Killarney Extends a Warm Welcome

to Twin Towns

illarney Town Twinning Association recently hosted two of the first towns, Killarny twinned with - Castiglione di Sicilia, Italy in 1986 and Concorde in North Carolina in 1993. "We were delighted to introduce both groups as they had planned their visits at the same time", Sean Counihan, Chairman of the Killarney Twin Town Association told the Killarney Outlook.

"We hope in the future to have a mini-conference with the emphasis being on sport, cultural and business", he added.

The group are currently panning the Erasmus European Education and Work Experience Programe with their Twinned town of Pleinfield, Germany where many links have been established. Killarney town is twinned with 5 towns in Europe and has a Sister City Agreement with 4 cities in the USA.

The twinning link between Killarney & Castiglione di Sicilia was established in 1986. Castiglione is located in the province of Catania in Sicily near the foot of Mount Aetna Volcano and has a population of c. 4000. In 1993, Killarney was chosen as Concord's first Sister City. Concord is a city in the state of North Carolina with a population of approx. 84,000. It is effectively a suburb of Charlotte. Concord offers an excellent variety of entertainment and leisure for visitors, e.g. shopping spree, taking in the beauty of the historic district or attend one of NASCAR's largest races and special events at the Charlotte Motor Speedway. Concord has a diverse economic base that includes distribution, manufacturing, racing and professional services.

Killarney Golf and Fishing Club are formally twinned with Rocky River Golf Club in Concord - joining two premier golfing facilities.

ESB Networks warning to farmers transporting hay and straw

ESB Networks has issued a public safety warning to the farming community about transporting high loads of hay and straw which may come in contact with overhead electricity wires.

Coming in contact with overhead electricity wires is extremely dangerous and can be fatal.

Electricity wires are erected at best international heights that permit the transit of loads safely. However serious problems arise when loads are too high and interfere with live overhead electricity wires

ESB Networks Public Safety Manager Arthur Byrne says: "At this busy time for farmers, hay and straw is being saved and transported on roads around the country. ESB Networks is concerned about a number of incidents where tractors pulling high loads of hay and straw, have come in contact with the overhead electricity network. In one case, where a high load pulled down live electricity wires, both the tractor and load caught fire. Thankfully the driver escaped injury, but it serves as a timely warning to the farming community on these hazards." When loading hay and straw onto a tractor or lorry, our advice is to always ensure that the load is low enough to allow for safe transit, and avoid putting the public at risk. When planning the route with a high load, identify where electricity wires cross the road. Where there is doubt, establish if there is adequate clearance and, if necessary contact ESB Networks. NEVER, under any circumstances touch an electricity wire or anything the wire may be in contact with, including the inside or outside of a tractor/lorry/trailer etc. Please contact ESB Networks immediately on 1850 372 999.

Council issue caution alert at Lough Lein



Following investigations, Kerry County Council has identified algal growth along part of the shoreline of Lough Leane in Killarney. In accordance with protocols for these situations, precautionary signage is being erected at locations around Lough Leane and those who frequent the shoreline are being advised to exercise caution and not to allow dogs to enter the water.

There are indications of further warm and humid condi-

tions which may give rise to further algal blooms at other shoreline locations. Kerry County Council will continue to monitor this very closely. It should be stressed however that Lough Leane is currently considered to be in very good condition and that the development of algal growths is due to the exceptionally warm weather that has been experienced over the last few weeks.

UNIQUE TRAVEL CLUB TARGETS THE OVER 50S

oneliness may be a growing problem among older people but one Kerryman has come up with a fun solution to encourage empty nesters and pensioners to connect with others, broaden their horizons and even make money in the process. It's called the Freebird Club, a website offering peer-to-peer homestays with fellow older adults. It is like Airbnb but for over 50s and with a social aspect, in that the host always interacts with the guest. The story of the Freebird Club began in Killorglin, when Dublin-based, Peter Mangan, asked his dad, Owen, to look after Airbnb guests at his house in Kerry. While Peter was away working at a university in Dublin, his retired father Owen was on hand to meet and greet the visitors from around the world. This was an enjoyable experience for Owen, but when fellow older adults came to stay something special happened. They had nights together in the local pub, games of golf and local sightseeing trips, with Owen at the helm. Seeing the great social benefits that his father was now enjoying prompted Peter to think how he could encapsulate and replicate this enriching experience for the benefit of older adults everywhere. This is the heart of The Freebird Club, to



connect people. The Freebird Club was officially launched in 2017 as a social travel and homestay club exclusively for the over 50's. It is now developing as a global 'peer-to-peer' community, whereby Freebird Club members can travel and stay with each other in the context of a trusted social membership club. Members who wish to travel can search and stay with suitable hosts in destinations far and wide, knowing that a genuine, warm and personal welcome awaits them. To travel or host via Freebird, you first have to become an approved member of The Freebird Club. There is a once-off Joining Fee of €25

which helps cover the costs of vetting and approving members. This 'pay-to-join' membership model also serves to ensure that only genuinely interested people, who subscribe to the Freebird ethos, will go on to join the Club. This enhances the sense of trust, community and security. At the moment they have about 2000+ users across 63 countries. The Freebird Club's mission is to connect and enrich the lives of adults, fostering an 'age-friendly' world and life-enhancing experience. For more information see www.thefreebirdclub.

SHOULD YOU BE CONSIDERING **SWITCHING YOUR MORTGAGE**

Most definitely yes because some of the Irish mortgage lenders have much lower mortgage interest rates compared to others. There can be a very substantial difference in interest rates and monthly repayments between lenders. For example on a mortgage of €200000 over 30 years based on a property value of €300000 and comparing current fixed interest rates one lenders 2 year fixed rate is as slow as 2.30% (3.90% APR) which costs €770 per month whereas another lenders 2 year fixed rate is as high as 3.30% (APR 3.96%) monthly repayment €876 per month. The upgrade of the N70 route is sup-







CHANGING JOB

Whenever you leave a job you should get a P45 certificate from your employer. Your P45 is a statement from your employer that shows your pay, tax, Universal Social Charge (USC), and PRSI details for the year up to the date you leave. When you begin work at your new job, you will need this P45 to give to your new employer. Your new employer then takes some details from your P45 and then sends your P45 to the tax office on your behalf. This is to notify the tax office that you have now commenced working for a new employer and ensures that they are deducting tax appropriately. When you give the P45 to your new employer, they will:

- · Operate PAYE in accordance with the tax credits and standard cut off point details shown on the P45 until they receives a tax credit certificate from the tax office.
- · Notify the tax office that you have changed jobs so that a tax credit certificate can be issued for your new job.

If you do not give your new employer a P45 certificate, emergency tax will be deducted.

Emergency tax

If your employer has not received either as

·Certificate of tax credits from the tax office or,

 P45 certificate (parts 2 and 3) from you, in respect of your previous employment, your employer will be obliged to deduct tax on an emergency basis when paying your employee's wages or salary. This means that they will give you a temporary tax credit for the first month of employment but tax deductions are increased progressively from the second month onwards. The effect of emergency basis is that after 4 weeks, no tax credits are given and tax is paid at the higher rate from week 9, regardless of the level of pay.



A late late piece of individual magic from Kieran Donaghy, David Clifford and James O'Donoghue rescued Kerry from almost certain defeat in this Super 8 Phase 2 clash at St Tiernach's Park, Clones on Sunday afternoon.

Just as he had accomplished seven days previously in Croke Park, Clifford was in the right place to volley Donaghy's palmed delivery to the net for a crucial goal.

O'Donoghue's perfectly-timed kick pass to Donaghy was the catalyst for the dramatic equalising goal which left the Monaghan faithful in shock and the Kerry supporters breathing a huge sigh of relief.

Monaghan should have won this game as they held four and five-point advantages three times during the second half but Kerry are never beaten until the final whistle blows.

The Kingdom stuck to their guns and clawed their way back each time and indeed, the fighting ability of the younger players in this Kerry side, such as Sean O'Shea, David Clifford, Tom O'Sullivan and Gavin White was there for all to see.

Monaghan, thanks to the individual brillance of Conor McManus, their main scoring threat this summer, got off to a dream start. McManus, who finished the day with 1-9, stole inside the Kerry defence to shoot past Brian Kelly.

Monaghan were unlucky not to goal a secod time when Conor McCarthy's shot from a rebound flew over but the Farneymen were full value for their four-point interval lead, 1-11 to 0-10.

Kerry's main scoring threat in the first-half was Kenmare's Sean O'Shea, who scored seven of his side's tally, including six frees. O'Shea was subsequently withdrawn midway through the second-half by manager Eamonn Fitzmaurice, much to the chagrin of the Kerry fans.

Late late points from David Clifford, Stephen O'Brien and Anthony Maher ensured that Monaghan maintained a three-point cushion as the game entered stoppage time. Then came that late-late equaliser and the rest is history.

Kerry know that a win by at least seven points in their final game against Kildare should secure them a semi-final spot provided of course Galway beat Monaghan in the other final round fixture in Pearse Stadium.

He rung the changes - 5 in all from the Galway loss - but it seemed more of the same for a team who thrilled and delighted fans in their opening rounds against Clare and Cork.

That delight was in short supply as the clock ticked into injury time, in fact some Kerry fans had already headed for the exits. Something I can never understand from supporters. You go to support the team, they are amateur in status and despite their performances, signally or team, they certainly do not go out to underperform. During the game, Kieran Donaghy called on Kerry supporters to make their voice heard and for a time, sections did but not in a way Mayo fans did last season.

In two weeks' time, Kerry fans will get a chance to host their team in Fitzgerald Stadium, in a game in which the players need support. Real support, real colour and real encouragement. The eyes of the GAA world will be on Kerry to see can they perform their great escape and while it is true that their fate is in the hands of others, they still have the ability and talent

Where it goes after that is another day's debate.



Last Sunday was a rather special occasion in that Kerry hadn't played too many Championship games in Ulster. In fact, the last time was in 1933 when Cavan beat us in the All Ireland semi-final. Compliments to Monaghan GAA who did a superb job hosting the fixture and St Tiernach's Park, Clones proved to be a top-class venue. The game was a joy for all neutrals but Kerry Fans experienced a range of emotions throughout the 75 minutes! At 70 minutes, it looked as though our Championship hopes had come to an end but then came the pass from James to Kieran, the brilliant block down from Kieran and the sublime finish by David to level the game. CLONES AND DESCENDANTS OF ISAAC NEWTON'S FAMED APPLE TREE GROW ON 6 CONTINENTS

At Woolsthorpe Manor in Lincolnshire, England, the ancestral home of Sir Isaac Newton, sketches drawn by the revolutionary physicist, mathematician, and astronomer still adorn the house's walls. Outside, a gnarled apple tree has been growing for centuries.

A genetically identical tree is growing at Trinity College, Cambridge the University he attended, several more grow at Parkes Observatory in Australia, and another at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Descendants and clones of the Woolsthorpe Manor tree dot college campuses and research centres on every continent, except Antarctica, A tree at Occidental College in Los Angeles bears plaque like many others across the globe that reads "Grown From An Apple From The Estate of Sir Isaac Newton, Lincolnshire, England."

In 1665, the just-graduated Isaac Newton fled to his family home to avoid a plague outbreak. After observing an apple fall from the then-young tree when he was just 23 years of age he considered what force could pull objects in a straight line towards the earth. It was the first step towards his theory of gravity, which he published in 1687.

The story is widely believed to be false, but Isaac himself said his theory arose from seeing a falling apple while he stayed at Woolsthorpe.

Regular sketches of Woolsthorpe Manor after Mr. Newton's death continuously show an apple tree in the same spot as the current tree. With no other aged apple trees recorded as growing in the garden, before or after Newton, the Woolsthorpe Manor tree is now widely considered "the one."

Likely planted around 1650, it partially collapsed after a storm in 1816. While it re-rooted itself, part of the fallen tree was made into a chair, and chunks of the wood were taken as souvenirs. Living wood was also taken and propagated elsewhere. One shoot was taken to nearby Belton Park in 1820. The Fruit Research Station in East Malling took part of that tree in the 1930s. From there, the tree spread across the world, as universities, observatories, botanical gardens, and research centres clamoured for a Newton tree of their own. These institutions received a piece of history, not delicious fruit.



Whilst we can't control everything in our work environment, we're not powerless to make some changes - even in very difficult circumstances. Fear of losing our job, increased pressure to perform to meet rising expectations, staff cutbacks and increased overtime can all lead to excessive workplace stress. The way in which we deal with workplace stress and pressure is crucial. The key factor is to focus on those things that are within our control - namely ourselves. The better we are at managing our own stress, the less we will be affected negatively by other people's stress. Strategies to manage our own stress include It is important not to ignore the warning signs of work stress as these can lead not only to less productivity and effectiveness bu to physical and emotional problems. Some signs and symptoms of excessive job stress include lack of interest in work, sleeping problems, social withdrawal, headaches and muscle tension, fatigue, difficulty concentrating, feeling anxious or irritable and stomach upset. If you are experiencing any of these symptoms then it is time to take action. Taking care of you involves making more positive lifestyle choices - one step at a time.

- 1. Keep Active. Regular exercise is a powerful stress buster. Try to get at least 30 minutes of heart-pounding exercise at least 5 times a week. This will enhance your mood, increase your energy and relax your body and mind.
- 2. Healthy eating is vital for dealing with stress. Eat small but frequent meals to maintain a balanced blood sugar, avoid mood swings, keep your energy up and help you to concentrate.
- Smoking can lead to higher levels of anxiety as nicotine is a very strong stimulant.
- **4. Don't drink** to relieve job stress as this can lead to problems down the line.
- 5. Aim to sleep for 7-8 hours per night as a good sleep can keep us emotionally balanced and better resourced to deal with stress
- 6. We've all heard how'a problem shared is a problem halved' – so share how you are feeling with family or friends.
- 7. Prioritise and Organise your responsibilities. Good time man agement and organization can significantly reduce stress levels. Make a list of 'to-do' tasks and attend to them in order of impor-
- tance with high priority tasks first.

 8. Break tasks into small steps and focus on each manageable step one at a time. This will prevent you from getting over-

Know Your Rights:

OUESTION

I am a pensioner living alone. I used to get an allowance towards my telephone bill, but it stopped a few years ago. I heard it might be coming back – is this true?

ANSWER

The allowance you used to get was the Telephone Allowance, which was a monthly payment towards your mobile phone or landline and was part of the Household Benefits Package. This payment was discontinued in January 2014.

What you may have heard about is the new Telephone Support Allowance (TSA). The TSA is a weekly payment from the Department of Employment Affairs and Social Protection (DEASP) which aims to help with the cost of communications and/or home alert systems for people who live alone and have limited means.

To qualify for the TSA, you must be getting both the Living Alone Increase and the Fuel Allowance along with another social welfare payment such as the State Pension. Since the week of 4 June 2018, the TSA has been paid automatically to people who qualify. There is no application form and you do not need to contact the DEASP to apply.

The TSA is a payment of €2.50 a week. It is paid in addition to your weekly social welfare payment.

If you believe you should qualify for the TSA but have not been getting it since 4 June, contact the DEASP section that pays your main pension or benefit. You can find these contact details on welfare.ie.
