
Niamh Coffey, 6th Year student at St. Brigid's Presentation School in Killarney has been awarded this year's Orla Benson Award this week.

Patients being forgotten as hospital waiting lists soar - Foley

Fianna Fáil TD Norma Foley says patients in Kerry are being forgotten as waiting lists at University Hospital Kerry have increased significantly since the start of the Coronavirus pandemic. She's calling for the cancellation of the HSE contract with private hospitals, and for the money to be used to treat patients via the National Treatment Purchase Fund.

The latest in-patient waiting list figures published by the NTPF reveals a 76.1% jump in the number of people waiting for appointments at University Hospital Kerry since the pandemic began.

In February there were 297 people on the inpatient and day case waiting lists at UHK. In April this number rose to 523 - an increase of 226 in just two months.

Deputy Foley said, "Nationally, an additional 20,000 people are on in-patient lists since the pandemic began and the total number- 86,343 - is the highest ever recorded.

"At the beginning of this pandemic our hospital network was rightly prepared for a major surge in COVID-19 cases. Procedures were cancelled. diagnostics postponed, and people urged to stay away unless absolutely necessary.

"Thankfully hospitals overwhelmed and now is the time to get them operational again. Everyday healthcare needs have not gone away just because there is a pandemic. The longer a patient is left waiting for an essential procedure, the higher

the possibility that their prognosis could deteriorate. That's before even considering that they may be in unnecessary pain or discomfort. "If the current contract between the HSE and the private hospitals was cancelled, it would release €115m a month back into the system. People with heart complications, possible cancer referrals and those with deteriorating evesight don't have time on their side. As it currently stands, that money is paying for empty beds, shut doctors' rooms, dark operating theatres and unused diagnostic equipment. It really is the worst of both worlds. "We can't allow the lists to keep rising and we need to urgently step up our response to get the lists down again," she concluded.

KERRY WELCOMES A **NEW UNIVERSITY**

An Taoiseach Leo Varadkar TD, Minister for Education and Skills Joe McHugh TD and Minister of State for Higher Education Mary Mitchell O'Connor have announced that the consortium of Cork Institute of Technology (CIT) and Institute of Technology Tralee (ITT) is set to become a Technological University. Munster Technological University (MTU) will be officially established in January 2021 and will be Ireland's newest Technological University.

Kerry County Council has also warmly welcomed the announcement of the merger of the Institute of Technology Tralee and Cork Institute of Technology to form the new Munster Technological University.

Cathaoirleach, Cllr Niall Kelleher said the announcement was an enormous boost for County Kerry and provided new and exciting opportunities for education, research, business and economic development in the county.

President of IT Tralee, Dr Brendan O'Donnell, in welcoming the announcement, signalled MTU's ability to become astrong driver of economic growth for the region:

"We are delighted to receive confirmation that we will formally establish MTU in 2021. This is a time of unprecedented challenge for the region, Ireland and the world. MTU will play a leadership role in the strategic development of the South-West region as we work towards national and global recovery. The availability of a skilled professional workforce is essential to

the creation of Irish companies and in attracting new companies to locate in Ireland. As a new university, MTU will develop and enhance curricula and research opportunities through stakeholder engagement ensuring that the changing demands of regional enterprise, the professions, and the community are realised."

'The conferring of university status on the new Munster Technological University will greatly enhance Kerry's reputation for topclass education facilities and will greatly assist Kerry in attracting high-level research and investment in many areas.

Chief Executive, Moira Murrell congratulated the existing colleges on the work they have done over many years to achieve the new status.

'This is wonderful news for Kerry and will provide a wider economic boost to the county at what is a very challenging time. This decision is an endorsement of the tremendous effort of the staff and management of IT Tralee and Cork IT over many years to bring this project to fruition.

'Kerry County Council has had a long-standing and very productive relationship with IT Tralee, and I look forward to continuing that collaboration and engagement with the management of the new university in the years ahead.'

2020 Clár Programme will help rural communities in Kerry to respond to COVID-19 - Griffin

Minister for State for Tourism and Sport, Brendan Griffin TD is encouraging local groups in Kerry to apply for the Government's 2020 Clár Programmme, which has a total fund of €5 million and is designed to help rural communities respond to the challenge of COVID-19. Minister Griffin said, "The Clár Programme can be used for small scale infrastructural projects in rural communities where there has been significant levels of population decline. This year it has been tailored to help such communities to respond to COVID-19. "The details of the 2020 CLÁR programme were announced this week by the Minister for Rural & Community Development Michael Ring TD, and I encourage local community groups in Kerry to apply. All the details they will need, including the application forms, are available at https://www.gov.ie/en/ policy-information/91ba52-clar/ Minister Griffin continued, "Since Fine Gael reopened the Clár Programme in 2016, it has supported over 1,400 projects nationally with funding of almost €33 million. It has been a significant support to communities in some of the remotest parts of Kerry. "CLÁR is one element of a €30 million package of co-ordinated and complementary supports that is being launched by the Minister this week as part of his Department's Rural

Development Investment Programme. The other elements of the programme to be opened later this week will be the Town and Village Renewal Scheme and the Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme. The Rural Development Investment Programme is funded under Project Ireland 2040. "It's great to see the Clár Programme being adapted this year to help rural communities respond to new challenges as a result of COVID-19. "For example, the Schools and Community Safety Measure, which funds items such as pedestrian crossings and footpaths to provide safe access to schools, has been broadened to allow additional investments to adapt areas around schools and community facilities to help meet new public health requirements arising from COVID-19.

"Funding will be provided under a new measure for community recreational areas where friends and families can socialise outdoors in safe, accessible, community spaces while respecting public health guidelines. This measure will include support for items such as picnic benches/tables, outdoor covered seating or BBQ areas, public lighting, bicycle stands, bandstand/ stage areas, etc. These recreational areas will be particularly important for community social interaction in the coming months, in line with

the Government's Roadmap for Reopening Society and Business. "Community organisations providing meals on wheels and other community services will also be supported to purchase kitchen or food delivery equipment. "I was also pleased to hear Minister Ring confirm that we will separately continue to fund vehicles for those vital voluntary organisations that provide free transport for people with mobility issues and for those attending cancer treatments."

Minister Ring added, "I have introduced a standard grant rate of up to 90% of the total cost of projects across all of the CLÁR Measures this year. This should ensure that the requirement on communities or Local Authorities to source match funding is kept to a minimum. "With the introduction of these new Measures, my Department will play its part in helping rural communities adapt their local spaces and support their interactions with one another in a safe but inclusive way. I will be announcing further complementary supports in the coming days under the Town and Village Renewal Scheme and the Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme as part of my Department's Rural Development Investment Programme".

DON'T TOUCH ME

...I am not alone

f you are out and about enjoying the pleasures of Killarney National Park and you go off the beaten track, be careful where you walk.

This is the time of year when deer calves are born. They are often well camouflaged in the cover of the vegetation and remain close to their mother.

May and June are an important time in the wildlife calendar as the next generation of wild deer are born, with the first of new-born calves seen in Killarney over the past two weeks.

Of the three deer species found in Ireland, new-born Red and Sika deer, known as a calf, and Fallow deer young known as a fawn. It is important to remember that new-born deer generally do not follow their mother for the first two weeks after birth. While the mother is away feeding the young are left lying in cover to protect them from predators.

The Irish Deer Commission are asking the general-public, if they come across a young deer alone to remember they are not abandoned and should not be touched or attempt to rescue. The

mother will be nearby feeding and will only return once you move away.

With many wildlife species, including deer, using silage fields as cover for new-born against predators, here are some useful tips for farmers and contractors to reduce mortality of new born deer and other wildlife during the silage cutting season.

Cutting height: the higher the cut, the lower will be the losses suffered by crouching animals and nesting birds Mowing direction: mowing the field from the center outwards gives fullygrown wild animals the opportunity to escape

Mowing date: late cuts-from mid-July

on-wards-reduce the losses to wildlife during the nesting and rearing period Mowing strategy: mowing of partial areas, leaving edge strips not mown Mowing frequency: a longer interval between first and second cuttings reduces the mortality rate, especially for ground-nesting birds

Mowing technology: cutter-bar mowers cause less harm to wild animals than rotary mowers.



"We also had an exercise challenge going for two weeks, I would send a challenge each day and the students had to send me videos of them completing the challenge.


The challenge set for this week is a dancing video challenge and we look forward to seeing what we have at the end of the week.

TidyTowns groups in Kerry can still use funding despite no competition in 2020 - Griffin

Killarney Looking Good Committee are among 39 Tidy Towns groups in Kerry to receive funding.

According to Minister of State for Tourism and Sport, Brendan Griffin TD, TidyTowns groups in Kerry can still use funding allocated to them despite the cancellation of this year's competition.

Last September, Minister for Rural and Community Development, Michael Ring allocated €1.4m to groups nationwide to assist them in their preparations for this year's SuperValu TidyTowns competition.

Since cancelled because of Covid-19, any unspent funds can still be used by the community groups.

Minister Griffin said: "I welcome the announcement that 39 TidyTowns groups in Kerry will not lose out on funding of €52,000 which was earmarked for them by my colleague Minister Ring to help them prepare for this year's competition.

"Any groups that have already spent the funds they received should retain their records of expenditure in the normal way.

"I also want to assure those groups which have not yet spent the funding they received, they can continue to use it over the next few months to assist with activities they might undertake as the COVID-19 restrictions are eased, or in preparing for the 2021 competition."

"For decades, the SuperValu TidyTowns

competition has brought people of all ages in Kerry together to work collectively outdoors to make the environment in which they live and work a better place.

"Due to the current restrictions in place as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic, it would not have been feasible or safe for TidyTowns groups in Kerry to continue their great tradition of work in the normal way.

"However, I very much hope that once the restrictions on gatherings are eased, and where possible within the public health guidelines, they can resume their work in making towns and villages in Kerry more attractive and welcoming.

464 Kerry people respond to Govt call for community volunteers during COVID-19 crisis



URGENT APPEAL TO RETURN TRÓCAIRE BOXES

Once they walked in the doors of Killarney Community College. Their uniform was probably too large, and a little itchy, their bags were heavy, and the school seemed enormous. But now they have walked out those same doors, they are taller and more confident, their uniform probably barely fits, their bags are worn and tattered, and the school seems a smaller place.

Students, you have walked down these corridors, you have memorised every corner and every hallway, the canteen, the classrooms, your friends desk, the lockers, the year that ended abruptly.

The day has arrived and you have left for the last time.

No more Monday morning roll calls, no more teachers telling you to 'get to class' or 'take off that hoodie' or 'what time do you call this?', no more canteen lunches, chats with your classmates, no more thanking God that it is finally Friday!

On occasions such as this I often remember my own early days as a teacher in Dublin. I was supervising a class of leaving certificate students just like yourselves. There was much talk about CAO forms and points and what the future would bring. As the students chatted I could tell clearly that the 'in' profession at the time was to be an air-steward. And as they chatted, yes some said they wanted to be a nurse, or a doctor, or an engineer, as you would expect. Most, however, were talking about being an air-steward. There was great excitement and great talk about what that would be like. Eventually when almost every student had spoken, I turned to the last, somewhat quite student, who really had not said a lot. When I asked her what she wanted to be, she lifted her head and thoughtfully looked at me, and she said 'I'm going to fly the plane'.

It has been over 20 years since I had that coincidental conversation with a student who probably has forgotten the encounter, but to this day when I see a plane overhead, I smile and think of her flying that plane.

You will miss Killarney Community College, but what you will take are the memories you have made along the way, the friendships, the ups and the downs, and what you have learnt. With time will come experience to each and every one of you, and however uncertain you may be about the rest of the world, at least about the foundations you have received in Killarney Community College you can be sure.

So to our Killarney Community College Class of 2020, I say to you, you will have many career paths, you will have many choices ahead, but when it comes time, raise your head above everyone else and fly that plane. May you become whomever it is you want to be, hope to be, and can be.





SHOULD YOU BE CONSIDERING SWITCHING YOUR MORTGAGE

Yes, because some of the Irish mortgage lenders have much lower mortgage interest rates compared to others. There has been a lot of discussion recently in the media recently as regards mortgage switching this is because there can be a very substantial difference in interest rates and monthly repayments between lenders. For example on a mortgage of €200000 over 30 years based on a property value of €300000 and comparing current fixed interest rates one lenders 2 year fixed rate is as slow as 2.30% (3.50% APR) which costs €770 per month whereas another lenders 2 year fixed rate is as high as 3.30% (APR 3.96%) monthly repayment €876 per month. The monthly repayment for the lender with the higher rate is a staggering €106 per month more expensive. Over the term of the mortgage you could pay €38,160 (approx) more in interest, this figure will change depending on interest rate changes in the future. Of course you would need to qualify for the mortgage with the new lender and also there are many other considerations and information you need to know before proceeding further. Most lenders will also cover the cost of paying the legals fees for switching your mortgage. An experienced mortgage broker should be able to discuss your options with you in plain simple english and answer any queries you may have.



SMOOTH JUICY LIPS..

Dry, chapped and cracked lips are a common complaint but can be prevented. Lips lose moisture very quickly as they have less sebaceous glands, than the face and body.

3 main causes are 1.DEHYDRATION

When you are dehydrated, your body pulls water from other parts of the body, mainly the intestines, this can cause constipation and dryness of skin and lips. Try to consume 6-8 glasses of water daily. Consume high quality fats like fish oils and coconut oil or a supplement to moisturise the intestines and boost hydration.

2. WEATHER





From one of Killarney's YOUNGEST CITIZENS TO ITS OLDEST...

This week Killarney Outlook photographer Marie Carroll O'Sullivan continues her visits within her 5k



I was so excited to visit the home of Centenarian Mr Michael J O'Connor this week, 106 years young turning 107 in October, born in 1913. Here he is with his dog Fitzie.

Of course the very first question I was bursting to ask Mr O'Connor was "What is your secret to such long and healthy life"? Mr O'Connor replied "Enjoy your life and do everything in moderation". Wise words. He then followed on to say he enjoys a whiskey in milk each evening. I asked "Is there a particular whiskey you enjoy the most Mr O'Connor". His son in law Joe replied "Crested Ten" to which Mr. O'Connor disagreed sternly "Red Breast Whiskey Marie, that's the one". Top shelf for a top man and very well deserved Mr. O'Connor.

Mr. O'Connor was a motorist for 76 years of his 106 and has never had an accident, a claim or even a parking ticket. His first car was a Model T Ford in 1930 and Mr. O'Connor went from there to travelling in similar style sometime later as a quest on the 'First Flight' of the Concord.

Mr O'Connor worked for Shannon Air Radio as 'Officer in Charge'. I asked him if there was any time in his life that was particularly fulfilling and memorable to him? Standing at the back porch I could see from his display of World War 2 medals, a medal from the pope, framed certificates and photographs with the president etc this provoked my question with great anticipation. I literally hung on his every word.

Mr. O'Connor recalled being a radio officer at

sea in 1937, at a mere 24 years of age, on a First Class Cruise Liner. The ship was headed for the West Indies and arrived in Trinidad on Christmas Eve where Mr O'Connor enjoyed a Champagne Christmas dinner. He said he was walking through the Restaurant and the thought struck him that day 'by God O'Connor, it's a far cry you've come from turning turf in Glencar'.

Michael J O'Connor moved to Killarney on 2nd Feb 1980 to retire. He had always loved Killarney and had a holiday home here throughout his life.

I had actually forgotten I was there to chat about Covid19. Such a wonderfully fascinating gentleman. Mr. O'Connor is grateful for his wonderful family around him and has no great concerns for Covid19 as he is cocooning regardless. Mr. O'Connor said " I am 106, very comfortable and very happy".

I've been smiling for most of the day. What an absolute honour to chat to Mr. O'Connor. He has given me a whole new outlook on life. His mind for dates and details was mind blowing.

I said I would have loved to hug Mr O'Connor goodbye and he replied "another time". Another time for sure. There's a book if not two in you Mr. O'Connor.

Thank you Centenarian Mr Michael J O'Connor for having me to your beautiful back garden in Muckross and allowing me your time.



RIP MOSSIE

What's the difference between an official, a player, a supporter, or a reporter? For Mossie Spillane, the always smiling figure in Austin Stack Park, there never was any. If you attended a game there, you have met Mossie and you were always the better for it. Mossie always had a friendly word and always did anything he could for people - and make no mistake, oppositions teams and supporters were treated just as well as Kerry ones. That was the mark and measure of the man. I especially liked meeting Mossie at juvenile and college games. I tend to arrive early to those – I enjoy the chat and banter beforehand at least as much as the actual games, to be truthful, and so did Mossie. Dermot Moynihan and Con Griffin in the Fitzgerald Stadium were always the same. All three had one thing in common – I spoke with all of them often, and asked each of them at different times if they would do an interview on the record about their experiences at the front lines of Kerry GAA. No, not a chance, was each smiling reply. As far as they were concerned, it was not about them, they were only small contributors. I respectfully disagree, both then and now, and I'm fairly sure that any of the greatest players would agree with me on that. The contributions of the likes of Mossie are the literal embodiment of the GAA. Sadly, Mossie has recently gone to join Dermot and Con and many more in a different viewing gallery, and I have no doubt that the famous lad who could turn water into wine at weddings will enjoy the conversations.

Although I never met either man, I knew who John Murphy and Pat Fenning were. John Murphy was there with Down in 1968 when they they beat Kerry for the third time in a decade, scoring a vital goal on the day, and he was a selector when they beat us on the way to their next All Ireland in 1991 and then 1994. Pat Fenning was a key part of the Offaly team of the early 1970s. They stopped Kerry winning three in a row in 1971 and he got the crucial goal in the 1972 All Ireland Final replay in 1972. I always think that great Offaly team has been unfairly overshadowed by the Kerry and Dublin teams that followed; Offaly were fantastic in their own right. May they rest in peace.

THE LAST DANCE - MICHAEL JORDAN

It's already the most watched ESPN/Netflix documentary of all time (over 6 million) – and ESPN do the best documentaries out there. It's the most popular tv show in the world right now, having replaced 'Tiger King'.Mind you, from the little, but already too much that I have heard about Tiger King, I would sooner watch a Donald Trump 'press conference' instead. I do not say that lightly.

'The Last Dance' is supposedly a documentary about the Chicago Bulls, centred around exclusive footage of their tumultuous and ultimately successful '96 and '97 season. In fact, it's the television footage from the time, not the exclusive stuff, that I enjoy most. I remember thinking that it was the most glamorous thing in the world at the time - it looks very dated now. It's not a documentary, not when the lead character is also one of the main producers. It's openly acknowledged that Michael Jordan had the final say on editing. Director Jason Hehir's denials are about as convincing as the aforementioned president. That's not even a biopic - that's a hagiography. But no harm in that; it still looks brilliant.

In the '80s Showtime dominated basketball, but it was a long way behind American football and baseball in US sports culture. It had the glamour of urbanisation (always basketball's biggest draw, it doesn't take much space or equipment) but the money was in suburbia and they were watching field sports.

Then came Michael. He had signed for the Bulls in 1984. Akeem Olajuwon was actually the first pick, and Sam Bowie was second. Jordan was third, Barkley was fifth, John Stockton was sixteenth. Jordan was a guard in an era when the game was always about centres (Abdul Jabbar, Ewing, Robinson, and later Shaq). The Last Dance doesn't discuss any of that, and is the poorer for it. The game today is focussed much more on speed and accuracy than big man plays. But by the end of the year, Michael Jordan was not just Rookie of the Year, he was a sensation.

Michael both epitomised and transcended his era. Magic Johnson and Larry Bird were the big names for his first few years. He met both on his way up, and both make very likeable appearances in this, Bird especially. Thankfully, the trash talk is mostly absent. I know it's part of the game. But I'm old-fashioned and it irritates me. I don't care how much money Drake gives the Raptors – any team that lets celebrity eejits like that on the sideline is an embarrassment to the game.

The Detroit Pistons, the 'Bad Boys' (the nickname was not ironic in any way), were led by Isaiah Thomas to titles in 1990 and 1991. Once the Bulls took over, they were virtually unstoppable. Coach Phil Jackson gave Jordan free reign, since he knew that Jordan would drive his team non-stop. Jordan genuinely lived and breathed the game. He actively looked out for disrespect as incentive, usually it existed only in his own imagination. His Hall of Fame acceptance speech was like something out of 'Fr. Ted'. He mercilessly bullied his own teammates but he was even worse on the opposition and he won six titles in 8 years. Frankly, a lot is being said at the moment comparing him to LeBron James. LeBron was a better outside shooter and way better at assists - Jordan was about as likely to pass a ball as Pat Spillane was in his heyday. Jordan was far from a team player. If you shared a dressing room with him, you'd hate every minute - except the medal presentations, and there would be plenty of


Yes, it sounds like a certain Corkman we know of - in fact, Jordan was worse than Roy. Or, arguably, better. That's not taking away from Phil Jackson, Scottie Pippen (who actually blossomed once he stopped being Michael's wing-man and started dominating in his own right, or the controversial Dennis Rodman. Rodman, who came from the 'bad boys', was great on court, completely unreliable off it. In fact, there's a serious documentary to be made about Rodman's insecurities and craving for the spotlight that look like a cry for help, but this isn't that documentary. Kukoc and Grant barely get a mention so far. Jerry Krause isn't treated as unfairly as is rumoured. He is praised for the things he got right, but blamed for everything that went wrong. It isn't as if Krause didn't have to work within a budget - money is almost never mentioned throughout, apart from Pippen's contract woes. Jordan's shoe deal with Nike that catapulted basketball into global consciousness barely gets a mention.

This is all about Michael. And, no matter what the ad slogan says, nobody could ever "be like Mike". Comparisons with LeBron James (and I like and admire him) are superflous. LeBron was the best player of an era. Michael Jordan literally created one.

This doesn't look anything like the unvarnished truth. This is a fantastic romp through the era when the sport exploded while wearing blinkers. I'm halfway through and loving it. I'll admit that the chronology jumps annoy me, especially that first big jump from May

'95 to October '97, but I suppose the disclosures are timed for dramatic effect.

By the way, I have been been binging also through MasterChef Australia. "Jaysus, lad, that's no way to friccassee a lobster", I cry as I munch my sausage and ketchup sandwich. But that thing is no more honest than The Last Dance. How in heaven's name has Poh not been eliminated already? Is she blackmailing them or something? 'Cause it certainly can't be her cooking.

always been credited with the stroke of genius. In fact, Jack always says that it was Johnny Culloty's suggestion - a manager who can take on board ideas is often more effective than one who comes up with them. The Kerry minors didn't win the All Ireland – and something in Kerry that has always annoyed me is that teams that don't win the big canister tend to be quickly consigned to history. That was a great team - it just so happened that so were Mayo and Donegal, and Roscommon proved themselvesa slightly better one in the last ten minutes of a replay. Paddy Curran and Jamie Doolan got the goals that saw them win a tough opener against Tipperary by 2-10 to 2-7. They beat Limerick well, 4-11 to 0-9, Paddy Curtin (2), Tommy Walsh, and Johnny Buckley with goals. Meanwhile, Tipperary had beaten Cork through the back door (Tipperary from 2006 to 2016 had great minor teams). Kerry had more lessons learnt alomng the way and their victory was more emphatic this time around. Mayo were a serious challenge in the quarter-final. Kevin McLoughlin was in defence and Tom parsons was in midfield. Pearse Hanley in the forwards was their star name - he is an even bigger star now in Aussie Rules. A young Donal Vaughn sprang from the bench. But Kerry always had that little bit of an edge, especially with Moran and Walsh dominating midfield. Kerry led by 0-6 tom 0-1 but Mayo rallied, only for Johnny

Buckley's goal to put them ahead by 1-7 to 0-4. Again mayo rallied in the second half, but a neat finish by Eoin Kennedy after great work by Walsh and Moran saw Kerry win by 2-7 to 0-9.

Donegal in the semi-final. They had never played in an All Ireland Minor Final. And they would still have to wait until 2014 to do so (guess which county would be waiting?). Donegal had good footballers. Leo McCloone was centre back. Declan Walsh was in the corner behind him. Martin McIlhenny had a great game on the wing, scoring 1-2. The most famous of them all was the lad who had turned 17 just three weeks before. Michael Murphy would kick 0-3 and battle hard against Tommy Walsh. But to be honest, Kerry won midfield (Gary O'Driscoll and David Moran had switched) and I had no idea of the phenomenon that he would become. Kerry won convincingly by 2-13 to 1-10. Paddy Curran was unstoppable, with !-6 racked up by the end.

Roscommon manager Fergal O'Donnell had been with his team from U14. They weathered an early storm and came right back at Kerry. By the three quarter mark they were in front before it was Kerry's turn to rally. Donie Shine with 0-6 and Conor Devaney with 0-5 were Roscommon's main men. Tommy Walsh was superb throughout for Kerry, while Paddy Curran had 0-4 in each half. In the end, David O'Gara pointed an equaliser and the sides had to go to a replay in Ennis.

So many supporters turned up that the game had to be delayed. When the action did begin, Roscommon were able to keep the ball away from Tommy Walsh, but Shane Enright was able to curb the dangerous Devaney. It was a fantastic game. Kerry actually played the better football, but their shooting was just that bit off-kilter. I felt that we would still have enough to get us past the finish line, but in fairness to Roscommon they hit a spurt in the last ten minutes. Fintan Cregg won some great ball and Donie Shine hit three points on the trot, and it was all over. 17 of that Roscommon squad would eventually play senior. As for Kerry....well, a lot of the names on this list should be familiar.

RESILIENCE

When we engage with strategies to enhance Mental Wellness resilience is talked about, but usually as an essential skill for healthy childhood development. This article examines the steps adults can take to boost resilience in middle age, which is often the time we need it most as midlife can bring all kinds of stressors including divorce, the death of a parent, career setbacks and retirement worries, yet many of us do not build the coping skills we need to meet these challenges. The good news is that some of the qualities of middle age - a better ability to regulate emotions, perspective gained from life experiences and concern for future generations — may give older people an advantage over the young when it comes to developing resilience. There are three core psychological attributes at the heart of resilience: strength, meaning/purpose, and pleasure. If your personal life is characterized by these traits, you have the core components needed to build resilience. You feel equipped to handle both daily life and those challenging moments when you have to dig deeper. You also believe that you're contributing to the world in a way that helps others, consistent with what seems most important to you. Whether you believe that you exist in a universe controlled by a clearly defined higher power, or participate in the human collective that transcends your personal identity, your source of meaning helps you manage high stress and trauma effectively. And finally, pleasure. It's about deeply enjoying that which enriches and satisfies you. Whether it be poetry or pottery, movies or theater, having experiences that bring you a deep sense of pleasure are essential. Strength, meaning and pleasure. These core attributes must be experienced on both an emotional and cognitive level. Resilience grows from both feelings and engagement in a thought life, bringing you strength, meaning and pleasure. Reading, thinking, working, praying, writing, conversing - these are just as important as emotional experiences that give you the feelings of strength, meaning and pleasure.

Practice Optimism. Optimism is part genetic, part learned. So if you were born into a family of Eeyores, you can still find your inner Tigger. Optimism doesn't mean ignoring the reality of a dire situation. After a job loss, for instance, many people may feel defeated and think, "I'll never recover from this." An optimist would acknowledge the challenge in a more hopeful way, saying, "This is going to be difficult, but it's a chance to rethink my life goals and find work that truly makes me happy."

Rewrite Your Story. When recovering from a challenging situation, know that your life was forever changed, but reframing the situation, focusing on the opportunity the setback presented, so that you can rewrite what will be the

Don't Personalize It. We have a tendency to blame ourselves for life's setbacks and to ruminate about what we should have done differently. In the moment, a difficult situation feels as if it will never end. To boister your resilience, remind yourself that even if you made a mistake, a number of factors most likely contributed to the problem and shift your focus to the next steps you should take.

Go Out of Your Comfort Zone. Resilience doesn't just come from negative experience. You can build your resilience by putting yourself in challenging situations and learn to cope a bit more each time.

Take Stress Breaks: Times of manageable stress present an opportunity to build your resilience. It's almost as if you need to invite stress into your life to practice how to manage it. Taking a walk break, spending five minutes to meditate or phoning a good friend are ways to give your mind and body a break from stress

So, take a look around in your life, and keep working on strength, meaning and pleasure and building resilience!

A Word of Victory


Welcome back dear reader, here is another testimony from one of our congregation. 'For many years I struggled emotionally with inferiority and absolute shame of myself. This was due to abuse that I endured as a child. When I got to know the Lord through Bible study I found that His Word read my heart like a book. Fear, bitterness, and resentment were exposed, and ever so gently God led me like the tender Father that He is to forgive those who had hurt me with their actions and their words. I learned that there is no distance in the Spirit where God dwells and those things that happened to me were as real to God as when they had occurred. He showed me how to go back to that time in prayer, and surface those buried emotions and deal with them acknowledging the pain I had endured, and choosing to let it go by releasing toxic emotions out of my heart. Such peace and lightness came into my heart and mind as a result. Those emotions had burdened and weighed me down. They affected how I reacted to people and situations and turmoil. There is a Scripture in 1st Corinthians chapter 13:11 that says "when I was a child I spoke and thought and reasoned as a child. But when I grew up I put away childish things." Well, while I held onto the rejection, inferiority, shame and the hurts, I reacted to everything in the same way as a child would. Fear was a massive factor, especially the fear of man. I wanted to please people to make them like me and constantly thought about how not to hurt or offend others by doing or saying the wrong thing. This is an exhausting way to live but I didn't know how to escape or break the pattern. Mentally and emotionally I was under strain. I learnt to partner with God and allow Him to expose the painful places in me, and my life changed. The emotional stunting was replaced by God's peace and wisdom and I was able to 'grow up' emotionally, because even though I am a mature adult physically, my heart was grieved and hurted like a small child. But now, since I got to know God as my loving Father through Jesus His Son I am a different person. I face challenges like everyone - but now I have the assurance that God loves me and He is with me, and He will never leave me. Amen.' (Psalm 55:22; Romans 8:31-39)


