ear ye, hear ye - a new queen has  $oldsymbol{1}$  arrived in town! With the annual Puck Fair celebrations just around the corner, preparations for the biggest event of the year are already well underway in Killorglin and an integral part of that is the selection of her royal highness, Queen Puck. The selection process sees an independent judging panel trawl through all the entry letters from 6th class pupils across the region before interviewing each hopeful and hearing them read aloud the famous Puck Fair welcome speech, which is recited during the Coronation Ceremony on the festival's opening day.

The legendary 3-day event, which runs annually on the 10th, 11th and 12th of August, is Ireland's oldest gathering festival and revolves around the crowning of a wild mountain goat as King Puck and overseer of the town. The festival's ancient traditions date back to 1613, but over four centuries later the popularity of this unique event shows no sign of waning, with visitors from all over the globe flocking to Killorglin every August to witness the royal festivities with their own eyes. One little lady who is

especially excited for this year's celebrations is 12-year-old Maeve McCarthy from Cromane Lower in Killorglin, who has just been crowned as Queen of Puck Fair.

Maeve, a student of Scoil Réalt na Mara in Cromane, will now take her rightful place among a long list of former Puck Queens, each of whom has played a central role in Puck Fair over the decades. Much like her predecessors, Maeve's duties will include meeting and greeting visitors to the festival, addressing the crowd in the town's main square on day one of the fair and of course. the all-important crowning of King Puck during the Coronation Ceremony. Although a lot of responsibility will fall on her royal shoulders, it seems that Maeve is most certainly up to the task. The 2019 Puck Fair line-up is looking more promising than ever, with the usual wide range of free family fun activities, children's entertainment and musical acts on the agenda. 
# KERRY POLITICIANS ATTEND FAILTE IRELAND CLINIC

With 16 races on the card, it looks like we are in for a very exciting day on the water.







## MOTOR INDUSTRY AT A CLIFF EDGE WITH TAXATION CHANGES

The Motor Industry and the motorist is facing the greatest change in taxation since 2009. Overnight car values plummeted, new car sales declined and theIndustry feel off a cliff. That together with a recession resulted in the closure of 150 family businesses, 14,700 job lost and over €1bn in lost revenue for the Exchequer.

The looming Budget 2020 brings a very concerning feeling of Déjà vu. The Society of the Irish Motor Industry (SIMI) continues to highlight the need for extreme caution in dealing with motor related taxation in the upcoming Budget, doubly so now that the Budget almost coincides with the Brexit date.

The Economic Statement issued by the Minister for Finance Paschal Donohoe yesterday outlined budgetary policy is not a one size fits all, and highlighted the huge difficulty in framing a Budget for next year. Brian Cooke, SIMI Director General outlines the major concerns facing the Industry, "The State must stop overburdening new cleaner cars with tax, while at the same time ignoring the problem of replacing older cars, which is where the real emissions problems lie. In fact, it's even worse, the VRT system discriminates against new cars when compared to older used imports. With the full move to WLTP emissions testing on the horizon, Budget 2020 must make allowance for the difference between the new and old emission testing systems. Most other EU countries have followed the EU Commission view that consumers should not be faced with increased taxation due to the new emissions testing regime. Ireland should be no different. So let's not make the mistakes of the past. Progressive changes to VRT should be focused at replacing older cars with new ones. This is the only way to start the transition to a low and ultimately zero-emission free fleet. In that way wewill all win, the consumer, the Industry, the Environment, protecting the 47,000 jobs and businesses in our communities."

# Cost and accommodation cause huge problems for Kerry's ambitious students

It's not easy to make the most of college life if you have to make a daily return commute from Kerry to Cork or Limerick. But that's the only option facing an increasing number of Kerry's brightest students who can't afford to meet the spiralling cost of student accommodation. Education is a right of all citizens not a privilege of those who can afford to pay. So, it's sad that Government stands idly by while deserving students, who have studied very hard to achieve a college place, struggle financially with little or no state support.

Further and third level education is very expensive. The financial burden is somewhat eased for students who qualify for partial or total state funding. Even so, many college students have to work part-time or depend on their parents to make ends meet. Thousands of students who are ineligible for funding due to punitive means testing of the family income must come up with about €9000 annually if they are living away from home or about €4000 if living at home. The unjustifiable student contribution of €3000 also has to be paid.

The introduction of a fair and adequate higher education grants' system must be a priority. Currently the maximum standard maintenance grant payable to students whose college is 45 km (28ml) or more from their homes is only €3025 (non-adjacent grant). For students who live less than 45km from their college, the standard maximum grant is a paltry €1215 (adjacent grant). Consequently, students who qualify for maintenance grants this year will receive less they did ten years ago despite the considerable increase in the cost of further and higher education.

Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI), the grant awarding authority, is prioritising

new grant applications until 11th July. SUSI : will process late applications but its best to be on the priority applications list. Submit your online grant application as soon as possible. Applicants are assessed on gross income from all sources in the 2018 financial vear. Applications are assessed as either a "dependent" or "independent" application. A dependent applicant is assessed on the income of parents or quardians, while an independent applicant is assessed on personal income and that of her/his partner.

As the grant is means-tested, you might like to visit the eligibility reckoner on www.susi. ie. This facility provides potential applicants with an approximate indication of whether or not they are likely to qualify for a grant. However, it's always advisable to submit a grant application. Even if you don't currently qualify, your financial circumstances may change on route through college. Begin your SUSI grant application by registering for an online account where you can set up your username, password and security pin. Then carefully complete the interactive application form. Once you have submitted a grant application you can follow its progress on the SUSI Online Application Tracker.

Further information on state funding can be found on www.studentfinance.ie. Most of the institutions also offer a range of scholarships for excellence in areas such as academic, sport, creative arts and entrepreneurship. Colleges also operate a Financial Assistance Fund for students experiencing financial difficulty during term. Go to the relevant colleges' websites for further details. Watch out also for local scholarships such as Credit Union Scholarships available to members. If at all possible, avoid

taking out a student loan, but if you must then the best rates are available from your local Credit Union.



# Summer Gardening

# Lárge Containers

If large pots, troughs or barrels are used, these should be slightly raised above the ground using small blocks or bricks. This aids free drainage, prolongs the life of wooden containers and reduces the risk of entry of soil pests. Place a five cm layer of small stones or broken brick at the base of the container to aid drainage and top up with compost. Plants for Containers Window Boxes

A wide range of plants can be used including pansies (for winter colour), dwarf bulbs (for spring), annuals and perennials such as pelargonium (for summer) and dwarf shrubs (for permanent planting). Plants should be selected carefully so that they can be seen from inside the house but will not be so tall that they block out light. An example of a planting scheme for a 1 metre long x 25 cm wide window box would be 2 trailing ivy (one at each end), a row of 7 surfi na petunia at the front and 2 grey helichrysum towards the back. Hanging Baskets


Many different kinds of plants can be used but the most popular are summer fl owering bedding plants, such as pelargonium, petunia, fuchsia and impatiens. A 45 cm (18 in.) diameter basket could be planted up with one fuchsia 'Swingtime' or 'Cascade', 8 plants of lobelia 'Cambridge Blue' and 3 plants of Helichrysum petiolare. The basket should be planted as follows: Put one third of the compost in the basket and plant 3 lobelia at this level by cutting appropriate holes in the liner and pushing the roots carefully through the wire-mesh so the top growth of the lobelia is trailing on the outside. Add a further third of the compost and plant 2 lobelia and 3 helichrysum at this level in the same way. Fill in the remainder of the compost and plant the fuchsia in the middle of the container and surround it with the remaining 3 lobelia planted on the top surface of the compost. As with other containers, the level of the compost should be about 2.5 cm below the rim to allow for watering.

Many plants can be grown in large containers including those mentioned for window boxes and hanging baskets. Most suitable plants are generally those with a bushy habit such as pelargonium, calceolaria, begonia and fuchsia with trailers around the edge to soften the sides of the container. Perennial plants such as heather, ivy, Japanese maple and camellia can be grown successfully in large containers.


Care Watering needs to be done carefully as it is easy to overwater or underwater plants where their rootrun is restricted. Containers should never be allowed to dry out completely, nor should the plants be kept constantly moist. However, a well-fi lled hanging basket in summer will dry out quickly and may need watering twice a day. Because their root system is constricted, plants in containers need regular feeding. Many kinds of slow release fertilisers for adding to compost and foliar feeds are available. Removing the dead fl ower heads will prolong their flowering period and improve their appearance. Your local garden centre can supply suitable containers, compost and plants as well as providing additional information on how to get best results.

# This week we focus on Patrick Feeney.

Patrick Feeney was born to sing and from the age of four he wanted to be on stage with his father who played in a local band.

Growing up near Gurteen, Co. Sligo Patrick says that Country music was always on the local radio in the family home at that time. It was during the late 80s and 90s when the songs of Daniel O'Donnell and others were huge on local radio. Patrick went on to play and sing in his early teens with his dad as a duo while studying sales and marketing at third level college. "My dad influenced me a lot into the Country style of music. But as I come from an area that is rich in Traditional Irish music, Sligo, famous for the great Trad musician Michael Coleman, I was influenced by Irish songs and tunes too."

After his college years Patrick was also successful in an interview to become a member of the Gárdai. But instead of joining the boys in blue it was a phone call which came out of the blue that resulted in him following a career as a singer.

"I got a call from Kevin McCooey who managed Big Tom and several others. He said that as Country singer Johnny Loughrey had passed away would I be interested in fronting Johnny's band. I auditioned for the job and was accepted. So I rang the Garda Training College in Templemore and told them that it was the music scene, rather than the law, that had captured me for a career," says Patrick with a laugh.

At 19 he started out on a Country music career



in 2002 but while Patrick can, and does, sing anything from hits by his idols such as Bruce Springsteen or Ed Sheeran to Glen Campbell or Marty Robbins his interest in Irish music may have been the catalyst for him modernising Folk songs from the past. Those include the hilarious 'Courtin' in the Kitchen', first popularised internationally by The Clancy Brothers and Tommy Makem or a song written by the late great balladeer Sean McCarthy, who also penned Shanagolden, the humorous story of 'Red Haired Mary'.

"Everyone has their own particular niche when performing on stage and I discovered that those songs, and others, brought out the humorous side in me.

"Indeed 'Red Haired Mary' was the song that really put me on the road to success in a big way. When we went to film the promotional video for it the initial idea was that it would be in a serious style. But instead we ended up acting the mickey and making it a totally humorous production. That was one of the reasons for its success and it also convinced me that I could let myself go in a fun way on stage too."

Regarding the diversity of songs that Patrick sings on stage, on TV and on record he says he hopes that he has found the formula that the fans want.

"The best advice I ever received, early in my career, was 'never try and educate your audience when you're on stage'. It took me a while to find my niche and discover what songs suit me best - but more importantly what songs suit the audiences best. Thankfully there is a broad spectrum of songs that my voice can handle. I've always been a fan of Bruce Springsteen and his song 'Old Dan Tucker' proved popular for me while his 'American Land' was the type of song that we could put a Country and Traditional feel to by including fiddle and accordion," says Patrick.

"When it comes to authentic American Country music the songs of Marty Robbins have always inspired me and Glen Campbell has also been one of my biggest influences in Country music." Another highlight of Patrick's career was getting to sing on the same stage as the great Charley Pride.

Patrick's new single 'The Darling Girl from Clare' is the most requested song on all radio stations at the moment.

# LET'S GO BACK IN TIME

Dermot Hegarty and the Plainsmen...

Vocalist/organist born on October 6, 1940 in Longford, Ireland. He was spotted by Mick Clerkin who was director of King Records and Dermot was playing a cabaret date at the Longford Arms Hotel, in Longford. Impressed by Dermot's performance and rapore with the audience he signed him to King Records. Disc debut: Shores of Amerikay (1967). In April 1969 Dermot launched his own showband, calle "The Plainsmen." The members of his band were: Roger Farrell (guitar), Seamus Roddy (bass), Tony Farrell (drums), Frank McKenna (guitar), Francis Middelton

(trumpet), Vincent Summers (tenor sax) and Brendan McCusker (tenor sax/fiddle). He wrote a stage musical, "A Song To Remember", and starred in it with The Plainsmen at the Temperance Hall, in Longford, in March 1972.

Dermot left the band in April 1973 to return the cabaret scene. "The Plainsmen" continued until 1977 with Brian Harkin as lead singer.

In the 70's the hits just kept coming. Songs

like "Love is Teasing", "Four Green Fields", and of course the biggest hit he had was "Twenty One Years". This song made it to Number 1 and spent a staggering 46 weeks in the charts. Dermot Hegarty is still entertaining and living in Manchester 50 years on from The Plainsmen. Next year he will be celebrating his 80th birthday which is hard to believe.



Physical Activity & it's Benefits - part 2

- 5. Counting steps makes a difference: counting steps daily will make you more aware of how active you are daily. It is easy to count steps these days through your phone, activity trackers and pedometers. All ages can benefit from counting their daily steps. It is a great motivating tool to create awareness in those that don't reach their step count. Guidelines are 10,000 steps for adults and 15000 for kids.
- 6. Higher intensity exercise is better for cardiovascular health: the new guidelines clarify that exercising at higher intensity brings greater gains in cardio respiratory fitness than steady state exercise. There is a caution to be noted that the harder the workout the greater the risk for injury especially for beginners or older people. The guidelines advise starting with moderate intensity and increasing your frequency and duration before increasing
- 7. Children also benefit from exercise: even at ages as low as 3-5 years, reports now suggest that they benefit from consistent physical activity. Increases physical activity in children will reduce the risk of increased body weight and adiposity, improve cardiovascular risk factor status, fewer symptoms of depression, and favorable signs of bone health in children aged 3-17. Physical activity that boost bone health include hopping , skipping, jumping, tumbling, and other forms of dynamic high impact, short duration exercise. Children should get 60 mins per day of moderate to vigorous physical activity.

About Me

Killarney on 20th July

My name is Brian, I run the RunninginIreland.com website and blog. I am not an elite athlete; I don't think I'd consider myself a fast runner either. I just love to run. But I have done a lot of races, including Killarney and I will draw on this experience to help you on your way.



Incorporating other races into your training plan

It's week 3 of the Run Killarney race column, and 4 weeks to go to race day. Now would be a good time to get out and try a shorter race. There's nothing like the race day experience to push your training along. You are guaranteed to go faster than you normally would, and it can really give you a lift, that is different to the usual mileage that you are currently putting in.

If you are doing the 10K, find a good local 5k or 4 Mile – even a Park Run could give you a boost. If you are doing the half-marathon, maybe try a 10K close to you. Even if this race doesn't go to plan, you can learn a lot before the big day, such as pacing, so as not to burn out too early in a race. Races should be part of your training plan if you can make the time.

#### Breaking down the distance on the day

If this is your first time attempting a longer distance in Kiliarney, then an important strategy for the day is how you are mentally going to approach the race. If, for example, you are doing the half-marathon, it is easier to think of the race in sections rather than the full 13.1miles. One example might be, start out with an easy 5K (get to know the runners around you). Once you've achieved an easy 5K target, your next section of the race might be a steady 10K, slightly faster. That'll be a bit harder, but just keep focusing on finishing out the 10K. Now you only have 4K to go to the finish. But really, you only need to focus on a quick 3K once you get within 1K, you'll know the finish line is coming, and the atmosphere and excitement will bring you home. Mentally breaking the course down like this should make it more manageable and less daunting. There are many ways to break down the race. Find a version that will work for you.

## Tip of the Week!

To run well, it's not always about actually running. Doing core strengthening exercises and a quality stretching programme will improve your running, making you more efficient, and likely faster. Try a Pilates class to mix things up and use other muscles.

# **CORK 3-10 KERRY 1-19**

Despite having to play the final 15 or so minutes with 14 men following the controversial sending-off of Paul Geaney, Kerry still had enough fuel in the tank to see off Cork's brave challenge in a pulsating Munster Senior Final at Pairc Ui Chaoimh on Saturday night.

Manager Peter Keane will no doubt be worried about the leakage of the three goals and will be concerned that one of these was similar to the two goals conceded in the league games against Mayo and this is something the Cahersiveen native will no doubt address ahead of Kerry's first Super 8 match in Killarney next month.

Indeed, those who bely and belittle the current state of Cork football should have been in Pairc Ui Chaoimh on Saturday to witness a resurgent Leeside outfit take the game to their visitors. Cork made life extremely difficult for the Kingdom for long spells during the game and had they taken a number of their first-half scoring chances they could have been much closer at half-time

The silken and golden skills of Kerry's Sean O'Shea and David Clifford were there for all to see as both players were central to everything that moved in the forward line and scored



0-12 between them with O'Shea claiming 0-8.

Tom O'Sullivan's 1-1 was central as Kerry held a 1-10 to 1-4 advantage at half-time. With 47 minutes gone, the Leesiders, urged on by their fanatical home following, were level, thanks to two goals including a Luke Connolly penalty and a Brian Hurley effort from play and the score now read 1-12 to 3-6.

However, Kerry got stuck in again and two points from Man of the Match Stephen O'Brien were crucial as the Kingdom held on for another provincial success, their 81st in total and seventh in a row.

There has been much debate about Kerry's Munster final victory over Cork last Saturday evening, with some fans fearing the worst ahead of the Super 8's while more choosing to pick the positives from Kerry's victory. Donal Barry argues that the work rate of the players is in the details and he pours over some of the stats from last Saturday's victory over Cork.

In the aftermath of Kerry's Munster Final win over Cork, thoughts now turn to the Super 8's and while Kerry only know for a fact that Donegal will join them at least they will be keeping an eye on Galway and Meath and thier progress as it is likely that both could yet join Kerry in the group of 4 or at the very least the team that will defeat them.

So lets take a closer look at players performances and let the numbers do the talking.

#### Explainer

Ball in Hand - the times that a player had clean possession of a ball. The first number is for the first half and the second is for the second half.

Runs - the times that a player made a forward run with ball in hand over 15M in distance Kick Pass - the amount of times a player passed the ball by way of a kick and picked out a player at a distance of 20M or more

Scores - Goals, points and even wides

Turned Over - The amount of times a player lost possession either by an intercepted pass or having the ball taken from him from an opposing player Blocks - Just like it says Fouled by opposition - the times a free was called by the ref for a foul on the player Displayed as they lined out, i.e Tom O'Sullivan at wing back etc.







# **OUESTION**

How do I access the Early Childhood Care and **Education Scheme for my 2 year-old child?** 

# **ANSWER**

The Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) Scheme primary school.

Your child can start ECCE when they are 2 years and and 6 months at the end of the pre-school year). The Department of Children and Youth Affairs' eligibility calendar shows when your child can participate in the ECCE Scheme.

If your child has special needs they may be able to get supports under the Access and Inclusion Model (AIM) you can find more information on aim.gov.ie.

Children can only enrol in pre-school in September. The ECCE Scheme runs from September to June for 3 hours parent and toddler group) for longer than this each day you have to pay for these extra hours.

To get a place for your child, apply to a participating Childcare Committee (CCC) on myccc.ie. You will need passport and their PPS number.

Laughter can also help us to bond, connect and communicate with others. Humour helps lubricate the channels of communication and can make people feel more comfortable.

Think about what makes you laugh and be sure to do more of it. This may be watching your favourite comedy, sharing a good joke, going to a comedy club or watching a funny U tube clip. Why not try now - just turn the corners of your mouth up into a smile and give a little laugh out loud. It may feel a bit contrived, but notice how you feel. Whatever gets you chuckling be sure to factor in more laughter to your life on a daily basis and increase those happy gamma waves.
