# TIMELY SEMINAR HELPS TO KEEP KERRY'S YOUTH SAFE

Killarney and District Motor Club and the Road Safety Authority (RSA) joined forces on Tuesday last to organise a road safety seminar for our next generation of road users. The initiative organised to coincide with the running of the International rally of the lakes over the May holiday weekend was specifically targeted at Transition vear students and took place at St Brendan's College Killarney on Tuesday April 25th. Speaking from rally headquarters earlier this week Mr Anthony O'Connor clerk of the course of the rally emphasised that the raising of awareness and increasing understanding of road safety issues among new road users is very much the primary

focus on the day.

Safety of competitors, spectators, pedestrians and general road users is very much our main priority when planning such major sporting events such as the rally of the lakes and with national statistics indicating that young first time drivers particularly male drivers being among the highest at risk category in terms of likelihood of being involved in a road traffic accident we are delighted to lend our support to any initiative which addresses these issues.

Many inexperienced drivers overestimate the capabilities of a standard road car and during the hour long presentation given by Eileen Cunningham from the R.S.A and Garda Joe Sullivan students were informed of how the lack of understanding of the affects of factors such as driver distractions, change in road surface, underestimating braking distances etc can result in very serious consequences for all road users. Experts were also be on hand from the motor club to detail the very specific performance and safety components built in to modern competing rally car, which allows crews competing in the rally to travel at such high speeds in a safe and controlled environment. Following presentation participants were treated to a first hand experience of these modifications as the club

had arranged to have a one of the rally cars competing in this year's event to be present on the day for each student's personal inspection.

We very much want to get the message out there that there is no possible way that any standard road car can in any emulate the performance of the competing rally cars and we encourage all road users to keep the "race in its place" before, during and long after the rally weekend students were reminded to be ever mindful of their responsibility to themselves and all other road users each time they drive a vehicle.

# MONUMENT TO PATRICK UNVEILED IN RATHMORE

A monument to the late Captain Patrick O'Connor, a recruit to the Irish Volunteers and the IRB, was unveiled in his home town of Rathmore on Sunday afternoon last

Commissioned by the Glenflesk-Rathmore 1916 Commemoration Group, the costs were covered by proceeds from the staging of a musical drama based on Patrick's life which was staged for four nights in Rathmore Community Centre last year.

Patrick left his home in Rathmore to travel to Dublin on Good Friday 1916 and having spent a week with Padraig Pearse inside the GPO, he was killed on Moore Street on 26 April 1916.

The monument in his memory which is carved from stone with a black marble insert, was unveiled close to the church in Rathmore town on Sunday afternoon last and Patrick's last Patrick's nephew, Dan Joe O'Connor, from Rathmore

townland, had the honour of unveiling the monument after Parish Priest Fr Pat O'Donnell celebrated Mass for Patrick in St Joseph's Church in the town.

The highly-rated Glenflesk Choir were in attendance and Paul Sheerin who plays the trumpet along with Con Houlihan of Cullen pipe Band were also on hand to provide music.

Following the blessing of the monument by Fr. Pat O'Donnell, Deputy Mayor of the Killarney Municipal District, Cllr Niall Kelleher spoke to the large crowd. Brian Kelly, Chairman of Rathmore Community council along with Patrick's grandniece Ann Moynihan was also in attendance. Other guests of honour at the ceremony were Val Moynihan, of the extended members O'Connor family, including Patrick's nephew, grandnieces and grandnephews, public representative Michael & Danny



Healy Rae TDS, Cllr Maura Healy Rae, Cllr John Joe Culloty, Cllr Bobby O'Connell, former minister & TD jimmy Deenihan and Aidan O'Connor, Producer and journalist of Patrick - the Musical Drama. An informal reception was held in Teach losagain after the event.

Rathmore Community Council have been tasked with the maintenance of the monument and for those who have missed it or would like to see it again, Patrick - A 1916 Musical Drama will take place on 11th May in INEC.

Glenflesk's GAA Club 'Looking after Me' event last week was an huge success and the club are delighted with the response on the night.



The hard-working team behind the Cartell.ie International Rally of the Lakes is the Killarney and District Motor Club which boasts over 250 members and is the biggest and most progressive motor club in Ireland.

Under the direction of Clerk of the Course, Anthony O'Connor, preparations for this year's rally started in the dark months of last winter and, this weekend, a total of 600 marshals will volunteer their services over the three days.

Killarney and District Motor Club members will be joined by colleagues from neighbouring clubs, including Kerry Motor Club, Skibbereen and District Motor Club, Munster Car Club, Cork Motor Club, Limerick Motor club, Connaught Motor Club, Birr Motor Club, Carlow Car Club, Meath Motor Club, Turkingtons Leitrim, Belfast Club members, Wexford Marshals Club, Five Counties Marshalling Club, Donegal Motor

Club, Cork Marshalling Club and Imokilly Motor Club.

There will be very close cooperation with An Garda Siochana throughout the weekend and the organisers have confirmed that the Garda helicopter unit, regional support units and traffic and public order dog units will all be monitoring events.

Several traffic management meetings have been held with the Gardai and road closure agreements have been facilitated by with Kerry County Council.

Rescue units in attendance will include Athlone Rally Rescue, Russell Rally Rescue, Martin Byrne, Galway Bay Rally Rescue, Southwest Rally Rescue.

Eight doctors, emergency medical technicians and six fully-staffed ambulance units a day will be provided by Medilink, Killarney Order Malta Killarney and Cork Order of Malta while water rescue specialists will be present

A total of 140 officials will be working tirelessly to ensure the safe running of the event with 25 TV crews and 50 professional photographers descending on Killarney to capture the action.

In addition to the thousands of spectators, the 260 competitors will bring their mechanics, helpers, families and friends for five nights and they will all dine and stay in Killarnev and its environs.

# RALLY IS A GREAT "TEAM KILLARNEY" EFFORT

Worth well in excess of €10 million to the local economy and attracting several thousand people to the town for the long weekend, the Cartell.ie International Rally of the Lakes is one of the Kerry's major annual visitor attractions as well as being right up there as a hugely exciting sporting spectacle.

Killarney has been synonymous with rallying for decades, which is hardly surprising given the terrific stages it can offer, with the technically demanding stages matched only by the spectacular landscape served up in Beauty's

The rally certainly plays its part in promoting Killarney and Kerry on an international stage with TV coverage of the event reaching close on 40 countries throughout Europe with an estimated 30 million household subscribers.

Various stages, showcasing the wonderful scenery that Killarney has to offer, are beamed into living rooms through the huge network of channels, including TV3, UTV, RTÉ, Sky Sports and Motors TV. This exposure hugely increases the deserved reputation of the rally as international event for competitors and spectators.

Mayor of Killarney, Cllr Brendan Cronin, remarked: "Killarney takes



great pride in hosting the rally year after year and it comes at a great time which kicks off the tourist season in the locality, bringing huge benefits to the local economy."

He added: "I wish to congratulate the hard-working team from Killarney and District Motor Club who work, on a voluntary basis, to ensure that the Cartell. ie International Rally of the Lakes grows from strength to strength." Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce President, Paul O'Neill, said the town has seen the rally event flourish down through the

years and great credit is due to the Killarney and District Motor Club. "It is very much a Team Killarney effort with Gardaí, Kerry County Council, residents and businesses all playing their part. In terms of coverage, Killarnev and Kerry benefit enormously through TV, media and social media exposure," he added.

The 2017 Cartell.ie International Rally of the Lakes will get underway with a ceremonial start in Killarney town centre at 7.00pm on Friday. The real action will commence early on Saturday morning with the iconic Moll's

Gap stage, followed by the Tim Healy Pass and centralised service on Castletownbere Pier.

Then the crews head out on the famous stages of Cods Head and Ardgroom with a repeat run over the Healy Pass and into service for a well-deserved break. Cods Head and Ardgroom are repeated and there will be a blast through the Kilmackillogue Harbour stage to finish off the day.

Sunday morning's action starts with Moll's Gap once again, followed by service at the Liebherr Container Cranes base in Killarney. The crews will then complete a loop of three stages, Kilgobnet, Caragh Lake and Rockfield, before heading into service again at Liebherr.

This loop is again repeated with plenty of spectator-friendly access points in Kilgobnet and Rockfield. The crews will arrive back to the finishing ramp at the Rally Headquarters in the Gleneagle Hotel at approximately 5.30pm for celebrations and champagne.

The 38th Rally of the Lakes will be accounting rounds of the Clonakilty Black Pudding Irish Tarmac Rally Championship and the PlasticBags.ie Southern 4 Rally Championship.




organisers expect to welcome 10,000 video gaming enthusiasts through the doors over the weekend.

# TWO TIER APPROACH REQUIRED IN PROPERTY SECTOR

'Property Partners the nationwide property group has called for the government to introduce incentives for the provision of new homes in areas with the lowest values. The first quarter of 2017 has already seen property prices increase nationally by in excess of 4%. It is widely accepted that the only way that this can be controlled is by increasing supply. Pent up demand is evident in the most popular areas. Property Partners, believes however, that the gap in property values between the urban areas and the regions will only continue to widen. According to CSO figures just released only 8,800 new housing units were constructed nationally between 2011 and 2016. The cost of a new 3 bed home in Dublin currently ranges from €300-€450,000 while outside the capital prices range from €140,000-€300,000 with little or no availability in many areas.

Similar to the recently introduced Rent Controlled Zones, the government need to assess areas on an individual basis and identify locations where supply is unlikely to occur in the short to medium term. The fact remains that despite an overall 10.7% increase nationally in the last 12 months, values in many areas still remain well below the cost of construction. In many areas, the figures are coming off a very low base and until such time as the government creates incentives to make it financially viable to build, development sites will remain untouched. It was recently announced that ghost estates are 'a thing of the past but not forgotten' with numbers dropping by 80%. This figure may be correct, however it is vital to look at where the remaining 20% are located. The areas where ghost estates have been completely eliminated are in the cities and commuter belts, where prices and demand are at their highest.

According to Tadgh Gallivan of Property Partners Gallivan (local agent), "An acute shortage of new

homes still exists in many counties and this will continue to be the case for the foreseeable future. Simply waiting for values to return to a point where a profit can be made is an extremely negative approach and will deny many people the opportunity to remain in their locality."

The cost of constructing a 3 bed s/d residence outside the capital costs of €200-250,000. The average value of a 3 bed s/d currently stands below €200,000 in 20 out of 26 counties in the country. This is despite the recent increases in value. In some areas, it will take up to five years before construction will become viable again. The government however, have confirmed that they want young people to consider remaining in their own locality.

"There currently is little or no incentive for developers to provide new housing in Killarney. The average value of a 3 bed semi-detached property stands at €230,000" Tadgh said. "Values

would need to increase by a minimum of 20% before the figures stack up commercially", he added. Surely everyone should have the opportunity to purchase a new home in their own locality. This is a fundamental right for all.

# **UPDATE ON SKELLIG MICHAEL ROCKFAL**

The specialist safety access team who were on the Island last week have surveyed all of the slopes concerned and have satisfactorily resolved all of the areas where there was a suspicion of loose material. remains to threaten the Lighthouse Road, though it is evident that, as conditions remain very dry, there is still a possibility that the actions of burrowing birds in particular may continue to dislodge small material from the mountainside.

The specialist team have now left Skellig Michael and their place has been taken this week by OPW staff who will now undertake a number of specific tasks.



#### RUNNING FOR FAITH

Over 75 people are going to run from Killarney to Castletownroche tomorrow, Saturday 29th April to raise funds so a Castletownroche family can finally see their daughter take her first steps. The runners are taking on the challenge of running 80km each on April 29th to raise €100,000 for a life-changing operation.

Two-vear old Faith Browne Castletownroche, Co. Cork has spastic diplegia cerebal palsy, which means she cannot walk, crawl or even sit up unassisted. Faith also has a rare hearing condition called Auditory Neuropathy Spectrum Disorder (ANSD).

After tirelessly searching for a treatment, Faith's parents, Lisa Browne and Dave Carroll have found an operation in St Louis Hospital, Missouri that specialises in helping patients with spastic cerebral palsy move independently. The operation, called Selective Dorsal Rhizotomy (SDR), treats muscle stiffness in cerebral palsy by separating the rootlets in the spine. This, teamed with intensive physiotherapy three to four times a week, will help Faith to finally walk, skip and play like her older sister Lydia.

The €100,000 will cover the operation in St Louis Hospital and pay for four weeks accommodation, flights and intensive physio in Missouri as well as two to three years private physio and equipment after the operation.

Faith's family have received generous donations from people around the country so far, including Irish footballer James McClean who donated €1000, however they are long way off the amount needed for Faith's operation and follow-up treatment.

Runners from a number of athletic clubs are taking part in the '80k in One Day' run from Killarney to Faith's home in Castletownroche, Co. Cork on April 29th. You can find out more on her Go Fund Me page.



#### **Student Grant Scheme**

To qualify for a student grant, you must fulfil the conditions of the scheme as regards:

- · Nationality and immigration status
- Residence
- Means

You must also be attending an approved course in an approved institution.

The means test for a student grant in 2017-2018 is based on your family's gross income for the previous full tax year (2016). However, if you or your family have had a change of circumstances (which is likely to be permanent) since 31 December 2016, your changed circumstances may be taken into account. Reckonable income for a student grant is gross income from all sources. Some social welfare payments are excluded from 'reckonable income' for the purposes of student grants.

#### How to apply

From 3 April 2017, you can apply for a student grant for the 2017/2018 academic year.

Since 2012, Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI) is the single grant-awarding authority handling all new applications for student grants. All new grant applications will be made online. You do not need to know the exact course you will be attending in order to apply

The closing date for receipt of student grant applications for the 2017-2018 academic year is 13 July 2017.

Last Thursday, I picked up the final hour of Dr Crokes' Easter Camp that had been bubbling with fun and excitement for three days. I was really pleasantly surprised and impressed by what was transacting before me. The coaches were made up of a cohort of young ladies and men from the ranks of the Senior and Minor players. Those being coached were mainly in the five to ten years age bracket and all was overseen by the senior members of the coaching academy. The Events Committee played their part, in ensuring everyone was fed and watered.

There was an obvious organisation around the drills, games and skills transfer from one generation of players to the next – or rather "half-generation", for, in reality, that is all that was between both ranks. But the overall ambiance was one of fun, levity and comradery. Our young coaches were making huge efforts to ensure that, above all, the younger kids were enjoying themselves and were included in everything. Again, it was obvious that friendly relationships had built up between coaches and players over the three days - the high-fives, the jokes, the hugs, the easy manner, in which they interacted – a shared community.

The Easter and Summer Camps are one of the most important dates on the Crokes' calendar. It is, of course, an opportunity for our younger players to improve their football skills, make new friends and start appreciating what it means to be part of the Dr Crokes' community. 

World Day for Safety and Health at Work and International Commemoration Day for Dead and Injured Workers:

The World Day for Safety and Health at Work is an annual international campaign to promote safe, healthy and decent work. Every 15 seconds, a worker dies from a work-related accident or disease. Every 15 seconds, 160 workers have a work-related accident as workers are facing greater pressure to meet the demands of modern working life. Yet these fatalities; accidents and illness at work are highly preventable.

Many Psychosocial risks such as increased competition, higher expectations performance and longer working hours are contributing to the workplace becoming an ever more stressful environment and workrelated stress is now generally acknowledged as a global issue affecting all countries, all professions and all workers both in developed and developing countries. In this complex context, the workplace is at the same time an important source of psychosocial risks and the ideal venue to address them in order to protect the health and well-being of workers.

A national occupational safety and health culture is one in which the right to a safe and healthy working environment is respected at all levels, where governments, trade unions, employers and workers actively participate in securing a safe and healthy working environment through a system of defined rights, responsibilities and duties, and where the highest priority is accorded to the principle of prevention.

The 28th of April is also the International Commemoration Day for Dead and Injured Workers organised worldwide by the trade union movement since 1996. Its purpose is to honour the memory of victims of occupational accidents and diseases by organising worldwide mobilizations and awareness campaigns on this



### A FEW TRICKS FOR THOSE WHO WEAR GLASSES

\* Apply a thin line of fluorescent paint on your glasses case. It'll become much easier to find it in a dark room.

\* The best fabric to dry-clean your glasses is microfiber. It doesn't scratch the lenses and neither does it accumulate grime. Never wipe the lenses with your shirt's hem or sleeve: they'll leave tiny scratches that will create an additional burden for your eyes.

\*Washing up liquid is perfect for lenses! Don't use cleansers containing alcohol, vinegar, ammonia, or bleach as these substances deteriorate the protective coating of the lenses.

Don't use your spectacles as a hairband — the frame will lose its shape and start falling off. When washing your face and in other situations when you don't use your glasses, better just take them off.

\* If your glasses keep sliding down, hold the rounded parts of the earpieces in hot water for a few minutes until the plastic gets a bit softer. Then bend the ends down so they better fit your ears. On the other hand, if your spectacles are a little too tight, hold the earpieces in hot water, and then try bending the rounded ends up to reduce the pressure.

\* When traveling in a car don't leave your plastic glasses on the dashboard in direct sunlight. Heating up, the lenses may lose shape or even pop. It's best to store your spectacles in the glove compartment in a special pocket.

To adjust movable nosepieces, put your glasses on an even surface to see how they look compared to each other.

\* If you've got wide-spaced eyes, opt for glasses with a thick or prominent bridge — this will draw attention to the middle of your face, making your eyes visually closer to each other. If you have close-set eyes, choose frames with decorations on the outer edge. That way, your eyes will look farther apart from each other.

#### ICECREAM-EATINGSQUIRREL



## **FOCUS ON SUMMER BEDDING**

Its that time of year again when we think of putting colour in our pots, baskets and containers and also in the ground. Summer Bedding plants can be used very effectively in the ground for filling gaps between shrubs or border perennial plants as they can cover a lot of ground and add plenty of colour very quickly. When planting Summer bedding plants in the ground the first thing you have to do is to dig over the area and dig in plenty of compost. Most Summer Bedding plants need a nice sunny sheltered position but if you have a shaded area, begonias are excellent bedding plants for this situation and they will give you flowers right through the summer and into early autumn. As an added bonus they will also provide you with excellent coloured foliage from light green to dark purple. Always remember when planting bedding to put the taller ones at the back. If you want to do a summer display of bedding on its own in a bed you will have to choose a centre piece - a good plant for this would be a standard fuschia. Then start with the tallest, such as marigolds or antirrhinums and work your way out to the edge of the bed with some begonias or petunias and finally at the edge of the bed with some lobelia and alyssum. A good idea before you plant would be to position all your plants to get an overall view of what it will look like. And remember to water all plants well in
