NEW CAR PARK FOR **KILLARNEY**

Killarney is set to get a new car park in early 2018.

Kerry County Council will launch a Part VIII public consultation process in the coming weeks following a decision by councillors in the Killarney Municipal District to acquire a site for car and bus parking on the Rock Road in Killarney.

The site between the Mercy Convent and Áirne Villa at Rock Road measures 1.25 acres approximately and will provide additional parking capacity for the town. A new footpath for pedestrians on the Convent side of Rock Road will also be provided to link the new car/bus park to the town centre.

The acquisition of the site is being finalised and the Part VIII consultation will commence in the coming weeks.

Cathaoirleach of the Killarney Municipal District, Cllr Niall Kelleher welcomed the development saying it would provide much-needed capacity for car and bus parking in Killarney.

"I welcome the acquisition of this site which is ideally located on Rock Road and which will provide additional spaces for parking adjacent to the town centre. I urge people to examine the proposals when the public consultation is launched and to share their views," he told the Killarney Outlook.

"It is absolutely fantastic news and huge credit is due to the council" said Paul O'Neill, President of Killarney Chamber,

"The issue of traffic and parking is the number 1 concern for our members. We have worked, and continue to work closely with the Killarney Municipal District executive and councillors to find solutions" he went on. The Chamber recognises that land procurement is far from straight forward in Killarney. "It is no easy task but the town is only getting busier and though we do not believe that this is the silver bullet to solve our traffic problems, it will certainly help" he commented.

"We will continue to give our input to the elected members and Killarney MD executive and look for further parking solutions, which will help alleviate traffic congestion", he added.



DON'T FORGET TO TURN THE CLOCKS BACK!

On Sunday October 29th at 2am the clocks go back, making mornings slightly lighter and evenings darker. Some will spend an extra hour in bed and others will get out and embrace the day but an interesting fact is that the whole concept of daylight saving was actually introduced in 1907 by the great-greatgrandfather of Coldplay singer Chris Martin! William Lillet published a pamphlet called 'The Waste of Daylight' in a bid to get people out of bed earlier by changing the nation's clocks. Willett then spent the rest of his life trying to convince people his scheme was a good one. Sadly, he died of influenza in 1915 at the age of 58; a year before his clock-changing plan was adopted by the Germans and the UK in 1916. His great-great grandson, Chris Martin however has had huge success with smash hits 'Clocks' and 'Daylight' perhaps inspired by his forefather! There are currently about 70 countries that participate in Daylight Saving Time, though not necessarily on the same schedule as Ireland. Ireland is located in the Greenwich Mean Time zone, sharing the same time as Great Britain, Iceland, Portugal, and some countries in northwest Africa. In Ireland, the maximum 17 hours of sunlight - on the longest day in June (the summer solstice) dwindles to just seven hours and 30 minutes six months later in December (the winter solstice). So don't forget - the clocks go back on October 29th!

ROME ESCAPE LINE HEROINE DIES AGED 93

On Sunday October 1st, in the presence of her family, Rome Escape Line heroine Gemma Sands (nee Chevalier) died peacefully at her home in Aldershot in England.

Inspired by the bravery of her widowed mother Henrietta, and still only in her midteens Gemma played a very important role in the Rome Escape Line for Monsignor Hugh O'Flaherty, as she moved escapees and vital messages and supplies during World War 2 in Rome. Despite the grave and very real risk to their own freedom and lives, Gemma, her mother and some of her 7 siblings, helped to keep many Allied escapees safe from the grasp of the Nazi's during this time.

Shortly after the war ended, Gemma met and

married English soldier Kenneth Sands serving with the post-war military administration in Rome. They were married by Monsignor Hugh and they subsequently moved to Aldershot in

Gemma was awarded the British Empire Medal (BEM) and was awarded a certificate thanking her for all that she had done by Field Marshall Alexander, head of Allied forces in the Mediterranean.

"It is hard to imagine how much courage it took for a 17-year-old girl to do what she did in the Nazi occupied city of Rome, where escapees and those that were helping them were being mercilessly hunted down by the Gestapo", Chair of the Memorial Society Jerry O'Grady told the



"In 2016, during the 3rd Memorial Society Tour of Rome, it was an historic and emotional moment when representatives of the Chevalier, Derry and O'Flaherty families gathered outside the Via Imperia apartment building where Henrietta Chevalier and her 8 children lived and where they successfully hid so many Allied escapees from November 1943 to June 1944" he added.

On behalf of the Memorial Society Jerry O'Grady extended sincere and heartfelt condolences to the Sands family.

The selfless deeds of Gemma Sands will never be forgotten.

USING YOUR PENSION TO REDUCE YOUR TAX BILL

Pension contributions provide a way of paying less income tax. Up to Revenue Limits, contributions to a pension qualify for relief from income tax. This effectively means that, where the higher rate of income tax is 40% and you are a higher rate taxpayer, a €100 contribution to a pension will only have a net cost to you of €60 (had you not made the contribution, the other €40 would have gone to the government as income tax).

Pensions carry another tax benefit: they grow free of tax, unlike deposit accounts in Banks etc (which are generally subject to tax on interest in the form of DIRT) or investment in property or shares (where rent or dividends are liable to income tax and gains in value are subject to Capital Gains Tax).

When pension benefits are drawn down, a Retirement Lump Sum can usually be taken either completely free of tax or subject to a beneficial rate. The rest of the benefit, usually taken in the form of an ARF or an annuity, is taxable. However many people will find themselves in a lower tax bracket in retirement than when they were working and making contributions, and so will have made a net gain from tax relief.

The Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr John Sheahan has welcomed the proposed development of a wastewater pumping station in the townland of Clashnagarrane, Kilcummin, as part of the Kilcummin Sewerage Scheme. The proposal has been granted by An Bord Pleanala based on the submissions of the planning application and the appeal which included the Natura impact statement. It was found that the proposed development would not seriously injure the amenities of the surrounding area and is therefore in accordance with planning and sustainable development in the area. The wastewater pumping station will include a below-ground peak flow holding tank, a belowground pump sump with duty and standby pumps. There will be odour control, electrical

and telemetry systems which will be housed in an above ground building with an access road to the station from the rear of Pairc Chuimin Estate. There will be an emergency over flow from the station adjacent watercourse which discharges to the River Deenagh. It is welcome news for the people in the area.



The book echoes an era of social and cultural uprising in Ireland as the country began dancing the weekends away to the sounds of showbands in newly-built ballrooms.



MINIMUM WAGE INCREASE 2018

The Minimum Wage in Ireland will be increased from January 1st 2018.

The Low Pay Commission recommended in June this year that the National Minimum Wage for an experienced adult worker should be set at a rate of €9.55 per hour.

The rates of the Minimum Wage that will apply from January 2018

- Experienced adult worker €9.55 per hour.
- Over 19 and less than 2 years since first job €8.60 per hour.
- Over 18 and less than 1 years since began first job €7.64 per hour.
- Aged under 18 €6.69 per hour.

An experienced adult worker — for the purposes of the National Minimum Wage Act is an employee who has an employment of any kind in any 2 years over the age

For example: A 19 year old gets his first job on June 1st 2018 - he is entitled to €7.64 an hour. He won't be entitled to €8.60 an hour until June 1st 2019 — the first anniversary of his first job. He won't be entitled to €9.55 an hour until June 1st 2020 - the second anniversary of his first job. It doesn't matter how long he worked in each job or if there were gaps in employment.

FOCUS ON DIVIDING **HERBACEOUS PERENNIALS**


If you divide your herbaceous Perennials regularly it will ensure healthy, vigorous plants that will look good and should perform year after year. It also gives you the opportunity to multiply your plants.

Every two to three years should be enough to divide most perennials to maintain good vigor and healthy plants but if you want to divide them for the purpose of propagation, it can be done more regularly.

The best time to divide herbaceous Perennials is when the plants are dormant, so anytime from November to mid March. A lot of spring flowering plants such as Irises, are best divided in Summer after flowering when they produce new shoots.

When you have divided your plant and you have either planted some in the border or in pots, remember to keep well watered until established.

Know Your Rights:

ONLINE SHOPPING AND IMPORT CHARGES

OUESTION

I want to do some of my Christmas shopping on American websites. What are the rules about VAT and customs duties when shopping outside the EU

ANSWER

You are importing goods if you buy goods from abroad online or from a mail order catalogue, or if you get goods that are sent as a gift from abroad. In general, when goods are imported into Ireland from a country outside of the EU, they become liable to import charges. These include VAT, customs duty and excise or other duties where relevant. In some cases, you can get relief from import charges.

If someone sends you a gift from outside the EU, and it is valued at under €45, you do not have to pay customs duty or VAT. To qualify for this relief, the gift must be of an occasional nature and sent from one private individual to another. You can buy some goods from outside the EU up to a value of €22 without paying VAT. The value is calculated on the full value of the item, plus postage and duties. This is also the value that is used to calculate VAT, if it is payable. If you buy goods from outside the EU valued at more than €150, you will have to pay customs duty as well. Customs duty is normally calculated as a percentage of the full value of the goods including the cost of postage, packaging and insurance. VAT, customs duty and excise duty are always charged on excisable products (such as alcohol, tobacco and perfume) from outside the EU, whatever their value.

All packages received from outside of the EU require a customs declaration, which is usually completed by the sender. The declaration should include a description of the goods, the value and whether they are gifts or commercial items. Some websites offer to undervalue your goods to avoid import charges. This is illegal. You, as the importer of the goods, are responsible for ensuring that the information provided is accurate and that all duties and taxes are paid. Some websites may also promise delivery from within the EU, which would eliminate any import charges, but are in fact shipping their products from outside the EU. If this is the case, you are liable to duties and VAT.

THE IMPORTANCE OF COMMUNICATION

When people come along to counselling, and begin talking about their problems, it sometimes becomes apparent that some of their difficulties may be down to the challenge of communicating with the other people in their lives.

This can apply to any of us. Whether discussing issues in our relationship with a partner or other family member, or with friends or colleagues, we are quite likely to say 'He knows how I feel about this, or 'She knows how difficult I find that,' or 'I'm not going to ask them for help because I shouldn't need to ask, they should just know what to do, and so on. Sound familiar?

All this ignores a fundamental reality - we cannot assume other people know what we think, or how we feel, or what we need, unless we tell them. We are all equipped with a degree of intuition, and some people can be very 'tuned in' to the thoughts and feelings of others. But we cannot always rely on intuition alone. For example, someone may long for their partner to open up about a shared difficulty in their lives, while the partner may want exactly the same thing, but feel they 'shouldn't go there' because they think this would be unwelcome. Two people, who long to connect with each other, may grow further apart because of a gap in communication.

Of course we all need, and are entitled to, our privacy. We don't have to wear our heart on our sleeve all the time. What we are thinking about here is building bridges and sustaining connections with the significant people around us, rather than seeing those connections weaken through a lack of communication, with all the misunderstandings, frustrations, conflict, hurt and loneliness that can ensue.

As children, we may have been fortunate enough to have an adult around who tuned in to our feelings and tended to our needs, before we were old enough to put those feelings and needs into words. Even if we don't realise it, perhaps a bit of us still quite naturally longs for that sort of automatic understanding from others. But, as adults, we probably need to play our part in making ourselves known and understood. The counselling process can offer a safe space where we can start putting things into words, gradually find our own voice, and become more confident about making ourselves known to another person.

Denis had previously met with Paul on a number of occasions, the first occasion was here in Killarney in January 1993 when Denis was the Club Captain for our Centenary year, and an exhibition/challenge match was arranged to mark the occasion, and Paul who was partnered by Philip Walton defeated John McHenry and our own Eoghan O'Connell by 68 strokes to 71 strokes.

Paul graciously accepted the award on the 8th of January 2015, when his name was added to our list of Honorary Life Members. Denis was also present when Paul and Padraig Harrington famously defeated Tiger Woods and Davis Love 111 at Oakland Hills U.S.A. in the 2004 Ryder Cup by 4/3 after they had gone two down after two holes against the Americans, Denis has Paul's Golf glove as a treasured memento of the occasion.

Paul's career include 3 Winning Ryder Cup successes in 2002. 04, and in 2006, when the Ryder Cup was played at the K Club in Co. Kildare. In 2002 Paul had the honour of holing the winning putt of the Ryder Cup when he holed his putt on the 18th green in his match against Jim Furyk at the Belfry, in England, it was from about 10 feet, and Paul has since described this putt as the single Golf stroke as being the most decisive and defining moment of his entire playing career, and for which he will be forever remembered. Paul has remained undefeated in his singles matches in the Ryder Cup. Paul has also won 9 tournaments worldwide, and they include his winning partnership with Padraig Harrington in the World Cup of Golf when it was played at the Ocean Course Kiawah Island South Carolina U.S.A. in 1993. Padraig is also an "Honorary Life Member" of Killarney Golf and Fishing Club, it was awarded to Padraig in 2010.

FIREWORKS ARE ILLEGAL

For those of you that like putting the lives of the Emergency Services and public at risk and enjoy terrifying the elderly, babies and animals - are you willing to face a fine of up to of €2,500 or to imprisonment for up to 6 months or both? Yes folks that is the penalty you could face if you are found in possession of a firework without having a licence to import, or for their use even in your own property, or if the person caught using them supplies your name to the Gardai.

TIPS FOR PROVIDING A SAFE HALLOWEEN FOR ALL ANIMALS

Farmers it is now time to double check your roadside fences especially to make sure they are stockproof and to make your cubicle houses, fields and feeding yards etc as safe as possible to prevent injury or death to terrified animals and also make sure your farm dogs are secured in comfortable surroundings they cannot escape from.

As it impossible to know when fireworks will be set off keep your pets inside as much as possible, from this weekend until November 2nd preferably with human companionship. Keep your dog on a lead while it does its necessary in the garden and provide clean litter trays for cats etc. If you are unable to be present to comfort your pet leave a radio switched on. Make sure your pets do not escape when you answer the door to 'trick or treaters' and if you are having a party remember all alcohol and most human foods are poisonous to pets - it is really safer to keep your pets in rooms away from all the excitement.

Provide a safe place inside for your pets to retreat. When scared of sounds they can't orient, dogs often prefer small enclosed areas. Keep the curtains closed, and also the windows. Make sure all your dogs are wearing ID tags with a properly fitting collar. (Dogs have been known to become Houdini around Halloween.) Leave your pet something fun to do - like a frozen Kong filled with his favourite treats.

If a pet or any animal goes missing at Halloween or any other time, please place notices in shop windows etc. also contact your local Garda Station, the numerous animal shelters throughout the County and the Kerry Co. Council Pound at 066 - 7183 700.

THE ORIGIN OF HALLOWEEN

Samhain, the Celtic festival of the dead was celebrated on October 31st with big bonfires,



parades and dressing up in costumes.

In later years The All Saints Day celebration which falls on November 1st was also called Allhallows or All-hallowmas (from Middle English Alholowmesse meaning All Saints' Day). The night before it, Samhain, began to be called Allhallows Eve and, eventually, Halloween.

The tradition of the Jack-o'-Lantern stems from Ireland, England and Scotland, where ghostly flickering lights, a natural phenomenon known as "ignis fatuus" or "fool's fire" that might be seen in the distance over bogs, swamps or marshes and would disappear upon approach. It was thought to be trying to lure night-time travellers off the safe roads. In Ireland, the story goes that an unsavoury character named Stingy Jack kept tricking the devil into not claiming his soul upon death. When he got to heaven, he found that God didn't want him because of his misdeeds, so he was condemned to roam the earth with nothing but a burning coal to light his way. He carved a turnip into a lantern and became known as "Jack o' the Lantern."

Across Britain and the continent, people started making their own spooky lights from various indigenous hard vegetables that were carved out and lit from within with candles. Immigrants to America brought the tradition with them and began using locally grown pumpkins, which were larger and easier to carve.

The American tradition of "trick-or-treating" dates back to early All Souls' Day parades in England. During festivities, poor citizens would beg for food and richer families would give pastries called "soul cakes" in return for a promise to pray for the wealthier family's dead

The practice, which was referred to as "going a-souling" was eventually taken up by children who would visit the houses in their neighbourhood and be given ale, food and money. It is believed that this is the first time the celebration turned into a community event.

FROM RAGS TO RICHES

When Dr. Charles Mully was growing up in Kenya, he lived in an abusive home for the first six years of his life. His father was an alcoholic and he was abandoned at just six years of age. For 10 years, he survived as a beggar, living on the streets. Though he attended and finished primary school, Mr. Mully couldn't afford secondary school. Growing tired of being homeless, he took it upon himself to walk more than 40 miles to Nairobi, where he found a job in a private home.

Eventually, he gained more lucrative employment and was able to save up enough money to buy a vehicle. From there, he started his first business — a transportation company. He went on to start multiple other companies and by his late 20s, the once-homeless boy was valued in the millions.

When his car was stolen by street children, he saw himself in them. Knowing that he had to help them, rather than giving them money to return his car, he took on a new life passion: saving underprivileged children.

He had long felt guilty for all his wealth and when he was confronted by the homeless kids, he saw an opportunity. Mr. Mully liquidated all his businesses despite having a loving wife and seven children, and began bringing children back to his family's home.

The once-wealthy entrepreneur's family thought he was crazy. Mully even went so far as to send his children off to higher education at boarding schools so he could make more room in their home for other street kids.

From 1989 to 1995, Mr. Mully and his wife took in more than 300 children. But their home was



too small for such numbers, so they began looking for a new place to run Mully Children's Family (MCF).

The organisation found land in an arid part of Kenya and began building. Soon, the Ndalani outpost was a 503-acre self-sustaining farm. The Mully's continued to take in more and more children, educating them, housing them, and showing them that love existed in the world. Since the beginning, Mr. Mully and his family have taken in more than 13,000 children. They've gone on to become engineers, doctors, teachers, lawyers, and scientists. And nowadays, there are multiple MCF outposts. The Mully's goal is now to start a university.

HIKER RESCUED A ROOSTER AND CARRIED HIM 42 MILES TO SAFETY

Heather Bolint was not expecting to rescue a rooster while of hiking the Appalachian Trail. Heather Bolint is an animal advocate but a few months ago, the 31-year-old left a job with The Humane League, working on farm animal protection measures, in order to fulfil her lifelong dream to hike the Appalachian Trail from Maine to Georgia. Still devoted, Heather had been using the hike as a fundraiser for the animals.

By 9 a.m. on Oct. 10, heather had already hiked 4 miles that morning. She'd completed 1,124 miles of her hike altogether, and was in Pennsylvania, about a half-mile north of the Mason-Dixon Line.

That's when this very "fancy rooster appeared out of nowhere. The rooster in question was on a trail, about 30 feet from a rural road, with no houses nearby. Heather sat on a log, while eating some snacks and waiting to see if the rooster would depart on his own or if he'd be collected by another person. "But he just stuck around" she said

She walked around for a good long while to see if there was any evidence of a home the rooster might belong to. There wasn't. It's possible the rooster, who seemed comfortable around people, had been left to fend for himself in an area with many predators and she later heard that another hiker had seen the rooster there a couple of days earlier.

"I was afraid that someone just dropped him off there because it was a quiet country road, and because he was a rooster, which people don't always desire," she said.

Given her professional background and passion for animals, plus having always taken care of creatures in need, what choice did Ms. Bolint have? Holding the rooster close to her body, they proceeded along the trail. Now familiar with one another, she called him Eddie.

Over the course of the following 24 hours, Heather carried Eddie for 42 miles, from Pennsylvania to West Virginia, having stopped about every hour so he could forage for insects and plants and drink some water.

The two reached Harper's Ferry, West Virginia, at noon the next day where Heathers boyfriend, who works for another farm animal advocacy group, met them with his car. He suggested reaching out to a farm animal sanctuary called Poplar Spring, located on 400 acres in western Maryland.

"We rescue farm animals from many bizarre situations, but this one was definitely unique," Poplar Spring co-founder Terry Cummings renamed the rooster Mason, in tribute to the location where he was found. Mason settled in well and went through a quarantine period



until the veterinarian deemed him safe to interact with the sanctuary's other animals and he is now living a wonderful, happy life.

THE CEO WHO GAVE 90% OF HIS SALARY TO HIS STAFF

In April of this year Dan Price, CEO of the Seattle-based tech company Gravity Payments did something with barely any precedents in the modern business world. He gave away 90 per cent of his own pay to raise the salaries of his 120 employees to a minimum \$70,000 a

When he announced the decision to his staff "There was a moment of stunned silence. Some people were looking around at each other, a few jaws had dropped, and then someone actually asked me to repeat myself. Then the team started clapping, cheering, and giving each other high fives. It was an emotional moment" he said.

Mr. Price's decision came after reading a study by Professors Angus Deaton and Daniel Kahneman of Princeton University, which found that emotional wellbeing rises with income up to a cut-off point of \$75,000 dollars, after which extra pay has no effect on happiness. At first Mr. Price struggled to make the numbers work, but after a while he realised that by cutting his own pay and using some company profits, he could

FEARLESS HERDING DOG SURVIVES **CALIFORNIA WILDFIRES AFTER REFUSING TO ABANDON HIS GOATS:**

A brave goat-herding dog who refused to abandon his flock amidst the deadly California wildfires miraculously survived the flames that burned the entire property.

Odin is one of two Great Pyrenees who take turns guarding the Handel family's eight goats from coyotes and mountain lions, and he was on duty the night the fires broke out.

As the raging fires encroached upon their home, Roland Handel had to make a splitsecond decision: try to force his dog Odin into the car, or leave him behind.

"My daughter and myself had opened the gates so the animals could flee and loaded up our 3 other dogs and 2 cats in the family car, but Odin, our stubborn and fearless Great Pyrenees would not leave the goats. Even under the best of circumstances it is nearly impossible to separate Odin from the goats after nightfall when he takes over the close watch from his sister Tessa. I made a decision to leave him, and I doubt I could have made him come with us if I tried. We got out with our lives and what was in our pockets" Mr. Handel said.

Mr. Handel returned the next day to discover that his home and everything else on the property was completely destroyed - except for Odin, who was there waiting for him with all eight goats.

"Eight goats came running to see us and get cuddles and kisses," he said. "Dixon has a burn on his back the size of a nickel. Other than that they are perfectly fine. Odin's fur is burned and his whiskers melted. He was limping on his right leg. And he has adopted several baby deer who huddle around him for safety and water from the goat trough, which is miraculously intact and full of relatively clean water" Mr. Handel added.
