A Killarney restaurateur has landed a major television deal with Ireland's first international satellite channel Irish TV.

Paul Treyvaud, who rose to fame with his hit YouTube channel, is bringing his unconventional approach to the screen with his new show Cooking with Treyvaud.

From lake shores to mountain tops, Paul will take viewers on an exploration of the wild Kerry countryside while cooking up some of his signature gourmet recipes.

Cooking with Treyvaud will air every Wednesday night at 9.30 on Sky 191, Freesat 400, Eircom eVision 191 and online at irishtv.ie.





EAMON KELLY REMEMBERED AT KILLARNEY LIBRARY

A celebration of the life and work of Seanchai, will take place at the Killarney Library on Thursday 11th September..

The event will celebrate the life and career of the Actor, Seanchaí and Author on the centenary of his birth and will begin at 6.30pm.

Known as Ireland's master storyteller, Eamon Kelly described the art of the Seanchaí as the oldest one-man-show-on earth and held his audience spellbound as he stared into eternity while sitting in intimacy of the firelight and candlelight in the homes of rural Ireland.

Born in Glenfesk in 1914, Kelly was initiated into the art of acting when he became involved within Co. Kerry's amateur dramatic scene. Whilst teaching in Listowel, he co-founded the Listowel Drama Group in 1944 where his acting and directing prowess readily developed. He played Christy Mahon in the group's 1951 production of The Playboy of the Western World, which also starred his wife to be Maura O'Sullivan as Pegeen Mike. As a result, the couple moved to Dublin to join the RTE Players. Although Eamon is probably best remembered as a Seanchaí - he travelled the length and breadth of the country to perform his storytelling - he was also well-known in the theatre world: he joined the Abbey Repertory in the 1960s and also worked for the Gate Theatre. In 1966 he was nominated for

a prestigious Tony Award for his role in Brian Friel's Philadelphia, Here I Come.

The programme, which will feature music, song and storytelling, introduces guest performers including Kelly's sister, Brid Sugrue, performing some of Kelly's stories, as well as Cork actor Jack Healy, journalist Donal Hickey and Eamon's grand niece, and the classically-trained vocalist Gemma Sugrue, whose specially chosen repertoire will include some of the late actor's favourite songs.

The programme, which is being planned and coordinated by Brid Sugrue, Mary Murphy (Killarney Arts) and Dr. Fiona Brennan, also includes short audio and video recordings of Kelly in some of his most well known roles. An exhibition of photos and newspaper articles regarding Kelly's career will be on display in Killarney Library from Saturday 6th - Saturday 13th September.

WARM TRIBUTES PAID TO THE LATE PADDY MACMONAGLE

WARM tributes have been paid to well-known Killarney Author, Photographer, Printer and Publisher Paddy MacMonagle who was laid to rest at Aghadoe graveyard, Killarney last Friday. Paddy's long life of 94 years was celebrated at a requiem mass in St. Mary's Cathedral last Friday morning.

Chief celebrant, Fr Howard praised Paddy's great faith and outlined his outstanding work in promoting Killarney and said that he was involved so many activities that many described him as the unofficial Lord Mayor of



OVER 75% OF SAVERS UNHAPPY WITH POOR DEPOSIT RETURNS

A recent survey of more than 1,000 people reveals more than three quarters of depositors think current deposit interest rates are a poor return on their money. Ninety two per cent of savers aged 55-64 think deposit rates are bad value.

- 78% of people have a deposit savings account.
- The average Irish person has €25,500 on deposit.
- Just over a third or 35% know what interest rate is paid on their deposit.

Investment returns vs deposits in the last five years:

Investors who kept long term funds on deposit for the last few years may be licking their wounds with the average managed fund returning 12% per annum over five years.

Former Kerry senior footballer Seamus Moynihan has been appointed to the Kerry Under 21 football management team. He joins former All Star Darragh Ó Sé who had already been reappointed as manager. WATER QUALITY IN DEENAGH RIVER

At the July 2014 Killarney Municipal Area Meeting, Councillor Michael Gleeson proposed the following Notice of Motion:

"Has there been any change in the water quality in the River Deenagh since the matter was last raised at an area meeting".

Kerry County Council replied that there is not any change in the biological status of the water. The River is monitored at a site upstream of Lough Léin at least 26 times per year as part of the catchment programme. Results to date denote a water of good quality in accordance with standards set out EU regulations.

At least 3 sites are measured on a three-year cycle for biological parameters by the EPA. Only one site - the one furthest upstream - shows evidence of pollution. This is of a moderate level and is suspected to come from agricultural sources.

Overall the river water is of acceptable status. Ongoing monitoring will, however, take place and Laboratory staff intend to undertake a more specialised biological analysis during September 2014.

Councillor Gleeson welcomed the detailed response and stated that every effort must continue to be made to ensure that all waters in the Lough Léin catchment are of the highest possible quality.

Know Your Rights:

JOBSEEKER'S ALLOWANCE FOR YOUNGER JOBSEEKERS

OUESTION

I am 22 years of age and I live with my partner who is 25. He is currently unemployed and has been claiming Jobseeker's Allowance for three months. I have just finished college but cannot find work. What amount of Jobseeker's Allowance can I qualify for?

ANSWER

People aged under 26 get a lower rate of Jobseeker's Allowance. If you claim Jobseeker's Allowance in your own right the maximum amount you are eligible for is €100 a week. However, your partner could claim for you as a dependent adult on his Jobseeker's Allowance claim and he would be paid €124.80 each week in addition to his personal payment.

Even though the rate paid is less, it might be more beneficial for you to claim Jobseeker's Allowance in your own right because you are then eligible for a range of training and employment schemes to help you into employment. If you take up a place on a course of education, training or an employment support scheme you will get a higher rate of payment.



MALARIA

Introduction

Malaria is widespread in many tropical and subtropical countries and is a serious and sometimes fatal disease. You cannot be vaccinated against malaria but you can protect yourself in three ways:

Avoidance of bites

Mosquitoes cause much inconvenience because of local reaction to the bites themselves and from the infections they transmit, Mosquitoes spread malaria, yellow fever, dengue and Japanese encephalitis.

Mosquitoes bite at any time of the day but most bites occur in the evening.

Precautions to take:

- Avoid mosquito bites, especially are sunset, if you are out at night wear long sleeved clothing and long trouser.
- Mosquitoes may bite through thin clothing, so spray and insecticide or repellent on them. Insect repellents should also be used on exposed clothing.
- Spraying insecticides in the room, burning pyrethroid coils and heating insecticide impregnated tablets all help control mosquitoes.
- If sleeping in an unscreened room, or outdoors, a mosquito net (which should be impregnated with insecticide) is a sensible precaution. Portable, lightweight nets are available.
- Garlic, vitamin b and ultrasound devices do not prevent bites.

Where the disease occurs:

For those travelling to many of the warmer regions of our world there may be risk of contracting malaria. Each year this parasitic disease causes many deaths both in the tropics and among travellers returning to their home countries. most of the transmission occurs in tropical Africa (approx 95%), Asia and Central & South America. Travellers need to remember that there is also a mild risk of the disease when visiting parts of North Africa and some parts of the Middle East.

How is the disease transmitted?

In the majority of cases the disease is transmitted to humans through the bite of an infected mosquito. The parasite enters the blood and passes very rapidly into the liver

After an incubation period (usually 1 to 4 weeks) the parasite breaks out of the liver and back into the blood stream. at this stage the infected red blood cell begins to break down and only then does the patient start to develop symptoms (the disease can also be transmitted through blood transfusion, infected needles and from an infected mother to unborn baby). Initially the patient may develop an itchy reaction at the site of the mosquito bite. This is not always present — it depends on the individual's allergic reaction to bites. After the liver phase has passed the patient may go on to develop the classical symptoms of malaria. The individual will usually feel they have flu. It will frequently be difficult to convienence them that perhaps malaria is a possibility following their journey.



YOU STILL HAVE TIME TO APPLY FOR A PLC COURSE **AND A COLLEGE GRANT**

The CAO route isn't always the best one for people to continue in education. Some may not be ready for higher education while others may not have secured a CAO course offer or, perhaps, are unhappy with the offer they received. The PLC route provides an attractive alternative to higher education and has established a niche link between second level and third level. Colleges of Further Education have sprung up throughout the country to offer PLC courses leading to awards at Level



5 (Certificate) and Level 6 (Advanced Certificate) from Quality and Qualifications Ireland (QQI), which has incorporated the functions of the Further Education and Training Awards Council (FETAC).

A PLC course is ideal for a person who has completed the Leaving Certificate and requires further vocational education and training to enhance her/his prospects of employment or progression to other studies. A PLC course is perfect for a mature student, who may not have completed the senior cycle but is considered to have the necessary competencies to benefit from the programme. It's also tailor made for a student who has completed the Leaving Certificate Applied (LCA) programme or who didn't achieve sufficient points in the Leaving Certificate for entry to a CAO course

PLC courses are full time, mainly one year, programmes of general skills education, vocational training and work experience. The courses are an end in themselves, leading directly to employment in many cases. Increasingly, they are utilised as an alternative entry route to third level education. This year, more than 15,000 applications to the CAO were from students who hold a PLC qualification. This is a very healthy development as it provides young and not so young people, with an alternative route into third level. Another attraction of PLC courses is their availability nationwide at nominal cost in Colleges of Further Education. The PLC courses cover an extensive range of options in areas such as Business and Secretarial Skills, Computer Skills, Art, Craft and Design, Multi-Media, Child and Community Care, Sport and Leisure, Tourism and Catering, Theatre and Drama.

Through the higher education links scheme (HELS), the PLC courses provide an alternative route into CAO courses. This year, over forty higher education institutions including universities, institutes of technology and private colleges are offering a variety of courses to PLC graduates. Entry is based on a scoring system for PLC awards achieved at Level 5 and Level 6 on the National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ). Full details about the scoring system are available on the QQI, www.qqi.ie and FETAC websites, www.fetac.ie/learners/hels.

Unlike the CAO, there isn't a centralised application system for PLC courses. Each PLC college looks after its own application process. Entry requirements normally consist of Leaving Certificate standard of education and satisfactory performance at interview. Mature applications are assessed on their life's experiences. PLC colleges usually accept applications from early spring but they will still accept applications for any courses that have vacancies. Contact your local PLC course provider or access all the relevant information on www.qualifax.ie.

PLC students have the same entitlement to funding as third level students. Applications for student grants are processed by Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI), the new single awarding authority for all new grant applications. Apply to SUSI through www.studentfinance.ie or www.susi.ie.

The punitive budgetary cuts in eligibility criteria and value of the maintenance grant during the past few years is making life very difficult for college students and their parents. To qualify for a full grant the gross family income must be less than €39,875. The value of the non-adjacent (more than 45km from college) grant is as low as €3025 while the adjacent (less than 45km from college) grant is now as little as €1215. Grants are paid into a recipient's bank account in nine equal monthly instalments. In addition, the student contribution has increased to a staggering €2750 this year. It's a far cry from the pledge given by Ruairi Quinn before the 2011 general election to retain the student contribution at €1500. Mr Quinn recently fell on his sword and it remains to be seen if his successor, Jan O Sullivan has the bottle to honour her predecessor's pledge. The closing date for grant applications to SUSI was 1st August but applications are still being accepted online.

As the 2014 Leaving Cert cohort moves on, schools reopen to prepare for the next cycle of exams. In the next article, I'll explain how good planning and consistent work will lead to exam success in 2015

RSA REVEAL KERRY ROAD DEATHS & INJURIES

New research from the Road Safety Authority (RSA) has revealed that three children (0-14 years old) were killed and 12 children were seriously injured on Kerry roads in the period 2006 to 2012. This report was published as the RSA and Electric Ireland teamed up for the fifth year running to distribute 85,500 high visibility vests to every child starting school this year. The vests will be included in the RSA's 'Back to School' road safety packs which will be sent to primary schools nationwide over the coming months. The Road Safety Authority (RSA) and Electric Ireland are urging parents, guardians and teachers to make road safety a priority as 13 children under the age of 14 have died in the first eight months of the year on Irish roads. The report on child casualties between 1997-2012 also found that of the child passenger fatalities in this period, 1 in 3 was not wearing a seatbelt or a child restraint. Thereport also showed that:

- * 262 children were killed and 1115 were seriously injured on Irish roads between 1997 and 2012.
- * Child fatalities decreased by 89% in the period 1997 to 2012 with a 42% reduction in serious injuries, a 73% reduction in pedestrian fatalities, a 100% reduction in cyclist fatalities and an 100% reduction in child passenger fatalities
- * 44% of children who were killed in the period from 1997 to 2012 were pedestrians.
- * 42% of children who were killed or seriously injured between 1997 and 2012 were passengers in a car.
- * 59% of children killed in this period were male. * Peak time for children to be killed on the road is between 4:00pm and 5:59pm when 27% of children lost their lives, and during the summer





HOME SECURITY CHECKLIST CHALLENGE

Burglars like easy opportunities. If they have to make a lot of noise, spend a lot of time or risk being seen, the chances are they won't bother. A good rule of thumb is the 3 minute delay test. If you can deny entry for 3 min- utes or more - chances are the burglars will go elsewhere. SEPTEMBER IS NATIONAL CHIPPING MONTH!

Dogs Trust are offering free chipping for the month of September, through participating vets Nationwide.

- 1. What is a microchip? A microchip is a small electronic device, which is the size of a grain of rice.
- How is the microchip implanted? Using a specially designed implanting device the microchip is injected through a sterile needle under the dog's skin.
- 3. Where is the microchip implanted? In dogs, the microchip is implanted under the skirt, between the shoulder blades.
- 4. Does it hurt? No anaesthetic is required and the procedure should cause no more discomfort than a standard vaccination.
- 5. How does the microchip stay in place? Once the microchip has been inserted, the dog's body tissue surrounding the microchip attaches itself, preventing movement of the chip.
- 6. Could my dog be allergic to the microchip? The microchip is inert and biocompatible. There is virtually no chance of the body developing an allergy.
- 7. How does the microchip work?. The computer memory in

the microchip contains a unique 15 digit number - no two dogs will ever get the same number. Apart from the number the chip contains no other information.

8. Who has a scanner? These can be found at most veterinary practices. Local Authorities and animal welfare groups. Local Authorities and animal welfare groups use scanners to check stray dogs to see if they have been microchipped.

9. How are the owners traced?

If a dog is found to have a microchip, the Local Authority, vet or animal welfare organisation contacts a national database to find the owner's details.

- 10. Where can I get my dog microchipped? You can get your dog microchipped at Abbey Veterinary Tralee.
- 11. How much does it usually cost?You can expect to pay €20-€50 to have your dog microchipped at the vet.
- 12. How long does a microchip last? Once injected under the skin of your dog, the microchip becomes encased by a thin layer of protein which anchors it in place for the rest of the life of your pet.

TRANSITION FROM PRIMARY TO SECONDARY SCHOOL WHAT CAN PARENTS DO?

The transition from primary to secondary school can be a difficult one for many children. The change from being the most senior student to suddenly becoming a junior again may bring many challenges for your child. They are leaving behind a familiar world and entering a whole new domain with new teachers, subjects, classrooms, class mates, an increased workload and a longer day. As this change also tends to coincide with the onset of puberty, is it any wonder that it can be so daunting for your child? This can also be a difficult time for parents. The school day is longer and your child will be taking on more subjects. Some of these subjects are ones you may not be familiar with which may mean you won't be able to help out with homework. There are also more teachers involved in your child's schooling. Your child's social circle is widening and you may not know who their friends are.

As your child moves through this transition, your job as parent is to support them to negotiate the challenges posed. First and foremost it is important not to pass on your own fears to your child. Remember, children are extremely resilient and adaptable and before long these new surroundings will be familiar and comfortable for them. When talking to your child about the expected transition let them know that you have trust and confidence in their ability to master these changes. Tell them about your own experiences and ways that helped you to cope. Talk to them about the change in routine and the possible change of classroom and teacher every 40 minutes. To make this transition as smooth as possible, particularly in the early days, try to be as supportive and encouraging as possible. Ensure they eat well, sleep well and stay tuned for any signs of distress or difficulty. Listen to them when they relay stories from school and show an active interest in their friendships, the school, their teachers, their activities and their subjects.

As parents, we can often feel a little helpless – our role is to be supportive, interested and encouraging. Always keep the lines of communication open and if you have any concerns please contact the school. No one knows your child better than you. As your child moves through their teens remember they are involved in a major life change. Your job as a parent is to nurture their confidence and enable them to become welladjusted and fully functioning adults. 








Almost immediately, Mayo struck back with a goal of their own from full-forward TJByrne. But there was no denying Kerry and a string of points from Liam Carey (2), goalkeeper Shane Ryan, who converted a magnificent long-range free, Liam Kearney and full-forward Killian Spillane eased the Kingdom seven clear as the game headed into injury time.

But Mayo refused to give in and a goal at the death from full-forward TJ Byrne somewhat against the run of play put a gloss on the scoreboard.



IFA CALLS ON NRA AND COUNTY **COUNCILS TO CURB THE** RAMPANT SPREAD OF RAGWORT ON PUBLIC ROADS

IFA Environment and Rural Affairs Chairman Harold Kingston has called on the NRA and County Councils to improve their efforts to control the rampant spread of ragwort and noxious weeds on public roads. "Roadside verges across the country are blighted with ragwort and other noxious weeds. There is a clear failure to manage these poisonous weeds and eliminate their spreading from roadside onto farmland. The NRA has published guidelines on the management of noxious weeds, however they now need to implement these guidelines and instruct county councils to do the same. County Councils and the NRA must adhere to their own guidelines and control the spread of ragwort and other noxious weeds. The law is not being implemented fairly."

Farmers also have a responsibility to control noxious weeds on their own land and they face penalties if they do not comply with the requirements: of the law. Farmland must be kept in good environmental and agricultural conditions, while local authorities avoid any responsibility for their actions." The NRA must urgently implement their own guidelines and work with Councils to clean up roadside verges and maintain them free from noxious weeds.



DAIRYGOLD PHASED SUPERLEVY PAYMENT SCHEME A WELCOME MOVE - O'LEARY

IFA National Dairy Committee Chairman Sean O'Leary has complimented Dairygold on their phased superlevy payment scheme, which will allow their suppliers to stagger their superlevy payment over the following 2 years' peak periods. He said this was a positive example other co-ops, perhaps in co-operation with financial institutions, should emulate to better support their suppliers through the challenging transition out of quotas. "The Dairygold scheme is an excellent example of constructive innovative thinking to assist farmers. Now that markets and milk prices have weakened, it is vital that the pressures farmers will face on their cash flow over the coming 18 to 24 months be properly appreciated by co-ops and banks alike," he said. "I would urge banks to provide farmers with equally innovative financial products for cash flow and for investment, which recognise fully the volatility of

farmers'incomes and gives them the greatest possible flexibility on terms and repayment requirements when margins are down. I would also urge farmers to remember that, whether or not their co-op and their banks provide an instrument to help them deal with superlevy and short term cash flow problems, they will still have to pay in full any fine arising from exceeding their quota. While this is the final year of the quota regime, it still remains vital that they would properly plan for this."








HAVEYOU SEEN A HEDGEHOG IN YOUR GARDEN?

Long before Beatrix Potter unleashed the twinkly-eyed hedgehog washerwoman Mrs. Tiggy-Winkles upon the world, children have been enamoured by the spiny mammals. In fact, a carved toy hedgehog, presumably a prized possession was found buried next to a child's grave unearthed near Stonehenge dating back approx. 3,000 years.

- 1. The hedgehog was named for its unique foraging methods. They root through hedges seeking their prey, mostly insects, as well as worms, bird eggs, snails, mice and frogs, while emitting snorts, squeals and grunts. Like a hog, of the hedge ... hence, "hedgehog."
- 2. Shakespeare mentioned hedgehogs in "The Tempest" and "Midsummer Night's Dream," calling them "hedgepigs" and "urchins."
- 3. The collective noun for a group of hedgehogs is "array" or "prickle."
- 4. There are 15 species of hedgehog; they are found in Europe, Asia, and Africa, but they have also been introduced into new areas such as New Zealand.
- 5. The earliest known member of the family that includes hedgehogs lived about 58 million years ago. The smallest hedgehog ever, Silvacola acares, lived 52 million years ago in a rain forest in northern British Columbia. It was about 2 inches long.
- 6. Today's hedgehogs measure roughly from 5 to 14 inches (plus a 1- to 2-inch tail), depending on the species. The European hedgehog is the largest species of all and reaches 14 inches in length.
- 7. The hedgehog can thank its spines for its signature look; they are 1-inch long modified hairs that cover the animals back and sides. The face, chest, belly, throat and legs are covered in fur

8. There are somewhere between 5.000 to 7.000 spines on an average adult hedgehog. They are neither poisonous nor barbed, and unlike the quills of a porcupine, the hedgehog's prickers stay firmly attached to the animal.

9. Hedgehogs use their quills defensively, more like armour than projectiles. When threatened, hedgehogs roll up into a ball, thereby becoming an orb of hard-to-eat spines. This is how they sleep which they do during the day, by the way. 10. Hedgehogs can live for four to seven years in the wild, a relatively long time for animals of their size. Smaller species live two to four years. 18. Hedgehogs are loners; they generally only match up for mating.

12. Depending on the species, the gestation period is 35 to 58 days, and in the end produces a litter of five to six pups for smaller species and three to four pups for larger species and leave the nest sometime between four and seven weeks of age.

WELL DONE:

EVER DREAM OF WINNING THE LOTTO?

A 24 year old Port Huron, Michigan, resident, who recently won a \$66 million Mega Millions lottery jackpot, has big plans for her new found wealth.

The lucky lady and her boyfriend intend to purchase some of the more typical items associated with the receipt of a windfall of cash. including a new car, as well as a new home and a European vacation.

The winner who has seven-month-old son, also has her sights set on a more altruistic endeavour - opening a no-kill animal shelter. She has already hired a financial advisor and lawyer to help her manage her millions, as she plans on being one of the "smart" winners and not end up bankrupt after losing it all.

GROUND LIZARDS INVITE THEIR FRIENDS TO LUNCH:

To a Little Scrub Island ground lizard, a pushup is less of a workout and more of an invitation to lunch. A pair of scientists found that when these lizards perform pushups near extra food, their neighbours will scurry over and tuck in. What's unusual about the Little Scrub Island ground lizards (Ameiva corax) is that these reptiles don't seem to mind sharing, as long as there's enough food to go around. Many Lizard species are territorial or, like the fig-eating cape flat lizards, attempt to steal food from one another.

When researchers spent 8 days on Little Scrub Island, a tiny isle in the Caribbean, they spotted the native ground lizards eating socially. The scientists presented the reptiles with three objects, to see when lizards choose to invite guests over: a whole prickly pear, split down the middle; a quarter of a pear; and a red Swiss Army knife, which the scientists say was roughly the same size and colour of a pear. Ground lizards are rather fond of prickly pears, but struggle to get through the fruit's thick

Upon encountering a whole pear, the lizards would perform a quick pump of the legs, a silent way to communicate in noisy environments.

Based on the rate of pushups -- performed much more often near whole pears, and then with decreasing frequency as more diners showed up -- the scientists believe these manoeuvres are advertisements of bonus food.

OUR FUTURE DEPENDS ON SPIDER CONSERVATION:

How much do you know about spiders? The superhero Spider-Man is awesome, but the role of actual spiders in diverse ecosystems around the world is just as captivating.

If spiders disappeared, we would face famine, spiders are primary controllers of insects. Without spiders, all of our crops would be consumed by those pests.

Although insects and spiders are often grouped together, they belong to different animal groups. Spiders are arachnids - technically Class Arachnida, which includes ticks, mites, and scorpions. The most obvious way to distinguish insects from spiders is to count their legs. Insects have six legs, while arachnids have eight.

The importance of spiders to agriculture may be well known, but did you know that the spiders on one acre of woodland alone consume more than 80 pounds of insects each year? Clearly, those insect populations would explode without their spider predators.

Aside from chemical control, predation is the only way to limit herbivorous pests. And spiders are excellent at this task. Spiders are particularly crucial in organic farming, which relies heavily on biological pest control.

- * Spiders were around more than 300 million years ago, long before dinosaurs walked the
- Only about 50 percent of known spider species make webs. Others hunt their prey or burrow underground.
- * You are unlikely to be bitten by a spider, since they are very shy. They generally prefer to run away rather than bite.

Scientists are also exploring other ways in which spiders could be helpful to humans, a spider's venom contains hundreds of different chemical compounds, some of which may be medically active.

At Yale, scientists are examining whether chemicals in the venom of the Australian funnel-web spider could be used to improve pain-control medications. At the University of Buffalo, a researcher is working on healing muscular dystrophy patients with a compound in the venom of a South American spider. In Seattle, a doctor is working on a project that involves a scorpion-venom concoction that makes brain tumours glow.

Then of course there is spider silk: spiders make many different kinds of silk in their webs, each with a property, such as toughness, flexibility, stickiness. Perhaps this too could have important uses in the future.

Scientists have identified almost 45,000 different spider species and that's at best one-half of what actually exists. When we lose a spider species, we may lose a compound that could have cured epilepsy. We may lose a silk that could have produced a strong and lightweight material.

Spiders are threatened by habitat loss and fragmentation of habitat, as well as by introduced species and are often overlooked in conservation planning, just because they are so small, but without spiders, our crops will be eaten by insects and we humans will starve.

So look kindly on the next spider you see; our future depends on these eight-legged creatures.
