



GARDAI POLICING PLAN IN PLACE FOR LABOUR PARTY CONFERENCE

The annual conference of the Labour Party will take place at the I.N.E.C Killarney from Friday the 27th February to Sunday the 1st March 2015. A policing plan is in place to meet the policing requirements of this event and An Garda Síochána wishes to advise the public that an Anti Austerity Protest march is due to take place in Killarney on Saturday the 28th February 2015. This march is scheduled to commence at Market Cross, Killarney town centre at 12 noon and protesters will then make their way via the Muckross Road towards the I.N.E.C. where the conference is taking place. "There has been extensive engagement with the organisers of this protest march who have assured me that the march will be peaceful and orderly. To accommodate this march, a traffic management plan has been agreed with the organisers and diversions will be in place. An Garda Síochána will strive to ensure that any disruption is kept to a minimum". Flor Murphy, Superintendent told the Killarney Outlook

- Traffic diversions will be in place as follows;

 Upper New St, Main St and High St will be experience traffic diversions from midday until the protest march has moved off from Market Cross at approximately 12.30pm.
- Traffic will be diverted off the Muckross Rd to facilitate protesters from 12.30pm until the protest concludes at approximately 2:30pm.
- Traffic entering Killarney from the Molls Gap side of Killarney should divert at the Loretto Rd Junction to avoid the delays.
- For Garda Operational reasons Mill Road will only be open to local residents all day Saturday. Mill Road residents are advised to use the Ballycasheen entrance to Mill Road as the Muckross Rd/Mill Road intersection will be closed to all traffic.





DEDICATED STROKE UNIT QUERY

At a recent meeting of Kerry County Council, Councillor Michael Gleeson asked that the Health Service Executive - South (H.S.E.) would clarify if: A Dedicated Stroke Unit was in place in Kerry General Hospital. The following Reply has been received by Kerry County Council from H.S.E. South:

"I refer to the above reference and previous correspondence regarding same.

We do not have a dedicated Stroke Unit within Kerry General Hospital with the dedicated staffing mentioned in your correspondence. We do, however, cater for stroke patients within our general medical wards where the patients receive all the necessary clinical interventions and supports.

We are currently exploring options around the establishment of A Dedicated Stroke Unit and particularly what our options might be in terms of providing clinical governance to any such Unit. We are committed to establishing such a Unit once the various governance and resourcing issues are resolved".

Councillor Gleeson expressed disappointment that such a Dedicated Unit has still not been established in Kerry General Hospital despite his raising the matter for the last ten years. Stroke is the third most common cause of death in Ireland and the most common cause of acquired physical disability.



COPING WITH GRIEF

Whilst we may often think of grief resulting from the death of a loved one, any loss can cause grief. These losses may include divorce or the break up of a relationship, a miscarriage, loss of a pet, loss of our health, a job, a cherished dream, a friendship, financial security, or selling the family home.

Grieving is a highly individual and personal experience and the way in which we grieve can depend on many different elements. These include our personality, our life experiences, our faith, the nature of the loss, our resilience and coping style. Grief can be like a roller coaster - with ups and downs. Powerful feelings can come unexpectedly some more intense and longer lasting than others. Feelings can range from shock and disbelief, to guilt, sadness, anger, fear and frustration. Physical symptoms are also common such as weight loss/gain, insomnia, fatigue, nausea, aches and pains. Forgetfulness and poor concentration are also symptoms of grief. All of these feelings are perfectly normal and there is no right or wrong way to feel. Sometimes people can feel guilty about their anger - but it is okay to

It is important not to go through this alone and to talk and share your feelings. This may be with family and friends or you may prefer the support of a counsellor. Counselling can offer the space and time to talk through your feelings and overcome obstacles to your grieving. Allowing yourself time to experience your feelings is very important even if, at times, they are difficult. For many people their faith, prayer, meditation or going to church can be a great solace in times of loss. Support groups where you can share your sorrow with others who have experienced similar losses can be also be of tremendous help.

It is vitally important that you take care of yourself when you are grieving. You are coming to terms with a major upheaval in your life so give yourself permission to take things a bit easier. Your energy may be low, so do not place too many demands on yourself and make sure you get enough rest and sleep. It is important to look after your physical health by eating healthily and getting some exercise each day. Don't rush things and put off making major decisions such as moving home or changing jobs for at least six months to a year.

PLANNING TO BECOME PREGNANT-

GENERAL ADVICE BY DR MOLONEY

WHAT ABOUT FISH? In general, fish is a good source of protein and other nutrients. Aim to eat at least two portions of fish per week. However, there are some important exceptions. Some types of fish contain a high level of mercury which can damage the developing nervous system of an unborn baby.

- You should not eat any shark, marlin, or swordfish.
- Limit tuna eat no more than four medium-sized cans, or two fresh tuna steaks per week. Also, do not eat raw fish or uncooked shellfish (which may contain bacteria, viruses or parasites). Also, some types of fish may contain a small amount of chemicals from pollution. If you eat a lot of these fish, these chemicals may build up in your body over time, which may be harmful. Advice is that you should have no more than two portions a week of any of the following fish:
- Oily fish, including mackerel, sardines, salmon, trout and fresh tuna.
- Sea bream, sea bass, turbot, halibut, rock salmon.
- Brown crabmeat.

Some experts argue that the concern over toxic chemicals in fish is over-cautious and that the benefits of eating three or more portions of oily fish per week outweigh other risks. Further research may help to clarify this.


FOODS AND DRINKS TO AVOID: You should not eat the following if you are pregnant or trying to become pregnant:

- Anything with a lot of vitamin A. You need a small amount of vitamin A to keep healthy. However, large amounts can harm an unborn baby. So, avoid:
- Liver and liver products.
- Vitamin tablets or supplements which contain vitamin A.
- Food which may have high levels of listeria. This bacterium (germ) does not usually cause problems in people who are not pregnant. However, pregnant women are more likely to become infected with listeria, and it sometimes causes miscarriage, stillbirth, or infections in the baby after birth. Foods which are most at risk of carrying
- Undercooked meats and eggs. This may occur in some pre-cooked meats and preprepared meals. Make sure all meat foods are cooked until piping hot. Eggs should be cooked until the white and yolk are solid. Avoid foods that may contain raw eggs, such as some types of mayonnaise and mousse.
- Mould-ripened and soft cheeses such as brie, Camembert and blue-veined cheeses. (Hard cheeses and processed cottage cheese are safe.)
- Pâtés including vegetable pâtés. Raw shellfish and raw fish.
- Unpasteurised milk. Note: goat's milk is often unpasteurised, and goat's milk products such as cheeses are often made from unpasteurised milk.
- Certain fish (as described earlier).
- Limit the amount of caffeine to no more than 200 mg per day (2 mugs of coffee). Having a lot of caffeine increases your risk of having a miscarriage and a baby with low birthweight. The main sources of caffeine are coffee, tea, chocolate, and cola.



racing and technical sessions that we did for the past few days. We also did a number of Pilates classes with our team physiotherapist and we have completed two weightlifting sessions. The training programme consists of three 3 sessions' days with the fourth day being a lighter day with only two sessions per day including racing preparation and weight lifting.

The lake on which the team trains is located 2 minutes' walk from the Hotel and is surrounded by beautiful Alps. There are two 2,000m buoyed racing courses on the lake so we have many opportunities to practice some sideby-side racing and paddling. We are the only senior national rowing team here however, there is also a German Junior national rowing team training on the lake and some local Italian rowers. Early training sessions and spreading of training during the day ensures that the lake is not as busy and we have plenty of space on the water.

The weather was very nice for the first few days with sunshine however, the last day or two were overcast with snow and rain not leaving us for a minute. Regardless of the weather on the day, we had to go out rowing and cover the required distance. When the sun is out it is so much more enjoyable, I cannot wait to return here in April for another training camp.

So far, I have covered a lot of mileage in a variety of combinations and boats ranging from a single to a double to a pair. The Head Coach is experimenting with crew selection, which may perhaps mean changes in the coming season. Although only time will tell. Changes like that however keep things fresh and make us adjust and feel the rhythm of one another. It gels the team and challenges us at the same time.

In addition, I would like to thank Victoria Tierney from Nightout Ireland for sponsoring this training camp. Nightout Ireland paid my individual contribution of €300 to support me on the road to Rio.

LEGION GAA CLUB

WHERE ARE THEY NOW

This week the club catches up with Muckross man, Donald Burke who has been gone from Killarney for over 26 years. Its hard to imagine that he has been gone that long but it was in 1988, he tells me, that he left home with a new job offer in Jersey in the Channel Islands working in IT. Donald is one of three children born to parents John and Eileen, both of whom have sadly passed away, having a sister Mary [Farrell] and a brother Willie who also played for Legion. Donald was a keen sportsman in his Killarney days and it wasn't just football that he played as he was also big into rowing, shotputt, discus and soccer, where he lined out with Killarney Celtic. Donald was an ever present on Legion teams from 1973 as a 7 year old up to 1984 but success on the pitch for the most part eluded him and his team mates as youngsters until, after a few years of close calls, they finally won the U16 East Kerry Championship, a medal he still has in his possession today. Donald laughs as he looks back on his juvenile days playing football and says that its unbelievable, the changes that have occurred over the years, especially with regards to the facilities, as he remembers, that, in his time that you togged out under a tree in Knockreer and the only hope of a shower after the game was only if it happened to rain on the way home. You can tell by talking to Donald that he holds very fond memories of his club days and remembers the likes of Pa Doyle and Jim Trant as being true gentlemen and of being a great influence on him. Simple things, he says, that really stick out in his mind from those days was travelling to games in the back of some parents car along with friends Declan Murphy, Timmo Leary and Mikey Brien. He also remembers Diarmuid O' Donoghue as being the outstanding footballer of that era . Outside of the Gaa , Don recalls that the sports star of his early years in Killarney was when St Vincents basketball club signed one of their first American players, Cornell Bedford.

Having had his formal education in Vocational school Killarney and then furthering his studies in Information Technology in Tralee RTC, Don then began his working career and in 1988 headed for Jersey, where he stayed for three years and in 1991, he went back to Dublin, Knocklyon in south Dublin to be precise, where he still lives and works today. On returning to the capital, Don kept up his keen sporting interests and as well as playing football with Lucan Sarsfields and later Liffey Gaels, Don also took up marathon running and to this day, at 48 years of age, has ran the Dublin City Marathon

almost every year since his return, having also competed in an Ironman a couple of years ago, so all in all, still very active.

Tommys Farming Week

Its been a good week for farming Ireland. The significance of the opening of a beef trade with China cannot be overstated. When it was closed fifteen years ago it was an insignificant trader on the world stage. Today it is a \$50 billion industry and it is a growing market, if we described Europe and the US as mature then this market is in its infancy. The average person consumes only 5kgs of beef in the year and the availability of product is, at this stage, the limiting factor in individual consumption. By comparison the average "westerner" consumes about ten times that volume. I am in awe of prices reputedly paid for a kg of beef in China in recent times, as high as 300 euros for one kg are reported. Gone are the days of aiming at self sufficiency, Chinese businesses have been buying land in New Zealand and Australia in order to grow their own in recent years and the strategy now also includes preferred suppliers of safe food. This is where we come in.

The Irish beef industry has gone through a tough twenty years, ever since the arrival of BSE , a scandal never laid at the door of those truly responsible, it has been struggling to survive. Incomes were and still are derisory. The level of investment required to develop this business is enormous when compared to poultry or pork. Three years of investment to get one calf on the ground, another two to get it to market. Then the infrastructure required per animal makes it completely uneconomic to consider as a business model, but it has remained a traditional way of life. Its success is made possible only by the type of succession planning practised here in Ireland. Mom and Dad hand the farm over to boy or girl for nothing and everyone chips in free of charge to keep the show on the road. Over the years many fine slatted units were built, by off farm income, just to make the penance of inheritance a little less onerous. It is possible that we are about to see a renaissance of beef producer fortunes. If the Chinese market takes off then the suffocating link to poultry and pigs may be broken and beef will trade on its own merits. When we add in the US market, recently opened then the prospects for the next few years look decidedly good.

Still if recent experience teaches us anything, then it is that supply and demand on this small island of ours is the most important equation of all. The markets may be there but the processors of our product ultimately dictate the returns to Irish producers. Coveney and the IFA have achieved ground



farmers in recent months but that niggling doubt about investing further in an industry controlled by such a close group of individuals, will limit farmers euphoria about this breakthrough. The Chinese, we are told, have been looking for processing plants on the ground here in recent times, to no avail. That news, were they in a position to invest in facilities, would do more to inspire farmer confidence in expansion, than all the positive access stories in the world. It is a sad reflection on our biggest food industry but trust and conviction left the room a long time ago.

PEOPLE FEEL ABANDONED WITH REDUCTION OF SERVICES

The President of ICMSA has criticised the ending of several rural bus services and said resentment is building rapidly in rural areas at what he called the relentless and intensive stripping-out of services that had taken several decades to put in place. John Comer said that it was deeply ironic to hear so much concern and official commentary about the need for 'connectivity' and the supreme importance of retaining state control of access to and from Ireland while at the same time as a state transport agency simply announces - without a word of consultation or warning - that it is ending bus links to Dublin from several rural towns where that bus service was the only public transport option. "It's as if the State simply turns around to a whole community and announces 'there you go now lads, you're on your own from here onwards'. People feel abandoned. The need for 'Connectivity' doesn't end at city boundaries", said Mr Comer.

The ICMSA President said that it now seemed that rural populations were expected to sit quietly and simply accept the disappearance of their state transport facilities in the same way as their schools, post offices, Garda stations and district departmental and veterinary offices had already steadily

disappeared.

He said that aside from the inhibiting effect this policy was having on any prospect of economic investment it was hugely demoralising for the residents of rural communities to witness this ill-considered and shortsighted withdrawal of the State from swathes of the country and he urged the Government to re-commit to an Ireland based on some semblance of state services for all the people.

IRELAND IS A GROWTH MARKET FOR TRACTOR SALES'

The 9 series comprises four models from 270hp to 340 hp, utilising TTV continuously variable transmissions. Power is provided by Deutz TTCD 7.8L twin turbo six cylinder engines. These are compliant with Tier 4 final emission regulations and employ four valves per cylinder.

MINISTER MUST ACCEPT ALL FARMERS WHO APPLY FOR GLAS SCHEME & BROADEN GLAS+ ELIGIBILITY

IFA President Eddie Downey has welcomed the announcement from the Minister of Agriculture Simon Coveney that the new GLAS scheme has been opened. He said the Minister must ensure that all farmers applying to GLAS in 2015 are accepted into the scheme and that there is a significant payment to farmers this year. "IFA will be insisting that all farmers are allowed into the scheme and the rules and specifications must not debar any farmers from joining and maximising their payment."

IFA Rural Development Chairman Flor McCarthy said the GLAS+ extension to farmers with significant amounts of Natura land is welcome, but must be extended to all Natura land and not confined to those with endangered bird species. A significant amount of land is designated for other reasons such as flora and farmers must be encouraged to protect these areas. These include designated commonages and private Natura land.

The Rural Development Chairman also called for other aspects of the RDP to be implemented without delay. These include other schemes such as ANCs, Knowledge transfer, TAMS and the Beef Data and Genomics scheme which also form part of the €4bn Rural Development programme. "Early introduction is vital as all of these schemes play a vital role in supporting low income, helping farmers to achieve greater efficiency, supporting vital on-farm investment and helping support the suckler herd."

2015 DAIRY MARKETS TOO UNPREDICTABLE TO CALL – ARLA

Arla has said that 2015 dairy markets will be too unpredictable for it to announce any expectations for its revenue or performance price in 2015.

"The global dairy industry has never been as unpredictable as it is now, but we believe that our strategy is the right one to take us forward," said the CEO of Arla Foods, Peder Tuborgh.

He said Arla will continue to rigidly streamline and control costs, while investing significant sums in marketing and new products.

"Arla's ability to profitably handle larger milk volumes will define the success of the business in 2015."

Last year, it says, was a complex year for Arla. It reported that the farmerowned company achieved one of its best results ever in a market impacted by volatility and international

politics. A strong first half of the year produced recordhigh earnings, but the global market shifted the second half, reducing the farmer milk price significantly.

"Seldom has

business year been split in two so opposing halves. 2014 was a year that first saw strong economic tail winds in the global market that carried Arla into the summer with record-high milk prices for its cooperative farmers in Sweden, Denmark, Germany, the UK, Belgium, Luxembourg and the Netherlands.

"Then things changed. The tail winds became head winds as global supplies rapidly outstripped demand, Chinese consumption ebbed off, and inventories were full. Finally, when Russia imposed a ban on dairy products from the EU, the headwinds grew in strength."

Arla posted its highest-ever revenue of €10.6 billion, with much of it attributable to organic growth of

ANSWER TO LAST WEEKS RIDDLE

What invention lets most people look right through a wall? A Window.

KEEP YOUR SHOWER NATURALLY CLEAN

• Shower Doors - A good wipe-down with heated undiluted vinegar and a soft rag (which doesn't scratch acrylic or glass doors) will give them a whole new lease on life.

Apply a coating of vinegar, topped off with a generous sprinkle of baking powder, and leave to percolate overnight to the tracks the doors slide along, at the beginning it might take a couple of applications to get them really clean.

For routine maintenance, keep a spray bottle of vinegar mixed 1:1 with water in the bathroom and use it to spritz the shower doors occasionally. If you have the time and the inclination first thing in the morning, you can also use one of your rags to wipe off the water drops after your shower. Drape the cloth over a squeegee, if you like, to make your job easier.

- Shower Curtains To prevent the formation of mold and mildew on fabric shower curtains, keep your bathroom well ventilated and close the curtains after each use; otherwise, mold will tend to grow in their folds. Toss the shower curtains in your washing machine every six months or so. Then fill up the washer with used cleaning cloths or soiled towels. Add one-half cup vinegar to the rinse cycle and wash on the "hot" setting.
- Shower head Lime scale on your shower head not only looks ugly, but it can impede the flow of water, leaving you with an unsatisfying trickle. Saturate a rag with vinegar and wrap it tightly around the shower head, covering the spray holes completely. Leave on overnight to dissolve the mineral buildup.
- Taps Scale can affect shower taps as well, making them dull and dirty looking. Restore the gleam of chrome and nickel taps with a vinegar scrub. If they are very encrusted, use the overnight vinegar wrap described above. Clean the tap aerator by soaking in vinegar to cover for 30-60 minutes. Then wipe and replace.
- Mold on Shower Tiles and Grout Spray full-strength vinegar onto mold which affects grout and ceramic tiles. Leave for one hour, followed by a good hard scrub with a brush to thoroughly clean the tile. (Wear a breathing mask and rubber gloves for the task). Your tile grout may need resealing after this kind of treatment.

CAUTIONS -

- Avoid applying vinegar to any type of natural stone tile or counter top, such as marble, travertine, or granite, because the acid will etch — and ruin — the beautiful stone surface.
- Never, ever use bleach together with vinegar (or any other type of acid, for that matter). The mixture will produce toxic chlorine gas, which

is extremely dangerous to both human and pets respiratory system.

ARE THEY WORRIED ABOUT PEOPLE OR THE ECONOMY?

The number of new cases of Ebola has dropped from 1,000 a week, when the crisis was at its peak, to around a dozen a week today. But in Sierra Leone and Guinea, the World Health Organization reports that there are about 150 new Ebola cases a week and that there has been a slight uptick recently. Although health officials are optimistic that with continued diligence, the epidemic will be contained in 2015, the crisis is far from over. Ebola will be an economic concern long after its health effects have disappeared. The World Bank says Ebola will cost the three most-affected countries at least \$1.6 million in lost economic growth.

Everyday citizens in the region are already feeling the economic consequences. Food costs have rise - leaving many families without adequate nutrition. Tourism, agriculture and small businesses have all been affected. Schools closed during the height of the epidemic, and many children may not return because they will have to work to help their families survive. Approx 10,000 children have lost their parents to Ebola. Many of these children are Ebola survivors, and most have been exiled by their home communities. Orphans and their extended families and communities need support.

MYTHS AROUND DRUGS AND DRIVING CONTINUE TO THRIVE

Driving after using drugs can cause unwelcome side effects such as a shorter attention span, an altered perception of time and distance, and slow reaction times that impair the driver's ability to respond to sudden events in traffic. A University study found that smoking pot three hours before driving nearly doubled a driver's risk of having a motor vehicle crash. But there's a lot you can do to make a difference. Personally vow never to drive while under the influence. Make sure your friends and loved ones know that being impaired is the same whether they have been drinking alcohol or using drugs. If you have young drivers in your family, make sure they understand the laws, their obligations, and understand the risks. If you're under the influence of drugs or alcohol, don't get behind the wheel. Plan ahead if you're hosting a party or you're going out on the town and there's a likelihood that you will be consuming alcohol or drugs or you will be around people who will. If you're a parent, make sure your child knows that no matter what they can call you for a safe ride home. Have a designated driver who doesn't consume or ensure you have taxi numbers on you. If you're hosting a party, arrange transportation or even offer a bed up for the night to your guests.

A woman with a heart condition who lost consciousness outside on a freezing morning was found in time to be saved — all because of one devoted dog named John Boy.

Police officer Jeff Gonzalez was driving in a German town, Wisconsin, neighbourhood recently when he was approached by John Boy wandering alone along the snow-lined streets. After Officer Gonzalez stopped his patrol car, the dog began to bark and wag his tail, prompting the officer to get out of the vehicle, and then he ran a little bit, John Boy led Officer Gonzalez to the front porch of his home, where the officer found the black Labrador's human companion unresponsive on the porch. Fortunately, the woman was still breathing and, thanks to her dog, was found in time to get the medical attention she needed.

THE HOOTING HAT THIEF

In the past few months, several people have reported being walloped from above in Bush's Pasture Park, Salem Oregon by a winged perpetrator. Two joggers had their hats stolen. The perpetrator is likely a barred owl weighing between 1 and 2 pounds and standing 16 to 20 inches in height. However, s/he has not been identified in a lineup.

None of the joggers were seriously injured, though the first victim initially believed himself to have been struck by lightning.

BARGAIN 0F THE **CENTUARY?**



The Lockheed Martin-built Sea Slice is an experimental United States Navy vessel, launched in 1996, and has a uniquely modified hull design called SWATH (Small Waterplane Area Twin Hull design).

The unique hull design allows it to remain super stable even in 12-foot waves and allows it to cruise at a much higher speed than a conventional ship of its size.

This 32 meter (105 ft) long, 17 meter (55 ft) wide, 180 ton ship is powered by two 3,480 hp diesel engines and two 180-kW Caterpillar diesel electric generators.

Sea Slice's wide and stable top is suitable for entertaining guests on board. It has 12 single berths, six cabins, a full galley, and bathroom. The top speed of this vessel is 30 knots (35 mph). This experimental naval vessel is now being offered to private parties. Sea slice originally cost about \$15 million, but it can now be yours for an amazingly rock-bottom price of just \$180,000.

DID YOU KNOW

Indigenous communities in South America have long experienced devastating impacts from contact with Western society. In the Sixteenth Century, European colonists brought slavery, war, and violence, but disease proved the most devastating. In all, European contact destroyed over 95% of the native population. The Brazilian Amazon contains the largest number of uncontacted tribes, with 23 confirmed groups and 47 potential locations of uncontacted communities. It is the Brazilian government's policy to avoid contact with these tribes unless they face extreme risk of survival. However, many of these communities are surrounded by the soybean or cattle industry, or are under assault from illegal loggers and miners.

In the summer of 2014, an uncontacted tribe approached a group of Brazilian government officials - the first contact with an isolated

Amazonian tribe in 20 years, to seek help to defend against illegal loggers and drug traffickers. However, recent research suggests there is hope for the remaining uncontacted indigenous peoples, based on a long-term demographic study that showed positive growth rates for indigenous communities after the initial fallout from contact.

Despite the ability of some groups to rebound quickly, there is uncertainty about the longterm impacts on their communities in a rapidly changing Amazon. Today, indigenous tribes face threats beyond disease, including deforestation, dam and road development, breakdown of community networks, and the loss of cultural knowledge.

Know Your Rights: BACK TO WORK FAMILY DIVIDEND

FEBRUARY 2015

QUESTION

I am unemployed, married with three children and getting Jobseeker's Allowance. I would like to get back to work. I have heard there is a new payment to help with this situation.

ANSWER

The Back to Work Family Dividend (BTWFD) gives financial support to people with children who were getting jobseeker's or one-parent family payments and who either take up employment, increase their hours of employment or become self-employed.

The scheme is not yet operational but applications for the scheme are being accepted from 5 January 2015. No payments will be made until April 2015 and all eligible claims will be backdated to the date of application.

If you qualify for the scheme you will get a weekly payment for up to 2 years. You will be paid the equivalent of any Increases for Qualified Children that were being paid on your jobseeker or one-parent family payment (up to a maximum of 4 children) for the first year in employment. Half of that amount will be paid weekly for the second year.

You can combine time on a jobseeker's payment with time spent on education, training or employment schemes to meet the eligibility requirements.


To qualify, you and all members of your family (including your adult dependant) must sign off all social welfare payments. The Back to Work Family Dividend cannot be paid with any other primary social welfare payment - with the exception of Child Benefit, Domiciliary Care Allowance and Family Income Supplement (FIS). The Back to Work Family Dividend is not taken into account in the means test for FIS.

You can contact your Intreo centre or local social welfare office to get more information on the scheme.
