firm favourite with Killarney folk, Rossbeigh Beach has been awarded one of 14 Blue Flags by Kerry County Council for the 218 season.

Kerry beaches have again maintained their excellent standard this year with the awarding of 14 Blue Flags for 2018 by An Taisce – The National Trust for Ireland, as announced in recent weeks.

Blue Flags are awarded to beaches and marinas which comply with a very specific set of criteria relating to water quality, information provision, environmental education and beach management. Beaches must also comply with EU bathing water directives to secure the honour.

The following Kerry beaches retain their flags for 2018: Rossbeigh, Ballybunion North, Ballybunion South, Ballyheigue, Fenit, Maherbeg, Kells, Derrynane, White Strand, Ballinskelligs, Banna, Ventry and Inch. Fenit Marina also retains it Blue Flag this year. Green Coast awards have also been announced for Beal Bán, Castlegregory, Littor and Ballinskelligs.

Attending the raising of the new Blue Flag at Rossbeigh today were the Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr John Sheahan; councillors from the South and West Kerry Municipal District and the Director of Services for Environment, John Breen.

"Blue Flags are an important indicator of the quality of our beach environment and it is encouraging that Kerry is continuing to set a very high standard in this regard. These flags are a result of a collaborative approach between Kerry County Council, local community groups and beach users who work together to maintain our beautiful beaches and bathing waters," Cathaoirleach Sheahan said told the Killarney Outlook.

Be SunSmart as temperatures soar

With temperatures in Ireland reaching highs of 30 degrees, the Irish Cancer Society is urging the public to take measures to protect their skin and follow the SunSmart code.

"With the onset of increasing temperatures, it is vital that people take pre-cautions to reduce their risk of sun damage", Kevin O'Hagan, Cancer Prevention Manager with the Irish Cancer Society said.

"It is especially important to protect babies and children as much of the UV damage that leads to skin cancer takes place in the early years of life. Research has shown that getting sunburnt in childhood or adolescence can increase the risk of melanoma--the most serious form of skin cancer. Tanned skin is damaged skin. The tan a child gets may fade but the damage remains.

"By protecting children and young people's skin when they are outdoors you can reduce their risk of developing skin cancer in years to come. But, using sunscreen alone is not enough so make sure to follow the full SunSmart code to ensure maximum protection."

The SunSmart Code

• SEEK SHADE: when UV rays are at their strongest – generally between 11am and 3pm.

• **COVER UP:** by wearing a shirt with a collar and long shorts. Also wear a hat that gives shade to your face, neck and ears.

• WEAR WRAPAROUND SUNGLASSES: make sure they give UV protection.

• SLOP ON SUNSCREEN: Use sunscreen SPF minimum 30 or higher and UVA protection 20 minutes before going outside and reapply every two hours – more often if swimming or perspiring.

 CHECK the UV index – www.cancer.ie/ uvindex

Call for new Ambulance Deployment Point

A Kerry County Councillor has called on the Minister for Health, Simon Harris TD, the Health Service Executive and the National Ambulance Service to provide an "Ambulance Deployment Point" in Killorglin to service the greater Killorglin area and vast Mid Kerry Region where the population dramatically increases during the summer season. Councillor Michael Cahill said the Minister should prioritise an "Ambulance Deployment Point" for the region and should deal with it as a matter of extreme urgency. "The area is vast and hosts a number of festivals every year such as the Glencar Cattle Show and Cromane Regatta.""Killorglin is home to the world renowned Puck Fair Festival, Glenbeigh hosts a Horse Racing Festival and this year Milltown hosts the County Fleadh Cheoil" stated Councillor Cahill. The Fianna Fail Councillor said Killorglin has the largest population of all the Towns in the South and West Kerry Municipal District and is the only one that does not have an "Ambulance Deployment Point". "I believe a vast region that includes Killorglin, Milltown, Keel, Castlemaine, Cromane, Glencar and Glenbeigh warrants such a service, stated the Rossbeigh Councillor.

Expenses incurred on a vacant residential premises prior to it being first let after a period of non-occupancy are allowable as a deduction against rental income from that premises.

The premises must have been vacant for at least 12 months and then let as a residential premises between 25th December 2017 (the date of the passing of the Finance Act 2017) and 31 December 2021. The expenditure must have been incurred in the 12 months before the

premises is let as a residential premises.

The deduction authorised is capped at \in 5,000 per vacant premises. If the person who incurs the expenditure ceases to let the property as a residential premises within 4 years of the first letting the deduction will be clawed-back in the year in which the property ceases to be let as a residential premises. This cessation can be either on sale of the property or change of use from rented residential property. The claw-back will be made by deeming the deduction previously allowed to be a Case V profit or gain of the year of cessation.

EDUCATION OUTLOOK Could you live away from home for an academic year on €3025?

t can't be easy to integrate into college life if you're forced to make a daily return commute from Kerry to Limerick or Cork. But that's the only option facing an increasing number of students who can't afford to meet the spiralling unregulated cost of student accommodation. I firmly believe that education is a right of all citizens not a privilege of those who can afford to pay. So it saddens me that Government stands idly by while deserving students, who have studied very hard to achieve a college place, struggle financially with little or no state support.

Further and third level education is very expensive. The financial burden is somewhat eased for students who qualify for partial or total state funding. Even so, many college students have to work part-time or depend on their parents to make ends meet. Thousands of students who are ineligible for funding due to punitive means testing of the family income must come up with about €9000 annually if they are living away from home or about €4000 if living at home. The unjustifiable student contribution of €3000 also has to be paid.

The introduction of a fair and adequate higher education grants' system must be a priority. Currently the maximum standard maintenance grant payable to students whose college is 45 km (28ml) or more from their homes is only €3025 (non-adjacent grant). For students who live less than 45km from their college, the standard maximum grant is a paltry €1215 (adjacent grant). Consequently, students who qualify for maintenance grants this year will receive less they did ten years ago despite the considerable increase in the cost of further and higher education.

Means testing of applicants for grants is now so restrictive that thousands of students in higher

education may be ineligible for any financial aid. Capping the gross annual income levels for grant eligibility at \in 39,875 makes a mockery of soaring living costs. Rental accommodation, alone, has increased by 45% in the cities during the past five years, putting a great deal of rental accommodation out of reach of students.

Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI), the grant awarding authority, is prioritising new grant applications until 12th July. SUSI will process late applications but its best to be on the priority applications list. Submit your online grant application as soon as possible. Applicants are assessed on gross income from all sources in the 2017 financial year. Applications are assessed as either a "dependent" or "independent" application. A dependent applicant is assessed on the income of parents or guardians, while an independent applicant is assessed on personal income and that of her/ his partner.

As the grant is means-tested, you might like to visit the eligibility reckoner on www.susi.ie. This facility provides potential applicants with an approximate indication of whether or not they are likely to qualify for a grant. However, it's always advisable to submit a grant application. Even if you don't currently qualify, your financial circumstances may change en route through college. Begin your SUSI grant application by registering for an online account where you can set up your username, password and security pin. Then carefully complete the interactive application form. Once you have submitted a grant application you can follow its progress on the SUSI Online Application Tracker.

Further information on state funding can be found on www.studentfinance.ie. Most of the institutions also offer a range of scholarships for excellence in areas such as academic, sport, creative arts and entrepreneurship. Colleges also operate a Financial Assistance Fund for students experiencing financial difficulty during term. Go to the relevant colleges' websites for further details. Watch out also for local scholarships such as Credit Union Scholarships available to members. If at all possible avoid taking out a student loan, but if you must then the best rates are available from your local Credit Union.

Focus on Hydrangeas

Hydrangeas are a very popular garden shrub with delicate heads of flowers that come in shades of white, pink or blue and they flower from late Spring to Autumn.

The mophead and lace cap Hydrangeas are well known for the ability to change colour in different soils.

Hydrangeas thrive in moist but well drained soil, in the cool, semi shady part of the garden. Try to avoid dry sunny situations and east facing areas.

Feeding your Hydrangeas once in late Winter or early Spring is probably enough for the year as too much feeding will only encourage too much soft leafy growth and this will lead to the Hydrangeas not developing a lot of flower buds.

Pruning your Hydrangeas is usually done in late Winter or early Spring, although the climbing Hydrangeas should be pruned after flowering in Summer.

Motivation tips

Try mixing up your training by using different routes and terrain because not only as this keeps it interesting and exciting it will also lessen the impact that road running can impact on the body. Here in Kerry we are spoilt for choice with the magnificent Killarney national park, the mighty Gap of Dunlop (my favourite place!) or one of our beautiful beaches to trot a few miles out whilst admiring the views these places have to offer. Believe me I never get bored by doing this!

Using a GPS watch or download one of the many mobile phone apps for runners such as, Strava or MapMyRun can help your training in a huge way. By tracking your distance, pace, calories burned, speed and many more features adds so much depth and fun to your training. You can then download your runs to see your progress, elevation of the run, splits of miles and much more. These apps and watches also allow you to share progress and connect with other likeminded people via social media and is a great way of making new friends too.

If you can't seem to find your mojo no matter what you do, take some time off. A few days rest will revive you both mentally and physically and the chances are you'll miss lacing up the runners and will be raring to go after this time.

In addition, your concentration may improve, you may heal faster, you'll get more exercise and you'll likelier be happier.

*Finally, for total selfish reasons, you'll feel a sense of pride for saving a dog and for helping reduce the homeless pet population. You will totally deserve that pat on the back and it will pay off a thousand fold with snuggles and pet handshakes and looks of adoration.

THE FIRST AMERICAN DOUGHNUT CHAIN USED SPUDS

In the 18th century, German emigrants in Pennsylvania fried up sweet, potato-based doughnuts the day before Ash Wednesday to help get rid of sugar and fat sitting around the house as they would not be indulging in these ingredients again until Easter. The emigrants were thrifty, and potatoes were cheap, local, and helped make flour stock last longer.

The first doughnut chain in the United States was a Utah-based franchise named Spudnuts. In the 1940s and '50s, the owners took potato-based doughnuts mainstream, opening hundreds of stores. Mr. Spudnut, their proud mascot, made it all the way to outposts in Japan. In 1968, three years into acquisition by a Canadian company, a bad investment destroyed the future of the franchise. Store owners were forced back into independent operation. In 1964, Spudnuts sold an estimated 400,000 doughnuts per day. Today, scattered across the United States, only a few outposts remain standing.



THE COLDEST VOLCANO IN THE WORLD SPEWS BLACK LAVA

The crackling black lava that erupts from Ol Doinyo Lengai located within the Arusha Region of Tanzania in Africa runs about 510 degrees Celsius (950 degrees Fahrenheit) well below the melting point of most lava (1,000 degrees Celsius/1,832 degrees Fahrenheit).

Ol Doinyo Lengai's one-of-a-kind lava forms thanks to its chemical makeup. Unlike the basalt that forms the lava of most volcanoes, the magma rocks of Ol Doinyo Lengai are carbonatite, made up of calcium, sodium, and dissolved carbon dioxide. Carbonatite has a much lower melting point than basalt, which is also why the lava never heats up enough to gain a reddish glow (except one that's faintly visible at night). Otherwise, the lava stays an inky black colour until it cools and hardens, at which point it turns white.

In some ways, Ol Doinyo Lengai is even more dangerous than much hotter volcanoes. The glowing red lava that gets the most attention flows in a thick mass at about 10 kilometres per hour (6 miles per hour) and easily outrun, but Ol Doinyo Lengai's lava rushes downstream as fast as water, thanks, again, to its unique chemical makeup.

The volcano last erupted in 2006.

THIS ORANGUTAN TRIED TO STOP A BULLDOZER FROM DESTROYING HIS HOME

The video footage is devastating. It shows an orangutan running across a felled tree and trying to fight off a bulldozer clearing his natural habitat in West Borneo.

It's a heart breaking reminder of the plight critically endangered orangutans face. Over the past 20 years, orangutans have lost 55% of their natural habitat due to deforestation. Their population has decreased 50% over the past 60 years, due in large part to this loss of habitat. All for the production of palm oil.

Each year, 50,000 square miles of tropical forests are cleared to produce palm oil, which is then used in everything from household products to cosmetics to food. As a consumer, it can be challenging to find products that don't contain palm oil because it is so ubiquitous. Unfortunately, the more products we buy that contain palm oil, the more forests we lose.

It's hard to make an impact with individual consumer choices, but what if stores took a stand and stopped carrying products containing palm oil? That could make a real impact.

Know Your Rights:

QUESTION

I'm in my 70s and live alone. Is it there any support available to help me with my household running costs?

ANSWER

The Household Benefits Package may help with the costs of running your household. The package is available to everyone aged over 70 and to some people under 70. It is paid by the Department of Employment Affairs and Social Protection (DEASP).

The package includes an electricity or gas allowance and a Free Television Licence. The electricity or gas allowance pays \in 35 per month (\in 1.15 per day) towards the cost of either your electricity or gas supply (you cannot get an allowance for both). It is paid to your bank or post office account or as a credit on your bill. You can get the Free Television Licence from the next renewal date of your licence after you qualify for the package.

Only one person in a household can qualify for the package. You must be living in the State all year round, and you will need to show that you are the registered gas or electricity consumer, for example, by providing a utility bill.

People aged between 66 and 70 may also qualify if they are getting a qualifying payment, such as the State Pension. If they are not getting a qualifying payment, they must satisfy a means test. You qualify if you are getting Carer's Allowance and providing full-time care to a person you are living with. You may also qualify if you are getting certain social welfare payments and living alone or living with certain people, for example, a qualified adult or child or with someone who would qualify for the allowance in their own right.

To apply, use form HB1 (pdf) from welfare.ie. The form is also available from your local Intreo Centre or Social Welfare Branch Office or from your nearest Citizens Information Service.

When we laugh we release 'feel good' hormones and naturally occurring anti-depressant (e.g serotonin). Laughter can also be a great way to deal with life's unexpected events and help get us through difficult times. Responding to the trials of life with some laughter, can help to protect our body mind and spirit – and may be a bleak situation doesn't seem as insurmountable when we can find some humour.

Laughter can also help us to bond, connect and communicate with others. Humour helps lubricate the channels of communication and can make people feel more comfortable.

Think about what makes you laugh and be sure to do more of it. This may be watching your favourite comedy, sharing a good joke, going to a comedy club or watching a funny U tube clip. Why not try now – just turn the corners of your mouth up into a smile and give a little laugh out loud. It may feel a bit contrived, but notice how you feel. Whatever gets you chuckling be sure to factor in more laughter to your life on a daily basis and increase those happy gamma waves.

Welcome back dear reader last week we saw how unforgiveness is often a root of sickness and disease. Bitterness and offence which result from holding unforgiveness are snares that block you from moving forward and bearing fruit. Jesus said "by their fruits you know them" (Mathew 7:20). Fruit is a sign of whether a plant or tree is healthy and productive, or dead and useless. Jesus chastised those religious followers of God who put their hopes of salvation on how good their works were, rather than on the fruit their lives showed, as being seriously misled hypocrites (Mathew chapter 23). God abhors when we point the finger at the shortcomings of others - their mistakes or lifestyles, telling us instead to look at the state of our own lives (Isaiah 58:9; Mathew 7:3). God is the Judge of all (Hebrews 12:23). Jesus came to seek and save the lost, and we will reap on our treatment of people (Galatians 6:7).

When we adopt the attitude and character of Jesus in our dealings with others i.e. loving rather than judging, we reflect His light and people are drawn to light. Jesus told of a king who made a wedding banquet for his son. When everything was ready he called those who were invited to come to the feast. But these invited guests refused to come, and insulted and killed the kings messengers. The king then sent others to go out into the streets and invite everyone they met to the banquet instead (Mathew 22:1-14). This is a reflection of the church today. The church is not a temple or building made with hands, but the church is God's people of faith joined together worshipping Him (Acts 7:48; Mathew 22:37). We are all invited to come to the Kings Son - who is Jesus, the Son of God. But many refuse the invitation Father God extends because they are more interested in dead works, and criticising others, rather than entering into intimate relationship with Him through faith in Jesus as Lord and Saviour. When we open our whole heart to Jesus, His Word exposes the areas in our lives that need correction and realignment. Some people do not allow the Lord full access to their lives because of this.

They prefer to hold onto grudges and gripes and wither and die inside, and never produce any good fruit. But for those who answer God's invitation, and allow Him to transform them from the inside out, the fruit of forgiveness and healing is the evidence of a life forever changed!
