



# HUGH O'FLAHERTY INTERNATIONAL AWARD FOR FOSSA NATIVE FR SEAN MYRES

Fr Sean Myers a native of Fossa is this years Hugh O'Flaherty International Humanitarian Award winner. Fr Sean is a Redemptorist Missionary in Brazil. The Award will be presented to Fr Sean by the Mayor of Killarney Municipal Authority Cllr Bobby O'Connell on Saturday October 31st at an Award Ceremony in the Killarney Plaza

This year marks the eight year of the Memorial to the Monsignor, organised to raise awareness of the Humanitarian work carried out by the Monsignor, during WW2, together with his colleagues in the Rome Escape Line, he saved over 6,500 people from the clutches of the Nazis who had occupied Rome at the time. On October 30th 2013, on the 50th anniversary of the Monsignor's death a permanent memorial to the Monsignor was unveiled in Killarney town centre. The memorial is a life-size

sculpture of the Monsignor by Valentia based artist Alan Ryan Hall.

Fr Myers (85) who was nominated by the Fossa Community arrived in north east Brazil in the spring of 1960 and soon assumed responsibility for a parish over half the size of the island of Ireland.

Chairperson of the Hugh O'Flaherty Memorial Committee Jerry O'Grady stated "Fr Sean was selected by the Award Committee from an extensive short list of very worthy nominees, and it is indeed striking that his life history is in so many ways similar to Monsignor Hugh's. It is incredible that at the age of 85 he continues to serve his community in Brazil and apparently has no intentions of retiring".

# KILLARNEY HARDMAN TRIATHLON TESTING WRATH IRON ATHLETES TO THE CORE

The Iron men and women Athletes took to the Water at dawn at Lough Lein, Killarney, in an epic one day Triathlon, organised by Killarney Hardman Director, Alan Ryan. The Killarney Hardman Long Distance Triathlon, included a 3.8km swim in Lough Lein, Killarney, followed by the iconic Ring of Kerry Cycle with a distance of 180 Km and a marathon of 42.2km in Knockreer Demesne in Killarney National Park. While the Olympic distance Triathlon included a 1.5 km swim in Lough Lein, Killarney, followed by a 40Km cycle on the iconic Ring of Kerry Route, and finishing with a 10km run at Knockreer Demesne in Killarney National Park.

Now in its 5th year, the annual Triathlon has steadily growing in popularity, Race Director, Alan Ryan, Killarney, believes in the personal touch with athletes, and has watched it grow organically. He knows every competitor and their families personally. Speaking after the event Alan remarked "the weather was perfect for the competitors, not to much sun, perfect for the challenging and beautiful course which included the iconic Ring of Kerry and Killarney National Park, it belonged to the athletes for the day. It was great to see new Hardman Winner, David McCarthy, Cork, who finished in an amazing time of 10 hours, 06 minutes and 53 seconds.

The Council replied that Irish Water in the preparation of its next capital investment programme [2017- 20121] is currently assessing all water and waste water facilities throughout the county, including the associated environmental standards. The Killarney wastewater treatment plant including the possible reed bed treatment facility will be considered in that process. Councillor Gleeson stated that every possible means or reducing the phosphate inputs into the vitally important lakes should be thoroughly examined."

# **DRIVER** DISTRACTION

Driver distraction is a diversion of attention away from activities critical for safe driving toward a competing activity. A distraction can often occur simultaneously – at times resulting in a complete loss of control. Distraction can be visual, manual and cognitive.

Based on international evidence it is estimated that driver distraction could play a role in 20-30% of all road collisions in this country. This means that driver distraction could be a contributory factor in over 1,400 fatal and iniury collisions annually.

CHILD DISTRACTION: The two biggest distractions for drivers in Ireland are the mobile and children. But did you know that child distraction could be the more lethal? According to researchers at Monash University in Australia they are 12 times more distracting to a driver than talking on a mobile.

The study also found that on average a parent takes their eyes off the road for three minutes and 22 seconds during a 16-minute trip. The most common types of distractions that children cause include the driver turning to look at the child or watching the goings on in the back seat in the rear-view mirror, engaging in conversation with the child, leaning into the back to help or pacify the child and even playing with the child.

This is the subject of the first of two new ads from of the RSA on the subject of driver distraction over the Summer of 2015. The first ad which was aired on Monday 15th ad deals with child distraction and is entitled 'Looking Back' [insert link]. (A second ad will follow later in the summer and deals with the issue of mobile phone distraction).

In the 40 second ad we see a woman looking back, over the duration of her entire life. She's looking back with regret at something that happened many years ago. By the end of the advertisement, we see what this event was. The moment she looked back in a very concrete sense - looking back to her child while she was driving. We cut before she crashes into an oncoming car and loses this child forever.

- · We end with the message: Don't lose a lifetime looking back.
- · Never let a child take your focus off the road.

#### Pull over if you have to.

- The cost is too high to take your focus off the road to look at your child for even one second.
- · We're asking drivers to give the road all of their focus, and if they need to, to pull over.

**BEING A GOOD PARENT MEANS BEING A** GOOD DRIVER: When it comes to children in the car, parents are resigned to the distraction they cause and sceptical of finding a permanent solution. That's why we need to educate parents about the risks of focusing on their children rather than the road.

The RSA undertook research in this area in 2014 to understand what was going on in the car with parents and young children. We asked parents to keep a diary and what they had to say was very revealing.

- It found that parents are conflicted. They are trying to be a good driver and a good parent at the same time. They are torn between looking after the child, and they struggle to put the child's more immediate needs behind the task of safely driving the car.
- · A good parent wouldn't ignore their kid screaming in the back seat without at least trying to intervene. Yet the very act of attempting to attend to their children's needs, makes them bad drivers and puts their children in mortal danger.
- · Parents of young children are busier than most and see their car as an extension of the home and a necessary place to multi-task. For parents, driving with children on board, can be an experience filled with anxiety, guilt, frustration and irritation.
- In the RSA study we asked parents to gain a fresh perspective. Parents consciously took a trip without children and asked to note any differences. It was a revelation for some when it came to their driving and they realised they needed to do something.

• The aim of this new campaign is to educate parents on the risks that children pose as a distraction in the car. We want parents to understand that the things going on outside the vehicle need their attention much more than the things inside it.

TIPS FOR PARENTS: The best advice is to give serious thought to your children's needs before you all jump into the car. One solution in reducing driver distraction, according to the Monash University report, is the correct restraint of children in their car seats.

 The RSA sees it regularly at its Check it Fits child car seat service. Think how you would feel on a trip in the car sitting in a seat that's incorrectly fitted, wearing layers of padded clothing and the straps not adjusted correctly so they're cutting into your shoulders? It certainly explains some of the constant crying and trying to get out of the seat behaviour of some children. The Australian researchers found the children in their study were in the incorrect position for over 70 per cent of the journey time. Three quarters of child car seats we examine here in Ireland are incorrectly fitted. Ensuring your child is properly restrained in the correct car seat could eliminate a big cause of distraction while driving for parents. If they do start acting up once the car is in motion, keep your attention on the road. If you feel you absolutely have to intervene, find a safe place to pull over in order to do so, but under no circumstances on the hard shoulder of a motorway. Otherwise stay focused on the driving. Everything and everyone else can wait. You have spent every waking moment working hard to protect your children, don't jeopardise this because you didn't make in car safety your single-minded priority. If you want to be a good parent in the car, focus on being a good driver.

## **BUCKLEY INSPIRED KERRY SET UP ALL IRELAND DATE**

#### KERRY 0-18 TYRONE 1-11

Kerry survived a stern test from the men of Tyrone to qualify for another All-Ireland final and make it just their third win over the Red Hands in Senior Championship football. Those who were expecting a dour defensive type of game were in for a surprise as both teams served up an exciting game of football in very testing conditions before an attendance of 53,000 at GAA headquarters.

Tyrone's record of having conceded just two goals in the All-Ireland Senior Football Championship this year remains intact while at the same time they held Kerry goalless. Apart from their goal which was from a penalty, they created a few other goal-scoring opportunities and must be considered unlucky when one shot went whizzing just above the crossbar. Two more goal chances were prevented through the excellence of goalkeeper Brendan Kealy.

Both Colm Cooper and Kieran Donaghywereverycloselywatched throughout but nonetheless all of the Kerry forwards scored; an outcome which must have pleased manager Eamonn Fitzmaurice.

Kerry showed great character in coming back strongly after Tyrone had scored a goal from a penalty late into the game. This was a big talking point among fans afterwards as was the contributions of Paul Geaney and

Barry John Keane when introduced in the second-half.

Tyrone were more than a match for Eamonn Fitzmaurice's side and for long periods of the game there was little between the teams.

The Tyrone defence certainly made things very difficult for the Kingdom, given the fact that Kerry were unable to create a decent goal scoring opportunity all day.

But between the 64th minute and the end of the game, Kerry kicked for home and a run of four points from Anthony Maher, Paul Geaney (2), and Barry John Keane effectively sealed victory for the Kingdom.

Kerry suffered the loss of Marc O'Se through a black card in the 16th minute of the first half and survived this particular upset due no doubt to the solid performance of Fionn Fitzgerald who came on in place of the An Ghaeltacht veteran.

Darren McCurry opened the scoring for Tyrone with two quick fire points, but Kerry responded with three from Johnny Buckley to take the lead for the first time. Ronan McNabb levelled for Tyrone with a fine score but Kerry hit back with a splendid score from Stephen O'Brien.

Tyrone goalkeeper Niall Morgan converted a great free in the 15th minute after Connor McAliskey was fouled. McAliskev landed a fine score of his own in the 26th minute but Kerry responded with two points from James O'Donoghue

leave the score a 0-7 to 0-5 in favour of Kerry. Tyrone refused to surrender and scores from Mark Bradley and Mattie Donnelly had the teams level coming up to halftime, but Kieran Donaghy with a great effort secured possession and made no mistake to leave Kerry with a 0-8 to 0-7 interval advantage.

#### SECOND HALF

Mickey Harte's side were back on level terms within two minutes of the resumption as Connor McAliskey landed his second point of the game.

Tyrone were hit a blow within minutes of the resumption when Colm Cooper made the most of two poor Niall Morgan kick outs to give Kerry the lead.

Paul Geaney, with his first point of the afternoon in the 39th minute, made the margin three, and at this stage, it looked as if Kerry would pull away.

But Tyrone stuck doggedly to their task and Darren McCurry, who had an otherwise quiet afternoon, pointed.

Kerry hit three points in a row from Donnchadh Walsh and James O'Donoghue (0-2, both frees) to take a 0-14 to 0-9 lead with 52 minutes gone.

Colm Cavanagh kept Tyrone in the hunt with a well-worked point. Then, all of a sudden, Tyrone were handed a lifeline when a penalty was awarded after Barry Tierney was fouled inside the area.

Peter Harte coolly converted the subsequent spot kick and then Mark Bradley levelled for the Red Hands with his second of the game. It was anyone's game once more.

However, Kerry came up with the right answers and a run of four unanswered points eventually earned them a place in another All-Ireland final.

The Spa clubman got the vital goal in the second half for Jack O'Connor's men as they fought back after Conor Maunsell slotted a freak goal for Derry.

Goalkeeper Billy Courtney was left red-faced as the ball looped over his head and Derry were level after 33 minutes.

But it was a well-deserved win for Kerry who were the better side at Croke Park and will go on to defend the title they won for the first time in 20 years last term against either Tipperary or Kildare on September

Geaney, who is a cousin of seniors Paul and Michael, was still a major asset and has now hit 2-23 in just five games in this year's championship - he slotted 0-05

Meanwhile Derry's wait goes on; it is 13 years since they last claimed an All-Ireland minor crown.

They trailed 0-06 to 0-03 at halftime and couldn't reduce the deficit after the break with substitute Niall McAtamnev's late goal disallowed. Both sides struggled to deal with the greasy conditions but initially it looked as though Kerry would run away with it.

They took a 0-05 to 0-01 lead inside 13 minutes but Derry packed out their defence and fought their way back.

Geaney kicked Kerry into the lead in the second minute when he won a free and tapped it over from 45 yards out, Michael Foley hit a quick-fire second as the Kerry forwards looked too hot to handle and Andrew Barry slotted a third after a patient build-up.

Derry flooded back in numbers and AFL potential recruit Conor Glass was used as an extra-man in defence, as was Tiarnan Flanagan. Flanagan was one of three changes from the spirited win over Longford three weeks ago while another one of those, Francis Kearney helped Derry find a way back.

First Sean McGuigan got his name amongst the scorers with a curled effort from his left boot but Kerry extended their lead through Geaney, again from a free, and a John Mark Foley point in the 13th

That gave the Kingdom a 0-05 to 0-01 lead but when Geaney failed to convert a possible goal opportunity Derry grew into the game.

Glass was deployed more around the middle and they used the route one option to find Kearney in at full-forward.

Kearney pointed their second after 21 minutes and McGuigan doubled his tally for the day with a free.

Kerry had not scored in 14 minutes until John Mark Foley potted a monster effort from distance and that gave them a 0-06 to 0-03 lead the break.

Derry made the ideal start to the second-half when Maunsell had the ball in the Kerry net after three minutes.

It was just a speculative effort from the Derry corner-back but it left the scores at 0-06 to 1-03. Geaney replied with a free and his first from play but a massive score from Kearney kept Derry in touch.

However Derry only had two more scores for the remainder of the game while Kerry's experience as All-Ireland champions showed.

Mark O'Connor, who was part of last year's winning side, was introduced off the bench and when Foley slotted their goal in the 38th minute they pushed on for victory.





# Citizens Information

## **Know Your Rights: EUROPEAN HEALTH INSURANCE CARD**

## QUESTION

My daughter and I are planning a holiday in Germany and Switzerland this summer and I'm wondering what happens if one of us becomes ill. Am I liable to pay for medical costs if I don't take out insurance?

#### **ANSWER**

You and your daughter each need an individual European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). This card allows you to access public healthcare services if you become ill or get injured when visiting certain European countries. It doesn't cover private treatment or the cost of repatriation to Ireland, if one of you becomes very ill.

The countries covered by the card are the 28 member states of the EU, the three other members of the EEA (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway) and Switzerland. The card is not required for a visit to the UK if you can show that you are ordinarily resident in Ireland. In practice, this means showing a driving licence, passport or similar document. There is no charge for the card. Any website attempting to charge you for your EHIC is not connected to the HSE or any State services.

You can apply online at ehic.ie if you already have a medical card, GP visit card or Drugs Payment Scheme card. Otherwise, you can download an application form from ehic.ie or get it from your Local Health Office. You need to provide your name, address, date of birth and Personal Public Service Number (PPSN). If your EHIC card has expired you can renew it online at ehic.ie. If a family member has changed name or address, they will need to contact their Local Health Office.

You should apply for the card a month before travelling, if possible. If you have concerns about getting a new or renewed card in time, you can get a Temporary Replacement Certificate either online or from your Local Health Office. You may also wish to consider taking out private travel insurance for expenses that are not covered by the European Health Insurance Card (such as the costs of repatriation or the expenses of relatives who travel to you if you fall ill abroad).

If you have a smartphone you can also download the free EHIC App. This helps you contact health services in the country you are visiting. The app does not replace the EHIC.

## TRANSITION FROM PRIMARY TO SECONDARY SCHOOL WHAT TO EXPECT AND WHAT CAN HELP

By the time you reach your final years in primary school, you will be totally comfortable with your school environment. By sixth class, you are one of the most senior people in your school and you are used to being given responsibility and looked up to by the younger children. However the transition to secondary school means that you have to revert to being the most junior again and have to cope with a brand new environment. Change can be a daunting task for any one of us and can take a lot of adjusting to.

Easily the biggest change when entering secondary school is going from the experience of one teacher all day in one classroom to encountering eight or nine different teachers and subject/classroom changes every forty minutes or so. A tip to help you cope with this is to write down the name of each new teacher beside the name of the subject and write your own version of the class timetable.

The second big change is the constant movement between classrooms throughout the day. Depending on your subject choices, you will be moving all around the school. Getting lost during the first few weeks will be inevitable and a good tip is to always stay with at least one other person from the class.

Another big adjustment is the number of specific subjects you will be covering. Students in First Year will cover up to sixteen different subjects; many of these will be new to you. Discuss all the subjects at home with your parents and let them know which ones you struggle with. Everyone will have their own favourites and will excel at certain subjects.

Your timetable will take a lot of getting used to and you may need help initially in the organisation of your schoolbag each day. Each student will also be provided with a locker and be sure to use your locker to avoid 'heavy bag syndrome'

Homework time is obviously going to increase. However not all subjects are covered every day and not all subjects involve homework. Learn how to successfully manage your time and don't rule out the possibility of supervised study. Schools reports may also be a new experience that comes with secondary school as regular reports come home from the school.

Taking part in games and P.E. is a great way of getting to know more students in your school. Find activities which you and enjoy and try out new activities even if you haven't tried something before, or if you don't know what the activity entails

If you find yourself struggling with any aspect of this change be sure to talk to someone: Your parents, a friend, a class teacher or school counsellor. This time will fly by, and before long your new school will feel like your second home!!

However, it is important to involve the child as much as possible and to listen to their ideas and preferences when deciding what changes to make to the

Your healthcare professional may ask you to keep a diary of the food that your child eats. They may then have specific recommendations for changes to make. Sometimes a referral to a dietician may be suggested.

#### Some suggestions that may be helpful include:

- · Aim for a balanced and varied diet for the whole family.
- Encourage your child to eat meals at regular times and to watch how often they are eating. They should avoid snacking as much as possible.
- Try to eat meals in a sociable atmosphere as a family without distractions. For example, do not eat in front of the television.
- If snacks are eaten, they should be healthy snacks (for example, fruit) instead of sweets, chocolates, crisps, nuts, biscuits, and cakes.
- Snacks or food should not be used as a reward.
- Encourage your child to watch the portion sizes of the food that they are
- Make up the bulk of most of your child's meals with starch-based foods (such as cereals, bread, potatoes, rice, pasta). Wholegrain starch-based foods should be eaten when possible.
- Make sure that your child eats plenty of foods high in fibre. Foods rich in fibre include wholegrain bread, brown rice and pasta, oats, peas, lentils, grain, beans, fruit, vegetables and seeds. Amongst other things, foods high in fibre will help to fill your child up.
- Aim for at least five portions of a variety of fruit and vegetables per day for your child.
- Encourage low-calorie drinks (water is best).
- Children need some fat in their diet but aim to grill, boil or bake rather

### **DOING PLENTY OF PHYSICAL ACTIVITY**

It is recommended that all children should do at least 60 minutes of moderate physical activity every day. Some suggest that children who are overweight or obese should even do more than this. This 60 minutes does not have to be done all at once and can be broken up into 10- or 15-minute blocks. Also, you should encourage your child to become generally less sedentary. The amount of time that they spend doing sedentary activities, such as watching television, using a computer, or playing video games, should be less than two hours each day.

As parents and carers, there are some ways that you can encourage your child to become more physically active. For example:

- Encourage active play for your child including games that involve moving around a lot, such as skipping, dancing, running or ball games.
- Encourage your child to spend less time sitting doing sedentary activities.




























## TIPS FOR LIVING WITH LESS PLASTIC:

Plastic is so commonplace in our world today that it's nearly impossible to imagine a life without it. Striving for a plastic-free life, however, remains a noble and worthwhile goal – and it's becoming easier with every year that passes, as more people demand plastic alternatives and refuse to participate in the grotesque plastic waste that's filling our planet's landfills and oceans.

Here are some tips on how to get rid of plastic at home. Don't worry; it's easier than you think!

\*Carry a reusable water bottle and travel mug wherever you go. Pack your lunch in cloth sandwich bags or a suitable wooden box, etc. Take reusables to the supermarket, farmers' market, or wherever you're shopping.

\*Buying bottled water in Ireland is absurd; it's exorbitantly expensive; it's a gross waste of resources to collect, bottle, and transport it; and it results in unnecessary plastic waste that's usually not recycled.

\*The more items you can buy in bulk, the more you'll save in packaging. You'll save money in food costs and, if you drive, in the petrol used for extra trips to the store.

Search for items such as large wheels of cheese, without any plastic packaging, and stock up on those whenever possible.

\*Convenience foods are among the worst culprits for excessive packaging waste. Frozen foods come wrapped in plastic and packaged in cardboard, which is often lined with plastic, too. There's not any way around it; it's a shopping habit that will have to go if you're serious about ditching plastic.

\*Don't expose yourself and your family to toxic perfluorochemicals that are released when non-stick surfaces such as Teflon are heated. Replace with cast iron (which works just as well as non-stick if seasoned and cared for properly), stainless steel, or copper cookware. \*This could be a fun experiment in canning, and if you dedicate a whole day to it, you could have enough to last the whole year. Make cucumber or zucchini relish and ketchup when late-summer vegetables are at their peak. Items such as chocolate sauce, mustard, and mayonnaise are quick and simple to make once you get the hang of them. Everything can be kept in glass jars.

\*Baking soda, which comes for cheap in large cardboard boxes, and vinegar, which comes in large glass jars, can be used to clean, scour, and disinfect the house and wash dishes, replacing plastic cleaning bottles; soda can be turned into an effective homemade deodorant; and both soda and vinegar (apple cider, specifically) can replace shampoo and conditioner bottles.

#### COMMUNITY AND HURRICANE KATRINA FORCE A RADICAL RETHINKING OF. CRIMINAL JUSTICE:

Abandoned by correctional staff when Hurricane Katrina hit, inmates at the Orleans Parish Prison stood chest-deep in sewagetainted floodwater for as long as four days before they were rescued. On the eve of the

2005 storm, the jail held nearly 6,300 inmates, and leeches, rodents, mould, and unexplained deaths were its hallmarks. That year, the city's incarceration rate was more than five times the national figure—which itself is the world's highest.

The destruction wreaked by the floodwaters laid bare a corrections facility that could no longer be sustained. Many of the buildings in the jail complex were beyond repair and did not reopen. Inmates, including thousands locked up pre-trial because they couldn't afford bail and others serving years-long sentences, were transferred to a series of temporary tent-like structures—where all incoming defendants and convicts are sent today while a new facility is under construction. Since Katrina, a coalition of grassroots organizers that has demonstrated a surprising amount of power and political savvy, as well as a lawsuit, has pushed local officials into a challenging debate about how to diminish the city's kneejerk reliance on incarceration as a remedy for all crime. Results so far are impressive, the average daily jail population has dropped 67% since just before Katrina, from 6,000 to 1,900 inmates.

In 2012, the city launched the New Orleans Pre-trial Services programme, and it became a key element in decreasing the number of inmates at the jail. The program helps judges assess arrestees so they can decide who needs to be detained and who poses less of a risk to the community.

\*The Ragman Rolls of 1296 refers to the collection of instruments by which the nobility and gentry of Scotland subscribed allegiance to King Edward I of England.

After the death of Queen Margaret in 1291, there were a number of claimants to the Scottish throne. King Edward of England offered to hear the claimants cases and decide who had the most valid claim. When the Noblemen who were involved met with Edward at Norham on Tweed, Edward insisted in having them sign an oath of allegiance to him. The document signed by most of the noblemen is called the first and smallest of the Ragman Rolls.

On the 30th March 1296, King Edward sent an army 30,000 strong north into Scotland (the largest army ever to invade Scotland). The first stop was Berwick Upon Tweed. The English forces quickly overwhelmed the Scots timber fortifications, and for two days streams of blood from the massacred Scots filled the River Tweed. Men, women and children were slain... 7,500 souls of both sexes were ordered massacred by Edward despite the surrender of the local garrison. The slaughter was finally stopped when local Catholic Clerics pleaded with Edward to show some pity.

English forces under the Command of Edward next fought the Scots at the Battle of Dunbar

The Scots forces were led by Wallace and Moray in Dunbar. The Scots at Dunbar were quickly overwhelmed and capitulated. Most of the Scots nobility were captured and imprisoned.

The Ragman Roll, heavy taxes, and the forcing of Scotland to send her troops to support Edward's war with France laid the seeds of rebellion in the years to come. In Edward's efforts to claim the Kingdom and Crown of Scotland, he grossly underestimated the people of Scotland. His determination to crush the Scots people had served only to define for the Scots, who they really were.

Nearly 180,000 Care2 members signed a Care2 petition demanding that UPS stop shipping shark fins. Shark populations are declining around the globe, with over 140 species of sharks listed as endangered, threatened, or near threatened by extinction."

Sharks are being maimed and left to die because people consume their fins in soup. Care2 asked earlier this month why UPS

continued to ship shark fins, despite a growing public outcry. The company had become a primary method of transporting fins around the world, placing it in a unique position of responsibility.

After Care2 members raised their voices, UPS had a conversation with the World Wildlife Fund about the impact of their actions. Following that discussion, the shipping giant tweeted that it was banning the shipment of shark fins.

## 'LOST' GOOSE FOLLOWS PICKUP TRUCK 6 MILES TO WATER:

If there's a wild Canada goose following you, it often means you're being chased angrily from a pond or harassed for bread crumbs.

Andre Bachman first realised a goose was tailing him as he drove along a gravel road in rural southwest Alberta. "The goose was flying above when it saw his truck and started flying beside him, said his son.

Curious why a goose would spontaneously follow a pickup truck, Mr. Bachman pulled over — as did the goose. He began filming with his smartphone as he stepped out to greet the goose, which was waddling nonchalantly toward him.

"Hi," Mr. Bachman said. "What are you doing? Are you lost?"

The goose didn't answer, aside from quiet honking. But its behaviour spoke volumes, revealing a level of comfort with humans that suggests it may have been a pet at some point. Shooing it with "off you go, off you go" didn't work, so Mr. Bachman decided to embrace the goose's idea. Thinking it might need help finding water, he set out for Shining Bank Lake, which is about 10 kilometers (6 miles) away.

As Mr. Bachman filmed through his truck window, he began driving and coaching the goose to follow. It started with a brisk trot — a pretty amusing sight on its own — and then flapped into flight, letting Mr. Bachman capture an endearing view of it flying

alongside to the Beatles' "Let It Be."

Mr. Bachman stopped at least once to check on the goose, who had little trouble keeping up. "My dad would just about stop for the corners after the first one to let it turn," his son said "Also, at one point he wanted to see how fast it could go. At around 80 km/h [50 mph], the goose started flying above his truck on the air coming off his windshield."

Once at the lake, the goose "seems happy and stays," Mr. Bachman wrote on YouTube, where the video has been watched more than 1.5 million times in about a week.

While the bird was probably never in serious distress, Mr. Bachman did it a favour by leading it to water where it had a much better chance of finding food.




