

Diocese takes up the Climate Change Challenge

The Diocese of Kerry takes up the challenge of Climate Change for this Season of Creation: Climate Crisis - 11 years to save Our Common Home.

The Season runs from September 1st to October 4th when Christian churches around the world focus on prayer and action to protect the natural world and to protect creation. This time can be described as the churches' Eco Time.

The title 'Our Common Home' is that used by Pope Francis in his letter Laudato Si' on Care for Our Common Home, which he addressed "to every person living on the planet".

To mark this Season of Creation all parishes across the diocese have received copies of the attached leaflet which explains the theme and gives suggestions of practical actions to be taken in the three areas of energy, water and waste.

The leaflet will also be available on the dioceseofkerry.ie, the diocesan website. This five week Season gives parishes the opportunity to include the theme in Sunday Masses, and resources to support the leaflet have been circulated to the fifty-three parishes. The Radio Kerry programme 'Horizons', the daily 'Just a Thought' and the diocesan facebook page will all highlight the theme of Climate Crisis and in particular what we can do to help the situation. Climate Change Activist Lorna Gold features on Horizons at 9 Radio Kerry on Sunday morning the 1st of September.

"Climate Crisis: Food, Floods and Faith" a special season of creation workshop is planned for Tuesday 17th September, at 8pm in Killarney, in the John Paul 2 Pastoral Centre, Rock Road. (See attached Poster) Here local eco leaders Lisa Fingleton and Martha Farrell will speak on the specific impacts of the Climate Crisis on food and floods. Local climate action groups will display information stands to give people the opportunity to get involved locally. These groups include: Transition Kerry; Kerry

Climate Action Network; Kerry Sustainable Energy Cooperative (KSEC); the Climate Action Regional Office (CARO); Grow it Yourself (GIY) and of course Trócaire.

Anna Pokojska, who is originally from Poland won silver in the 5k race and bronze in the 30km cycling.

She arrived back into Dublin Airport last Saturday afternoon where she and her team members, along with a huge haul of 50 medals, were greeted to a rousing welcome by family, friends and supporters. The team's final medals tally was 17 Gold, 18 Silver and 15 Bronze which earned them a very respectable 11th place position on the leader board amongst 56 countries some with larger teams and the host country GB&NI having 320 participants.

DEATH MASK OF DANIEL O' CONNELL PRESESENTED TO THE OPW



A death mask of Daniel O' Connell, regarded as one the great figures of modern Irish history, was presented to the Office of Public Works (OPW) this week by the Countess of Dunraven at Derrynane House, the family home of O' Connell. The presentation of the death mask, which has been in the custodianship of the Dunraven family for over 160 years, was made at the Daniel O' Connell Summer School which is taking place in Derrynane House today.

O'Connell died in 1847 in Genoa, Italy, while on a pilgrimage to Rome at the age of 71. At the time of O'Connell's death, it was not uncommon that a death mask would be made of a person's face. Death masks were often used as a reference by sculptors and artists when creating busts and

paintings and are also highly valued in their own right.

The Earl of Dunraven was a title in the peerage of Ireland created in 1822. The Dunraven and O'Connell families have a strong connection over many generations and it is believed the mask came into the care of the family over 160 years ago.

Derrynane House, the family home of O'Connell, is now dedicated to his life and achievements, under the care of the OPW. Following any restoration or conservation works required to the mask, the OPW will place the mask on public display at Derrynane House, where it will join a large and rich collection of items relating to O'Connell's life.

QUEST 12/24 ENDURANCE RACE RETURNS

Quest 12/24, the ultimate endurance adventure race will take place for the second time next weekend.

More than 250 hardened adventurers will take to the mountains, roads, paths and water of South Kerry in an attempt to complete their chosen course in the allotted time of either 12

The event will kick-off from the Sneem Hotel at 6am on Saturday 31st of August. The event is being run by Quest Adventure Series who operate other events around the country including Quest Killarney, Quest Kenmare, Quest Glendalough and their newest event Quest Lough Derg. The difference with this event is the endurance aspect. It is the only

Race Director, Oliver Kirwan said, 'Following the success of our first long-distance endurance event in 2018 we are delighted to bring back Quest 12/24 for its second year. Those who have signed up have made a serious commitment to train and prepare for this event. We've run special training days and produced training plans as well as advice on all aspects of preparation. There are some people doing the race to step it up a gear from our regular events, there are others who have never done an adventure race before. We have endurance athletes coming from all over the world for it, from as far afield as USA, Canada, Israel and all-around Europe. It's

Participants start in Sneem and cycle to Carrauntoohil, ascend and descend Ireland's highest mountain, then carry on along the Ring of Kerry Road, kayaking in Waterville and back via the Kerry Way. It's a massive course and a real test for all taking part. We'd encourage anyone on the route to show their encouragement. Spectators can view participant's progress using a website that will track them using GPS on the route too. The hard work is done now in terms of training, best of luck to all the participants."

More than 250 participants will take part in the 24 hr (248km) course or on the 12hr (147km) course.
















My top three tips to stop overthinking!

Happily, there are many things you can do to calm your mind and stop overthinking. Here are my top three tips:


Top three tips for a clear & calm mind



A GUIDE TO **SCREEN USE**



Many people worry that viewing a screen can damage their eyes. There is no evidence of this. In fact, because you can alter the size, brightness and contrast of the display, it can easier and more comfortable to see on a screen compared with looking at things on paper. However, some people find that looking at a screen for a long time is tiring, and may find wearing glasses for computer use helpful.

Special protective coatings can be put on glasses lenses to help against eye fatigue from digital screens. These can help reduces glare for more comfortable and relaxed vision. Create better contrast perception, offering a more natural colour experience

HERE ARE SOME WAYS TO LOOK AFTER YOUR EYES WHILE USING YOUR SCREEN:

- •Apply the 20-20-20 rule every 20 minutes look at something 20 feet away for 20 seconds. That will give your eye muscles a rest.
- •Try to blink regularly. Focusing


on a screen may make you blink less, which may make your eyes dry and uncomfortable.

- •Position your computer screen so that: •it is between 40 and 76 centimetres (16 to 30 inches) from your eyes
- •the top is level with, or slightly below, your eyes
- •it is tilted away from you at a 10to 20-degree angle
- distracting •there are no reflections, e.g. from a window.
- •Once you have adjusted your screen, adjust the font size so it's easy to read.
- •Use document holders for reading or reference materials. Place them close to the screen at the same distance from your eyes. This will enable your eyes to remain focused as they move between the screen and the documents.
- •Use a character size that is easy to see. The character size is an important factor since it determines the distance at which you prefer to view the monitor

FANS FALLING IN LOVE WITH KERRY FOOTBALL AGAIN BY: Donal Barry



Real too was the amount of time players gave each supporter from the David Moran's and Tommy Walsh's who have seen it all before to the David Clifford's and Seanie O'Shea's who were getting their first real taste.

Whatever the result on Sunday, there is a real feeling of people beginning to fall in love with Kerry football again and there are many great days ahead of us.



ell in fact, David (Clifford) will have plenty help on this occasion as he and his teammates take on the modern day GAA Goliath that is Dublin.

W However, it is funny how things have changed in the GAA landscape since the golden days of Kerry GAA from the mid 1970's through to 1986 and even the wonderful noughties in which Kerry won 5 All Ireland titles.

On Sunday Dublin will have a legion of players looking for their seventh All Ireland medal. Having won titles 2011 2013 2015 2016 2017 and 2018. To put that into some kind of modern day context. Tomas Sé won five and his brother Darragh Sé won six.

Another win for the Dubs and some of their players will hit the golden bar of seven with them closing in on Kerry greats Pat Spillane, Mikey Sheehy, Páidí Ó Sé, Ogie Moran and Ger Power with eight All Ireland medal who are regarded by many part of the most successful team in the history of Gaelic football.

Of the starting panel of 30 Dublin have only Sean Bugler is yet to win an All Ireland medal with all the rest stretching from one up to six. Of the starting 15 against Mayo, they had over 600 senior appearances between them (618 in fact) and when it comes to their manager's record. It is one to look back and admire.

Jim Gavin's championship record is one won 43, drawn 2 and lost just the one to Donegal, in 2014.

Kerry went on to defeat, Donegal in that final and one wonders what would have happened had Dublin not squandered their big lead that day and if they came face to face with Kerry in that final.

And when we look at the Kerry team that Peter Keane will lead out, it screams inexperience all over. Between their starting 15 against Tyrone they managed to scramble together 265 appearances. Take David Moran, Paul Geaney, Shane Enright and Stephen O'Brien out of that equation and the remaining 11 have only 123 appearances between them. That is an average of 11 each for the remaining players. Still well behind Dublin's lowest with 15 Brian Howard. In addition, a hell of a long way behind Stephen Cluxton on 105.

In fact, David Moran carries the most Kerry experience with 41 appearances into Sunday's final and they would see him still behind four Dublin players, the aforementioned Cluxton (105), Michael Darragh McAuley on 57, Mick Fitzsimons on 56, , James McCarthy on 54, Dean Rock and Ciaran Kilkenny on 42 each.

In fact, Moran is level with Johnny Cooper on 41. Hard to imagine that even.

So there can be no doubting the task on hand for Peter Keane's young team. However if we have learned anything from sport over the years, inexperience is an unknown quantity and one Dublin at times become shipwrecked on. Remember 1955 when a young Kerry team helped by six Tadghie Lyne points saw Kerry win 0-12 to 1-6.

Remember 1975 when Micko Dwyer brought a young team to Croke Park to tackle Dublin and they won 2-12 to 0-11. Will 2019 be one of those moments when Kerry unleash the youthful shackles and just let go?

IF INFORMATION IS THE NEW KEY TO WINNING MATCHES IT'S A MATTER OF "STA

With so little between teams at the very highest level as the Stats men and women becoming an integral part of getting teams over the line Donal Barry asks.

t is five minutes before throw in. Austin Stack Park is packed to the rafters. The patrons have been seated for almost two hours, the media have all their Wi-Fi codes and laptops at the ready and there are eight vacant seats left just in front of them.

With the anthems over, they are swiftly occupied by an unlikely gang armed with implements that would be more at place in a school hall ahead of the honour maths paper on leaving cert day.

These are the modern day stats team for Dublin. They have become an integral part of their success and other teams are now seeing a big growth in this area. After all Stats are now an official weapon for managers to get more from their team.

Now fast forward to the 23th minute, Stephen O'Brien has just punched the ball over the Dublin goal line to open up a 4 point lead, one of Dublin's Stats team is dispatched

from his seat. Have they hit upon a maths failure in the Dublin team? The info makes it way to the line. Two minutes later Dublin have a goal of their own. Coincidence or did the relayed info spot a weakness that Dublin acted upon so quickly. Now fast forward to the All-Ireland Semi-final between Mayo and Dublin. It looks like Mayo are well in this but a third quarter blitz by Dublin puts them in the All Ireland Final. Was it all the info gathered in the first half? Did they get their tactics and match ups bang on for those ten second half minutes to hurt Mayo on the scoreboard.

Of course most managers will suggest that the only stat they are interested in, is the final result but there is no doubt that the Kerry/ Dublin league clash in February in Tralee will be dissected no end by the teams looking for get that extra something on each other for next Sunday.

As for the game in February, Kerry launched 30 meaning attacks of which they converted 70% over the course of both halves; however, their second half return was just 62%, unlike their first half attack rate of 79%. Dublin on the other hand were almost computer like efficient. Their total attack rate was 70% from 31 attacks throughout the game came with a first half efficiently rate of 73% and a second half return of 71% The most important one from a Kerry perspective was that they converted 73% of their scores from play while Dublin laboured with just 60% from play. This will be the key to winning on Sunday, more scores from play. There is a feeling that Kerry with enough possession can hurt Dublin here. Time will tell.

Probably one of the most telling stats on the night was that Dublin did not have Stephen Cluxton between the posts and Kerry had no David Clifford. Two more equations to place in the bowl.



KEEPING IT CLOSE TO THE CHEST IS ALL PART OF PETER'S PLAN

When it comes to Inter County managers, Kerry's Peter Keane says a lot more in the way he looks at you and smiles. He certainly adds an entertainment value with at times a real honesty but not unlike veteran mangers, he also has the defensive cloak when he needs it.

There is the old tired worn out GAA phrases thrown out like "game by game", "we respect everyone", "We are waiting on more information on that injury", with "close to fitness", "almost there" and "happy enough at where we are at" used to either explain or confuse either the media or those looking in from a distance to get some kind of nugget for advantage.

However, for a manager in his first senior year, he has dragged a largely inexperienced team along the road to an unlikely All Ireland final. Well unlikely in the since of where Kerry ended last season's championship with a failure to exit the Super 8's.

For many it would feel like bonus territory, with such a young team taking on a team for five in row but Keane bucks this cover.

"I would not say we are in bonus territory. We have a lot of guys who won minor All Irelands and have been around winning teams over the years. That is not how they are thinking

Still for Keane, the side show of management is something that he has been forced to tackle away from the playing field. Two weeks ahead of the All Ireland Final, he has to handle the David Gough appointment in terms of heavy criticism from former players and managers in Kerry. Keane is having none of it

"I have no problem with David Gough; I think he is probably the best referee in the country at this moment in time. I am not too hung up in referees. I was thinking about it today, we played Dublin in the league. I can't tell you who riffed the game. Does it matter? The referee does his job. My father (Tom) was a referee years ago in South Kerry. He went out to do an honest job, some guys get hung up

that this fellow doesn't do us any favours, or that fellow doesn't do us any favours. Sure, the referee is appointed. Just get on with it"

He equally bats the talk of a protest against Gough out of the park with "I haven't heard of it" and cuts the new "Watergate" controversy following the Tyrone game with repeated replies "we are preparing for Dublin in two weeks" – three times. The tone of his third rebuttal ends the topic.


When it comes to that Dublin challenge, Keane is fulsome in his praise of Dublin "These are guys who are going for five in a row. This is the team of the ages and we are here trying to do our best to come us against them"

So how have Kerry got to this stage. Keane is very much one foot in front of the other and hope we don't fall over kind of a person

"You don't start out at the start of the year saying we have to make a league final or we have to make a championship final. You just take in game by game but you start at the foundation of anything which is you try and build a squad, get as

much experience around that squad and you take it from there. If you look at our team, you have a lot of guys, 16 players in fact who made their championships over the last 15 months. A lot of fellows retired this year and some walked away the previous year. Add to that players like Jonathan Lyne, Tommy Walsh and Jack Sherwood who came. So there has been a huge transformation in the personnel in the group and while it may not be huge from my perspective because I was not with them before but there is still a lot of learning go on there. We are going in with a team who do not have a whole pile of experience, we have some guys who have only four or five games played for Kerry. You are up against a team with fellows with well over a hundred games. This has always been about us trying to formulate some type of a squad. What I have learned over the year is the longer you are at it, the easier it becomes because you know the players better."

CLASHES A ROMANTIC RIVALRY OR AN AGE OLD BATTLE OF TITANS?

Donal Barry looks back at the history pages to look at Kerry and Dublin's battles since 1893

Kerry and Dublin's rivalry was to be taken by the laws of averages then Kerry should win on Sunday in Croke Park by 1-9 to 0-7 points.

behind the Kerry/Dublin All Ireland final rivalry in such a way but for many there remains a romance about Kerry and Dublin clashes over the last 126 years. During the

Sunday Game's live coverage of the All Ireland Senior Football Semi Final, RTE Analysis and 8-time All-Ireland winner Pat Spillane pour water on the fact that Kerry

defeating Tyrone in 1986 had anything to do with rivalry. "There is no such things as rivalry when you are winning," he admitted.

Despite the fact that Kerry have a better head to head over Dublin (8-5) when it comes to All Ireland finals, Kerry have not actually beaten Dublin in an All Ireland Final in 34 years, having lost their last two outings to the dominant Dubs in 2011 and 2015.

That said Kerry have defeated Dublin 9 times in the All Ireland Quarter finals and semi-finals along the way with only two draws in their 29 clashes. Few will remember the 1941 drawn game in the All Ireland semi final in which both sides finished level 0-4 apiece. However nobody will forget the 4th August 2001 when a certain Maurice Fitzgerald floated over one of the finest points ever scored in the rivalry when from the outside of his boot he floated a glorious shot over the bar (and Tommy Carr) to level matters. Kerry won the replay

For the romantics it wa another semi-final that standouts as the best game ever, the 1977 All Ireland semi final. Maybe it was the best thriller ever but it was one Kerry lost 3-12 to 1-13. Maybe for that reason it stands out more but more the 1978 All Ireland final is remembered as Kerry's best win when they defeated the Dubs 5-11 to 0-9.

Neither Peter Keane nor Jim Gavin are likely to have been brought up on Mills and Boon so romance will not be part of their set up on Sunday. Both will try to out manoeuvre each other like Chess champions, each aware that one poor move could consign their county to a loss as another chapter will be written into the Kerry/Dublin Saga.



Being Kerry Captain is not all that Black and White for Gavin

In years to come this will certainly be a sports quiz question. Name the man that captained his county to an All Ireland Senior Football Final while yet to make his league debut.

As far-fetched as it sounds, 22-year-old University of Limerick student Gavin White is yet to make a league appearance for Kerry despite his three-year involvement with the Kerry senior set up.

Ruled out due to injury for a season and his clubs (Dr. Crokes) All Ireland club run has left White a little outside the loop at the beginning of each competitive season but the Killarney man is determined to make up for what he has missed when it comes to championship.

"I have never played a league game. I played championship last year and obviously the championship this year. I have yet to make my league debut," he laughs as he speaks to the Killarney Outlook about Sunday's All Ireland Football Final.

White admits that it leaves him a little behind the other members of the panel but is realistic enough to know that there is nothing he can do about it

"You miss about three or four months of bonding with the team and the hard training, going up the country staying overnights ahead of games. You miss all that"

His late arrival to the panel also sees him getting to meet the new manager a little later than others. Does this have an impact? "I did not get to meet him until after April, once the club championship was over. Then I picked up an injury to the elbow and that ruled me out for another few weeks."

White's wanting to get back in quickly into the Kerry panel hit him the most when he missed Kerry's league game against Dublin in Austin Stack Park

"You are sitting up in the stand when you are itching to be out there. You want to put on a Kerry jersey as much as you can really. You are going to all the games and you are saying to yourself if I was out there would I make a difference?"



White who won two All Ireland minor medals with Jack O'Connor as manager had to get use to another South Kerry man this season in the shape of Peter Keane. So what does he think of the new set up?

"Peter brought in a whole new management team. We are really impressed with the whole set up and everything. He brought a new perspective to the whole thing. In fairness to Eamonn, he was brilliant in everything he did. It was top notch. It didn't really work out for us, for whatever reasons but this year Peter brought a different approach. We fed off that and we blossomed off that. His relationship with the minor lads helps an awful lot as well. So he has a good relationship with younger players and it has worked well. Jason McGahan and Donie Buckley arrived and they brought something new to the whole setup as well."

White accepts that there was big changes with the wholesale retirements of household names but sees the 2019 squad "really minding each other" and rejects the notion that inexperience comes with youth. "Look first and foremost we are footballers; a lot of the team would have played with each other at minor and all the way up. So I think there has been a bond. This year it has been taken to another level altogether. The major difference between a minor and senior team is the league. Having been together for that extra three or four months makes a huge difference. It helps an awful lot. We are all a similar age and that helps as well. I think the fact that we are in each other's company for so long helps us at this stage.

Despite his age of just 22 White already has a fine list of achievements under his belt. The Dr. Crokes man has been a part of the Crokes side that won three Kerry titles in a row from 2016 to 2018. Winning an All Ireland Club Championship title in 2017. It was a special winning Croke Park feeling that he hopes to feel come five o clock on Sunday evening.





They are all of similar size so we we will have a lot of rotation options with the right mix of Irish players to adapt to different situations on defense and on offense," he said. It will be Scotts Lakers third year in succession participating in the national league division one.
