sensors to the plant's specific needs.

The anthropomorphic Lua planter was designed by Belgian designer Vivien Mueller of Mu Design. Since he launched an Indiegogo campaign to raise funds for the planter, it has successfully raised more than three times its original financing goal. The planters are expected to be shipped out to backers in December of this year.



The transition from Primary to Secondary school can be a difficult one for many children. The change from being the most senior student to suddenly becoming a junior again may bring many challenges for your child. They are leaving behind a familiar world and entering a whole new domain with new teachers, subjects, classrooms, class mates, an increased workload and a longer day. 
