

## **KILLARNEY** MAN **LAUNCHES** HISTORIC **BOOK**

Killarney man Tony Horgan launched his book 'The Lark In The Bower Sang Sad Songs' on Thursday last (February 20th 2014) in the Lower Lake Room at The Malton Hotel Killarney. The book is a social history of his time growing up in Killarney during the hungry 30s and then his life in Hammersmith, London in the 1940s. Tony, has been very supportive of the Irish in London, was integral to the setting up of the Irish Cultural Centre in Hammersmith and also donated generously to the appeal to erect a Memorial to the Royal Munster Fusiliers who served in the First World War back in Killarney. He was invited to attend the opening ceremony by Michael Courtney, and he wore his father Michael Horgan's medals when the memorial was unveiled by Mary McAleese on 1st October 2009. Many of the stories and details of Killarney in the book are lost or forgotten and he has often been contacted by the general public and historians for his knowledge which is why he put pen to paper. The retail price is €12 but he sold copies on the night for €10. Apart from being a piece of social history, it also details his successes having overcome the prejudices the Irish experienced on arrival and the hardships they faced in a 'sink or swim' scenario. His dream has now been realised.



With a total of €800,000 raised in Kerry to date services funded include Night Nursing, which provides extra support for the person who is ill and wishes to remain at home being cared for by their family. The National Cancer Helpline (Freefone 1800 200 700) which is a free and

confidential service staffed by specialist cancer nurses. Last year the helpline received over 17,000 enquiries with 155 of these coming from Kerry while the society also distributed almost 2,000 cancer information booklets to people concerned about cancer in Kerry. The money raised also went towards the society's financial aid programme which provides a grant to support cancer patients who are experiencing hardship due to their diagnosis. During 2013 financial aid to the value of €1,182,744 was also provided to 1,836 cancer patients across the country with €35,210 going to cancer patients in Kerry.



loss that lasts is to adopt a healthier lifestyle which includes a balanced diet and regular physical activity," said Ms. Mee. ## **CHERNOBYL GROUP FUNDRAISE FOR NEW PROJECT**

The Killarney Branch of the Friends of the Children have been bringing children to Killarney for the past 21 year, over 400 in total for a months holiday every July. The children are hosted by generous families in the Killarney and surroundings areas for two weeks at a time. This task has become much harder in recent years with the committee finding it increasingly difficult to find families to keep the children. The group also helped to equip, repair and carry out renovation to hospitals, schools and houses for the needy.

During their regular visits to the region, committee members have realised that the conditions in Belarus were worsening. children with intellectual and physical disabilities are living in appalling conditions with mothers who are in desperate straits. The group's work is increasingly focused on the families and the villages where the children are living, realizing as they do that the children's health benefits greatly when families and communities are supported. This support comes in the form of food on a weekly

The charity also supplies dressings for leg

ulcers, nappies, and sudocrem to the elderly and incapacitated in the villages from which the children are brought. At present there are 7 working groups in Ireland. Not all groups bring children to Ireland as some groups have chosen to help with supplies. In December 2012 the charity became international and now has charitable status in Belarus.

Members of the Killarney Branch of the Children of Chernobyl, Betty Crosbie, Liz Griffin, Kathleen Collins, Mary O'Leary, Francis O'Toole and Sheila Goulding visited the area in 2013

and along with members of other branches met with a man who is involved in helping these families.

During the meeting, Deacon Sergei revealed that when his eldest daughter was 3 years old she was diagnosed with a malignant brain tumour. As it was a worrying and stressful time there was medical support however there was no emotional support or help for parents on how to cope with an ill child. Sergei decided to use this experience to help others who found themselves in similar situations. After sourcing a building and land Sergei carried out repairs to make the building live able in. It was opened in 2011 and is open from April to November weather permitting.

As soon as people heard about Sergei's help they approached him with problems such as drug, alcohol addiction etc. Sergei admits that 'I cannot turn anyone away'. In 2006 the hospice in Sasnovichy began, 15km from Pinsk. His main sponsors are a group in Rye, United Kingdom, this group finance 1 doctor and 2 nurses. Other funds are raised through a website from voluntary donations, as a result of talks given by Sergei himself. Sergei became a deacon in July 2013 and his dream is simple to build a multi-purpose house that would provide him and his staff with the facilities to:

- 1. Give counselling to children of alcoholic parents.
- 2. Give help and support to parents of children with life threatening illness
- 3. Room for children with speech and learning difficulties.

Since their first meeting the Killarney group have provided Fr. Sergei with supplies such as surgical gloves, sudocrem, pressure relieving dressings and much needed money to help families care for their loved ones. Following a request by Fr Sergei that the group could organise help for adults and children suffering from cerebral palsy, two students are planning to travel to the region in May. Both girls are eager, and enthusiastic and are full of ideas and hope which is what is needed for this project. They will teach the parents of sick children how to help them to have a better quality of life. 



## **Know Your Rights:**

## **MEDICAL CARDS FOR OVER-70S**

### **OUESTION**

I am 72 years of age and I think I may be eligible for a medical card. How much income can I have and still qualify?

### **ANSWER**

To qualify for a medical card from the Health Service Executive (HSE), your weekly income must be below a certain figure. The assessment of a couple for medical card purposes is based on the age of the older person.

Since 1 January 2014, the weekly income guidelines for medical cards for people aged over 70 have changed. The gross income limit for the over-70s medical card is €500 (was €600) for a single person and €900 (was €1,200) for couples.

Your total income is taken into account in the means test. There are no standard deductions allowable, for example, for income tax. Pensions, earnings, interest from capital and all other sources of income are included.

Savings or similar investments of up to €36,000 for a single person and €72,000 for a couple are disregarded. A notional rate of interest is applied by the HSE to the balance. Alternatively, the HSE will apply the actual rate if you provide a certificate of interest paid on savings in the last full calendar year. Property will not be assessed in the means test unless it is generating a rental income.


If your income is above the limit for a medical card, you may be eligible for a GP visit card. To qualify for it, your gross weekly income must not be over €700 for a single person or €1,400 for a couple. A GP visit card allows you to visit your family doctor

If your income is over the above limits, you can still apply for the ordinary medical card or the GP visit card on hardship grounds, for example, if you would have difficulty meeting significant ongoing medical expenses without it.



# RURAL KERRY IS UNDER ATTACK FROM THIS GOVERNMENT

Rural Kerry is under attack from the Government, according to Fianna Fail candidate Niall Kelleher, who has raised concerns about what he has described as ongoing attacks on rural Ireland and rural Kerry.

His comments come on the back of alarming reports about the future of rural Post Offices. Niall Kelleher has stated that Post Offices throughout rural Kerry could face closure, if the proposals from the Government go ahead. "It is alarming that Minister Pat Rabbitte continues with his plans to move towards electronic payments and the use of bank accounts" said Niall Kelleher.

According to Niall Kelleher "I am shocked and concerned with what the Government is proposing with regard to Post Offices. If the Government succeed with their proposals, we could see almost every post office across Ireland loose up to a third of it's income. This will be as a direct result of the removal of social welfare payments, leaving many of these business unsustainable. We need to be vigilant about what is happening, as An Post appear to be trying to partner with the global supermarket chain Tesco, to provide the new post and pay partnership."

"All of us know that for many people, the weekly visit to the local Post Office may be the only social outing for many people in Kerry. I will continue to fight for the preservation of as many services as is possible for rural parts of Kerry. We need to unite to oppose any draconian steps that further hurt rural Ireland."

"This latest development has followed the Governments closure of rural Garda Stations in Kerry and has the potential be a further slap in the face to hard pressed families of Kerry. The only thing that I can conclude is that rural Kerry is under sustained attack from this Government" concluded Niall Kelleher.

# CAHILL CALLS FOR SUPPORT FOR POST OFFICE NETWORK



Councillor Michael Cahill has called on the Minister for Communications, Energy & Natural Resources and the Government to support the Post Office Network. The Killorglin Councillor who raised the matter at this months meeting of Kerry County Council said that up to 500 Post Offices will close in Ireland between now and 2017, if action is not taken immediately. Councillor Cahill said if the proposal to remove all Social Welfare payments from Post Offices is followed through and transferred to the Banks, that it will finish Rural Ireland and in particular

Councillor said Post Offices employ up to 3,000 and the impact of this proposal will be devastating for small towns and villages. The Killorglin Councillor said the Irish Government should take into consideration as an example the UK model, whereby 12 years ago they introduced subvention. The Independent Councillor said in 2013 the UK Government paid £210 million pounds sterling resulting in a £49 million after tax profit and but for the subvention this would have resulted in an after tax loss of £161 million. This proves the UK model has failed and the Post Office Network in the UK is still in serious trouble despite subvention stated Councillor Cahill. The Killorglin Councillor said community life revolves around the local Post Office and if it goes so will local businesses such as the local shop and pub, etc. This will take the life and soul out of communities in Kerry if it goes through stated the Mid Kerry Councillor. This Government should be supporting and allotting additional services to Post Offices and not jeopardising their future stated Cllr. Cahill. Councillor Cahill said all Kerry TD's should support the Private Members Motion of which Deputy Fleming is a member and signatory. Councillor Sean Counihan supported Councillor Cahill's proposal.

# CLOSING DATE FOR 2014 SPORTS CAPITAL PROGRAMME

Labour Senator Marie Moloney, wishes to remind local clubs and sporting organisations that the closing date for funding under the 2014 Sports Capital Programme is fast approaching.

The 2014 round of sports capital funding will allocate €40million to local sports clubs to improve and develop facilities such as changing rooms, pitches and floodlights, as well as providing funding for regional facilities. "Clubs and sporting organisations had to register online by the 07th of February, however, the deadline for completed applications is today February 28th. Clubs and sporting organisations should ensure that their application is completed by this date".

#### **FOCUS ON HEDGING**


Hedges can make a much more natural background to a garden than a wall or a fence. They can provide shelter and are cheaper and require a small amount of maintenance. Because a hedge allows the wind to filter through it reduces its velocity. Tall or low growing, clipped or informal, there is a hedging plant for every purpose. One thing to remember about a hedge is that it is intended to be a permanent feature in the garden so therefore should be chosen with care and planted in well prepared soil.

## To choose the right hedge for your garden here are a few pointers to think about

- . 1. The type of soil you have
- 2. How exposed the garden is, i.e. what direction is it facing
- 3. The eventual height and width the hedge will be
- 4. Does it need to be evergreen

When you have chosen the type of hedge that you want its time to prepare the soil. Start preparing the soil by digging thoroughly and forking in some well rotted farmyard manure. Hedges can be planted all year around but the ideal time is between November and March as all hedging plants will be dormant at this time. What that means is when you go to buy your hedging plants they are lifted straight from the ground and are called bare-rooted hedging. This enables you to replant straight back into the ground when you get them home. Just make sure that when planting that the roots are spread out well as this will encourage them to root quickly when the growing season starts. If you have missed the bare rooted season at the end of March you can plant container grown hedging all year around. Next week I will focus on trees.


# BREAK FREE FROM EMOTIONAL EATING!



#### THE BENEFITS OF STOPPING SMOKING

Stopping smoking can make a big difference to your health and lifestyle. It is never too late to stop smoking to greatly benefit your health.

Even if you give up after the age of 60, your risk of dying at any given age is reduced by about 39% compared to a person who carries on smoking.

Reduce the risk of getting serious smoking-related diseases such as heart disease, cancers, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) and peripheral

Reduce the risk of getting various other conditions which, although not lifethreatening, can cause unpleasant problems. For example: impotence (erection problems), fertility problems, optic neuropathy (a condition affecting the nerve supplying the eye), cataracts, macular degeneration (a breakdown of tissue at the back of the eye), psoriasis, gum disease, tooth loss, osteoporosis and Raynaud's phenomenon (fingers going white or blue when exposed to cold).

Reduce the risk of pregnancy complications if you are pregnant.

# **Treat yourself this** Pancake Tuesday

## **SEAFOOD PANCAKE**

#### **Ingredients:**

#### For the Pancakes

- 4oz/115g plain flour
- Pinch salt
- 1 egg
- 300ml milk
- 1 tsp melted butter plus melted butter for cooking

#### For the Filling

- 11/2 tbsp all purpose/plain flour
- 1½ tbsp butter
- 250 ml milk
- Pinch salt and pepper
- 225g cooked skinless salmon fillet
- 120g prawns
- 120g mushrooms, cleaned and finely sliced
- 1 tbsp fresh dill, finely chopped
- 2 tbsp grated cheddar cheese

#### **Preparation:**

#### Pancake Recipe

- Sieve the flour into a large baking bowl, add the salt. Make a well in the centre of the flour and add the eggs and beat well until smooth and lump free.
- Add half the milk and the tsp of butter, beat well. Add the remaining milk and stir.
- Leave the batter to rest for 15 minutes.
- Lightly grease a 9" pancake or frying pan with a little melted butter, heat until very hot and add in batter to evenly and thinly coat the base of the pan. Cook until set and lightly golden. Flip over and cook on the other side for approx 30 seconds.
- Remove the pancake from the pan, place on a sheet of kitchen 5. paper and keep warm. Continue as above until all the batter is used up.

## **Filling**

Place the flour and butter into a large saucepan. Over a low heat stir the butter and flour until the butter has melted and the flour is incorporated. Add a pinch of salt and pepper and continue stirring for 2 minutes.

- Turn the heat up to medium and add the milk in one go and whisk furiously until all a smooth sauce is formed. Continue stirring until the sauce is thickened and glossy (about 5 minutes) If the sauce is very thick add a little more milk. The sauce should be thick but still runny. Remove from the heat.
- Break the salmon fillet into large flakes and carefully stir into the sauce, followed by the prawns, mushrooms and dill. Return to a gentle heat and warm through.
- Place a pancake onto the worktop, put a quarter of the seafood sauce mixture into the centre of the pancake and spread in a long line from one end to the other. Fold the opposite edge of the pancake over the filling then roll the pancake into a thick sausage shape. Place the pancake into an approx 7" ovenproof baking dish. Repeat with the remaining 3 pancakes.
- Sprinkle the cheese over and bake in the preheated oven for  $20\,$ 4. minutes or until the cheese is melted but not browned. Serve immediately with green vegetables or a salad.



# A LOOK AT HYBRID CARS

Hybrid cars are becoming more widely available and more popular these days and with good reason too. They're a more eco-friendly car than petrol or diesel only vehicles and there's great scope to save on


A hybrid car refers to any vehicle that combines two or more sources of power. While there are quite a few options, most hybrid cars combine an electric motor with an internal combustion engine. Hybrid cars are capable of being driven on electronic propulsion alone for a material part of their normal driving cycle.

Hybrid cars and the environment:

- Hybrid cars burn less fossil fuels than traditional cars and therefore emit less toxic by products and greenhouse gases than traditional petrol or diesel fueled vehicles.
- Hybrid cars also generate less engine noise than petrol or diesel powered cars. When switched onto electric power mode hybrid vehicles are virtually silent.



Whilst hybrid cars are generally more expensive to buy than a petrol or diesel engine car, savings can be made in terms of fuel economy as they burn less fuel per mile driven. Just how



much fuel you can save driving a hybrid car will depend on your driving patterns and overall driving style. For example if you do a lot of city driving you are likely to save more on fuel consumption compared with a normal petrol or diesel fuelled vehicle.

Getting the most out of your hybrid car:

Drive slowly - the faster your driving the more aerodynamic drag your car will experience. Keeping your driving speed down can really increase your vehicle's mileage.

Drive smoothly - if you stop the car sharply, the electric motor's energy will be decreased more than if you gradually slow the car down before

Drive at a constant speed - you use energy when driving every time your car speeds up -

and that energy is wasted when you slow the car down. You can maximize your fuel usage when driving through maintaining a constant driving speed.

#### **HYBRID CARS AND MOTOR TAX**

Normal petrol or diesel vehicles are subjected to vehicle registration tax in accordance with their CO2 emissions.

#### **CAR INSURANCE ADVANTAGES**

Many car insurance companies will provide a 10% discount for hybrid vehicle owners. Tips on identifying pothole damage:

- The front end of your vehicle dips when you
- You can feel your vehicle roll or sway while turning.

- In general your vehicle feels like it's sitting a

little lower at the front or the rear.

- If you stop suddenly you experience a loss of directional control.







## **5 MYTHS ABOUT PERSONAL HYGIENE:**

Washing your hands. Brushing your teeth. Shampooing your hair. They're so engrained into our daily routine we barely give them a second thought. But should we?

1. Myth: Public Toilets Should Be Avoided at All Costs.

**Reality:** They're not nearly as dangerous as many people think. There are certainly germs living on public toilet seats, but the odds of actually getting sick from those germs is very, very small. For one thing, your body's skin is a natural defence against scary disease-causing germs if they even live long enough to infect

2. Myth: You Need to Wash Your Hair Every Day.

Reality: A nice, hot shower is just what many of us need to wake up in the morning or wind down at night. But should you really be washing your hair every day? Probably not. Though how often you wash your hair depends on a number of factors, including the type of hair you have, the health of your scalp, and how long or processed it is, almost none of us need to lather up our locks every single day. That's because shampoo strips your hair of its natural oils; it will also make your hair more difficult to style and, ultimately, lead to more damage.

Skip the daily shampooing. If your hair and scalp get too oily between washes, a dry shampoo or baby powder will absorb all that excess oil.

3. Myth: Your Dentist Can't Tell If You Don't Floss.

**Reality:** Slacking on your oral hygiene routine? You dentist can tell, and it's not merely a matter of flossing really well before your appointment. That's because gums that aren't flossed regularly will bleed when you're in the chair; plaque build-up will, over time, lead to cavities and gum disease. You're not outsmarting anyone by only reaching for the floss before a clean-up, and you're only hurting your oral health.

4. Myth: The More You Brush Your Hair, The Healthier It'll Be. **Reality:** It does help prevent tangles and distribute healthy oils. But over-brushing your hair will not improve its condition, it'll actually make it more prone breakage and fraying. That's not to say you shouldn't brush your hair at all, of course.

**5. Myth:** Hand Sanitizer is the Ultimate Defence Against Germs. Reality: Want to avoid getting sick? Skip the hand sanitizer

and wash with plain old soap and water. Even with a hand sanitizer containing more than 60 percent alcohol is only slightly better than soap and water. The United States Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is also concerned that overuse of hand sanitizer will have dire consequences in the long term. Notably, that these germs will develop a resistance to the stuff. In the end, if you're worried about germs, it's far more effective to make sure you're washing your hands correctly than it is to use

## REINDEER WITH GLOW IN THE DARK ANTLERS:

Finland, has begun spraying Reindeers antlers with glowin-the-dark fluorescent dye in an attempt to prevent traffic accidents. Last year alone, more than 4,000 reindeer in Finland were killed in car accidents.

The reflective spray is an alternative to previously attempted solutions such as reflective tape, which the reindeer rip off once applied.

The need is particularly pressing during winter months, when northern Finland plunges into a prolonged darkness (called the polar night) that can last up to 18 hours a day.

The pilot program is tiny at present with the dye being tested on the antlers of just 20 of the 200,000 reindeer that roam Lapland's forests. If found to be effective the spray will be used on reindeer

The region attracts thousands of tourists from around the world, especially during Christmastime, as Lapland claims to be the home of Santa Claus.

## AN IRISH WOMAN WHO LIVED AS A MAN IN THE US **CIVIL WAR:**

Jennie Hodgers, a hero of the American Civil War, was born in Clougherhead, Co. Louth in 1843 and immigrated to the US as a young girl. Not much is known about her early years, but on August 6, 1862 she enlisted with the 95th Illinois Infantry under the name of Albert Cashier.

She was not the only one. Estimates say at least 400 women soldiers fought on the two sides of the conflict – some fighting for patriotism, some to be with their husbands or brothers. others to earn a steady income and, if they survived, a pension. Options available to poor, single women at the time were very limited

Many younger boys lied about their ages in order to join up so it would have been easy to write off Ms. Hodgers' small stature and smooth face to youth. There is no record of Cashier's comrades ever questioning his sex. Cashier excelled as a soldier, serving straight through until August 17, 1865 and taking part in over 40 battles and skirmishes. When captured at Vicksburg she managed to escape by stealing the guard's gun and outrunning the soldiers who pursued her. In a later battle, she braved open enemy fire just to climb a tree and re-attach her company's flag, which had been taken down.

After the war, Ms. Hodgers continued to live as Cashier for close to 50 years, settling in a town in Illinois. Unable to read or write, as a man she was able to secure a variety of jobs, including farm labourer, handyman, and, later, chauffeur to State Senator Ira Lish. While under Lish's employment, she was hit by car, badly injuring her leg. The doctor who treated her discovered her secret, but agreed to keep it safe.

By 1911 she was living in the Soldier's and Sailor's home in Quincy, IL where, by some accounts, a few staff members knew of her sex but kept it secret. Suffering from dementia, in 1913 she was moved to the Watertown State Hospital for the Insane. Following her death on October 11, 1915 she was buried in her Civil War uniform and under a tombstone that read "Albert D.J. Cashier Co G 95III Inf"

## THE STORY BEHIND M&M'S:

In the 1930s, Forrest Mars noticed that soldiers in the Spanish Civil War were eating chocolate pellets coated with hard tempered chocolate to prevent them from melting in high temperatures. In 1941, Mars patented this idea and began producing M&M's in New Jersey.

The name stood for the surnames of himself and Bruce Murrie, the son of Hershey's president, who owned 20% in the company and helped produce the chocolate. Originally the candies were produced solely for American soldiers fighting in World War II and came in a cardboard tube. In 1948, at the end of the war, they were made available to the public.



## **WELL DONE:**

The Shembe Church in South Africa (Nazareth Baptist Church), a traditionalist 7ulu church has more than five million members and tens of thousands of the faithful flock to a special service every January in Durban, where older men move to the rhythmic sound of drumbeats and low trumpets and perform a trance-like dance to worship God.

But participants must wear the colourful ceremonial dress, which includes a loin cloth of monkey tails, a leopard skin belt, elaborate headgear with ostrich feathers and above all a cape of leopard skin slung across their naked chests.

Leopard skins are a symbol of pride and royalty in the Shembe religion, which was founded a century ago in the country's eastern KwaZulu-Natal region with roots in Christianity and Zulu

However, with the big cat populations threatened by loss of habitat and poaching. Shembe leaders have backed a cheaper and predator-friendly alternative that still upholds tradition as the striking spotted pelts around the dancers' chests are slowly being swapped for synthetic faux fur -- thanks to a pact between conservationists and church leaders.

Listed as "near threatened" by the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species, it is believed leopards number between 5,000 and 7,000 in South Africa today despite the fact that no official

About 10% of members' furs are now estimated to be fake, since

the church threw its weight behind the initiative, a spokesman for the church said that up to 70% of dancers will have given up real skins within two years and later, synthetic loin cloths, bracelets and belts will follow.

## DOES CHOCOLATE REALLY **HURT DOGS?**

If your doggy companion is more family member than pet, you may be in the habit of sharing the foods your family loves with him. Although some people foods are fine in moderation, this is definitely not the case with chocolate. Stimulants in chocolate can lead to vomiting, diarrhoea, agitation and life-threatening elevated heart rates or seizures, depending on their weight and how much they eat and it is one of the most common causes of canine poisoning

The darker the chocolate, the more toxic it is. For a 20-pound dog, 9 ounces of milk chocolate can cause seizures, but it takes only 1.5 ounces of baker's chocolate.

Seizures due to toxicity don't stop unless you treat them, so head to your veterinarian if you come home to find your dog vomiting repeatedly and extremely agitated, and certainly if the pet is unconscious and its limbs are shaking.

Unlike cats, dogs like sweets. So it's best to keep chocolate stored away and off countertops, which are no match for a motivated

## **CUSTODY BATTLES:**

A fifth of separating couples found deciding who gets the dog'as stressful' as who should get the children, a survey has revealed. More and more dog owners are considering signing prenuptial agreements in order to avoid custodial battles as their fourlegged friends outlive the average marriage or relationship.

With January being the most popular month for divorce, families rarely think about the impact on their pet, charity Dogs Trust

It found a quarter of couples believed their dog would be the most important thing for them if they split up.

Nearly a third said they would consider signing a pre-nup, a legally binding document outlining what would happen to the dog if they were to split up.

However more and more warring couples are ending up in courts fighting over access rights to the dogs and even demanding pet maintenance to look after their pampered pooch.

But for some dogs neither side want them and the Dogs Trust alone cared for nearly 400 abandoned pets over the past three vears due to breakups.

The charity's CEO Clarissa Baldwin said: 'It's heartbreaking to think that, on top of everything a family goes through in a divorce or separation, their beloved pet has be drawn into the

'Sadly in some cases the change in circumstances makes it impossible for the dog to stay with either of his previous owners and subsequently our statistics show there has been a consistent three year increase in this problem from 2011.

'After going on a mini-break together and then sharing a home it looks like couples see the natural next step as owning a dog

'However, with a dog's life lasting longer than the average marriage it is becoming all too common for the dog to then end up in the care of rehoming centres like Dogs Trust.

'Dogs are not like expensive jewellery or fixtures and fittings and cannot be divided as easily.

'After all 'a Dog is for Life' and the cost of looking after one - as a couple and independently - needs to be considered before bringing one into your family to avoid having to give it up should the unthinkable happen down the line.'

Divorce lawyers have also reported a surge in cases involving bitter disputes over the custody of dogs.

When custody is given, its crucial owners can manage the financial implications of caring for a dog, whether that's independently or with a pet maintenance agreement to avoid having to abandon it for financial reasons in the future.

## **HEALTHY** OUTLOOK



When someone comes along to counselling and begins to talk about what is troubling them, one of the difficulties that sometimes emerges is their sense of having feelings that are 'bad' or 'wrong'. Perhaps they have been experiencing feelings of anger, or frustration, or maybe sadness, or regret. They may see such feelings as negative or self-pitying, and not compatible with being a good and kind and positive person. They wish these feelings would just go away. But, however much they try to wish them away, the feelings stubbornly persist. So then they experience shame and anxiety about having what they see as such negative feelings, and this shame and anxiety gets added to the mix, and just makes everything worse.

Counselling can offer us time and space in which we can talk about, and think about, all the different aspects of our emotional life, without using labels like positive or negative, right or wrong, good or bad. Instead, the counsellor provides a non-judgemental relationship, in which all aspects of our emotional experience can be heard and thought about. If we can slow things down a bit, begin to make sense of our feelings, and see them as an unsurprising response to aspects of our life experience, they are much less likely to cause us anxiety.

Gradually, we become more able to manage our feelings and get on with our lives, instead of our feelings managing us, perhaps by making us anxious or irritable or unconfident or withdrawn. We learn to accept that, if we face difficult and challenging situations in the future then, naturally, we are bound to experience difficult and challenging feelings within ourselves. And when we have to bear particularly difficult circumstances or events in our lives, there is no shame in seeking support to work through our feelings about them.

A counsellor is able to sustain an open and accepting attitude to another person's feelings, without anxiety getting in the way, because, through their own training and personal development, they accept that having emotional responses to life's events is a part of what it is to be human. Perhaps then, the more accepting and tolerant we can be towards our own emotional life, the more kindly and accepting we are able to be towards the feelings of others.

## Replacing Sugary Drinks

Sugary drinks, which include fizzy drinks, squashes, cordials and juice drinks are linked with excess weight in children.

#### **TIPS**

- If your family loves soft drinks or other sweetened drinks, reduce them gradually.
- Start by adding plenty of water to cordials and squashes.
- Add extra water each time to squashes and cordials to reduce your child's taste for sweetness.
- Keep sweetened drinks for the weekend.
- Make water freely available between meals.
- Water is tastier when it's cold:
- Put a jug of water in the fridge
- Add a slice of lime, lemon or orange to give it flavour and colour.
- Use bendy or coloured straws to make water more fun for younger children

#### **Encouraging more sleep**

Children who don't get enough sleep may be at increased risk of becoming overweight.

#### **TIPS**

- Regular bedtime routine can help children get the right amount of sleep
- Encourage children to be active in the evenings to tire them out.
- Finish eating 2 or 3 hours before bedtime.
- Create a sleep-friendly environment that is dark, quiet, comfortable and cool.
- Keep your child's bedroom a TV-free zone and get them to charge their phones and other devices downstairs.
- The recommended hours of sleep per night are:
- 11 hours for under 5 year olds
- 10 hours+ for over 5 year olds
- 9 hours for over 10 year olds.
- Make bedrooms a tech-free zone.
