### A LOOK AT THE POLICING HERITAGE OF THE QUIRKE FAMILY

A member of An Garda Siochana, based in Killarney has a family history chronicled in the Spring 2022 edition of the Garda magazine "Siochana - celebrating 100 Years of An Garda Siochana -Capturing Our History". Detective Sergeant

Michael Quirke is the

nephew of Supt. Eddie



Police Chief Edward Quirke

Quirke and the son of Lou and Pat Quirke from Listry.

Supt. Eddie Quirke took on the task of researching the career of his granduncle Edward J Quirke, Commander of the Yonkers Police Department from 1926-1940.

During his research he came across a citation which depicted the life and times of the Killarney born member of the Police Force, who was born in Killarney on 5 May 1878 and emigrated to the United States with just a Primary School Education and would go to achieve the highest honour of Chief of Police. At just 20 years of age Edward Quirke became a naturalised citizen and joined the Police Force in 1905.

He quickly rose through the ranks, becoming a Sergeant in 1909, and was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant in 1914. From there, he was promoted from Detective Commander to Captain in 1921. During his career he is reported to have had huge success in ridding the city of several hold up gangs and burglars, all of whom ended up in the infamous Sing-Sing Prison.

In September 1926, Captain Edward J. Quirke was elevated to the position of Police Chief of the Yonkers Police Department, where he was responsible for setting up a modern radio

system and ensuring that all prohibition laws were adhered to.

On October 23, 1940, Captain Quirke suffered a stroke while driving home and passed away the following week. More than 500 uniform policemen turned out to honour their chief, led by 75 motorcycles from different divisions in the city of New York.

His career demonstrated the indomitable spirit and courage of the young Irish immigrant to succeed in the face of adversity in the challenging environment of New York City in the early days of the 20th Century, making a significant contribution to policing and law enforcement in his new environment.

Chief Edward Quirke was a granduncle of Supt Eddie Quirke who retired in 2006 from Kevin Street and was a great granuncle of Detective Sergeant Michael Quirke who is currently serving in Killarney, the same town where Chief Quirke emigrated from in 1898, thus completing the full circle of the Quirke Policing Heritage of over 100 years.

#### t. Brendans Killarney have won the most Corn Uí Mhuirí titles of Jany school in Munster, 23 and counting. This year's title can stand beside any of them - that was a team that really had to grow along the way.

Kerry's O'Sullivan Cup is always a strong indicator of Corn Uí Mhuirí form. With twin terrors team captain Cian McMahon and Will Shine in sparkling form, the Sem saw off an understrength Killorglin by 3-23 to 1-10 to get their campaign off to a flying start. Then they came a real cropper as Colaiste na Sceilge beat them by 1-14 to 3-6 in the semi-final. That one certainly jolted any confidence, as they watched the reigning Corn Uí Mhuirí champions Tralee CBS go on to beat na Sceilge in a cracking Kerry Final.

That only whetted the appetite for the Corn Uí Mhuirí. All eyes were on the big two from Kerry, and both obliged with big early wins. The Sem put Clonmel to the sword by 5-13 to 0-4 – you couldn't read too much into it, as the Tipperary school were simply outclassed. Their second group game did them no favours either - again Killorglin were mising some key bodies and went down by 0-20 to 0-2.

That put them into a quarter-final, with Coláiste na sceilge coming out of the hat. The Cahirsiveen school rapidly proved that their earlier result was no fluke. They gave the Sem a very tough hour of it before Kevin Cronin's charges emerged victorious on a 2-8 to 2-7 scoreline. In hindsight, that hard battle may have been the making of the Sem, as they proved for the first time that they could dig deep on the hard days.

The semi-final against Bandon looked done and dusted at half-time, with the Sem leading by 1-9 to 0-3, Cian McMahon with a great goal. It was 1-14 to 0-4 after forty four minutes. Then Bandon shook off their torpor and both teams produced the best spell of football in the whole competition. It was genuinely electrifying....and frightening, as Bandon inexorably whittled that lead down to nothing. In fact, it took a stunning point from John Kelliher to bring the Sem back to parity. Extra-time. Thankfully, the Sem had cool heads and prevailed in extra-time.

In the circumstances, it was no surprise to see the Green go into the final as favourites. They had great players on board, lads who will be seen in Kerry jerseys before too long.

But the Sem produced one of the all-time great performances. Will Shine was unquestioably man of the match, with a whopping nine points to his name - he teased and tormented his markers all through. But it was the overall team display, especially the heart and hunger in the relentlessly hunting and harrying, that saw the Sem lead almost all though and eentually win out on a 0-17 to 0-12 scoreline.

The Sem went on to win another thriller against St. Marys Magherafelt in the Hogan semi-final but bowed out in the final itself to a magnificent Naas CBS. However, each and every one of them can hold their heads high and will always have the precious heirloom of a corn Uí Mhuirí medal to remind of their achievements this year and to spur them on in future in both life and football.

# At's the talk of the town... With Anne Lucey

Anne Lucey looks at the positive news happening in the town of Killarney

#### **BLOWING AGAINST THE WIND**

June 16th is the deadline for the submissions on the changes proposed to the draft county development plan - the most controversial of which is wind.

The area east of Killarney and north to Scartaglin /Castleisland has half of all the wind farm output in Kerry which itself has more megawatts per square metre than most European countries, an astonishing fact.

More in hope than expectation, the councillors have now proposed ignoring the office of the planning regulator who wants more of Kerry to be open to turbines to meet national targets. Instead they have told the regulator the county is full apart from an area along Kilgarvan to the Clydagh valley.

In an area Stretching from Castleisland to Killarney including Currow, Cordal and the outskirts of Killarney there is a huge concentration. You can see this quite clearly from the sky over Kerry Airport.

Senior planner Damien Ginty's reply to the planning regulator told how Kerry has "the largest number" of installed wind turbines and installed megawatt output of all counties.. To date there are 364 wind turbines in Kerry - notwithstanding the renowned and protected landscape. And there are still a lot of wind turbines with planning

The problem is the cumulative effect, Damien says. ( Anyone can see the huge concentration from the sky over Kerry Airport.)

If Kerry were included in an analysis of MW per square kilometer from wind turbines it would be in third place, behind Denmark and Germany and ahead of Spain.

It is not just people in Scartaglin and Gneeveguilla who are saying "Enough!".

Countries like Germany now are putting wind turbines offshore and no longer on land, antiwind campaigners tell me. In France, just this week, people have taken to the streets in the Hauts-de-France demanding a stop to the "saccage" of their region.





Is it time local authorities Frank Doran considered hiring private

security to ferret out those responsible for fly tipping or dumping household waste in our woods bogs and riversides?

I ask this after a court case last Friday which saw a rare prosecution and successful conviction for illegal dumping on the 9th May 2020, mainly thanks to a local private security firm.

The woodland on the Mill Road had become a huge dumping spot. Household waste including cat and dog food was being regularly dumped. There was concern that the material would be carried by the river.

Several tonnes of rubbish was removed by the Tidy Towns volunteers. The rubbish was cleared but the tipping started up again and the landowner hired Frank Doran's company, Safeguard Security, who put a watch on the area over two weekends.

On the Saturday night of the second weekend a black Dublin registered car pulled up and out the driver with a black plastic bag "full of household rubbish" according to the charge brought by the DPP under the Litter Pollution Acts relating to the single date.

The man who is of East European origin is out of the country currently and the case was heard in his absence last Friday. A conviction and fine was handed down for the single offence of May 9th. (The man's solicitor Brendan Ahern did a good job in getting the fine down to Euro 500 as the offence can carry a fine of Euro 3,000.)

The littering and dumping problem in Kerry is becoming intractable. Councillors have put forward various solutions including redeploying staff, putting up CCTV at rural black spots. But nobody seems to have put forward the idea of hiring private security!

Speaking with Frank this week, after the court case, most dumping is taking place on weekend nights, he tells me.

Between 12 midnight and 3 am are peak fly tipping times. This is when cars with blqck bags of household rubbish stalk the woods down Ross Road and Mangerton, the entrance to the race course and Torc Waterfall. This is the time too also when the cars pull into and circle the Glebe car park and leave stuff in other people's bins.

Prosecutions for fly tipping are notoriously difficult to bring and as a recent meeting heard people are "getting cute" and leaving no trace of identity.

Kerry County Council received 885 complaints and issued 121 litter fines during the year and from these just six prosecutions were instigated in 2021.

In Killarney there was not a single prosecution brought although 132 cases were investigated by the council.

CCTV is not the answer, I suggest, as people can disguise themselves with hoodies and not bring their cars within shots of the cameras.

Has the council which spends millions of outside consultants and companies ever considered hiring private surveillance? No one is suggesting the man convicted this week was responsible for all of the rubbish on Mill Road - but the word about surveillance seems to have gone out and there has been no dumping since at the spot.

### TRIBUTES TO DONIE

Some great tributes have been paid to the late Donie Courtney and none more so than that by Alan O'Sullivan, his great friend, who grew up alongside him in Ardshan. In a lovely



written piece - proving it is not only Colin who was a natural writer in the O'Sullivan house -Alan speaks at length of his sadness, broken heart and grief at the passing of his childhood and teenhood and adult friend Donie. But Alan also gives a sense of the character to those of us who were not fortunate enough to know Donie:

"There are thousands of words to describe Donie charming handsome affectionate witty magnetic charismatic fun loving passionate ...the list goes on and on ...and everyone of these words are apt.

Donie was all of these things and more.

Even if you try to add a negative word, a word like mischievous or cheeky, they still become positive when it comes to Donie, for everything he did was done with a glint in his eye.

For me his greatest gift was that he was able to take his passions seriously (his family, his work, his teaching,his writing, his performing, his love of music and all art forms )and yet crucially .. he never took himself seriously at all . That was the essence of him."

# **GAIN FOR KERRY** AS COUNTY RECEIVES THE MOST BLUE FLAG AWARDS

### 15 Blue Flags awarded for County Kerry in 2022

The high standard of the coastal environment in Kerry has been acknowledged with the awarding of 15 Blue Flags for Kerry beaches and coastal amenities for 2022, the highest number in the country.

Kerry has retained its current 14 Blue Flags, including 12 at beaches and one each at the Portmagee Seasonal Pontoon (Operated by Kilrush Maritime Ltd) and Fenit Marina as well as regaining the Blue Flag at Ballybunion North, bringing the total to 15.

The decision of the International Blue Flag jury was announced today (Friday) and sees the following beaches and marinas awarded Blue Flags for 2022: Rossbeigh, Ballybunion South, Ballybunion North, Ballyheigue, Fenit, Maherbeg, Kells, Doire Fhíonáin (Derrynane), White Strand, Baile an Sceilg (Ballinskelligs), Banna, Fionntrá (Ventry), Inch, Fenit Marina and Portmagee Seasonal Pontoon.

Five Green Coast Awards have been presented for Waterville, Ballinskelligs, Béal Bán, Castlegregory and Littor beaches.

Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr Jimmy Moloney warmly

welcomed the announcement as a very significant acknowledgement of the quality of beach environments in Kerry: 'Blue Flags are a very important internationally recognised indicator of the quality of a beach environment, and it is encouraging that Kerry emerging as the national leader in this regard.'

Cllr Moloney said that the awarding of the Blue Flags is a result of a collaborative approach between Kerry County Council, local community groups and beach users who work together to maintain our beautiful beaches and bathing waters.

Director of Services, John Breen added: 'The local authority invests tremendous effort and resources in keeping County Kerry at the top of the Blue Flag list and will continue to ensure the sustainable management of the magnificent beaches along the Kerry coast.'

'We would appeal to all beach users this summer to continue to be responsible by acting responsibly and leaving nothing behind on the beach except their footprints,'he added.

### BEN CLAIMS SILVER IN THE CZECH REPUBLIC

A St. Brendan's Student was chosen from 230 Competitors to represent Ireland in the European Olympiad for Experimental Sciences last week in the Czech Republic.

Benjamin Gaughran was part of a team of three where he was the 'physics guy' and his teammates biology and chemistry.

"There were two teams of 3 students each picked for the Irish Team chosen out of an intial 230 competitiors made up of talented science students from all around Ireland. Each student competed in Round 1 in November 2021 in their chosen science subject. This initial test was online due to Covid and consisted of a mulitple choice exam. Ben was alerted to the existance of the competition a few days earlier by his Physics and Chemistry teachers in St. Brendan's College, Killarney and got up early one Saturday morning to compete without really knowing what it was or where it would lead", Ben's mum, Louise MacIndoe Gaughran told Killarney Outlook.

Following a trip to DCU, Ben was successful on the Physics team and ultimately was selected along with 5 other students for the Irish Team (2 for Physics, 2 for Chemistry and 2 for Biology). The six team members returned to DCU in April for a 2 day training and team work session where Benjaimin was selected for Team A as the physics 'expert' along with Dominika Ryzwanowicz (Chemistry) and Manahil Sabir (Biology).

The Irish Team, along with their three mentors from DCU, travelled to the Czech Republic on 08th May and returned to Dublin airport on 14th May. Throughout the week, they attended an Opening Ceremony (Sunday evening) and two days of competition (on Tuesday and Thursday) in which each team worked for 4 hours each day on a number of experiments first solving their own element of the problem (i.e. Benjamin worked on the Physics element of the question) before coming together with his 2 team mates, to complete a final solution of the task as a team. The competition days were interspersed with some fun and educational excursions with their colleagues from the other 19 competing European countries. The week culminated in a closing ceremony on Friday in which Benjamin and the rest of Team A were thrilled to be awarded a silver medal.

"The week was about more than just the science", Ben said, it was also an amazing opportunity to meet their science colleagues of the future, to network and to make friends with students with similar interests outside of their own countries.

Following this incredible journey, Ben is hopefully that it will help him in his bid to follow his dream of getting into Cambridge University to study either Physics or Engineering after his Leaving Cert next year.

• At different points during the day, tune in to your breathing. Become aware of your breath flowing through your body. Allow yourself to pause and simply pay attention to your breath. These pauses really help to ground and re-balance ourselves, bringing us back into the moment we are living in.

# JIMMY O'SULLIVAN-DARCY

takes a look at all things sport...

#### MUNSTER FINAL PREVIEW: KERRY V LIMERICK FITZGERALD STADIUM, SATURDAY, MAY 28TH, 3.00PM

It occurred to me that we don't really have much of a history against Limerick. If you think about it, Waterford has 1957, where divisions in the Kerry camp came back to bite them hard as the Deise claimed a famous victory. No fluke either – they beat a couple of years later as well. Clare has 1992 – hindsight would say that the exclusion of Ambrose and the inclusion of an aging Jack O'Shea was costly, but nobody was having those conversations on the way up to the Gaelic Grounds that day. Tipperary don't have famous scalps like that, but would be widely acknowledged as the third best football team in Munster. I remember being justly worried about Tipperary senior teams.

I'm not overly worried about Limerick. I'm just coming out and saying it. Limerick have a fine history and have rattled our bones more than once. Darragh Ó Sé twice fielding under our own crossbar to preserve hard-fought victories. Darran O'Sullivan with that back-heel. We met them every year from 2001 to 2005 and every one was a hard game - truthfully, they deserved to win in 2004; we only sneaked out of there with a draw. Paul Galvin and Eoin Brosnan saved our streaky bacon that day; Darragh came good in the finish. For me, John Galvin was the best midfielder of his era (good basketball player as well, and for the same reason - he brought drive and power). I seem to be fairly unique in rating him higher than the traditionalist John Quane; so be it. They had Gavin, Lucey, Kelly as well....great footballers.

That was then; this is now. The truth is that the stronger teams have gotten stronger, while the weaker teams have declined. One anomaly about the blanket defence is that it makes margins much tighter - but at the sacrifice of any real ambition to go and win the game. Think about the last time rthat you saw the underdogs win an inter-county match. And before you suggest it, Derry did not curl up in any defensive shell against Tyrone, they went hunting, and Mayo threw caution to the wind when ten points down and ended Dublin's dominance - at least temporarily. Every team, Kerry included, floods the back with bodies now, but the great ones swarm the attacking angles as well (it's why I still don't really fear Mayo, O'Donoghue and the O'Connors will again have to much to do). I know, I know.... that could bite me on the posterior later on! Ah, well, I've been bitten there before...

Billy Lee has done a very good job with Limerick. The only game I saw was their Division Three Final against Louth. They were unlucky enough to lose that – both teams played defensive



and Louth got the game-breaking goal. C'est la vie. One thing that really impressed me was Limerick's work-rate – those lads were still full-blooded sprinting at the finish; that takes months of very hard work behind the scenes. Limerick are not coming to Killarney to make up the numbers.

They just don't have the scorers. We can dress it up and talk around it all we want, but the simple fact is that Limerick do not have players seasoned enough at this rarefied stratosphere to be able to convert 85% of their scoring chances, and that's the minimum they'll need. Kerry are a pacy team now, and one that converts a huge amount of their chances.

There aren't too many debates about the starting team. Shane Ryan has firmly established himself as number one; he's a verv solid keeper now. Graham O'Sullivan and Brian Ó Beaglaíoch have both seized their chances admirably. Tadhg Morley is the rock that opposition attacks flounder on; his positional sense is reminiscent of Dublin's guarter-back Cian O'Sullian in their heyday. W aren't giving the same goal chances away. Do vou hold David Moran in reserve? I'd be getting game-time into our talisman, but Jack Barry and Adrian Spillane perform unsung but vital roles. Stephen O'Brien will hold his place with Dara Moynihan out - Dara's tigerish snaffling of breaking ball and tackling will be crucial later on but Stephen is back to his outstanding 2019 form. It might be a confidence thing: he goes straight for the jugular now, and I like it. Seanie and David....sure, God love you if you think there's any debate there. To me, Paudie is just as vital, a relentless dynamo. With Seán back, he takes a corner forward slot. That leaves the last position up for debate between Tony Brosnan and Paul Geaney, and I don't think there's a wrong call there. Personally I'd start

Tony and finish with Paul – Tony has a certain unorthodoxy and unpredictability to his play that can put foxes into defensive henhouses. Paul is more traditional but just so good an executioner.

No, I'm genuinely not being mean about it, but I can't see Limerick being within touching distance at the finish. Certainly not in Killarney. One gripe, and a very serious one. E40 for a stand ticket and E30 for the terrace? It's too much, lads, it really is. Limerick have expensive hurling games coming up and they know the odds here the same as everyone else; vou're asking a lot of blind loyalty there. Pack up the car, drive to Killarney, feed the kids, watch a likely foregone conclusion, and drive back home? Or watch it on television, followed by the Heineken Cup Final, followed by the Champions Cup Final? I know how most Limerick supporters will be voting, and it won't be with their feet.

Spare me the talk of a double-header. I'm delighted to have the Ladies Munster Final on before it....but it's almost three hours before it. I guess I'll be bringing a sleeping bag and a hot water bottle....

#### LADIES MUNSTER FINAL PREVIEW: KERRY V CORK FITZGERALD STADIUM, SATURDAY, MAY 28TH. 12.15PM

Let's be honest. It's been a long generation ago since the Kerry Ladies went up against Cork as favourites, and it's not going to be happening this Saturday either. They have multiple All Ireland winners like Martina O'Brien, Orla Finn, the O'Sullivan sisters Ciara and Doireann (their pace has always been a huge problem for us), Áine O'Sullivan, Libby Coppinger...basically, it

could be the tagline for a horror movie. And while they have lost the likes of Orlagh Farmer, Breige Corkery, Rena Buckley (18 All Ireland medals over both codes!), while multi-talented Saoirse Noonan appears to have committed to soccer, the likes of Melissa Duggan have stepped seamlessly into those gaps.

Cork aren't the dominant force that they were – I'd argue that team in their pomp were better than Dublin were at the mens' game. Dublin took over their crown and looked an unstoppable force....until Meath emerged like a steak of green and gold lightning. That Meath team might lose players to the Australian game – it's a debate for another day, but I don't see the scheduling changes in that game making any difference to the lure for Irish players, most of whom are thriving over there.

Kerry were fairly down in the dumps just a few years ago. Dropping to Divisin Two was a bit ofa shock to the system, truth be told, and that's a hard one to break out of – you get no room for error and ned a big panel. Getting back to Division One was a big one for Kerry, and they achieved it this year in fine style against a good Armagh side. I'm not sure that Kerry people appreciate the big commitment that these players give to the jersey, often without any real acknowledgement. Not just the players – Darragh Long, Declan Quill, and their management team have put in massive work behind the scenes.

There have been tweaks to the team. Erica McGlynn at full forward has been a revelation -m she does the simple things right every time. Personally, I'm surprised at Danielle O'Leary being on the bench, a natural and deadly predator, but she showed what she can do to teams against Armagh. A worry for me for a long time was our dependence on Louise Ní Muirchertaigh for scores (not a huge worry she is that good at delivering them). Nowadays, as well as Erica, you have Rachel Dwyer, Paris McCarthy (I was surprised to see her at wing forward, but it works), and Niamh Ní Chonchúir. Aishling O'Connell from half back is a great threat going forward. Cáit Lynch to midfield was another puzzler for me that worked – Cáit's pace and reading of the game is second to none. Mind you, I remember Kerry playing both Tomás Ó Sé and Seamus Moynihan in midfield and it was never a natural fit - like them, Cáit can direct games from wing back. Lorraine Scanlon remains one of the best midfielders in the game (having speedy ball-winners inside will hopefully take some of the prodigious workload off her) and Anna Galvin isn't far off that.

Are we favourites against Cork? No, not a hope. But have we what it takes to give them a huge rattle and beat them? I'm not even that tentative about the maybe. If we can hold them early on – and that's no small 'if', pace will be key, Cork are very fast – then I genuinely think that this could be one of the most entertaining games of the day.

Credit to Galway, by the way – that was a lovely brand of fast-paced and fearless football. Frankly, you don't see it enough at senior in any code these days.

Cork in the final. Oh, just great. We had already lost to them twice, albeit narrowly. Kerry haven't had the best of luck against Cork teams in recent times – I thought our minors were better than Cork this year, but we just couldn't execute the scores we needed. Turns out that wasn't a problem for the U14s!

Cork leapt into a 1-1 to 0-0 lead in Pairc Uí Rinn, but Naoise O'Donoghue(1-1) and Phoebe O'Donoghue put us in front. There was a slice of luck for Kerry when Avril Rooney's long punt fluked its way into the net. At half-time we led by 2-5 to 1-3 and were deserving of it.

Aoife Treacy scored a cracking Cork goal. Phoebe made it 2-8 to 2-4, but 1-1 from Laura Collins (he was outstanding, credit where it's due) made it 3-5 to 1-8. It could have been worse, with Cork twice denied goals by great defending. They nudged two points in front. Phoebe nervelesly slotteda free and Laura Falvey pointed an equaliser with just seconds left.

Extra-time. Keeva Riordan pointed for us but Laura Walsh replied with two and Lily Collins put Cork 4-10 to 2-11 ahead. At that point it was more about character than anything else – it turned out that Kerry had an abundance of it. Their response was simply brilliant – maybe the interval helped to teady the ship, I don't know. But crtainly Naoise O'Donoghue and Lisa Falvey sliced in for superb goals to suddely turn the game on its head. Kerry a point in front.

Full credit to Cork; they were absolutely brilliant as well. Laura Walsh (watch out for that name) converted a penalty with a coolness that veterans might envy. Laura Falvey pointed in reply. With the game in the balance, Kerry just had that fraction more left in the tank, and Naoise O'Donoghue someghow found space to smash home a tenth goal of a genuine game of the year contender.

Fadó, fadó (it was actually 1963, but that's no way to start a story) Steve McQueen starred in a movie called 'The Great Escape'. It was loosely based on a true story, in much the same way as 'Star Wars' was, and it was brilliant. Stiff upper lip, etc.To be honest, Eddie Izzard's comedy routine about it was even better – seriously, google it.

Last weekend, Kerry pulled off an even more unlikely and greater escape.

I'll freely hold my hands up and say that I had essentially written off Kerry's chances. Losing to Down twice wasn't exactly condusive to confidence. Kerry have lost a lot of bodies in the past two years. We were, in my now muchmore-humble opinion, too dependent on Shane Conway for scores. The contretemps over Shane Nolan's absence was deeply troubling – I'm still iffy about that one, but results are declarative statements.

Kerry needed to beat unbeaten Antrim, who had held their heads reasonably high in Division One (the gap between Divisions One and two is like the gap between Everest and Mangerton). Not only that, but we needed Carlow, the same Carlow whom we had trimmed comfortably, to beat the Offaly side who had pipped us by a point. Frankly, the lad who wrote 'Game of Thrones' would have written the plot off as outlandish.

Kerry hurlers are used to defying the odds. To be honest, it'd confuse us if we ever went in as favourites. They tore into the seemingly impossible task with relish. The versatile Eoin

Ross and irrepressible Padraig Boyle with three frees (he has to be the McDonagh Player of the Year already, no-one else even comes close) gave us an early lead. Antrim settled and drew level at 0-7 apiece but Pádraig, Fionán Mackessy, and Eoin Ross made it 0-12 to 0-8. James McNaughton pulled two back but Kerry kept going and Pádraig pointed his ninth score on the stroke of half-time. Arguably advantage should have been played for Shane Conway's goal but, look, the referee had already blown the whistle. As far as I am concerned, cribbing about such things is only a distraction from the business at hand. Did I say that in an aggrieved press box? No, I most certainly did not. Half-time Kerry 0-14 Kerry 0-11

Carlow had their noses in front in the other game. I didn't follow the scores in that one; a certain sense of fatalism. A game of hurling requires full concentration.

Kerry made a bright start to the second half. Bright enough to start hope fluttering. Eoin Ross picked off two more, Colum Harty added another (predictably, he drifted out into space and worked tirelessly) and Jordan Conway once again sprang from the bench to devastating effect - I'd be starting him in our full forward line, where our scoring return has not been what I would be looking for. Kerry's lead stretched to seven. Antrim pulled that back to three (after that climactic battle aaginst Offaly, my nerves were jangling by now). The ever-reliable Fionán Mackessy struck twice to relieve the tension slightly. Antrim came back again but again Pádraig, Eoin, and Gavin Dooley struck vital scores.

Disaster. Antrim got in on goal, and it was again just too easy a chance to cough up – it's been a real achilles heel this year. Jordan Conway with a point....and back came Antrim again to hit the net. One point in it.

Pádraig with point number fifteen. Seconds were stretching like a Stephen Hawking lecture now. Offaly point. Just one in it. Paudie O'Connor with a chance, Paudie O'Connor with a score.

A moment's shocked pause while we waited momentarily in case Offaly had done another smash-and-grab, but they hadn't. Carlow, may their praises be sung forever (well, until next year, when we face them again) had done Kerry a massive favour and we were through to our third final in a row on scoring difference. You can call it lucky if you want, but every bit of 'luck' had to be hard-fought for.

Look, a caveat. The truth is that Antrim weren't at full strength for this game; I supect that they are happier to be facing Kerry than Offaly. They have a strong record against us in recent times – the hard truth is that they pulverised us in the 2020 Final and the Division One side have been red-hot favourites from day one.

The winners of the McDonagh Cup will go direct into a quarter-final against Cork. In other words, Kerry could conceivably last longer in the hunt for Liam McCarthy than either Tipperary or Waterford (I really fancied Waterford this year, I have a grá for them for years, but the wheels really came off that wagon). I couldn't help notice some national commentators fighting hard for Kerry's right to be promoted straight into the Munster Championship.

Look, let's get real. That would be madness. We would be annihilated on the scoreboard and it wouldn't do anyone any good. I'd oppose it with every fibre of my being. I'm proud, fierce proud of Kerry hurling (I take real pride in having a local team to support in the County Championship) but frankly that sounded a lot more patronising than realistic to me. I'll put it this way – the same commentators gave the last couple of McDonagh cup Finals the most token of mentions in their analysis – I will credit RTE with showing the finals live, and hope they do so again.

A lot of people forget it, but boxing has traditionally been Ireland's best sport. Granted, there has been serious disarray at both professional and amateur level in recent years, both nationally and internationally, but there has been one huge shining light in recent years. Ireland is developing a reputation a the best in the world in womens' boxing. There's no question but that Katie Taylor lit that beacon at the 2012 Olympics. Kellie Harrington added another gold last year.

Last week Ireland added two gold World Championship medals to the collection, with Amy Broadhurst and Lisa O'Rourke both winning in Istanbul. Interestingly, both Taylor and Harrington helped prepare the Irish boxers for the challenge – their willingness to give back to the sport speaks volumes about their character.

#### SOCCER

Well, the greatest soap opera in sport is over for another year. I don't actually get to watch that many Premiership games anymore – since opening up after covid, every sport has packed busy schedules and there's something to go to most days (I love it). I'll sit down and watch a Premiership game and enjoy it, but I'm no longer au fait with all the players and to be honest I am genuinely mystified when I watch Sky Sports commentary. Gary Neville, Jamie Carragher, Roy Keane (who appears be to be the straight man in comedic routines more than anything else) and Micah Richards all appear to laugh an awful lot at very little. Be fair to Giles and Dunphy, they could play to the cameras a bit (especially Eamonn) but they would actually analyse the game along the way.

In the end, Man City pipped Liverpool to the title in dramatic fashion, pulling back a two goal deficit to win 3-2. Liverpool – and I do like the pace of their attack, especially from their wingers masquerading as full backs – won their own game, but to no avail. I don't know, it never felt like that famous Sergio Aguero goal to light up the blue moon and deny Alex Ferguson. Ultimately, the story is "once upon a time a team started as red-hot favourites to win a competition, and then they did". De Bruyne for Player of the Year, by the way, and I don't think anyone is really arguing.

I will watch the Champions League Final, although not live (too much else on that day). Liverpool have a multiplicity of attacking threats, I can't see them being held scoreless and I suspect that this could be their day. That said, Real Madrid (the history of Spanish football always made me more sympathetic to Barcelona, until I realised exactly how the big two keep every other Spanish team down – viva Atletico!) beat big spenders PSG (hint: buy a midfielder instead of all the expensive goalscorers, you won't win without the ball), Chelsea (a going concern through no fault of their own) and Man City (probably the most expensive team ever assembled) along the way.

RTE recently did an article, and a very good one, on how Irish players fared in the Premiership, and it doesn't make for pretty reading. Seamus Coleman did well, but in an Everton team that barely avoided relegation. Shane Duffy restored his battered reputation (he had a nightmare with Celtic) with Brighton. Aaron Connolly left Brighton on loan to Middleborough but it didn't work out, the promising striker appears to have stalled a bit. Matt Doherty regained his place with Spurs and actually did okay until picking up injury in April. Nathan Collins and a rarely-used Kevin Long took the drop with Burnley (to be fair, Collins looks a prospect). So did Adam Idah (out with injury for most of the season) and Andrew Omobamidele with Norwich, having missed the last four months with injury. Jeff Hendrick and Ciarán Clark couldn't get starting jerseys with Newcastle, likewise with Shane Long at Southampton. Caoimhín Kelliher is in bit of a strange position. He's widely recognised as on of the best goalkeepers in the Premiership but is very much understudy to the admittedly brilliant Alisson. Medals from the bench won't help him take Gavin bazunu's Irish iersev. Frankly, I'd always take a starting player from a lower league team ahead of an unused sub frrom a higher team. Reserve games simply don't have that sharpening edge.

Well on Saturday almost exactly a year to the date that Roisin's mum, Marie, brought her to her first training session with MKL Gaels, Roisin is now an U14 All Ireland winner having played a starring role at cornerback for Kerry in their dramatic extra time win over Cork. Her Club mate Naoishe O'Donoghue starred alongside her and made a most valuable contribution to Kerry's success scoring 2-2 on the day.

Whats next for Roisin? Well this story is far from over and the next chapter is back at her club with her U15 team mates as they travel to Mallow on June 4th to play in the Feile Div 2 Regional Finals after winning the Div 2 Co.Kerry Feile earlier this month. More great memories with her teammates and friends await!

Welcome back dear student, we have been studying healing recently. "You will indeed hear but never understand, and you will indeed see but never perceive. For this people's heart has grown hard, and with their ears they can barely hear, and their eyes they have closed, lest they should see with their eyes and hear with their ears and understand with their heart and turn, and I would heal them." (Matthew 13:14-15). This Scripture identifies a major block to receiving healing - a hardened heart. What is a hard heart? Calamity is trouble that comes from alignment with the demonic an act of the will over which God has no power. The Lord has given to each one of us a free will to live as we choose. "Don't be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. Whoever sows to please their flesh, from the flesh will reap destruction; whoever sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life" (Galatians 6:7-8). God is merciful and compassionate but He is also Just (totally fair). "Righteousness and Justice are the foundation of His throne" (Psalms 89:14). God's Kingdom is like a scales on one side Righteousness (holiness, truth, honour, integrity) and equally balancing on the other side is Justice (accountability, fairness, responsibility to do right, mercy, generosity).

Sin cannot stand in God's Presence because He is holy, and sin is of the devil (1 John 3:8; Isaiah 57:15). Therefore those who desire to come to God must be cleansed of sin. But we human beings are flesh with a bent towards sin which was inherited from the first man Adam. And we had no way of saving ourselves from that generational curse (Ephesians 2:1-10; Romans 6:23).
