



Forum on Irish Language Tourism

A forum on Irish tourism took place this week at Tralee Institute of Technology.

The Gaeltacht Experience, accessing Irish language Markets and Sustainable Tourism in the Gaeltacht were just some of the discussions brought up at the Fóram ar Thurasóireacht na Gaolainne which was held on Monday, 22 October.

The joint initiative by Fóram Gaeilge Chiarraí, Kerry County Council's Oifig Gaeilge, and the Hotel, Culinary & Tourism section of IT Tralee, decided to bring together the sections of the Gaeltacht and Irish Speaking communities across Kerry which have a keen interest in growing language based tourism. Matt Mooney, Cathaoirleach of Fóram Gaeilge Chiarraí said "This niche market forms a vibrant part of cultural tourism and is a corner stone of Gaeltacht tourism, with tens of thousands teenagers attending some 50 Irish Language Summer Colleges nationwide every year".

Irish Language Tourism is more than just summer school for secondary students, there are a multitude of opportunities for Irish Language Tourism including; training for Mary I students and upskilling for teachers: Saoire Teaghlaigh sa Ghaeltacht; heritage and language adults courses; American College students, not to mention cultural centres, guide tours and walks and the 15 or more festivals across Kerry that actively celebrate the Irish language and culture.

The aim of the Fóram was to give the Gaeltacht & Irish Speaking Communities an opportunity to create a platform to support the marketing of the Gaeltacht, and Gaeilge experience in a way that will help sustain and grow our Gaeltacht communities.



Killarney crews take part in Italian rally







COMMEMORATIVE PLAQUES LAUNCHED AS KILLARNEY GOLF & FISHING CLUB CELEBRATE THEIR 125TH ANNIVERSARY

The vision of the men and women who founded Killarney Golf and Fishing Club on the shores of Lough Lein has been honoured. Commemorative Plaques to celebrate the 125th anniversary of Killarney Golf & Fishing Club have been launched by Brendan Griffin T.D., Minister of State for Transport, Tourism and Sport.

The launch took place at Killarney House and Gardens as the history of Killarney Golf Club is inextricably intertwined with the story of the Earls of Kenmare, and in particular Lord Castlerosse. Historically, both locations have benefitted from the generosity of benefactors such as the Mc Shain family, Lord Castlerosse, and Beatrice Grosvenor, who in generously

donating their estates to the Irish Republic, have ensured that many generations to come will have the absolute pleasure of visiting and viewing these beautiful locations.

While the primary mission of Killarney Golf and Fishing Club is what it says in its name - to promote golf and fishing – the club are very conscious in celebrating its anniversary that they not only celebrate the present but also mark the past by erecting these commemorative plaques. In this way, the story of the men and women who founded Killarney Golf and Fishing Club and the story of its various locations, will not be forgotten and will live on in present and future memories.

The names of all the founder members are on

a plaque and will be displayed permanently in Killarney Golf and Fishing Club. Relatives of the Downing Brothers, represented by Creagh Downing and Lady Tucker, Ellen O'Connell, represented by Katie and Clare O'Connell, who were involved in the founding of the club. Lady Tucker was a founder member of the club and she was also a scratch golfer - both activities would not have been the norm for the majority of women at that time. As part of Killarney Golf Club's 125, the Ladies Club in consultation with Ellen, Lady Tucker's family, re-designated the Lake Cup as the Ellen Lady Tucker Cup which was awarded to the best nett score in Handicap 18 and under on this year's Lady Captain's Day. Paddy Mc Carthy and his family, and Mary Shanahan were also presented with a commemorative plaque. Killarney Golf Club was located on Paddy Mc Carthy's land (Deerpark) from 1893-1936 and the clubhouse of Killarney Golf Club was located in Brú na Páirce which is the property of Mary Shanahan. Pat Dawson, of Killarney House and Gardens, was presented with a plaque to acknowledge the involvement of Valentine Browne, the 6th Earl of Kenmare, in establishing Killarney Golf and Fishing Club at its current lakeside location at Mahony's Point in 1939. Valentine Browne was better known as Lord Castlerosse and is quoted as saying "When anyone sees Killarney, even if he is the basest heretic, he must believe in God". Lord Castlerosse found it necessary to find a new location for Killarney Golf Club due to the fact that the Land Agent for that part of the Kenmare Estate located at Deerpark and comprising of the then Killarney Golf Club, was instructed by receivers to obtain a proper market rate for the letting of the lands. The lands at that time in 1936 were let to Killarney Golf Club at a peppercorn rent of just 1 shilling per annum, and following a review, it was devised that the rate should rise to £75.00 Per Annum. This was a massive and potentially ruinous increase, and one that the then membership of some 130 members could not afford, after all they were only paying 1 guinea Per Annum as their Subscription, which in total amounted to £136, and 10 Shillings.

Thanks to the vision of these men and women, Killarney Golf and Fishing Club found a new home on the shores of Lough Lein. This vision has made the club what it is today with all its rich history and breath-taking scenery, and we look forward to what the next 125 years will bring.







WHAT IS A CATARACT?

A cataract happens when the lens within your eye becomes cloudy. It can happen to all of the lens or just part of it. There are different types of cataract, but the most common is age-related cataract, which is more common in people over 65. It can be found to some degree in almost all older people.

RISK FACTORS

Age is the biggest risk factor for developing cataracts. Apart from age, smoking increases the risk of cataracts and often causes the cataract to develop earlier and more quickly. Excessive exposure to sunlight and ultraviolet light can increase the speed at which cataracts develop. In some cases, people are born with cataracts.

SYMPTOMS

Cataracts can cause your vision to become cloudy and less clear. You may notice that you're more easily dazzled by vehicle headlights, or that objects appear less colourful. Cataracts don't cause eye pain or make your eyes red


TREATMENT

At first following a sight test we may be able to prescribe new glasses that will help with changes to your vision caused by the cataract. When this no longer helps you to see well enough, the only effective treatment is surgery. Surgery is usually only recommended once the cataract is causing problems with everyday activities, such as driving, watching television and reading.

Cataract surgery improves the vision of nearly all patients and has one of the highest success rates of all surgery. If you experience blurred or cloudy vision you should have a sight test.



Know Your Rights:

OUESTION

I am pregnant but I have only been working with my employer for a few weeks. Am I entitled to maternity

ANSWER

If you are pregnant while in employment, you are entitled to maternity leave, regardless of how long you have been relation to maternity at work, including maternity leave. You are entitled to 26 weeks' maternity leave. You can also take up to 16 weeks' additional unpaid maternity leave, which begins immediately after the end of maternity leave.

Under the Maternity Protection (Amendment) Act 2004, of your baby's expected birth and at least 4 weeks after. You can decide how you would like to take the remaining and the remaining weeks after. If you qualify for Maternity Benefit (see below) you must take at least 2 and no more than 16 weeks before the end of the week the baby is due. Your entitlement to pay and superannuation during maternity leave depends on the terms of your contract of

Employers are not obliged to pay you if you are on Protection if you have enough PRSI contributions.

However, your contract with your employer could provide for additional rights to payment during the leave period, so that, for example, you could receive full pay less the amount of your Maternity Benefit.







IT'S ALMOST HALLOWEEN SO WHERE WOULD WE BE WITHOUT A MORBID STORY?

it's tricky to focus on food when you're surrounded by recently deceased, mouldering corpses, however this was not always the case. For a time, friends and families used to put aside any sense of squeamishness and congregate to have picnics in graveyards all over the world. Early photographs from the 19th-century show lines of men and women heading happily to leafy burial grounds, heavy-laden baskets in tow, preparing for a perfectly innocent day out.

Though we now think of a picnic as the perfect excuse for a family-focused day in the sun, the realities of domestic life differed considerably for earlier generations. Rampant disease and poverty meant that mortality rates and life expectancy were considerably lower for everyone. Death was a part of daily life. Though tragic, this also meant that many people were used to the idea of mortality in a way that we aren't any longer.

Spending time in cemeteries was, for many, the only way to reconnect with loved ones who had



passed before their time. Families would gather around the graves of children, parents, brothers and sisters, swapping stories and sharing food with one another away from the squalor and dirt of the inner city. Visiting cemeteries became, for many, one of the few opportunities for leisure available outside of the tortuous 19th century working week.

The diet of the picnickers varied enormously depending on social class. Luxury portable items such as chocolate would only be available to a select few families who had the disposable income to afford such extravagance. For ordinary people, meals were far more restrained with staples such as sandwiches, boiled sweets and fruit and records from disgruntled graveyard officials, reporting on the mess left by crowds of rowdy diners, show that that cans of sardines and bottles of beer were commonly left strewn across the sites.

In Ancient Rome, an annual celebration known as the parentalia commemorated the spirits of deceased ancestors. The festival involved family members transporting a carefully prepared banquet to offer to the spirits of dead relatives, before themselves dining on wine and cakes around the tomb. Similarly, cultures across Asia regularly prepare food for the dead to this day, to be offered up as part of funeral festivities.

At the start of the 20th century graveyard dining began to wane as networks of new public parks sprouting in or close to Cities across the world, families became far less concerned with sharing their leisure time with the dead.

1951 - The conservative party led by Winston Churchill at the age of 86 won the general election in Britain defeating the Labour party led by Clement Attlee.

1972 - Guided tours of Alcatraz by the Park Service begin.

1982 -The U.S. budget deficit reached more than \$110 trillion for the fiscal year 1982.

STRICTER LAWS FOR TRICK OR TREATING IN PARTS OF THE U.S. AND CANADA

For teens living in certain cities, the scariest part of Halloween is a ban on teenage trick-or-treaters. In the city of Chesapeake, which is Virginia's third-largest city, local law states that trick-or-treaters older than 12 can be charged with a misdemeanour. Teens guilty of this offense can be required to pay a fine of between \$25 and \$100, spend up to six months in jail, or both. And the city also has a ban on all trick-or-treating past 8 p.m., which is punishable with a fine ranging from \$10 to \$100, or up to 30 days in jail.

Other cities in Virginia have similar laws on the books. The town of Newport News prohibits trick-or-treaters who are older than 12, and parents who accompany their children cannot wear masks. Other towns like Norfolk, Portsmouth, Suffolk, and Virginia Beach have similar regulations.

Several North Carolina cities have similar laws against teen trick-or-treaters, as well as requirements to end the festivities by 9 p.m. And in some areas in South Jersey, a curfew of 7 p.m. is enforced.

In many Cities in Canada it is also illegal for teens over the age of 14

When people come along to counselling, and begin talking abou their problems, it sometimes becomes apparent that some of their difficulties may be down to the challenge of communicating with the other people in their lives.

This can apply to any of us. Whether discussing issues in our relationship with a partner or other family member, or with friends or colleagues, we are quite likely to say 'He knows how I feel about this', or 'She knows how difficult I find that', or 'I'm not going to ask them for help because I shouldn't need to ask, they should just know what to do', and so on. Sound familiar?

All this ignores a fundamental reality - we cannot assume other people know what we think, or how we feel, or what we need, unless we tell them. We are all equipped with a degree of intuition, and some people can be very 'tuned in' to the thoughts and feelings of others. But we cannot always rely on intuition alone. For example, someone may long for their partner to open up about a shared difficulty in their lives, while the partner may want exactly the same thing, but feel they 'shouldn't go there' because they think this would be unwelcome. Two people, who long to connect with each other, may grow further apart because of a gap in communication.

Of course we all need, and are entitled to, our privacy. We don't have to wear our heart on our sleeve all the time. What we are thinking about here is building bridges and sustaining connections with the significant people around us, rather than seeing those connections weaken through a lack of communication, with all the misunderstandings, frustrations, conflict, burt and loneliness that can ensue.

As children, we may have been fortunate enough to have an adult around who tuned in to our feelings and tended to our needs, before we were old enough to put those feelings and needs into words. Even if we don't realise it, perhaps a bit of us still quite naturally longs for that sort of automatic understanding from others. But, as adults, we probably need to play our part in making ourselves known and understood. The counselling process can offer a safe space where we can start putting things into words, gradually find our own voice, and become more confi dent about making ourselves known to another person.


