



The walk raised €41,000 last year. Everybody is welcome to the launch.



Funding for River Flesk

anny Healy Rae TD and Cllr. Maura Healy Rae acknowledge the announcement by Charlie O'Sullivan, Kerry Co Council, that an application has been lodged to the Department for funding to clear some of the Flesk River down as far as Curreal Bridge,

"We are now very concerned for the people of Curreal and surrounding areas that this application does not include clearing of the river from Curreal Bridge down to Gortahoosh Bridge, as many Residents now feel that their homes will become under severe pressure if this job is only half done, if the river is not cleared from Curreal to Gortahoosh it means the flood will back up faster and will flood the people of Curreal and Glenflesk Village away worse than ever before", they told the Killarney Outlook.

"We have been fighting continuously for this for a number of years in every way open and available to us ie deputations, motions, written and verbal requests and we will settle for nothing less than for all of the river to be cleared down as far as Gortahoosh, in fact we have already been on to Kerry Co Council Officials today requesting them to lodge a second application urgently to clear all of this river down as far as Gortahoosh"", Maura added.

Lucky Kerry folk win over €600,000 with Prize Bonds in 2017



erry residents are among the luckiest holders of Prize Bonds, having won more than €600,000 in prizes last year. This is according to The Prize Bond Company DAC, which administers Prize Bonds on behalf of the National Treasury Management Agency, and which has published its 2017 Annual Report.

Kerry's total winnings were €606,850, with 10,625 prizes won in the county. Other cash prizes awarded each week include prizes to the value of €1,000, €500 and €50.

HAY FEVER (SEASONAL ALLERGIC RHINITIS) IS AN ALLERGIC DISORDER

For a person with an allergy to pollen, when pollen comes into contact with the nose, eyes, mouth or throat, their body produces an antibody to attack the pollen.

Hay fever symptoms

Hay fever symptoms can be similar to a cold. Generally hay fever symptoms include one or more of the following:

- Rhinorrhoea (runny nose).

This is often clear and watery.

- Nasal itching and nasal congestion which in more severe cases may result in headache or perhaps earache.

- 5. If you have indoor allergy triggers, try to keep your house clean and well ventilated to reduce exposure to dust and moulds.



coming weeks.

'This Family Fun Walk on 7th May is aimed to promoting the very significant Killaclohane Portal Tomb and getting kids and their families, and anyone else that wants to join in, to walk the mile or so from the village to the tomb and back,' PRO of Fleadh Cheoil Chiarraí, Chris Horan, told the Killarney Outlook.

'We have adopted the image of the tomb as our official logo for the Fleadh and we have themed the festival 'Reconnecting with the Past' with the portal tomb forming an important part of the Fleadh programme on 21st June. 'So on Bank Holiday Monday, anyone and everyone who fancies a stroll is invited to join the walk and to make a small contribution towards the running costs of the Fleadh.

'Walkers should assemble at the Nagle-Rice Community Centre from 10am and hand in their sponsorship cards or simply make a small contribution if they wish. The walk will set off at about 10.30am and there will be refreshments for everyone after. All the sponsorship cards will be put into a hat for a raffle for a few spot prizes,' Chris added.

Inform and invite the whole school community to participate in the ASF process


Self-evaluate current provision in terms of PE, physical activity and community links



Good time management and smart study will pay dividends at the State Exams

The 2018 state exams begin on Wednesday, 6th June so it's vital to make good use of the remaining six weeks. Manage your revision efficiently and sharpen your exam techniques. Concentrate on a final revision of your course material and practice answering past exam papers. Be organised in your revision plan. Set down priorities in the subject areas, which you intend to revise. Be patient and methodical in your routine. Don't be over ambitious in your revision planning. Take a self-contained manageable unit of work in a revision session. Cramming – extended revision sessions with too much content – is the least effective way to prepare for exams.

When answering past exam papers simulate exam conditions as far as possible. Using A4 paper, try to answer within the time allowed for each question. Accurately number each question and part of question. Ensure that your handwriting is legible, that your diagrams are detailed and that your presentation is neat.

Attend school each day up to the end of term as your best work is done under the expertise of your teachers, who will guide you through revision and exam techniques. Be familiar with the format of each exam paper. Be aware of the style of questions and the topics examined in each paper. Know how the marks for each paper are allocated and how much time should be spent on each question.

As the final weeks are for revision and for answering past exam papers, avoid studying new unfamiliar material, if possible. If you have missed out on some part of the course, give that topic immediate priority. Study the topic, revise the topic and consolidate it by answering past exam questions based on it. The alternative is

to omit that topic completely. In summary, an intensive revision period is the best prescription for effective exam preparation.

Efficient management of your home study is vital. A regular routine is essential. Study for about four hours on each of the five weekday nights. Two sessions of about two hours each with a half-hour break in between will result in good quality work. Aim to do seven or eight hours of revision spread over Saturday and Sunday. Prepare a daily, weekly and full term study schedule. Review your progress at the end of each week. Be disciplined and organised in your approach to study. Stick to your routine and to your study schedule. Use short breaks between subjects. Avoid unscheduled breaks and beware of "time thieves" such as excessive TV watching and long telephone calls.

Good working conditions are vital aids to effective study. A comfortable study environment at home is essential. If possible, study on your own where you will have peace and quietness. A comfortable room temperature, neither too hot nor too cold, is an aid to concentration. You need a table or desk on which to write and a hard-backed chair on which to sit. Good lighting keeps you from getting tired. A desk lamp, if available, is a useful aid to mental application. Your total focus must be on your work, so don't allow yourself to be distracted.

Use a reward system to reinforce your progress and to maintain your momentum. The aim of doing well in your exam is your greatest motivator but also build in a few treats. After an evening of study, your reward might be a favourite television programme or listening to some music. At the weekend, treat yourself to a film, a swim in the local leisure complex or an

Irish League of Credit Unions Holds AGM in Killarney

The Annual General Meeting of the Irish League of Credit Unions (ILCU) takes place in Killarney this weekend (April 28th and 29th). Representatives from credit unions across Ireland will discuss how services can be further enhanced for their 3.6 million members, and lending will be a key discussion topic. In 2017, lending continued apace across credit unions in the Republic of Ireland, with 540,000 loans issued.

Loans were issued for reasons such as home improvement, third level education, holidays, weddings and car purchases amongst others. Loans to members now stand at almost €4 billion (accurate to end September 2017). Credit unions continue to be a trusted provider of affordable credit to the local communities they serve, largely because they exist to serve their members and not to profit from their needs.

The 2018 AGM was organised in conjunction with Chapter 23 - (which represents credit unions in Co Kerry and West Limerick). The credit unions represented by the Chapter have combined assets of €540 million. Membership across these credit unions has now reached over 118,000, and they have €234 million available to lend to the communities they serve. Another central point of focus at AGM will be progress on the new, centralised mortgage solution which is due to be piloted in the coming weeks. This has been developed by the ILCU and its credit unions in direct response to demand from members. This standardised mortgage solution will assist credit unions with the heavy administrative and regulatory requirements associated with the processing and fulfilment of residential mortgages, based on a standardised, consistent reliable methodology.

A special discussion panel to celebrate the 60th Anniversary of the Irish credit union movement will also take place at AGM. The panel will focus on the movement's many achievements and successes throughout the years. Commenting on this, ILCU President, Charles Murphy said; "It is entirely fitting that we are holding AGM

in Killarney this year, so close to Ballydesmond, the birthplace of Nora Herlihy - one of the key founders of the Irish credit union movement. Marking this important milestone near the townland where she grew up adds a very special air to the proceedings. Throughout the 60 years of its existence, the credit union movement has not been without its trials and tribulations. Credit unions have always weathered the storm however and will continue to be cornerstones of the local communities they are so proud to serve."

Also speaking ahead of the upcoming AGM, Chapter 23 spokesperson, John O'Regan said "While there has been very positive growth on the lending front, credit unions are in no way complacent about this. At AGM, a focal point of discussions will be the enhancement and diversification of lending for the years ahead. In Co Kerry, credit unions are a vital financial provider and also much more - they are deeply rooted in the local communities they serve. Local clubs, organisations, charities

and initiatives have benefitted from their credit union's financial support. Through these activities and supports, credit unions have forged strong bonds with their valued members. The best interests of our valued members will be at the fore of our minds during discussions at AGM, and they will always be at the fore of every decision taken for the future path of credit unions."

Another extremely positive point of focus at AGM will be the recent introduction of additional investment classes for credit unions to facilitate their investment in Approved Housing Bodies. Commenting on this, Mr Murphy said: "The ILCU has long campaigned for a review of the restrictive investment regulations on credit unions, and this year we welcomed the decision by the Central Bank of Ireland to introduce additional investment classes, paving the way for credit unions to provide significant funding to support the development of critically needed social housing in this country."

Access group issue plea

Killarney Access Group are appealing to allmotorists to refrain from parking in the Disabled Parking Bays which are provided throughout the town unless they are genuine holders of the Disabled Persons Parking Permit. If you decide to use yourrelatives Disabled Persons Parking Permit when they are not with you, they will run the risk of having their permit cancelled and you will also face a €150 fine. Please remember that Disabled Parking Bays are specifically provided in convenient accessible locations for people with disabilities to enable them to remain independent and mobile. If you park in or block a Disabled Parking Space and do not

have a Disabled Parking Permit or are using a permit illegally you should reflect on your behaviour and move on. Your ignorance causes great distress to those that need convenient parking the most. Disabled Persons Parking Permits are only issued to persons who have a permanent condition or disability that severely restricts his or her ability to walk. Permits are issued to eligible persons whether drivers or passengers. These permits allow holders to park in Disabled Parking Bays. Only a vehicle displaying a Disabled Person's Parking Permit is allowed park in a disabled person's parking bay and the permit holder must be availing of this parking facility.

Motorcyclists Urged to Bike Safe This Summer

- 168 motorcyclists have been killed and 629 seriously injured since 2010
- Summer is high risk for motorcyclists, especially Saturday and Sunday
- Approved PPE, high visibility clothing and 'ease off the throttle'
- Drivers need to look and look again for motorcyclists

The Road Safety Authority (RSA) and An Garda Síochána are appealing to motorcycle riders to 'Bike Safe' as the risk to riders' safety is set to increase over the summer months.

An examination of forensic collision investigation files published in 2016 by the RSA found that almost a third of motorcyclists involved in fatal collisions between 2008 and 2012 had consumed alcohol and that bikers speeding was a factor is almost half of all motorcyclist deaths.

While the majority of motorcycle riders are absolutely aware of their vulnerability when biking, some motorcyclists may not be so safety conscious. Younger riders on powerful machines need to appreciate the risk they face and take all necessary precautions to ensure their safety. The RSA study also found that half of the 80 motorcyclists deemed culpable for the collision were aged between 25 and 34 years old.

The message from the RSA and Gardai to these bikers is to never drink drive. You simply cannot control a motorbike if you are impaired from drinking alcohol. They are also being urged to ease off the throttle and keep within the speed limits.

Mr. Shane Ross, Minister for Transport, Tourism and Sport, "Motorcycle riding is fun and challenging yet it requires very high levels of knowledge, skill, and understanding. A good motorcycle rider needs to have a healthy respect for the motorcycle they are riding and always demonstrate a socially responsible attitude. This way they can ensure their safety



on the road. It's also important for drivers to be on the lookout for motorcyclists especially in their blind spots when turning, overtaking and at junctions."

Ms Moyagh Murdock, Chief Executive, RSA, said "I want to thank the majority of bikers who are behaving responsibly on the road. However, there is a group who are riding motorbikes with no regard for their personal safety or the safety of others, and this is shown clearly following our examination of forensic investigation files of fatal collisions involving motorcyclists. Bikers who think it is ok to drink and or speed on the public road need to realise that you are giving all bikers a bad name. If you are not going to change your reckless behaviour then I would appeal for you to do it for the sake of your family and loved ones."

Chief Superintendent Finbarr Murphy, Garda National Roads Policing Bureau said that "Motorcyclists are among our most vulnerable of road users because they have very little protection in the event of a crash. You can help reduce this vulnerability by taking some very simple steps. Wear the appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and high visibility clothing to make yourself visible to other roadusers plus ride with your dipped headlight on. Show restraint and reduce your speed,

and never ever ride impaired. Over the coming months An Garda Síochána will engage with motorcyclists and use a mixture of educational and

enforcement measures to reduce motorcycling casualties"

Chief Superintendent Murphy continued "This is not only a safety message for motorcyclists. Drivers need to look and look again for that motorcycle, especially when overtaking or turning right".

Road users are also being urged to take extra care over the May Bank Holiday Weekend as figures show that three people died over the May Bank Holiday in 2017

The room the children were using at"Tig Roisin"was needed for other services. The parents got together to form a committee to set up a standalone After School Service for their children.

Since October 2015 Resilience Care have come on board to take care of the day to day running of the service as they have the compliance (expertise and policies and procedures) required to run a professional service. Summer camps, Easter camps, Mid-term camps Halloween and Christmas camps are run. The majority of our children come from St Francis Special School Beaufort from where they are collected daily at 2.30 pm and brought here to Home from Home. One day a week 4 of our group are taken home to Bonane/Kenmare as they all come this long distance and they all attend on this day. We have the support of Kerry County Childcare, the HSE, Pobal and South Kerry Development Partnership without them we would not be able to stay open.

The time spent by the children at Home from


Home give the parents the rest assurance that their children are looked after. They get some welldeserved rest/respite and quality time with their other children. " By having our children at Home from Home it gives families an opportunity to do activities that others may take for granted be that shopping, cooking, cleaning, assisting other siblings at homework etc. "(parent statement) Can you help? We need your support, every year we try to better our services to ensure our children have everything they need to develop. Our future plans for the service are to install a lift to utilise all the building, to its maximise potential. There is also a plan to build a covered area in our back garden to be able to get out in all weathers. As our children are in school all day the extra time in the fresh air makes a welcome change. Ireland's Greatest Cycling Experience gets underway

The Wild Atlantic Way Cycle Sportif 2018 spring event kicked off this week in Kinsale, West Cork. A joint initiative between Fáilte Ireland and cycling specialists, Ride Wild, the bi-annual cycling event includes 16 stages covering 2,152 kilometres of coast along the magnificent Wild Atlantic Way, finishing on the 8th May in the village of Muff in Co. Donegal.

Launched in September 2017, the Wild Atlantic Way Cycle Sportif isdesigned to promote the Wild Atlantic Way as a premium cycling destination for both national and international cyclists with events taking place in April/May and September. Ireland's only fully supported, multi stage cycling event, up to 100 cyclists are taking part in each stage of the spring sportif.

"Following the success of our inaugural ride in September last year, we're delighted to see so many cyclists here today from all over the world for the Wild Atlantic Way Cycle Sportif. Cycling has great potential for tourism - research indicates that the average cycling tourist spends an average of five nights attending a sportif event. This Fáilte Ireland initiative was created to attract cyclists along the full length of the route during spring and autumn in a bid to spread tourism across the region and grow tourism in the 'shoulder seasons' each side of summer",

Fiona Monaghan, Head of Activities, said: Nearly 400 official cycling sportifs take place in Ireland each year - along with many more local events - and the number of events is growing each year. In the UK alone, over two million

adults cycle at least once a week and sales of high-quality road bikes grew 24% in 2017. The location of a sportif is a key driver for this type of visitor and research has revealed that 81% of potential sports tourists would identify the Wild Atlantic Way as having a strong (45%) or very strong (36%) appeal for them. It is estimated that the Wild Atlantic Way Cycle Sporitf could generate over €13m and up to 50,000 bed nights.

Organised by Ride Wild, everything from overnight accommodation and meals to road side support is taken care of for participants. Ride Wild's Cycling Director, Michael O'Boyle,

"Our priority is to provide a first-class experience and this event is the perfect opportunity for cyclists to see the beauty of the Wild Atlantic Way on a fully-supported, multi-day cycling tour. The route stages were designed by cyclists for cyclists and the combination of stunning scenery, the remote wildness of the west coast and the characters you meet along the way makes this event very special."

Participants in the Wild Atlantic Way Cycle Sportif spring event will have the option of covering the full distance over a set number of days, completing a stage of the event over a multi-day section of the route or joining the event for a single day.

DATA PROTECTION AND ITS IMPACT ON THE GAA

The laws relating to data protection come into effect on the 25th May 2018. Considering that the sanctions are quite substantial fines, it's extremely important to comply and have measures in place for the new data protection regulations. Like other organisations the GAA club will be required to implement the appropriate organisational measures in relation to how we handle, store and process personal data for our members. These laws relate to any Personally Identifiable Information (PII) – that's any information



that can be used to identify any individual e.g. name, email address, phone number. For clubs some examples of this type of data can be member registration details, lotto ticket sales, photographs, facility bookings etc. Kerry County Board will be holding a special meeting to help the Kerry clubs get started in the area of data protection. In the meantime, we would advise clubs to appoint a Data Protection Officer, think about how you store your data and try to identify risks of data breach.

GREEN RIBBON CAMPAIGN

Kerry GAA is encouraging club members to 'Wear the Green Ribbon this May to end Mental Health Stigma in Kerry'. Green Ribbons were given to Club Delegates at the County Committee meeting last Monday night and additional Green Ribbons will be distributed to clubs over the coming week. The Green Ribbon campaign aims to get people talking openly about common mental health problems.

To support the Green Ribbon campaign this May in your club, encourage all club members, team Mentors, coaches, club officers etc. to wear the Green Ribbon and to use social media accounts and photographs to spread the word. Distributing a green ribbon to people attending games would have a huge impact in getting the conversation going as would including information on the Green Ribbon campaign in match programmes.

6 BEAUTY USES FOR VASELINE:

Upon rushing to her window, she saw 10 people crying for help from the third story as smoke billowed from the windows of the lower floors.

Ms. Verma initially threw one end of her sari to the workers so that they could climb from the window down to the safety of her terrace. Because they were too afraid to risk the 15-foot distance, one man jumped onto her terrace from the window of the factory.

Not wanting anyone else to injure themselves by jumping, Ms. Verma rushed inside to find something more useful. In the midst of her apartment, she found a small bamboo ladder. With the help of a neighbour, Ms. Verma propped up the ladder onto the roof of her terrace so that it stretched across to the factory window. Over the course of the next half hour, twenty workers were able to crawl to safety.

According to one of the workers, the owner of the illegal factory locks the gates to the building every night in order to prevent theft. If it had not been for Ms. Verma's heroic ingenuity, the employees may not have been able to escape.

EXOTIC PET AUCTIONS IN THE U.S

When most people think of animals designated as pets, dogs and cats come to mind, but for some others, exotic animals also fall into this category. Although you might think that obtaining an animal like a tiger or lion would be a difficult task, it is shockingly easy to do in the U.S. In fact, there are currently more tigers in American backyards than the wild.

It's apparent to most that the exotic pet epidemic is a growing problem for wild animals of all sizes. No matter how large the enclosure, nothing can compare to the wild — not to mention the fact that exotic pet owners aren't even required to have a special certification or knowledge that would qualify them to care for a wild animal.

While the exotic pet trade continues to flourish (a billion dollar trade in the United States alone), we've seen an increase in the number of exotic pets being abandoned and released. To combat this influx of abandoned exotic pets, certain states have even enacted exotic pet "amnesty" programmes that allow residents to surrender their pets. Since Exotic Pet Amnesty Day was established in Florida, more than 2,000 exotic pets have been surrendered.

The variety of exotic animals available at auctions ranges from gazelles, giraffes and zebras to big cats and primates for sale. Depending on the species, some animals are bred in captivity, others are captured from the wild, and many are smuggled into the states. Regardless of where the animals began, they all have ties to the illegal wildlife trade. More often than not, the animals sold at the auctions are brought in by dealers, and the owner of the auction simply takes a commission on each animal sold.



Know Your Rights: RENEWING A PASSPORT

OUESTION

How do I check if I can vote in the forthcoming referendum? If I'm not in Ireland on polling day, can I still vote?

ANSWER

To vote in a referendum, you must be an Irish citizen and be registered to vote. Every local authority is responsible for compiling and publishing a list of voters in its area. This is called the Register of Electors or the electoral register.

In general, Irish citizens living abroad cannot be entered on the Register of Electors and cannot vote in a referendum. The only exception to this is in the case of Irish officials on duty abroad (and their spouses) who may register on the postal voters list. If you are abroad on holiday on polling day, you cannot have a postal vote.

The current Register of Electors came into force on 15 February 2018. You can check if you are on the register at checktheregister.ie or at your local authority, Garda station, post office or public library.

If you are not on the register, you can apply to be added to the supplement to the register. You use Form RFA2, which is available online at checktheregister.ie or from your local authority, post office or public library. To be included in the supplement used at an election or referendum, your local authority must receive your application at least 15 days before polling day. Sundays, public holidays and Good Friday are not counted as days for this purpose.

Local authorities prepare a postal voters list as part of the electoral register. You can only apply for registration as a postal voter if you cannot vote at a polling station because of illness or disability, your occupation, being in prison, or if you are studying full-time in Ireland but away from the address where you are registered to vote.

You can apply to be added to the supplement to the postal voters list up to 22 days (excluding Sundays and public holidays) before polling day in a referendum. The application form for inclusion in the supplement to the postal voters list is available from your local authority or online at checktheregister.ie.

SELF ESTEEM I

Self-esteem is determined by how much we value ourselves, and tends to develop from early childhood right into our



adult years. Healthy self-esteem is maintained when we achieve a good balance between feeling capable while also feeling loved. Self-judgement or the judgement of others can trigger low self-esteem. Negative self-talk such as 'I'm no good', 'I'll never succeed', 'nobody like me' can all contribute to our low self-esteem. The more we use this negative self-talk the more we begin to believe its fact.

There are many ways in which we can raise our self-esteem and begin to feel better about ourselves. These include

Positive Self-Talk: Why not change the way you talk to yourself by giving yourself positive statements. Replace the negative thoughts with something positive and create positive affirmations. Look at what you do well or what is working in your life and begin to 'change the recording' in your mind to incorporate these.

Positive Self-Care: When we begin to take care of ourselves we begin to feel good about ourselves. This involves eating healthier food and cutting out and junk. Exercise is also vital to help us feel good about ourselves and feel energised. Talk a walk, run, cycle or dance; do whatever feels good for you.

Do things you enjoy: What do you love to do? Make a list and ensure that you do at least one pleasurable activity each day.

Remember your Success: Look at past successes you have had and draw from these. Reflect on an achievement or a challenge you overcame. Be sure to give yourself credit for this and remember, if you did it once, you can do it again.

Spend time with good people: Be sure to spend time with people who treat you well and try to avoid negative people who put you down.

Don't compare: Comparing ourselves to others can really dent our self-esteem. Instead of focusing on the success of others – we need to focus on ourselves and what we can do better. Comparing ourselves will only bring us down.

Take small steps: Set small achievable goals so you can see your success as it unfolds. This will result in feeling more successful and confident and lead on to greater accomplishments.

Be prepared for setbacks; they are part and parcel of life. However, the way in which we deal with a setback can greatly impact our self-esteem. If you are unable to achieve a goal, try again or change tactic.

A WORD OF VICTORY

Welcome back dear reader "the Lord is like a Father to His children, tender and compassionate to those who fear Him. He knows how weak we are...that we are only dust." (Psalm 103:13) This revelation of the character of our Heavenly Father is different from what I imagined before I got to know Him through the Bible. I had pictured an angry old guy with a stick ready to give me a whack of it anytime He liked. This is what religion does — it removes the relationship and love of the Father, and replaces it with distance, ritual and formality with no heart connection involved. In the story that Jesus told of the prodigal son we see the Father's heart revealed further. (He relayed this parable in Luke chapter 15 because the religious leaders were chastising Him for ministering to 'notorious sinners' whom they considered 'undesirable'). The younger son wanted to taste life for himself (like many of us when we were younger - thinking we knew it all!) and the Father let him go. He did not follow him but His heart yearned for his son to return. The son meanwhile, lived it up for a while, indulged in sin and wild living that cost him everything. He was reduced to lack, depravation, loneliness and isolation. Sound familiar? When we choose to walk away from the Lord we expose ourselves to evil and every kind of destruction. The enemy is cute — he waits for people to come out from under the protection of the Lord as they decide they don't need God's input, but this is the most dangerous place to end up. The son in this parable came to his senses and repented in his heart before he even set out on the journey home — he was prepared for condemnation and shame, but did not get that from the Father. Instead, he found his Father had been waiting, longing to have him back and poured His love on him and celebrated his return and restored his position as His cherished child. Jesus told this story to illustrate that God the Father never forgets any one of His children. Jesus said if you want to inherit the Kingdom of God you must become as a little child. (Mathew 18:3; John 14:6) Little children are trusting and believe God's goodness. They love to snuggle up with their parents, safe and secure - it's the best place in the world. Friend, your Heavenly Father is yearning for you to come to that place of restoration to Him safe in His outstretched arms, under the shadow of His wings (Psalm 91:1-4).
