

# A woman of substance....

# **Tributes to a "lioness"** as Miriam Burns is laid to Rest

Although the sun was shining, the grief in the air was palpable as thousands of mourners queued for hours on Sunday at St. Mary's Cathedral to pay their last respects to mother of four, Miriam Burns, who was found dead at her home in Ardshanavooly last Monday.

A prayer service which was due to start at 4pm had to be delayed by an hour such was the outpouring of grief as people queued to pay their respects to "Killarney's Smiling Lady".

Speaking at the service, Miriam's daughter Sharon said her mother was a "lioness" who was known locally as the "beautiful smiling lady on the bike".

The glamorous and elegant mother and grandmother was described by Sharon as a strong, powerful, a force of nature, who was great craic.

"Most importantly she was brim-full of compassion and love – a woman of substance, she gave her children everything in life to be happy and strong.

"The way Mam loved is an example to us all and she should be remembered for her bravery and her strength.

Sharon went on to thank their family and friends, the people of Killarney, Miriam's neighbours and friends in Ardshanavooly and everyone in Ireland for the way they honoured Miriam.

"In the lottery of parents, we her children, we lucked out as we were very lucky to have her as a mother.

"We are humbled and proud to have had a lioness for a mother. May she rest in peace and hopefully wherever she is, she is with her sister Brenda and our grandmother and grandfather and wherever they are they are having a bit of craic."

The chief celebrant at the service, Fr Kieran O'Brien, described Miriam as the salt of the earth.

"You are the light of the world, you are the salt of the earth are words we use in life to compliment each other. For those of us who knew Miriam, we can say it sums her up quite well.

"For those who didn't know her, it's like they say a picture speaks a thousand words. Over the last few days Miriam's pictures have shown someone who is very pleasant, always smiling, someone looking her best happy out in life.

"That is how she is remembered in this town and by her family.

"A loving mother to her four children and as any mother always had their interests at heart. It was an unconditional love, also including her grandchildren in Australia."

He said that Miriam's light "shone brightly" in Killarney.

Miriam brought joy to everyone she encountered bringing brightness to the many people she knew just by her presence.

"To this community she was a carer. She visited the housebound and they were pleased to have her, such a caring person."

He said that Miriam brightened up so many people's lives merely by her presence, her actions and her words.

Roses from Miriam's garden were placed on her coffin by her children and following the service, Miriam's remains were brought for private creamation.






### SPECIAL KERRY SCREENING OF 'MICHAEL COLLINS' THE MOVIE TO MARK CENTENARY

The Kerry GAA star forward was conferred with a Masters in PE Teaching at UL this Tuesday, among thousands of students receiving their parchments this week.

The 23-year-old played a starring role in UL GAA's Sigerson Cup Final run, claimed the Higher Education Rising Star Footballer of the Year Award, and was Man of the Match in the All-Ireland Football Final this year.

A Silver Scholarship recipient at UL, David has been in the UL Sports Scholarships Academy for the past two years, allowing him access to the high-performance gym to keep up his demanding sporting regime while taking the course. The Kerry star is among almost 3,300 new graduates being conferred at UL over five days of the 2022 Autumn Conferring Ceremonies this week.

"he oldest man in Ireland, Michael O'Connor, Muckross, passed away on Sunday morning last in his 109th year.

Michael was born in Glencar in south Kerry in 1913. Michael left Ireland as a young man, and followed a career as a radio operator during World War II.

The former Merchant Navy man, travelled the world, survived the sinking of his ship by a German U-boat as well as the blockade of The Bay of Bengal by the Japanese, where only five of the 30 ships trapped there, including his, managed to escape. His most memorable memory is enjoying a champagne dinner on Christmas Day in Trinidad. Michael also survived the Spanish Flu. He returned home after the war where he met and married his wife Joan, and they had five children. Up until recently Michael kept very active — and his favourite exercise was digging, cutting his lawn on his ride-on lawn mower, growing vegetables, taking great pride in his colourful roses. He loved baking scones and regularly drove to town.

Peacefully in his 109th year, Michael J. is predeceased by his wife Joan (McTernan), his siblings Tim, Deo, Diarmuid and Maureen, his sons-in-law Fern and Joe and his utterly adored grandson Meredith. Deeply missed by his daughters Maureen (Lulling), Avril (O'Keeffe) and Teresina (Gallagher), his sons Michael and Meredith, son-in-law Denis, daughters-in-law Ann and Lynda, 9 grandchildren and 9 greatgrandchildren, relatives, neighbours and many

# PLANNING PERMISSION SOUGHT FOR **PERMANENT HOME IN KILLARNEY FOR THE KERRY RAPE AND SEXUAL ABUSE CENTRE**

The Kerry Rape and Sexual Abuse Centre is seeking planning permission to develop a counselling centre at Reen, Ross Road, Killarney. The construction of a bespoke centre has been a long-term ambition of the organisation, now coming to fruition in 2022, the year the Kerry Rape and Sexual Abuse Centre celebrates 30 years in existence.

Centre Director, Vera O'Leary outlines the significance of this development. "The new building has been designed with the clients we service core and central in terms of their individual needs. The proposed facility will offer our professional and dedicated team of counsellors and support team a permanent home where we can continue to provide safe, confidential and free counselling to survivors of all types of sexual violence and support for non-abusing partners, parents, relatives and



friends. This is a milestone moment for the Centre, with a stated ambition of ours to develop such a facility for many years."

Chairperson of the Board of Management of the Centre, Brid Mc Elligott in welcoming this development also acknowledged the kindness of the Clarke family, who have generously donated the site at Ross Road to support the work of the Centre. "On behalf of all stakeholders involved with the Centre I would like to acknowledge the generosity and kindness of the Clarke family, in particular Matt Clarke who has championed this proposed development from the outset. Without this philanthropic gesture realising our own building would not have been possible. In supporting our clients and their families on their journey of recovery, it will massively assist our efforts when we can operate from a client tailored, bespoke facility."

The Kerry Rape and Sexual Abuse Centre now await the decision of the planning authority. If granted, the build would take approximately 14 months, with monies to finance the development to be sourced from state funds and charitable donations. The Kerry Rape and Sexual Abuse Centre will also continue to deliver services from Tralee and other outreach locations as needed.

### **LIEBHERR CRANES** DESTINED FOR USA

Massive Liebherr cranes destined for the United States dominated the Rushbrook skyline in Cobh in recent weeks. Three megamax ship to shore container cranes (STS) are being assembled in the old dockyard, These cranes are amongst the largest in the world. Once complete, they will undertake a 10-day sea voyage on board a specialist vessel, the BigLift Baffin, before arriving at their final destination, Maher Terminals LLC at the Port of New York and New Jersey.

Liebherr secured the order for the cranes in 2021 and since then our expert teams of engineers and designers have been working hard with our customers and partners to bring the project to completion. The cranes were designed and built at Liebherr Container Cranes Ltd. in Killarney. Following manufacture, the main crane components were transported by road to the Port of Fenit and onwards by sea to Cobh where assembly began earlier this year.

This is the third group of Liebherr ship to shore container cranes to have shipped from Cobh. Liebherr have previously shipped three STS cranes to Puerto Rico and a further two to the Port of Hull in the UK, but these are the largest STS to ship from Cobh to date. When they enter service in a number of months, they will work on megamax size container vessels and will move many millions of containers over the course of their

lifetime

Speaking about the order, Liebherr's Managing Director-Sales, Gerry Bunyan said, "We are delighted, with this latest order to be able to continue our longstanding relationship with Maher Terminals. With these latest technically advanced machines working alongside the other Liebherr STS cranes at the Port, we are confident Maher Terminals will be able to offer improved services and faster turnarounds to their customers and continue to grow as North America's largest marine container terminal"



# The Green Party representative in Killarney Diarmaid Griffin raises an important topic with regard to the bring banks on Beech Road car park which were almost full on the Saturday of last weekend.

"This is not a good situation for our town as the bottles left there are unsightly and dangerous if broken.

I would understand if the bring banks had filled up in one day but this was not the case as they were close to full on Saturday. Surely they can be emptied on Fridays in anticipation of a busy weekend?" Diarmaid said.

The reality is the town's two bring banks are often full. But that there are so few bring banks in Killarney is what I fail to understand. None at all on the busy Park Road and eastern side of town. And no central bank for Muckross or the southern side.

Surely Killarney traffic is bad enough besides dragging everyone from all directions to the bottle can and clothes bank off the congested Mission Road?

The council operates a site in the Woodlands Industrial which would make an ideal bring bank for the eastern side of town.

The council is quite open to the idea of more bottle banks, it transpires. However, the suggestion must come from the local area or the Tidy Towns committee.

At present, Kerry County Council has no plans to locate new bring banks in Killarney – generally requests come from local Tidy Towns Groups and a location is generally proposed by the local community, the council spokesman said when I asked.

"KCC would be willing to provide Bring Banks in consultation with any local groups. Bring Banks are generally provided where there is a demand from local residents and/or the local community."

Perhaps this is a project the Greens could take on? Certainly I think communities in the Park Road area would be interested.

### **Wind Farms**

There is much talk about wind and how the minister may intervene to change the county development plan back to zoning for more

wind farms which are all but banned in the plan agreed earlier this summer.

The four transmission stations for high voltage lines put in place in Kerry by EirGrid in recent years make the county an ideal watering hole for the big wind farm companies.

EirGrid the body that plans the electricity network built by the ESB is also undertaking a joint project with the French TSO, Réseau de Transport d'Électricité (RTE), to investigate the development of a HVDC interconnector between Ireland and France that could connect in Cork

Cork/Kerry wind farms generate far more power than this region needs or uses. So we have in place the high capacity voltage lines along our county border and the plethora of wind farms supplying the power.

It will be very hard to prevent the Minister overturning the county plan intervening when the national and European interest is at stake. It was that transmission infrastructure that should have come under scrutiny by our public representatives at local and national level. We have seen the same lack of vigilance with telecommunications masts. But, eh Voilà encore!

What has also slipped under the radar in the reporting on the ministerial displeasure with the new county plan is his clamp down about planning for houses: Kerry's councillors are trying to allow shared access roads onto national routes to allow locals to build in the countryside. However that too is a no-no on ministerial high ground!

Time-consuming county development plans created locally and worked on and voted on locally are in effect being taken out of the hands of the decision makers. I smell a legal challenge.



# Miriam passing unites the tight Killarney Community

There has been a genuine and heartfelt outpouring of grief and sadness at the death of Miriam Burns who was much loved and much appreciated. You just hope she knew how valued she was locally. To many of us she was pure Killarney - open, outgoing, friendly, intelligent, funny, sociable, well spoken, and someone with a sense of pride and self-respect

and who took great care of herself and her home and family and had a great interest in her town as well as the wider world.

There is also a huge and deep shock.

One of the most troubling things about her terrible murder is how it was known how Miriam, in her mid seventies, and living alone was worried about her safety.

People in various positions of authority seemed to have known also, according to a number of national newspapers last weekend.

Yet this very outgoing and very lovely person was dead for some days before her death was discovered. This is very upsetting for everyone. Could steps not have been taken to better protect her? Part of me wonders if women are taken seriously enough when they express their very real worries and anxieties and needs in a system that is often cold and formal and is not exactly encouraging for women.

In fact, I wonder are there systems in the first place that know how to deal with safety concerns, especially for older women and indeed older men living alone.

I do not wish to generalize too much but I do ask if there is a problem deep in our system - locally and nationally - in listening properly to women especially perhaps older women.

It is a vexing question, but that there was a very real threat out there seems beyond question. People are naturally fixated on the who and on bringing to justice the perpetrator.

But perhaps the greatest honour and justice we could bestow on Miriam is to set up an interagency and volunteer unit, of garda, community health workers and ordinary individuals for instance to call and maybe even bike around in a highly visible and very open manner, particularly at weekends.

If nothing else good is to come from this dark and dreadful deed that led to her death, the outpouring of affection and genuine sorrow and Miriam's huge funeral shows how tight and old and warm a community Killarney is at heart.

RIP Miriam.

# History of Killarney Racecourse

Racing was first held in the Killarney area in 1822 and continued to use several different courses until 1901. In the early days, the meetings were supported by Lord Clanmorris and the Earl of Kenmare, the feature race being the Kenmare Stakes from 1826 to 1830.

The venue here on Ross Road held its first race meeting on July 20th and 21st 1936, featuring Ontario our first ever winner in a 1 ½ m handicap hurdle, ridden by Willie O' Grady. May and August Festivals were added over time, whilst in 2019 we added a 2-day October Festival to our calendar.

In conjunction with the town, Killarney Racecourse has developed as a tourist destination. Racegoers travel from far and wide to enjoy the great racing, hospitality, and unbeatable scenery that Killarney Racecourse has to offer. Giving its undisputed title as Ireland's most scenic racecourse.

One of the most memorable days in our history was when the legendary Lester Piggott came to ride at our racecourse on the 15th of July 1991, largely thanks to the foresight and professionalism of former secretary/manager Finbarr Slattery. Finbarr regularly wrote letters to Lester, including during the time that Lester spent in jail, and built up a strong relationship with the biggest name in racing at the time. Lester, along with the equally legendary Barney Curley, flew into Farranfore Airport by private plane and received an escort to the course. The record crowd who attended on the evening were not disappointed, as Lester rode three winners. Notably, Princess Haya of Jordan also rode here in 1994.

Down through the years, many famous names have come to visit Killarney Racecourse such legendary commentators as. O'Sullevan, Peter Mícheál Ó and Muircheartaigh Micheal O'Hehir, racing personality John McCririck, Taoiseach Bertie Ahern and Enda Kenny. The list goes on. Constant improvements

have been made to Killarney

Racecourse in the past few

decades. Development work took place on the course from 1991 to 1996, with a section of the track done each year to avoid disruption to the racing schedule. This work was overseen by the watchful eyes of Jim Fleming and Michael Doyle. Our 9-hole parkland golf course, Ross Golf Club, opened in 1995 and cost £500,000 to develop, a huge undertaking for its time. The golf course provides life and vibrancy to the racecourse.

We welcomed racegoers through our admissions building for the first time in May 2007. The days of the old turnstiles are long gone. However, as the business model evolves, we have adapted to the new demands of business from online ticket sales, tap and go, membership cards and cash sales. New state of the art stables was constructed by Redweld Stables in 2017 at a cost of €500,000. In 2020, we redeveloped our parade ring and presentation area. Racegoers may remember our old sand ring. We have had two Derby winners win their maidens here in recent years, namely Wings of Eagles and Anthony Van Dyck. Group 1 winners Iridessa, Luxembourg and La Petite Coco also won their first race here. These results are of testament to our ground staff, who ensure our racing surface is always in pristine condition, and the investment in the track.

pandemic, During the management and the directors continued to plan for the future, and we are delighted to officially open our new entrance during this August Festival. These projects have been supported by HRI grant funding, which we greatly appreciate.

We are confident that racing at Killarney Racecourse will continue to go from strength to strength and whilst we are 'reeling in the years' in our bi centenary celebrations, we are delighted to be unlocking the key to the next 200 years where we will continue to grow and develop allowing us to pass the keys to the next generation who will no doubt enjoy the vibrancy, history and legacy of Killarney Races for many years to come.



### **BLENDED LEARNING IS NOW ESSENTIAL IN ACCOMMODATION CRISIS** AS LEAVING CERT RESULTS TO BE ISSUED ON 2ND SEPTEMBER



he lack of suitable student accommodation is at crisis point and many students may be forced to refuse or defer their college offers. The alternative is a daily commute to college. Even that option won't be feasible for many students due to the long distance between home and college as well as spiralling travel

Minister Harris, who has made little progress in providing extra student accommodation, is now appealing to householders to provide a bedroom in their homes for students. It all sounds very ad hoc and unplanned. Who is going to assess the suitability and safety of any such offered accommodation? There has to be a better solution and, of course, there is.

The blended learning used so effectively during the pandemic is worth consideration. It allows students to take lectures on line and make occasional daily or overnight trips to college campus for non-lecture activities. It's not a perfect solution but it enables all students, with and without accommodation, to begin college together. As accommodation becomes more available during the semester, students can gradually move up to their college location. The Catholic Church has demonstrated how effective the streaming of Church services is. The colleges should do likewise. Blended learning is a particularly attractive option for first year students, most of whom won't have a CAO offer until 8th September when it will be well-nigh impossible to find accommodation. Rapid advances in virtual communication have totally opened up exciting new ways for teaching and learning. College authorities must respond creatively to the accommodation crisis to ensure that those who secure a college course are enabled to avail of the opportunity to advance their education and career prospects.

Last July, Minister Harris, announced that an extra 1,056 college places will be offered through the CAO for the 2022/2023 academic year in targeted skills areas. All of these additional places will be permanently added to the system. Some examples of courses receiving extra places this year include IT, architecture and construction, nursing, medicine, engineering, education and welfare. As we approach the CAO Round One offer date of 8th September it's very likely that Minister Harris will announce extra college places.

With keen competition for high-points courses in the Central Applications Office (CAO) system, the points for places on these popular college courses will be high. Latest CAO data confirms a final figure of 83,803 applications, down slightly from 84,526 in 2021. It means heavy demand across many courses. 76,896 (77,356 in 2021) have applied for an honours bachelor degree (Level 8) while 42,785 (42,161 in 2021) have applied for an ordinary bachelor degree/ higher certificate (Level 7/6).

Many courses have seen an above average increase in demand, driven largely by schoolleavers expectations of high points, based on a commitment by Government that the results will, on aggregate, be no lower than the results in 2021.

The Central Applications Office (CAO) has already issued two early rounds of college offers - Round A and Round Zero - to mature applicants, mature nursing/ midwifery applicants, applicants who must make visa arrangements, graduate entry medicine applicants, deferred applicants, Access applicants and applicants presenting qualifications for entry to PLC courses with a quota. To date, 11,345 offers have been issued by CAO in Round A and Round Zero to 9,256 applicants. For all other successful applicants, Round One, the main round of offers, will be available online on 8th September at 14.00, and successful applicants will also receive an offer notification by email and text message. Applicants who don't receive an offer will receive a 'Statement of Application' email. The reply date for Round One offers is 15.00 on 14th September. Round Two offers will be available online at 10.00 on 19th September.

#### WHEN CAN YOU ACCESS YOUR PENSION & WHAT ARE YOUR OPTIONS WHEN YOU WANT TO RETIRE?

You can normally get access to your pension from age 60, a lot of the rules depend on whether you are an employee or self employed. If you are coming close to retirement then you are probably wondering what options you have when you want to get access to your pension. It depends on what type of pension you have but generally there are four options:

Tax Free Cash: Most people will be entitled to a tax free lump sum, the amount varies however generally you will get at least 25% of the value of your pension in a tax free cash lump sum.

Annual Pension: This is a guaranteed income usually paid monthly for the rest of your life that is purchased with the money left after your tax free lump sum, this is subject to taxation.

Approved Retirement Funds: You may be entitled to keep some of your money in an approved retirement fund, money can be taken from the fund to give you a regular income, usually monthly. This is subject to taxation also. Taxation at retirement is often much lower than when you are working. It is extremely important that you take your time and have all the options explained to you in plain simple English and that you understand all your options clearly before you make your final decision. As well as the above there is much more to be discussed about your pension. You should discuss your retirement options with a financial advisor who has access to a number of different pension providers before making any decisions, he or she will help you with the above options and any other queries you may have.

#### HOW DO I KNOW IF MY CHILD HAS AN **EYE PROBLEM?**

Some eye conditions do not : display any signs or symptoms, so the only way to know for sure is to take your child for a sight

Signs which may show there is a problem with a child's sight

- an eye appearing to drift inwards or outwards;
- difficulty concentrating:
- headaches;
- sitting too close to the television; or
- · rubbing their eyes a lot.

The condition 'lazy eye' can run in the family, so if someone in your family has either an eye turn ('squint') or suffers from reduced vision in one or both eyes('amblyopia'), it's a good idea to take any related children for a sight test.

#### What is vision screening?

Some children have their vision screened at school - this is usually a basic test, designed to pick up children who have reduced vision in one or both eyes. If a problem is suspected, children will usually be referred for a full sight test.

#### What is a sight test?

A sight test is a comprehensive

check which can pick up many conditions, including colour vision defects, problems with the development of 3D vision and any need for glasses. Taking children for sight tests from an early age helps to build good eye health habits into adulthood.

#### What can I do if I don't want my child to wear glasses?

Some parents avoid taking their children for a sight test, because they do not want them to wear glasses

It's important to understand that some children do need visual correction so their vision can develop normally and to achieve their full potential. The good news is there is now a much wider range of attractive frames to choose from and less stigma attached to wearing glasses.

Many children are also suitable for contact lenses.

This is particularly helpful for children who take part in regular sports activities and they can be successfully worn from an earlier age than most parents expect.

# Irish Self Catering Federation WEBINAR

## Fighting For The Rights of Self Catering Owners In Ireland / Conference

The National Irish Self Catering Federation is the sole representative and lobbying body for owners of Self-Catering properties in Ireland, recognised as such by consultative bodies, Local & Central Government, and every leading Tourism Groups. Our aim is to promote and defend the interests of Self-Catering property owners giving voice to issues affecting our sector. The Irish Self Catering Federation represents members who market approx. 6,000 holiday homes in Ireland.

We are holding a Webinar: Fighting for the rights of Self-Catering Owners in Ireland on the 31st of August 2022 at 7:30pm, as a result of the Bill introduced recently for STR property owners.

#### Let me explain:

#### There are major changes coming in our industry.

1) Earlier this month the Irish Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage Darragh o Brien introduced a Planning and Development Bill (no 2) 2022. This Bill states that a person who rents a house as a Short-Term Rental (STR) must apply to their local authority for planning permission to change the use of the property, so it can be used for tourism and short-term letting purposes. Online platforms, such as Airbnb, will not be able to advertise properties in rent pressure zones without required planning permission that permits the property to be used for short-term letting.

Blog - https://iscf.ie/blog/str-rental-bill-2022-ireland/The controls will apply to non-principal private residences in Rent Pressure Zones and are to come into effect on the 1st of September 2022.

2) This year a Register for Short Term Rentals will commence. The EU are bringing legislation in for all Short-Term Rentals. This will be followed by legislation developed by Failte Ireland who have been appointed by the Irish Government to develop a Register for Short Term Rental Accommodation which will go into effect in Q1 2023. We recommend for all Self-Catering businesses to join the Irish Self-Catering Federation ahead of this legislation coming into law in Ireland. As a Member of the ISCF you will be kept up to date on all the current Tourism Developments which effects the Self-Catering owners with Ireland.

**3)** On the 19th of October 2022 we will be having our "Shared Future for Self Catering" Conference in The Grand Hotel Malahide, Dublin. Which will be open to the General Public. Discounted tickets will be available to ISCF Members Only. ISCF Members will have priority over the limited available tickets. #### **CLUB VERSUS COUNTY**

It's not a debate I've been too willing to get into, simply because I have absolutely no sympathy with it and never did. I'm not going to debate long on it now either; I've nailed my colours to that particular mast long ago.

There have been a number of comments by national pundits - whose opinions I generally value more than most - the likes of O'Rourke, Spillane (who wrote a superb and honest article about the difference between the Irish people and the Irish people that are active on twitter!) and even Brolly have put the work in on the ground in getting to know the game. But most of them, and most national editors and radio hosts, have had a few digs at the shortened inter-county season. As one friend said to me as we were listening to another 'expert' talk about how the GAA are 'shooting themselves in the foot' (an expression that arose during the Napoleonic Wars, not WW1), "cui bono?" Who benefits? As in, these people are getting well paid for speculation, gossip, opinion (the more controversial the better) and nuggets of occasional wisdom during the inter-county season. It's tougher from a national perspective to sell the club scene. And the operative word is 'sell'. The GAA don't get a percentage of their advertising revenue (let's talk about the Sky deal another time – I profoundly disagree with it, despite the good quality of their coverage). I'm glad to see that the GAA public are resisting these calls to arms. I've spoken to a lot of club players and a few inter-county players in recent times, I genuinely haven't come across a single one who isn't loving it. Last year you had county player watching on the side-lines as their clubs face county league relegation, knowing that they could be making the difference. That's not a good head space for anybody. Club championships squashed into April, with county players released very reluctantly to play provided they had no slight niggle whatsoever. That was a GAA sop to the club players that made absolutely no sense. I don't blame the inter-county managers at all - a few weeks before playing Cork, and no Kerry manager that lost to Cork ever got too much leeway because he had obliged the clubs!

This year players can give everything they have to Kerry and then return to the club without outside obligations. I know winning the All Ireland lifts all boats, but I genuinely think that the form of county players in the club championships so far (they have genuinely been outstanding) is partly because that

weight has been lifted off their shoulders.

Next year you'll have a group stage in the All Ireland. I'm still old-fashioned enough to say that a National League shouldn't have knockout stages, and a National Championship shouldn't have a back door. But weaker counties getting just one game and their year over? That model doesn't work – players won't commit to that, and nor would I. More games means more revenue for the GAA (and let's be clear, that's a good thing). I know recovery time will be tight, and I would be recommending monitoring the amount of injuries closely, especially towards the end as the series of games starts to take its toll on bodies. That especially applies to Kerry, where we have group stages in both our club and the separate county championship. It's a general rule, I believe that burnout is more about the monotonous grind of a constant training regime. Players love games - why else would they be playing an amateur sport?

I do have issues with the age change to U20 and especially U17. The idea was to prevent club competitions being held up for talented U18 minors. It didn't work then, and it's working even less now - the rural diaspora is a huge and growing problem for the GAA and for communities in general. A cursory glance at primary schools numbers in rural areas will tell you a lot, and none of it good news. It was being quietly mooted - actually, it was quite loud through back channels, albeit never explicitly stated - that the GAA wanted to make U17 a developmental grade and introduce a U19 competition at this year's Special Congress. The fact that that Special Congress has been 'postponed' to next year's Congress makes me think that the feedback they got from the grassroots was a clear rejection of the notion. The idea that U17s are too young to play in front of crowds is nonsense -as them, they love it. Personally, I still favour a return to U18 for minor – I accept that with extra-time now mandatory when most games finish level, curtain-raisers are no longer generally viable. U21 is more difficult – January/February looks like the only time of year it could realistically be run, and you'd be clashing with the Sigerson. By the way, let us gently consign the McGrath Cup to history – frankly, it was never more than a warm-up competition anyway.

From a supporter's perspective, the GAA have gotten a huge amount right recently – far more than my cynical self dared hope for, really. This year I got to watch Kerry progress to winning a National League (a bit too easily for me – I was still scared) and a Sam Maguire (nothing easy about those last two games!), and out hurlers progress to a McDonagh Cup Final to once again rattle that cage.

In the last couple of weeks, it's gotten even better for me. I'm writing this on Tuesday after watching three great games in a row, all of them tight and hugely entertaining. That County Minor Final was spectacular. The Senior Club Championship – Kenmare Shamrocks are facing a relegation battle after drawing one game and losing two by a point. That's an indication of how fine the margins are, and it's the same when you look down through the competitions. We have our grading right and the County Board have to be commended on the fast turnaround in preparing for and scheduling games – I'm not sure that people fully appreciate the mammoth task that is in the circumstances.

The County Board have sent out a few enquiries as to whether people would be interested in games being streamed. I know there were problems before – and they do include that caveat in the question – but yes. I would be massively in favour of it.

This has been the best GAA season I can remember, and I'm loving every bit of it.

#### **BASKETBALL**

Congratulations to Leah McMahon, who was once again absolutely outstanding in Podgorica for the Irish U16 team.Ireland can genuinely consider themselves very unlucky here. The opened with a narrow defeat to Bosnia Herzegovina in their opening game, clawing back an eight point deficit in the third quarter, but just culdn't get their noses in front. A big three by Leah at the start of the fourth had them within touching distance, 54 apiece

with four left, but Bosnia Hercegovina held out to win by 60 to 55.

It was a similar story in their next game. Serbia looked in control, but Leah made a great drive and sank her own rebound and it ignited her team-mates. Again they were able to draw level, but again they couldn't deny Serbia a 35-28 win. Leah finished with six points, every one of them crucial.

Ireland could be justified in rueing their luck at this stage, but the great teams don't waste time on that. Ireland were out against a physical but perhaps slightly limited North Macedonia side. Credit the coach for continuing his policy of giving every player time on the court as Ireland won well. Emma Tolan was the star of the show with eleven points and, often more important, rebounds, while Leah once again re-affirmed her credentials with 10 points.

#### **ATHLETICS**

It's been some week for Irish athletics! Pride of place has to go to Ciara Mageean, who comes home from Munich with a silver medal in the 1500m at the European Championships. Mageean ran a season best of 4'2.56", but more significantly she ran a very clever race. Scotland's Laura Muir - an absolute sensation, I remember the teenager's absolutely stunning debut several years ago) went past Ciara to take the front and the Portaferry woman stayed with her all the way - other runners were slow to respond and the gap between the two and the chasing pack was soon nigh on insurmountable. In a lovely gesture, one of the first things Ciara did in the aftermath of her stunning performance was pay tribute to her late coach, the great Jerry Kiernan, probably the best athlete Kerry has ever produced.

Mark English also came home with bronze, and that might have been even more spctacular. Mark stayed determinedly on the inside rail and stayed on the shoulder of the early leaders. When the World champion and the Indoor European champin made their break, Mark stayed with them. He was never going to catch the top two, but coming home with bronze was as much proof of his intelligence and determination as much as his speed.

In Irish athletics, the trinity of Ronnie Delaney, John Treacy, and Sonia O'Sullivan hold an

almost unassailable place in our affections. But there's room on that particular podium, and a beaming Rhadisat Adeleke from Tallaght is joining them. She broke her own 400m Irish record, running 50.53 to finish fifth in the European Final.

Adeleke was also key to a brilliant 3' 26.23" in the womens 4 x 400m, just 0.6 seconds off their national record. Sophie Becker led them out, handing over to Phil Healy, Adeleke then went on a superb burst before handing over to Sharlene Mawdesley as the Irishwomen finished fifth. It was Adeleke's 50th race in her annus mirabilis - and given her talent, things might only be getting better.

It was a night of double celebrations for Tallaght AC, with Israel Otalunde becoming the first ever Irishman to qualify for a European 100m final, finishing in sixth place with a new national record of 10.17.

Interestingly, both Adeleke and Otalunde feel that they have even better times within their grasp – Adeleke wasted a precious fraction of a second glancing at the screen and Otalunde is aiming for a sub 10 time in the near future.

#### BOXING EUROPEAN SCHOOLS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Boxing, one of Kerry's oldest and proudest sport, has enjoyed a serious revival over the past decade, and it reached new heights last weekend as not one but two local boxers came back from the European Schoolboys and Schoolgirls Boxing Championships in Turkey. 13 year old Jamsie Casey from the Sliabh Luachra Boxing Club came home with the silver medal in the 46kg category, beating Azerbaijan's Baghir Alimkhanli in the semi-final and only losing out in the final to his Scottish opponent Jacob Naismith on a 3-2 split decision – it doesn't get any tighter than that!

Ballyspillane native Alana O'Brien, currently boxing out of the Setanta Club in Kildare (her club colleague Elma Barry also came home with a silver medal in the 40kg), beat home boxer Sude Naz Efil in a blistering semi-final display but lost out to Ukrainian Uliana Ovsepian in her 46kg final.

All told it was a fantastic Championships for Irish boxing, with no less than 14 boxers returning home with medals. Congratulations to all the boxers, their families, and the team management, especially our own Jennifer

Oleksandr Usyk's toughest fight in recent times most certainly wasn't in the Jeddah Stadium in Saudi Arabia (let us leave discussions about sports washing for another day). Usyk has spent a lot of time recently on the front lines in his native Ukraine's battle for freedom against invading Russia. In the circumstances, then, he was always going to have the crowd behind him. Did that get to Anthony Joshua? Not really; he gave it everything he had in the tank. I'll freely admit that I've always rated AJ highly, maybe a bit behind Wilder and certainly behind Fury, but not out of place in that company. Usyk I thought a bit over-rated, brilliant at taking a punch but a small bit cumbersome in his footwork and limited technically at the elite level. Gutsy as they com, but more of a brawler than a maestro. I thought AJ had under-performed badly in their encounter last time out and would make amends here. He did start well and landed some good punches. The trouble is that Usyk shrugged them off with ease, and, although it was a good fight, he never really looked it trouble. It went the distance, but Usyk was ahead for almost all of it and retained his WBO, WBF, and IBF belts. His technique and footwork are a lot better than I thought.

Joshua wasn't the most dignified in the aftermath, with a slightly bizarre speech – it

wasn't anything like as bad as the media have made it out to be. It was ráimeis, alright, but not abusive or malicious. Look, I hate the showbiz and bluster aspect of boxing – it's a sport of great skill and discipline, but unfortunately seems to rely on bluster and braggadacio to sell itself. Anyone ever read William Hazlitt's short story account of an 1822 fight between Tom Hickman and Bill Neate? US sportswriter Red Smith's reports in the 1970's? A pity that you don't have writers like that given space to flourish in this twitter-driven drama queen era.




Welcome back dear student there is power in the Word of God for transformation. 'Light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it' (John 1:5). 
