

AN HONOUR AND A PRIVILEGE FOR JORDAN

AS HE CARRIES THE IRISH FLAG

illarney athlete Jordan Lee had the honour of carrying the Irish flag at the opening ceremony at the Paralympics in Tokyo on Tuesday last.

Jordan who is competing in the High Jump was joined by weightlifter Britney Arendse at the helm, leading out the 29 strong Irish contingent. Taking to his social media accounts when he heard the news, Jordan said that "it was an absolute honour and privilege to announce that I have been chosen to lead out the Paralympics Ireland team into the Olympic Stadium as the Flag Bearer for the Paralympics Opening Ceremony alongside the incredible Britney Arendse". "To say that it is a Dream Come True, is a complete & utter understatement. I am so incredibly thankful and humbled to be given this incredibly rare

and amazing opportunity", he added. Speaking to the Killarney Outlook from Tokyo this week, Jordan's coach, Tomas Griffin, said that all the work is done now.

"Jordan is resting now, we are prepared for Sunday's event and looking forward to it", Tomas said. "He was on a high after the Opening Ceremony and is now focusing on Sunday when his high jump event takes place.

A total of 4,521 athletes will compete at the Games over the next fortnight.

Both Jordan and Britney, the two flagbearers are competing on Sunday 29 August when his high jump event begins and Arendse attempts to make the podium in the para weightlifting.

You can see Jordan jumping live on RTE on Sunday morning at 11.30am.



PAUL CROSSES THE WORLD TO MEET HIS HERO

"FROSTBITE BOY"

IS RESCUED AMONG A DOLPHIN POD



mong a pod of dolphins, two and a half miles off the Maherees, a young man, who became an internet sensation in 2015 was rescued in dramatic fashion by the Fenit RNLI Lifeboat on Sunday last.

Ruárí McSorley went viral in 2015 during heavy snow in Northern Ireland when he was interviewed on his way to school saying "you wouldn't be long getting frostbite", a line that catapulted him into worldwide fame with 3.5 million views in just three days.

On Sunday last Ruárií attempted to swim to Fenit Lighthouse and back but when his pile of clothes were found on the beach in The Maherees the Fenit RNLI All-Weather Lifeboat crew were on exercise when they were tasked to a search for swimmer at 12.40pm. Fenit RNLI Inshore lifeboat and Rescue 115 also joined the search. Conditions were excellent with calm waters and low tide and a search was undertaken of the area. With nothing found

and no further information the search was stood down in the afternoon.

At 6pm the search was reactivated at the request of An Garda Siochana with the two lifeboats searching the original area and the bay nearer to Tralee and again joined by Rescue 115 overhead. At 8.30pm, volunteer lifeboat crew with Fenit RNLI spotted a pod of dolphins and a head above the water about two and a half miles off Castlegregory beach. The casualty was conscious and immediately recovered onto the lifeboat and brought Fenit Harbour to be taken to hospital. Fenit RNLI's medical advisor

was also on scene.

Commenting on the rescue Fenit RNLI Lifeboat Operations Manager Gerard O'Donnell said, 'After a long and exhaustive search, members of the lifeboat crew were overjoyed to sight the missing swimmer in the water. They had been scanning the water for any sign of movement and were worried with light fading that they would not find anyone. Even at this time of year, the water can be very cold and as yet we don't know how long this person was in the water and when they entered it. When the lifeboat crew found them they were a good distance from the shore and were exhausted.'

'We would advise that anyone undertaking a swim lets people know where they are going and when they expected back. This was a very lucky individual.'

Ruarí spent the night at University Hospital Kerry and was released the following day to continue his trip around Kerry where he met up with Fossa man Brendan O'Sullivan at the Seafront Inn at Inch Beach.

Further walk-in vaccination clinics planned in Kerry

Walk-in vaccination clinics will again be available in Kerry in the week ahead, as the last phase of the vaccination roll-out in the county continues. Anyone eligible for a Pfizer BioNtech vaccine can receive a first or second dose without an appointment at either the Tralee or Killarney centres next Sunday morning, between 9.15am and 10.15am. The Tralee centre is at Kerry Sports Academy and the Killarney centre is at Killarney Sports and Leisure.

Meanwhile, evening walk-in clinics will run at both Kerry vaccination centres next week, on Wednesday September 1st and Thursday September 2nd, from 4pm to 8pm.

The full list of times and dates are:

- * Sunday, August 29th, 9.15am to 10.15am, at both Tralee and Killarney centres.
- * Wednesday September 1st, 4pm to 8pm, at both centres.

*Thursday September 2nd, 4pm to 8pm, at both centres. The walk-in vaccination clinics will be open to any eligible person aged 12 or over. Anyone aged between 12 and 15 years must be accompanied by an adult, and will need the consent of a parent or guardian before vaccination. Those attending for either a first or second dose should check hse.ie to make sure they are eligible and that they bring all necessary documentation eg those hoping to receive a second dose should bring proof of their

first dose vaccination (eg your vaccination card) and photo ID. For anyone waiting for a second dose, it does not matter where you received your first dose – in other words, if you received your first dose with your GP, in a pharmacy or another vaccination centre, you can still attend.





RAISING AWARENESS...

PUBLIC ACCESS AED'S ENSURE LIVES CAN BE SAVED

illarney Cardiac Response Unit in conjunction with Michael Linehan Killarney Heartsafe group have throughout the summer aimed to highlight the locations of the 16 public access AED's in Killarney and every week Killarney Outlook highlighted a different location of a public access defibrillator.

"These lifesaving automated external defibrillators (AED's) are available 24/7 to the public", Kevin O'Leary from Killarney Cardiac Response Unit told Killarney Outlook.

However it is essential that the public are aware of the nearest device and the simple steps needed to save a life.

"An out of Hospital Cardiac arrest has the worst possible outcome for survival, mainly because resuscitation is often delayed or not given. It is Vital that resuscitation is started as soon as possible following a cardiac arrest", he added.

A sequence of steps has been developed to provide the best possible chance for survival for a patient with a cardiac arrest, these are described as the links in the chain of survival, and like any chain, the chain of survival is only as strong as the weakest link. And so each link is of equal value and importance.

The chain of Survival

Early Access: Recognition of an emergency and calling 999 or 112 for help.

Early CPR

Early Defibrillation

Early ALS (Advanced Life Support)

Early Post Resuscitation Care

WALK IN TESTING IN KILLARNEY EXTENDED



Walk-in testing in Killarney has been extended and will be available from 11am to 7pm, today Friday August 27th.

In addition to walk-ins, the centre will also accept appointments made by the public on hse.ie at this page https://covid19test.healthservice.ie/hse-self-referral/

It will also take referrals from GPs.

The pop up testing site is located on the grounds of Killarney Community Hospital, Saint Margaret's Road, Killarney.

Walk-in testing in several parts of the region has proven to be quite successful in detecting and containing cases of Covid-19 in recent months. This site was planned in partnership by CKCH, the National Ambulance Service and Public Health experts.

Everyone attending for testing needs to bring a photo ID and a mobile phone number to receive their results. No appointment is necessary. You should use this free, walk-in COVID-19 testing service primarily if you:

- Do not have symptoms of Covid-19 but would like to be tested
- Have not tested positive for Covid-19 in the last nine months

Children under 16 can attend a walk-in centre. The parent or guardian attending with a child must have photographic ID and give consent for a child under 16 to have a COVID 19 test and there must also be an accompanying adult present when a child under 16 has a COVID 19 test. You must bring photo identification with you and provide us with a mobile telephone number so we can contact you with your results.

Social distancing measures will apply as people attend for testing.

ADVENTURERS TAKE ON THE DINGLE PENINSULA

The incredible feat of circumventing the Dingle Peninsula in 24 hours is being spearheaded by Kieran O'Callaghan, Patrick O'Sullivan and Daniel Bohan who collectively plan to walk, kayak, run, cycle, climb, swim and mountain bike the area all on the 4th of September.

When speaking with these guys it becomes apparent that the over-whelming challenge they are endeavouring to achieve takes second place to the determination and generosity of spirit that spurs them on to raise funds for

Comfort for Chemo, Kerry.

Their challenge will begin at 10pm as they take on the first 30km of their 126km distance by jogging the Dingle Way from Tonevane (Tralee) to Inch Beach/Annascaul rivermouth. Then kayaking from Inch/Aunascaul rivermouth to Dingle Harbour, from where they will run to Ventry Beach.

They will cycle onwards to An Baile Breac (Pilgrimmage car park) followed by a climb up Mt. Brandon and descent to Lough Cruite. A swim in Lough Cruite and hike to Cloghane

Village will be followed by a mountain bike from Cloghane to Conor Pass, then off road to Dingle town where they plan to finish at 10pm. This punishing challenge has been long planned, and all the team are deep into their training schedule and determined to complete this within twenty-four hours, whatever the weather will bring. They have an ambitious fundraising goal of €30,000 and welcome all contributions to their Go Fund Me page.

EILEEN HELPS LAUNCH COVID-19 MEMORIAL EVENT



Killarney Restaurateur joins frontline medical staff to remember lives lost to Covid-19 and to raise €150k for those impacted by the pandemic at ICU4U memorial event.

Eileen Finucane, owner of Kitty O'Se's in Killarney, who lost her partner Seamus O'Connor to Covid-19 at Cork University Hospital, has helped to launch a national Covid-19 memorial event.

ICU doctors, nurses, healthcare workers, hospice staff, paramedics and gardai will take part in a cycle of remembrance from hospitals

throughout Ireland and Northern Ireland to the Memorial Gardens in Islandbridge Dublin from 2-3 September to remember the lives lost to Covid-19 at an ICU4U memorial event.

They will pass through as many community hospitals on the way, collecting white roses to represent lives lost to the virus. At the end of the cycle on Friday 3rd September, a commemoration ceremony will be held at the Memorial Gardens Islandbridge in front of 7000+ white roses, which will be displayed at the gardens for the weekend.

On Saturday 4th September members of the public, like Eileen, will be invited to visit the commemoration site to take a rose and remember a loved one, making a charitable donation if they so wish.

"Tragically more than 7,000 people have lost their lives to this terrible virus and my partner was one of them", Eileen said at the launch.

"I urge everyone to get vaccinated, as that's the only way we will beat this disease and prevent more loss. The ICU team were incredible during Seamus' time in Cork University Hospital and it's so moving that they are yet again there for family members by remembering our loved ones and by raising much needed funds for those who now need our help", Eileen added.

The event also aims to raise €150k for ALONE (older people), AWARE (mental health supports), AWARE NI (supports for overcoing depression) and Breakthrough Cancer Research (funding new treatments for cancer patients) to support those affected by the secondary challenges of the pandemic.

How can Irish Forestry help the Climate Crisis?

Kevin O'Riordan and **Tim Nairn**, Forester and Ecologist at SWS Forestry take a look at the solutions

Ireland is badly in need of solutions to the climate crisis, so how can forestry help? Over the past decades, forests are responsible for sequestering around 30% of annual global CO2 emissions arising from human activity. This is similar to the amount absorbed by all the oceans on the planet. Considering that two thirds of all forests on Earth are managed to some degree, there is an opportunity to use native woodland establishment and forest management to influence carbon cycles and enhance carbon capture.

This can be done through sustainable forest management practices of commercial timber production, actively locking carbon into long-lived timber products. Forestry can also contribute by promoting the establishment of native Irish woodlands, which will exist for generations to come. Native woodlands act as carbon sinks, increase biodiversity and provide amenity and cultural value to local communities.

We at SWS Forestry have been increasing the level of Broadleaf and Native Woodlands establishment over the last number of years. We work in partnership with landowners at all scales, from the individual to large corporations. Recently, we collaborated on projects that are helping to restore Ireland's degraded peatlands. In the first of its kind for Ireland's dairy industry, we collaborated with a large milk processing facility and donated close to 40,000 native Irish trees to farmers providing solutions at a local level.

Through initiatives like those above along with a strong calibre in the emerging fields of carbon forestry and sustainable timber

IMPROVEMENTS IN WATER SUPPLY TO BEGIN



Efforts are being stepped up this week to significantly improve water supply in Kerry as Irish Water, working in partnership with Kerry County Council, are soon to begin works, replacing the problematic trunk water main in Farranfore. This 600mm watermain is part of the spine of the network, supplying water from Killarney to Tralee,

Castleisland, Castlemaine and surrounding areas and the section in Farranfore has burst numerous times in recent years.

The works will be carried during evening and nighttime hours – from 7pm to 7am Monday evening to Friday morning, starting on the 30th August and continuing until the end of October. To ensure as little disruption to homes and businesses as possible, Irish Water, Kerry County Council and our contractor, Ward and Burke, have agreed on night-time works for the duration of the works. The N22 Killarney to Tralee road will have a one lane stop-go system in place from 7 pm-7 am, Monday to Friday from August 30 until the end of October 2021 with the road reopening fully during the day. No works will be carried out over the weekend for the duration of the works schedule.

An optional alternative route that bypasses the works will be signposted, and vehicles may take the alternative routes if they wish.

It will come as no surprise to residents and businesses of the area that there have been regular bouts of unplanned outages in the recent past due to the aging network. The size and scale of this challenge, not only in Kerry but nationally is well documented and reacting to this, Irish Water is implementing their strategic plan to ensure security of supply, the reduction of high levels of leakage and the improvement of water quality in the county.

In order to ensure minimal disruption, we hope to have our crews finished and the road clear each weekday morning at 7 am. Local businesses will remain open for the duration of the works. A minimum of 48 hours' notice will be given ahead of any planned outages and at this stage there is only one planned outage and that is due to take place during October."

STRONG DEMAND FOR COLLEGE PLACES AS LEAVING CERT RESULTS DUE OUT ON 3RD SEPTEMBER

bout 4,650 extra college places will be available this year to cater for the record numbers who applied to the Central Application Office (CAO). With keen competition for highpoints courses, the points for places on these popular college courses will be high. Latest CAO data confirms a final figure of 84,526 applications, up from 77,831 in 2020. It means increased demand across many courses. 77,356 have applied for an honours bachelor degree (Level 8) while 42,161 have applied for an ordinary bachelor degree/higher certificate (Level 7/6).

Many courses have seen an above average increase in demand, driven largely by school-leavers expectations of high points, based on the dual option Leaving Cert 2021 – exam grade and/or accredited grade. At 8.6%, the overall percentage increase in CAO applications is high, and also reflects more demand from mature students and students from EU countries.

440 new places are on offer in health sciences, such as nursing, pharmacy and medicine as well as 450 in science subjects, 120 in education and 102 in law. There will also be a significant increase in places for media

studies, veterinary and business. Architecture, agriculture, veterinary, biological sciences, computing, arts, environment-related courses, social sciences and journalism are also among the areas with big surges in interest. Law has declined in popularity, with first preferences down 8pc to 2,930. Teaching courses and those linked to transport have also experienced a decrease in interest.

The Central Applications Office (CAO) has already issued two early rounds of college offers, Round A and Round Zero. 6,698 applicants received CAO offers in Round A, which was available on 7th July last. Of this 6,698, 5,510 received a Level 8 offer and 2,408 received a Level 7/6 offer. 1,220 applicants received an offer on both the Level 8 and Level 7/6 lists. Round A offers mainly concerned mature applicants, mature nursing/midwifery applicants, and deferred applicants, but offers were also issued to some applicants who completed an access course, or those who required to make visa arrangements. The reply date by which Round A offers had to be accepted was Tuesday, 13th July.

6,163 offers were issued to 4,820 applicants in CAO Round Zero on 5th August. Round Zero offers concerned applicants who are not competing with those awaiting 2021 Leaving Cert exam grades, or who are assessed on other criteria. The applicants who fall into this category include graduate entry medicine applicants, additional mature applicants, deferred and Access applicants, and applicants presenting PLC and related qualifications for consideration for entry to courses with a quota for PLC. The offers were available online on 5th August. This year there were 3,950 Level 8 offers and 2,213 Level 7/6 offers issued in Round Zero, 1,343 applicants received an offer on both the Level 8 and Level 7/6 lists. The reply date by which applicants had to accept

their offers was 10th August. To date, a total of 14,071 offers have been issued by CAO in Round A and Round Zero to a total of 11,518 applicants. For all other successful applicants, Round One, the main round of offers, will be available online at 2pm on 7th September, and successful applicants will also receive offer notification by email and text message, if they have selected this option. There will be no postal offer notices. The reply date for Round One offers is 13th September at 3pm. Round Two offers will be available online at 10am on 20th September.










MINSTER FOLEY WELCOMES OVER €470,000

in funding for digital innovation in Kerry

Minister for Education and Kerry TD Norma Foley welcomes the announcement of €476,000 in funding for Kerry under the Our Rural Future Digital Innovation Programme. The programme funds Local Authority-led innovation projects that provide a public benefit and support regional digital development.

In total €476,800 in funding is awarded to three major projects across the county.

Some €200,000 will fund the roll-out of the innovative pilot scheme at Inch Beach over to multiple beaches in Kerry and other public attractions.

Part of the project's scope is to deliver Disabled Bay parking sensors to provide the Local Authority and public with live information on their status (free / busy).

The scheme also provides for smart sensor technology to monitor the water quality, lifebuoy and asset alarms, digital signage and fund the integration with websites and Apps like discoverkerryand the Atlantic Discovery App and the EPA's beaches.ie.

The Smart Park Kerry project receives €76,800 to develop a new easy-to-use Disabled Parking application.

The Atlantic Discover Platform has been awarded €200,000 to provide an enhanced

digital visitor experience whilst visiting Kerry / the SW / the Atlantic Seaboard. The platform will provide an authentic brand experience that will increase awareness, direct bookings and physical visits.

Minster Foley said: "Innovation and creativity

has always been at the heart of Kerry's visitor attractions. I welcome this funding which will provide digital innovation to enhance and improve the imagination, energy and expertise that already supports Kerry's vibrant tourism sector."

COASTAL EROSION



Fianna Fáil Councillor, Michael Cahill, has called on Kerry County Council to ensure Funding applications can be submitted to the OPW for Flooding Relief Schemes and Coastal Protection Works at Cromane, Dooks, Glosha, Rossbeigh, Tullig, Incherea, Reenannalagane, Keelnabrack Lower, Douglas, Gurrane, Reen, Callinafercy etc, at the earliest possible date.

"These works are urgently required to protect and save people's homes and livelihoods along our coastline and it seems to be taking forever to get things moving in what could be a life and death situation" stated the Rossbeigh based Councillor.

"Apparently, additional survey works are required and funding to ensure the Consultants complete the Pilot Study of Castlemaine Harbour, must be agreed by KCC and the OPW, before it can be completed" said Councillor Cahill.

"This needs to be expedited now as lives and property are at risk, year after year, as storms batter our coastline. It is not as if there will be any change in the situation and we need to get on with solving this major problem now" added the Fianna Fáil man.

CALL FOR REVIEW OF AMBULANCE SERVICE

Fianna Fáil Councillor, Michael Cahill has called for an immediate review of our National Ambulance Service and it's efficiency in rural Ireland following a number of adverse reports on response times in recent weeks

"One report detailed in the media is of an ambulance being sent from Ennis to Cromane a distance of 160km approximately, which cannot be helpful for a quick operation" stated Councillor Cahill.

"I personally got a detailed report from a constituent of an ambulance being sought at 18.55 one evening, following a serious accident. At 19.50, the Ambulance Service could not give and estimated time of arrival. South Doc saw the patient at 21.15 and a parent drove them to Hospital A&E, arriving around midnight. From accident site to A&E in this case is 75km approximately and the patient got there after 5 hours. This is totally unacceptable for any patient, not to mind one who has been involved in a serious accident" said the Rossbeigh based Councillor.

"What needs to be clarified here is if the deficiency is in the numbers of staff or vehicles available to the National Ambulance Service. Living as we do in an area famous for its tourism, we understand that our population increases majorly during the season and allowances need to be made in all of our services" stated Councillor Cahill.

"This review should also look at the locations of the ambulance bases. Geographically, some areas are obviously more difficult and slower to access and exit, and therefore should be considered for increased or closer coverage" said the Cathaoirleach of Kenmare Municipal District and Deputy Mayor of Kerry. "This is not a service that you can put a monetary value on and it must be organised to operate at its most efficient level possible which certainly does not appear to

be the situation presently" added

Councillor Cahill.



BLACK PUDDING & APPLE SAUSAGE ROLLS

Ingredients

1 pack Of just rol Puff Pastry 1 Egg Splash Of Milk 454g Sausages 280g Blackpuding (Crumbled) 1 Apple (Grated (Skin On)

Method

- 1. Defrost the puff pastry in a fridge overnight if using frozen. Make some egg wash by whisking the egg with a splash of milk and set aside. Preheat the oven to 200°C fan
- 2. Make the filling by squeezing the filling out of the sausages into a large bowl. Add in the grated apple and crumbled black pudding. Season with pepper and mix well
- 3. Lay out the sheets of puff pastry. Split each sheet of pastry in half with a sharp knife. On one half of each halved sheet, generously spoon on the meat filling down the middle in along the pastry. Make sure the other half of the pastry can fold over the filling to prevent over filling. Before folding, egg wash one side of the pastry with your fingers or a pastry brush and fold over, stamping with a fork to seal.
- 4. Cut with a sharp knife into 24 small sized (6 per roll) or 12 large sized (3 per roll) sausage rolls. Place the rolls on 2 baking tins lined with greaseprroof paper, ensuring there is decent space between each roll allowing them to puff up.
- 5. Bake in the oven for 25 minutes at 200°C until golden brown and puffed up

CAJUN BLACK BEAN AND QUINOA PROTEIN POWERHOUSE

Ingredients

1 tablespoon oil
1 red onion chopped
3 cloves garlic crushed
1tablespoon frozen coriander
1 teaspoon Cajun Spice mix
1 tablespoon ground cumin
1 tablespoon ground coriander
2 cans chopped tomatoes
1 can black beans drained and rinsed
600ml vegetable stock

Method

200g quinoa

Sprig of parsley to serve

Put the oil in a large pan and fry the onions and garlic for 5 minutes being careful not to burn them. Add all the spices, the frozen coriander, the beans, quinoa, tinned tomatoes and vegetable stock and bring to a boil. Cover the pan and simmer for about 15 minutes or so until most of the liquid is absorbed. I served this with basmati rice and a sprig of parsley to garnish. This high protein mix is also great served in a tortilla wrap for a quick and healthy lunch.


SHOULD YOU BE CONSIDERING SWITCHING YOUR MORTGAGE

Yes, because some of the Irish mortgage lenders have much lower mortgage interest rates compared to others. There has been a lot of discussion recently in the media recently as regards mortgage switching this is because there can be a very substantial difference in interest rates and monthly repayments between lenders. For example on a mortgage of €250,000 over 30 years based on a property value of €320,000 and comparing current 3 year fixed interest rates. One lender is as low as slow as 2.20% (2.63% APR) which costs €950 per month whereas another lenders 3 year fixed rate is as high as 3.00% (APR 3.90%) monthly repayment €1,055 per month. The monthly repayment for the lender with the higher rate is a staggering €105 per month more expensive. Over the term of the mortgage you could pay €37,000 (approx) more in interest, this figure will change depending on interest rate changes in the future. Of course you would need to qualify for the mortgage with the new lender and also there are many other considerations and information you need to know before proceeding further. Many lenders will also cover the cost of paying the legals fees for switching your mortgage. 












You are not alone

Peter shares with us The Importance of Having Goals, targets and mini wins!

Firstly, what is a goal? A goal is something that can be short term or long term that you want to achieve, having a goal can drive our behaviours long term. 

PARALYMPICS

he best moment of the Tokyo Olympics was, without question, when high jumpers Mutaz Barshim from Qatar and Italy's Gianmarco Tamberi decided to share the gold medal in the high jump. Both men had jumped perfectly until the bar was set to 2.39m, the Olympic record. Both men had three attempts and neither cleared it. Instead of going for a jump off, the usual way of ending such an impasse, they simply decided to share the gold. All of Kerry will be hoping that the T47 High Jump in the Tokyo Paralympics outshines that moment, at least for one competitor. Jordan Lee takes the stage Dallas Wise from Arizona is ranked number one in the world for 2021, and will be competing in both the high and long jump. His best jump is a whopping 2.10m. World number two is also American, Roderick Townsend from Minneapolis, who has jumped 2.08m, and third is Nishad Kumar (2.06m).

Jordan Lee, who is ranked 11th in the world at his discipline, joined Britney Arendse in leading out the Irish team in Tokyo as flagbearer last Tuesday. Jordahn will be competing this Sunday at 11.00am (Irish time) and the event is being broadcast by RTF

BEST OF LUCK

Best wishes to Peter Keane and the Kerry senior team this Saturday. Kerry have looked a rejuvenated side all season, not just because of new blood (Mike Breen and especially Paudie Clifford have not only slotted in, but rapidly made themselves practically indispensable), but also a more pressing and attacking style of play that has seen Seán O'Shea closer to the scoring zone. Kerry are hot favourites here but complacency shouldn't be an issue. Not against Tyrone, given our mutual history. Forget the League mauling by Kerry, that game was dead in the water early on. No, think back to 2019, when Tyrone had us on the back front but Kerry managed to just about take control in the second half. Tyrone have fresh guns since then, not least Cathal McShane back to his best. I do still worry about physicality in defence, Tyrone carry at speed and with a lot of bulk. Remember Mayo shrugged off Dublin's tackling attempts in their second half surge into the final? Tyrone have all that muscle and a bit more, and are a lot more accurate than Mayo when shooting chances open up. Kerry have profited this year from pressing on opposition kick-outs. I'd still commit to an attacking philosophy - we have been too defensively oriented in tactics for almost a decade now and it hasn't worked - but we need to remember that Niall Morgan can boom long range monsters right into the heart of our half back line and Mattie Donnelly is as good a midfielder as is out there. That said, I don't want seven at the back, that plays right into Tyrone's hands.

Forget covid, as well – at least in terms of the football, I strongly urge every supporter to exercise due caution in regard to masks and social



distancing, given the rising numbers.

Tyrone are very, very dangerous. They still defend in numbers, but not as rigidly as before, and their support runners can all shoot as well as supply. I get that Kerry are favourites, given the margin of our victories this year, but no way can I see more than three points in the difference at the finish.

GAA

There were two hurling finals and two football semi-finals over the past week, and all of them emphasized the lesson for me that in modern GAA, the truth is that power is at least as important as skill. That's not say to say that there wasn't much skill, far from it. There was attacking and defending that would grace any era in the history of the games. But there was strength and conditioning on view that has never been seen before, and it was a crucial feature in the winning of all those games.

All Ireland Minor Hurling Final: Cork 1-23 Galway 0-12

Cork already had the U20 title in the bag and always looked like favourites to add the minor title – their average winning margin throughout their campaign was a whopping 19 points. The tide certainly seems to have turned for Cork at juvenile in both football and hurling after the revamp of their Rebel Óg set-up four years ago. Cork were much stronger physically than their opponents. They dominated Galway's puckouts throughout and that gave them a platform to lead all through. It was 0-9 to 0-4 at the first water break and the writing was already on the wal at half-time as they led by 0-16 to 0-7. By then there was no way

back for Galway and David Cremin's goal early in the second half effectively put the game to bed as a contest. Galway's reign as All Ireland minor champions had lasted the grand total of a month and a half.

All Ireland Senior Hurling Final: Limerick 3-32 Cork 1-22

As Cork manager Kieran Kingston graciously admitted in the aftermath of an absolute trouncing, "it was like trying to stop the tide with a bucket". In fairness, Limerick completely dominated the play and were far stronger than the Rebels - their strength and conditioning was almost unbelievable to behold. Cork didn't always help their own cause, with short puck-outs all too often playing into Limerick's hard press and occasional over-elaboration. The long distance shooting on both sides was absolutely spectacular - in fact, the record totals being put up this year in hurling could become a problem - how do you defend against players who are frequently scoring from 60 and 70 metres? Limerick's tally set a new record for an All Ireland Final. Man of the match, without guestion, was Cian Lynch, but Limerick had a host of heroes in a display for the ages. In truth, Kingston's side showed admirable guts to keep battling hard long after the game aws gone from them. They coughed up a goal after just two minutes, Gearóid Hegarty giving Patrick Collins no chance with an excellent strike. Shane Kingston cut in for a Cork goal against the run of play but the writing was on the wall and Aaron Gillane's 13th minute goal was as easy as a hot knife through butter - Cork were at sixes and sevens and allowed him far too much space. It was 2-8 to 1-6 at the first water break. Just before

the half-time whistle Gearóid Hegartym (a superb hurler, but lucky enough to stay on the pitch after a tussle that owed more to jujitsu than hurling) pounced for his second goal to make it 3-18 to 1-11 and the contest was effectively over. In fact, Limerick did drop their intensity in the second half - one could hardly blame them, I suppose. Imagine what kind of total they would have put up if they had kept the accelerator pressed? In truth this was too one-sided to make for an entertaining contest - the scary thing is that Cork didn't leave too many scoring chances behind them, but were totally outfought and outclassed in the most one-sided contest the hurling final has seen since Kilkenny Waterford in 2008. Unfortunately, a lack of masks or social distancing was very obvious on the tv cameras and bodes ill for coming days - hopefully the Kerry and Tyrone fans will show more discretion this weekend.

All Ireland Minor Football Semi-Final: Meath 2-14 Sligo 2-9

This was Sligo's first All Ireland minor semi-final since 1969 and it proved a step too far on this occasion. Meath's Christian Finlay slammed an early goal as the Royals opened up a 1-8 to 0-3 lead. A Brian Duffy penalty brought the gap back to four points but Meath always had a response and led by 1-11 to 1-4 at half-time. Meath had a player sent off early in the second half but had the luxury by then of dropping a sweeper back and, while Sligo never lost heart, the closest they could come was a Jack McGovern goal six minutes from time to bring it back to four points again, only to be caught on the counter-attack and John Mannion's goal for Meath soon after settled any doubts.

All Ireland Minor Semi-Final: Tvrone 0-23 Cork 1-6

Meath were unquestionably very good against Sligo, but Tyrone's display against Cork was on a different level altogether. The Red Hand were huge for a U17 team - quite honestly, I doublechecked to make certain that this wasn't a U20 game. Tyrone completely dominated all through, it was very obvious almost from the start that there was only going to be one winner. The fact that stand-in Cork goalkeeper Daniel Walsh was the official man of the match says a lot, he made five great saves in the game and it didn't ever look like stemming the tide. Cork were out-thought, out-fought, and thoroughly outplayed from start to finish – and that's a Cork team who saw off Kerry in the opening round with physical strength being a key factor. Tyrone will be red-hot favourites for the final this Saturday and hoping for a double victory on the day.

KERRY HURLING

The Kerry Hurling Championship is down to the last four and no surprise to see these four teams in the hat for the semi-final draw. St. Brendans opened well against Ballyduff but actually trailed by a point late on, but managed to score the last two to scrape through. Lixnaw were much more comfortable against a very understrength Abbeydorney, with the outstanding Conway brothers contributing 0-10 between them. Awaiting those teams after getting a bye in the quarter-finals are last year's finalists, champions Kilmoyley and runners-up Causeway.

LADIES GAA

The Donal Curtin Memorial Cup Finals were played last Monday night.

Division One: Southern Gaels 4-11 Rathmore 1-13 The Division One Final was a repeat of last year's County Championship Fi8nal, except without county players, but with a different result. On this occasion Southern Gaels were quickest out of the box, a goal from Ellie O'Connell giving them a 1-5 to 0-2 lead. Further goals from Cliona Murphy and Shannon O'Donnell extended that lead to 3-8 to 0-3 at half-time. It could have been more but for a great penalty save by Rathmore keeper Lauren O'Leary. LEONA MAGUIRE MAKES SONDHEIM CUP TEAM

Cavan native Leona Maguire has been having a phenomenal season – a tie for 13th place at the Open in Carnoustie was her ninth top fifteen finish. Better again, it earned her a wild card entry to the team from Sondheim Cup captain Catriona Matthew, making her the first Irish woman to ever play. Europe faces the US next week.

Leona was both excited and intrigued by the honour and the challenge facing her. "I'm really excited, it is something that I have looked forward to. I have played the PING Junior Solheim Cup in 2009 and 2011, it was an incredible thing to be part of the Junior side so to be on the 'big' team is something really special and no Irish person has ever done it before. I think it's going to be great for Irish golf and to show the young girls coming up that it is possible to do things if you set your mind to it. Catriona is a legend in her own right – a winning Solheim Cup captain and a Major winner. For her to think I'm good enough to be on her team is quite humbling and an honour."

PITCH AND PUTT

Medals and trophies once again came Kerry's way at the National U16 Strokeplay Championships in Lakeside, Templemore Co Tipperary last Saturday as all three of Kerry's participating clubs had medals in the three different competitions played. Bryan McCarthy of Deerpark was the trophy winner as he won the U13 Helen McMorrow Memorial Cup for the second time in three years with a score of one over par. Brian had rounds of level and one over par in shooting his winning score as he had previously won the inaugural staging of the event in Glenville back in 2019.

The win came at the same venue where his father Derry had won the Munster Senior Strokeplay back in 1995 as it capped another fine performance following a semi-final appearance in the National Matchplay Championships last month. Jayden Chute of Listowel was third in the section on four over par, one shot behind Adam O'Brien from the host club who was second. Kerry's other semi-finalist in the National Matchplay Championships, Robbie Harnett of Deerpark, missed out by two shots in making it a Kerry double as he finished second overall in the U16 category.

Three under par had been the clubhouse lead for most of the day but Robbie set the new standard with a four under par total that saw him come back from a double bodev on the 9th hole in the second round to play his last nine holes in five under par. That included a Hole-in-One at the 10th as he came in as the new leader (on four under) approaching the closing stages of the event. He would be denied by the player who beat him in the National Matchplay semi-final however as Mark Cadden from Oldcastle in Meath came in with six under par to claim the title outright. Robbie's runner-up finish was the second consecutive year a Deerpark finished runner-up following Fintan Martin's finish in the same position in Athgarvan Co Kildare last September. The finish was a fine one for Robbie in a successful run as an U16 player where he was on two National U16 Kerry Inter-County winning sides in 2018 and 2019 and also won a Munster U13 Boys title in 2019 as well. The Girls competition meanwhile saw Ella Moynihan of Tralee finish second for the second-year-in-arow as well as she was defeated by the player who she got the better of in the National Matchplay final a month earlier. Sarah Cooney of Seapoint in Louth was the winner on 122, nine ahead of Ella, who needed a good second round to get second place on countback from Athgarvan's Beth O'Donoghue who also finished on 131. Ella's sister Sophie claimed her first national prize meanwhile in finishing fourth on 139 as she too won the prize on countback from Megan Ahern of Collins in Cork. Overall a great showing again for Kerry players as the Kerry clubs made up the bulk of entries for the event. They play their County Matchplay in Listowel today (Thursday) which will have a nice end of season feel beyond club level for them. This weekend meanwhile the places for the National Mens Strokeplay finals will be decided in Tralee on Sunday. There are seven senior spots on offer to join National Mens Matchplay champion Damien Fleming who is automatic for this event following his fourth place finish at the delayed 2020 event in St Annes back in June.

There are also eight Intermediate spots on offer in that section while there are five Junior Mens spots on offer. It gets underway with the Juniors at 9am and the Intermediates and Seniors will follow from there. Participants are asked to check with the County Board regarding tee-times later in the week as we await confirmation on potential drop-outs etc. The event is dress code all players are asked to note.

The finals will take place in Navan, Co Meath on the weekend of September 11th/12th.





END OF A GENERATION

with Kathleen's passing

"The saddest moment is when the person who gave you the best memories becomes a memory"

NE year has now passed since the death of Kathleen MacMonagle Keogh whose first anniversary occurs on August 31st. Her sad death, this time last year, poignantly marked the end of an era for one generation of a very well-known and respected Killarney family.

Kathleen was the last surviving member of seven MacMonagle siblings who were best known for their pioneering work in printing, publishing and photography for well over a century.

Born on August 3rd 1926, she grew up in Glebeside, College Street, Killarney, with her parents, Daniel and Catherine, and family. Daniel MacMonagle was a master printer and photographer, who founded Killarney Printing Works and Photography in 1913

and he launched The Kingdom newspaper in 1923. He died in October 1964 and his wife Catherine (née Fogarty) died in March 1975.

Following school in the Presentation Convent and a commercial course in Killarney

Technical School in the 1940s, Kathleen worked in Mrs McDonnell's Electrical & amp;

Photographic Store on College Street, a business that specialised in film processing, which was a skill she had a natural flair for. She worked in Hilliard's Department Store, on Main Street, during the 1950s and, in later years, she enjoyed working alongside her brothers, Paddy and Seán MacMonagle, in Killarney Printing Works.

Kathleen married Tim Keogh in January 1957 and they had five sons, Seán, Don, Tim, Francis and Eamonn, initially living in Upper Sunny Hill before moving to Countess Grove.

Sadly, her husband Tim passed away, suddenly, on May 24th 1976 while watching two of his sons playing for his beloved Dr Crokes against town rivals Legion in an Under 12 East Kerry final at Fitzgerald Stadium.

Kathleen knew sorrow and sadness but she demonstrated remarkable resilience through difficult times. She experienced the loss of her own mother, Catherine, her husband Tim and her brother Louis all in the space of a short time span in 1975-76 but she had the strength and faith to keep going to raise her five young sons.

Later she was a devoted and cherished grandmother to Donnchadh, Darragh and Selina and treasured the quality time that she spent with them. Outside of her dedicated family life, Kathleen was a member of the Franciscan Friary Choir, Third Order of St Francis and the Order of the Knights and Dames of Innisfallen.

In her early years she was an accomplished oarswoman with St. Brendan's Rowing Club.

During the course of her life overseas trips to Rome and the Chelsea Flower Show were some highlights while she thoroughly enjoyed family holidays in Dungarvan every summer, visiting her sister May Walsh and family. Despite the fact that there was a 100 mile journey between them for most of their lives, the close bond was never broken and they always remained particularly close. Kathleen had tremendous faith and belief in the power of prayer and rarely missed daily morning Mass in the Franciscan Friary.

She had an enormous lifelong interest in news and current affairs and she also enjoyed hearing of local sporting successes, particularly when it involved Dr Crokes or Kerry teams. Sporting and media personalities often attracted her attention more than the match itself and she was greatly amused by the engaging and colourful personality of charismatic Liverpool manager Jürgen Klopp while the distinctive and descriptive radio commentary by the late Weeshie Fogarty always captured her interest.

Kathleen was extremely close to all of her five brothers and her sister and each of their deaths over the years came as a cruel blow to her. She was predeceased by all of her siblings Louis (1976), Harry (1994), Donal (2001), Seán (2005), May (2013) and Paddy (2014).

At her Requiem Mass in St Mary's Cathedral, principal celebrant, Fr Niall Howard, paid a very warm tribute to Kathleen who he described as a gentle, devoted and caring lady and a wonderful mother, who had a very strong faith and who always put the best interests of her family and



others first. Fr Niall said he got to know her particularly well when she and her brother, Paddy, would attend St Mary's Cathedral for devotions and regular prayer services.

He was joined on the altar by Fr Eamonn O'Driscoll, OFM, Canon Tomás Ó Luanaigh and Fr Paddy O'Donoghue and also in attendance were Franciscan Friary Guardian Br Pat Lynch, and family friend, Br Isidore Cronin OFM.

Hymns in the church were performed by Kathleen's grandniece, Lily MacMonagle, and soloist Maura Reen and the organist was Anita Lakner. Prayers of the faithful were read by the next generation of the MacMonagle family, Kathleen's nieces Catherine, Riona, Ann, Orna and her nephew, Donal Walsh, and by her son Tim, while her two eldest sons, Seán and Don, delivered the readings. In a moving final farewell at the burial in Aghadoe Cemetery, two of Kathleen's sons,

Don and Francis, played one of her favourite tunes, the old Irish ballad Roddy McCorley, on concertina and tin whistle respectively. Kathleen's youngest son, Eamonn, delivered a eulogy remembering her as a wonderful, devoted mother and grandmother and recalling how her love, kindness and generosity knew no bounds as she always put everyone else first. She even focused on the concerns of loyal, faithful family dog, Bob, ahead of herself. Bob's health had declined rapidly in 2020 but he battled on and Kathleen would constantly say that she hoped that Bob would not die before her. The great Bob passed on just a few months before her in May 2020. Eamonn said his mother enjoyed a long and healthy life, always insisting that she never wanted to be a burden on anyone - and stressing that she never was.

Her presence, her calming and reassuring influence and wise words were always a huge source of encouragement to all her family, he said. She always stressed the importance of good manners, to treat others the way you wanted to be treated yourself and to always use the words 'Please' and 'Thank You'.

Kathleen often quoted the prayer of St Teresa of Avila when reassuring others that difficulties and obstacles could be overcome, that everything comes to an end eventually and that people could get over setbacks in life.
