## **COUNCILLORS AGREE TO RETAIN 2015 PROPERTY TAX RATE**

Kerry County Councillors have agreed to retain the rate at which the Property Tax is paid in the county in 2015. The property tax rate was set following a commitment from management to ring-fence  $\in 600,000$  for recreational facilities around the county. Councillors have the power to increase or decrease the property tax rate in their counties by 15%. Chief Executive of Kerry County Council, Moira Murrell told a meeting of Kerry County Council that the council is facing a budget deficit of €1.5m next year. She said maintaining services in the county demanded that the LPT rate for 2015 be retained at its current level. Councillors voted by 22 votes to 9 to retain the Local Property Tax rate at its current rate for 2015.

2. The painting of Safety Signage on the approaches to Loughquittane National School.

3. The provision of Safety Fencing at Ballyspillane.

Councillor Gleeson wishes to clarify that the Rates proposal by Kerry County Council of having the AVR rise progressively from  $\notin$ 70.37 to  $\notin$ 79.90 from 2016 to 2019 is not acceptable to him and that he will be voting against it as its impact would be far too severe on Killarney businesses.

He will be asking Kerry County Council to seek a more equitable means of achieving Rates harmonisation over a certain number of years."

# MUSIC TOTS RETURNS TO KILLARNEY – WITH A MASTERS!

Last year, Music Tots classes in Killarney took a break while the teacher, Ruti Lachs, did a Masters degree in Community Music in University of Limerick. Ruti's MA specialisation is the social and language benefits of music for young children. She has researched how music can be used as a tool in developing these characteristics, as well as the pleasure of music for music's sake.

Now, Music Tots is back, with more games, songs, and educational/social aims than before. Music Tots is a fun way for young children to start learning music, including having a go on various instruments, playing music games, singing songs, and hearing different styles of music. ## REDUCED VAT RATE RESULTS IN 692 NEW JOBS IN KERRY

According to a report published by the Restaurant Association of Ireland, 692 new jobs in the Food, Tourism and Hospitality sectors have been created in Kerry since the reduced VAT rate of 9% was introduced in July 2011. Speaking about the launch of the Report Adrian Cummins, Chief Executive of the Restaurants Association of Ireland, said: "In terms of creating new jobs in the food and accommodation sector, the introduction of the new VAT rate in July 2011 has been a major driver of local employment growth. 692 new direct jobs have been created in Kerry alone, with 21,633 new direct jobs created across the whole country. This is a very conservative estimate and does not include the number of indirect jobs created in the wider economy as a result of the multiplier effect. When the multiplier effect is included, the total number of new jobs is even more impressive, with 1010 jobs created in Kerry and 31,584 jobs created nationally."

# **BARBADOS TRIP AWAITS RALLY WINNER**

The Killarney Historic Rally is set to hit the roads on Saturday November 29th with the winner of this year's Rentokil Killarney Historic Rally receiving free entry into the 2015 Barbados Rally Carnival.

This year's rally, the only event in Ireland to cater solely for historic rally cars and the organisers, Killarney and District Motor Club under the guidance of clerk of the course Kevin Flannery, have selected a typically challenging route.

Classic stages, like Molls Gap, Ballaghabeama, Carragh Lake and Gortnagane, often rated by rally drivers as being the best and mostchallenging in the world, will each be tackled twice over the course of the day. The second run over Gortnagane, which runs in parallel to the main Rathmore to Killarney road, will be run under the cover of darkness.

The rally always attracts a strong entry from Ireland and abroad but the new Barbados prize package will be welcomed by competitors new and old.



Mr Flannery said: "The prize includes free of cost: entry on both motor sport events during the Carnival, two return flights from London to Barbados, free return shipping for one car from Portsmouth dock to Barbados and a double hotel room for 12 nights."

The event, which provides a welcome end of season boost to Ireland's tourism capital will be, once again, based at the Gleneagle Hotel in the town. It will form the opening round of the 2015 Irish Tarmac Rally Championship.

# WHERE TO INVEST YOUR MONEY

Interest rates for deposits in banks are the lowest they have been in years. Another problem for people looking for good interest rates is that as well as interest rates being low is that DIRT tax is very high at 41% and since the 1st January this year a PRSI levy of 4% can also be applied. The effective tax rate on interest earned on savings can be as high as 45% as both the new higher rate of Deposit Interest Retention Tax (DIRT) tax and the PRSI levy on unearned income have both come into force. If you invested €20000 over 12 months at 2.50%, taking into account DIRT tax and the levy you may only get €275 after DIRT tax and the PRSI levy. Because these returns are so poor people are looking for alternative investments. Thankfully there are other investment options available to you.

Investment providers have introduced many different types of products because of the very low returns on deposit accounts and it is very important that people know about all these products before deciding on what products suit them best. # MOTORING OUTLOOK Revealed to Be VIGILANT DURING DEER RUTTING SEASON

It's autumn and in our forests and across our mountains, tensions are rising as the rutting season gets under way, the time of the year when male deer are driven by an urge to reproduce. From late September until early November the clash of antlers will be heard as males show off their virility to potential mates and, like gladiators entering an arena, they parade around showing off their armoury of antlers.

While the rut is an amazing experience to witness it is also a time when there is an increased incident of road traffic accidents involving deer as male deer go in search of females and younger males are ousted by dominant males forcing deer to cross roads and motorways. The Wild Deer Association of Ireland are calling on motorists to be vigilant at dawn and dusk, when deer are most active, particularly in high risk areas such as woodlands and mountains.

What should drivers do in high risk areas? Reduce speed where they see a warning sign and stay alert. Prepare to stop, never swerve as you could hit another obstacle or oncoming vehicle. When you see a deer "dip your



headlights" as the full-beam may cause the deer to freeze. If a deer has crossed in front of your vehicle, be aware that others may follow. Do not approach an injured deer. If you are involved in a Deer RTA or come across a deer that has been involved in a RTA, immediately contact the local Gardaí.

# HEALTH AND SAFETY AUTHORITY, AN GARDA SÍOCHÁNA AND THE ROAD SAFETY AUTHORITY JOIN TO FOCUS ON TRACTOR SAFETY



Accidents involving tractors and machinery have been the main cause of serious and fatal accidents on farms over the last 10 years. So far this year 21 people have been killed in Agriculture, with 14 of those deaths involving tractors and machinery.

In an effort to improve and increase safety awareness around tractors, the Health and Safety Authority, An Garda Siochana and the Road Safety Authority have launched an 'Essential Tractor Safety Checks' leaflet at the National Ploughing Championships in Ratheniska, Stradbally, Co Laois.

The leaflet has been designed to provide tractor users with a series of simple visual checks that should be undertaken regularly. These checks are easy to carry out and, if done properly, will help to protect the driver, passengers and anyone in the vicinity of the tractor, whether on the road or on the farm.

Pat Griffin, Senior Inspector with the Health and Safety Authority, says that it is important to understand why so many of the fatalities are associated with tractors, "When we study the causes of deaths involving tractors very often we find that poor maintenance, inappropriate usage, lack of training and competence are the main factors. Tractors are essential to the work of the farm, they have made farming more productive and reduced the need for heavy labour. Maybe it is because these developments have been so beneficial that the dangers are less apparent. Farmers must be aware of the dangers and focus on working safely at all times."

Chief Superintendent Michael O'Sullivan, Garda National Traffic Bureau said:-

"Working with tractors and machinery carries risk, whether on or off road, especially if simple checks are not carried out. It is essential for any driver or operator to take a few minutes to carry out these safety checks, not only for their safety but for all around them. An Garda Síochána are delighted to join with the HSA and RSA to produce this simple but effective check list for the safety of all working with such equipment." Mr. Michael Rowland, Director, Road Safety, Driver Education and Research with the RSA asked farmers to also be safety conscious whenever bringing a farm vehicle onto the public road. "Farmers should be aware of traffic building up behind them and keep left where possible to allow other vehicles pass safely. I would appeal to other road users to show patience when encountering farm machinery on the road. With understanding on both sides, the roads can be safer for everybody."

He also reminded drivers of agricultural vehicles that they are covered by road traffic laws on driver licensing, insurance, standards in relation to vehicle roadworthiness, vehicle lighting and motor tax.

# KERRY COMPLETE THE DOUBLE SAM RETURNS FOR THE 37TH TIME

### **KERRY 2-9 DONEGAL 0-12**

#### **Report Kerry O'Shea**

Firm favourites Donegal were in shock as they wended their way home following a decisive victory by underdogs Kerry in last Sunday's All-Ireland SFC Final at Croke Park.

The Kerry Minors and Seniors are bringing <sup>A</sup> home two trophies, the Tom Markham Cup and the Sam Maguire Cup. This in itself is a unique achievement as the double has only been won on six previous occasions in the Kingdom's history.

As a spectacle, the game wasn't memorable, but that will not worry the legions of Kerry supporters who turned up in Croke Park last Sunday

Kerry are back as All-Ireland champions for the first time since 2009, and the Kingdom's excellent record of winning an All-Ireland title in a year ending with the number four continues as they won the title previously in 1904, 1914, 1924, 1984, and 2004.

This was a very sweet victory for the management and team; firstly it was the County's first win over Ulster opposition in an All-Ireland final since 1986. Fitzmaurice has garnered the respect of Kerry fans and the team for his flawless management skills. After the game, the Finuge man spoke to reporters saying this team of veterans and youngsters spurred him on this year. They made me feel as if I was playing again myself. It was a joy to train a team prepared to give all they had."

Paul Murphy, in his first full competitive season, impressed at wing-back and was a deserving winner of RTE's Man of the Match award, while Kieran Donaghy more than most deserves special credit.

Donaghy singlehandedly kept Kerry in the title hunt, and his opportunist goal which he dedicated to Colm Cooper 51 minutes into the game, helped to effectively seal the deal.

James O'Donoghue, despite not scoring last Sunday, made a vital contribution to this win with some telling foot passes and clever ball distribution and is a certainty for the Player of the Year award. Kerry manager Eamonn Fitzmaurice's tactic of playing O'Donoghue as a decoy worked perfectly. It did not allow the young player the freedom to score, but he didn't mind as he was part of a team who worked to achieve this great victory.

The contribution of the subs to this win too was impressive, as Barry John Keane and Bryan Sheehan scored three vital frees at a stage when Kerry needed scores.

This wonderful win had everything, but the common thread was the achievement of a brilliant young manager, Eamonn Fitzmaurice and a group of players who wanted to win.

# MINISTER MUST INSTRUCT COMMONAGE COMMITTEE TO DELIVER ON JULY COMMITMENTS TO HILL FARMERS

IFA Rural Development chairman Flor McCarthy has said the flexibility secured by IFA in July at a meeting with the Minister for Agriculture, Simon Coveney must now be delivered by the Commonage Implementation Committee to ensure that all farmers who sign up for GLAS on commonage lands are accepted. IFA will hold the Minister to his commitment that if the 50% management agreement is not achieved for legitimate reasons, active farmers will still get priority to participate in GLAS.

He must ensure that the Commonage Implementation Committee, which IFA fought for and secured, must recognise the difficulties and constraints of hill farming and ensure the Minister's commitment to IFA in July is upheld. He also said there is a responsibility on the Department of Agriculture and Teagasc to prioritise hill and commonage areas in the west of Ireland that will have a significant number of applicants. "Whatever resources are required in those areas will have to be made available to avoid any delay in getting the new GLAS Scheme up and running. Farmers cannot be left waiting because of a lack of personnel. If it means relocating resources, it will have to be done."

Flor McCarthy said, "Flexibility has always been a key demand of IFA. It is absolutely essential that no farmer is disadvantaged and IFA will make this very clear to the Department at their forthcoming meetings." He called on the Department of Agriculture to run additional information meetings to explain the new rules and provide accurate and detailed information. It is essential that every effort is made by the Department to address farmers concerns.

"No barriers must be put in the way of effective implementation of GLAS and early approval from the EU Commission is now urgently required." Pat Dunne said the upcoming Budget is a real test of the Government.

Following a meeting with the Department of Agriculture on Monday, IFA Rural Development chairman Flor McCarthy from Kenmare has urged the Minister for Agriculture Simon Coveney to utilise all EU TAMS funding by reopening TAMS for specific measures.

Flor McCarthy said it is clear from the applications and drawdown across all TAMS measures there is an underspend of up to €10m. This is due to farmers not proceeding with work for various reasons such as delays in getting Department of Agriculture approval and the changing economic circumstances of various enterprises. If this funding is not utilised by next August it will go back to Brussels.

The EU funding available only needs to be co-financed by 15% of exchequer funding. This low level of co-financing was agreed a number of years ago at the height of the recession and allowed member states which were in the bailout to utilise EU funding by applying the lowest level of national cofinancing.

Rural Development The IFA Chairman said there is now an

opportunity to implement a scheme targeted at specific issues such as safety measures on farms. This could include replacing damaged slats, safety fences, silage pit barriers, outside agitation points etc. Applications could be open for a short period between now and the end of the year with approvals being issued shortly afterwards and with payments made by end of August 2015. TAMS 2 will be available under the new RDP and IFA is calling for an early start-up date. This scheme must be broad based and include a much greater list of items for grant aid.

# **SOWING HARDY ANNUALS**

It may seem a long time away, but sowing some hardy annuals now will give you a very impressive display in early spring. Most hardy annuals can be sown in autumn and will overwinter quite well.

Hardy annuals are plants that will grow and flower for one year only.

When sowing your seeds, dig the soil over well, to about a spades depth, then rake it over and firm it down, and make sure it is weed free. A good idea before sowing your seed is to mark it out by sprinkling some sand on the on the area you're going to sow the seed on. Also don't sow the seed into soil that is too rich, as this will only encourage too much leafy growth and not enough flowers. If the soil is rich there is no need to use fertilizers.

You can also scatter the seed over the whole bed, and try and leave about a 1/4 of an inch between them and cover them lightly with some compost and water well, but make sure there is a fine rose on your watering can. There is a range of hardy annuals to choose from so make sure you know the heights and spread and, of course, the colour.

# Know Your Rights: AFTER-SCHOOL CHILD CARE SCHEME

#### QUESTION

I'm unemployed and want to get back to work but my son is in primary school, which makes it difficult to be available all day for work or training. Can I get help with childcare for afterschool hours?

#### **ANSWER**

If you go on an employment support scheme, go back to work or increase the number of days you work, you may be able to avail of the After-School Child Care Scheme. The scheme provides subsidised after-school childcare places with local childcare providers and is for primary school children aged 4 to 13.

To qualify for the scheme you must be getting Jobseeker's Allowance, Jobseeker's Benefit or One-Parent Family Payment, or be on an employment support programme, for at least three months.

If you get a place, you can get after-school childcare for up to five days a week at a daily rate of  $\in$ 3 per child. The scheme includes a pick-up service. You can get up to 52 weeks of childcare while you remain eligible for the scheme. If you use the scheme during the school year, you can also get up to 10 weeks' full-time childcare during the holidays.

You can apply and get more information at your local Intreo centre or social welfare office. You can apply up to 26 weeks after you start your new job, take up additional employment or start your employment support scheme.

The scheme is not available to Community Employment scheme participants who can apply for the CE Childcare Programme instead.

For vocational training with an Education and Training Board, the Childcare Education and Training Support Programme offers subsidised childcare.

If you don't qualify for these schemes you may be eligible for the Community Childcare Subvention Programme, which offers childcare at a reduced cost to parents who are disadvantaged or in training, education or low paid work.

# 8 THINGS EVERYONE SHOULD KNOW ABOUT COOKING:

1. Cooking from scratch can be fast and easy. Don't bite off more than you can chew. On busy weeknights, do the absolute minimum. Tackle the basics – steamed rice, boiled potatoes, pasta. Sauté vegetables, serve with some meat or eggs, and you've got a fast, tasty dinner. Remember, it's better to cook simply every night than make elaborate meals once in a while.

2. Cooking from scratch will save you so much money! Buy groceries once a week, keep a wellstocked kitchen, and cook from scratch on a nightly basis, or cook just a few times a week and eat the leftovers.

3. Learn some cheap shortcuts to save even more money. Dried beans and lentils are very cheap and easy to prepare: simply soak, boil, and season. Ask your butcher for tough cuts of meat, which are just as delicious as pricey cuts if cooked for a lengthy time in stews or soups; they're especially simple to use in a slow cooker. Buy seasonally to keep the cost down. Plan your weekly menu in advance to cut down on wasted groceries.

4. There's a lot more to pasta than just tomato sauce. The sky's the limit when it comes to pasta. Cream, butter, and Parmesan can create a quick Alfredo sauce. Olive oil, toasted breadcrumbs, and cheese are a delicious combo. Add a beaten egg, ham, and more Parmesan for instant carbonara. Pesto, chopped leftover roasted vegetables, smoked fish, fresh tomatoes with basil and mozzarella – try everything!

5. Making bread from scratch takes time, not work. There are wonderful no-knead recipes that require almost no work – just some initial measuring and stirring – then you let them sit for hours with minimal attention.

6. Master a few recipes and use those. Start by establishing a small collection of foolproof recipes that you can always fall back on, i.e. roasted chicken, a fine pasta dinner, a vegetable soup, a good omelette, an awesome steak. Branch out as you can, but don't stress out about knowing how to cook everything all at once.

7. Good, basic cookbooks are a great investment.

8. Last but not least, buy a fabulous knife. When chopping becomes effortless, cooking anything becomes a whole lot easier and you'll be more inclined to do it.

# **BUYING A NEW CAR -BUDGET CAREFULLY:**

\*Aim to keep a new car for at least three years to spread the cost of rapid initial depreciation \*Check car tax rates before you buy and make sure your budget includes insurance and road tax.

\*If you need to borrow money, shop around for a loan before visiting the dealer–you'll almost certainly get a better deal than you would with the dealer's own finance.

\*Check the price covers delivery charges and number plates

\*Make sure any special features or extras you

#### want are included in the price

\*If you're part– exchanging, price your car realistically: Get an idea of your car's value based on its age, condition and mileage.

\*Focus on the 'cost to change' – if you negotiate a good discount on a new car, you're unlikely to get a generous trade–in for your old car.

\*You should be able to get more for the car by selling privately but that can be very time consuming and stressful compared with the simplicity of driving to the dealer in your old car and driving away

#### in the new one.

\*Be wary of advertised minimum trade-in offers – they might look attractive, but may only be available if you take the dealer's finance package

\*Many dealers will have allowed for bargaining in agreeing a price - remember your budget though – don't get carried away

\*Don't hand over money until you're satisfied with the collection or delivery arrangements

\*Try to schedule collection for a time when the dealer's not too busy so that they can put aside enough time to help familiarise you with controls and any set-up required.

\*Familiarise yourself with the warranty conditions before you sign anything:

You may need to fork out for routine checks done to ensure the long-term anti-corrosion warranty remains valid.

Car manufacturers can't insist that you get the car serviced by a franchise dealer during the warranty period but you must still get it serviced according to the manufacturer's recommended schedule and

criteria using only manufacturer approved parts. You will have to keep records so you can demonstrate to the manufacturer that servicing was undertaken to their requirements.

It's worth bearing in mind that if anything goes wrong shortly after the warranty expires, a manufacturer is more likely to show goodwill towards any claim if the car has been serviced by one of their dealers.

\*Don't be pressured into buying - walk away if you're not completely happy.

### THREE-LEGGED DOG RESCUES LITTER OF KITTENS & CARES FOR THEM:

A three-legged dog in Britain has welcomed new family members to her pack after a heroic rescue that brought a litter of kittens to safety. The dog named Meg alerted staff members at the Rochdale RSPCA to a litter of kittens that were trapped in the ceiling of the animal rescue facility by whimpering and looking up at the ceiling in distress.

When they began to investigate, the team found five baby cats in a tiny ceiling cavity, with only about eight inches of space surrounding them. The staff thinks the kittens' mom snuck into the space from the roof of the building to give birth.

The shelter believes it is caring for the kittens' mother, but the cat has rejected the litter of kittens, so Meg, a mixed-breed dog who is responsible for their rescue, is pitching in and helping, she is really kind and gentle with them and is always licking them.

Meg was brought to the RSPCA shelter as a puppy back in 2008. After being abused by children, Meg had to have her back leg amputated. But the dog has thrived with the manager's care and regularly accompanies her to work.

The Rochdale RSPCA will find homes for the kittens once they are old enough to adopt out

but for now, Meg will continue to assist the staff in caring for the young felines and is doing a very good job so far.

### IT'S NICE TO BE AN ALASKAN

Residents will pocket \$1,884 by way of this year's Alaska Permanent Fund dividend, up from last year's \$900 payout and the third largest since the payments from the state's oil wealth savings account began in 1982.

The fund which is available to all residents born in Alaska on or before December 31st 2013, or those who have lived in the state for one year was established in 1976 after the discovery of oil on Alaska's North Slope.

The payout is based on a five-year average

### **SAVING WATER:**

Don't run your washing machine and dishwasher until they are full.

Only fill your kettle with as much water as you need - you'll also save on your electricity bill.

Use a basin. It's useful for washing dishes by hand or collecting the water you use to rinse fruit and veg – which can then be used for watering plants.

Keep a jug of water in the fridge instead of running the tap to make the water cool to drink.

Use the shower instead of soaking in the bath. Spend less time in the shower.

Flush the toilet only when necessary -

depending on your cistern's age and size one flush can use up to 9 litres of water.

Consider adding a displacement device (such as a 2 litre plastic bottle filled with water or sand) to your cistern to reduce the amount of water used.

Turn the tap off when brushing your teeth, shaving or washing your face.

Collect rainwater to use in your garden instead of using drinking water from the tap.

Use a rose head watering can instead of a hose to water your plants.

Avoid watering your lawn – grass can survive long dry spells and recovers quickly with the next rainfall.

Use a bucket and sponge to wash your car or windows instead of a hose.

Regularly check your indoor and outdoor taps, pipes and plumbing fixtures for leaks.

# EMOTIONAL INTELLIGENCE

Emotional intelligence (EI) refers to the way in which we manage, perceive, understand and control emotions and relationships – both our own and others. Research has shown that EI is very important in life – and for many people it is more important for success than general intelligence (IQ). Four different factors have been identified in EI and these include

1. The ability to perceive emotions. In order to understand emotions, we have to first perceive them accurately. This might mean understanding nonverbal cues such as body language and/or facial expressions.

2. Reasoning with Emotions. Emotions help us to prioritize what we pay attention to and what we respond to.

3. Understanding Emotions. If someone is expressing emotion, we must interpret what it might mean – emotions can have a wide variety of meanings.

4. Managing Emotions. Being able to manage our emotions, regulate our emotions and respond to the emotions of others effectively is key to El.

In order to recognise an emotion 'as it happens' for us, it is important to develop self-awareness. This involves tuning into our feelings, recognising what they are and the effect they have on us. Self-regulation is also important in helping us to manage our emotions. There are times when we may have little control over our emotions, but we can learn techniques to self-regulate.

All of these factors are important in helping us to better understand, empathise and negotiate with other people. The ability to recognise how other people feel is important for success. Being able to read other's signals and respond appropriately is key. The better we are at discerning the feelings behind another person's behaviour, the more skilled we become at communicating with them.

The good news is that EI can be learned and developed. Strategies to work on our EI include

1. **Observe:** How do you react to others. Do you rush in to judge before you know all the facts? Do you stereotype people? Take a closer look at how you are interacting with people and try putting yourself in their shoes.

2. **Put the focus on others:** Give others a chance to shine – without worrying about getting attention for your accomplishments.

3. **Examine how you respond to Stress?** Do you get upset, blame others or get angry when in difficult situations. The ability to stay calm and in control when things go wrong is key to success.

4. Take Responsibility: If you make a mistake, apologies.

5. Know how your actions will affect others.

# Health Matters.... With Dr. Michael Moloney

Pneumonia is a serious lung infection. Treatment with antibiotics is usually needed. If you are normally well, it is likely that you will make a full recovery. Some severe cases are life-threatening. When someone is in poor health or very old, pneumonia can make them very ill and the infection is more likely to be life-threatening.

# WHAT IS PNEUMONIA?

Pneumonia is an inflammation of the lung tissue. It is usually due to infection. Pneumonia tends to be more serious than bronchitis. Bronchitis is an inflammation or infection of the large airways - the bronchi (see diagram). Sometimes bronchitis and pneumonia occur together which is called bronchopneumonia.

#### Are there different types of pneumonia?

Pneumonia is commonly caused by an infection with a bacterium or virus. There are 3 or 4 different bacteria that are the most common causes of pneumonia. There is also a well-known group of bacteria that causes pneumonia in about 3 out of 10 cases. They are called atypicals. Other germs such as fungi, yeasts, or protozoa can sometimes also cause pneumonia.

Rarely, non-infective pneumonia is caused by inhaling poisons or chemicals.

#### What are the symptoms of pneumonia?

Typical symptoms are cough, fever, sweats, shivers, being off your food and feeling generally unwell. Headaches and aches and pains are common. You usually make more sputum. This may become yellow/green coloured and is sometimes bloodstained.

You may become breathless, breathe fast and develop a tight chest. A sharp pain in the side of the chest may develop if the infection involves the pleura. (This is the membrane between the lung and the chest wall.) A doctor may hear crackles in the chest when listening with a stethoscope.

#### Can pneumonia be prevented

Pneumococcal vaccine helps to protect against infections such as pneumonia and meningitis. The vaccine will be injected into a muscle or under the surface of your skin. The most common side-effects are tenderness at the site of the injection, mild fever, feeling tired, and head/muscle aches. These should soon pass.

Pneumococcal vaccine stimulates your body to make antibodies against pneumococcal bacteria. These antibodies then help protect you from illness should you become infected with pneumococcal bacteria. It provides protection against many (but not all) types of pneumococcal bacteria. If you have any further queries please do not hesitate to contact us on 0646620628
